- Defensive end Kobe Jones earned the first start of his career in Saturday's contest.

- The Bulldogs have out-scored opponents 120-31 in the first half this season.
- MSU had one play of 20 or more yards against Auburn to bring its season total to 37.
- The Bulldogs eclipsed the 200-yard rushing mark for the fifth time this season, ending the game with 201 yards on the ground.

DEFENSE

- Johnathan Abram (10), Mark McLaurin (10) and Jeffery Simmons (10) all finished the game with 10+ tackles, marking the first time since the 2012 season versus Texas A&M that Mississippi State had three or more players record double-digit tackles in a game.
 Montez Sweat and Jeffery Simmons has combined for 48 tackles for loss over their 20 career games played together.

- Rushed for over 100 yards for the fourth time this season and the 18th time in his career, which sets MSU's school record for most 100-yard rushing games in a career. The previous record of 17 was held by Anthony Dixon (2006-09).

- 1. The LSU Captains were RB Clyde Edwards-Helaire, S Todd Harris Jr., S Grant Delpit and LB Devin White.
- 2. LSU win the toss and deferred to the second half. Mississippi State will receive. LSU kicked off and defended the north end zone.
- 3. The attendance for the homecoming game was 101,340.
- 4. LSU's 2018 homecoming queen is Sarah Perkins, and the king is Daniel Wolf.
- 5. LSU defeated #22/RV Mississippi State, 19-3.
 - a. LSU now has an overall record of 7-1 this season.
 - b. LSU leads the series with an overall record of 73-35-3.
 - c. MSU was the fifth Top 25 team that LSU faced this season. The Tigers are 4-1 against ranked opponents with three of the four wins coming against Top 10 teams.
 - d. LSU has now won 22 straight games played in Tiger Stadium during the month of October, a streak that dates back to 2009.
- 6. LSU head coach **Ed Orgeron** improved to 22-7 at the helm.
 - a. He now has a 38-34 overall record.
 - i. He is now 3-3 against MSU.
 - ii. LSU is 17-7 as a Top 25 team under Coach O.
 - b. In his last 37 games as a head coach, Orgeron has a 28-9 mark, a stretch that includes a 6-2 record with Southern Cal in 2013.
 - c. With the 16-point win against Mississippi State, 18 of LSU's 22 wins under Orgeron have come by double digits.
- 7. LSU's streak of 100-yard rushing games has been extended to 25 as the Tigers ran for 110 total yards.
- 8. LSU now has a +13-turnover margin with four interceptions by the LSU defense and one interception thrown by Joe Burrow.
 - a. In its last 15 games, LSU only has nine turnovers.
- 9. The Tigers only allowed a field goal in the first quarter, and LSU has not allowed a first quarter touchdown in 12 consecutive games dating back to week 9 of 2017.
- 10. The game marked the first time since September 27, 2014 vs. New Mexico State (Tre'Davious White and Kendell Beckwith-TD) that LSU had two first quarter interceptions.
 - a. Tonight, Grant Delpit and Michael Divinity were responsible for the two picks.
- 11. With the targeting penalty in the fourth quarter, LB **Devin White** was ejected from the game. He will miss the first half of the game against Alabama.
- 12. LSU's defense came up big against 22nd-ranked Mississippi State, holding the Bulldogs to season lows for points (16), passing yards (59) and third down conversions (2).

Individual

Offense

- 1. QB **Joe Burrow** is now 7-1 as LSU's starting quarterback. He finished the night 16-of-38 passing for 129 yards with one interception.
- 2. **RB Nick Brossette** ran for 64 yards on 16 attempts with one touchdown, including a long rush of 12 yards.
 - a. On his 16th carry of the game, a 6-yard run with 14:17 left in the 4th quarter, Brossette eclipsed the 1,000 career yards mark with 1,001.
 - i. He has 1,003 career yards.
- 3. RB Clyde Edwards-Helaire rushed for a career-high 145 yards. It was his second 100-yard rushing game.
 - a. His career-long rush of 47 yards ended the first quarter and set up a touchdown three plays later.
- 4. WR **Dee Anderson** and **Justin Jefferson** led the team with three catches apiece.
 - a. Anderson had 29 yards, and Jefferson recorded 18 yards receiving.

Defense

- 1. On 3rd-and-11 during the first Mississippi State drive and 13:48 on the clock, LB **Michael Divinity** intercepted Nick Fitzgerald and ran it back 31 yards for his first career interception.
 - a. Divinity finished the night with four tackles one tackle for loss and one pass break-up.
- 2. S **Grant Delpit** posted a career-high 10 tackles in the game, tying his career best. He had one sack, one tackle for loss and two interceptions.
 - a. On 3rd-and-4 with 3:56 left in the first quarter, Delpit recorded his team-best fourth pick of the year.
 - i. He now has five career interceptions.
 - b. Delpit dropped Fitzgerald for his fourth career sack in the third quarter. It was for a loss of 8 yards. He now has 4.0 sacks for a loss of 36 yards.
 - c. He recorded his second interception of the game, his first multi-interception game of his career with 0:41 left in the game, sealing the LSU victory.
- 3. S John Battle had four tackles and one interception.
 - a. With 5:03 let in the game, Battle intercepted Fitzgerald to put the Tigers on their own 10-yard line.
 - i. The interception was his third of the season and fifth career.
- 4. LB Jacob Phillips had another double-digit tackle game, posting 10 tackles and one quarterback hurry.
 - a. It was the second game of his career with at least 10 tackles.
- 5. LB **Devin White** had 10 tackles, one pass break-up and one quarterback hurry.

Special Teams

- 1. PK **Cole Tracy** was 4-for-4 on field goal attempts and 1-for-1 on extra points. He now is 21-for-23 as the Tigers' kicker and 24-of-24 on PATs.
 - a. The graduate transfer connected on a 25-yarder as time expired in the first half to give LSU the 10-3 lead
 - b. For his second field goal of the evening, Tracy booted a 38-yard field goal to give LSU the 13-3 edge.
 - c. His third field goal put the Tigers up 16-3. It was a 29-yard attempt.
 - d. He legged a 40-yard field goal for his fourth of the night to give LSU the 19-3 lead.
 - i. With his fourth field goal of the night, Tracy moved into a tied for third on LSU's single-season field goal list.
 - 1. Drew Alleman was 21-of-29 in 2012.
 - ii. It was also the fourth consecutive drive that LSU kicked a field goal. It was the first time converting four-straight field goals since September 18, 2010, when LSU's Josh Jasper converted four on its first four drives to open the game against Mississippi State.
 - e. Since 1966, there is no record of an LSU placekicker making a total of nine field goals in consecutive games.
- 2. SNP **Blake Ferguson** handled snapping duties for the 33rd-consecutive game.
- 3. P **Zach Von Rosenburg** punted seven times for 306 yards for an average of 43.7 yards per punt. He dropped the ball inside of the MSU 20-yard line three times and had two punts for at least 50 yards. He had a long punt of 51 yards.
 - a. The 306 punting yards are a career high. His seven attempts also tied a career high.
