OPENING TIP

► K-State (4-0) will open play in the 25th annual Hall of Fame Classic on Thursday, as the Wildcats face off against Mississippi State (2-1) in the nightcap of a doubleheader at the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City. The Wildcats and Bulldogs are tentatively set to tip off at 8:30 p.m. CT, following the first game between Nebraska (4-0) and New Mexico (3-1), which is slated to tip off at 6 p.m., CT.

► The winners of the two semifinal matchups will play in the championship game at 8:30 p.m., CT on Friday with the third-place game set for 6 p.m., CT. All tournament games will air on Peacock, NBC Sports NOW as well as on the NBC Sports Network linear channel on YouTubeTV.

► K-State will be making its fourth appearance in the Hall of Fame Classic and the first since 2021. The Wildcats finished as the tournament runner-up in their first two visits, defeating No. 18 Gonzaga before losing to top-ranked Duke in 2010 and defeating Missouri before losing to No. 9 North Carolina in 2015. The team lost to No. 13 Arkansas and No. 14 Illinois in their most recent appearance in 2021.

► This will be the fifth meeting between K-State and Mississippi State and the first since a 67-61 Bulldog win at the Never Forget Tribute Classic in Newark, N.J. on Dec. 14, 2019. The Wildcats won the previous 3 meetings in the series in 1984, 1985 and 1994.

► Led by fourth-year head coach Chris Jans, MSU is 2-1 after wins over North Alabama (86-62) and SE Louisiana (75-68) in between a 96-80 neutral-site loss to No. 16 Iowa State. The Bulldogs are led by one of the top scorers in the country in Josh Hubbard, who is averaging 22.3 points per game.

LAST TIME OUT

► K-State rallied from a 5-point deficit with 49 seconds to play with a 6-0 run to end the game, as the Wildcats moved to 4-0 with a nail-biting 84-83 win over a defiant Tulsa squad on Monday night to cap a 4-game homestand to start the season.

► Down 83-78 with 49 seconds left, K-State was able to pull out the improbable win behind the heroics of junior P.J. Haggerty and sophomore David Castillo, who combined for the final 6 points.

► Haggerty and Castillo were among four Wildcats in double figures, as Haggerty finished with game-highs in both points (31) and rebounds (10) while recording the first 30-point, 10-rebound performance since Michael Beasley in 2008. Castillo had 12 points off the bench, while senior Khamari McGriff and junior Abdi Bashir Jr. added 13 and 12 points, respectively.

THANKS JACK!

► Head coach Jack Hartman, who won a school-record 295 games during his illustrious 16-year tenure from 1970-86, will officially be inducted the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame this week. He is the sixth person with K-State ties to be named to the Hall, including the fourth coach.

► Hartman will be recognized at halftime of Thursday's game where his daughter Jackie will receive his induction medallion. She will be joined by a number of Hartman's former players.

TEAM NOTES

■ UP NEXT: MISSISSIPPI STATE

► Led by fourth-year head coach **Chris Jans**, Mississippi State is off to a 2-1 start to the season with wins over North Alabama (86-62) and SE Louisiana (75-68) in between a 96-80 neutral-site loss to No. 16 Iowa State. The Bulldogs return 4 players, including starter **Josh Hubbard**, from a squad that posted a 21-13 record and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2024-25.



► MSU is averaging 80.3 points on 46.2 percent shooting, including 35.9 percent from 3-point range, while allowing 75.3 points on 41.8 percent shooting, including 24.2 percent from 3-point range. Four Bulldogs are averaging 7 or more points, including Hubbard, who is averaging 22.3 points on 44.4 percent shooting and 90 percent from the line. Hubbard also has a team-high 17 assists. Senior **Shawn Jones Jr.** is averaging 11.7 points and 7.0 rebounds per game. Transfers **Achor Achor** and **Sergej Macura** are both averaging a team-best 7.7 rebounds per game.

► The Bulldogs were picked 10th in the 16-team preseason SEC poll by the media. Reigning national champion Florida is the preseason favorite to win the league. Hubbard was selected to the SEC preseason First Team.

► Jans is in his 10th season as a head coach, which includes a successful 5-year stint at New Mexico State, where he led the Aggies to 122 wins and 3 trips to the NCAA Tournament. He has a 208-85 record as a Division I head coach, including a 65-41 mark at MSU with 3 more NCAA Tournament bids.

SERIES HISTORY

► K-State leads the all-time series, 3-1, but is 0-1 in neutral-site contests. The Wildcats won the first 3 meetings in 1984, 1985 and 1994 before the Bulldogs earned a 67-61 win at the Never Forget Tribute Classic in the last meeting on Dec. 14, 2019 in Newark, N.J.

► K-State is 300-293 against current members of the SEC, including a 46-29 mark in games played at neutral sites.

HISTORY AT T-MOBILE CENTER

► K-State is familiar with the T-Mobile Center, having played in 48 games since the arena's opening in 2007, posting a 24-24 all-time record.

► Most of these games have come in the annual Big 12 Championship (28; 2008, 2010-current), while the Wildcats have played 13 times in the Wildcat Classic (2007-12, 2014, 2016, 2018-19, 2022-24), along with 6 in the Hall of Fame Classic and once in the NCAA Tournament (2013).

► K-State has 5 wins over SEC teams at T-Mobile, including Alabama in 2011, Florida in 2012, Texas A&M in 2014, Missouri in 2015 and Vanderbilt in 2018. The Wildcats also defeated Nebraska in the 2022 event.

LAST TIME OUT
K-STATE 84, TULSA 83

► K-State rallied from a 5-point deficit with 49 seconds to play with a 6-0 run to end the game, as the Wildcats moved to 4-0 with a nail-biting 84-83 win over a defiant Tulsa squad on Monday night before 7,123 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► Down 83-78 after a pair of free throws with 49 seconds left, K-State was able to pull out the improbable victory behind the heroics of junior **P.J. Haggerty** and sophomore **David Castillo**, who combined for the final 6 points.

► Haggerty connected on 2 free throws before a successful coach's challenge reversed an out of bounds play, leading to a jumper by Haggerty that closed the deficit to 83-82 with 31 seconds. Senior **Khamari McGriff** stole the ball on a bad pass on the next possession, leading to the game-winning layup by Castillo with 18 seconds.

► Tulsa (3-1) had two chances in the final seconds to escape with victory, but senior **Miles Barnstable** missed a 3-pointer with 7 seconds, then after a second coach's challenge reversed another out of bounds call this time in favor of the Golden Hurricane, graduate **David Green** missed a jumper and senior **C.J. Jones** was able to corral the rebound as the clock expired.

► Haggerty finished the night with 31 points on 10-of-17 field goals and 11-of-12 free throws to go with a game-high 10 rebounds, 3 assists and 2 steals in 32 minutes. He is the first Wildcat with a 30-point, 10-rebound performance since **Michael Beasley** registered 33 points and 14 rebounds against Colorado on March 4, 2008. It was his fifth career game of 30 or more points, while he posted his fourth career double-double and his second in a Wildcat uniform.

► Haggerty scored 27 of his game-high 31 points in the second half, as he converted on 8-of-13 field goals and 11-of-12 free throws. His 27 second-half points are the fifth-most by any Wildcat in a half and the most since **Denis Clemente** went for 32 points in the second half at Texas on Jan. 31, 2009.

► Haggerty was joined in double figures by McGriff, who narrowly missed his own double-double with 13 points and 9 rebounds, while Castillo and junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** added 12 and 10 points, respectively.

► K-State entered the game averaging 96.7 points on 58.7 percent shooting, including 54.4 percent from 3-point range, but had to score its 84 points in a different way with season-lows in both field goal percentage (44.1) and 3-point field goal percentage (20.8).

► The Wildcats shot 56.8 percent (25-of-44) inside the 3-point arc with 46 points in the paint to go with 26 fast-break points and a 17-15 edge in second-chance points while out-rebounding the nationally-ranked Hurricane, 40-38. They also converted on their opportunities from the free throw line, hitting on a season-best 90.5 percent (19-of-21).

► Tulsa, which entered the game averaging 90 points per game, connected on 40.9 percent (27-of-66) from the field, including 26.7 percent (8-of-30) from 3-point range, and hit on 72.4 percent (21-of-29) from the line. Four players scored in double figures led by Barnstable's 18 points.

POSTGAME NOTES

► K-State moves to 4-0 on the season for the first time since 2022-23.

► K-State is now 43-9 at Bramlage Coliseum under head coach **Jerome Tang**, including 22-2 in non-conference play.

► The Wildcats made 56.8 percent (25-of-44) of their 2-point attempts with 46 points in the paint. They also held a 17-15 edge on second-chance points.

► The 90.9 free throw percentage tied for sixth-best with a minimum of 20

■ OFFENSE OFF TO FAST START

MOST POINTS THROUGH 4 GAMES

► Although they didn't extend their streak of 90-point games to start the season in the 84-83 win over Tulsa on Monday, the Wildcats are still off to a fast offensive start. The squad is averaging 93.5 points on 54.7 percent (135-of-247) shooting, including 45.7 percent (42-of-92) from 3-point range, while hitting on 72.9 percent (62-of-85) from the line.

► The 374 points are the most points through the first 4 games of a season, surpassing the 367 scored by the 1991-92 squad. The 99 points vs. Cal marked the third consecutive 90-point performance to open the season, which was a first since that Dana Altman-led squad 34 years ago.

HAGGERTY JOINS ELITE COMPANY

► After his season-high 31-point performance, junior **P.J. Haggerty** became just the third Wildcat to open a season with four consecutive games of 20 or more points, joining **Bob Boozer** in 1958-59 and **Michael Beasley** in 2007-08.

HAGGERTY HAS RARE 30-10 GAME

► In addition to his 31 points, junior **P.J. Haggerty** tied a career-high with 10 rebounds to become the first Wildcat since **Michael Beasley** in 2008 to post a rare 30-point, 10-rebound double-double. He scored 27 of his 31 points in the second half, which are the fifth-most in any half.

MOST POINTS AT BRAMLAGE

► K-State's 99-96 win over Cal on Nov. 13 made history, as the 195 combined points were the most-ever in Bramlage Coliseum, surpassing the 194 scored between K-State (106) and Marshall (88) on Dec. 2, 1995.

► K-State posted the highest field goal percentage of the **Jerome Tang** era for the second straight game, as the Wildcats hit on 64.4 percent (38-of-59) from the field. It was the highest field goal percentage since shooting 66.0 percent vs. Wake Forest on March 14, 2017.

TRIO OF 'CATS POST 20-POINT GAMES

► K-State had three players record 20-point games in the win over Cal, as junior **P.J. Haggerty** led the way with 23 points to go with 21 from senior **Khamari McGriff** and 20 from senior **Nate Johnson**.

► The trio is the first to each have 20-point games since **Dean Wade** (34 points), **Kamau Stokes** (23 points) and **Barry Brown Jr.** (21 points) did it against Iowa State on Dec. 29, 2017.

MCGRIFF, CASTILLO GO PERFECT

► Two Wildcats - senior **Khamari McGriff** and sophomore **David Castillo** - each went perfect from the field, becoming the 24th and 25th players in school history to go perfect from the field on 5 or more field goals in the 98-71 win over Bellarmine on Nov. 8. They are the first set of teammates to accomplish the feat in the same game.

► Castillo scored a career-high 19 points on 7-of-7 shooting, including 5-of-5 from 3-point range, while McGriff totaled 16 points on 8-of-8 field goals. Castillo is just the eighth Wildcat to go 5-of-5 from beyond the arc, joining his high school coach **Cient Stewart** who was in attendance.

■ HOW THE 'CATS WERE BUILT

CATS WELCOME 10 NEWCOMERS, INCLUDING 5 DIVISION I TRANSFERS

► K-State brought in one of the top transfer classes with 10 newcomers, including 5 Division I transfers, 4 players from the international ranks and 1 true freshman. The class has been rated nationally as high as No. 4 by 247Sports and No. 20 by On3.

► Among the 10 newcomers are 5 Division I transfers, including **Abdi Bashir Jr.** (Monmouth), **P.J. Haggerty** (Memphis), **Marcus Johnson** (Bowling Green), **Nate Johnson** (Akrón) and **Khamari McGriff** (UNC Wilmington). Haggerty, N. Johnson and McGriff were on teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2024-25.

► The 4 international additions include the school's first-ever players from Italy (**Dorin Buca**), Serbia (**Andrej Kostic**) and Germany (**Elias Rapieque**). The fourth international player - **Stephen Osei** - from Toronto played at the junior college level at Casper College in Wyoming.

► Haggerty is coming off a career year at Memphis, in which, he became the first Tiger since 2008 to be named an AP All-American while earning consensus Second Team All-American honors. The AAC Player of the Year ranked third nationally in both scoring (21.7 ppg.) and total points (759).

► Johnson became the first Akron player to be named both the MAC Player and Defensive Player of the Year in the same season and the first since Ball State's **Bonzi Wells** in 1998.

► Bashir was one of the top scorers in the NCAA in 2024-25, leading the CAA in scoring at 20.1 points per game while leading the nation in 3-point field goals per game (3.85) and second in total 3-pointers (127).

► McGriff was one of the top sixth men in the CAA at UNC Wilmington, where he was part of 99 wins and 3 conference championships.

► A member of the German U18 and U20 National Teams, Rapieque played in 53 games with ALBA Berlin in 2024-25 between the EuroLeague (27 games) and the German Basketball Bundesliga (26 games).

► Kostic was a member of the Serbia U18 and U19 National Teams, winning the gold medal at the 2023 European U18 Championship and the silver medal at the 2024 European U18 Championship.

► The lone freshman - **Exavier Wilson** - was a 3-time all-state selection and scored more than 1,700 career points in his prep career.

SUCCESS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

► K-State has posted a 192-62 (.752) record in non-conference play since the 2006-07 season. During that span, the Wildcats have a 150-18 (.890) mark at home venues (includes games played at Bramlage Coliseum, INTRUST Bank Arena in Wichita and the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City) in non-conference play, including a 134-14 (.903) mark at Bramlage Coliseum.

► K-State's 12-1 non-conference mark in 2022-23 was the best since the 2009-10 team went a program-best 13-1. Last season, the team went 7-6 in non-conference play, including 4-1 in Bramlage Coliseum.

1750 WINS AND COUNTING

► K-State is one of the winningest programs in Division I history, as the Wildcats have posted a 1,760-1,255 (.583) all-time record which includes 32 NCAA Tournament appearances and 21 conference championships. The 1,760 wins are the 43rd-most in Division I history (one shy of Virginia in 42nd), including the seventh-most among current Big 12 schools.

TANG ADJUSTS COACHING STAFF

► Head coach **Jerome Tang** adjusted his coaching staff during the offseason, adding veteran head coach **Matthew Driscoll** as associate head coach as well as acclaimed player development coach **Bill Peterson** as an assistant coach and **Chase Driscoll** as director of video and analytics.

► The winningest coach in both North Florida and Atlantic Sun Conference history during a 16-year stint (2009-25) with the Ospreys, Driscoll joined the staff on May 23. He won 248 games at North Florida, including 144 in ASUN play, while guiding the school to 3 regular-season championships and the league's tournament championship and a NCAA Tournament bid in 2015.

► Driscoll's relationship with Tang dates back more than 20 years, as the two coached alongside each other for 6 seasons (2003-09) at Baylor as original members of head coach **Scott Drew's** staff.

► Peterson has served in various capacities in the NBA, including the Golden Warriors, Dallas Mavericks and Milwaukee Bucks. He has mentored over 20 NBA players, including Hall of Famers **Dirk Nowitzki**, **Steve Nash** and **Karl Malone**. He also has a combined 10 years of head coaching experience at the NAIA, Division II and G-League levels in his 47-year coaching career.

► Peterson coached alongside Tang while at Baylor from 2017-22, where they helped guide the Bears to the 2021 NCAA Championship.

► **Chase Driscoll** joined the staff on May 13 after serving as an assistant coach and director of operations for his father, Matthew, at North Florida.

BAYLOR NORTH

► With the additions of associate head coach **Matthew Driscoll** and assistant coach **Bill Peterson**, **Jerome Tang** tapped into his coaching history, as all three were on staff at Baylor. Tang and Driscoll were part of **Scott Drew's** first staff from 2003-09, while Tang and Peterson helped the Bears to the 2021 NCAA title while together on staff from 2017-22.

► Driscoll and Peterson aren't the only K-State staffers with Baylor ties, as director of player development **Austin Carpenter** was a graduate assistant for Tang with the Bears from 2020-22, while current graduate assistants **Henry Dugat** and **Mark Vital Jr.** are among the best players in Baylor history.

► Dugat is one of five players known as “The Foundation” that was inducted into the Baylor Athletics Hall of Fame in 2021. He was part of Drew’s first two recruiting classes that led to Bears’ historic turnaround. He still ranks in the top 20 all-time in program history with 1,229 career points.

► Vital was a 3-time All-Big 12 selection and a member of Baylor's 2021 National Championship team, playing in 126 games with 105 starts.

WILDCATS VS. RANKED TEAMS

K-State has played over 400 games vs. ranked teams in their history, posting a 138-299 (.316) record, including 28-85 (.248) vs. the top-5, 56-150 (.272) vs. the top-10 and 80-211 (.275) vs. top-15.

K-State has 45 wins vs. ranked foes in the last 13 seasons, including 17 vs. the top 10 (one over No. 1), and 34 Top 25 wins at home.

PLAYER NOTES

HAGGERTY AMONG THE BEST

▶ Junior **P.J. Haggerty** is the among the best players to transfer to K-State, as he is coming off a career-best year in 2024-25, in which, he became the first Memphis Tiger since 2008 to be named an AP All-American while becoming the first Division I player to average at least 21.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.5 steals per game to go with 6.5 free throws per game since **Ja Morant** in 2018-19. He is the only Division I player to average at 21 points, 5.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.5 steals per game in each of the last 2 seasons.

▶ Haggerty ranked third nationally in both scoring (21.7 ppg.) and total points (759) in 2024-25, while his 759 points were an AAC single-season record and the most since **Dajuan Wagner** (762) set the school season record in 2001-02.

▶ Haggerty was a consensus Second Team All-American in his lone season at Memphis, while was just the second Tiger to be named the AAC Player of the Year as well as Most Outstanding Player at the AAC Tournament. He was also a finalist for the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year award, the Wooden Award and the Riley Wallace Award as the most impactful transfer.

▶ Haggerty, who has also made stops at TCU (2022-23) and Tulsa (2023-24), has scored more than 1,500 points (1,537) in his college career, connecting on 48.8 percent from the field and 79.4 percent from the free throw line. He has scored in double figures in 68 of 76 career games with 27 games of 25 or more points, including four 30-point games and one 40-point game. He scored a career-high 42 points vs. Wichita State on March 14.

HAGGERTY ALSO GREAT AT LINE

▶ In addition to his scoring prowess, **P.J. Haggerty** is also great at getting to the free throw line, as he ranked in the top-3 nationally in both free throws made and attempted in the past 2 seasons, including second in attempts (309) and third in makes (237) in 2023-24 while playing at Tulsa and second in both makes (224) and attempts (274) in 2024-25 while at Memphis.

▶ Haggerty has made 504 free throws on 635 attempts in the past 4 seasons, averaging nearly 7 makes on nearly 9 attempts in his last 76 games played.

▶ Last season, Haggerty connected on 81.8 percent from the free throw line with an AAC-best 224 makes on 274 attempts. He went perfect from the line in 6 games, including 14-of-14 vs. Tulane on March 15 in the AAC Tournament. He made 27 straight free throws at one point during the season.

▶ Haggerty drew 7.9 fouls per 40 minutes as a sophomore at Tulsa in 2023-24, finishing behind only National Player of the Year **Zach Edey** with 309 free throw attempts, while his 237 free throws were the third-most in the country.

BASHIR GOOD FROM 3

▶ Junior guard **Abdi Bashir Jr.** is among the best returning 3-point shooting in the country, as he led the NCAA in 3-point field goals/game (3.85) while he was second in total 3-point field goals (127) and 3-point field goals attempted (332) in 2024-25. He broke both the Monmouth and CAA (Coastal Athletic Association) single-season record for 3-pointers (327).

▶ Bashir connected on a career-high 10 3-pointers in his 38-point performance against Rutgers on Nov. 18, 2024. The 10 treys tied for the second-most in Monmouth history. He made at least 5 3-pointers in 12 games, while he had 8 triples in back-to-back games vs. Northeastern (2/24/25) and Elon (2/27/25).

▶ Bashir has made 191 3-point field goals in his 70-game college career on 39 percent shooting, which is nearly 3 made 3-pointers per game. He leads the team with 13 makes so far this season on 48.1 percent shooting.

▶ As a sophomore, Bashir led Monmouth and the CAA in scoring at 20.1 points per game, while he was 16th in scoring and 25th in total points (663) in the NCAA. He posted five 30-point games, which tied for the most in program history, while he scored 20 or more points in 13 other contests. His 38 points at Rutgers were the most points scored against the Scarlet Knight since 1977.

▶ Bashir also had notable performances against Michigan State (20 points), Wichita State (15 points), Stephen F. Austin (30 points), Seton Hall (28 points), Lehigh (22 points), Princeton (26 points) and Auburn (15 points) in 2024-25.

BASHIR ALSO A TWIN

▶ Junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** and his brother **Abdul** are among 9 sets of twins playing Division I basketball in 2025-26, including one of 3 sets of identical twins (Illinois’ **Tomislav** and **Zvonimir Ivisic** and Texas State’s **Dimp** and **Ky Pernel**). They also one of 3 sets playing at different schools, joining **Ethan** (Air Force) and **Eli** (Le Moyne) **Greenberg** and **Tajuan** (Seton Hall) and **Takai** (Oregon) **Simpkins**.

▶ K-State’s 5 international players are the most on any Wildcat team in school history, which includes juniors **Dorin Buca** (Perugia, Italy), **Mobi Ikegwuruka** (Galway, Ireland) and **Elias Rapieque** (Berlin, Germany), sophomore **Stephen Osei** (Toronto, Ontario) and freshman **Andrej Kostic** (Belgrade, Serbia).

▶ Buca, Kostic and Rapieque are the first-ever players from their respective countries, while the trio joins Ikegwuruka among 7 players from Europe.

▶ Junior **Nate Johnson** nearly made history in his first game in a Wildcat uniform, as he narrowly missed the school’s first triple-double in the 93-64 win over UNC Greensboro on Nov. 4, as he finished with 22 points on 8-of-11 field goals, including 6-of-7 from 3-point range, to go with 9 rebounds and 9 assists.

▶ Johnson’s 6 made 3-pointers are the most by a Wildcat in a season opener, while his 9 assists tie **Aaron Swartzendruber** vs. Kansas City in 1996 and **Larry Reid** vs. UTSA in 2000 for the most in an opener.

▶ Junior All-American candidate **P.J. Haggerty** (27 points) and Johnson (22 points) became the first duo to go over 20 points in a season opener in nearly 18 years since **Michael Beasley** and **Blake Young** went for 32 and 22 points, respectively, against Sacramento State on Nov. 9, 2007.

▶ Haggerty’s 27 points, which came on 10-of-20 field goals and 6-of-7 free throws, are ninth-most by a Wildcat in an opener and the most since the aforementioned Beasley, who had 32 points in his first career game.

▶ Haggerty and Johnson became the first Wildcat duo to post 20-point games in any game since **Arthur Kaluma** (23) and **Cam Carter** (21) did it against No. 6/6 Iowa State on March 9, 2024.

▶ Junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** was the other Wildcat to score in double figure, scoring all 16 of his points in the second half, hitting on 6-of-7 field goals, including 4-of-5 from 3-point range.

▶ The 93 points equaled the most by a **Jerome Tang**-team in a season opener (93 vs. UTRGV (11/7/22) and were the most since scoring 98 vs. Southern Utah on Nov. 14, 2014.

▶ K-State shot just over 50 percent (34-of-67) from the field, including 59.5 percent (22-of-37) in the second half, while hitting on 51.9 percent (14-of-27) from 3-point range. The 14 made 3-pointers tie for the seventh-most in any game and are the most-ever in a season opener.

▶ The Wildcats scored 60 of their 93 points in the second half, connecting on 59.5 percent from the field and 64.7 percent (11-of-17) from 3-point range. The 60-point second-half marked the 11th time that a Wildcat team has 60 or more points in a half and tied for the ninth-most points in any half.

38th season [1988-present]

Now in its 38th season of hosting Wildcat men's basketball, the **Fred Bramlage Coliseum** has carved its own niche in K-State's colorful history of basketball homes. In keeping with the tradition established by Nichols Gymnasium (1910-50) and Ahearn Field House (1950-88), the arena has given the team a deafening, winning environment since its opening in 1988.

Dubbed the "Octagon of Doom," K-State has posted a 445-153 (.743) all-time mark in its current home, including an emotional 81-77 win over Purdue (led by alumnus **Gene Keady**) in the facility's debut on Nov. 26, 1988. The 445 victories are the most at a home venue for the Wildcats, surpassing the previous mark of 378 wins at Ahearn Field House (1950-88).

K-State has earned double-digit victories in 29 of its 37 seasons at Bramlage Coliseum, including a streak of 18 consecutive seasons from 2001-19. Three times Wildcat teams have set the single-season mark with 16 wins in the arena, which came in the 2008-09, 2010-11 and 2012-13 seasons. The 2010-11 team set the high mark for highest winning percentage (.61-1; .941) in a single season, which was then matched by the 2012-13 squad. The team recorded a 15-1 mark at home in 2022-23, which tied for the fewest losses in arena history.

K-State's home court advantage has been even better since the 2001-02 season, as the Wildcats have compiled a 306-96 (.759) record at Bramlage Coliseum, which includes a 176-19 (.901) mark in non-conference play. Among those 306 victories are 130 in Big 12 play, including 42 against ranked conference foes. In the last 24 seasons, the school has posted double-digit wins 21 times with an average of just over 12 home wins (12.7) per season.

Wins over Top 25 teams have also been a regular occurrence at Bramlage Coliseum since its opening with 54 ranked opponents falling to K-State, including 23 Top 10 opponents. Four No. 1 teams have been defeated during the arena's history, including No. 1 Missouri in 1990, No. 1 Texas in 2010, No. 1 Kansas in 2011 and No. 1 Oklahoma in 2016. The Wildcats have beaten at least one Top 25 opponent at Bramlage Coliseum every season since 2009-10.

The three Top 10 wins (No. 9 Baylor, No. 4 Kansas and No. 6 Iowa State) at Bramlage Coliseum in 2024 were a first in the arena's history. It surpassed the mark of two Top 10 wins set four times (1989-90, 2007-08, 2013-14, 2022-23).

In addition to wins, Bramlage Coliseum has also played host to some of the biggest crowds in the history of K-State basketball. The Wildcats have averaged better than 12,000 fans in 10 seasons since the doors to the arena opened in 1988-89, including a program-best 12,978 fans during that inaugural season.

Nine of the school's Top 10 attendance averages have come since 2006-07.

K-State has ranked among the NCAA's Top 40 nationally in attendance 13 times in the last 19 seasons, including a program-best 24th in 2012-13 (12,528) and 25th in both 2007-08 (12,529) and 2011-12 (12,783). In addition, the program has been rated 26th in 2006-07 (12,301), 2010-11 (12,652) and 2014-15 (12,549), 29th in 2013-14 (12,125) and 2016-17, 31st in 2009-10 (11,884), 32nd (11,903) in 2015-16 and 35th in 2018-19 (10,640).

K-State was one of 22 schools nationally and one of four Big 12 schools (Arizona, Iowa State and Texas Tech) to have both its men's and women's programs finish in the Top 40 nationally in average attendance in 2023-24, as the Wildcats finished 19th in women's basketball attendance with an average of 5,531 fans. The Wildcat women hosted NCAA First/Second Round action for the first time since 2017, selling out the arena for their Second Round matchup with Colorado.

Seating changes and construction has reduced capacity over the years to its current total of 11,010 for the 2025-26 season. The Wildcats sold out eight games and ranked 23rd nationally in percentage capacity at 87.57% as well as 39th in average (9,596) and total attendance (163,135) in 2022-23.

COACH OF THE YEAR

Jerome Tang, who was selected as the 2023 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year after guiding the Wildcats to a 26-win season and its 13th trip to the Elite Eight in his inaugural season, is set to start his fourth season as the 25th head men's basketball coach at K-State in 2025-26.

With his relentless passion, energy and positivity, Tang has re-energized a K-State program which had endured three consecutive losing seasons before his arrival in 2022-23. In his first 3 seasons, he has led the Wildcats to a 61-42 (.592) record, including 28 wins in Big 12 play, with consecutive postseason appearances (2023 NCAA Tournament, 2024 NIT) highlighted by the run to the Elite Eight. He is one of just 4 head coaches (**Lon Kruger**, **Frank Martin** and **Bruce Weber**) to help the Wildcats to the postseason in their first 2 seasons.

Among his 65 wins at K-State are 16 against teams ranked in the Top 25, including 7 Top 10 opponents. The 16 career Top 25 wins tie **Tex Winter** (1954-68) for the fourth-most in school history, while the 7 against Top 10 competition are also fourth all-time. Thirteen of the 16 ranked wins have come in the friendly confines of Bramlage Coliseum, where Tang is 43-9 (.820) overall, including 21-7 (.750) in Big 12 play and 13-4 (.765) against ranked foes. The 13 career home Top 25 wins are the second-most by a head coach in school history.

In addition to the wins over ranked teams, Tang's teams have also proved to be clutch in his short tenure, posting a 13-1 mark in overtime games, including an NCAA single-season record 7 such wins in 2023-24. The 12-game winning streak in overtime games was the second-longest such streak in Division I history since 1950 and the second-longest streak behind Florida State (14; 2018-present) and right ahead of Winthrop (10; 2017-present). Including his time as interim head coach at Baylor, Tang is now 13-1 in overtime games.

Tang has helped reestablish the "Octagon of Doom" as one of the toughest places to play in college basketball, as the Wildcats have played before nine sellouts while posting a 40-9 record at home with 13 wins over Top 25 foes, including a pair of top-5 wins over archival Kansas, two over top-10 Baylor and No. 6/6 Iowa State. The 15 home wins in 2022-23 were the most in nearly a decade (2014-15) and tied for the second-most in the arena's 35-year history.

During a roller coaster 2024-25 season that included a 6-game losing streak followed by a 6-game winning streak in Big 12 play, K-State could not overcome a disappointing non-conference season, as the Wildcats finished with a 16-17 overall record, including a tie for ninth place with TCU in the new-look 16-team Big 12 with a 9-11 mark. Among the 16 wins were 10 over teams that advanced to the postseason (3 NCAA Tournament, 1 NIT and 6 College Basketball Crown), including ranked wins over No. 3/3 Iowa State, No. 3/13 Arizona, No. 16/17 Cincinnati, No. 16/17 Kansas and No. 23/23 West Virginia.

Despite losing a pair of All-Americans in **Keyontae Johnson** and **Markquis Nowell** as well as a third starter in **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** right before the season, Tang kept the Wildcats in the NCAA Tournament conversation until the very end of the 2023-24 season before receiving a bid to the NIT, where they lost in the first round at Iowa. The team posted a 19-15 record, which included a tie for ninth with Oklahoma in the new 14-team Big 12 with an 8-10 mark. Among the 19 wins were 10 over teams that advanced to the postseason, including No. 9/9 Baylor, No. 4/4 Kansas, No. 25/21 BYU and No. 6/6 Iowa State.

The victories over the Bears and Jayhawks came in overtime, as the Wildcats set a new Division I single-season record with 7 overtime wins, breaking the mark of 6 set by Wake Forest (1983-84), Chattanooga (1988-89) and Lafayette (2007-08). The 7 overtime wins also broke the school record of 5, set in 1992-93 and 2022-23, while it is the most overtime games in school history (5 total set in 1992-93 and 2022-23). The 6 overtime home wins are also a Division I record.

Armed with just two returning players, the Wildcats posted a 26-10 overall record in Tang's inaugural season, which included a tie for third place in the nation's most difficult conference — the Big 12 — with an 11-7 mark and the school's 13th appearance in the Elite Eight and the first since 2017-18. The 26 wins are the third-most in school history, trailing the school-record 29 in 2009-10 and the 27 in 2012-13, and just the eighth 25-win campaign. His 26 wins are the second-most by a first-year head coach in school history.

During the team's historic season, Tang coached a pair of All-Americans in 2023 Bob Cousy Award winner **Markquis Nowell** and forward **Keyontae Johnson**, who became the first duo in school history to each earn the recognition from The Associated Press when they were selected to the Third Team. Both players were named to the All-Big 12 First Team, while Johnson was the league's Newcomer of the Year. Nowell was selected as the winner of Cousy Award as the nation's top point guard by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame after he finished second nationally in assists/game (8.3 apg.), total assists (297) and total steals (92) while ranking in the top-15 in four others. He was chosen the East Regional Most Outstanding Player after guiding the Wildcats to the Elite Eight, averaging 23.5 points, 13.5 assists and 4.0 steals in his 4-game NCAA Tournament run, which included a tournament and school-record 19-assist performance in the win over Michigan State on March 23. Nowell was also named a Third Team All-American by *The Sporting News*, NABC and U.S. Basketball Writers Association.

Tang arrived at K-State on March 21, 2022 after a 19-year stint at Baylor (2003-22), where as an original member of **Scott Drew's** staff played an instrumental role in building the Bears' program from one rocked by scandal and NCAA probation into one of the nation's top programs highlighted by the 2021 NCAA Championship. He helped Baylor win 397 games, including 168 in Big 12 play, to go with 13 postseason appearances (10 NCAA Tournaments, 3 NITs).

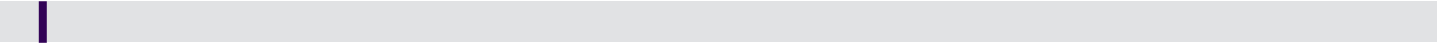

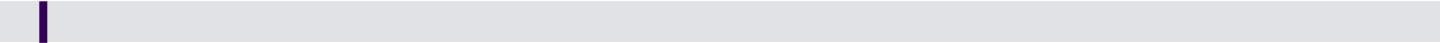

▶ K-State erupted for 60 points in the second half to shake off a one-point halftime deficit, as the Wildcats opened the 2025-26 season with a 93-64 win over UNC Greensboro on Nov. 4 before 7,765 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ Three Wildcats scored in double figures, including a pair of 20-point efforts from junior **P.J. Haggerty** (27 points) and senior **Nate Johnson**, who narrowly missed the school's first recorded triple-double, with 22 points and game-highs of 9 rebounds and 9 assists. Junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** scored all 16 of his points in the second half, hitting on 6-of-7 field goals, including 4-of-5 from 3.

▶ It marked the first time in nearly 18 years that a pair of Wildcats each went over 20 points in an opener and the first since **Michael Beasley** and **Blake Young** went for 32 and 22 points against Sacramento State on Nov. 9, 2007.

▶ Down 34-33 at the half, the Wildcats (1-0) came out of the locker room a different team, scoring 22 of the first 31 points to take a 12-point lead and force a timeout by UNGC head coach **Mike Jones** at the 13:25 mark. Unfortunately for the Spartans, the timeout only slowed the Wildcats' momentum as they rattled off 15 straight points — all on 3-pointers from Bashir and Johnson — to go ahead 70-45 with under 10 minutes to play. The lead grew to as many 32 points (89-57) after Haggerty's last points of the night with 3:12 left.

▶ K-State shot just over 50 percent (34-of-67) from the field, including 59.5 percent (22-of-37) in the second half, while hitting on 51.9 percent (14-of-27) from 3-point range. Eleven of the Wildcats' 14 makes from beyond the arc came after halftime. The 14 3-pointers tie for the seventh-most in any game, while the 11 in the second half tie for the second-most in any half.

▶ The 60-point second half marked just the 11th time that the Wildcats have scored 60 or more points in any half, as it ties for the ninth-most points in any half and are the most since a 63-point second half against UAPB on Dec. 1, 2024.

▶ K-State is now 95-27 all-time in season openers, including an 83-10 mark at home and a 31-3 mark at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ UNGC (0-1) led by as many as 10 points in the first half before K-State closed to within one at the break. The Spartans were led by graduate **Justin Neely**, who had 15 points to go with a team-high 9 rebounds, 5 assists and 3 steals in 32 minutes. Freshman **Lilian Marville** added 14 points in his college debut, while junior **Domas Kauzonas** chipped in 10 points.

▶ Four Wildcats scored in double figures, including the first career points/assists double-double for junior **P.J. Haggerty**, as K-State moved to 2-0 with a 98-71 win over Bellarmine on Nov. 8 before 8,040 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ The offense continued its fast pace, as K-State (2-0) posted 90 or more points in the first 2 games for the first time in nearly 34 years while totaling the most points in that span since scoring 193 to open the 1991-92 season.

▶ The Wildcats posted the highest field goal percentage of the **Jerome Tang** era at 62.3 percent (33-of-53), including 60.9 percent (14-of-23) from 3-point range. It was the highest field goal percentage since hitting on 62.5 percent against Alabama State on Dec. 11, 2019.

▶ Haggerty led the way with his third career double-double and first points/assists double-double, as he finished with a game-high 23 points on 5-of-9 field goals and 11-of-12 free throws to go with a career-best 11 assists. It marked his first double-double since posting a pair of tradition points/rebounds double-doubles while playing at Tulsa in 2023-24.

▶ Two Wildcats — senior **Khamari McGriff** and sophomore **David Castillo** — each went perfect from the field, becoming the 24th and 25th players in school history to go perfect from the field on 5 or more field goals. Castillo scored a career-high 19 points on 7-of-7 shooting, including 5-of-5 from 3-point range, while McGriff totaled 16 points on 8-of-8 field goals.

▶ K-State broke open a back-and-forth affair with an 18-4 run near the midway point of the first half en route to taking a 46-30 lead into the halftime break. The lead grew to 19 points in early moments of the second half before a timeout by Bellarmine head coach **Doug Davenport** keyed a surge by the Knights, who closed to within 62-52 with 13:04 to play.

▶ Bellarmine kept the pressure on K-State over the next 6 minutes, staying within 11 points, including 73-62 on back-to-back layups, before a 10-5 run by the Wildcats pushed the lead to 83-67 at the final media timeout. The squad then ended the game on a 15-4 run to put it away.

▶ Bellarmine (0-2) saw four players score in double figures, including 19 points from sophomore **Michael Wilson, Jr.**, and 18 from senior **Jack Karasinski**. The Knights shot 45.9 percent (28-of-61) from the field, but just 20 percent (4-of-20) from beyond the arc.

▶ K-State scorched the nets in building as much as a 25-point lead before holding off a late charge from a hot-shooting California squad in a 99-96 win on Nov. 13 before 7,521 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ The 195 points are the most combined points in Bramlage Coliseum history, surpassing the 194 scored between K-State and Marshall on Dec. 2, 1995. The Wildcats have now scored 90 or more points in each of the first 3 games for the first time since 1991-92. The 290 points scored through the first 3 games are the most since that **Dana Altman**-led team scored 308 nearly 34 years ago.

▶ Four Wildcats scored in double figures, including three 20-point scorers in junior **P.J. Haggerty** (23 points), senior **Khamari McGriff** (21 points) and senior **Nate Johnson** (20 points). It marked the first time three Wildcats each had 20 points since the trio of **Dean Wade** (34 points), **Kamau Stokes** (23 points) and **Barry Brown Jr.** (21 points) did it at Iowa State on Dec. 29, 2017.

▶ K-State posted the highest field goal percentage of the **Jerome Tang** era for the second straight game, as the Wildcats connected on 64.4 percent (38-of-59) from the field, including 50 percent (9-of-18) from 3-point range. It was the highest field goal percentage since hitting on 66.0 percent against Wake Forest in the First Four on March 14, 2017.

▶ A 13-0 run by K-State early in the first half broke open a back-and-forth contest, as the Wildcats built a 20-point lead with 7:43 to play on a 3-pointer by Haggerty then increased it to 25 points on two occasions, including 53-28 with 3:01 before halftime. The lead stood at 55-34 at break, as the squad shot 67.6 percent (23-of-34) from the field, including 34 points in

- K-State rallied from a 5-point deficit with 49 seconds to play with a 6-0 run to end the game, as the Wildcats moved to 4-0 with a nail-biting 84-83 win over a defiant Tulsa squad on Nov. 17 before 7,123 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.
- Down 83-78 after a pair of free throws from junior **Myles Rigsby** with 49 seconds remaining, K-State was able to pull out the improbable victory behind the heroics of junior **P.J. Haggerty** and sophomore **David Castillo**, who combined for the final 6 points.
- Haggerty connected on 2 free throws before a successful coach's challenge reversed an out of bounds play leading to a jumper by Haggerty that closed it to 83-82 with 31 seconds. Senior **Khamari McGriff** stole the ball on the next possession, leading to the game-winning layup by Castillo with 18 seconds.
- Tulsa (3-1) had two chances in the final seconds to escape with victory, but senior **Miles Barnstable** missed a 3-pointer with 7 seconds, then after a second coach's challenge reversed another out of bounds call this time in favor of the Golden Hurricane, graduate **David Green** missed a jumper and senior **C.J. Jones** was able to corral the rebound as the clock expired.
- Haggerty finished the night with 31 points on 10-of-17 field goals and 11-of-12 free throws to go with a game-high 10 rebounds, 3 assists and 2 steals in 32 minutes. He is the first Wildcat with a 30-point, 10-rebound performance since **Michael Beasley** registered 33 points and 14 rebounds against Colorado on March 4, 2008. He scored 27 of his game-high 31 points in the second half, which the fifth-most by any Wildcat in a half and the most since 2009.
- Haggerty was joined in double figures by McGriff, who narrowly missed his own double-double with 13 points and 9 rebounds, while Castillo and junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** added 12 and 10 points, respectively.
- K-State entered averaging 96.7 points on 58.7 percent shooting, including 54.4 percent from 3-point range, but scored its 84 points in a different way with lows in field goal percentage (44.1) and 3-point field goal percentage (20.8).
- The Wildcats shot 56.8 percent (25-of-44) inside the 3-point arc with 46 points in the paint to go with 26 fast-break points and a 17-15 edge in second-chance points while out-rebounding the nationally-ranked Hurricane, 40-38. They also converted on their opportunities from the free throw line, hitting on a season-best 90.5 percent (19-of-21).
