TEAM NOTES

- Mississippi State has reached the NCAA Regionals in every season under head coach **Dusty Smith**, excluding the canceled 2020 season. The six-year run is the longest streak in school history.
- MSU set a school record for the lowest season-opening round at the Visit Knoxville Collegiate (274) last year. At the time, it was the sixth-lowest team round in school history.
- State totaled 827 at the 2023 Visit Knoxville Collegiate, which is the fifth-lowest 54-hole team total in program history.
- Hunter Logan** won last year's Visit Knoxville Collegiate for State, firing a 54-hole total of 199 that ranked fifth in program history.
- Eight of the 12 lowest team rounds in program history have come during **Smith's** seven seasons as the head coach.
- A victory would give **Smith** six tournament titles. He currently ranks fourth among Bulldog head coaches. Greg Martin and Ronnie Moore are tied for second with eight career wins.
- State signed a four freshmen and two transfers this offseason. Both transfers won conference titles at their previous schools.
- The top three finishes by an individual at an NCAA Regional in program history have come in just the last two years. **Garrett Endicott** posted the best such finish last year when he tied for fourth.
- Endicott** missed out on advancing to the NCAA Championships as an individual after a five-hole playoff.
