MSU Earns Program's 14th NCAA Round Of 16 Berth

Mississippi State's men's tennis team, currently ranked No. 7 nationally with a 24-3 overall record, returns to the NCAA Championship Round of 16 for the 14th time in school history, the sixth time since the NCAA field expanded to 64 teams in 1999, and the third time in the last four years.

MSU's appearance in this year's NCAA Team Championship marks the 28th appearance overall in the NCAAs, the 24th since the event adopted its current dual match format in 1977.

State qualified for the NCAA Championship 15 consecutive seasons (1991-2005) and now nine-straight times (2011-19), making 14 Round of 16 showings (1991-99, 2001, 2013, 2016, 2018-19), six quarterfinal appearances (1994-98, 2018), and two national semifinals (1994, 1998).

Bulldogs Host NCAA Super Regional Matchup With TCU

In the first year of the new NCAA Super Regional (Round of 16) format, the Bulldogs (as a top 8 national seed) will host the 10th-seeded and ninth-ranked TCU Horned Frogs (21-6) Saturday, May 11, at 1 p.m. CT for the right to advance to the national quarterfinals May 16 in Orlando, Fla.

The Horned Frogs advanced to the Round of 16 by taking care of business at home in the NCAA 1st and 2nd Rounds with a pair of 4-1 wins over Harvard and Arizona State in Fort Worth.

TCU has had a stellar season overall with eight Top 25 victories to their credit, three of those against Top 10 foes. One of those came over Mississippi State, a 4-1 triumph in the opening round of the 2019 ITA National Indoor Championship in Chicago on Feb. 15.

The Bulldogs and Horned Frogs have met six times in total, with the series deadlocked at 3-3. All but two of the matches have come in neutral site affairs and this Super Regional bout will be the first-ever between the teams in NCAA competition.

Both MSU and TCU have very storied histories in the NCAA Team Championship. MSU has made 24 appearances to TCU's 30. State is 29-23 in the NCAAs all-time while TCU is 37-29. Both teams' best finish in the NCAAs has been the national semifinals - MSU doing it in 1994 and 1998 while TCU did so in 1989, 1996, 2001 and 2015.

MSU Downs Alabama State/South Alabama, Moves To NCAA Round Of 16

In a dominating display of tennis, the seventh-ranked Mississippi State men's tennis team (24-3) shut out Alabama State and South Alabama in Starkville to pave the way to the program's 14th NCAA Team Championship Round of 16 berth.

The Bulldogs defeated Alabama State on May 3. State grabbed a the doubles point from the Hornets with wins at No. 1 and 2, and then got straight-set singles victories from Gregor Ramskogler, Niclas Braun and Giovanni Oradini to clinch the first round triumph.

On May 4, the Bulldogs faced South Alabama in the second round for the second year in a row. The Jaguars had upset No. 40 Tulane the previous day. After securing doubles with victories at the No. 2 and 3 spots, Trevor Foshey, Nuno Borges and Florian Broska posted straight-set triumphs to help MSU cruise to the win amidst a couple of short rain delays late in the match.

Mississippi State's History In The NCAA Team Championship

This is the 24th season Mississippi State has made the NCAA Team Championship field (28th NCAAs when including four appearances in the 1960s prior to the team format), the ninth-straight year since 2005 when a 15-year streak of making the tournament ended. MSU holds a 29-23 record in its 24 appearances (1991-2005, 2011-19).

The Bulldogs went 1-1 in their initial showing (1991),

defeating Western Athletic Conference champion New Mexico 5-3 before a 5-1 round of 16 loss to No. 2 UCLA.

During the next two seasons, MSU dropped 5-3 decisions to Notre Dame, both years in the round of 16.

The next five seasons (1994-98), State was an NCAA quarterfinalist or better.

In '94, MSU went 2-1, reaching the semifinals of the NCAAs for the first time in school history. MSU defeated Kansas 4-0 in the first round, SEC rival Georgia 4-2 in the quarterfinals, and fell to eventual champion Southern Cal 4-0 in the semis.

In 1995, MSU bested California 4-2 in first-round action before losing to eventual champion Stanford 4-0 in the quarterfinals.

In '96, the Bulldogs got a 4-1 win over Harvard before falling to host Georgia 4-0 in the quarterfinals.

1997 saw the Bulldogs down Florida 4-1 before being eliminated by Georgia once again in the quarterfinals, this time by a 4-2 count.

In 1998, State returned to the national semifinals, downing SEC foes South Carolina and Auburn 4-0 before falling to eventual champion Stanford by that score in the semis. That season, the Cardinal was considered by many to be college tennis' best team ever.

In 1999, the first year to exhibit a 64-team field, MSU went 2-1. State went 2-0 in Knoxville, Tenn., in the first and second rounds, the only #2 seed not hosting a regional to advance to the round of 16. In Athens, State fell 4-2 to arch-rival Ole Miss.

State's "Sweet Sixteen" presence was denied in 2000 for the first time in 10 seasons. MSU opened the tournament with a 4-3 first-round victory over Louisville before bowing out in a tight 4-2 loss to host Baylor in Waco.

MSU returned to the round of 16 for the 10th time in 11 years in 2001, downing Middle Tennessee 4-0 and upsetting host Illinois 4-2 in Champaign, Ill., to advance back to the final site once again. The SMU Mustangs then handed the Bulldogs a 4-2 setback in Athens.

In 2002, State fell in the second round. After downing South Alabama 4-1 in the opening match, the Bulldogs fell to host Auburn in the second 4-0.

The 2003 tournament saw MSU become a first-round vic-

tim of Pepperdine, dropping a 4-1 decision to the favored Waves.

MSU downed a solid Wake Forest team 4-2 in the first round in 2004 before coming just points away from upsetting host Virginia, the No. 9 seed overall, in Charlottesville, falling 4-2 to the Cavaliers.

In 2005, the Bulldogs met up with an underrated VCU squad in Durham, N.C., falling to the Rams 4-2 in a hard-fought affair.

2011 brought the return to the NCAA field for MSU for the first time in six years, while barely missing a return to the Round of 16. After defeating Florida State 4-0 in the opener, the Bulldogs fell 4-1 in a close match to host Georgia Tech in the second round.

In 2012, MSU earned NCAA First and Second Round hosting rights for the first time in school history. MSU easily dispatched the Alcorn State Braves 4-0 in the first round. In second round action, State and Baylor went down to the wire, with the Bears pulling out a 4-3 victory.

In 2013, MSU finally made its long-awaited return to the Round of 16. Hosting for the second-straight season, the Bulldogs dispatched Austin Peay, 4-0, setting up a second-round match against Harvard. State found little resistance from the Crimson, notching a 4-1 victory to advance to the Round of 16 for the first time since 2001, the 11th time in history. MSU would fall there to No. 7 seed Tennessee, 4-2.

In 2014, State headed to Austin, Texas, for its fourth-straight NCAA Championship appearance. State ousted Louisiana-Lafayette, 4-0, in the first round, but fell in a 4-1 decision to No. 9 seed Texas in the second round.

State took a trip to Chapel Hill, N.C., in 2015. The Bulldogs edged No. 50 Denver, 4-3, to earn their fifth straight opening round victory. In the second round, MSU would fall to host and No. 13 seed North Carolina, 4-1.

In 2016, the Bulldogs clinched their 12th NCAA Championship Round of 16 appearance after the Maroon & White downed Memphis 4-1 and then dominated No. 15 host Illinois 4-0 in Champaign. For the second-consecutive season, however, the Bulldogs' run would be halted by North Carolina, as State fell 4-0 to the third-ranked Tar Heels in Tulsa, Okla.

Two years ago, State went 1-1 while competing in Norman, Okla. The Bulldogs shut out SMU 4-0 in their opener before falling in a tough 4-1 decision to 14th-ranked host Oklahoma.

Last season, State returned to the NCAA quarterfinals for the first time in 20 years as the No. 6 national seed. The Bulldogs opened action by blanking Tennessee Tech and South Alabama (both 4-0) in Starkville. MSU then ousted Texas (4-1) in the Round of 16 indoors in Chapel Hill, N.C., before being edged by No. 3 Ohio State 4-3 in the quarterfinals in Winston-Salem, N.C.

This season, the Bulldogs entered NCAA postseason play on fire, after State claimed its second-straight SEC Tournament Championship. State has won 24 matches this season, one shy of tying the program record (25, 1979).

The seventh-ranked Bulldogs earned the No. 7 national seed and hosted the 1st & 2nd Rounds, downing Alabama State and South Alabama to return to the NCAA Championship Round of 16 for the 14th time in program history (fourth in the last seven years). The Bulldogs will face 10th-seeded and ninth-ranked TCU in the Round of 16 Saturday, May 11.

State Versus The 2019 NCAA Field

Prior to the 2019 NCAA postseason, 21 of MSU's 25 matches came against teams that are in the 2019 NCAA Team Championship. Of the 21, State had 18 wins (Alabama, Arizona, Georgia, Kentucky, Miami, Notre Dame, Oklahoma, Ole Miss, South Carolina[2], South Florida, Tennessee[2],

Texas A&M, Texas Tech, Tulane and Vanderbilt[2]) and three losses (Baylor, Florida, TCU).

Five (Baylor, Florida, Oklahoma, TCU, Tennessee) of those 21 teams join MSU in the Round of 16 this week.

Much of the reason for State's common play with NCAA teams is due to the continued strength of the Southeastern Conference in college tennis. This season, the league placed 10 of its 13 teams in the draw. Ten of MSU's 52 all-time team matches in the NCAAs have come vs. SEC teams.

Bulldogs Repeat As SEC Tournament Champions

Winning back-to-back championships at the same event is always a tall task. But that's just what Mississippi State men's tennis did in 2019.

After claiming the 2018 SEC Championship crown in Tuscaloosa,

Ala., the Bulldogs successfully defended their crown this year in Gainesville, Fla., with three wins in three days to take the title.

As the No. 2 seed for the second-straight year, State received a double-bye and began action Friday, April 19, against No. 10 seed and 36th-ranked Vanderbilt. The Commodores put up a strong fight, taking doubles and pushing five singles matches to third sets. But State buckled down when it mattered to pull out a 4-2 quarterfinal round victory.

The next day in the semifinals against No. 22 and sixth-seeded South Carolina, State once again dropped the doubles point and this time dropped three first sets to give the Gamecocks the early edge. But the Bulldogs showed their tenacity for a second-straight 4-2 triumph, this

one sending them to the SEC finals for the third consecutive year.

There they faced 13th-ranked Tennessee, which had upset top seed host Florida in the semis. This time around, State had little trouble in doubles, cruising to a 1-0 lead and taking three of the first four singles matches complete for a 4-1 victory. Senior Nuno Borges provided the match-clincher with his 23rd-straight win at No. 1, propelling MSU to its second-consecutive league tournament title.

Borges' 3-0 mark in the event garnered him SEC Tournament MVP honors, while he and classmate Niclas Braun (5-0 on the weekend) were both named All-Tournament.

Borges Named SEC Player of The Year For Record Third Time: Four Bulldogs Earn All-SEC

Senior and top-ranked Nuno Borges has simply been dominant for the Maroon & White all season, earning an amazing 31-2 singles record while becoming the first Bulldog ever to go undefeated during the dual match regular season (20-0). Borges' efforts were rewarded when the league office announced him as the 2019 SEC Player of the Year, becoming the first player in league history to win the award three times.

Borges was also named the SEC's Scholar-Athlete of the Year for men's tennis for the second year in a row. A member of the All-SEC First Team, he headlined MSU's dominance.

Joining Borges on the All-SEC First Team was junior Giovanni Oradini and senior Strahinja Rakic, each having outstanding seasons of their own. Oradini was 12-5 in SEC play overall this spring and is ranked No. 61 in singles and 32nd in doubles. Rakic went 15-6 in league matches. He is ranked No. 3 nationally in doubles with Borges entering the NCAAs.

Rounding out State's SEC player honors, senior Niclas Braun garnered Second Team All-SEC laurels for the third year in a row. Braun has been a stalwart in the MSU lineup during his career. This season, he is a combined 51-16 in all matches, 30-6 in dual match competition, 14-4 in the SEC.

Bulldogs Seventh In Latest National Rankings; Borges No. 1 In Singles; Borges/Rakic No. 3 In Doubles;

Mississippi State's men's tennis team is ranked No. 7 nationally in the latest *Oracle/Intercollegiate Tennis Association National Rankings*, released May 1. MSU has been among the top 10 for the entire 2019 season. MSU started the season 3rd, their highest of the season, and the highest for the program since 1999.

On the individual level, State currently has two singles players and two doubles teams ranked nationally.

In singles, Nuno Borges is the nation's No. 1-ranked player for the first time in his career. Giovanni Oradini is 61st.

In doubles, Borges and Rakic are the nation's third-ranked tandem. Niclas Braun and Oradini are 32nd as a tandem.

A Look Back At The 2019 Season...

With all six starters returning from a 2018 season that was Mississippi State's best since 1998 - reaching the NCAA quarterfinals and capturing an SEC Tournament title - expectations were higher than ever for Matt Roberts' fifth year at the helm. The Bulldogs have lived up to the hype, staying in the top 10 nationally the entire season, ranked as high as third.

State has won 24 matches entering the Round of 16, the most by an MSU team since 1979. The Bulldogs' 22 wins entering NCAA play was the most in program history. MSU also went 11-1 in SEC play and finished second in the league for the second year in a row, including ending the regular season on a season-long nine-match winning streak. The Bulldogs rode that momentum into the SEC Championship in Gainesville, Fla., battling back from down 1-0 in their first two matches to make a third-straight appearance in the tourney final before successfully defending 2018's title.

MSU began the season with a pair of wins at home as part of 2019 ITA Kick-Off Weekend, blanking Wichita State 4-0 and ousting Arizona 4-1 to advance to the ITA National Team Indoor Championship for the 12th time ever. A week later, MSU welcomed Miami and South Florida to Starkville. The Bulldogs stormed past both squads, defeating the Hurricanes 4-1 and the Bulls 6-1.

The Bulldogs then traveled to Lubbock, Texas, to meet a pair of strong teams in Texas Tech and No. 19 Tulane. Despite being forced indoors due to high winds and cold weather, State responded to hold off a resurgent Red Raiders squad for a 4-2 win. The next day, MSU notched a 4-1 win against then-19th-ranked Tulane. Those two indoor matches served as good preparation for State's trip to Chicago and the ITA National Team Indoors.

Making its 12th appearance in the prestigious 16-team field, MSU squared off against three top-15 foes. The Bulldogs started off by taking doubles against No. 15 TCU, but the Horned Frogs rallied with four singles wins to take a 4-1 win in the first round. In its first consolation match, State's NCAA-best 18-match doubles point streak was snapped on a tiebreaker against No. 9 Baylor, but Nuno Borges evened up the score at 1-all with a straight-set win. However, the Bears picked up three tight wins for a 4-1 victory. In its final match in Chicago, State finished on a strong note, picking up a 4-2 triumph over No. 11 Notre Dame.

State's final non-conference battle came in a neutral-site showdown, taking a 4-2 victory over No. 21 Oklahoma in Orlando, Fla., at the USTA

National Campus - the final site of the 2019 NCAA Championships. The Bulldogs and Sooners battled to 2-all before rookie Gregor Ramskogler and Borges notched three-set triumphs for the victory.

To start March, MSU began conference play in dominant fashion, sweeping Vanderbilt and Kentucky, 7-0, on back-to-back days.

The Bulldogs would hit some adversity in the second week of conference play, having to battle the weather and a pair of tough top-30 foes. State would begin its match at South Carolina on March 8, taking an exciting doubles point before having the match halted midway through singles due to heavy rain. Hopes of continuing the match the following morning dwindled due to persistent overnight rain, forcing the resumption of the match to Monday morning after MSU returned to Columbia from its match at No. 10 Florida. In Gainesville, State took doubles again, but the Gators rattled off four singles wins to clinch the match and take a 5-2 decision over the Bulldogs, which was State's last loss this season.

Upon returning to Columbia on Monday to finish the match against the Gamecocks, MSU had to fend off a feisty Carolina squad that forced four matches to third sets. Nuno Borges was victorious in a third-set tie-breaker, saving a match point after dropping his first set to Paul Jubb - the only set he would surrender in SEC play in 2019. USC knotted it up at 3-all with a tight win on court 2, but Niclas Braun came up clutch with third-set magic of his own, taking a tiebreaker to clinch a 4-3 MSU victory.

That victory would start the 14-match win streak the Bulldogs are currently on.

The streak continued when the Bulldogs took a 4-1 decision at home over No. 18 Alabama before heading down to Auburn to cruise past the Tigers in a 4-0 sweep.

State then returned home for two more key conference bouts against top 25 foes March 22 & 24. In Friday's contest, the Bulldogs held off No. 19 Tennessee for a 4-3 win on Friday behind another clutch match-clincher from Niclas Braun - his fifth in a row. Down a break 4-2 in the third, the senior surged back by winning 14 points in a row - and 16 of the final 18 - to propel State past the Vols. On Sunday vs. perennial power and No. 22 Georgia, the Athens-based Bulldogs took doubles before MSU went up 2-1 with quick wins by Borges and Strahinja Rakic. UGA responded to go up 3-2, needing only one point to clinch with two courts still in play. The tables turned, however, when UGA's Philip Henning suffered an untimely ankle injury in the third set - up 5-2, 30-love over Trevor Foshey - but played through the pain. Foshey won the next five games to clinch the match as, during that time, Giovanni Oradini posted the highest-ranked victory of his year with a three-set upset over No. 13 Jan Zielinski.

MSU next trekked to Fayetteville, Ark., to take on No. 38 Arkansas indoors. Despite Oradini being removed from the lineup just before doubles due to injury, the Bulldogs still claimed doubles and four first sets en route to a 5-2 victory.

To conclude its home slate, State trounced 25th-ranked in-state rival Ole Miss 6-1 on Senior Day after honoring its four seniors - Borges, Braun, Foshey and Rakic - before the match. In the Apr. 5 victory, all four seniors contributed by capturing straight-set singles wins over the Rebels.

The seventh-ranked Bulldogs - now 17-3, 9-1 in the SEC - then headed into a match at No. 8 Texas A&M (also 9-1 SEC) the next Friday that would ultimately decide two of the top three seeds in the SEC Championship.



Mississippi State Men's Tennis Notes



2019 NCAA Division I Men's Tennis Championships (Round of 16)

May 11, 2019 — Mississippi State University — Starkville, Miss.

State came out firing and took a dominant doubles point before claiming four first sets in singles. That momentum continued, as MSU built a quick 3-0 lead with straight-set victories by Borges and Florian Broska at the top and bottom of the lineup. The Aggies got on the board with what would be their lone point - a three-set decision on court 3, but it was too little too late. On court 5, last season's hero against the Aggies in the SEC Tournament final - Trevor Foshey - battled back from a break down in the third to force a tiebreaker. The senior would go on to snag another victory against the Aggies, dominating the tiebreaker to clinch a 6-1 statement win in College Station. To close out conference play, the Bulldogs posted another dominant performance in a 4-0 sweep at LSU.

SEC Championship action began in Gainesville, Fla., on Apr. 19 with No. 6 and second-seeded MSU opening with a tough 4-2 victory over 10th-seeded Vanderbilt in the quarterfinals. After uncharacteristically dropping the doubles point to the Commodores, the Bulldogs picked up three wins in a row to go up 3-1. Vandy cut the deficit to 3-2, but Braun clinched State's fifth straight appearance in the tournament semifinals.

There, the Maroon and White took on a confident South Carolina team that had upset third-seeded Texas A&M the day before. MSU dropped doubles for the second day in a row, while both teams took three first sets in singles. State took the lead for good, however, when Foshey and Braun notched straight-set wins. Borges also battled back after dropping his first set to take a 4-6, 6-3, 6-1 victory over No. 6 Jubb to put his team up 3-1. Carolina cut it to 3-2 with a three-set win on court 3, but Saturday's hero would be senior Strahinja Rakic with a three-set triumph on court 3 to hand MSU its third straight SEC Tournament final.

In the final against fourth-seeded Tennessee, which was riding high after upsetting SEC regular-season champion and No. 4 host Florida in the semifinals, State squashed that momentum by taking 6-2 victories on courts 2 and 3 to go up 1-0 early. MSU went on to take four first sets in singles. The Vols knotted it up at 1-all with a win on court 6, but that would be all she wrote, as State rattled off two straight-setters at Nos. 3 and 5 to go up 3-1 with Borges up a break at 5-3 in the third on court 1 after dropping his first set to No. 28 Timo Stodder. The second-ranked Borges built a 15-40 lead with Stodder serving and a forehand shot by Stodder fell wide, moving Borges past the Tennessee All-American and catapulting the Bulldogs into Mississippi State Athletics lore as the only program in school history to earn back-to-back SEC Tournament crowns.

MSU then hosted the 2019 NCAA Team Championship First and Second Rounds for the second year in a row, downing Alabama State 4-0 in the opener. In the second round, State once again secured a 4-0 victory against South Alabama, ousting the Jaguars in the second round for the second year in a row to advance to the Round of 16 for the third time in four seasons and the second year in a row.

There, the Bulldogs will host ninth-ranked TCU, which earned the No. 10 national seed in the tourney, in the first-ever NCAA Men's Tennis Super Regional format. MSU looks to avenge its loss to the Horned Frogs from earlier in the season. Should the Bulldogs advance, they will travel to the USTA National Campus in Orlando, Florida, to take on either No. 2 Texas or No. 24 Cal in the NCAA Quarterfinals on May 16.

Borges and Daniel Courcol are the only Bulldogs to ever hold No. 1 national rankings in both singles and doubles during a career and Laurent Miquelard is the only MSU player to ever hold the No. 1 national doubles ranking with two different partners.

MSU In The 2019 NCAA Individual Championships

The Mississippi State Bulldogs will be sending four players to the 2019 NCAA Individual Championships in Orlando, Fla., later this month. It marks the ninth-straight season State has had at least one representative in the NCAA Individual Championships and the 34th year all-time.

Nuno Borges earned a third-straight NCAA Singles bid in 2019 after an absolutely incredible season on the court. Debuting at No. 1 nationally for the first time in his career in the May 1 ITA Rankings, he also earned the No. 1 seed in the 2019 NCAA Singles Championship (the third Bulldog ever to do so, joining Thomas Dupre (1997) and Marco Baron (2001)). As such, he will earn ITA All-American honors for the third year in a row. He is the only Bulldog to earn a Top 4 NCAA Singles seed three times.

The senior, who became the first MSU player ever to reach the NCAA Singles semifinals in 2017, repeated that result in 2018. He also earned SEC Player of the Year honors for an unprecedented third consecutive season in 2019. He has compiled an incredible 31-2 record this season and is riding an amazing 25-match win streak after two rounds of NCAAs.

In doubles, Borges and senior Strahinja Rakic will represent State in the NCAA Doubles Championship for the second-straight year after becoming the first MSU pair ever earn the No. 1 seed a year ago. As the No. 3 seed this season, both players will once again earn All-America status in doubles.

The tandem picked up right where they left off from their NCAA Doubles quarterfinal run a year ago, holding a 21-9 overall mark in 2018-19. This spring, the duo has anchored the No. 1 position with a 16-6 ledger (9-2 SEC). Together, Borges and Rakic hold the most wins by a doubles pair in program history with 55.

Niclas Braun and doubles partner Giovanni Oradini (ranked 32nd at present) received an at-large bid to the NCAA Doubles field. The pair has been outstanding this season, holding a team-best 28-7 overall record (16-2 in dual matches). The duo is also steadily climbing up the charts for wins by an MSU doubles pair, ranking third all-time with 46.

Finally, Oradini, who earned his first career bid to the NCAA Singles draw in 2018 and capitalized on it by advancing to the Round of 16 to earn All-America status, is in that field for the second year in a row. Ranked 61st nationally at present, Oradini is 18-11 in singles overall. Oradini earned All-SEC First Team honors for the second year in a row.

Roberts Quickly Establishing Himself As One Of Nation's Top Collegiate Coaches

After joining the MSU Men's Tennis program as an assistant coach in 2013, Matt Roberts established himself as one of the nation's top assistants. Since moving into his role as State's head coach, he has rapidly begun to do the same as the Bulldogs' fifth-year mentor.

This season, Roberts has led the Maroon and White to a second-straight SEC Tournament title and a remarkable 24-3 overall record. The 24 wins are one shy of matching the program record of 25 (25-2, 1979).

Roberts has already reached the 100-win mark in his brief head coaching tenure and continues to climb up the State record books. He already sits third in program history for wins by a Bulldog mentor (106) and his winning percentage (76.8%) at present has him in second place all-time at MSU.

Roberts is an impressive 106-32 (76.8%) in his five seasons, including a remarkable 46-13 (78.0%) record in SEC play, with the Bulldogs finishing in the top 5 in the toughest league in the nation every one of his seasons.

In addition, the Bulldogs have gradually climbed in the final national rankings, finishing 23rd in 2015, 19th in 2016, 18th in 2017, and 5th last season. State currently sits at No. 7 nationally.

In his first season in Starkville as an assistant (2013), he helped Per Nilsson guide MSU to its first NCAA Round of 16 showing in 12 years, as the Bulldogs finished ranked 11th nationally.

A year later, Roberts was named ITA Southern Region Assistant Coach of the Year and, the following year, he took over the reins of the Bulldog program and continued the success built by Nilsson.

Just two seasons into his tenure as the Bulldogs' skipper, Roberts became the fastest MSU coach to reach the NCAA Round of 16, doing so in 2016.

Last year, Roberts was named SEC Coach of the Year after guiding the Maroon and White to a stellar 23-3 mark that included State's first SEC tournament title since 1996 and its first trip to the NCAA quarterfinals since 1998. He became the first since Nilsson in 2011 to earn the SEC accolade, and the fifth Bulldog head coach to do so in program history.

On the individual level, State has been just as successful during Roberts' time at MSU. He has mentored four All-Americans and 10 All-SEC players in his seven seasons as assistant and head coach.

Dogs Prove To Be Doubly-Tough

Since the current 3-6 dual match format went into effect at the beginning of the 1993 season, MSU has been solid in showing its ability to claim the crucial opening doubles point.

MSU has claimed the opening doubles point 369 times in 641 matches (57.6%) over the past 27 seasons.

As expected, MSU's success rate has been high when it wins the doubles point, having posted a 299-70 (81.0%) record when it does so, 166-16 (91.2%) at home.

State is 21-2 this season when claiming the doubles point, 11-0 at home. MSU has won 25 straight matches at home when taking doubles, dating back to March 25, 2016, in a tight 4-3 setback to Florida.

MSU DOUBLES POINT PROWESS (STATE'S RECORD WHEN TAKING THE DOUBLES POINT)

MSU has taken the opening doubles point 369 times in 641 matches since the 3-6 dual match format began in 1993. When taking the doubles point, MSU is 299-70 (81.0%) overall. State has snagged the doubles point 182 times in 275 matches at home and is 166-16 (91.2%) when it has done so.

GENERAL NOTES

- Mississippi State holds an impressive 24-3 overall record in 2019, while going 11-1 in the powerful Southeastern Conference (finishing 2nd). The Bulldogs won the 2019 SEC Tournament title (the second year in a row), defeating Vanderbilt, No. 2 South Carolina and No. 13 Tennessee.
- State opened the season ranked No. 3 nationally and is currently No. 7 in the nation. MSU has been among the nation's top 10 the entire 2019 campaign.

NCAA NOTES

- The Bulldogs are one of only 16 teams to have been selected for the NCAA Team Championship field in at least 24 of the last 29 seasons (1991-2019). Six of those teams are SEC members.
- State is the No. 7 national seed in this year's NCAAs, top 8 for the second year in a row (6 in '18).
- MSU is 29-23 in the NCAA Team Championship in its 24 (1991-2005, 2011-19) appearances. State made four trips to the NCAAs under legendary head coach Tom Sawyer when it was a flighted individual draw. MSU finished 8th in 1965, t3rd in both 1966 and 1967, and t13th in 1968.
- State is one of only 15 teams in the nation to have reached the Round of 16 at the NCAAs in 14 of the last 29 years (1991-2019). MSU made 10 Round of 16 showings in an 11-year span (1991-2001) and has now returned in four of the last seven years (2013, 2016, 2018-19).
- The Bulldogs have reached the quarterfinals of the NCAA Team Championship six times (1994-98 & 2018), including program-best semifinal showings in 1994 and 1998.

- Nuno Borges, Niclas Braun, Giovanni Oradini and Strahinja Rakic earned bids to the 2019 NCAA Individual Championships. Borges and Rakic claimed automatic bids in singles and doubles. Borges earned the No. 1 national seed in singles. He and Rakic earned the No. 3 national seed in doubles. Braun and Oradini were an at-large selection in doubles. Oradini was moved into the singles field on May 7 after being named first alternate on April 30.

SEC NOTES

- MSU won the 2019 SEC Tournament crown (Gainesville, Fla.), ousting 13th-ranked Tennessee 4-1 in the title match to defend its 2018 crown (Tuscaloosa, Ala.).
- State finished regular season SEC play with a remarkable 11-1 record, the only setback at No. 10 Florida. It was the ninth-straight season MSU had a .500 or better record in conference play and the second year in a row MSU was 11-1 in league action.
- Four Bulldogs earned 2019 All-SEC honors - Nuno Borges, Giovanni Oradini, Strahinja Rakic (First Team), Niclas Braun (Second Team). Borges was named SEC Player of the Year for an unprecedented third year in a row and was also named SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year for the second time.
- Nuno Borges was named the 2019 SEC Tournament MVP after clinching MSU's 4-1 win over No. 13 Tennessee in the title match. He was the second Bulldog to receive the honor in as many years (Trevor Foshey, 2018). Niclas Braun joined Borges on the SEC All-Tournament Team.
