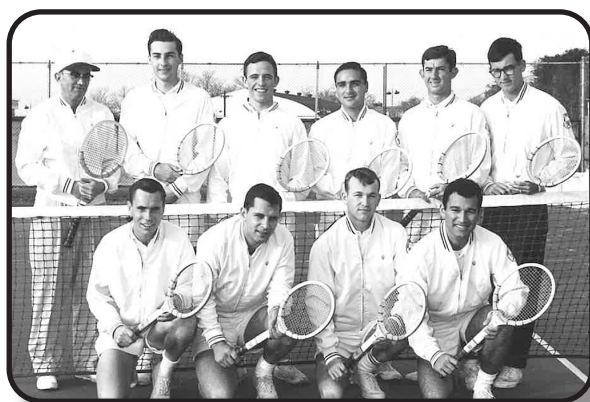

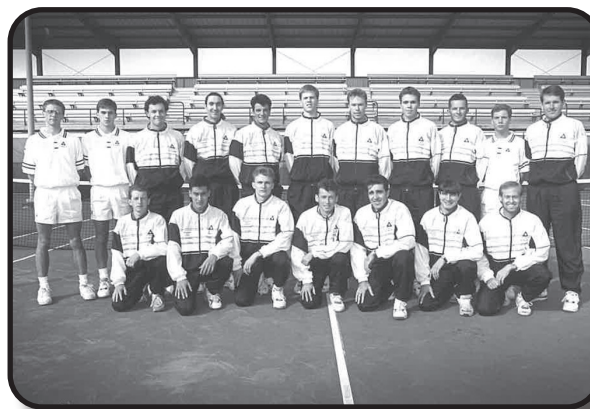

## MSU IN MAJOR COLLEGIATE EVENTS

Members of Mississippi State's men's tennis teams have had their share of success in college's major championships. From 1986 until 2001, there were four major events that constituted the Collegiate "Grand Slam" each academic year—the National Clay Court Championships in September, the All-American Hardcourt Championships in October, the National Indoor Championships in February and concluding with the NCAA Individual Championships in May. The Clay Courts and National Indoors were later disbanded but, in 2017, the ITA National Fall Championships were initiated and State All-American Nuno Borges claimed the singles title that year. Each of the tournaments features a singles and doubles draw. The majors officially began in 1986.

In the major events held during the past 31 seasons (since Fall

1992), members of MSU's nationally-ranked teams have captured 10 (seven singles, three doubles) of the possible titles at those events, which ranks among the nation's best.

MSU's most successful season in the majors was 1992-93 when former Bulldog All-Americans Daniel Courcol and Laurent Miquelard won a combined four titles. Courcol's four overall titles that season were unprecedented in college tennis history. Prior to Borges' win at the Oracle in 2017, State's most recent crowns came in the fall of 1996 at the National Clay and Hardcourt Championships, when Thomas Dupré beat MSU teammate Matthieu Ballay for the singles title of both of those events, also an unprecedented feat.

Below is a listing of MSU players who have placed in the Round of 16 or better at each of the major college events since 1986.

## 1965 - LOS ANGELES, CALIF. - 8TH PLACE

### 13-1 OVERALL - SEC CHAMPIONS

Mississippi State's first-ever appearance in the NCAA Championship as a team came in 1965 under legendary head coach Tom Sawyer. The '65 squad, which claimed MSU's first-ever SEC title, would be the first of four straight Bulldog teams to compete in the national championship.

Though new to the tournament, the Bulldogs managed an eighth place finish, spurred by all-American Bobby Brien. Brien reached the singles round of 16 and teamed with Graham Primrose to make the quarterfinals in doubles. UCLA's Arthur Ashe was the spoiler for State in both matches, teaming with Ian Crookenden in doubles.

## 1966 - CORAL GABLES, FLA. - T-3RD PLACE

### 12-2 OVERALL

Sawyer guides the Bulldogs to an improvement upon their eighth place finish in '65, tying for third at the national championship.

All-American Bobby Brien again leads MSU, winning four matches to reach the quarterfinals of the singles tournament. All-SEC selections Tito Echiburu and John Edmond make the third round to help the cause.

In doubles, State place two teams in the round of 16—Echiburu and Hugh Thomson and Brien and Edmond.

## 1967 - CARBONDALE, ILL. - T-3RD PLACE

### 18-4 OVERALL - SEC CHAMPIONS

The Bulldogs match their tie for third in 1966 with another outstanding tournament following the second SEC crown in three years.

All-American Bobby Brien returns to the singles quarterfinals of the national championship. John Edmond makes the third round, and Gary Hockey and Hugh Thomson advance to the second round. All four are named all-SEC.

In doubles, Brien and Edmond team to make the quarterfinals.

## 1968 - SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS - T-13TH PLACE

### 16-0 OVERALL

The final of four consecutive trips to the NAAs for the Bulldogs.

Following a perfect record during the regular season, State has three players advance to the third round of the national championship in all-SEC stars Rob Cadwallader, John Edmond and Hugh Thomson.

Cadwallader and Glen Grisillo team to reach the third round in doubles, while Edmond and Thomson make the second round.

## 1991 - ATHENS, GA. - ROUND OF 16

### 17-12 (5-7) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 20TH

The first of State's appearances in the national championship under the team format adopted in 1977 and also the first of nine straight showings under young head coach Andy Jackson.

No. 18 MSU downs New Mexico 5-3 in its first NCAA match under the team format before falling to second-ranked and eventual national champion UCL 5-1 in the round of 16.

In the individual championships, Daniel Courcol and Christophe Damiens reach the quarterfinals in doubles and are named all-America.

## 1992 - ATHENS, GA. - ROUND OF 16

### 19-6 (9-3) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 9TH

The Bulldogs return to the NCAA Championship after posting the most wins in a season since 1979 and claiming the SEC regular season title.

Entering the tournament ranked sixth nationally, the favored Bulldogs are upset by No. 10 Notre Dame 5-3.

## 1993 - ATHENS, GA. - ROUND OF 16

19-7 (12-2) - SEC CHAMPIONS - FINAL ITA RANKING: 7TH

MSU matches its win total from the previous year and posts a remarkable 11-1 mark to claim the SEC regular season title for the second year in a row. State ties Georgia for the overall league championship.

Unfortunately for the Bulldogs, the luck of the Irish continues, as MSU draws Notre Dame for the second time in as many years. ND, who would reach the finals, upsets MSU by the exact same score as in 1992, 5-3.

## 1994 - SOUTH BEND, IND. - SEMIFINALS

21-7 (10-4) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 3RD

The breakthrough year for the modern era of Mississippi State tennis, as the Bulldogs had the best all-around tournament in their history.

After nearly claiming a second straight SEC crown, State enters the NCAA Championship ranked third in the country, the highest since 1967.

The Irish charm was in State's favor this season, as the Bulldogs posted convincing wins over Kansas (4-0) and SEC rival Georgia (4-2) to advance to the national semifinals for the first time. MSU faced top-ranked Southern Cal in the semis, falling to the eventual champion Trojans 4-0.

The run to the semis seemed to inspire State on the individual level.

The obvious highlight was the story of Paris, France native, Laurent Miquelard, teaming with Tulsa, Oklahoma product, Joc Simmons to claim the NCAA doubles title and gain all-America honors.

Simmons and Laurent Orsini both reached the quarterfinals in singles action to earn the all-America label in that category as well.

## 1995 - ATHENS, GA. - QUARTERFINALS

19-7 (10-3) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 6TH

MSU continues a run of five straight quarterfinal-or-better appearances at the national championship.

The Bulldogs, ranked seventh entering the tournament, down California 4-2, but drew top-ranked and eventual champion Stanford in the quarters, falling to the Cardinal's 4-0.

## 1996 - ATHENS, GA. - QUARTERFINALS

20-6 (11-4) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 8TH

State gets back to the national quarterfinals once again, this time following the claiming of the SEC Tournament championship.

Ranked ninth going in, MSU draws Harvard in the round of 16, downing the Crimson 4-1. But the Bulldogs would draw old nemesis and NCAA host Georgia in the quarters, dropping a 4-0 decision there.

## 1997 - LOS ANGELES, CALIF. - QUARTERFINALS

17-6 (8-4) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 6TH

The Bulldogs continue their NCAA quarterfinal streak, meeting two SEC foes in the tournament.

State downs Florida 4-1 in the round of 16, but is eliminated from the draw by Georgia for the second year in a row, 4-2.

## 1998 - ATHENS, GA. - SEMIFINALS

21-5 (10-4) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 4TH

With what could possibly have been the best Bulldog team ever assembled, State reaches the NCAA semifinals for the second time.

Three All-Americans (Thomas Dupré, Matthieu Ballay and Simon Larose) and one which will garner that award a year later (Marco Baron) grace the MSU lineup.

MSU blanks SEC members South Carolina and Auburn 4-0 in the round of 16 and quarterfinals to set up a showdown with No. 1 Stanford.

Unfortunately for State, while 1998 may have been MSU's best team ever, it also produced what many consider the best team to ever play the collegiate game in Stanford, and the Cardinal handed MSU a 4-0 defeat.

Individually, Dupré makes the singles quarterfinals.

## 1999 - KNOXVILLE, TENN./ATHENS, GA. - ROUND OF 16

13-12 (5-7) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 15TH

Injuries plague State for most of the season, but the Bulldogs make an inspired run at the end of the season to get into the NCAA Championship, which is now in its first year of a 64-team bracketed draw. The five previous seasons, regionals are held, but State is named a top eight seed all five years and does not have to play in regional action.

After winning their last three regular season matches to secure a spot in the NAAs, the Bulldogs travel to Knoxville for first- and second-round competition. State downs Purdue 4-1 and then tackles host Tennessee in a dramatic 4-3 effort to advance to the round of 16 for the ninth year in a row.

MSU draws arch-rival Mississippi for the first time ever at the national championship, but falls in a close 4-2 decision to the Rebels.

## 2000 - WACO, TEXAS - SECOND ROUND

12-8 (6-5) - Final ITA Ranking: 22nd

The Bulldogs extend their streak of NCAA appearances to 10 consecutive, one of only nine schools in the country to claim that distinction.

MSU opens the tournament with a 4-3 win over Louisville, but State drops a tight 4-2 decision to regional host Baylor in the second round.

The loss marks the first time since 1991 that the Bulldogs do not advance to the NCAA round of 16.

Despite that streak ending, MSU does finish in the top 25 for the 12th straight season.

## 2001 - CHAMPAIGN, ILL./ATHENS, GA. - ROUND OF 16

14-11 (5-6) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 14TH

The Bulldogs opened their 11th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance in Champaign, Ill., with a 4-0 blanking of Middle Tennessee. MSU followed that with a 4-2 upset over regional host Illinois, the No. 11 seed in the NAAs overall, to head to Athens as one of only two non-top 16 seeds to make it to the final site.

MSU faced eighth-seeded Southern Methodist in the round of 16, falling to the Mustangs 4-2.

## 2002 - AUBURN, ALA. - SECOND ROUND

11-12 (3-8) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 28TH

Under the direction of first-year head coach Sylvain Guichard, MSU returns to the NAAs for the 12th consecutive season, one of only seven teams in the country to have done so.

In the first round, the Bulldogs draw South Alabama, downing the Jaguars 4-1, their second win over USA on the year.

State then draws regional host Auburn in the second round, falling to the Tigers. After claiming a tight doubles point, AU rolls on to a 4-0 victory. The loss hands State its first losing campaign since 1988.

## 2003 - NASHVILLE, TENN. - FIRST ROUND

8-13 (4-7) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 42ND

MSU extends its string of NCAA appearances to 13 straight seasons, remaining one of just seven schools nationally to do so.

The Bulldogs draw an underrated Pepperdine squad in the first round at Vanderbilt and fall to the Waves 4-1.

## 2004 - CHARLOTTESVILLE, VA. - SECOND ROUND

9-14 (2-9) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 29TH

After a trying regular season, the Bulldogs rally late in the season to post some of their best wins and come very close to returning to the NCAA round of 16 for the first time since 2001.

In its 14th consecutive NCAA appearance, State opens the tournament with a 4-2 defeat of Wake Forest. MSU loses the doubles point against the Demon Deacons, but rallies to post four singles wins to win its opening-round NCAA match for the 11th time in its 14-year streak.

In the second round, MSU faced the nation's No. 6 overall seed in host Virginia, but the Bulldogs fell in a close 4-2 decision to the Cavaliers, coming within a few points of pulling the upset.

## 2005 - DURHAM, N.C. - FIRST ROUND

12-10 (6-5) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 25TH

After its most successful season in four years, State made its 15th consecutive NCAA appearance. MSU drew an underrated Virginia Commonwealth team in the first round. The Rams upset the Bulldogs in a close 4-2 affair.

## 2011 - ATLANTA, GA. - SECOND ROUND

14-9 (8-3) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 20TH

After a five year absence, Mississippi State returned to the NCAA Tournament play in the Atlanta regional, as head coach Per Nilsson picked up his first-career NCAA win, defeating Florida State in the first round, 4-0.

In the second round, State would face a tough challenge in the regional host, No. 15 Georgia Tech. The Yellow Jackets would have to hold off a late Bulldog charge to win, 4-1. Junior George Coupland represented the Bulldog's lone point in the match.

State finished with its first winning season since the 2005 campaign and the first in the Per Nilsson Era. Also, for the 14th time in the program's history the Maroon and White advanced past the first round.

## 2012 - STARKVILLE, MISS. - SECOND ROUND

20-7 (9-2) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 11TH

For the first time since the NCAA Championships expanded to regional play in 1999, Mississippi State was named a regional host. In their first round matchup, the Bulldogs easily handled the Alcorn State Braves, winning 4-0.

The second round proved to be a much more difficult task as State battled Baylor for a chance to return to the round of 16 for the first time since 2001 in a rain-soaked match. Baylor took the early lead by taking the doubles point. As singles play started, all but four first sets had been decided when play was suspended.

Play resumed inside McCarthy Gymnasium. James Chaudry and Louis Cant would claim victories to battle back against the Bears and senior George Coupland would earn a victory to tie the match, 3-3. In the deciding match, sophomore Zach White would fall in a thrilling two-tiebreak battle.

The Bulldogs put together their first 20-win season since going 21-5 in the 1998 campaign and notched their highest final ranking since that same year.

## 2013 - STARKVILLE, MISS./CHAMPAIGN, ILL. - ROUND OF 16

18-10 (6-6) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 11TH

It had been 12 years since the Mississippi State men's tennis program had reached the NCAA Round of 16, but the 2013 season brought an end to that streak.

Being named a regional host for the second-straight year, the Bulldogs dispatched the Austin Peay Governors in first-round action, 4-0. State faced 27th-ranked Harvard for a chance to advance to the Round of 16, defeating the Crimson 4-1 in a tough matchup.

Play then shifted to Champaign, Ill., for the NCAA finals where the Bulldogs returned to the Round of 16 for the first time since 2001, drawing SEC foe Tennessee. The Vols jumped out early by grabbing the doubles point. The teams traded shots in singles action, with MSU's Zach White earning a straight-set victory to bring the Bulldogs within one, down 3-2. Play came down to courts one and two, when UT's Hunter Reese fended off MSU's Malte Stropp to advance UT to the next round.

## 2014 - AUSTIN, TEXAS - SECOND ROUND

19-11 (7-5) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 19TH

For the fourth-straight season, the Bulldogs earned a postseason bid, travelling to Austin, Texas, for first round action. MSU first faced Louisiana Lafayette, dispatching the Ragin' Cajuns with a 4-0 sweep. State then took on host Texas for a trip to the Round of 16 on the line, but fell in a 4-1 decision to the Longhorns.

## 2015 - CHAPEL HILL, N.C. - SECOND ROUND

20-8 (9-3) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 23RD

Heading back to the postseason for the fifth-straight year, the Bulldogs travelled to Chapel Hill to face No. 50 Denver and No. 13 North Carolina in the NCAA First & Second Rounds. Behind a clincher from Rishab Agarwal, MSU edged Denver, 4-3. MSU fell short in the second round, falling to host UNC, 4-1.

## 2016 - CHAMPAIGN, ILL./TULSA, OKLA. - ROUND OF 16

18-9 (7-5) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 19TH

Despite having a youth-heavy squad, Mississippi State did not suffer a drop in success in 2016. The Bulldogs consistently stayed in the top 25, posted an 18-9 record and returned to the NCAA Team Championship for the 25th time in school history, and the Round of 16 for the 12th time ever.

MSU opened the 2016 NAATs by taking down familiar foe Memphis 4-1 in the first round in Champaign, Ill. In the second round, the Bulldogs matched up with favorite Illinois and MSU posted one of the bigger surprises of the tournament, shutting out the host Illini 4-0 to punch its ticket to the round of 16 in Tulsa.

There, the Bulldogs faced a rematch of their 2015 NCAA second round contest with North Carolina. The second-seeded Tar Heels would eliminate State from postseason play for the second year in a row with a 4-0 decision in Tulsa.

## 2017 - NORMAN, OKLA. - SECOND ROUND

21-9 (8-4) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 18TH

Still sporting a relatively young roster, Mississippi State still achieved great things in 2017, including the program's 26th all-time appearance in the NAATs, including a seventh-straight.

After an incredible regular season that saw the Bulldogs reel off 10 consecutive victories at one point, State started the postseason in superb fashion, reaching the finals of the SEC Championship for the first time since 1996.

In NCAA action, the Bulldogs blanked SMU 4-0 in their opener before bowing out to regional host Oklahoma in the second round.



## 2018 - STARKVILLE, MISS./WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. - QUARTERFINALS

23-3 (11-1) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 5TH

Simply put, the 2018 MSU Men's Tennis campaign was the best overall season the Bulldogs had in 20-plus years and State did it with no seniors on its roster.

Going 23-3 overall, a program-best 11-1 in the SEC, and claiming the SEC Tournament title for the first time since 1996, MSU was primed for a memorable run in the NCAA Championship and the Bulldogs did just that.

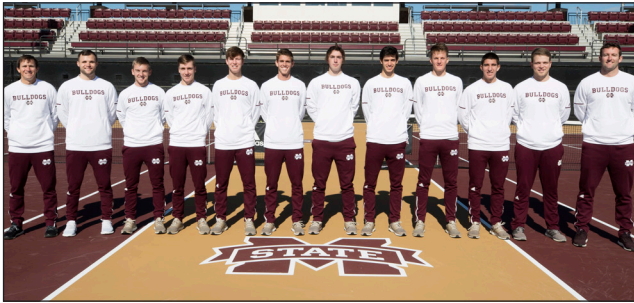
Making the program's 27th all-time NCAA appearance (eighth-straight), State earned the No. 6 national seed and hosted the 1st & 2nd Rounds of the NCAAAs for the first time since 2013. The Bulldogs had little trouble holding serve on its home courts, blanking Tennessee Tech and South Alabama 4-0 in Starkville to advance to the Round of 16 for 13th time in school history.

In the Sweet 16, State faced No. 11 seed Texas. In a tight contest (played indoors at North Carolina due to rain), MSU held off the Longhorns for a 4-1 triumph which marked the Bulldogs' first trip to the NCAA quarterfinals since 1998.

In the national quarterfinals at Wake Forest, State pushed No. 3 seed Ohio State to the brink, but fell in a heartbreaking 4-3 setback to the Buckeyes.

MSU ended the year ranked No. 5 nationally, its highest final ITA ranking since the 1998 squad ended No. 4.

Three Bulldogs - Nuno Borges, Giovanni Oradini and Strahinja Rakic - earned All-America status. Borges advanced to the NCAA Singles semifinals for the second year in a row, Oradini made the Round of 16, and Borges and Rakic made the quarterfinals in doubles.

## 2019 - STARKVILLE, MISS. - ROUND OF 16

24-4 (11-1) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 9TH

With all six starters back from 2018's NCAA quarterfinal squad, expectations were indeed high in 2019.

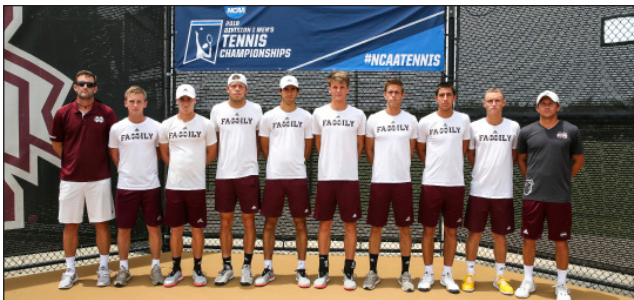
The Bulldogs notched 24 wins on the season - one shy of the program record - while successfully defending their SEC Tournament crown from the year before. MSU also compiled a remarkable 11-1 league mark once again.

NCAA appearance No. 28 (ninth-straight) saw State grab the No. 7 national seed. The Bulldogs hosted the 1st & 2nd Rounds for the second year in a row. The Bulldogs again breezed through those two rounds, shutting out Alabama State and South Alabama 4-0 in Starkville to advance to the Round of 16 for 14th time.

Under the NCAA's new Super Regional format, State hosted the Round of 16 matchup, welcoming No. 10 seed TCU to campus. In a very close contest that saw the last three matches go to third sets, the Horned Frogs upended the Bulldogs 4-2 in front of a rowdy crowd at the Pitts Tennis Centre.

MSU ended the year ranked No. 9 nationally, the ninth Top 10 finish in MSU Men's Tennis history.

Four Bulldogs - Nuno Borges, Niclas Braun, Giovanni Oradini and Strahinja Rakic - earned All-America status. Borges advanced to the NCAA Singles title match (MSU's first-ever), Oradini made the quarterfinals, he and Braun reached the NCAA Doubles semifinals (State's second ever), and Borges and Rakic made the quarterfinals for the second consecutive campaign.

18-10 (5-7) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 15TH

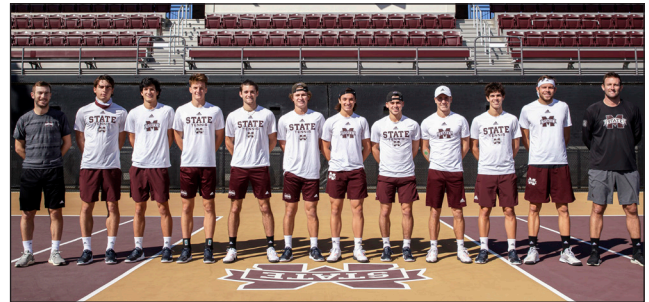
Following the loss of four All-Americans in 2019 and the COVID-19 pandemic shortening the 2020 campaign, a bit of uncertainty was to be expected in 2021 for Bulldog Tennis. However, with several talented veterans back from the abbreviated 2020, along with some key newcomers, State put together another excellent season which ended with the programs' 15th trip to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen.

State tallied 18 wins on the season, five over Top 25 foes, and was ranked as high as No. 11 in the country at one point.

NCAA appearance No. 29 (10th-straight) saw State travel to Orlando for all three of its tournament matches. The Bulldogs cruised to a 4-1 opening-round triumph over No. 39 Miami and then notched an impressive 4-2 upset of host and No. 9 national seed UCF on day two to advance to the Round of 16 for 15th time.

That win would earn State a return trip to the USTA National Campus in Orlando the following week, where the finals of the NCAAAs were coincidentally being held. In the Round of 16, the Bulldogs met a familiar foe in eighth-ranked Texas A&M. The Aggies proved too much for MSU on the day, taking a 4-0 decision.

MSU ended the year ranked No. 15 nationally, its 10th consecutive Top 25 national finish and the 28th in program history.

## 2022 - CAMBRIDGE, MASS. - FIRST ROUND

14-13 (4-8) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 36TH

Propelled by a pair of All-SEC performers in Florian Broska and Nemanja Malesevic, Mississippi State made its 11th consecutive appearance in the NCAA Championships.

Matt Roberts' Bulldogs posted 14 victories on the season - 12 of which came on their home court. MSU hosted ITA Kickoff Weekend and sent Broska to the NCAA Individual Championships as well. Broska was selected as the ITA Southern Region Senior Player of the Year posting 21 victories during his final season with the Bulldogs, including seven wins over ranked opponents. He finished the year ranked 22nd in singles and 44th in doubles alongside partner Gregor Ramskogler.

Malesevic led State with an 18-7 singles record during the spring and tied Broska with seven ranked wins. Malesevic was ranked as highly as 36th during the year.

Mississippi State was selected as the No. 3 seed in the Cambridge Regional, marking the eighth straight season the Bulldogs have reached the NCAA Championships under Roberts. State was eliminated in the opening round by No. 18 Stanford.

Academically, the Bulldogs had the highest GPA of any sport on campus during the fall (3.73) and earned the highest-ranked GPA among men's sports during the spring (3.62). Six of the eight members of the team were selected as ITA Scholar Athletes by maintaining a GPA of 3.5 or higher with Broska and Ramskogler maintaining a perfect 4.0 during both semesters.

MSU was ranked as highly as 18th and finished the year at No. 36 nationally.

## 2023 - STARKVILLE, MISS./FORT WORTH, TEXAS. - ROUND OF 16

21-8 (7-5) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 16TH

Mississippi State celebrated its 100th season of men's tennis by reaching the Round of 16 at the NCAA Championships for the fourth time in the last five years.

Matt Roberts' squad posted a 21-8 overall record, which including a sparkling 17-1 mark at home. The Bulldogs hosted a home regional for the fifth time in program history and defeated Alabama State and No. 27 Middle Tennessee in the Starkville Regional to reach the Round of 16.

MSU earned nine wins over ranked opponents, four of which were top 20 victories. The Bulldogs picked up the highest-ranked win in program history on March 19 when they knocked off second-ranked South Carolina 5-2 inside the Rula Tennis Pavilion.

Carles Hernandez, Ewen Lumsden and Nemanja Malesevic were all selected to the All-SEC second team while Petar Jovanovic garnered Freshman All-SEC honors.

Gregor Ramskogler ended his illustrious career as the school's all-time leader in dual-match doubles victories with 64. Ramskogler also won the Most Improved Senior award for the ITA Southern Region while Lumsden was selected as the Senior of the Year for the region.

Roberts was named the ITA Southern Region Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career while Jake Jacoby was tabbed as the top assistant coach in the region.

## 2024 - STARKVILLE, MISS./COLUMBUS, OHIO. - ROUND OF 16

19-8 (9-3) - FINAL ITA RANKING: 13TH

Mississippi State earned its fifth trip to the Sweet 16 in the last six seasons and hosted the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament in Starkville for the second consecutive year.

Matt Roberts' squad posted a 19-8 overall record and finished third in the SEC with a stellar 9-3 mark. The Bulldogs went 7-3 on the road with two of those losses coming against top 10 opponents.

MSU beat 11 ranked opponents during the year and were ranked as highly as 12th nationally. The Bulldogs hosted ITA Kickoff Weekend and also downed Alabama State and Middle Tennessee State in the NCAA Championships for the second-straight year to secure a spot in the Sweet 16.

Petar Jovanovic and Benito Sanchez Martinez were both named All-Americans in doubles and finished the year with a career-best No. 6 national ranking together.

Jovanovic also won the consolation singles bracket at the ITA Fall National Championships and was a first team All-SEC selection. Nemanja Malesevic was tabbed as a second team All-SEC honoree for the third consecutive year.

## MSU's No. 1 NATIONAL RANKINGS

Mississippi State Men's Tennis has had five singles players and three doubles teams hold No. 1 national rankings during their careers, Nuno Borges the most recent.

Three of the five singles players have ended seasons ranked in the country's top spot (Thomas Dupré-1997, Marco Baron-2001 & Nuno Borges-2019) and one of the doubles teams has done so (Nuno Borges and Strahinja Rakic in 2018). Borges is the only player to ever finish seasons ranked No. 1 in both singles and doubles.

The longest any player has held the No. 1 ranking was Thomas Dupré for 364 days (12/10/96-12/9/97), which spanned nine releases of the national rankings.

Borges and Daniel Courcol are the only Bulldogs to ever hold No. 1 national rankings in both singles and doubles during a career and Laurent Miquelard is the only MSU player to ever hold the No. 1 national doubles ranking with two different partners.
