**ABOUT ALABAMA:** The Crimson Tide is coming off an undefeated weekend at the Easton Crimson Classic. Alabama's pitching has thrown 21 straight scoreless innings since allowing a seventh-inning run against Memphis (Feb. 26). Lexi Kilfoyl has been dominant in the circle so far, with just one earned run over 38.0 innings pitched for a 0.18 ERA and 43 strikeouts. Alabama is fourth in the SEC with 89 runs scored and 106 hits this year. Head coach Patrick Murphy recorded his 1,100th victory with the Crimson Tide earlier this year (Feb. 14).

## LEADING OFF

**GOING THROUGH THE GAUNTLET:** The Bulldogs are in the midst of a six-game road trip that sees them face three ranked opponents. That marks the most ranked non-conference matchups in the regular season since playing three ranked opponents in 2017 (vs. No. 21 Fresno State, at No. 23 Ole Miss, at No. 13 Oklahoma).

**LET'S GO STREAKING:** Chloe Malau'ulu is currently riding a career-long 17-game reached base streak. Three other Bulldogs have posted career-long hitting streaks in 2021.

**TWO-OUT RALLY:** MSU has driven in more than a third of its RBIs with two outs. State has hit six two-out homers, including back-to-back blasts twice.

**ASPEN'S ADJUSTMENT:** After posting a 2.47 ERA in 11.1 innings with 13 strikeouts in 2020, Aspen Wesley leads MSU with a 1.31 ERA in 10.2 innings and has struck out 16 (10.5 K/7).

**BACK ON TRACK:** Mia Davidson entered the Lone Star State Invitational batting just .217, but went 8-for-17 with five extra-base hits to raise her average to .325 (13-for-40). She had four RBIs entering the tournament and drove in seven runs over the weekend.

**THUNDER AND LIGHTNING:** Mia Davidson (57) and Fa Leilua (55) rank fifth and seventh respectively among the NCAA's active career leaders in home runs. The duo is the one of two pairs of teammates in the country to boast 50-plus career homers (Arizona).

**BWARE THE BIG INNINGS:** The Bulldogs have scored five or more runs in an inning four times this year and have hit three home runs in an inning twice.

**KENNEDY RETURNS:** Madisyn Kennedy returned from injury to play four games over the weekend. She makes a huge impact defensively, allowing Mia Davidson to return to her natural position of catcher.

## PRESS BOX SERVICES

Consistent with the SEC's COVID-19 policies, press box capacity will be limited to 50 percent of available seating. ## FAST FACTS

- Opening game at the MSU Softball Field came on Feb. 26, 1997, with the Bulldogs sweeping Samford in a doubleheader with back-to-back 4-0 scores.
- Nusz Park, a \$6 million project, includes 1,000 maroon chairback seats, in addition to an expanded concourse that includes new restrooms and concession stands.
- The Bulldogs' first action in the new digs came against Georgia Southern, a 6-0 victory on Feb. 11, 2016.
- MSU opened play at Nusz Park with six-straight victories, including a sweep of the Bulldog Kickoff.
- State captured its first SEC win at Nusz with a 6-3 win against eventual WCWS finalists and third-ranked Auburn on March 19.
- Nusz hosted the 2016 SEC Softball Tournament. The four-day event hosted 12 teams and a total of 11 games and drew praise from coaches across the league to ESPN and SEC Network officials.
- Over the 2018 season, Mississippi State posted a 24-10 record at Nusz Park, tying the program record for most home wins over a single season.

## TEAM NOTES

## THE NEW THUNDER AND LIGHTNING

- Dubbed "The New Thunder and Lightning" by MSU legend Rafael Palmeiro, **Mia Davidson** and **Fa Leilua** are two of the most dominant hitters in the nation.
- The pair is fifth and seventh on the active career leaderboard for homers. Davidson has hit 57, and Leilua has 55.
- Davidson is also among the top 25 active career leaders in slugging percentage (.786, 5th), total bases (382, 15th), hit-by-pitches (31, 18th) and RBIs (144, 23rd).
- Leilua lands among the top 25 in RBIs (160, 14th), total bases (382, 15th), walks (96, 18th) and games played (213, 14th).
- Former MLB players, Palmeiro and Will Clark were the original "Thunder and Lightning" at MSU from 1983-85.

## WE'RE GOING BACK-TO-BACK

- Mia Davidson and Fa Leilua have already hit back-to-back home runs three times in 2021. Prior to this season, however, State's dominating duo had only done so one time.
- On March 8, 2019, the pair did so against Mississippi Valley State in the third inning of a 15-0 victory.
- Davidson and Leilua have homered in the same game 12 times (8 in 2019, 1 in 2020, 3 in 2021).
- MSU is 3-1 when Thunder and Lightning hit back-to-back homers.

## TWO OUTS, SO WHAT?

- The Bulldogs have proven dangerous down to their final out this season.
- More than a third of State's RBIs have come with two outs on the board (24 of 70).
- **Paige Cook** has done the most damage with a team-high five of her nine RBIs coming in two-out situations.
- **Christian Quinn** has driven in four runs with two outs, while batting .556 (5-for-9).
- MSU has hit six two-out homers, including a pair of back-to-back blasts against Southern Illinois (Feb. 21) and at Baylor (Feb. 28).

## LET'S GO STREAKING

- **Chloe Malau'ulu** has reached base in a career-high 17 straight games, dating back to Mar. 6, 2020 against MVSU. She has a hit in 15 of those games.
- **Anna Kate Segars** reached base in a career-high 14 straight games to open the year, dating back to Mar. 2, 2020.
- **Montana Davidson** (6), **Paige Cook** (4) and **Christian Quinn** (4) have all recorded new career-long hitting streaks in 2021.
- The Bulldogs set a new school record with a 17-game winning streak from Feb. 22, 2020 to Feb. 21, 2021. That surpassed 16-game runs in 2006 and 2017.

## STATION TO STATION

- State has advanced the runner on 45.1 percent of its opportunities, and 15 runners have been advanced with an out.
- Four student-athletes have advanced the runner more than 50 percent of the time (minimum 10 opportunities).
- **Fa Leilua** leads the way at 63.2 percent (12-of-19), while **Christian Quinn** (60.0, 9-of-15) is right behind her.
- **Paige Cook** has done so on 10-of-19 opportunities, and **Anna Kate Segars** is 11-for-23.

## DUCKS ON THE POND

- MSU is batting .314 (38-for-121) on the year with runners in scoring position. With the bases loaded, the team average jumps up to .364 (4-for-11), which ranks third in the SEC.
- **Paige Cook** leads the way in RISP among those with at least 10 at-bats, hitting at a .357 (5-for-14) clip in such situations.
- **Christian Quinn** only has nine at-bats with runners in scoring position, but she is batting .556 in such situations.
- **Montana Davidson** is batting .353 (6-for-17) with runners in scoring position.

## SPEED KILLS

- The Bulldogs have stolen 19 bases already this year, which is tied for fifth in the SEC.
- State ranks 44th nationally with 1.58 stolen bases per game.
- MSU stole a season-high seven bases against MVSU (Feb. 24), which marked its highest total in a single game since swiping seven at Georgia Southern on Apr. 25, 2015.
- The last time MSU stole eight bags came on Apr. 1, 2014 against the Devilettes.
- **Fa Leilua** has already stolen three bags, matching her career total entering the season.
- Malau'ulu, Leilua and **Montana Davidson**, who stole home against MVSU, lead the team with three stolen bases each.
- **Aquana Brownlee** (2), **Christian Quinn** (2), **Anna Kate Segars** (2) and **Brylie St. Clair** (2) have all swiped multiple bags this year.

## MONTANA MAKES MAJOR STRIDES

- **Montana Davidson** has started the year off on a tear. She leads the team with a .421 batting average (16-for-38) and is second on the squad with a .463 on-base percentage.
- Davidson broke her career-long hitting streak at six games earlier this year, with four multi-hit games in that span.
- She has stolen three bases this year, despite entering the year with just one for her career.

## PROMISING PAIGE

- **Paige Cook** has started every contest at second base, after playing in 10 games off the bench as a freshman.
- The sophomore hit her first career home run, a three-run shot with two outs in the fourth inning, against Miami (Ohio) while driving in a career-high four runs in her first start.
- She is third on the team with nine RBIs and leads the team among those with at least 10 at-bats with just two strikeouts.
- Cook is also among the top five on the team in batting average, slugging percentage, on-base percentage, hits and total bases.

## RULE OF THIRDS

- The third and the sixth innings have been MSU's best early in the season. State has scored 35 of its 79 runs in those two innings alone, and has allowed just 11 in those frames.
- The Bulldogs are 7-1 when leading after three innings.

## LIGHT IT UP

- MSU players, led by **Mia Davidson**, purchased a toy lightsaber on their 2020 trip to the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic, and head coach **Samantha Ricketts** began using it to celebrate five-run innings when the Bulldogs were "lighting up the scoreboard."
- MSU has scored five or more runs in one inning four times so far this season.
- MSU's biggest inning came in a six-run outburst in Game 2 at Texas State (Feb. 26), providing all its scoring in a 6-2 victory.
- Both against the Bobcats and Southern Illinois (Feb. 21), State hit three home runs in one inning.

## OFFENSIVE OUTBURSTS

- MSU has scored double-digit runs in four of 12 games this year.
- The Bulldogs scored 10-plus runs in four games in all of the shortened 2020 season, including a season high in a 20-3 victory against MVSU (3/7), tied the second-largest margin of victory in school history.
- The Bulldogs also had two 16-run games last year against Alabama State (2/12) and UAB (2/28).

## NON-CONFERENCE NOT A PROBLEM

- MSU posted one of the best non-conference runs in school history in 2020, leading to a No. 20 ranking in the first RPI of the year.
- The Bulldogs have won 109 of 129 regular-season, non-conference games since 2017.
- Since 1997, MSU has won 20 or more regular-season, non-conference games 18 times and made the NCAA tournament in all but three such seasons.

## THE #RICKETTSEFFECT

- In five full seasons since Ricketts arrived (2015), the Bulldogs have broken the school record for home runs three times.
- The mark now stands at 72 home runs, set in 2019.
- The Bulldogs rank 13th nationally and fifth in the SEC since the start of the 2018 season with 176 home runs.
- Under Ricketts, State has homered in 51.6 percent of its games (171 of 331) and gone 125-46 in such contests. In 2020 alone, MSU hit at least one home run in 67.9 percent of its games, going 18-1 when doing so.
- State set school records with a .335 batting average with runners in scoring position and a .500 average from pinch hitters in 2020.

## QUICK HITTERS

- **Chloe Malau'ulu** is one of three Bulldog regulars with a 1.000 fielding percentage and has two outfield assists this year.
- **Mia Davidson** batted .471 (8-for-17) over the Lone Star State Invitational (Feb. 26-28) with five extra-base hits, including three home runs.
- **Annie Willis** allowed just four baserunners in a complete game shutout against Houston (Feb. 27) in the first complete game shutout by a Bulldog since **Emily Williams** did so against Southeast Missouri State on March 7, 2020.



## THUNDER ROLLING IN...

## TEAM NOTES

### MILESTONE WATCH

- **Mia Davidson** needs six RBIs to reach 150 for her career and become the fifth Bulldog to reach the milestone. She is eight runs away from 150 for her career, and would be the seventh in MSU history to score that man.
- Davidson is also 25 hits shy of 200 for her career.
- **Fa Leilua** needs one home run to move into a tie for third in MSU career history (37). She is also eight RBIs away from 100 in the Maroon and White.
- Leilua needs 16 hits to reach 200 for her career at both MSU and Arizona State.
- **Annie Willis** is two strikeouts shy of 100 as a Bulldog.

### WESLEY AT WORK

- **Aspen Wesley** has struck out a career-high eight batters and seven batters in back-to-back starts.
- Against MVSU (Feb. 24), she faced just 12 batters, allowing no hits.
- The sophomore leads the team in earned run average (1.31) and strikeouts per seven innings (10.5).
- She has been in command with runners on base, allowing just a .136 opponents' batting average. With two outs, she has held hitters to a .182 average.

### A CHANGEUP IN THE CIRCLE

- Assistant coach **Josh Johnson** transformed State's pitching staff in his first year on the job. Johnson's staff finished fourth in the nation with a 1.36 ERA in 2020 after posting a 3.36 ERA that ranked second-to-last in the SEC in 2019.
- The Bulldogs were second in the SEC in strikeouts (245) and opponent's batting average (.158) and led the league in looking strikeouts (61) in 2020.

### DUELING ACES

- **Annie Willis** and **Emily Williams** were dominant in 2020.
- Both pitchers finished among the top 10 in the nation in ERA. Willis' 0.46 ranked third nationally, and Willis' 0.80 was eighth.
- Williams held opponents to an SEC-best .099 batting average while allowing just 2.30 hits per seven innings, which led the nation. Her 11.5 strikeouts per seven innings ranked seventh.
- Willis threw the 22nd no-hitter in program history on March 6, 2020 against Mississippi Valley State, while setting the school record with 19 strikeouts.
- She finished seventh in the country in strikeout-walk ratio (9.75).

### LOOK OUT FOR THE LEFTY

- **Grace Fagan** was one of eight left-handed pitchers in the SEC in 2020. The Bulldogs went 7-2 in her starts last year.
- Lefties have proven rare across the diamond as the Bulldogs have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in just 10.9 percent of their games since 1997 (data from 2000 is unavailable).
- State is 89-58 against left-handed starters since 1997.

### ROLLING UNDER RICKETTS

- Last year, **Samantha Ricketts** became the first first-year head coach to lead the nation in wins (25), since at least 1989.
- She is also the fastest coach in State's softball history to reach 20 career wins, doing so in just 23 games.
- Ricketts' 9-1 record through 10 games was the best by any active SEC head coach through the first 10 games of their career.
- At their current school, only Auburn's Mickey Dean can top her with a 10-0 start to his tenure on the Plains in 2018.
- Ricketts was also the first Bulldog head coach to see her squad ranked in her first season.

### NUMBERS TO KNOW FROM 2020

- When the season was cancelled, MSU was one of two teams in the country to have won 25 games along with No. 1/1 UCLA, and its .893 winning percentage ranked fifth nationally and stands as a school record.
- **Mia Davidson** led the team among those with at least 15 two-out at-bats, hitting at a .412 clip in such situations (7-for-17).
- Six Bulldogs batted .400 or better with runners in scoring position in 2020. **Anna Kate Segars** led the way, batting .438 (7-for-16) in such situations.
- State had 46 RBIs in 71 opportunities (64.8 percent) with runners on third and less than two outs. That percentage ranked second in the SEC.
- The Bulldogs led the SEC in pinch hitting (.500, 12-for-24), and pinch hitters collected 11 RBIs. State's pinch hitters reached base on 21-of-33 (.636) opportunities when walks, hit by pitches and errors are included.

### A FINE FRESHMAN SEASON

- Multiple freshmen broke out for MSU in the 2020 season.
- **Madisyn Kennedy** forced her way into the lineup in the middle of the Bulldog infield, starting every game at shortstop.
- The Montgomery, Alabama, batted .333 with three doubles, three home runs and 18 RBIs.
- **Brylie St. Clair** batted .417 and reached base in 8-of-12 at-bats thanks to three errors. She hit an RBI triple in her first career at-bat and later added a double.
- **Kiki Edwards** hit .333 with a double and three runs scored. She doubled in her first career at-bat as a pinch hitter.
- **Paige Cook's** first plate appearance resulted in an RBI single to right field. She finished 4-for-6 on the year with five RBIs.

### TRIO ON PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCHLIST

- **Mia Davidson**, **Fa Leilua** and **Emily Williams** are all among the 50 student-athletes named to USA Softball's Collegiate Player of the Year Watchlist.
- MSU's three selections trail only No. 1/1 UCLA (6), No. 2/2 Washington (4) and No. 8/8 Alabama (4).
- The Bulldogs are one of seven schools, and just two SEC programs, with three or more players on the list.
- Davidson and Leilua are repeat selections, while it is Williams' first recognition.
- No Bulldog has won the award, but State has seen three student-athletes named finalists. Most recently, Davidson was among the Top 10 Finalists in 2019.
- Chelsea Bramlett was finished in the Top 25 in 2008 and 2009 before reaching the Top 10 stage in 2010.
- Iyhia McMichael was a Top 10 selection in 2003 and became the only Bulldog to reach the Top Three in 2004.

### A FULL-STAFF EFFORT

- Eight of MSU's 24 student-athletes are pitchers as the Bulldogs continue to trend more toward using a full pitching staff rather than one standout arm.
- MSU used more pitchers than any other SEC team in 2020. The Bulldogs threw seven different arms in the circle.
- Last year, Missouri was the only SEC program with more pitchers on its roster (8), but the Tigers only used six in game action.

### VETERAN CORE

- MSU roster includes five student-athletes entering their fifth or sixth year of college softball, which is the third-most in the SEC behind Alabama (7) and Arkansas (6).
- Three Bulldogs, **Montana Davidson**, **Allison Florian**, **Alyssa Loza** and **Christian Quinn**, are entering their fifth season, while **Fa Leilua** begins her sixth.
- State has nine student-athletes who are in at least their fourth year of college.

### MSU'S 30<sup>TH</sup> SEASON OF SOFTBALL

- State is playing its 30<sup>th</sup> season of softball in 2021. MSU holds a 897-684 all-time record.
- **Samantha Ricketts** is the sixth head coach in program history and is in her second season at the helm.

## #NOONEFIGHTSALONE

- Honoring the legendary spirit of the late Alex Wilcox, Mississippi State will continue its "No One Fights Alone" campaign throughout the 2021 softball season.
- The Bulldogs will continue to wear teal uniforms throughout the season to raise awareness for ovarian cancer in honor of the former softball student-athlete who passed away in 2018 at the age of 18 after a courageous fight with the disease.
- MSU immortalized Wilcox last fall by retiring her No. 8 jersey on Sept. 15, 2018, making Wilcox the first female student-athlete in Mississippi State history to have her jersey retired.
- A permanent graphical fixture on the right field wall at Nusz Park was installed to commemorate Wilcox. The Bulldogs also re-branded the annual February Freezer tournament and now host the The Snowman: Alex Wilcox Memorial tournament in February.

## MAROON AND WHITE

- Named the sixth head softball coach in program history on July 22, 2019
- Became the fastest head coach in program history to reach 20 wins, doing so in 23 games. Started 9-1, marking the best 10-game start by a head coach in program history.
- Became the first first-year head coach to lead the nation in wins (25 in 2020) since at least 1989.
- Is the only coach in program history to have her team nationally ranked at some point during her first year and led MSU to its highest final ranking in program history (No. 20).
- Earned first career coaching victory in first career game on Feb. 7, 2020, against Missouri State (5-0).
- Led her team to a 4-0 opening weekend to win the NFCA Leadoff Classic.
- Served as an assistant coach from 2015-18 focusing on hitting and recruiting before being promoted to associate head coach
- Has been a part of one Women's College World Series appearance, six NCAA Regional berths and two NCAA Super Regional appearances during her coaching career
- In 2019, MSU was one of two teams in the nation (Arizona) to boast multiple hitters with 20 or more home runs
- The Bulldogs shattered the school record for home runs (72) and posted the second-highest slugging percentage in school history (.484) in 2019
- For the first time since 2008, State produced multiple NFCA All-Americans with Fa Leilua and Mia Davidson earning the honor.
- Leilua closed 2019 with 22 total home runs, setting a new MSU junior record. The total ranked second in single-season history behind only Davidson's record-shattering mark of 26.
- Davidson ranked second nationally and led the SEC in homers in 2019 while breaking the league's single-season record that was once held by Georgia's Alex Hugo (2014) and Alabama's Kelly Kretschman (1998).
- Davidson was the lone player in the SEC to record at least 60 RBI, 60 hits and 50 runs scored in 2019
- In 2017, Ricketts produced five starters that hit .300 or better to help lead the Bulldogs to an NCAA Regional
- During the 2016 season, Ricketts' leadership led senior Kayla Winkfield to a .330 average and an SEC-leading six triples, which finished top 10 in the nation
- In her first season of 2015, the Bulldogs set new single-season records for home runs (54), batting average (.312), slugging percentage (.495), RBI (294) and on-base percentage (.416)
- MSU also finished second in the single-season record books for runs scored (326), doubles (84) and hit by pitches (72)
- In 2014 without Ricketts on the MSU staff, just two Bulldogs hit over .300, while in 2015 with the addition of Ricketts, nine Bulldogs hit over .300 (min. five at-bats).

## WICHITA STATE UNIVERSITY

- Served as assistant coach at Wichita State from 2012-14, working with the team's hitters and consistently improving their production
- Her last spring at WSU saw the Shockers increase their overall win total by 15 from 2013 to 2014 and win the program's first regular-season conference title
- Part of the 2014 MVC Coaching Staff of the Year, helping to improve the Shockers from the ninth place in 2012, to eighth place in 2013, to MVC champs in 2014
- Produced five starters who each hit better than .300 in 2014 after the squad did not have a batter hit over .300 in 2013
