ABOUT SAMFORD: Samford is coming off of a shutout loss at the hands of Southern Illinois, which also defeated MSU, 6-5, in extra innings earlier this season. Samford, however handed SIU its first loss of the year and snapped its 16-game winning streak on Saturday, no-hitting the Salukis in a 2-0 victory. Taylor DeCelles and Emily Barnett combined for the no-hitter, Samford's first since 2016. Timberlyn Shurbutt was named the SoCon Player of the Week on Monday after hitting .467 with two homers and four RBIs over the weekend.

LEADING OFF

CONSISTENT COMPANY: Chloe Malau'ulu is currently riding a career-long 28-game reached base streak that is tied for the seventh-longest in school history. She is one of three players in MSU history to reach base in 23 consecutive games to open a season.

OUTFIELD ARMS: Anna Kate Segars leads the team with three outfield assists, including two in her last three games. Malau'ulu and Christian Quinn have each thrown out a pair of runners too.

WE DON'T MOVE: MSU ranks third in the nation in hit-by-pitches and second in the SEC. Malau'ulu is second in the country and leads the SEC with 11, while Segars is tied for seventh nationally at nine.

MILESTONE WATCH: Mia Davidson needs two homers to move into a tie for eighth in SEC career history and one run to move into a tie for sixth in school history. Emily Williams (99) needs four looking strikeouts to break the school record of 102.

GOT HER LOOKING: The Bulldogs lead the SEC with 48 looking strikeouts this season. Williams and Aspen Wesley lead the team and are tied for eighth in the SEC with 14 each.

THUNDER AND LIGHTNING: Davidson and Fa Leilua rank seventh among the NCAA's active career leaders with 58 home runs. The duo is the one of two pairs of teammates in the country to boast 50-plus career homers (Arizona).

NEARING 200: Davidson and Leilua are both approaching 200 career hits. Davidson needs 11 to become the 12th Bulldog to reach the mark. Leilua is nine away over her career at MSU and Arizona State.

QUINN AND THE GANG: Quinn's batting average climbs to .370 with runners on base and .353 with runners in scoring position, which is second on the team.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

Consistent with the SEC's COVID-19 policies, press box capacity will be limited to 50 percent of available seating. Seats will be assigned in a socially distanced manner, and masks covering the nose and mouth are required at all times when not actively eating or drinking. A pregame meal is also served in the press box approximately one hour prior to each game.

RADIO BROADCASTS

Radio workspace will be contingent on available seating, but MSU will make every effort to accommodate visiting radio broadcasts.

PHOTOGRAPHERS / VIDEOGRAPHERS

Consistent with the SEC's COVID-19 policies, a limited number of photographers and videographers will be permitted to shoot at Nusz Park outside of the established buffer zone. Those wishing to shoot a game must request access at least 24 hours before the game.

FAST FACTS

- Opening game at the MSU Softball Field came on Feb. 26, 1997, with the Bulldogs sweeping Samford in a doubleheader with back-to-back 4-0 scores.
- Nusz Park, a \$6 million project, includes 1,000 maroon chairback seats, in addition to an expanded concourse that includes new restrooms and concession stands.
- The Bulldogs' first action in the new digs came against Georgia Southern, a 6-0 victory on Feb. 11, 2016.
- MSU opened play at Nusz Park with six-straight victories, including a sweep of the Bulldog Kickoff.
- State captured its first SEC win at Nusz with a 6-3 win against eventual WCWS finalists and third-ranked Auburn on March 19.
- Nusz hosted the 2016 SEC Softball Tournament. The four-day event hosted 12 teams and a total of 11 games and drew praise from coaches across the league to ESPN and SEC Network officials.
- Over the 2018 season, Mississippi State posted a 24-10 record at Nusz Park, tying the program record for most home wins over a single season.

TEAM NOTES

QUICK HITTERS

- **Chloe Malau'ulu** and Christian Quinn lead the Bulldog regulars with a 1.000 fielding percentage and two outfield assists each.
- Malau'ulu leads the team with a .429 batting average in conference play. **Paige Cook** is second at .375. The pair is tied for the most hits in SEC games (8).
- **Carter Spexarth** is 11-for-29 in the last 10 games with five extra-base hits (.609 slugging) and 12 RBIs.
- Spexarth and Cook have reached on a team-leading four errors.
- **Christian Quinn**'s batting average climbs to .370 (.255 overall) with runners on base. She is hitting .353 with runners in scoring position, which is second on the team, and has advanced the runner a team-leading 58.6 percent of the time (17-of-29).
- With a runner on third with less than two outs, the Bulldogs are fourth in the SEC with an RBI on 59.7 percent of their opportunities (37-of-62).

QUICK PITCH

- The Bulldog pitching staff leads the SEC with 48 looking strikeouts this season. **Aspen Wesley** and **Emily Williams** are tied for eighth in the league with 14.
- State's top three pitchers (Wesley, Williams and **Annie Willis**) have held opponents to a .147 batting average with two outs.
- Willis leads the team with a 5.3 strikeout-walk ratio, which ranks No. 61 nationally.
- Williams has held opponents to a .161 average with runners on base and a .157 average with two outs.
- Wesley (8.9) and Williams (8.7) are among the top 100 pitchers in the country in strikeouts per seven innings.

CONSISTENT CHLOE

- **Chloe Malau'ulu** has reached base in a career-high 28 straight games, dating back to Mar. 6, 2020. She has a hit in 22 of those games and has been walked or hit by a pitch 19 times.
- Malau'ulu's is one of just three Bulldogs to reach base in 23 straight to open a season along with Iyhia McMichael (2004) and Brittany Bell (2012).
- McMichael holds the two longest streaks in school history at 41 and 35 games.
- McMichael went 27 games over the 2003 and 2004 seasons before failing to reach base in just one contest in 2004. She then reached safely in the final 41 games of the year.

SEASON STREAKS

- **Carter Spexarth** (8), **Montana Davidson** (7), **Paige Cook** (4), **Christian Quinn** (4) and Malau'ulu (6) have all posted career-long hitting streaks in 2021.
- Segars reached base in a career-high 14 straight games to open the year, dating back to Mar. 2, 2020.
- The Bulldogs set a new school record with a 17-game winning streak from Feb. 22, 2020 to Feb. 21, 2021 that surpassed 16-game runs in 2006 and 2017.

THE NEW THUNDER AND LIGHTNING

- Dubbed "The New Thunder and Lightning" by MSU legend Rafael Palmeiro, **Mia Davidson** and **Fa Leilua** are two of the most dominant hitters in the nation.
- The pair is tied for seventh on the active career leaderboard for homers with 58.
- Davidson is also among the top 25 active career leaders in slugging percentage (.777, 9th), total bases (404, 17th), hit-by-pitches (32, 20th), runs scored (151, 28th), and RBIs (151, 23rd).
- Leilua lands among the top 25 in RBIs (168, 15th), total bases (398, 19th), walks (106, 10th) and games played (224, 7th).
- Former MLB players, Palmeiro and Will Clark were the original "Thunder and Lightning" at MSU from 1983-85.

WE'RE GOING BACK-TO-BACK

- **Mia Davidson** and **Fa Leilua** have already hit back-to-back home runs three times in 2021. Prior to this season, however, State's dominating duo had only done so one time.
- On March 8, 2019, the pair did so against Mississippi Valley State in the third inning of a 15-0 victory.
- Davidson and Leilua have homered in the same game 12 times (8 in 2019, 1 in 2020, 3 in 2021).
- MSU is 3-1 when Thunder and Lightning hit back-to-back homers.

STATION TO STATION

- Three Bulldogs have advanced the runner on at least 50 percent of their chances (minimum 20 opportunities).
- **Christian Quinn** leads the way at 58.6 percent (17-of-29), while **Mia Davidson** (52.1, 25-of-48) is right behind her.
- **Anna Kate Segars** has done so on 21 of 42 opportunities.

STARTING FROM THE TOP

- Bulldog leadoff batters have reached base on 39.6 percent of their opportunities in 2021.
- Hitting at the top of the order, **Chloe Malau'ulu** has reached on 17-of-35 opportunities (48.6 percent).
- Highlighting the importance of turning the lineup over, **Montana Davidson** (50.0 percent, 7-of-14) and **Paige Cook** (53.8 percent, 7-of-13) have started multiple rallies when opening a frame.
- **Mia Davidson** has reached in eight of the 14 innings she's led off.

MONTANA MAKES MAJOR STRIDES

- After ranking 11th on the team in batting average (.224) in 2020, **Montana Davidson** is now third on the team in batting average (.333) and hits (24).
- Davidson hit safely in a career-best seven games from Feb. 27 at No. 7/7 Texas to Mar. 6 against Western Kentucky.
- Earlier this year she also posted a six-game hitting streak, with four multi-hit games in that span.
- She has stolen three bases this year, despite entering the year with just one for her career.

THUNDER ROLLING IN...

CHASING PALMEIRO: MSU baseball legend Rafael Palmeiro holds the Diamond Dawgs' career home run record. Davidson is chasing him for the title of all-time MSU home run king or queen.

Davidson already holds MSU softball's career record, single-season record (26, 2019) and freshman record (19, 2018).

TEAM NOTES

MILESTONE WATCH

- **Mia Davidson** has cracked the SEC all-time career top 10 in home runs. She needs two to move into a tie for eighth in conference history (60, Kelly Kretschman, Alabama).
- She needs one run to move into a tie for sixth in school history (152, Hayle Guess, 2004-08) and eight RBIs to move into a tie for fifth (159, Michelle Gates, 1997-00).
- Davidson is also 11 hits shy of 200 for her career and become the 12th Bulldog to reach the mark.
- With two runners caught stealing, Davidson will move into a tie for fifth in school history (31, Katie Anne Bailey, 2014-17).
- **Fa Leilua** needs nine hits to reach 200 for her career at both MSU and Arizona State.
- Leilua is five home runs away from second in school history behind Davidson's school-record 57. Leilua boasts 39 home runs as a Bulldog, while Kellie Wilkerson hit 44 from 1999-2002.
- **Emily Williams** (99) is four looking strikeouts away from breaking the school record (102, Alison Owen, 2013-14).
- Williams needs two saves to tie with Sara Hickerson (12, 2004-07) for second in program history.

BREAKING DOWN THE BENCH

- **Allison Florian** has been the Bulldogs' most-used substitute, coming on as a pinch runner 14 times and pinch hitting once. She has scored six runs.
- **Brylie St. Clair** has come off the bench nine times and made four starts in the outfield. She has scored four times in seven pinch running appearances and has three stolen bases this year.
- **Addison Purivs** is 2-for-4 as a pinch hitter with a double and an RBI. She's also pitched out of the bullpen, tossing a three-up-three-down inning at Alabama State (3/9).
- **Aquana Brownlee** is recovering from an injury, but has scored in two games as a pinch runner since returning to the field.
- **Kiki Edwards** is 1-for-2 as a pinch hitter with two RBIs.

THE THIEVES

- MSU stole a season-high seven bases against MVSU (Feb. 24), which marked its highest total in a single game since swiping seven at Georgia Southern on Apr. 25, 2015.
- The last time MSU stole eight bags came on Apr. 1, 2014 against the Devilettes.
- **Chloe Malau'ulu** and **Christian Quinn** lead the team with five stolen bases each.
- State has seen some surprising swipes as well. **Fa Leilua** has already stolen three bags, matching her career total entering the season, and **Montana Davidson** stole home against MVSU.

GOING THROUGH THE GAUNTLET

- MSU's past and future opponents in 2021 have a combined winning percentage of .707, which ranks fifth in the nation.
- Against ranked opposition, **Emily Williams** has posted a 0.00 ERA and held opponents to a .115 batting average.
- In those same games, **Montana Davidson** is batting .455, and **Christian Quinn** and **Paige Cook** are hitting .375.
- **Mia Davidson** is slugging 1.000 with a team-high four RBIs.
- The Bulldogs faced an NFCA-ranked opponent in three of four straight road games earlier this year.

NON-CONFERENCE NOT A PROBLEM

- MSU posted one of the best non-conference runs in school history in 2020, leading to a No. 20 ranking in the first RPI of the year.
- The Bulldogs have won 116 of 137 regular-season, non-conference games since 2017.
- Since 1997, MSU has won 20 or more regular-season, non-conference games 18 times and made the NCAA tournament in all but three such seasons.

THE #RICKETTSEFFECT

- In five full seasons since Ricketts arrived (2015), the Bulldogs have broken the school record for home runs three times.
- The mark now stands at 72 home runs, set in 2019.
- The Bulldogs rank 12th nationally and fourth in the SEC since the start of the 2018 season with 186 home runs.
- Under Ricketts, State has homered in 51.8 percent of its games (177 of 342) and gone 131-46 in such contests. In 2021, MSU has homered in 75.0 percent of its games, going 12-3 when doing so.

E-DUB'S SCORELESS STREAK

- **Emily Williams** went six outings, including two starts, without allowing a run, running her scoreless innings streak to 24.1 frames, 1.0 shy of her career high.
- From Feb. 27 at No. 7/7 Texas to March 10 against Memphis, she struck out 29 while walking eight and holding opponents to a .129 batting average.
- For the year, the senior has held opponents to a .177 batting average and posted a 2.75 ERA.

WESLEY AT WORK

- **Aspen Wesley** struck out a career-high eight batters and seven batters in back-to-back starts to open her 2021 campaign.
- She then struck out a career-high nine against Alcorn State (Mar. 5) in 4.0 innings of one-hit ball.
- Against MVSU (Feb. 24), she faced 12 batters, allowing no hits.
- Wesley leads the team in strikeouts per seven innings (8.9).

A FULL-STAFF EFFORT

- Eight of MSU's 24 student-athletes are pitchers as the Bulldogs continue to trend more toward using a full pitching staff rather than one standout arm.
- MSU used more pitchers than any other SEC team in 2020. The Bulldogs threw seven different arms in the circle.
- Last year, Missouri was the only SEC program with more pitchers on its roster (8), but the Tigers only used six in game action.

LOOK OUT FOR THE LEFTY

- Lefties have proven rare across the diamond as the Bulldogs have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in just 10.8 percent of their games since 1997 (data from 2000 is unavailable).
- State is 89-59 against left-handed starters since 1997.
- **Grace Fagan** and **Kylie Taylor** are two of 14 left-handed pitchers in the SEC.

TRIO ON PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCHLIST

- **Mia Davidson**, **Fa Leilua** and **Emily Williams** are all among the 50 student-athletes named to USA Softball's Collegiate Player of the Year Watchlist.
- MSU's three selections trail only No. 1/1 UCLA (6), No. 2/2 Washington (4) and No. 8/8 Alabama (4).
- The Bulldogs were one of seven schools, and just two SEC programs, with three or more players on the list.
- Davidson and Leilua are repeat selections, while it is Williams' first recognition.
- No Bulldog has won the award, but State has seen three student-athletes named finalists. Most recently, Davidson was among the Top 10 Finalists in 2019.

VETERAN CORE

- MSU roster includes five student-athletes entering their fifth or sixth year of college softball, which is the third-most in the SEC behind Alabama (7) and Arkansas (6).
- Three Bulldogs, **Montana Davidson**, **Allison Florian**, **Alyssa Loza** and **Christian Quinn**, are entering their fifth season, while **Fa Leilua** begins her sixth.
- State has nine student-athletes who are in at least their fourth year of college.

#NOONEFIGHTSALONE

- Honoring the legendary spirit of the late Alex Wilcox, Mississippi State will continue its "No One Fights Alone" campaign throughout the 2021 softball season.
- The Bulldogs will continue to wear teal uniforms throughout the season to raise awareness for ovarian cancer in honor of the former softball student-athlete who passed away in 2018 at the age of 18 after a courageous fight with the disease.
- MSU immortalized Wilcox last fall by retiring her No. 8 jersey on Sept. 15, 2018, making Wilcox the first female student-athlete in Mississippi State history to have her jersey retired.
- A permanent graphical fixture on the right field wall at Nusz Park was installed to commemorate Wilcox. The Bulldogs also re-branded the annual February Freezer tournament and now host the The Snowman: Alex Wilcox Memorial tournament in February.

- Multiple freshmen broke out for MSU in the 2020 season.
- **Madisyn Kennedy** started every game at shortstop while batting .333 with three doubles, three home runs and 18 RBIs.
- **Brylie St. Clair** batted .417 and reached base in 8-of-12 at-bats thanks to three errors. She hit an RBI triple in her first career at-bat and later added a double.
- **Kiki Edwards** hit .333 with a double and three runs scored. She doubled in her first career at-bat as a pinch hitter.

MAROON AND WHITE

- Named the sixth head softball coach in program history on July 22, 2019
- Became the fastest head coach in program history to reach 20 wins, doing so in 23 games. Started 9-1, marking the best 10-game start by a head coach in program history.
- Became the first first-year head coach to lead the nation in wins (25 in 2020) since at least 1989.
- Is the only coach in program history to have her team nationally ranked at some point during her first year and led MSU to its highest final ranking in program history (No. 20).
- Earned first career coaching victory in first career game on Feb. 7, 2020, against Missouri State (5-0).
- Led her team to a 4-0 opening weekend to win the NFCA Leadoff Classic.
- Served as an assistant coach from 2015-18 focusing on hitting and recruiting before being promoted to associate head coach
- Has been a part of one Women's College World Series appearance, six NCAA Regional berths and two NCAA Super Regional appearances during her coaching career
- In 2019, MSU was one of two teams in the nation (Arizona) to boast multiple hitters with 20 or more home runs
- The Bulldogs shattered the school record for home runs (72) and posted the second-highest slugging percentage in school history (.484) in 2019
- For the first time since 2008, State produced multiple NFCA All-Americans with Fa Leilua and Mia Davidson earning the honor.
- Leilua closed 2019 with 22 total home runs, setting a new MSU junior record. The total ranked second in single-season history behind only Davidson's record-shattering mark of 26.
- Davidson ranked second nationally and led the SEC in homers in 2019 while breaking the league's single-season record that was once held by Georgia's Alex Hugo (2014) and Alabama's Kelly Kretschman (1998).
- Davidson was the lone player in the SEC to record at least 60 RBI, 60 hits and 50 runs scored in 2019
- In 2017, Ricketts produced five starters that hit .300 or better to help lead the Bulldogs to an NCAA Regional
- During the 2016 season, Ricketts' leadership led senior Kayla Winkfield to a .330 average and an SEC-leading six triples, which finished top 10 in the nation
- In her first season of 2015, the Bulldogs set new single-season records for home runs (54), batting average (.312), slugging percentage (.495), RBI (294) and on-base percentage (.416)
- MSU also finished second in the single-season record books for runs scored (326), doubles (84) and hit by pitches (72)
- In 2014 without Ricketts on the MSU staff, just two Bulldogs hit over .300, while in 2015 with the addition of Ricketts, nine Bulldogs hit over .300 (min. five at-bats).
