ABOUT ALABAMA STATE: The Hornets are receiving one vote in the latest NFCA Coaches' Poll. Alabama State hosted the season-opening Stinger Classic tournament, going 2-2 with wins over Purdue-Fort Wayne and College of Charleston. Junior Bailey Greenlee struck out 17 batters in her Hornet debut while also adding four RBIs on three hits at the plate. Kindall DeRamus recorded a team-high seven hits and five scores over the opening weekend, including all three runs in the win over the College of Charleston.

LEADING OFF

TOP TRIO: Paige Cook, Brylie St. Clair and Mia Davidson are all batting .400 or better after opening weekend. St. Clair and Davidson are tied for the team lead with two doubles, and Cook is tied with Davidson for the team lead in RBIs.

READY FOR A CHALLENGE: The Bulldogs are set to play 28 of their 55 games against teams that are ranked or receiving votes in either the NFCA Coaches' Poll or the ESPN/USA Softball Poll. 20 of those games will be on the road or at neutral sites.

IN THE ZONE: MSU's pitchers are averaging just 1.29 walks allowed per game. With four total walks this season. State ranks third in the SFC

RECORD WATCH: Mia Davidson is now just one home run away from tying the SEC career record set by Florida's Lauren Haeger (71).

HOME SWEET HOME: State holds a 124-45 record in Nusz Park (.734) since 2016.

LINEUP LOG: Samantha Ricketts used 33 different batting orders and 17 different fielding alignments in her starting lineups in 2021. She has used four unique cards this season, with four different batting orders and three defensive alignments.

COMMANDING THE CIRCLE: Aspen Wesley has allowed just three earned runs in 24.0 innings pitched (0.88 ERA) over her last nine appearances. She is 4-0 in that span.

NEW TERRITORY: Three current student-athletes are the first Bulldog from their state: Riley Hull (Kentucky), Kenley Hawk (Arkansas) and Grace Fagan (New Jersev).

DAWG DEBUTS: Matalasi Faapito homered in her first Bulldog atbat and did not allow an earned run in her first inning in the circle as a Bulldog. Shea Moreno, Phoebe Florian, Riley Hull, Bri Bower and Saleyna Daniel also made their MSU debuts last weekend.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

A complete NCAA box score and pertinent game facts are available to members of the working media following each game. Seats will be assigned, and masks covering the nose and mouth may be required, consistent with current university policy. A pregame meal is also served in the press box approximately one hour prior to each game.

The press box is divided into four separate work areas equipped with high-speed internet and telephone access. It is also set up to accommodate television and team radio/video personnel.

RADIO BROADCASTS

The Nusz Park press box houses radio lines to support home and visitor radio broadcasts. For more information on the phone lines, please contact Brian Ogden in the Communications office. Radio workspace will be contingent on available seating, but MSU will make every effort to accommodate visiting radio broadcasts.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Requested MSU players, along with head coach Samantha Ricketts, will be available for a postgame media session approximately 25 minutes after home games. For road games, phone interviews may be conducted postgame with advance notice. The Mississippi State locker room, indoor facility and field dugouts are closed to the media.

- Since 2016, MSU is 124-45 in Nusz Park (.734).
- Opening game at the MSU Softball Field came on Feb. 26, 1997, with the Bulldogs sweeping Samford in a doubleheader with back-to-back 4-0 scores.
- Nusz Park, a \$6 million project, includes 1,000 maroon chairback seats, in addition to an expanded concourse that includes new restrooms and concession stands.
- The Bulldogs' first action in the new digs came against Georgia Southern, a 6-0 victory on Feb. 11, 2016.
- MSU opened play at Nusz Park with six-straight victories, including a sweep of the Bulldog Kickoff.
- State captured its first SEC win at Nusz with a 6-3 win against eventual WCWS finalists and third-ranked Auburn on March 19.
- Nusz hosted the 2016 SEC Softball Tournament. The four-day event hosted 12 teams and a total of 11 games and drew praise from coaches across the league to ESPN and SEC Network officials.
- Over the 2018 season, Mississippi State posted a 24-10 record at Nusz Park, tying the program record for most home wins over a single season

BULLDOGS BY THE NUMBERS

OUTFIELD ASSISTS: SEC All-Defensive Team selection Chloe Malau'ulu led the SEC and recorded the second-most outfield assists in MSU single-season history (7) in 2021.

RANKED OPPONENTS: State will play 28 of its 55 games against teams that are ranked or receiving votes in the preseason NFCA Coaches' Poll or ESPN/USA Softball Poll.

CAREER HOME RUNS: The next record for Mia Davidson to chase down is the SEC career home run record set by Florida's Lauren Haeger. Davidson is three shy of Haeger's 71.

TEAM NOTES

QUICK HITTERS

- Since 2016, MSU is 124-45 in Nusz Park (.734).
- The Bulldog pitching staff was second in the SEC with 417 strikeouts in 2021 and led the league with 109 looking strikeouts.
- Paige Cook leads the team with .444 batting average and is tied for the team lead in RBIs (2).
- Brylie St. Clair is second on the team with .400 batting average and a .600 slugging percentage and has reached base in 67 percent of leadoff opportunities.
- Mia Davidson leads the team with with three extra-base hits this season (2 2B, HR) after leading the team with 29 in 2021.
- Aspen Wesley has allowed just three earned runs in her last 24.0 innings pitched (0.88 ERA).

TACKLING A TOUGH SCHEDULE

- The Bulldogs are set to play 28 of their 55 games against teams that are ranked or receiving votes in either the NFCA Coaches' Poll or the ESPN/USA Softball Poll.
- 24 of those games will come in conference play, and 20 will come on the road or at neutral sites.
- If all 11 currently ranked teams remain ranked at the time of the game. State will have played at least 20 ranked games in a season for the eighth time in the last nine years (since 2014, every year but the shortened 2020 season).
- Last year, MSU finished with the No. 8 strength of schedule in the nation and its opponents combined for a .650 winning percentage, which was fifth nationally.

ENDING ON A HIGH

- Mia Davidson turned in a career-best 22-game reached base streak from last year through the first two games of 2022. It is the 19th streak of 20 or more games in program history.
- Davidson joined Chloe Malau'ulu (28 games) in 2021 as the first Bulldogs with a 20-game reached-base streak since 2015.
- Madisyn Kennedy batted .364 in the 2021 Stillwater Regional with an .727 slugging percentage, both of which were second on the team. Defensively, she hrew out two runners at the plate.

LATE-SEASON SURGE

- MSU won its final seven straight SEC games and its first SEC Tournament game to put together an eight-game winning streak.
- State's pitchers posted a 1.50 ERA over the streak while the offense scored 6.4 runs per game.
- In the same span, State picked up an RBI 60.0 percent of the time with a runner on third and less than two outs.
- · MSU batted .288 with two outs during the streak, up 44 points from it's season average.
- State's seven consecutive victories in conference play was tied with the 1999 season for the second-longest SEC winning streak in program history behind a nine-game stretch in 2001.

WORTH A SECOND LOOK

• The Bulldogs were 10-5 in the second game of a series or doubleheader or when playing a team for the second straight day in a tournament last year. They outscored opponents 83-61 in such games.

STARTING FROM THE TOP

- Hitting at the top of the order, Chloe Malau'ulu reached on 43-of-100 opportunities (43.0 percent) in 2021.
- In the 43 times she reached to open a frame, she scored 23 runs (53.5 percent).
- The Bulldogs were 21-6 when Malau'ulu reached to open the game.
- Mia Davidson (51.2 percent) and Paige Cook (47.7 percent) reached in the highest percentage of leadoff opportunities (minimum 30 chances).

ALL HAIL THE QUEEN

- MSU legend Rafael Palmeiro likes to share his nickname "Thunder" with Mia Davidson, who last season broke his record for the most career home runs by an MSU baseball or softball player
- Davidson now stands alone in second place in SEC softball history with 70 career home runs. She needs one more to tie the league record.
- She is one of 16 baseball and softball players in the history of the conference to have hit 60 home runs in her career, and only 10 have hit 65.
- MSU boasts three of the sluggers (Will Clark and Palmeiro) which is tied with Florida (Matt LaPorta, Lauren Haeger and Megan
- Davidson's 0.333 homers per game is third among the 10 hitters with 65 behind Palmeiro (0.369) and LaPorta (0.344).
- Davidson is tied for fifth in league history between the two

MIA'S MILESTONE WATCH

- Mia Davidson became the 12th Bulldog to reach 200 career hits, and is two shy of ninth in program history (223, Hayle Guess,
- Davidson is third in school history with 177 career RBIs and needs five to tie lyhia McMichael (182: 2001-04) for second in program history.
- · Davidson is fifth in school history with 36 runners caught stealing and holds the program record with 10 runners picked off for 46 total runners erased. Sam Lenahan (2011-14) holds the record for both runners caught stealing (49) and runners erased (54).

THE #RICKETTSEFFECT

- In five full seasons since Ricketts arrived (2015), the Bulldogs have broken the school record for home runs three times.
- The mark now stands at 72 home runs, set in 2019. The 2021 team hit 70 home runs, which ranks second, and gives Ricketts a hand in each of the top four seasons in school history.
- The Bulldogs are 15th nationally and fourth in the SEC since the start of the 2018 season with 232 home runs.
- Under Ricketts. State has homered in 52.8 percent of its games (201 of 381) and gone 147-54 in such contests. In 2021, MSU homered in 61.7 percent of its games, going 26-11 when doing so.

- MSU's assists ranked third in school history behind the 2002 (18) and 2010 (17) seasons.
- · State's outfielders were tied with LSU for second in the conference with 232 total chances (Missouri, 239).

ALL HAIL THE OUEEN

Mia Davidson is one of 10 SEC student-athletes, playing either baseball or softball, to have hit 60 or more home runs in their career.

Davidson holds MSU's career record for baseball and softball along with softball's single-season record (26, 2019) and freshman record (19, 2018).

CHLOE CAPTAINS THE OUTFIELD

- Chloe Malau'ulu is the SEC's returning leader in outfield assists (7) and putouts (91) from last spring. Only Tennessee senior Cailin Hannon had more putouts (101) last year.
- Malau'ulu led the conference in outfield assists and total chances in the outfield as she displayed her versatility across all three positions. Only seven SEC outfielders recorded at least 80 chances, and of those, only three return in 2022.
- Of Malau'ulu's seven assists, six were runners thrown out at home plate.
- She was second in fielding percentage (.990) among league outfielders with at least 60 total chances trailing only Missouri's Casidy Chaumont who had an error-free campaign over 76 chances
- Her assists are tied for second in school history with lyhia McMichael's 2004 mark.

WIN THE LATE INNINGS

- The Bulldogs had 10 comeback victories in 2021 and made up as large as a six-run deficit. Four of those victories came when trailing after the fifth.
- At North Alabama (4/3). State recorded its largest comeback victory since erasing a six-run deficit against Alabama (W, 8-6) on April 9, 2004. MSU hit two home runs and scored five runs in the sixth inning to spark the comeback.
- In the sixth inning alone, MSU outscored opponents, 40-16.
- The sixth inning was MSU's best inning, producing its highest batting average (.311) and its lowest ERA (2.24) and opponents' average (.222) of any frame.
- The Bulldogs went 27-2 when leading after four innings and 21-0 when leading after five.

- Annie Willis threw the 23rd no-hitter in program history and the second of her Bulldog career at Louisiana Tech (4/10).
- She is one of seven Bulldogs with multiple no-hitters in her career and the first to throw multiple 7.0 inning no-hitters.
- The game was her fifth 10-strikeout game as a Bulldog.
- State has thrown at least one no-hitter in every season since 2015, and Willis has thrown each of the last two.

WORKING IN WESLEY

- Aspen Wesley is expected to take on an increased role in the circle this year splitting time alongside established ace Annie Willis. Willis is viewed at the team's No. 1A, while Wesley slots in at No. 1B.
- Wesley was third on the team last year in strikeouts (47) and made 22 appearances with nine starts.
- She finished the year as one of three State pitchers to ever post a 0.00 ERA in an NCAA Regional (min. 3.0 IP), tossing 5.0 scoreless frames and earning her first career postseason victory.
- Wesley has allowed just three earned runs in her last 24.0 innings pitched (0.88 ERA).

WE DON'T MOVE

- MSU ranked eighth nationally in hit-by-pitches (60) last year, which was fourth in the SEC.
- Chloe Malau'ulu was tied for seventh in the SEC and sixth in MSU single-season history with 14 hit-by-pitches.
- The Bulldogs were hit by at least one pitch in 36 of 60 games last spring.

SETTLING NEW TERRITORY

- Samantha Ricketts has expanded the Bulldogs' recruiting reach in recent years.
- Three current student-athletes are the first Bulldog from their state: Riley Hull (Kentucky), Kenley Hawk (Arkansas) and Grace Fagan (New Jersey).
- One of MSU's recent hotbeds has been the state of North Carolina. The first player from the state arrived in Starkville in 2014, and there have been seven total student-athletes from the Tar Heel State. Four of those seven are currently on the roster in Mia Davidson, Montana Davidson, Allison Florian and Phoebe Florian.
- Additionally, Bri Bower is the first Bulldog from Illinois since Alexis Silkwood graduated in 2014, and Addison Purvis is the first from the state of Missouri since Nakita Boyce graduated in 2008.

NEW NAMES TO KNOW

- 2021 NJCAA Player of the Year Shea Moreno has enrolled at MSU after spending last season at Seminole State College in Oklahoma where she led the nation with a .673 batting average, .709 on-base percentage and 1.280 slugging percentage.
- In addition to her Player of the Year honors, Moreno was named a First Team All-American.
- 2021 NFCA National Freshman of the Year Finalist Matalasi
 Faapito has also joined the Bulldogs from New Mexico State.

 Faapito was the only player in the country to both hit 16 or more homers and strike out 60 or more batters in 2021.
- While not a newcomer, Mia Davidson married Sean Smith in December 2021 and now officially goes by Mia Davidson-Smith off the softball field. She will continue to use only Davidson on her jersey and for statistical purposes.

#NOONEFIGHTSALONE

- Honoring the legendary spirit of the late Alex Wilcox, Mississippi State will continue its "No One Fights Alone" campaign throughout the 2021 softball season.
- The Bulldogs will continue to wear teal uniforms throughout the season to raise awareness for ovarian cancer in honor of the former softball student-athlete who passed away in 2018 at the age of 18 after a courageous fight with the disease.
- MSU immortalized Wilcox last fall by retiring her No. 8 jersey on Sept. 15, 2018, making Wilcox the first female student-athlete in Mississippi State history to have her jersey retired.
- A permanent graphical fixture on the right field wall at Nusz Park was installed to commemorate Wilcox. The Bulldogs also re-branded the annual February Freezer tournament and now host the The Snowman: Alex Wilcox Memorial tournament in February.

MAROON AND WHITE

- Named the sixth head softball coach in program history on July 22, 2019
- Became the fastest head coach in program history to reach 20 wins, doing so in 23 games. Started 9-1, marking the best 10game start by a head coach in program history.
- Became the first first-year head coach to lead the nation in wins [25 in 2020] since at least 1989.
- Is the only coach in program history to have her team nationally ranked at some point during her first year and led MSU to its highest final ranking in program history (No. 20).
- Earned first career coaching victory in first career game on Feb. 7, 2020, against Missouri State (5-0).
- In her second season, led MSU to its 16th NCAA Regional and third consecutive Regional Championship game.

 Also seeded at least three players to All Period because in each of
- Has coached at least three players to All-Region honors in each of the last three seasons.
- Served as an assistant coach from 2015-18 focusing on hitting and recruiting before being promoted to associate head coach.
- Has been a part of one Women's College World Series appearance, seven NCAA Regional berths and two NCAA Super Regional appearances during her coaching career.
- In 2019, MSU was one of two teams in the nation (Arizona) to boast multiple hitters with 20 or more home runs.
- The Bulldogs shattered the school record for home runs (72) and posted the second-highest slugging percentage in school history (.484) in 2019.
- For the first time since 2008, State produced multiple NFCA All-Americans in 2019 (Fa Leilua and Mia Davidson).
- Davidson was the lone player in the conference to record at least 60 RBIs, 60 hits and 50 runs scored in 2019.
- Davidson then broke Rafael Palmeiro's mark for the most home runs in a career by a Bulldog baseball or softball player in 2021 and entered the 2022 season just two long balls shy of the SEC softball career record.
- Four of the top five single-season home run totals in program history have come under Ricketts' watch, and the Bulldogs have broken the season record four times.
- MSU has hit at least one home run in 52.8 percent of its games (197-of-373) entering 2022 since Ricketts arrived as an assistant.
- In 2017, Ricketts produced five starters that hit .300 or better to help lead the Bulldogs to an NCAA Regional and Caroline Seitz beacme the first Bulldog to earn First Team All-SEC honors since Chelsea Bramlett in 2010.
- During the 2016 season, she led Kayla Winkfield to an SEC-leading six triples, which ranked among the nation's top 10.
- In her first season of 2015, the Bulldogs set new single-season records for home runs (54), batting average (.312), slugging percentage (.495), RBI (294) and on-base percentage (.416).

WICHITA STATE UNIVERSITY

- Served as assistant coach at Wichita State from 2012-14, working with the team's hitters and consistently improving their production
- Her last spring at WSU saw the Shockers increase their overall win total by 15 from 2013 to 2014 and win the program's first regular-season conference title
- Part of the 2014 MVC Coaching Staff of the Year, helping to improve the Shockers from the ninth place in 2012, to eighth place in 2013, to MVC champs in 2014
- Produced five starters who each hit better than .300 in 2014 after the squad did not have a batter hit over .300 in 2013
- The Shockers scored 138 more runs, smashed 26 more home runs, hit 11 more doubles and added seven more triples from the previous season.
- Overall, the 2014 team established program single-season records for batting average, slugging percentage, on-base percentage, runs scored, hits, doubles, home runs, runs batted in and total bases
- Led Cacy Williams to an NFCA All-Midwest Region First Team selection in 2014 as well as MVC Player of the Year and Newcomer of the Year, becoming the first student-athlete in MVC history to receive both in the same year
- Williams broke the Wichita State single-season records for batting average (.424), slugging percentage (.812), on-base percentage (.531), total bases (138), runs scored (57), home runs (16) and RBIs (47).

ADDITIONAL COACHING EXPERIENCE
