ABOUT UT MARTIN: The Bulldogs will once again face UT Martin on a neutral field as State has never played the Skyhawks in Martin. This will be the second meeting in the series in the state of Tennessee, with MSU defeating UT Martin, 6-5, in nine innings in Chattanooga in 2007. In their last game, both Anna Hazlewood and Kallie Pickens collected three RBIs as the Skyhawks claimed a 12-4 victory at Georgia Southern. UT Martin hit 10 extra-base hits in that contest.

LEADING OFF

SCORING IN BUNCHES: State has claimed three of its five wins via run-rule and is averaging 8.8 runs per game in its victories.

IN A PINCH: The Bulldogs are 6-for-1 (.545) when pinch hitting this season. State sent four pinch hitters to the plate in Game 2 against Alabama State (Feb. 16) and went 4-for-4 with three of the hits going

IN THE ZONE: MSU's pitchers are leading the SEC with 23 looking strikeouts this season. Kenley Hawk ranks eighth nationally in strikeouts per seven innings (12.3).

LINEUP LOG: Samantha Ricketts used 33 different batting orders and 17 different fielding alignments in her starting lineups in 2021. She has used a unique card in every game this season, with 11 different batting orders and nine defensive alignments.

NEW LOOK FOR KENLEY: Kenley Hawk adopted a facemask this season and has looked like a different pitcher since. She's currently pitching to a 1.02 ERA, allowing just two earned runs, in 13.2 innings across five appearances this season.

RECORD WATCH: Mia Davidson broke the SEC career home run record this weekend with her 72nd long ball. She surpassed Florida's Lauren Haeger (71) in just 214 games, while Haeger set the record

HELLO HULL: Freshman Riley Hull batted .500 (7-for-14) last week with two doubles, a triple and four RBIs, including a career-high three-RBI game against Georgia Tech (Feb. 19).

OUR SAVIORS: Annie Willis and Matalasi Faapito have both recorded one save in State's three wins already this year.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

A complete NCAA box score and pertinent game facts are available to members of the working media following each game. Seats will be assigned, and masks covering the nose and mouth may be required, consistent with current university policy. A pregame meal is also served in the press box approximately one hour prior to each game.

The press box is divided into four separate work areas equipped with high-speed internet and telephone access. It is also set up to accommodate television and team radio/video personnel.

RADIO BROADCASTS

The Nusz Park press box houses radio lines to support home and visitor radio broadcasts. For more information on the phone lines, please contact Brian Ogden in the Communications office. Radio workspace will be contingent on available seating, but MSU will make every effort to accommodate visiting radio broadcasts.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Requested MSU players, along with head coach Samantha Ricketts, will be available for a postgame media session approximately 25 minutes after home games. For road games, phone interviews may be conducted postgame with advance notice. The Mississippi State locker room, indoor facility and field dugouts are closed to the media.

FAST FACTS

- Since 2016, MSU is 128-48 in Nusz Park (.727).
- Opening game at the MSU Softball Field came on Feb. 26, 1997, with the Bulldogs sweeping Samford in a doubleheader with back-to-back 4-0 scores.
- Nusz Park, a \$6 million project, includes 1,000 maroon chairback seats, in addition to an expanded concourse that includes new restrooms and concession stands.
- The Bulldogs' first action in the new digs came against Georgia Southern, a 6-0 victory on Feb. 11, 2016.
- MSU opened play at Nusz Park with six-straight victories, including a sweep of the Bulldog Kickoff.
- State captured its first SEC win at Nusz with a 6-3 win against eventual WCWS finalists and third-ranked Auburn on March 19.
- Nusz hosted the 2016 SEC Softball Tournament. The four-day event hosted 12 teams and a total of 11 games and drew praise from coaches across the league to ESPN and SEC Network officials.
- Over the 2018 season, Mississippi State posted a 24-10 record at Nusz Park, tying the program record for most home wins over a single season

TEAM NOTES

QUICK HITTERS

- Since 2016, MSU is 128-48 in Nusz Park (.727).
- Three of MSU's five wins have come via run-rule, and State is averaging 8.8 runs per game in its wins. The Bulldogs are averaging just 1.5 runs per game in their losses.
- Brylie St. Clair, Mia Davidson and Madisyn Kennedy are the trio of Bulldog starters who are batting .300 or better. Davidson leads the team at a .379 clip.
- Davidson also leads the team in slugging percentage (.828) with with a team-high seven extra-base hits this season (4 2B, 3 HR) after leading the team with 29 in 2021.
- Riley Hull has moved into a starting role last week and has hit .500 (7-for-14) since with two doubles, a triple and four RBIs.
- When there has been a runner on third with less than two outs, MSU has picked up an RBI 72.7 percent (16-of-22) of the time.

PITCHING POINTS

- The Bulldog pitching staff leads the SEC with 23 looking strikeouts this season
- The Bulldog pitching staff was second in the SEC with 417 strikeouts in 2021 and led the league with 109 looking strikeouts.
- Aspen Wesley has pitched to a 1.75 ERA in her last 11 outings (32.0 innings), dating back, to last year while going 5-1.
- Kenley Hawk struck out a career-high 13 batters in her first complete game last week. She is eighth nationally in strikeouts per seven innings (12.3).
- Hawk is currently pitching to a 1.02 ERA, allowing just two earned runs, in 13.2 innings across five appearances this season.

TACKLING A TOUGH SCHEDULE

- The Bulldogs are set to play 28 of their 55 games against teams that were ranked or receiving votes in either the NFCA Coaches' Poll or the ESPN/USA Softball Poll.
- 24 of those games will come in conference play, and 20 will come on the road or at neutral sites.
- Last year, MSU finished with the No. 8 strength of schedule in the nation and its opponents combined for a .650 winning percentage, which was fifth nationally.

STARTING FROM THE TOP

- Brylie St. Clair has safely reached in seven of the 12 innings she's led off (58.3 percent). As a team, State has reached safely to open the frame 51.5 percent of the time (35-for-68).
- Chloe Malau'ulu is second on the team, reaching in 53.8 percent of leadoff chances. Last year, she reached on 43.0 percent of her opportunities.
- State is 3-1 this season when St. Clair (3-1) or Malau'ulu (0-1) reach to open the game. The Bulldogs were 21-6 when Malau'ulu reached to open the game in 2021.

WE DON'T MOVE

- MSU ranked eighth nationally in hit-by-pitches (60) last year, which
 was fourth in the SEC. State is tied for the SEC lead so far this
 season with 14 hit batters, matching Arkansas.
- **Mia Davidson** is tied for No. 10 nationally with four hit-bypitches so far this season.
- Chloe Malau'ulu was tied for seventh in the SEC and sixth in MSU single-season history with 14 hit-by-pitches in 2021.
- The Bulldogs were hit by at least one pitch in 36 of 60 games last spring.

IN A PINCH

- Samantha Ricketts has a knack for calling on the right hitters
 off the bench. Her team is 6-for-11 (.545) when pinch hitting this
 season and her pinch hitters are batting at a .333 clip (23-for-69)
 in her career.
- The Bulldogs sent four pinch hitters to the plate in Game 2 against Alabama State (Feb. 16) and went 4-for-4 with three of the hits going for extra bases.

ALL HAIL THE QUEEN

- MSU legend Rafael Palmeiro likes to share his nickname "Thunder" with Mia Davidson, who last season broke his record for the most career home runs by an MSU baseball or softball player
- Davidson broke the SEC softball career record on Feb. 18 against Central Arkansas with her 72nd home run.
- Only 16 baseball and softball players in the history of the conference to have hit 60 career home runs, and only 10 have hit 65.
- MSU boasts three of the sluggers (Will Clark and Palmeiro) which is tied with Florida (Matt LaPorta, Lauren Haeger and Megan Bush).
- Davidson's 0.332 homers per game is fourth among the 10 hitters with 65 long balls behind Palmeiro (0.369), LaPorta (0.344) and LSU's Brad Cresse (.331).
- Davidson ranks fourth all-time between the two sports, trailing LSU's Eddy Furniss (80) and Brad Cresse (78) and Florida's Matt IaPorta (74)
- Only five NCAA softball players have ever hit 90 career home runs. Davidson, who trails only Oklahoma's Jocelyn Alo among active players, would be the sixth to reach the mark.

MIA'S MILESTONE WATCH

- Mia Davidson became the 12th Bulldog to reach 200 career hits, and is ninth in program history with 228. She needs two to match Caroline Seitz (203; 2014-17) for eighth.
- Davidson is second in school history with 183 career RBIs and needs 10 to tie Courtney Bures (193; 2005-08) for the MSU record.
- She boasts 494 total bases, which is third. McMichael is second with 505, and Kellie Wilkerson (1999-02) holds the record at 529.
- Davidson is fifth in school history with 37 runners caught stealing and holds the program record with 11 runners picked off for 48 total runners erased. Sam Lenahan (2011-14) holds the record for both runners caught stealing (49) and runners erased (54).

THE #RICKETTSEFFECT

- In five full seasons since Ricketts arrived (2015), the Bulldogs have broken the school record for home runs three times.
- The mark now stands at 72 home runs, set in 2019. The 2021 team hit 70 home runs, which ranks second, and gives Ricketts a hand in each of the top four seasons in school history.
- The Bulldogs are 14th nationally and fourth in the SEC since the start of the 2018 season with 237 home runs.
- Under Ricketts, State has homered in 53.6 percent of its games (208 of 388) and gone 151-57 in such contests. In 2021, MSU homered in 61.7 percent of its games, going 26-11 when doing so.

NEW LOOK FOR KENLEY

- Kenley Hawk looks like a different pitcher this season, both on the field and on the stat sheet.
- Hawk adopted a facemask over the summer after her play in the Florida Gulf Coast League was cut short by a ball hit to her face.
- She is currently pitching to a 1.02 ERA, allowing just two earned runs, in 13.2 innings across five appearances this season.
- That's a significant improvement from last year when Hawk threw just 8.1 innings and allowed 12 earned runs (10.08 ERA). She struck out nine and walked eight.

WORKING IN WESLEY

- Aspen Wesley is expected to take on an increased role in the circle this year splitting time alongside established ace Annie Willis. Willis is viewed at the team's No. 1A, while Wesley slots in at No. 1B.
- Wesley was third on the team last year in strikeouts (47) and made 22 appearances with nine starts.
- She finished the year as one of three State pitchers to ever post a 0.00 ERA in an NCAA Regional (min. 3.0 IP), tossing 5.0 scoreless frames and earning her first career postseason victory.
- Wesley has pitched to a 1.75 ERA in her last 11 outings (32.0 innings), dating back to last year while going 5-1 in that span.



ALL HAIL THE QUEEN

Mia Davidson, the SEC softball all-time career home run leader, is one of 10 SEC athletes, playing either baseball or softball, with 60 or more career home runs.

WONDERFUL WILLIS

- Annie Willis threw the 23rd no-hitter in program history and the second of her Bulldog career at Louisiana Tech (4/10).
- She is one of seven Bulldogs with multiple no-hitters in her career and the first to throw multiple 7.0 inning no-hitters.
- The game was her fifth 10-strikeout game as a Bulldog.
- State has thrown at least one no-hitter in every season since 2015, and Willis has thrown each of the last two.

NOTHING TOUCHES THE GRASS

- The Bulldog outfielders had arguably one of the best seasons in program history, leading the SEC with 15 outfield assists in 2021.
- MSU's assists ranked third in school history behind the 2002 (18) and 2010 (17) seasons.
- State's outfielders were tied with LSU for second in the conference with 232 total chances (Missouri, 239).

CHLOE CAPTAINS THE OUTFIELD

- Chloe Malau'ulu is the SEC's returning leader in outfield assists [7] and putouts [91] from last spring. Only Tennessee senior Cailin Hannon had more putouts [101] last year.
- Malau'ulu led the conference in outfield assists and total chances in the outfield as she displayed her versatility across all three positions. Only seven SEC outfielders recorded at least 80 chances, and of those, only three return in 2022.
- Of Malau'ulu's seven assists, six were runners thrown out at home plate.
- She was second in fielding percentage (.990) among league outfielders with at least 60 total chances trailing only Missouri's Casidy Chaumont who had an error-free campaign over 76 chances
- Her assists were tied for second in school history with lyhia McMichael's 2004 mark.

SETTLING NEW TERRITORY

- Samantha Ricketts has expanded the Bulldogs' recruiting reach in recent years
- Three current student-athletes are the first Bulldog from their state: Riley Hull (Kentucky), Kenley Hawk (Arkansas) and Grace Fagan (New Jersey).
- One of MSU's recent hotbeds has been the state of North Carolina. The first player from the state arrived in Starkville in 2014, and there have been seven total student-athletes from the Tar Heel State. Four of those seven are currently on the roster in Mia Davidson, Montana Davidson, Allison Florian and Phoebe Florian.
- Additionally, Bri Bower is the first Bulldog from Illinois since Alexis Silkwood graduated in 2014, and Addison Purvis is the first from the state of Missouri since Nakita Boyce graduated in 2008

NEW NAMES TO KNOW

- 2021 NJCAA Player of the Year Shea Moreno has enrolled at MSU after spending last season at Seminole State College in Oklahoma where she led the nation with a .673 batting average, .709 on-base percentage and 1.280 slugging percentage.
- In addition to her Player of the Year honors, Moreno was named a First Team All-American.
- 2021 NFCA National Freshman of the Year Finalist Matalasi
 Faapito has also joined the Bulldogs from New Mexico State.
 Faapito was the only player in the country to both hit 16 or more
 homers and strike out 60 or more batters in 2021.
- While not a newcomer, Mia Davidson married Sean Smith in December 2021 and now officially goes by Mia Davidson-Smith off the softball field. She will continue to use only Davidson on her jersey and for statistical purposes.

ENDING ON A HIGH

- Mia Davidson turned in a career-best 22-game reached base streak from last year through the first two games of 2022. It is the 19th streak of 20 or more games in program history.
- Davidson joined Chloe Malau ulu (28 games) in 2021 as the first Bulldogs with a 20-game reached-base streak since 2015.
- Madisyn Kennedy batted .364 in the 2021 Stillwater Regional with an .727 slugging percentage, both of which were second on the team. Defensively, she threw out two runners at the plate.

LATE-SEASON SURGE

- MSU won its final seven straight SEC games and its first SEC Tournament game to put together an eight-game winning streak.
- State's pitchers posted a 1.50 ERA over the streak while the offense scored 6.4 runs per game.
- In the same span, State picked up an RBI 60.0 percent of the time with a runner on third and less than two outs.
- MSU batted .288 with two outs during the streak, up 44 points from it's season average.
- State's seven consecutive victories in conference play was tied with the 1999 season for the second-longest SEC winning streak in program history behind a nine-game stretch in 2001.

WIN THE LATE INNINGS

- The Bulldogs had 10 comeback victories in 2021 and made up as large as a six-run deficit. Four of those victories came when trailing after the fifth.
- At North Alabama (Apr. 3, 2021), State recorded its largest comeback victory since erasing a six-run deficit against Alabama (W, 8-6) on April 9, 2004. MSU hit two home runs and scored five runs in the sixth inning to spark the comeback.
- The sixth inning was MSU's best inning, producing its highest batting average (.311) and its lowest ERA (2.24) and opponents' average (.222) of any frame. State outscored opponents, 40-16, in the sixth.
- The Bulldogs went 27-2 when leading after four innings and 21-0 when leading after five last year.

#NOONEFIGHTSALONE

- Honoring the legendary spirit of the late Alex Wilcox, Mississippi State will continue its "No One Fights Alone" campaign throughout the 2021 softball season.
- The Bulldogs will continue to wear teal uniforms throughout the season to raise awareness for ovarian cancer in honor of the former softball student-athlete who passed away in 2018 at the age of 18 after a courageous fight with the disease.
- MSU immortalized Wilcox last fall by retiring her No. 8 jersey on Sept. 15, 2018, making Wilcox the first female student-athlete in Mississippi State history to have her jersey retired.
- A permanent graphical fixture on the right field wall at Nusz Park was installed to commemorate Wilcox. The Bulldogs also re-branded the annual February Freezer tournament and now host the The Snowman: Alex Wilcox Memorial tournament in February.

- Has been a part of one Women's College World Series appearance, seven NCAA Regional berths and two NCAA Super Regional appearances during her coaching career.
- In 2019, MSU was one of two teams in the nation (Arizona) to boast multiple hitters with 20 or more home runs.
- The Bulldogs shattered the school record for home runs (72) and posted the second-highest slugging percentage in school history (.484) in 2019.
- For the first time since 2008, State produced multiple NFCA All-Americans in 2019 (Fa Leilua and Mia Davidson).
- Davidson was the lone player in the conference to record at least 60 RBIs, 60 hits and 50 runs scored in 2019.
- Davidson then broke Rafael Palmeiro's mark for the most home runs in a career by a Bulldog baseball or softball player in 2021 and entered the 2022 season just two long balls shy of the SEC softball career record
- Four of the top five single-season home run totals in program history have come under Ricketts' watch, and the Bulldogs have broken the season record four times.
- MSU has hit at least one home run in 52.8 percent of its games (197-of-373) entering 2022 since Ricketts arrived as an assistant.

- In her first season of 2015, the Bulldogs set new single-season records for home runs (54), batting average (.312), slugging percentage (.495), RBI (294) and on-base percentage (.416).
