## SERIES HISTORY

OVERALL: 37-1 | CURRENT STREAK: Won 29 | LAST MEETING: Feb. 24, 2021 in Starkville, Miss. (MSU 10, MVSU 2 [6])

ABOUT MISSISSIPPI VALLEY STATE: The Bulldogs have won three of the last four meetings with MVSU by run-rule while allowing just eight combined hits to the Devillettes under head coach Samantha Ricketts. Most notably, in 2020, Annie Willis struck out 19 MVSU hitters on her way to a no-hitter with only two batters reaching on error. MVSU is among the nation's top 40 teams in stolen bases (1.75 per game). In the circle, A'tajua Wren holds the best walks per seven innings mark in the SWAC (1.38), and she tossed her first career shutout on Saturday.

## LEADING OFF

ALL HAIL THE QUEEN: Mia Davidson leads the SEC in home runs (8), slugging percentage (1.095) and total bases (46). She is second nationally in home runs, fifth in total bases and seventh in slugging percentage.

RECORD WATCH: Davidson is second in school history with 192 career RBIs and needs one to tie Courtney Bures' (2005-08) school record. She boasts 516 total bases, which is second behind Kellie Wilkerson's (1999-02) MSU record of 529.

JACK IS BACK: Jackie McKenna batted .455 (5-for-11) with a pair of home runs last week in The Snowman, and her six RBIs trailed only Davidson (8) on the team.

IN THE ZONE: Kenley Hawk is currently pitching to a 0.85 ERA, which is No. 39 nationally, and has allowed just three earned runs, in 24.2 innings this season. She is No. 23 nationally in strikeouts per seven innings (10.8).

SIXTH SENSE: The Bulldogs are hitting .404 and slugging .654 in the sixth inning, the highest of any frame. In the circle, MSU pitchers are holding opponents to a .095 batting average in the sixth.

WESLEY'S WHIP: Aspen Wesley boasts a 0.86 WHIP and in among the top 100 in the nation in both hits per seven innings (4.34) and walks per seven innings (0.97).

KEEPING IT 100: Samantha Ricketts secured the best record of any Bulldog head coach through their first 100 games (66-34), which is also tied for third among active SEC head coaches.

LINEUP LOG: Ricketts has used a unique lineup card in every game this season, with a different batting order in all 16 games and 12 defensive alignments. Last year, she used 33 different batting orders and 17 different fielding alignments.

OFF THE BENCH: This season, Ricketts is averaging using 14.3 players per game, the highest rate of her head coaching career.

## SOFTBALL MEDIA PORTAL

## PRESS BOX SERVICES

A complete NCAA box score and pertinent game facts are available to members of the working media following each game. Seats will be assigned, and masks covering the nose and mouth may be required, consistent with current university policy. A pregame meal is also served in the press box approximately one hour prior to each game.

The press box is divided into four separate work areas equipped with high-speed internet and telephone access. It is also set up to accommodate television and team radio/video personnel.

## RADIO BROADCASTS

The Nusz Park press box houses radio lines to support home and visitor radio broadcasts. For more information on the phone lines, please contact Brian Ogden in the Communications office. Radio workspace will be contingent on available seating, but MSU will make every effort to accommodate visiting radio broadcasts.

## POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Requested MSU players, along with head coach Samantha Ricketts, will be available for a postgame media session approximately 25 minutes after home games. For road games, phone interviews may be conducted postgame with advance notice. The Mississippi State locker room, indoor facility and field dugouts are closed to the media.

## FAST FACTS

- Since 2016, MSU is 132-49 in Nusz Park (.729).
- Opening game at the MSU Softball Field came on Feb. 26, 1997, with the Bulldogs sweeping Samford in a doubleheader with back-to-back 4-0 scores.
- Nusz Park, a \$6 million project, includes 1,000 maroon chairback seats, in addition to an expanded concourse that includes new restrooms and concession stands.
- The Bulldogs' first action in the new digs came against Georgia Southern, a 6-0 victory on Feb. 11, 2016.
- MSU opened play at Nusz Park with six-straight victories, including a sweep of the Bulldog Kickoff.
- State captured its first SEC win at Nusz with a 6-3 win against eventual WCWS finalists and third-ranked Auburn on March 19.
- Nusz hosted the 2016 SEC Softball Tournament. The four-day event hosted 12 teams and a total of 11 games and drew praise from coaches across the league to ESPN and SEC Network officials.
- Over the 2018 season, Mississippi State posted a 24-10 record at Nusz Park, tying the program record for most home wins over a single season.

## TEAM NOTES

## QUICK HITTERS

- Since 2016, MSU is 132-49 in Nusz Park (.729).
- Five of MSU's nine wins have come via run-rule, and State is averaging 8.7 runs per game in its wins. The Bulldogs are averaging just 1.4 runs per game in their losses.
- State is tied for eighth nationally with Georgia in home runs (21), and the Bulldogs rank No. 17 in home runs per game (1.31) and No. 24 in shutouts (4).
- **Mia Davidson** leads the SEC in home runs (8), slugging percentage (1.095) and total bases (46). She is second nationally in home runs, fifth in total bases and seventh in slugging percentage.
- Davidson has a team-high 12 extra-base hits this season (4 2B, 8 HR) after leading the team with 29 in 2021.
- **Jackie McKenna** batted .455 (5-for-11) with a pair of home runs last week in The Snowman, and her six RBIs trailed only Davidson (8) on the team.

## PITCHING POINTS

- The Bulldog pitching staff is second in the SEC with 31 looking strikeouts this season.
- The Bulldog pitching staff was second in the SEC with 417 strikeouts in 2021 and led the league with 109 looking strikeouts.
- **Aspen Wesley** has pitched to a 1.24 ERA in her last 13 outings (45.0 innings), dating back, to last year while going 7-1.
- **Kenley Hawk** and Wesley have combined to throw four complete games, going 3-1 in such contests. The only loss came in a 1-0 defeat for Hawk at the hands of South Alabama where she allowed three hits.

## TACKLING A TOUGH SCHEDULE

- The Bulldogs are set to play 28 of their 55 games against teams that were ranked or receiving votes in either the NFCA Coaches' Poll or the ESPN/USA Softball Poll.
- 24 of those games will come in conference play, and 20 will come on the road or at neutral sites.
- The Bulldogs past and future opponents have combined for a .692 winning percentage this season, which ranks fourth in the nation.
- Last year, MSU finished with the No. 8 strength of schedule in the nation and its opponents combined for a .650 winning percentage, which was fifth nationally.

## STARTING FROM THE TOP

- **Chloe Malau'ulu** has reached base safely in 45.5 percent (10-of-22) of the innings she's led off. Last year, she reached on 43.0 percent of her opportunities.
- **Brylie St. Clair** has safely reached in eight of the 16 innings she's led off (50.0 percent).
- State is 4-2 this season when St. Clair (3-1) or Malau'ulu (1-1) reach to open the game. The Bulldogs were 21-6 when Malau'ulu reached to open the game in 2021.

## MIA'S MILESTONE WATCH

- **Mia Davidson** became the 12th Bulldog to reach 200 career hits, and is ninth in program history with 235. She needs 20 to match Michelle Gates (255; 1997-00) for seventh.
- Davidson is second in school history with 192 career RBIs and needs one to tie Courtney Bures' (2005-08) school record.
- She boasts 516 total bases, which is second behind Kellie Wilkerson's (1999-02) MSU record of 529.
- Davidson is fifth in school history with 37 runners caught stealing and holds the program record with 11 runners picked off for 48 total runners erased. Sam Lenahan (2011-14) holds the record for both runners caught stealing (49) and runners erased (54).

## ALL HAIL THE QUEEN

- MSU legend Rafael Palmeiro likes to share his nickname "Thunder" with **Mia Davidson**, who last season broke his record for the most career home runs by an MSU baseball or softball player
- Davidson broke the SEC softball career record on Feb. 18 against Central Arkansas with her 72nd home run. She now has 77.
- Only 16 baseball and softball players in the history of the conference to have hit 60 career home runs, and only 10 have hit 65.
- MSU boasts three of the sluggers (Will Clark and Palmeiro) which is tied for the league lead with Florida (Matt LaPorta, Lauren Haeger and Megan Bush).
- Davidson's 0.347 homers per game is second among the 10 hitters with 65 long balls behind only Palmeiro (0.369).
- Davidson ranks third all-time between the two sports, trailing LSU's Eddy Furniss (80) and Brad Cresse (78).
- Only five NCAA softball players have ever hit 90 career home runs. Davidson, who trails only Oklahoma's Jocelyn Alo among active players, would be the sixth to reach the mark.

## DAVIDSON'S DOMINANT DAY

- **Mia Davidson** had a career day on Feb. 25 against Longwood and Belmont.
- She tied her career-high and the MSU single-game record with three home runs against Longwood, including a grand slam, and collected a career-high six RBIs against the Lancers while going 4-for-4.
- Her six RBIs are tied for the third most in MSU single-game history and the most since Kat Moore had six against Alabama (March 31, 2019).
- The grand slam was the third of her career, which ties the MSU career record. She is one of four Bulldogs with three career grand slams.

## THE #RICKETTSEFFECT

- In five full seasons since Ricketts arrived (2015), the Bulldogs have broken the school record for home runs three times.
- The mark now stands at 72 home runs, set in 2019. The 2021 team hit 70 home runs, which ranks second, and gives Ricketts a hand in each of the top four seasons in school history.
- Currently, MSU is averaging 1.31 homers per game. With 55 regular-season games on the schedule, State is on pace for a school-record-tying 72-homer season.
- The Bulldogs are 14th nationally and fourth in the SEC since the start of the 2018 season with 251 home runs.
- Under Ricketts, State has homered in 53.9 percent of its games (212 of 393) and gone 155-57 in such contests. The Bulldogs have hit at least one home run in every game they've won this season.

## ALL HAIL THE QUEEN

**Mia Davidson**, the SEC softball all-time career home run leader, is one of 10 SEC athletes, playing either baseball or softball, with 60 or more career home runs.

Davidson holds MSU's career record for baseball and softball along with softball's single-season record (26, 2019) and freshman record (19, 2018).

## IN A PINCH

- **Samantha Ricketts** has a knack for calling on the right hitters off the bench. Her team is 8-for-15 (.533) when pinch hitting this season and her pinch hitters are batting at a .342 clip (25-for-73) in her career.
- The Bulldogs sent four pinch hitters to the plate in Game 2 against Alabama State (Feb. 16) and went 4-for-4 with three of the hits going for extra bases.

## NEW LOOK FOR KENLEY

- **Kenley Hawk** looks like a different pitcher this season, both on the field and on the stat sheet.
- Hawk adopted a facemask over the summer after her play in the Florida Gulf Coast League was cut short by a ball hit to her face.
- She is currently pitching to a 0.85 ERA, which is No. 39 nationally, and has allowed just three earned runs, in 24.2 innings this season.
- Hawk is No. 23 nationally in strikeouts per seven innings (10.8).
- That's a significant improvement from last year when Hawk threw just 8.1 innings and allowed 12 earned runs (10.08 ERA). She struck out nine and walked eight.

## WESLEY WHIPPING IT

- **Aspen Wesley** boasts a 0.86 WHIP and in among the top 100 in the nation in both hits per seven innings (4.34) and walks per seven innings (0.97).
- Wesley tossed her first two complete-game shutouts in back-to-back starts last week in The Snowman, allowing just four total hits in the tournament.
- She has now gone a career-best 14.2 consecutive innings without allowing a run.
- She has pitched to a 1.24 ERA in her last 13 outings (45.0 innings), dating back to last year while going 7-1 in that span.

- **Annie Willis** threw the 23rd no-hitter in program history and the second of her Bulldog career at Louisiana Tech (4/10).
- She is one of seven Bulldogs with multiple no-hitters in her career and the first to throw multiple 7.0 inning no-hitters.
- The game was her fifth 10-strikeout game as a Bulldog.
- State has thrown at least one no-hitter in every season since 2015, and Willis has thrown each of the last two.

- She's especially known for getting creative with the flex and offensive player positions to increase the number of players that get in the game.
- This season, Ricketts is averaging using 14.3 players per game, the highest rate of her head coaching career.
- The Bulldogs carry 23 players on their roster with five who only pitch and 18 hitters.

## WIN THE LATE INNINGS

- Once again, the sixth inning is proving to be State's strongest. The Bulldogs are hitting .404 and slugging .654 in the sixth, the highest of any frame. In the circle, MSU pitchers are holding opponents to a .095 batting average in the sixth.
- Last year, the sixth inning was also MSU's best inning, producing its highest batting average (.311) and its lowest ERA (2.24) and opponents' average (.222) of any frame. State outscored opponents, 40-16, in the sixth.
- The Bulldogs had 10 comeback victories in 2021 and made up as large as a six-run deficit. Four of those victories came when trailing after the fifth.
- The Bulldogs went 27-2 when leading after four innings and 21-0 when leading after five last year.

## NOTHING TOUCHES THE GRASS

- The Bulldog outfielders had arguably one of the best seasons in program history, leading the SEC with 15 outfield assists in 2021.
- MSU's assists ranked third in school history behind the 2002 (18) and 2010 (17) seasons.
- State's outfielders were tied with LSU for second in the conference with 232 total chances (Missouri, 239).

## SETTLING NEW TERRITORY

- **Samantha Ricketts** has expanded the Bulldogs' recruiting reach in recent years.
- Three current student-athletes are the first Bulldog from their state: **Riley Hull** (Kentucky), **Kentley Hawk** (Arkansas) and **Grace Fagan** (New Jersey).
- One of MSU's recent hotbeds has been the state of North Carolina. The first player from the state arrived in Starkville in 2014, and there have been seven total student-athletes from the Tar Heel State. Four of those seven are currently on the roster in **Mia Davidson**, **Montana Davidson**, **Allison Florian** and **Phoebe Florian**.
- Additionally, **Bri Bower** is the first Bulldog from Illinois since Alexis Silkwood graduated in 2014, and **Addison Purvis** is the first from the state of Missouri since Nakita Boyce graduated in 2008.

## NEW NAMES TO KNOW

- 2021 NJCAA Player of the Year **Shea Moreno** has enrolled at MSU after spending last season at Seminole State College in Oklahoma where she led the nation with a .673 batting average, .709 on-base percentage and 1.280 slugging percentage.
- In addition to her Player of the Year honors, Moreno was named a First Team All-American.
- 2021 NFCA National Freshman of the Year Finalist **Matalasi Faapito** has also joined the Bulldogs from New Mexico State. Faapito was the only player in the country to both hit 16 or more homers and strike out 60 or more batters in 2021.
- While not a newcomer, **Mia Davidson** married Sean Smith in December 2021 and now officially goes by Mia Davidson-Smith off the softball field. She will continue to use only Davidson on her jersey and for statistical purposes.

## CHLOE CAPTAINS THE OUTFIELD

- **Chloe Malau'ulu** is the SEC's returning leader in outfield assists (7) and putouts (91) from last spring. Only Tennessee senior Cailin Hannon had more putouts (101) last year.
- Malau'ulu led the conference in outfield assists and total chances in the outfield as she displayed her versatility across all three positions. Only seven SEC outfielders recorded at least 80 chances, and of those, only three return in 2022.
- Of Malau'ulu's seven assists, six were runners thrown out at home plate.
- She was second in fielding percentage (.990) among league outfielders with at least 60 total chances trailing only Missouri's Cassidy Chaumont who had an error-free campaign over 76 chances.
- Her assists were tied for second in school history with Iyhia McMichael's 2004 mark.

## ENDING ON A HIGH

- **Mia Davidson** turned in a career-best 22-game reached base streak from last year through the first two games of 2022. It is the 19th streak of 20 or more games in program history.
- Davidson joined **Chloe Malau'ulu** (28 games) in 2021 as the first Bulldogs with a 20-game reached-base streak since 2015.
- **Madisyn Kennedy** batted .364 in the 2021 Stillwater Regional with an .727 slugging percentage, both of which were second on the team. Defensively, she threw out two runners at the plate.

## #NOONEFIGHTSALONE

- Honoring the legendary spirit of the late Alex Wilcox, Mississippi State will continue its "No One Fights Alone" campaign throughout the 2021 softball season.
- The Bulldogs will continue to wear teal uniforms throughout the season to raise awareness for ovarian cancer in honor of the former softball student-athlete who passed away in 2018 at the age of 18 after a courageous fight with the disease.
- MSU immortalized Wilcox last fall by retiring her No. 8 jersey on Sept. 15, 2018, making Wilcox the first female student-athlete in Mississippi State history to have her jersey retired.
- A permanent graphical fixture on the right field wall at Nusz Park was installed to commemorate Wilcox. The Bulldogs also re-branded the annual February Freezer tournament and now host the The Snowman: Alex Wilcox Memorial tournament in February.

## LATE-SEASON SURGE

- MSU won its final seven straight SEC games and its first SEC Tournament game to put together an eight-game winning streak.
- State's pitchers posted a 1.50 ERA over the streak while the offense scored 6.4 runs per game.
- In the same span, State picked up an RBI 60.0 percent of the time with a runner on third and less than two outs.
- MSU batted .288 with two outs during the streak, up 44 points from its season average.
- State's seven consecutive victories in conference play was tied with the 1999 season for the second-longest SEC winning streak in program history behind a nine-game stretch in 2001.

## MAROON AND WHITE

- Named the sixth head softball coach in program history on July 22, 2019
- Became the fastest head coach in program history to reach 20 wins, doing so in 23 games. Started 9-1, marking the best 10-game start by a head coach in program history.
- Became the first first-year head coach to lead the nation in wins (25 in 2020) since at least 1989.
- Is the only coach in program history to have her team nationally ranked at some point during her first year and led MSU to its highest final ranking in program history (No. 20).
- Earned first career coaching victory in first career game on Feb. 7, 2020, against Missouri State (5-0).
- In her second season, led MSU to its 16th NCAA Regional and third consecutive Regional Championship game.
- Has coached at least three players to All-Region honors in each of the last three seasons.
- Served as an assistant coach from 2015-18 focusing on hitting and recruiting before being promoted to associate head coach.
- Has been a part of one Women's College World Series appearance, seven NCAA Regional berths and two NCAA Super Regional appearances during her coaching career.
- In 2019, MSU was one of two teams in the nation (Arizona) to boast multiple hitters with 20 or more home runs.
- The Bulldogs shattered the school record for home runs (72) and posted the second-highest slugging percentage in school history (.484) in 2019.
- For the first time since 2008, State produced multiple NFCA All-Americans in 2019 (Fa Leilua and Mia Davidson).
- Davidson was the lone player in the conference to record at least 60 RBIs, 60 hits and 50 runs scored in 2019.
- Davidson then broke Rafael Palmeiro's mark for the most home runs in a career by a Bulldog baseball or softball player in 2021 and entered the 2022 season just two long balls shy of the SEC softball career record.
- Four of the top five single-season home run totals in program history have come under Ricketts' watch, and the Bulldogs have broken the season record four times.
- MSU has hit at least one home run in 52.8 percent of its games (197-of-373) entering 2022 since Ricketts arrived as an assistant.
- In 2017, Ricketts produced five starters that hit .300 or better to help lead the Bulldogs to an NCAA Regional and Caroline Seitz became the first Bulldog to earn First Team All-SEC honors since Chelsea Bramlett in 2010.
- During the 2016 season, she led Kayla Winkfield to an SEC-leading six triples, which ranked among the nation's top 10.
- In her first season of 2015, the Bulldogs set new single-season records for home runs (54), batting average (.312), slugging percentage (.495), RBI (294) and on-base percentage (.416).

## WICHITA STATE UNIVERSITY

- Served as assistant coach at Wichita State from 2012-14, working with the team's hitters and consistently improving their production
- Her last spring at WSU saw the Shockers increase their overall win total by 15 from 2013 to 2014 and win the program's first regular-season conference title
- Part of the 2014 MVC Coaching Staff of the Year, helping to improve the Shockers from the ninth place in 2012, to eighth place in 2013, to MVC champs in 2014
- Produced five starters who each hit better than .300 in 2014 after the squad did not have a batter hit over .300 in 2013
