OPPONENT NOTABLES

Sam Landry threw a no-hitter in the Ragin' Cajuns' second game of the year. She opened the season with 10.0 consecutive scoreless innings pitched. Louisiana scored 67 percent of its runs (30 of 45) with two outs. Brooke Ellestad and Sophie Piskos led the way offensively with identical .438 batting averages (7-for-16) and 11 combined RBIs. Mihiyia Davis was the 2023 Sun Belt Freshman of the Year and was picked as the league's Preseason Player of the Year. She led the nation with 52 stolen bases in 2023. Fourteen of Louisiana's 45 runs have been scored in the first inning this year.

LEADING OFF

**HITS HARD TO COME BY:** State threw the first pair of back-to-back no-hitters in school history against IUPUI on Feb. 9-10. **Josey Marron** tossed the 24th in program history and her first, while **Matalasi Faapito** threw the 25th and her second, dating back to her time at New Mexico State. Louisiana also saw Sam Landry throw a no-hitter over the weekend against California.

**HOME SWEET HOME:** State has now won 11 consecutive home openers while throwing shutouts in six of those games. The Bulldogs have outscored those opponents, 100-19, in that span. They are now 168-68 at home since Nusz Park opened in 2016.

**WHAT'S COOKIN':** **Paige Cook** is riding a six-game hitting streak that has seen her go 7-for-9 at the plate with four homers and a pair of doubles. Her career-long streak is eight games, and she has reached base in 11 straight, one shy of her career best.

**THE TARYNE TREATMENT:** New pitching coach **Taryne Mowatt-McKinney** has the Bulldogs ranked ninth nationally in ERA (0.32), and the Bulldogs were one of only two teams not to walk a batter on Opening Weekend. State has struck out 30 of the 66 batters the Bulldogs have retired.

**WELCOME TO THE SHOW:** State's freshman class was the No. 10 class in the nation when they signed in the fall of 2022. Five of State's six freshmen were Extra Inning Softball Top 100 recruits. Those freshman are a combined 8-for-27 (.296) with three doubles, two homers and eight RBIs.

**MAGIC NUMBER:** MSU is 53-2 over the last two years when scoring five or more runs. State scored at least five in 25 of its 27 wins of 2023 and has done so in all four games of 2024.

**TAKING ON TOP TEAMS:** The Bulldogs played a program-record 25 games against 11 ranked opponents in the 2023 regular season. This year's schedule features 19 games against eight teams ranked in the NFCA Preseason Coaches' Poll. State will face four of those teams in February alone.

**SIMILAR SLUGGER STORYLINES:** **Madisyn Kennedy** and **Paige Cook** rank ninth and 10th in school history, respectively, in career home runs. They've had very similar offseasons as both missed fall practice while rehabbing from offseason surgeries. Both homered in their first weekend back on the field and are separated by just one blast in the record books.

SOFTBALL MEDIA PORTAL

Mississippi State has created an online portal for media members covering the Bulldogs' softball program. To access the portal, visit [hailstat.at/SBMedia](https://hailstat.at/SBMedia). The Softball Press Box Page of HailState.com includes links to credential request forms, media guides, quick facts, game notes, box scores, recaps and team and staff headshots.

CREDENTIALS

Working media must apply for single-game credentials at least 24 hours in advance by visiting [hailstat.at/SBCreds](https://hailstat.at/SBCreds). Seats will be assigned to credentialed media members. Space is limited inside the Nusz Park press box. Indoor seating priority will be given to team staff, broadcast personnel, production staff and those media members who regularly cover the program. Auxillary seating is located at the top of Section 104.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/VIDEOGRAPHERS

Photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot around Nusz Park in approved areas. Those wishing to shoot a game should meet with Brian Ogden in the press box before the game to be granted field access.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

A complete NCAA box score and pertinent game facts are available to members of the working media following the conclusion of each game. Media members also have access to game notes, statistics, lineups and rosters prior to the start of each game upon request. A pregame meal is also served in the press box approximately one hour prior to each game.

The press box is divided into four separate work areas, with each equipped with high-speed internet and telephone access. It is also set up to accommodate television and team video personnel.

RADIO BROADCASTS

The Nusz Park press box houses radio lines to support home and visitor radio broadcasts. For more information on the phone lines, please contact Brian Ogden in the Communications office.

FAST FACTS

- » Since 2016, MSU is 168-68 in Nusz Park (.712).
- » Opening game at the MSU Softball Field came on Feb. 26, 1997, with the Bulldogs sweeping Samford in a doubleheader.
- » Nusz Park, a \$6 million project, includes 1,000 maroon chairback seats, in addition to an expanded concourse that includes new restrooms and concession stands.
- » The Bulldogs' first action in the new digs came against Georgia Southern, a 6-0 victory on Feb. 11, 2016.
- » MSU opened play at Nusz Park with six-straight victories, including a sweep of the Bulldog Kickoff.
- » State captured its first SEC win at Nusz with a 6-3 win against eventual WCWS finalists and third-ranked Auburn on March 19.
- » Nusz hosted the 2016 SEC Softball Tournament. The four-day event hosted 12 teams and a total of 11 games and drew praise from coaches across the league to ESPN and SEC Network officials.
- » On May 27, 2022 the largest college softball crowd in the history of the state of Mississippi descended on Nusz Park for the Bulldogs' Super Regional with Arizona (2,209). The next day the record was again broken (2,299) where it now stands today.

Telephone interviews can also be scheduled with players on a call-back basis during the week with arrangements made through Brian Ogden.

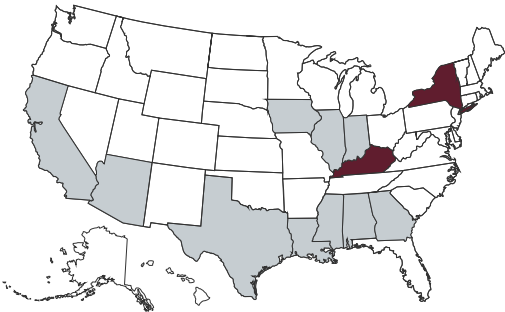

**WALKS:** Bulldog pitchers have not walked a batter yet this season. Meanwhile, they've struck out 30 batters in 22.0 innings (66 outs). Only Alabama State also has zero walks this year.

**TEAM AVERAGE:** State ranks fifth nationally with a .420 batting average. The Bulldogs also boast a .505 on-base percentage that is sixth nationally and a .682 slugging percentage that's seventh.

**NO-HITTERS:** The last time MSU threw no-hitters on consecutive days came in, 1997, for the first two in school history. On Feb. 9-10, 2024, State threw its first no-hitters in consecutive games.

## TEAM NOTES

## QUICK HITTERS

- » **Aquana Brownlee** ranks 10th nationally and second in the SEC with a .714 batting average. She is 4-for-5 (.800) with runners in scoring position.
- » **Kylee Edwards** hit .500 in her first collegiate action, including a home run on the first pitch she saw in her career. Edwards is leading the team with a 1.125 slugging percentage.
- » **Paige Cook** leads the team with four two-out RBIs.
- » State tied the school record with 17 sacrifice flies in 2023. Cook hit four, which was tied for third in MSU history and one shy of the individual record.
- » **Riley Hull** walked in 22.1 percent of her plate appearances last year, which ranked 15th in the nation and third in the SEC.

## WHAT'S COOKIN'

- » **Paige Cook** has been on a tear lately. She's riding a six-game hitting streak that is just two shy of her career-long streak. She's reached base in 11 consecutive games, which is one shy of her career best.
- » Cook was sidelined midway through her streak by a torn ACL and her rehab process, but she hasn't missed a beat in her return.
- » Over the course of the streak she is 7-for-9 (.778) with four homers and two doubles. She boasts a 2.333 slugging percentage, has driven in 10 runs and has been walked or hit by a pitch seven times.

## ENDING ON A HIGH

- » **Madisyn Kennedy** got hot over the final two weeks of 2023, leading the team in batting average (.333) and OPS (1.300).
- » She hit four homers and a double and drove in a team-high seven runs in that span.
- » Kennedy opened her 2024 campaign with a solo homer in her first at-bat. She later added a pinch-hit RBI double on Opening Weekend.

## EVERYBODY UP!

- » State batted around in eight innings in 2023, and the Bulldogs have already done so twice on Opening Weekend.
- » State scored eight runs in second inning against IUPUI (Feb. 10), sending 11 batters to the plate.

## THE TARYNE TREATMENT

- » State's pitching staff had about as impressive an opening weekend as they could get under new pitching coach **Taryne Mowatt-McKinney**.
- » The Bulldogs were one of two teams nationally not to allow a walk, and they recorded 30 strikeouts.
- » MSU's 0.32 team ERA ranks ninth nationally, and their nine hits allowed also rank ninth.
- » Mowatt-McKinney also called the pitches in the first back-to-back no-hitters in school history over the weekend.

## SWEET NOTHINGS

- » **Josey Marron** and **Matalasi Faapito** threw consecutive no-hitters, shutting down IUPUI on Feb. 9-10.
- » It was the first time State had no-hitters on consecutive days since the first two in school history on March 1-2, 1997, and it was the first time ever the Bulldogs have done so in consecutive games.
- » The duo turned in identical lines, allowing one baserunner on an error, but striking out nine of the 16 batters they faced in the shutouts.

## BULLPEN BULLETS

- » The Bulldogs have held opponents to a .074 batting average with two outs.
- » **Josey Marron** and **Aspen Wesley** accounted for six of State's eight complete games in 2023.
- » Wesley was among the top 10 pitchers nationally last year with a fielding-independent pitching mark, which estimates a pitcher's ERA without the results of balls in play, of 1.42 (10th).
- » **Matalasi Faapito** has homered while she is pitching seven times in her MSU career (40 appearances).

## MARRON LEAVES HER MARK

- » MSU's freshman pitching records were on the ropes in 2023 thanks to **Josey Marron**.
- » She matched the then-MSU single-game freshman record for strikeouts (13) against Furman (2/26/23).
- » Her season strikeout total ranked among the top five freshman campaigns in school history.

## JOSEY JUST WINS

- » **Josey Marron** won each of her first six career starts and is currently 9-2 with the losses to No. 1 Oklahoma and No. 10 Arkansas. In her 14 career starts, MSU is 12-2.
- » Marron has thrown four complete games, including three solo shutouts against IUPUI (2/9/24), South Florida (2/19/23) and Furman (2/26/23).
- » She ranked among the top 45 nationally last year in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.28; 26th), strikeout rate (28.3%; 39th), strikeouts per seven innings (8.38; 41st) and FIP (1.84; 24th).

## TAKING ON TOP TEAMS

- » Mississippi State played 11 NFCA-ranked teams in 25 games last year, which was a program record in the regular season.
- » This year's schedule features 19 games against eight teams ranked in the NFCA Preseason Coaches' Poll.
- » State will face four of those teams in February alone.

## THE #RICKETTSEFFECT

- » In nine full seasons since Ricketts arrived (2015), the Bulldogs have broken the school record for home runs four times, and each of the top five marks in school history came under her watch.
- » State broke the record with 73 in 2022, which gives Ricketts a hand in all three 70-homer seasons in school history.
- » The Bulldogs hit 72 homers in 2019 and 70 home runs in 2021.
- » The Bulldogs are 19th nationally since the start of the 2018 season with 356 home runs.
- » Under Ricketts, State has homered in 54.7 percent of its games (272 of 497) and gone 196-76 in such contests.

- » **Riley Hull** has been one of the most-reliable defenders in program history. Her career .992 fielding percentage would be a school record.
- » Hull is one of five players in program history to put together an error-less streak of 200 or more consecutive chances, going a career-best 297 chances error-free from April 10, 2022-March 5, 2023.
- » She is currently on a 114-chance run without an error.

## NEVER OUT OF IT

- » Since **Samantha Ricketts** took charge of the program, no lead has been safe for State's opponents.
- » In the program's modern era (since 1997), there have been just nine comeback victories after trailing by five or more runs, and Ricketts has led four of those.
- » Prior to the Ricketts Era, State's last five-run comeback victory was against Ole Miss on March 20, 2015 (trailing 6-1, won 8-6).
- » On April 3, 2021, Ricketts led the Bulldogs to a 9-7 victory at North Alabama after trailing 7-1, entering the sixth inning. Erasing the six-run deficit marked the largest comeback in program history since trailing 6-0 in the sixth inning of an eventual 8-6 win against then-No. 10 Alabama on April 9, 2004.

## EXTRA INNINGS EXCELLENCE

- » MSU was 4-0 in extra innings in 2023, which was the best record in the SEC. Tennessee was also undefeated, going 2-0.
- » There were 28 extra-inning games featuring at least one SEC team last year. Only Alabama (5-1) played more than State.
- » The Bulldogs' 6-5 win vs. Furman in 12 innings was the longest game by an SEC team in 2023. MSU also played the longest game in 2022, going 13 innings against Tennessee in the SEC Tournament, which was the longest game in the history of the tournament.

## OUR STATE

- » The Bulldogs are 22-4 against teams from the state of Mississippi under **Samantha Ricketts**. MSU has outscored in-state foes, 187-63, in her tenure.
- » The Bulldogs outscored the Rebels, 22-11, in the 2022 series, and capped the three-game set with a shutout in the finale.
- » State has now won four straight against Ole Miss, dating back to the 2021 SEC Tournament.

## RECRUITING ON THE RISE

- » **Samantha Ricketts** has signed three consecutive top-20 recruiting classes, highlighted by this year's freshman class.
- » The current Bulldog freshmen were tabbed the No. 10 recruiting class in the country last fall.
- » Ricketts has signed three top-10 classes (No. 4 in 2017, No. 7 in 2019) at MSU dating back to her time as a primary recruiter when she was an assistant for State.
- » Additionally, under Ricketts, State has signed the first Bulldog in program history from six new states.

## LOVE FOR LEILANI

- » **Leilani Pulemau** will not play in 2023 and will medically retire at the end of the season. Pulemau has been diagnosed with the degenerative eye disease keratoconus and will have surgery midseason.
- » Pulemau has played in five games off the bench in her career, but her role off the field cannot be understated. She has been responsible for charting opposing pitchers over the last two years and will continue in that role this season.

TEAM NOTES

SETTLING NEW TERRITORY

- » **Samantha Ricketts** has expanded the Bulldogs' recruiting reach in recent years. She is responsible for recruiting the first softball student-athletes in MSU history from the states of Arkansas, Kentucky, Maryland, New Jersey, New York and West Virginia.
- » Riley Hull (Kentucky) and Ella Wesolowski (New York) are the first in program history from their respective states.
- » Additionally, **Kylee Edwards** is only the second Bulldog from Indiana and the first since Kayla Calvert (1999). **Josey Marron** is the first from the state of Iowa since Cassidy Knudsen (2018).
- » Next year's signing class includes Gretta Grassel, who will be just the second Bulldog from Wisconsin and first since 2012. Paige Ernestes (Indiana) and Taylor Troutman (Kentucky) will add to the rare home states represented on the roster.

NATIONAL TEAM NOTES

- » Mississippi State has been well-represented by USA Softball National Teams in recent years.
- » Assistant coach **Zac Shaw** won bronze at the 2023 WBSC World Cup (New Zealand) with the Men's National Team and is a part of the 2024 U.S. Men's National Team athlete pool.
- » Former Bulldog Mia Davidson (2018-22) has played with the U.S. Women's National Team since the 2022 Pan American Championships (Guatemala), competing at that event along with 2023 WBSC World Cup Group Stage (Ireland) and 2023 Pan American Games (Chile).
- » MSU alum Iyhia McMichael (2001-04) is currently serving as an assistant coach on the U.S. U-15 Girls' National Team where she's guided the team to the 2023 Utsugi Cup championship and a gold medal at the 2023 WBSC Americas Qualifier. In her playing days, McMichael won the 2003 Canada Cup with Team USA.
- » Additionally, player development fellow **Alyssa Loza** played with the Mexican Junior National Team in her playing career. Sophomore **Gabby Coffey** was a member of the Brazilian Junior National Team, and junior **Jessie Blaine** played with the 2019 U17 U.S. National Team and the Pan American Games.

- » MSU immortalized Wilcox by retiring her No. 8 jersey on Sept. 15, 2018, making Wilcox the **first female student-athlete** in MSU history to have her jersey retired.
- » State's annual February Freezer tournament was rebranded in 2019 as **The Snowman: Alex Wilcox Memorial**.
- » The **All For Alex** campaign was started in 2021 as a joint effort of LSU head coach **Beth Torina** and MSU head coach **Samantha Ricketts**.
- » All 13 SEC schools unite to wear teal or teal accents for one day each year to recognize her impact on the softball community and raise awareness of the disease.
- » All For Alex Weekend is set for **April 13, 2024**, this season.

MARDON AND WHITE

- » Named the sixth head softball coach in program history on July 22, 2019, and became the fastest head coach in program history to reach 20 wins, doing so in 23 games. Started 9-1, marking the best 10-game start by a head coach in program history.
- » Became the first first-year head coach to lead the nation in wins (25 in 2020) since at least 1989.
- » Is the only coach in program history to have her team nationally ranked at some point during her first year and led MSU to its highest final ranking in program history (No. 20).
- » Earned first career coaching victory in first career game on Feb. 7, 2020, against Missouri State (5-0).
- » In her second season, led MSU to its 16th NCAA Regional and third consecutive Regional Championship game.
- » Led State to its first Super Regional appearance in 2022, upsetting No. 2 Florida State twice in Tallahassee to advance.
- » Guided MSU to its highest final ranking on record (No. 19) in 2022.
- » Won 66 of her first 100 games, the best total of any Bulldog head coach and third among active SEC coaches in their first 100 contests.
- » Has coached 11 Bulldogs who went on to professional careers, seven of whom were selected in a professional draft. Four of her proteges are currently playing professionally (Mia Davidson, Fa Leilua, Chloe Malau'ulu and Annie Willis).
- » Has coached multiple players to All-Region honors in each of the last five seasons.
- » Served as an assistant coach from 2015-18 focusing on hitting and recruiting before being promoted to associate head coach.
- » Has been a part of one Women's College World Series appearance, seven NCAA Regional berths and two NCAA Super Regional appearances during her coaching career.
- » In 2019, MSU was one of two teams in the nation (Arizona) to boast multiple hitters with 20 or more home runs.
- » The Bulldogs shattered the school record for home runs (72) and posted the second-highest slugging percentage in school history (.484) in 2019.
- » For the first time since 2008, State produced multiple NFCA All-Americans in 2019 (Fa Leilua and Mia Davidson).
- » Davidson was the lone player in the conference to record at least 60 RBIs, 60 hits and 50 runs scored in 2019.
- » Davidson then broke Rafael Palmeiro's mark for the most home runs in a career by a Bulldog baseball or softball player in 2021 and entered the 2022 season just two long balls shy of the SEC softball career record.
- » Four of the top five single-season home run totals in program history have come under Ricketts' watch, and the Bulldogs have broken the season record four times.
- » MSU has hit at least one home run in 54.4 percent of its games (241-of-443) entering 2022 since Ricketts arrived as an assistant.
- » In 2017, Ricketts produced five starters that hit .300 or better to help lead the Bulldogs to an NCAA Regional and Caroline Seitz became the first Bulldog to earn First Team All-SEC honors since Chelsea Bramlett in 2010.
- » During the 2016 season, she led Kayla Winkfield to an SEC-leading six triples, which ranked among the nation's top 10.
- » In her first season of 2015, the Bulldogs set new single-season records for home runs (54), batting average (.312), slugging percentage (.495), RBI (294) and on-base percentage (.416).

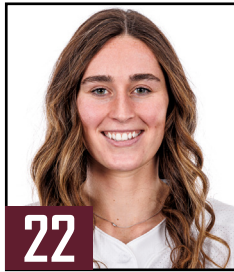

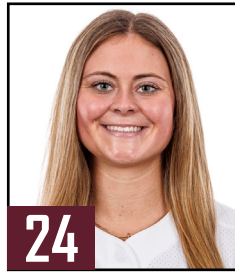
