OPPONENT NOTABLES

ULM is coming off a series loss to in-state foe McNeese over the weekend, but the Warhawks won the final game, 4-1. Warhawk pitchers have posted a 1.73 ERA that currently ranks 19th in the nation. Their 57 stolen bases rank seventh nationally, and the speed has also accounted for 10 triples, which ranks seventh in the country. The Warhawks have mimicked the Bulldogs in drawing 91 walks, which ranks among the top 20 in the nation, while State leads the nation with 111. ULM and State also two of three teams nationally with 15 or more sacrifice flies. The Warhawks' Andie Edwards leads the nation with seven sacrifice flies on her own.

LEADING OFF

SLUGGING IT: Madisyn Kennedy led the nation last week with a 2.000 slugging percentage. Since Feb. 29, every hit she's had has gone for extra bases (2 2B, 5 HR). Kennedy batted .571 in the series at Ole Miss (Mar. 8-10) and homered in the series as many times as she was put out.

FRESHMAN PHENOM: Salen Hawkins ranks third among all SEC freshmen with a .390 batting average, which also leads the team. In SEC play, she's hitting .625, which leads the league.

SWEET NOTHING: Aspen Wesley no-hit Ole Miss on Saturday, marking her first career no-hitter and State's first against an SEC team since 2013. State now has three pitchers with no-hitters this season, which trails only 2006 - when three pitchers tossed four no-hitters - for the most in a season in school history.

MAKING THE SACRIFICE: Paige Cook has already has four sacrifice flies again this year, which is one shy of the school record, and her 10 career sac flies are tied for second in school history. As a team, State's 15 sacrifice flies rank third nationally and are two shy of last year's school record. In 2023, MSU averaged 0.32 per game, and its now averaging 0.65.

WHAT'S COOKIN': Paige Cook has led the team in two-out RBIs each of the last two years, and is doing so again this year. She now has 55 for her career, which is sixth in MSU history.

MAGIC NUMBER: MSU is 64-3 since the start of 2022 when scoring five or more runs. State scored at least five in 25 of its 27 wins of 2023 and has done so in 15 of 19 wins in 2024.

GOING THE DISTANCE: As a team, MSU has tossed 10 complete games already this year after throwing just eight last season. Josey Marron and Aspen Wesley have accounted for seven complete games.

BLOWOUT BATS: State has scored eight runs an inning four times this year and sent 14 batters to the plate in a frame twice against Alcorn State (Mar. 3) and Troy (Mar. 2). MSU has 10 run-rule victories on the year, which is tied for fifth-most in school history.

OUR STATE: The Bulldogs are now 27-5 against teams from the state of Mississippi under Samantha Ricketts. MSU has outscored in-state foes, 242-76, in her tenure.

SOFTBALL MEDIA PORTAL

Mississippi State has created an online portal for media members covering the Bulldogs' softball program. To access the portal, visit hailst.at/SBMedia. The Softball Press Box Page of HailState.com includes links to credential request forms, media guides, quick facts, game notes, box scores, recaps and team and staff headshots.

CREDENTIALS

Working media must apply for single-game credentials at least 24 hours in advance by visiting hailst.at/SBCreds. Seats will be assigned to credentialed media members. Space is limited inside the Nusz Park press box. Indoor seating priority will be given to team staff, broadcast personnel, production staff and those media members who regularly cover the program. Auxillary seating is located at the top of Section 104.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/VIDEOGRAPHERS

Photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot around Nusz Park in approved areas. Those wishing to shoot a game should meet with Brian Ogden in the press box before the game to be granted field access.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

A complete NCAA box score and pertinent game facts are available to members of the working media following the conclusion of each game. Media members also have access to game notes, statistics, lineups and rosters prior to the start of each game upon request. A pregame meal is also served in the press box approximately one hour prior to each game.

The press box is divided into four separate work areas, with each equipped with high-speed internet and telephone access. It is also set up to accommodate television and team video personnel.

RADIO BROADCASTS

The Nusz Park press box houses radio lines to support home and visitor radio broadcasts. For more information on the phone lines, please contact Brian Ogden in the Communications office.

FAST FACTS

- » Since 2016, MSU is 176-68 in Nusz Park (.721).
- » Opening game at the MSU Softball Field came on Feb. 26, 1997, with the Bulldogs sweeping Samford in a doubleheader.
- » Nusz Park, a \$6 million project, includes 1,000 maroon chairback seats, in addition to an expanded concourse that includes new restrooms and concession stands.
- » The Bulldogs' first action in the new digs came against Georgia Southern, a 6-0 victory on Feb. 11, 2016.
- » MSU opened play at Nusz Park with six-straight victories, including a sweep of the Bulldog Kickoff.
- » State captured its first SEC win at Nusz with a 6-3 win against eventual WCWS finalists and third-ranked Auburn on March 19.
- » Nusz hosted the 2016 SEC Softball Tournament. The four-day event hosted 12 teams and a total of 11 games and drew praise from coaches across the league to ESPN and SEC Network officials.
- » On May 27, 2022 the largest college softball crowd in the history of the state of Mississippi descended on Nusz Park for the Bulldogs' Super Regional with Arizona (2,209). The next day the record was again broken (2,299) where it now stands today.

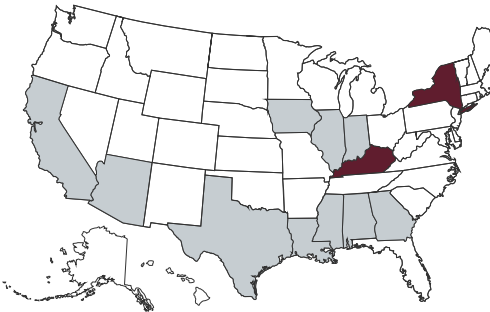

SACRIFICIAL DAWGS: State has already hit 15 sacrifice flies (0.65 per game), which ranks third nationally and is two shy of last year's school record. In 2023, MSU averaged 0.32 per game.

TEAM NOTES

QUICK HITTERS

- » **Madisyn Kennedy** leads the SEC with a 1.047 slugging percentage that ranks fourth nationally. Her 1.533 OPS this season, is fifth nationally and leading the conference. For the last two weeks all of her hits have gone for extra bases.
- » **Paige Cook** hit four sacrifice flies last year, which was tied for third in MSU history and one shy of the season record. She already has four this year, and her 10 career sac flies are tied for second in school history.
- » As a team, State's 15 sacrifice flies rank third nationally. The school record of 17 was set last year.
- » **Jessie Blaine** is second on the team in slugging percentage (.672) and homers (5) and tied for the lead with 22 RBIs. Her .362 average is third on the squad.

MADI'S AWARD-WORTHY WEEK

- » **Madisyn Kennedy** batted .571 in the series at Ole Miss (Mar. 8-10) while leading the nation with a 2.000 slugging percentage for the week and a .727 on-base percentage.
- » Despite her eye-popping numbers, she was not selected as SEC Player of the Week even though she doubled the winner's slugging percentage and drove in more runs over the week.
- » She homered in the series as many times as she was put out.
- » Kennedy leads the SEC in homers and RBIs in league games.
- » She tied her career highs in hits (3) and RBIs (5) in the Sunday series finale with a pair of homers and walks and a double.

SALEN STARRING EARLY

- » **Salen Hawkins** leads the team in batting average (.390) and ranks third among SEC freshmen this season.
- » Hawkins was named SEC Freshman of the Week (Mar. 12) after posting a .625 batting average at Ole Miss that led all SEC players with at least four at-bats in conference play.
- » She is tied for the team lead with seven multi-hit and seven multi-RBI games this season.
- » Defensively, her eight double plays rank third in the league.
- » During her active four-game hitting streak, she's batting .636 with a 1.643 OPS.

SPEEDY STATE

- » MSU already has 27 stolen bases after swiping just 29 all of last year.
- » **Sierra Sacco** leads the team, going 12-for-12 on steal attempts, which is fourth in the SEC.
- » Sacco leads the team with an 8.94 speed score out of 10.0 per 6-4-3 Charts, which classifies speed based on stolen base percentage, triples, runs and avoiding double plays.
- » Only Tennessee's Kiki Milloy (9.28) and Florida's Skylar Wallace (9.12) have a higher speed score than Sacco in the SEC.
- » State's team speed score has climbed to 7.20 from 6.47 a year ago.

SIERRA SETS THE TABLE

- » **Sierra Sacco** has reached base safely in 18-of-33 (54.5 percent) leadoff plate appearances.
- » Her 24.4 percent walk rate ranks 21st in the NCAA, and she is 12-for-12 on stolen base attempts, which is also 34th in the nation.
- » Sacco leads the SEC with 21 walks this season, and her 0.91 walks per game is ninth nationally.
- » She is also third on the team in runs created, per 6-4-3 Charts, at 18.45.

WHAT'S COOKIN'

- » **Paige Cook** has been arguably one of the most-clutch hitters in MSU history. She's led the team in two-out RBIs each of the last two years, and is doing so again this year.
- » Cook has a team-leading 11 two-out RBIs this season, and she now has 55 for her career, which is sixth in MSU history.
- » In 2022, Cook became just the sixth Bulldog to record 20 two-out RBIs in a season.

THE TARYNE TREATMENT

- » State's pitching staff has been impressive under new pitching coach **Taryne Mowatt-McKinney**.
- » The Bulldogs have allowed just 28 walks, which ranks 13th in the nation, and they have recorded 125 strikeouts. Their 4.46 strikeout-to-walk ratio ranks seventh in the nation.
- » MSU's 1.83 team ERA ranks 21st nationally.
- » The Bulldogs are also sixth in walk rate (4.8 percent), 10th in WHIP (0.96) and 16th in fielding independent pitching (2.09).
- » Mowatt-McKinney also called the pitches in the first back-to-back no-hitters in school history on Opening Weekend (Feb. 9-10).

BULLPEN BULLETS

- » State has held opponents to a .139 batting average with two outs, which is the third-lowest in the SEC.
- » State's staff is among the top 25 nationally in walks per seven innings (1.38; 6th), walk rate (4.8 percent; 6th), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.46; 7th), WHIP (0.96; 10th), fielding independent pitching (2.09; 16th), ERA (1.83; 21st).
- » **Josey Marron** and **Aspen Wesley** accounted for seven of State's 10 complete games this season. As a team, MSU threw eight complete games last year.

SWEET NOTHINGS

- » **Josey Marron** and **Matalasi Faapito** threw consecutive no-hitters, shutting down IUPUI on Feb. 9-10.
- » It was the first time State had no-hitters on consecutive days since the first two in school history on March 1-2, 1997, and it was the first time ever the Bulldogs have done so in consecutive games.
- » **Aspen Wesley** no-hit Ole Miss on Mar. 9, marking her first career no-hitter and State's first against an SEC team since Stephanie Becker no-hit the Rebels on April 14, 2013.
- » Wesley's was only the third no-hitter in conference play in program history.
- » State has three pitchers with no-hitters this season, which trails only 2006 - when three pitchers tossed four no-hitters - for the most in a season in school history.

JOSEY JUST WINS

- » **Josey Marron** won each of her first six career starts and is currently 16-2 with the losses to No. 1 Oklahoma and No. 10 Arkansas. In her 22 career starts, MSU is 20-2.
- » Marron has thrown seven complete games, including four solo shutouts against No. 23 Louisiana (2/13/24), IUPUI (2/9/24), Furman (2/26/23) and South Florida (2/19/23).
- » She is among the top 25 nationally in wins (8; 25th) and walk rate (3.0 percent; 23rd).

MARRON LEAVES HER MARK

- » MSU's freshman pitching records were on the ropes in 2023 thanks to **Josey Marron**.
- » She matched the then-MSU single-game freshman record for strikeouts (13) against Furman (2/26/23).
- » Her season strikeout total ranked among the top five freshman campaigns in school history.

ALL ABOUT ASPEN

- » **Aspen Wesley** was named the SEC Co-Pitcher of the Week (Feb. 19) and the NCAA Pitcher of the Week (Feb. 20) after earning two complete-game victories against No. 23 Louisiana (Feb. 13) and No. 8 Clemson (Feb. 17).
- » She faced a team-high 55 batters in 13.0 innings over the week and allowed just one earned run while striking out 12.

STATEMENT MADE

- » State won four consecutive games against ranked teams in a single week, highlighted by victories in Mexico against No. 8 Clemson and No. 13 Utah on Feb. 17.
- » MSU swept No. 23 Louisiana in a doubleheader on Feb. 13. The Bulldogs won the first game 9-1 in six innings, marking MSU's first run-rule victory against a ranked team since April 19, 2008 against then No. 21 Georgia (10-0 [5 inn.]).
- » The last time MSU swept a ranked team came at No. 2 Florida State in the 2022 Tallahassee Regional.
- » MSU's four-game ranked winning streak was its longest since taking five straight at the end of the 2021 season and is the third-longest in school history.
- » Notably, only the school-record seven-game streak in 2004 saw MSU win at least four in a row against at least three different opponents.

TAKING ON TOP TEAMS

- » Mississippi State played 11 NFCA-ranked teams in 25 games last year, which was a program record in the regular season.
- » State is already 4-1 against ranked teams, and is currently slated to face seven more ranked squads in 21 additional games.
- » Ole Miss is the only team on MSU's conference schedule that is not currently ranked by the NFCA.

THE #RICKETTSEFFECT

- » In nine full seasons since Ricketts arrived (2015), the Bulldogs have broken the school record for home runs four times, and each of the top five marks in school history came under her watch.
- » State broke the record with 73 in 2022, which gives Ricketts a hand in all three 70-homer seasons in school history.
- » The Bulldogs are 21st nationally since the start of the 2018 season with 371 home runs.
- » Under Ricketts, State has homered in 55.0 percent of its games (284 of 516) and gone 206-78 in such contests.

NEVER OUT OF IT

- » Since **Samantha Ricketts** took charge of the program, no lead has been safe for State's opponents.
- » In the program's modern era (since 1997), there have been just nine comeback victories after trailing by five or more runs, and Ricketts has led four of those.
- » Prior to the Ricketts Era, State's last five-run comeback victory was against Ole Miss on March 20, 2015 (trailed 6-1, won 8-6).
- » On April 3, 2021, Ricketts led the Bulldogs to a 9-7 victory at North Alabama after trailing 7-1, entering the sixth inning. Erasing the six-run deficit marked the largest comeback in program history since trailing 6-0 in the sixth inning of an eventual 8-6 win against then-No. 10 Alabama on April 9, 2004.

- » State batted around in eight innings in 2023, and the Bulldogs have already done so six times this year.
- » State has scored eight runs an inning four times this year and sent 14 batters to the plate in a frame twice against Alcorn State (Mar. 3) and Troy (Mar. 2).
- » MSU has 10 run-rule victories on the year, which is tied for fifth-most in school history.

OUR STATE

- » The Bulldogs are 27-5 against teams from the state of Mississippi under **Samantha Ricketts**. MSU has outscored in-state foes, 242-76, in her tenure.
- » State won six straight against Ole Miss, between the 2024 series win back to the 2021 SEC Tournament.
- » MSU won the 2024 series by taking the first two games, including a no-hitter in the clinching matchup.
- » The Bulldogs outscored the Rebels, 22-11, in the 2022 series, and capped the three-game set with a shutout in the finale.

EXTRA INNINGS EXCELLENCE

- » MSU was 4-0 in extra innings in 2023, which was the best record in the SEC. Tennessee was also undefeated, going 2-0.
- » There were 28 extra-inning games featuring at least one SEC team last year. Only Alabama (5-1) played more than State.
- » The Bulldogs' 6-5 win vs. Furman in 12 innings was the longest game by an SEC team in 2023. MSU also played the longest game in 2022, going 13 innings against Tennessee in the SEC Tournament, which was the longest game in the history of the tournament.

LOVE FOR LEILANI

- » **Leilani Pulemau** will not play in 2023 and will medically retire at the end of the season. Pulemau has been diagnosed with the degenerative eye disease keratoconus and will have surgery midseason.
- » Pulemau has played in five games off the bench in her career, but her role off the field cannot be understated. She has been responsible for charting opposing pitchers over the last two years and will continue in that role this season.

RECRUITING ON THE RISE

- » **Samantha Ricketts** has signed three consecutive top-20 recruiting classes, highlighted by this year's freshman class.
- » The current Bulldog freshmen were tabbed the No. 10 recruiting class in the country last fall.
- » Ricketts has signed three top-10 classes (No. 4 in 2017, No. 7 in 2019) at MSU dating back to her time as a primary recruiter when she was an assistant for State.
- » Additionally, under Ricketts, State has signed the first Bulldog in program history from six new states.

SETTLING NEW TERRITORY

- » **Samantha Ricketts** has expanded the Bulldogs' recruiting reach in recent years. She is responsible for recruiting the first softball student-athletes in MSU history from the states of Arkansas, Kentucky, Maryland, New Jersey, New York and West Virginia.
- » Riley Hull (Kentucky) and Ella Wesolowski (New York) are the first in program history from their respective states.
- » Additionally, **Kylee Edwards** is only the second Bulldog from Indiana and the first since Kayla Calvert (1999). **Josey Marron** is the first from the state of Iowa since Cassidy Knudsen (2018).
- » Next year's signing class includes Gretta Grassel, who will be just the second Bulldog from Wisconsin and first since 2012. Paige Ernstes (Indiana) and Taylor Troutman (Kentucky) will add to the rare home states represented on the roster.

NATIONAL TEAM NOTES

- » Mississippi State has been well-represented by USA Softball National Teams in recent years.
- » Assistant coach **Zac Shaw** won bronze at the 2023 WBSC World Cup (New Zealand) with the Men's National Team and is a part of the 2024 U.S. Men's National Team athlete pool.
- » Former Bulldog Mia Davidson (2018-22) has played with the U.S. Women's National Team since the 2022 Pan American Championships (Guatemala), competing at that event along with 2023 WBSC World Cup Group Stage (Ireland) and 2023 Pan American Games (Chile).
- » MSU alum Iyhia McMichael (2001-04) is currently serving as an assistant coach on the U.S. U-15 Girls' National Team where she's guided the team to the 2023 Utsugi Cup championship and a gold medal at the 2023 WBSC Americas Qualifier. In her playing days, McMichael won the 2003 Canada Cup with Team USA.
- » Additionally, player development fellow **Alyssa Loza** played with the Mexican Junior National Team in her playing career. Sophomore **Gabby Coffey** was a member of the Brazilian Junior National Team, and junior **Jessie Blaine** played with the 2019 U17 U.S. National Team and the Pan American Games.

MARDON AND WHITE

- » Named the sixth head softball coach in program history on July 22, 2019, and became the fastest head coach in program history to reach 20 wins, doing so in 23 games. Started 9-1, marking the best 10-game start by a head coach in program history.
- » Became the first first-year head coach to lead the nation in wins (25 in 2020) since at least 1989.
- » Is the only coach in program history to have her team nationally ranked at some point during her first year and led MSU to its highest final ranking in program history (No. 20).
- » Earned first career coaching victory in first career game on Feb. 7, 2020, against Missouri State (5-0).
- » In her second season, led MSU to its 16th NCAA Regional and third consecutive Regional Championship game.
- » Led State to its first Super Regional appearance in 2022, upsetting No. 2 Florida State twice in Tallahassee to advance.
- » Guided MSU to its highest final ranking on record (No. 19) in 2022.
- » Won 66 of her first 100 games, the best total of any Bulldog head coach and third among active SEC coaches in their first 100 contests.
- » Has coached 11 Bulldogs who went on to professional careers, seven of whom were selected in a professional draft. Four of her proteges are currently playing professionally (Mia Davidson, Fa Leilua, Chloe Malau'ulu and Annie Willis).
- » Has coached multiple players to All-Region honors in each of the last five seasons.
- » Served as an assistant coach from 2015-18 focusing on hitting and recruiting before being promoted to associate head coach.
- » Has been a part of one Women's College World Series appearance, seven NCAA Regional berths and two NCAA Super Regional appearances during her coaching career.
- » In 2019, MSU was one of two teams in the nation (Arizona) to boast multiple hitters with 20 or more home runs.
- » The Bulldogs shattered the school record for home runs (72) and posted the second-highest slugging percentage in school history (.484) in 2019.
- » For the first time since 2008, State produced multiple NFCA All-Americans in 2019 (Fa Leilua and Mia Davidson).
- » Davidson was the lone player in the conference to record at least 60 RBIs, 60 hits and 50 runs scored in 2019.
- » Davidson then broke Rafael Palmeiro's mark for the most home runs in a career by a Bulldog baseball or softball player in 2021 and entered the 2022 season just two long balls shy of the SEC softball career record.
- » Four of the top five single-season home run totals in program history have come under Ricketts' watch, and the Bulldogs have broken the season record four times.
- » MSU has hit at least one home run in 54.4 percent of its games (241-of-443) entering 2022 since Ricketts arrived as an assistant.
- » In 2017, Ricketts produced five starters that hit .300 or better to help lead the Bulldogs to an NCAA Regional and Caroline Seitz became the first Bulldog to earn First Team All-SEC honors since Chelsea Bramlett in 2010.
- » During the 2016 season, she led Kayla Winkfield to an SEC-leading six triples, which ranked among the nation's top 10.
- » In her first season of 2015, the Bulldogs set new single-season records for home runs (54), batting average (.312), slugging percentage (.495), RBI (294) and on-base percentage (.416).

- » Served as assistant coach at Wichita State from 2012-14, working with the team's hitters and consistently improving their production.

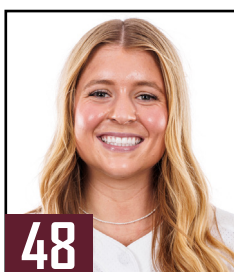

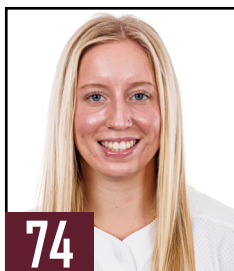
