- Opening SEC play in Oxford, Ole Miss Softball welcomes instate rival No. 17 Mississippi State to town for a three-game series March 8-10.
- Friday's contest will mark the 80th meeting between the two programs. MSU holds a 46-33 edge in the all-time series.
- The Rebels head into SEC play with a 15-5 overall record, the second best start to the season under head coach Jamie Trachsel in her time at Ole Miss.
- One of the most electric players on the diamond, Jalia Lassiter leads the SEC with 13 stolen bases and ranks third in the conference with 28 hits.
- As an offense, the Rebels are batting .321, the fifth best mark in the SEC and 38th best in the country. They have tallied 10+ hits in eight of the first 20 games this season.
- The Ole Miss pitching staff combined to throw six shutouts, the 13th most nationally. Four of those shutouts for the Rebels have come in the last week.
- Senior Makenna Kliethermes has looked sharp for the Rebels in the circle. She leads the team with a 7-1 record and 48 strikeouts through 41.1 innings pitched.
- Ole Miss' coaching staff features three new faces. Daniel Nicolaisen, Karl Gollan and DJ Sanders all join the Rebels for their first season in Oxford.

SCOUTING REPORT

Samantha Ricketts is in her fifth year as head coach at Mississippi State, already with a Super Regional appearance under her belt back in 2022. The Bulldogs have had a hot start to their 2024 campaign, boasting a 17-3 overall record through non-conference play, wins over No. 8 Clemson, No. 13 Utah and a pair over No. 23 Louisiana. MSU is coming off a perfect 6-0 weekend at their own Bulldog Invitational. Heading into the opening weekend of SEC play, Mississippi State is ranked in all four major polls, checking in as high as No. 17 according to D1 Softball. Friday's matchup will be the 80th all-time meeting between the in-state rivals. Mississippi State leads the series 46-33, winning each of the last four games, including sweeping the last series in Starkville in 2022.

Mississippi State's lineup hits a combined .362 at the plate, ranking ninth nationally. Junior outfielder Sierra Sacco, who was a 2023 First Team All-Conference USA selection at Louisiana Tech last season, is one of the top bats in the Bulldog, hitting. .391 so far this season. In addition to boasting one of the top offenses in the country, MSU also owns a top 10 ERA with a 1.57 mark led by Josey Marron in the circle, who has a perfect 7-0 record while pitching a team-high 40.0 innings, and Week 2 SEC Pitcher of the Week Aspen Wesley.

Ole Miss softball dropped the series finale to
Mississippi State 6-0 Sunday afternoon at Nusz
Park to conclude its opening weekend of SEC play.

Savannah Diederich made her second start in the circle of weekend for Ole Miss (21-7, 0-3 SEC). Mississippi State (19-10, 4-2 SEC) managed to hand the righty her first loss of the season, racking up 10 hits.

The Bulldogs took a one-run lead in the second on an RBI bunt single. They continued to load the bases, but Diederich was able to escape the jam.

Mississippi State tacked on three more unearned runs in the fourth. A collision in the infield led to a dropped ball, and three singles helped MSU make it a 4-0 game.

Ole Miss turned to Brooke Vestal to start the fifth but brought Catelyn Riley in after the Bulldogs hit a two-run home run to push the lead to six.

Down to their final three outs, the Rebels notched their first hit of the afternoon as Aynslie Furbush singled through the left side.

BUILDING SOMETHING SPECIAL

One of the most exciting things fans and student-athletes have to look forward to in 2024 is a brand new softball stadium as part of Ole Miss' Champions. Now. Campaign. This past May, the Ole Miss Softball Complex, which served as the Rebels' home field since 1998 and has seen one SEC Tournament, two NCAA Regionals and countless other memories, saw its final game ever as the Rebels walked off No. 14 Alabama with a four-spot in the bottom of the seventh inning. Just 23 days later, construction crews began demolition on the ballpark as part of a brand new \$32 million facility upgrade. The Ole Miss Softball Stadium renovations will include numerous fan amenities, upgraded grandstands, restrooms and concessions. The team will also benefit from enlarged bullpens, as well as improved team offices, locker rooms and storage.

TRIPLE THREAT

One of the most consistent parts of the Ole Miss lineup is left fielder Jaden Pone. Reaching base any way she can, the junior is a triple threat at the plate with the ability to bunt, slap and swing away. Pone leads the team with a .418 batting average and .522 on-base percentage. A key addition to the Rebel offense, she also ranks second in hits with 23 and has reached base safely in each of her last 16 games. Although this is her first season in Oxford, Pone is no stranger to success at the plate. She ranks among the nation's best, boasting a .413 career batting average, the ninth best mark among active players in Division I.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME

The Ole Miss Softball Complex has been a fortress for the Rebels since the arrival of head coach Jamie Trachsel. After going 24-3 at home in 2021 and 19-6 in Oxford in 2022, Ole Miss defended its home field again last season, welcoming in four top-25 foes. Under Trachsel, the Rebels are 61-23 while playing at home, including 42-5 against non-conference opponents.

LEADOFF LASSITER

After capping off her rookie campaign with NFCA All-South Region Third Team Honors, Jalia Lassiter is proving to be one of the most electric players in the SEC. Just a sophomore, the Atmore, Alabama, native brings a different level of energy to the diamond with her game-changing speed, swagger and confidence. Hitting in the leadoff spot, she ranks third on the team with a .389 mark at the plate and leads the Rebels with 28 hits (26th nationally) so far this season. Lassiter has tallied multiple hits in nine contests and has reached base in all but two.

OFFENSIVE FIREPOWER

Racking up 170 hits through the first 20 games of the season, Ole Miss' offense has been firing on all cylinders. The Rebels boast a .321 batting average as a team, the fifth best mark in the SEC and 38th best nationally. Led by Jaden Pone and Aynslie Furbush, who both are hitting over .400. Further, the Rebels have recorded at least 10 hits in eight of their 20 contests so far this season, including 17 against Miami (OH) at the Clemson Classic, the most in the Trachsel Era and the third most by an SEC team this season.

Not only are the Rebels seeing the ball fly off the bat, but they are showing patience at the plate, drawing 77 walks (17th nationally) to boast the 19th best

DON'T LET THE REBS GET HOT

Through the first 20 games of the 2024 campaign, Ole Miss softball is off to a blistering start. The Rebels boast a 15-5 record, their second-best start to a season under head coach Jamie Trachsel. Ole Miss bounced back after losing its season opener to BYU in Hawaii, winning 10 straight games. The Rebels dropped a pair of tough contests against No. 9 Clemson to round out February and went 3-2 at home last weekend in the Ole Miss Classic and run-ruled Memphis in a midweek tuneup before opening weekend of conference play.

RETURN OF THE MAK

One of the Rebels' top arms in the circle last season, Makenna Kliethermes, is back for her fifth year of eligibility and is on a tear in 2024. Through non-conference play to start the season, she boasts a 7-1 record, good for 23rd nationally. The Wardsville, Missouri, native has gone the distance in three of her victories while holding batters to a .181 mark at the plate and racking up 48 strikeouts (65th in the country) in 41.1 innings of work.

BRADY BUNCH

After patiently waiting for her opportunity, Lexie Brady took over as the Rebels' starting catcher for 19 of the final 20 games last season, powering Ole Miss down the stretch. Over Opening Weekend in Hawaii, she started her junior season off with a bang, mashing three home runs, including her first career multi-home run game, and driving in 11 runs. Brady, a Sioux Falls, South Dakota, native, has been a threat hitting cleanup for the majority of the season. She leads the team with six home runs (fourth in the SEC) and 21 RBI (11th in the SEC) on the season.

Not only is the junior an offensive weapon, but she is a general behind the plate. Brady leads the SEC and ranks 16th in the country with six runners caught stealing. She also boasts a perfect fielding percentage with 84 putouts and 12 assists.

LEGACY AND LOYALTY

Playing in her fifth and final season of eligibility, Paige Smith elected to return to Ole Miss for legacy and loyalty. With unfinished business on her mind, Smith looks to leave her mark as one of the program's top sluggers. A true threat in the middle of the Rebel lineup, she is one of seven players in Ole Miss history with 100 hits and 100 RBI and ranks second in the record books with 149 RBI. With over 200 career games under her belt, Smith brings a veteran presence to the team and looks to carry Ole Miss back on a deep postseason run.

top-tier talent to her 2024 roster, welcoming in four transfers who have made an immediate impact.

Brianna Lopez joins the Rebels after spending two seasons at Hawaii, where she posted a career 2.25 ERA with 30 victories in the circle and a pair of All-Big West honors. With Ole Miss this season, Lopez has nine appearances out of the bullpen to go along with a 2.21 ERA and .178 opponent batting average.

After spending four seasons with the Illini, Delaney Rummell signed to play her final year of eligibility in Oxford. The former All-Big Ten Defensive Team and All-Big Ten Second Teamer assumed the Rebels' starting third base job and never looked back. Through the first 20 games, Rummell is batting .355 and is one of three in the lineup with at least 20 hits.

2023 Big South Player of the Year and First Team NFCA All-Region second baseman Jaden Pone comes to Oxford after spending two seasons at Longwood, where she tallied 153 hits, 82 runs scored and 62 stolen bases. Pone, who made the transition to the outfield this season, leads the Rebels at the plate with a .418 batting average and is reaching base in 52 percent of her at-bats.

Ryan Starr joins the Rebels after starting 42 games in her freshman year at Syracuse last season. She quickly established herself as the starting shortstop for Ole Miss in the fall and has made an immediate impact in the lineup, boasting a .256 average and a stable presence on defense.

RUN DOWN

Head coach Jamie Trachsel enters her fourth season at the helm of the Ole Miss softball program heading into the 2024 season. In just three years in Oxford, she has guided the Rebels to back-to-back-back NCAA Regional Finals appearances. In 2023, she became the fastest coach in Ole Miss Softball history to achieve her 100th victory, needing only 159 games to accomplish the feat.

The sixth head softball coach in Ole Miss history and the 2019 NFCA Great Lakes Region Coach of the Year, Trachsel has collected 11 conference regular-season and tournament championships, developed 48 all-conference honorees, and guided her teams to the NCAA Tournament in 10-of-12 seasons, including a trip to the 2019 Women's College World Series with the Golden Gophers.

Despite playing the sixth toughest schedule in the nation in 2023, Trachsel's squad battled adversity and finished with a 32-28 record and an 8-16 mark in the SEC. The Rebels solidified their spot in the postseason after knocking off ranked opponents in conference play all season, earning a spot in the Salt Lake City Regional, where they went on to play in the Regional Final.

Ole Miss opened the season in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico, before returning stateside for three other nonconference tournaments, including a pair in Oxford. The Rebels began conference play where they would earn victories over No. 10 LSU, No. 19 Auburn, No. 15 Kentucky, No. 21 Texas A&M, No. 14 Florida and No. 14 Alabama, as well as take the series at Missouri. Trachsel also earned her 100th career victory at Ole Miss on April 9, becoming the fastest coach in program history to reach the milestone. Ole Miss earned a spot as the No. 11 seed in the SEC Tournament and went on to win its opening game for the second consecutive year. In the NCAA Tournament, the Rebels advanced to the Regional Final with a pair of wins over Baylor, including a shutout, but fell to No. 15 national seed and host Utah.

Freshman Jalia Lassiter earned NFCA All-South Region honors, grabbing a spot on the third team, while senior Tate Whitley was named to the SEC All-Defensive team. Whitley and senior Mya Stevenson also registered their 200th career hits nearly a week apart. Graduate transfer Savana Sikes tied for the team lead with 48 hits, while fifth-year senior Mikayla Allee put together the best offensive season of her career, posting a .288 average (third on the team) and 46 hits (18 more than her single-season high). The Rebels also saw success in the circle, with Aynslie Furbush and Catelyn Riley leading the way with nine and eight wins, respectively.

The 2022 campaign was one for the record books as Trachsel and Ole Miss got off to a blistering 21-4 start to the season, tied for the best record through 25 games in program history. The Rebels won 41 games on the year, the second most in a single season

in school history. With a tough conference slate that featured three consecutive series against top-10 opponents, Ole Miss managed to pick up marquee wins over No. 9 Arkansas and No. 8 Kentucky. The Rebels got hot down the stretch, winning nine of their final 11 contests and taking series from No. 11 Tennessee and at No. 16 Georgia to close out the regular season and tie the program record with 38 regular season victories.

Ending the regular season with a 38-16 mark, Ole Miss cracked the top 25 in multiple polls and finished eighth in the SEC. The Rebels went on to win a game at the SEC Tournament for the first time since 2019 and secure the program's sixth straight NCAA Regional bid, earning the No. 2 seed in the Los Angeles Regional. Despite dropping the opening game of the regional, they climbed back into the regional final with wins over Grand Canyon and LMU before falling to No. 5 UCLA.

Following a standout season, three Rebel outfielders in Tate Whitley, Abbey Latham and Bre Roper each earned NFCA All-Region honors. Whitley led the SEC in hits with 74 during the regular season, while Latham became the program's all-time RBI leader in March. Roper shined as a graduate transfer, she ranked second on the team with a .364 batting average and 64 hits and 39 runs scored. Ole Miss also saw unparalleled success in the classroom, posting a 3.70 team GPA during the spring semester, the highest in program history.

Picked to finish dead last in the 2021 SEC Preseason Coaches Poll, Ole Miss exceeded all expectations in Trachsel's first campaign at the helm. The Rebs collected a 36-22 overall record, including a 12-12 mark in SEC play, good for an eighth place finish and the second most conference victories in program history. Ole Miss received its fifth-consecutive NCAA Tournament bid for its work, earning the No. 2 seed in the Tucson Regional. The Rebels made Oxford a fortress in Trachsel's inaugural season, posting a 24-3 home record, including the first-ever sweep of rival Mississippi State and a three-game sweep of No. 25

Under Trachsel's guidance, four Rebels received SEC postseason honors, tied for the most in a single season in program history. Paige Smith was named to the newly minted SEC All-Newcomer Team, while rookies Blaise Biringer and Aynslie Furbush received a nod for the all-freshman squad. One of the most feared backstops in the country, Rebel catcher Autumn Gillespie was tabbed to the SEC All-Defense Team.

In her three-year stint with the Golden Gophers, Trachsel took over a program on the rise and kept the ascent going to the upper echelon of the softball world. After finishing off her inaugural season in Minneapolis with 41 wins, a Big Ten Tournament title, an appearance in the NCAA Seattle Regional Final and four All-Big Ten and NFCA All-Region honorees,

Playing arguably the nation's most challenging schedule, Minnesota racked up a 41-12 record during the regular season, setting the stage for a magical postseason run. The No. 8 national seeded Gophers ripped through the Regional and Super Regional rounds of the NCAA Tournament with five straight wins, including two apiece over SEC foes in No. 14 Georgia and No. 10 LSU. Minnesota then set sail for Oklahoma City, making its first trip to the Women's College World Series in the NCAA era.

Five Gophers were named to the All-Big Ten and NFCA All-Region squads, respectively, following Trachsel's second season at Minnesota, while Gopher ace Amber Fiser was named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year and a First Team All-American.

Minnesota finished the season ranked No. 8 in both the USA Today/NFCA Top-25 Coaches Poll and the ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top-25 Poll. The No. 8 ranking is the highest the Gophers have finished a season in either major poll. Minnesota also finished





No. 7 in the NCAA RPI, which is not only the school's highest RPI to finish a season, but the highest at any point in program history. For their efforts, Trachsel and her staff were named the NFCA Great Lakes All-Region Coaching Staff of the Year.

Ranked in the top 10 in five different preseason polls heading into 2020, Trachsel and the Gophers hit the ground running once again. Minnesota collected a 15-9-1 record prior to the cancelation of the remainder of the spring season due to the coronavirus, including ranked wins over No. 5 Florida State and No. 19 Missouri. Sophomore slugger Natalie DenHartog was tabbed a Shortened Season All-American by Softball America.

The Gophers also made history in the classroom under Trachsel. Their spring 2019 semester GPA of 3.63 was the highest in program history, while eleven different players notched 2019 Academic All-Big Ten honors. In total, Trachsel's players have received 41 academic all-league honors.

Prior to taking over Minnesota, Trachsel spent one season in the Big XII as the head coach at Iowa State. She led the Cyclones to a fifth-place conference finish in 2017, garnering their highest league win total in eight years along with the best regular-season Big XII finish since 1994. Trachsel's squad also saw improvement in the circle, dropping its team era by nearly two runs per game to the lowest since 2010. Two Cyclones earned NFCA All-Region First Team honors in Kelsey McFarland and Sami Williams, the latter selected to the All-Big XII First Team as well, one of only three freshmen leaguewide to earn that award.

Trachsel arrived in Ames following 14 seasons at North Dakota State, including the final six as co-head coach. In those half-dozen seasons, NDSU compiled a 221-109 overall record (.670), a 98-19 mark (.838) in the Summit League and advanced to NCAA Regional

play five times. The Bison won their conference regular-season championship and the tournament championship five times each with Trachsel as co-head coach.

NDSU won at least 30 games — including a school-record 45 in 2015 when it climbed as high as 41st in the NCAA Percentage Ratings Index (RPI) — for 10 straight seasons. The Bison advanced to the NCAA Regionals in seven of Trachsel's final eight seasons in Fargo. In 2009, NDSU pulled a shocking upset, claiming the Norman Regional over perennial power Oklahoma.

Her tenure with NDSU began with two seasons (2002-04) as a graduate assistant, followed by three (2005-07) as an assistant coach, three (2008-10) as associate head coach and the last six (2011-16) as co-head coach.

During her stay in Fargo, Trachsel coached five All-Americans, 25 All-Region players and 59 All-Conference student athletes, including five Summit League Players of the Year and five Summit League Pitchers of the Year. The Minnesota native was also a part of staffs recognized as NFCA Midwest Region Coaching Staff of the Year twice in 2009 and 2015.

As a player, Trachsel competed for NCAA Division II program St. Cloud State in St. Cloud, Minnesota. She led the Huskies to three straight NCAA Division II tournament appearances and one conference title. Trachsel made the 1999 NCAA Division II All-Region Tournament Team and received All-Academic honors from the NFCA twice. SCSU won 127 games during her

As a prep athlete, Trachsel earned 17 letters across four sports at Duluth (Minn.) Central High School. She is also a nine-time national champion in racquetball (1988-93 and 2003-05).
