#### **GAME NOTES**

#### NO. 14 SOFTBALL HOSTS NO. 18 MISSISSIPPI STATE FOR SENIOR WEEKEND

- The No. 14/14 University of Missouri softball team (35-13, 8-10 SEC) celebrates its five seniors this weekend, as the Tigers host No. 18/18 Mississippi State (30-13, 9-9 SEC) for its final regular-season home series of the season.
- The Tigers open the top-25 matchup Saturday evening at 8 p.m., CT at the Mizzou Softball Stadium. Fans are encouraged to wear gold and the opening giveaway is gold t-shirts, while supplies last.
- Mizzou will honor Maddie Gallagher, Jenna Laird, Laurin Krings, Alex Honnold, and Chantice Phillips following Sunday's 5 p.m., CT contest. Fans are encouraged to wear black for game two of the series and black shirts will be given to fans while supplies last.
- Head coach Larissa Anderson will participate in Mic'd Up Monday. The giveaway for the series finale is a Truman Sliding Bobblehead sponsored by Coca Cola, while supplies last.
- Fans can catch this weekend's three-game series with Mississippi State on SEC Network. Matt Schumacker and Amanda Scarborough will be on the call for all three games.
- Game times for this weekend's series are 8 p.m. Saturday, 5 p.m. Sunday and 6 p.m. Monday.
- Mizzou was ranked in all four of Week 11's polls this week after first appearing following week one (Feb. 13). The Tigers enter the week #14 in both the USA Today/NFCA Coaches Poll, and the ESPN.com/USA Softball Poll. Mizzou is also #14 in D1Softball and #13 in Softball America polls, respectively.

#### MISSISSIPPI STATE SERIES HISTORY

- Mizzou leads the all-time series with Mississippi State, 12-9.
- $\,\cdot\,\,$  The two teams last faced off in the 2023 SEC Tournament, as the Tigers defeated the Bulldogs, 3-1, on May 9 in Fayetteville, Arkansas.
- In the pair's last regular-season series in 2022, Mississippi State bested Mizzou, 2-1, taking Game 1 (9-2) and Game 2 (2-0). The Tigers closed the series with an 8-5 win in eight innings (April 8-10).
- The last time the Bulldogs traveled to Columbia, Missouri, the Tigers recorded a perfect weekend to pull off a three-game sweep of Mississippi State (April 17-18, 2021). Mizzou picked up 5-2, 4-3, and 6-5 wins over MSU that season.
- Head coach Larissa Anderson is 5-5 against the Bulldogs in her career.

#### HAY NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Abby Hay was tabbed the SEC Player of the Week, the league announced Tuesday. Hay, a first baseman from Columbia, Missouri, paced the Tigers this past week, batting .636 (1.182 slugging percentage/.692 onbase percentage).
- Hay hit .750 over the weekend SEC series with No. 9/9 Georgia. She posted a hit in each game this week including multi-hit games in all three games of the Georgia series. Hay also recorded an extra-base hit in all three games of the SEC series with Georgia.
- Hay recorded her first career triple in game one of the series with Georgia.
   She finished Friday with a career-best matching 2-for-2 day with a run and a walk.
- Hay then posted a pair of 2-for-3 outings over Saturday's doubleheader to wrap the series with Georgia. She notched a double in game two before belting her second homer of the campaign (both in SEC play) in the series finale.
- Hay has now posted a career-best two hits, five times in 2024 including each of the last three contests.
- She leads Mizzou in 2024 with a .395 batting average including .423 in SEC play. Hay has started in each of the last 13 games for Missouri at first.

#### **GEORGIA RECAP**

- Mizzou took one of three in its three-game road series at Georgia.
- The Tigers opened the weekend strong, defeating the Bulldogs 4-2 (April 19). Mizzou then dropped a pair of games on Saturday, falling 4-2 in each contest (April 20).
- Freshman Abby Hay led Mizzou over the series, hitting .750 while Alex Honnold followed with a .600 batting average. Kara Daly chipped in a .429 weekend and Kayley Lenger batted .333.
- Laurin Krings put in 5.1 innings of work in the circle, allowing just two runs on five hits, while adding four strikeouts (April 19). With the win, Krings secured her 50th career win as a Tiger (10th of the 2024 campaign).
- Taylor Pannell added her 10th save of the season in game one of the series, as she continues to lead the NCAA in this category. She notched a

strikeout over the seventh inning.

- With the win Friday, Missouri matched its overall win (35) total from 2023 and surpassed the Tigers' SEC win total of seven from last spring.
- Claire Cahalan knocked a single in Game 2 of the series Saturday. The Columbus, Georgia, native, notched her third hit of the season in her home state (April 20).
- Cierra Harrison pitched 4.0 innings, allowing four runs on six hits. Harrison tallied three strikeouts in Game 1 on Saturday, marking her sixthstraight appearance with three or more punchouts (April 20).
- Kara Daly (2-for-3) posted two hits in the series finale on Saturday, including a double and a solo homer for her sixth home run of the campaign (April 20).
- Marissa McCann opened the day for Mizzou on the rubber (letting up three runs on three hits over 2.0 innings), before Laurin Krings closed out the contest, giving up just one run on no hits to go with four strikeouts (April 20).
- Alex Honnold posted a pair of hits in each of three games at Georgia.
- Kayley Lenger went 1-for-3 in the series finale on Saturday, extending her hit streak to four consecutive games (April 20).

#### **QUICK HITTERS**

- The Tigers head into the weekend with a 35-13 record and 8-10 SEC mark.
- The Tigers 35-13 record to open the season is the best start for Missouri since the Tigers began the 2013 campaign 23-3 en route to a 38-14 finish. Prior to that, the 2011 Tigers commenced the season 27-3 en route to a 53-10 finish.
- Missouri matched its overall win (35) total from 2023 and surpassed the Tigers' SEC win total of seven from last spring.
- Missouri has now registered 35 wins in five of the last six seasons (2020 COVID-19 shortened season was the only time the Tigers didn't meet the threshold in that span).


NOTES

- Abby Hay (.395 batting average, 17 hits, three doubles, two home runs, 8 RBI and a .651 slugging percentage) paces the Tigers at the plate.
- Alex Honnold (.371, 38 runs, 32 RBI, 20 doubles and 4 homers, .609 slugging percentage) is second on the team and one of five Tigers batting over .300. Jenna Laird is third (.340 with seven doubles, 25 RBI, 44 runs), while Kayley Lenger has added 27 runs, 27 hits and 11 RBI (.310 batting average) in the nine-hole.
- Maddie Gallagher is hitting .304, adding 26 runs and 38 hits to go with 10 doubles and 31 RBI.
- Alex Honnold has notched 20 doubles this season (first in the SEC, second in the NCAA), marking a new Mizzou program best. Honnold is now the sole leader in the record books for the category, surpassing Mary Babb (19 in 1995).
- Alex Honnold's total career-doubles sits at 49, which is tied for sixth with Nicole Hudson (2010-13) in Mizzou program history.
- Alex Honnold extended her hit-streak to four games, pacing the Tigers with a team-high 17 multi-hit games. She ranks third in the SEC for hits (56).
- Abby Hay and Kayley Lenger are also on four-game hitting streaks.
- Abby Hay recorded her first career triple in Friday's contest against Georgia (April 19). The freshman has started in each of the last 13 contests in 2024.
- Laurin Krings secured her 50th career win as a Tiger against Georgia (10th victory of her 2024 campaign), allowing two runs on five hits in 5.1 innings of work. She now sits one win away from breaking into the Mizzou program top-10 list for wins.
- Laurin Krings ranks sixth in Mizzou history with 546 strikeouts.
- Laurin Krings is the 11th Mizzou player to reach 500 career innings

- pitched, notching the feat at Hofstra. She ranks in the top-10 in Mizzou history for innings pitched (527.0 innings).
- Closer Taylor Pannell ranks first in the SEC and in the nation with 10 saves in 2024.
- Kara Daly paces Mizzou with six home runs in 2024. The third baseman is one RBI away from 100 in her career at Mizzou.
- Kayley Lenger extended her hitting streak to four consecutive contests over the Georgia series. Lenger also ranks first in the SEC (seventh in the NCAA) with 16 HBP (0.36, eighth in NCAA) in 2024.
- Jenna Laird moved fourth at Mizzou for career at bats (730) at Mizzou. She also is tied for fifth for runs (186) with Emily Crane.
- The one-two punch of Laurin Krings and Cierra Harrison have combined for 22 wins in the circle with 10-7 and 12-3 records, respectively. The duo has also gone the distance in the circle 11 times (seven and four complete games, respectively).
- Lilly Whitten (5-0), Marissa Mc-Cann (7-3) and Taylor Pannell (1-0, 10 saves) have also picked up wins for Mizzou in 2024.
- Head coach Larissa Anderson registered her 200th win at the helm of Mizzou (204-110) during the midweek at Drake. In her sixth season at Missouri, Anderson holds a career record of 334-183-1 over 10 career seasons.

#### FRESHMEN ON FIRE

- The freshmen trio of Abby Hay, Stefania Abruscato and Marissa McCann have combined for four SEC Player of the Week honors. Hay most recently was named SEC Player of the Week while McCann has earned SEC Freshman of the Week twice and Abruscato has earned the laurel once.
- Abby Hay paces Mizzou at the plate with a .395 batting average, while logging 17 hits, three doubles, two home runs and 8 RBI.
- The freshman has started the past 13 straight games for the Tigers.

- The Columbia, Missouri, native extended her hitting streak to four-straight games on Saturday, going 2-for-3 with a double and a run in Game 1 before notching her second homer of the season (both in SEC play) in Game 2.
- Hay has also tallied two hits in each of the last three games, marking her fifth multi-hit performance of the season to pace the Mizzou freshmen.
- Stefania Abruscato has also been a force for Mizzou as a freshman, logging a .229 batting average to go with 16 hits, nine RBI, two homers and a pair of doubles. She has started in each of the last eight games.
- Prior to that, Abruscato paced Mizzou the week of April 8, starting in all four games to post a batting .417 average as the Tigers went 3-1 including a series win over No. 9 Florida.
- Marissa McCann has made 20 appearances (six starts) over her freshman campaign, racking up a 7-3 record with a 1.94 ERA over 57.2 innings. She is limiting opposing offenses to a .180 batting average.

#### **DOUBLES QUEEN**

- Senior Alex Honnold belted her Mizzou program-best 20th double of the campaign (SEC-leading) in the series finale against Georgia Saturday.
- With the feat, Honnold became the sole leader in the record books for the category, surpassing Mary Babb (19 in 1995).
- The senior has compiled 49 doubles in her career at Missouri, which now ranks tied for sixth with Nicole Hudson (2010-13) in Mizzou program history.
- Honnold also posted a pair of hits (2-for-3) to go with a run and a walk on Friday, before finishing the weekend with a 2-for-3 performance and a 2-for-4 showing on Saturday.
- After the weekend, Honnold extended her hit-streak to four games and has posted two hits in each of the last three games. She also paces Mizzou with a team-high 17 multi-hit games.
- Honnold is one of five Tigers hitting over .300 this year. She is second on the team with a .371 batting average (including 38 runs, 32 RBI, 20 doubles and 4 homers, along with a .651 slugging percentage).

NOTES

- The Tigers finished the 2023 season with a 35-26 mark, including a 7-17 in SEC play. With its 2023 record, Missouri has registered 35 wins in four of the last five seasons (2020 COVID-19 shortened season was the only time the Tigers didn't meet the threshold in that span).
- During the 2023 campaign, Missouri totaled 51 home runs, while logging 75 doubles to go with 310 runs as a team.
- On the dirt, Mizzou tallied a .978 fielding percentage. The clip ranks second in program history, after the Tigers' surpassed their previous .976 fielding percentage from 2022.

- Games are set for Friday (5 p.m., CT), Saturday (5 p.m., CT) and Sunday (2 p.m., CT) in Columbia, South Carolina.

A new era in Mizzou Softball began in the Summer of 2018, as Larissa Anderson was named the 10th head coach to lead the tradition-rich Tiger program on Saturday, May 26, 2018.

As Anderson enters year six in Mid-Missouri that new era has already gotten off to a successful start, and her ability to change the culture of the program in such a short time was a big reason why. Anderson has led Mizzou to a 169-97 record over her five seasons and owns a career record of 299-170-1 as a head coach.

In her short time at the helm of the Tigers, Anderson has steered Missouri to 169 victories, one NCAA Super Regional and two regional final appearances. In 2021, Mizzou hosted a regional and super regional for the first time since 2013 and again hosted a regional in 2022.

Anderson finished her first season in the Black & Gold with a 35-25 record, the most wins for the Tigers in a single season since 2016, when they won 42 games. Anderson's squad was also stellar in her first season as part of the always elite Southeastern Conference, as the Tigers' 12 wins during SEC play, which resulted in a tie for fourth place, were the most conference victories for Mizzou since 2016. The season ended with the Tigers' 13th straight regional appearance, as Anderson's Tigers earned a spot in the Los Angeles Regional, where they went 3-2, pushing host No. 2 UCLA to a winner-take-all game seven.

Her biggest test would come during the 2020 season. With Mizzou Softball's postseason ban being upheld three months prior to the season, Anderson's steady leadership guided the Tigers through what would be a turbulent year. Despite the postseason ban, Mizzou lost zero players to transfer, and entered the season with its roster intact.

Mizzou's postseason ban would prove to be only a minor blip in a season that was ultimately canceled after 26 games due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Tigers made the most of those 26 games, finishing with a 19-7 record, and being one of only two teams to be undefeated in SEC play. Mizzou ended the season ranked 25th in the NFCA Coaches' Poll – its first time finishing the season ranked since 2016 – while Cayla Kessinger was named to Softball America's All-America team.

Anderson returned Mizzou Softball to the national stage in 2021. With an experienced roster but a young pitching staff, she led the Tigers to a 42-17 record and a Super Regional appearance. Mizzou hosted an NCAA Regional and Super Regional for the first time since 2013. The 2021 team finished among the program's best statistically in fielding percentage (1st), home runs (1st), RBI (2nd), doubles (T-6th), and runs scored (3rd).

In the postseason, Mizzou pitching led the nation in ERA at 1.37 over six games. Two Tiger pitchers, Jordan Weber and Laurin Krings combined to allow only two hits and no runs over three games at the Columbia Regional. Freshman shortstop Jenna Laird earned SEC Freshman of the Year honors while senior outfielder Brooke Wilmes was recognized as an NFCA Third Team All-American. Anderson led the Tigers to a No. 13 final ranking in the NFCA Coaches' Poll and a No. 14 ranking in the USA Softball poll, the program's highest final rankings since 2015.

Mizzou's memorable 2022 season saw them host an NCAA Regional for the second-consecutive year and made the Southeastern Conference Tournament Championship game for the second time in program history. The Tigers notched a 38-22 mark and went 12-11 during SEC play. Mizzou's pitching staff posted a 2.81 ERA including a 1.00 ERA in the postseason.

In the inaugural year of the Rawlings Gold Glove Award, presented by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association, Jenna Laird and Casidy Chaumont earned the award at shortstop and left field, respectively.

Laird, a 2022 Softball All-SEC Second Team player, finished the year with a .975 fielding percentage, while turning 10 double plays and did not make an error during SEC play.

Chaumont, an All-SEC Defensive Team Selection, has appeared on SportsCenter's Top Ten Plays four times over her career at Mizzou. After beginning her career as an infielder at Louisiana, she converted to the outfield at the start of the 2021 season and finished with a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage. Chaumont has thrown out five runners on the basepaths from left field over her two seasons in the Black and Gold.

Kimberly Wert and Brooke Wilmes were each named First Team All-SEC performers in 2022. Jordan Weber, Jenna Laird, Wert and Wilmes were each tabbed to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association Southeast All-Region team. Weber led the Tigers to the SEC Tournament final with a pair of shutouts against No. 17/20 Auburn and No. 13/10 Tennessee. She became the first Mizzou pitcher to record three wins in a single SEC series when she earned the victory in all three games against Kentucky.

Mizzou is coming off a 2023 season that saw the Tigers reach a 16th straight NCAA Regional, finishing the season with a 35-26 record and going 7-17 against SEC foes. The pitching staff proved efficient yet again, registering a cumulative ERA of 3.33, including a strikeout/walk ratio of 2.66.

Alex Honnold became the 26th All-American in program history (31 total All-American honors) after earning Second-Team honors from the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA).

A Top 25 Finalist for 2023 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year, Honnold led Mizzou and ranked top six in the SEC for on-base percentage (.539), slugging percentage (.779), runs (52), batting average (.396), and triples (three). Her slugging percentage in 2023 ranked fourth all-time in program history. Honnold also earned NFCA Southeast All-Region honors and was named to the All-SEC Second Team.

Jenna Laird joined Honnold in representing the Tigers on the All-SEC Team, her sixth postseason honor at Mizzou and third-straight appearance on the All-SEC Team. The leadoff hitter paced the Tigers in SEC play with a .291 batting average to go with 14 runs, three doubles, five RBI, .371 on-base percentage, and a .329 slugging percentage.

Anderson joined Mizzou after a 17-year run at Hofstra, the final four as the head coach.



In four seasons at Hofstra, Anderson fashioned a 130-73-1 (.640) record with a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances, two Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) titles and four winning seasons. She picked up her 100th career win with the Pride's 7-2 win over Boston University, March 17, 2018, and posted seven career wins over nationally-ranked opponents, including three in 2018—a 1-0 victory over then-No. 13 Florida State on March 2 and a pair at No. 22 James Madison to claim the CAA Tournament crown.

The 2018 campaign was a historic one for Hofstra Softball, as Anderson led the 24th-ranked Pride to a 41-14 record, the CAA Tournament title and the NCAA Columbia Regional. Hofstra earned an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament by defeating CAA regular-season champion and 22nd-ranked James Madison, 7-4, to claim its 12th CAA title in the sport since joining the league in 2002 and returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2015.

Anderson's 2018 squad reached the 40-win mark for the 11th time in program history (and first since a school-record 46 wins in 2013), while setting school records for runs scored (334), home runs (70) and RBI (315). Hofstra owned an RPI of 19 against the nation's 29th-toughest schedule in 2018. Hofstra also garnered a league-high eight CAA postseason honors headlined by Sarah Cornell's selection as the CAA Pitcher of the Year—the Pride's 10th such honor all-time and first since 2013, all of which were tutored by Anderson.

In 2017, Hofstra returned to the CAA championship game, as the program registered its 28th-straight winning season (27-23) and earned the No. 2 seed in the CAA Tournament. Anderson picked up her first win over a Top 10 opponent as head coach with a 5-2 victory over No. 10 James Madison. Under Anderson's direction, Cornell was named first-team NFCA All-Northeast Region as a rookie, while also earning a spot on the All-CAA second team and All-Rookie team.

The Pride posted another winning record in her second season (24-22) and had six student-athletes earn CAA postseason honors and two garner NFCA All-Northeast Region recognition.

In her first season as the storied program's head coach in 2015, Anderson led Hofstra to the CAA championship and an NCAA Tournament berth, guiding Hofstra to a 38-14-1 record and a spot in the NCAA Gainesville Regional. Anderson and her assistants were named the NFCA Northeast Region's Coaching Staff of the Year after Hofstra posted a collective 2.05 ERA, smashed 56 home runs and out-scored opponents, 277-129.

Anderson has been part of eight NFCA Regional Coaching Staff of the Year award winners, including seven as an assistant or associate head coach and one as the head coach. In 17 seasons at Hofstra, she helped the Pride to a 610-267-2 (.695) record). Before taking over as head coach from Hall of Famer Bill Edwards, Anderson spent 13 seasons on the Hofstra staff as an assistant, including the last 10 as the associate head coach, helping the program to 10 NCAA Tournament appearances and 10 CAA titles. As associate head coach, she helped Hofstra win 24 NCAA Tournament games and make six appearances in the regional finals.

Under Anderson's guidance, Hofstra hurlers won nine CAA Pitcher of the Year awards in 10 seasons, including four consecutive wins by Olivia Galati from 2010-13 and three from Kayleigh Lotti from 2007-09. Galati was twice named an All-America by the NFCA and was the program's first-ever first-team pick in 2012 after leading Division I with a 0.95 ERA and a 34-7 record. Anderson helped guide Galati to a NCAA-best 40 wins and 22 shutouts in 2013.

A hallmark of the Hofstra Softball program during Anderson's tenure was the Pride's stellar defense. From 2008-13, Hofstra consistently ranked among the nation's elite in fielding percentage as the Pride was among the Top 20 nationally in five of those seasons. Hofstra ranked first in Division I in fielding percentage during the 2011 season and was fourth in 2008 and 2010, and 16th in 2012 and 2013. Her 2018 team currently ranks sixth nationally with an .979 mark.

An active NFCA member, she chaired its Ethics Committee from 2009-13, and currently serves as its Fourth Vice President on the NFCA executive board and as a member of the NFCA Recruiting Committee and the NFCA Hall of Fame Committee. Anderson is currently the Vice President of the Awards Committee. She was elected NFCA President on Oct. 25, 2022, and was one of eight members who were voted to the NFCA's Board of Directors for 2023. Anderson will officially begin her three-year term on January 1, 2023.

Prior to joining the Hofstra staff, Anderson served as an assistant coach for two seasons at LIU Post, where she helped the Pioneers to a combined 75-33 record, including a school-record 42 wins during the 2000 season. She assisted in all facets of the program at LIU Post and was in charge of coaching the pitchers and catchers. Her efforts helped the Pioneers to the 13th-best team earned run average in Division II (1.11) in 2001. She was also part of a C.W. Post staff that received the Northeast Region Division II Coaching Staff of the Year award from the NFCA in 2000.

Anderson spent one season as an assistant coach at Gannon University in 1998, after being named a regional All-American outfielder in 1997. She graduated from Gannon in 1997 with a bachelor's of science degree in therapeutic recreation.

She is married to former Hofstra Baseball Coach Patrick Anderson, who manages the St. Louis Cardinals' Class A affiliate in Peoria, Illinois.
