2017 (Junior)

- Appeared in 22 contests, earning a career-best 11 starts in the circle
- Closed the season with a 9-4 record with three complete games to finish second on the team with a 2.20 ERA, which ranked 20th in the conference and 105th nationally
- Struck out 77 over 73.1 innings of work to hold opponents to a .181 average at the plate, the third-lowest mark in MSU single-season history and the lowest by a Bulldog since 2013
- Ranked fifth in the SEC and 19th across the country with a 4.39 hits per seven innings average
- Placed third in the conference and ranked 49th nationally with a 7.35 strikeouts per seven innings mark
- Made season debut in a start against Western Kentucky (Feb. 11), tossing 6.1 innings of one-hit softball, allowing just one run and striking out nine
- First win of the season came in a start against Southern Illinois (Feb. 25) as she notched 5.0 innings of work and allowed just two runs off three hits with nine strikeouts
- Closed the season with three outings of nine strikeouts or better, including a career high of 10 against Alabama State on March 2
- Tossed 3.0 innings of relief against Samford (March 3), allowing one hit and striking out seven to tie her career high for strikeouts as a reliever
- In MSU's 10-0 victory over Alabama State, tallied her second no-hitter of her career, which ties for the most by a Bulldog in school history and the 19th in MSU history
- Tossed 1.1 innings of relief at Southern Miss (March 28) to earn her fifth victory of the season, shattering her previous career high
- Strung together 8.1 scoreless inning streak over April 14-22 to set a career high

2016 (Sophomore)

- Appeared in 19 games, drawing five starts
- Finished 4-0 on the year, moving her career record to a perfect 6-0 in two seasons
- Pitched a total of 37.0 innings, throwing one complete game and the first no-hitter of her career
- Totaled 34 strikeouts and 19 walks while keeping opposing batters to a .264 clip
- Recorded a pair of contests with at least seven strikeouts
- Made her season debut in a start against Houston on Feb. 12, throwing 5.0
 innings and only giving up one run on four hits while striking out three to
 open the season with a win
- In her third start of the season, turned in 5.0 innings of work and only surrendered one run to improve to 2-0 with a 7-4 win against SIU-Edwardsville (Feb. 20)
- Made her third relief appearance of the season against Western Kentucky
 (March 6), tossing seven strikeouts in 5.0 innings for the shutout, moving to 3-0
- In the final regular-season game of the season, tossed the 18th no-hitter in school history while striking out a career-high eight batters to push MSU to an 8-0 victory against Alcorn State on May 9

- Struck out one in one inning in her collegiate debut against Middle Tennessee (Feb. 6)
- Started her first collegiate game at UAB (Feb. 24)
- Threw her first complete collegiate game against Memphis (April 22) in an 11-3 win in five innings
- Struck out a career-high nine batters in a career-high 7.1 innings at Georgia Southern (April 26)

- A three-year letterwinner as an infielder, outfielder and pitcher for the Rams and head coach Tia Stiles
- As a junior, earned a spot on the Class 5A lowa Girls Coaches

Since being hired as the Mississippi State softball head coach on Thursday, June 23, 2011, Vann Stuedeman has invigorated the Bulldog program. In six seasons, the Vestavia Hills, Ala., native has led the squad to five NCAA Tournament appearances and 33 or more wins in five of her six campaigns.

In her most recent season, Stuedeman led the Bulldogs back to postseason contention, as State reeled off 36 wins and made their way to the Salt Lake City Regional, marking a fifth NCAA Tournament appearance in the last six years and the 13th in school history. That stretch marked the best since going seven out of eight years from 2002-09.

The Bulldogs found tremendous success in the SEC, which sent every team to the NCAA Tournament in 2017, the most ever sent by one conference. Under Stuedeman's leadership, the Dogs reeled off four SEC series wins in the last five weekends, including defeating No. 16 Kentucky, No. 19 Georgia and No. 24 Arkansas. MSU's four SEC series wins were the most since 2012, Stuedeman's first year with the Maroon and White, while its nine ranked wins tied for the most in school history (2004). She also became the only coach in school history to record at least one ranked win in every season of their tenure.

One of the many highlights of the 2017 campaign came from Feb. 17 – March 10, as the Bulldogs reeled off 16-straight victories to tie a school record. That record was first set in 2006, from Feb. 10 – March 3. Along with one of the most impressive winning streaks in school history was the continued success of drawing fans to one of the best collegiate softball parks in all of America. A total of 2,946 fans made their way to Nusz Park for MSU's first home weekend of SEC play, marking the largest such crowd in school history. State also drew 1,413 for the Saturday game against South Carolina for 2017 Super Bulldog Weekend, marking the third-largest SBW crowd in school history.

At season's end, MSU had drawn two of the program's top 15 largest crowds in school history during the 2017 campaign. That gives Stuedeman 12 of the program's top 15 crowds during her six years at the helm, including the top three crowds.

Individually, the Bulldogs had a number of standouts that led them back to the postseason, led by All-SEC First Team honoree Caroline Seitz. Seitz capped her career with the Maroon and White by becoming the 19th in school history and first since Chelsea Bramlett in 2010 to earn the honor. The Birmingham, Ala., native, who also was named NFCA All-South Region Second Team, blew up in the second half of the conference season. After struggling to start, Stuedeman's star third baseman tore through the SEC slate, finishing the year leading the conference with seven home runs, 28 RBI, a .724 slugging percentage and 55 total bases, while finishing top 10 with a .368 clip, 28 hits and six doubles. Her hot streak began during MSU's road series win at No. 19 Georgia, where she went 7-for-10 (.700) with 14 RBI, four home runs (two grand slams), four runs scored, a scorching 1.900 slugging percentage and a .667 OBP. She became the first player in school history to hit four home runs in an SEC weekend series and the first to hit a grand slam in back-to-back games.

For her efforts, Seitz was named SEC, Louisville Slugger NFCA and USA Softball Player of the Week honors. She became the second player in school history to win all three in the same week, joining former Bulldog All-American lyhia McMichael (2004).

From the circle, the Dogs were led by senior Alexis Silkwood, who finished her career as MSU's all-time leader in wins (59), strikeouts (552), complete games (50), innings pitched (665.0) and appearances (145). The NFCA All-South Region Second Team honoree became the first Bulldog in history to record 600-plus innings pitched and 500-plus strikeouts for her career. She also finished her career second in starts (96), third in saves (9) and tied for third in shutouts (13). Along with her 15 wins and 108 strikeouts, Stuedeman helped Silkwood become one of the nation's top closers in 2017, as she recorded five saves (1st in SEC, 8th in NCAA). Her five saves tied her for sixth on the MSU single-season list.

Silkwood also became the 13th Bulldog in school history to reach the pro level, as she was selected in the fifth round (24th pick) by the Akron Racers in the 2017 NPF Draft. She is the third Bulldog to be selected in the NPF Draft since Stuedeman arrived in 2012, joining Alison Owen (2014) and Kayla Winkfield (2016).

Rounding out the individual honors was center fielder Amanda Ivy, who reeled off one highlight play after another in the outfield to earn All-SEC Defensive Team honors.

Stuedeman's fifth season at the helm saw the Bulldogs capture 26 total wins and climb as high as 23rd in the ESPN.com/USA Softball Top 25. Stuedeman's club took on the third-toughest schedule in the nation, which featured five of its eight conference series coming against 2015 Women's College World Series participants, while two others came against 2015 NCAA Super Regional participants. They played a total of 23 games against Top 5 opponents and 16 against 2015 WCWS teams.

Despite some struggles, the team still showcased extreme grit and toughness while playing in the toughest conference in the NCAA, as the SEC finished 2016 with the highest RPI among conference teams. With a total of 10 come-from-behind victories, Stuedeman maintains







a reputation of fielding programs that fight until the final out. On her career, Stuedeman has 60 comeback victories. Her squads also continued to dominate late in games, as MSU finished 2016 with a 19-3 record when leading after five innings and a 19-2 mark when up after six. Stuedeman's teams have been nearly flawless when holding the lead late in games, going 109-8 after five and 101-6 after six for her career.

Behind the play of senior Kayla Winkfield, a 2016 NPF draftee who led the SEC and stood ninth in the NCAA with six triples, the Bulldogs' offense churned out 0.21 triples per game, finishing fourth in the SEC.

The 2016 Bulldogs tallied 15 sacrifice flies, which tied for fourth-most in program history. They also held true to the "We Don't Move" mantra brought by the coaching staff, tallying 60 hit by pitches, which is third in the school record books.

Success continued for Stuedeman's pitching staff in 2016, as State tallied 305 strikeouts. The total finished fifth in school history, as did MSU's 5.41 strikeouts per seven innings average.

In 2015, Stuedeman led MSU to its fourth-straight NCAA Tournament appearance with 36 wins, marking just the second time in program history that had been accomplished (2002-05).

The Bulldogs carried a never-say-die attitude with them in 2015 as they recorded 15 come-from-behind wins to give Stuedeman a total of 50 comeback wins over her first four seasons in Starkville. Three Bulldogs were named to the NFCA All-South Region team in 2015, tying a season-best in the Stuedeman era that was set in 2013.

Alexis Silkwood tallied SEC Pitcher of the Week honors in back-to-back weeks (March 30 and April 6). The two SEC Pitcher of the Week awards marked the third-straight year with such an honoree, the longest stretch for the program since 2001-04.

Prior to Stuedeman taking over the program in 2012,

MSU had seven total SEC Pitcher of the Week honors. In the five-year Stuedeman era, the Bulldogs have won seven. The 2014 Bulldogs' four total SEC weekly honors are tied with the 2008 and 2004 squads for the second most in program history.

Stuedeman's 2014 edition really took off, earning a program third-best 39 victories and an MSU second-best eight wins against ranked opponents. The Bulldogs made three-straight NCAA trips for the first time since 2007-09 and had three consecutive 30-win seasons for the first time since 1998-2008.

Included in the spring of 2014's 39 victories were three-straight victories against top-five clubs with back-to-back wins against No. 3/2 Alabama on April 12-13 and a 2-0 triumph at No. 4/4 Tennessee on April 18. It was the first time the Bulldogs had won three consecutive games against ranked foes since taking seven straight from April 9-May 13, 2004, and the first time ever winning three straight against top-five opponents.

During the campaign, Stuedeman guided her squad to four wins versus top-five opponents in the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) poll. Entering the year, the Bulldogs had won five games in program history versus top-five opponents.

Stuedeman's 2014 team also earned three-straight Southeastern Conference series wins for the first time since April 6-21, 2012. The club started off on fire, winning 15-straight games, one game shy of the longest season-opening victory streak in program history.

Individually, Stuedeman helped Caroline Seitz to selections as a Top 25 Finalist for the inaugural NFCA Freshman of the Year Award and NFCA All-South Region First Team honors. Seitz became the sixth freshman in program history to earn all-region honors, the initial under Stuedeman and the first since Ka'ili Smith in 2009.

Seitz was joined by Alexis Silkwood on the SEC All-Freshman Team. The two selections are tied for the most in a year in MSU history.

Silkwood used Stuedeman's guidance in the pitching circle to turn in one of the most successful rookie campaigns in program history. Silkwood set the MSU freshman record for strikeouts in a season with 167 and set the rookie single-game record with 13 whiffs against Texas Southern in the NCAA Tournament.

Following two impressive outings at No. 4/4 Tennessee, Silkwood was named the April 21 SEC Pitcher of the Week as well as the Feb. 17 and March 3 SEC Freshman of the Week. Alison Owen was also tabbed as the April 14 SEC Pitcher of the Week.

After becoming the winningest first-year head coach in school history (.579/33-24 record) in 2012, Stuedeman followed up with another 33-24 campaign and a second-straight NCAA Tournament bid in 2013. The 2013 Bulldogs were named an Easton Team of the Year, joining Women's College World Series participants Florida and Texas.

During 2013, Owen's first year on the active roster, she became the first pitcher in school history to receive SEC Pitcher of the Week honors in consecutive weeks, earning the nods on Feb. 25 and March 4. Owen established the singlegame Mississippi State record for strikeouts with 16 against SIU-Edwardsville on Feb. 24 and was selected as the March 5 CollegeSportsMadness.com National Pitcher of the Week.

Stuedeman guided the pitching staff to a pair of nohitters in 2013, the most by the program in a year since tossing four in 2006.

Offensively, Stuedeman's aggressive approach helped the team tie the program record for stolen bases per game with 2.00 and total the second-most swipes in a campaign in MSU history with 114. The approach at the plate translated into a program-record 51 home runs, besting the previous mark by four.

Stuedeman helped Owen earn a spot on the NFCA All-South Region Second Team at the end of the year. Owen was joined on the squad by Logan Foulks and Sam Lenahan. It was only the fourth time in program history having three or more selections.

The pitching development and philosophies Stuedeman brought from the University of Alabama, where she was known as a pitching genius in 11 years as the Crimson Tide pitching coach, paid huge dividends during her initial season. She took a school record-high 4.90 earned-run average from 2011 and with the same group of five pitchers, cut the ERA to 2.88 in 2012. Stuedeman also helped the pitching staff improve from 2011 to 2012 in: wins (24 to 33), complete games (12 to 20), no-hitters (zero to one), hits allowed (435 to 310), runs allowed (313 to 194), strikeouts (242 to 358), home runs allowed (50 to 27) and opponent batting average (.300 to .224).

Individually, Stuedeman coached Stephanie Becker to a career year. Against eventual Women's College World Series participant South Florida, Stuedeman called her 24th career no-hitter. Later in the year, Becker became the first Bulldog pitcher since Stephanie Comeaux in 2006 to be named SEC Pitcher of the Week after picking up three conference victories in a series sweep versus Kentucky.

Stuedeman also focused heavily on improving the defense. She succeeded, increasing the Bulldogs' fielding percentage from 2011 to 2012 by nine points (.954 to .963). Her staff gave up 154 earned runs in 2012, almost 100 fewer than the previous spring.

In 2012, Stuedeman took MSU to its first NCAA Tournament since 2009, she became one of only two first-time head coaches to make the field of 64. With 33 overall wins, Stuedeman guided MSU to its first 30-win season since 2008, despite having the fourth-toughest strength of schedule in the nation.

Fully buying into Stuedeman's system paid dividends at the end of the year, when the Bulldogs won 14 of their last 20 contests, including a 12-game winning streak from April 10 - May 4, 2012.

Prior to the NCAA Tournament, Stuedeman led the Bulldogs to their 12th Southeastern Conference Tournament berth with 12 SEC wins, the most for MSU since 2008. For the first time since 2001, MSU swept back-to-back three-game series and won six consecutive conference games.

Outside the SEC, Stuedeman was dominant. Mississippi State won 21 non-conference games and recorded 13-straight non-conference triumphs. It was the longest streak since a school-record 16-consecutive contests to begin the 2006 season.

On the road, the 2012 Bulldogs broke the school record for true road wins in a season with number 13 coming at Auburn on May 4, 2012. The eight SEC road wins were the most for the Bulldogs since eight in 2001.

Within Mississippi, Stuedeman has shined brightest. Stuedeman has only dropped two games to in-state foes during her tenure, while winning seven of her nine meetings with Ole Miss.

One of the key principles under Stuedeman has been having success in the late innings. The 2012 club outscored opponents 64-31 after the fifth. State went 9-7 in one-run games, its best winning percentage in one-run games since 2002. The Bulldogs were unbeaten when leading late during the year, finishing 21-0 when ahead after the fifth inning.

Offensively in her first year, Stuedeman oversaw a lineup that set a then-school record for single-season walks (202), while finishing in the top 10 in runs, home runs, slugging percentage and stolen bases. Stuedeman coached MSU's first SEC Player of the Week since 2010, two SEC Players of the Week in the same season for the first time since 2004 and MSU's second National Player of the Week.

Prior to her arrival in Starkville, Stuedeman helped Alabama claim three SEC regular-season titles en route to reaching the Women's College World Series six times.

As an assistant coach since 2001, Stuedeman helped the Crimson Tide go 579-150 from 2000-11 (.794), including a sparkling 243-70 record inside the SEC. Stuedeman anchored a staff that had an ERA under 2.00 in eight of her 11 campaigns, struck out an average of 485 batters per season and held opponents scoreless in 221 games. The 2011 staff led the SEC in ERA, giving Stuedeman's staff a top-20 ERA nationally in five of the previous six seasons before she left Alabama.

Stuedeman coached six All-American pitchers with 11 All-America and All-SEC honors while in Tuscaloosa. Under her instruction, Tide pitchers registered 23 no-hitters, including three perfect games. Three times Stuedeman coached the

SEC Pitcher of the Year, while racking up 19 SEC Pitcher of the Week honors. She also coached two SEC Freshman of the Year and one SEC Tournament Most Valuable Player.

In 2011, Stuedeman tutored the pitching staff to a 1.69 ERA, a 53-10 record and third-place finish at the Women's College World Series. The staff included a pair of All-American pitchers in Kelsi Dunne and Jackie Traina. Dunne, a volunteer assistant coach at Mississippi State in 2012, capped her career with a 29-5 record and a 1.42 ERA. The right-hander struck out 331 batters and held opponents to a school-record .146 average. Dunne also tossed three no-hitters and posted 11 shutouts. Traina went 19-5 with a 1.70 ERA, adding 190 strikeouts in 156.1 innings with two no-hitters, three shutouts and four saves.

Prior to joining Alabama, Stuedeman coached at West Alabama, Alabama-Huntsville and East Limestone High School. The Birmingham, Ala., area native graduated in 1994 from Huntingdon College, where she helped the Hawks to two third-place finishes at the national tournament (1992 and 1994). The 1994 All-American was inducted into her alma mater's Hall of Fame on Oct. 8, 2011.

Stuedeman served as a graduate assistant at the University of West Alabama from 1995-96 while earning her master's degree in elementary education, helping lead the team to the Gulf South Conference championship in 1995 while the team's head coach was away from the team on maternity leave. The championship and winning season was the first in the '90s for the West Alabama program.

After spending two seasons at UWA, Stuedeman went to the University of Alabama-Huntsville for three years as an assistant for her sister, Les Stuedeman, and worked with pitchers and outfielders. During her stint, the UAH pitching staff ranked in the top five in Division II in ERA. She helped lead the program to two Gulf South Conference championships, three NCAA Regional appearances and a trip to the 1999 Division II National Tournament. She was also part of the staff that was named South Region Coaching Staff of the Year in 1999.

She then accepted the head coaching position at East Limestone High School, in Athens, Ala., where she led the team to its first winning season since 1994.

Assistant Coach • Fourth Season @Coach Ricketts

Samantha Ricketts enters her fourth year as a member of the Mississippi State coaching staff after spending the three years prior as an assistant coach at Wichita State University. Ricketts works with Bulldog hitters and has game management and recruiting responsibilities.

In her first season in charge of the MSU offense, State set new single-season records for home runs (54), batting average (.312), slugging percentage (.495), RBIs (294) and on-base percentage (.416). MSU also finished second in the single-season record books for runs scored (326), doubles (84) and hit by pitches (72). State's 753 total bases in 2015 ranked third in the MSU single-season record books.

In 2014 without Ricketts on the MSU staff, just two Bulldogs hit over .300, while in 2015 with Ricketts, nine Bulldogs hit over .300 (min. 5 AB).

During the 2016 season, Ricketts' leadership led senior Kayla Winkfield to a .330 average and an SEC-leading six triples, which finished Top 10 in the nation. For her career, Winkfield finished in MSU's Top 10 for triples (10) and stolen bases (75)

Ricketts is also responsible for the rise of Bulldog star Caroline Seitz, who has put her name in numerous categories throughout the MSU record book. Seitz entered her senior season, Seitz is fifth in home runs (28), slugging percentage (.564) and doubles (43), while seventh in RBI (122) and tied for ninth in total bases (314).

In her most recent season, Ricketts produced five starters that hit better than .300 to help lead the Bulldogs back to a NCAA Regional berth. Under Ricketts tutelage, transfer infielder Reggie Harrison knocked 15 doubles, the ninth most over a single season. Harrison held a 0.26 doubles per game average to rank fifth amongst the SEC.

Ricketts guided Seitz to a breakout senior season that earned the Birmingham, Ala., native First Team All-SEC honors. Seitz was the first Bulldog to win the laurel since Chelsea Bramlett in 2010. She also brought home NFCA All-South Region Second Team honors.

Seitz turned in a phenomenal performance on the road at No. 19 Georgia as she went 7-for-10 with 14 RBI, four home runs (two grand slams), four runs scored and a scorching 1.900 slugging percentage. She became the first player in school history to hit four home runs in a SEC weekend series and the first to hit grand slams in back-to-back games.

Her efforts earned her SEC, Louisville Slugger NFCA and USA Softball Player of the Week honors. She became just the second player in school history to win all three in the same week, joining former Bulldog All-American lyhia Mc-Michael (2004).

Seitz closed her career in the Maroon and White ranking in the Top 10 in 12 categories, including tied for second all-time in home runs (37) and grand slams (2), third in doubles (53), fourth in RBI (166), fifth in slugging percentage (.554) and eighth in hits (230).

With the Shockers, Ricketts worked with the team's hitters and consistently improved their production. Her last spring at WSU was her most successful as she helped the Shockers increase their overall win total by 15 from 2013 to 2014. Wichita State finished 21-6 in the Missouri Valley Conference (MVC) in 2014 to win the program's first regular-season league title.

Ricketts was part of the MVC Coaching Staff of the Year, helping to improve the Shockers from the ninth place in 2012, to eighth place in 2013, to MVC champs in 2014.

Individually, Ricketts produced five starters who each hit better than .300 in 2014 after the squad did not have a batter hit over .300 in 2013. The Shockers scored 138 more runs, smashed 26 more home runs, hit 11 more doubles and added seven more triples last spring than in the 2013 season. Overall, the 2014 team established the program single-season records

for batting average, slugging percentage, onbase percentage, runs scored, hits, doubles, home runs, runs batted in and total bases.

Under Ricketts' guidance, Cacy Williams was a National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) All-Midwest Region First-Team honoree in 2014 as well as becoming the first student-athlete in MVC history to receive Player of the Year and Newcomer of the Year honors from the league. She broke the Wichita State single-season records for batting average (.424), slugging percentage (.812), on-base percentage (.531), total bases (138), runs scored (57), home runs (16) and RBI (47). Brittany Fortner joined Williams on the MVC First Team and was an NFCA All-Midwest Region Second-Team selection. She tallied 14 doubles, two shy of the program record, and finished with a .358 batting average, 62 hits, 35 RBI and a .578 slugging percentage.

In 2013, her second season at Wichita State, Ricketts oversaw a 12-point jump in team batting average from 2012 while helping the squad to 17 more doubles and seven additional home runs. She also helped Erin Carney earn a spot on the All- MVC First Team.

During her first year with the Shockers, Ricketts coached Rachel Milnark and Sydney Stuever to Second Team All-MVC accolades.

At the conclusion of her four-year Oklahoma playing career in 2009, Ricketts was the record holder in career home runs (48) and runs batted in (239) while ranking third in extra-base hits (97), total bases (444), slugging percentage (.645) and on-base percentage (.461). She started 192 consecutive games and ended her career as the Big 12 career RBI leader.

On the field, Ricketts was a four-time All-Big 12 first team selection, a two-time All-Amercian and and a two-time Academic All-Big 12 first team honoree. In 2009, she was named to the NFCA All-American Team and NFCA All-Central Region first team pick and was a top-10 finalist for the Lowe's Senjor Class Award.

In 2008, she was named to the Preseason USA Softball National Player of the Year Watch List and ESPN.com's Preseason All-America second team. Ricketts ended her junior season with All-Big 12 Tournament honors.

As a sophomore in 2007, Ricketts was a second-team All-American and first team NFCA All-Midwest Region selection. She became the first Sooner to be a top-three finalist for the USA Softball Player of the Year award after topping all Division I players in runs batted in during the regular season. She was the lone freshman in 2006 to earn All-Big 12 first team honors and was selected as a member of the NFCA All-Midwest Region squad.

Ricketts began her coaching career on the Oklahoma softball staff as a graduate assistant coach, in 2010 and 2011. During that time she played in the National Pro Fastpitch (NPF) league with the Akron Racers. She was the 12th overall pick in the 2009 NPF Draft.

The former NPF star made her return to the pro scene this past spring, as she joined the coaching staff of the USSSA Pride for the 2016 season. With the help of Ricketts, the Pride reached the NPF Championship Series against the Chicago Randits

The San Jose, Calif., product earned her bachelor's degree in sociology from the University of Oklahoma in 2009 and her master's of education in adult higher education with an emphasis in intercollegiate athletic administration in December of 2011.

Ricketts has three younger siblings who played collegiate athletics. Her sister Stephanie graduated in 2012 after an All-American pitching career at the University of Hawai'i and her sister Keilani graduated from the University of Oklahoma and is playing for the USSSA Pride of the NPF and Shokki Softball in Japan. Keilani was the 2012 and 2013 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year. Her younger brother Richard played football at the Air Force Academy.

Assistant Coach • Fifth Season @CoachTbratt

Tyler Bratton is in his fifth season as an assistant coach with the Mississippi State softball program as head coach Vann Stuedeman used a face familiar to Starkville to fill her coaching void in December of 2013.

Bratton, who works with outfielders and defense, and has game management and recruiting responsibilities, is a 2007 Mississippi State graduate and spent the previous five years working with the Bulldog baseball program as its coordinator of baseball operations.

The MSU outfield has committed just 18 errors and has posted a fielding percentage of .976 over the past four seasons under Bratton.

Over Bratton's fourth season, MSU's defense turned in a .965 fielding percentage, which tied the 2003 squad for the fourth-highest fielding percentage in program history and was the highest fielding percentage by the team since Bratton's debut season in 2014. MSU fielders also turned 19 doubles plays, while seven Bulldogs turned in error-free performance for the season.

Bratton's guidance earned Amanda Ivy a spot on the All-SEC Defensive Team, becoming the first player in program history to reel the laurel. Ivy robbed opponents of home runs three times over the season, with her wall-crashing catch against No. 24 Arkansas, which was voted SEC Softball Catch of the Year, highlighted the group. She earned national exposure with the play with a spot at No 6 on SportsCenter's Top 10 and the third top play on NCAA's weekly top 10.

lvy also showcased her arm over the season with three assists from the outfield, while adding 45 putouts. She closed her career ranking tied for fifth in program history with a .985 fielding percentage.

Caroline Seitz also earned MSU's first All-SEC First Team laurel since 2010. Strong defensive, Seitz only committed four errors in 195 chances for a .979 fielding percentage as a senior. The third baseman also turned four double plays.

Bratton's third season with the softball Bulldogs, MSU fielders turned 18 double plays, moving his career total to 50. A total of 17 fielders posted a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage and the Dogs registered 16 error-free contests.

In his second season with the program in 2015, MSU turned 22 double plays, which ranked third in the Southeastern Conference as nine different Bulldogs contributed to the 22 twin killings.

During his debut campaign with the softball squad, Bratton instilled a toughness in the team that helped carry it to a program third-best 39 victories. MSU earned eight wins against ranked opponents, tied for the second most in a year in program history.

With a 2-0 victory on April 18 at No. 4 Tennessee, Mississippi State earned its third-straight victory against a top-five opponent after downing No. 3/2 Alabama on April 12-13. It was the first time the Bulldogs had won three consecutive games against ranked foes since taking seven straight from April 9-May 13, 2004, and the first time ever winning three straight against top-five opponents.

The Bulldogs also qualified for the NCAA Tournament for the third-straight season, the longest such stretch for the program since 2007-09.

Bratton's approach of not moving in the batter's box paid dividends as the Bulldogs set the program record for hit by pitches in a season with 88. MSU set the Southeastern Conference Tournament single-game record eight HBPs during the opener against No. 16 Kentucky.

He aided in the development of freshman third baseman Caroline Seitz, who was a Top 25 Finalist of the inaugural National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) Freshman of the Year Award and an NFCA All-South Regional First Team selection as well as a Southeastern Conference All-Freshman Team pick.

Bratton also helped freshman Katie Anne Bailey become one of MSU's most reliable hitters in key situations. She drove in the game-winning run against No. 8 Kentucky with a pinch-hit walk-off single to give Mississippi State its first SEC win of the campaign and plated the winner against No. 3 Alabama with a sacrifice fly in the bottom of the 10th inning.

With Bulldog baseball, Bratton consistently organized a top-10 strength of schedule, coordinated team travel arrangements and acted as the program's liaison with adidas. The West Point, Miss., native also aided in on-campus recruiting efforts, directed the team's video operations and oversaw all tasks associated with the day-to-day operation of the MSU baseball program.

Bratton was a three-year standout in baseball and football, playing outfield for Bill Miley at Oak Hill Academy in nearby West Point. He continued his baseball career in 2003 and 2004 at East Mississippi Community College, where he was coached by Bill Baldner.

Bratton then came to MSU, earning a spot on Ron Polk's team as an outfielder in 2006. That Mississippi State squad ascended to a No. 1 in-season national ranking and advanced to the finals of the NCAA Clemson Regional.

At Mississippi State, Bratton earned an undergraduate degree in secondary education in 2007 and, in 2009, completed MSU graduate degree studies in sports administration.

Once an All-American and All-SEC standout, former Bulldog great Jessica Cooley is back in Starkville as MSU softball's director of operations, head coach Vann Stuedeman announced in August 2016.

A Birmingham, Ala., native, Cooley will serve as the program's primary liaison with adidas, coordinate all team travel and manage player relations. In addition, Cooley also oversees the MSU softball team managers.

Cooley starred on the diamond for the Bulldogs from 2010-13, finishing her time in the Maroon and White as one of the most prolific power hitters in program history. She still holds the school record for most career grand slams (3), while her 27 home runs stand sixth in the MSU record books. She tallied 15 homers in 2012, which is third in MSU single-season history, while her 10 bombs in her senior campaign tie Sam Lenahan's 2014 campaign for most single-season home runs by an MSU senior.

She also still stands as the only player in SEC history to record four multi-home run games in a single season (2012).

On March 6, 2012, she was tabbed as the USA Softball Player of the Week. She joined former MSU All-American and SEC Player of the Year lyhia McMichael as the only two in school history to receive the national honor. That same year, she earned CollegeSportsMadness Third-Team All-American laurels.

She was also a star in the classroom, as she was named Academic All-SEC all four years at State and earned a spot on the 2013 SEC Community Service Team.

The daughter of Mark and Candy Cooley, she was born Jessica Ashley Cooley on April 25, 1991, in Birmingham, Ala. She has two sisters, Lindsay Gornto and Katie Cooley Lock, an outfielder for the Bulldogs from 2004-07. Cooley graduated with her bachelor's degree in marketing in 2014 and her master's degree in sport administration in 2016.

One of the most prolific infielders in program history, former Bulldog and current NPF star Kayla Winkfield returns to Starkville as MSU's softball graduate manager for the 2017 season, head coach Vann Stuedeman announced in August 2017. Winkfield previously served as a student assistant coach over the 2016 season.

The first signee under Stuedeman's career as head coach, the Giddings, Texas, native wore the Maroon and White over the 2016-13 seasons, finishing her career ranked tied seventh in stolen bases with 75 and tied for ninth with 10 triples.

Over her freshman season, Winkfield closed the year third on the team with 17 stolen bases. She registered 10 hits, six walks and scored 17 runs. She held a .333 average at the plate and helped snapped MSU's 21-game losing streak against LSU as a pinch runner when she stole a base and scored the game-winning run against the No. 12 Tigers.

She followed up that performance with 13 stolen baes as a sophomore and ranked third on the team with 106 putouts at shortstop with 58 assists. She turned in a breakout performance as a junior, ending the season with a .331 average with help of 57 hits. She also slugged nine doubles and four triples.

Winkfield closed her career by leading the SEC in triples (6) and triples per game (0.11). The senior put up a .330 average in the box with 59 hits, 36 runs scored, 17 stolen bases and a .438 slugging percentage.

She became the 12th Bulldog in program history to play professionally as she was drafted as the 35th overall pick in the 2016 National Pro Fastpitch Draft by the Pennsylvania Rebellion.

In her rookie season, she led the Rebellion in batting average (.296), slugging percentage (.417) and assists (59). In January of 2017, Winkfield was signed by the Scrap Yard Dawgs through the 2018 season.

As a Dawg, Winkfield held a .262 average at the plate with 32 hits and 23 runs scored while swiping 11 bases. In the field, she held a .963 fielding percentage with 57 putouts and 22 assists with just three errors. Her performance helped carry the Dawgs to the 2017 Cowles Cup Championship.

The daughter of William and Patricia Winkfield, she was born Kayla Camille Winkfield on April 14, 1994, in Austin, Texas. She has one sister Keanna. Winkfield earned her degree in human sciences from Mississippi State in 2017. She is currently working towards her graduate degree in human development and family science.





Located on the north side of the Mississippi State University campus since 1997, Nusz Park, formerly known as the MSU Softball Field, sits in the heart of Mississippi State's physical plant.

The opening game at the MSU Softball Field came on Feb. 26, 1997, with the Bulldogs sweeping Samford in a doubleheader with back-to-back 4-0 scores. The opener was witnessed by over 300 brave fans that endured inclement weather.

Mississippi State posted a record of 327-169 (.659) overall record at the site and, in 2017, won a school-record 24 games in the friendly confines, including an 8-5 mark in home SEC action.

Nusz Park, a \$6 million project, includes 1,000 maroon chairback seats, in addition to an expanded concourse that includes new restrooms and concession stands. There is also abundant standing room space around the grandstand and outfield. The outfield portion draws comparisons to Dudy Noble Field's world-famous Left Field Lounge. Also beyond the outfield wall, a state-of-the-art Daktronics video board was being installed. It will be the first video board in MSU Softball history.

It was announced on Jan. 22, 2016 that the facility would carry the name of alumni couple Tommy and Terri Nusz of Houston, Texas, and be known as Nusz Park. The Nusz' lead gift for the softball facility was part of a significant contribution from them for Infinite

Impact: The Mississippi State University Campaign. The campaign gift continues their longtime support of the land-grant institution and will benefit athletics, academics, and other areas of MSU.

In addition, the new press box is constructed to the specifications of ESPN and the SEC Network. The structure contains separate booths for both home and visiting radio crews, TV crews and working media.

The playing surfaces across MSU athletics have always been regarded as some of the top surfaces in the country, with the field at Nusz Park being no different. It features Mississippi Pride grass – developed by researchers on the campus. The dimensions of the MSU Softball Field remain intact, stretching 200 feet down the lines and 220 feet to center field. The upgrades include new and updated bullpens, as well as a turf foul area marked by the Mississippi State logo and the school's trademark phrase, "Hail State."

MSU and visiting players and coaches will enjoy brandnew, larger dugouts and new locker rooms. In addition, a new training room is present to help keep players in shape to perform at the highest level.

The Southeastern Conference took notice of MSU's new stadium as well, with the Bulldogs hosting the 2016 SEC Softball Tournament from Wednesday, May 11 until Saturday, May 14.

The new ballpark has already been considered as one of the top collegiate softball facilities in the nation. The Bulldogs' first action in the new digs came against Southern Georgia, a 6-0 victory on Feb. 11, 2016. MSU opened play at Nusz Park with six-straight victories, including a sweep of the Bulldog Kickoff. State captured its first SEC win at Nusz with a 6-3 win against eventual WCWS finalists and third-ranked Auburn on March 19. Overall, the Bulldogs are 40-23 (.635) at home since the opening of Nusz Park.

Nusz Park was on national display, as it hosted the 2016 Southeastern Conference Softball Tournament May 11-14, 2016. The four-day event hosted 12 teams and a total of 11 games and drew praise from coaches across the league to ESPN and SEC Network officials.

"This is an awesome venue. We have been here a couple of days now. We had not been to the new stadium yet, so to be able to see the stadium, first and foremost, really shows a commitment to the sport of softball," Kentucky softball head coach Rachel Lawson said. "But then to see all the hard work that went into throwing the SEC Tournament was awesome, right down to the smallest detail. They have been tremendous, the city of Starkville and the surrounding areas have been tremendous."

The Bulldogs' new home will open its third season in the spring of 2018.

THE UNIVERSITY

Mississippi State is a comprehensive doctoral-degree-granting institution offering a diverse student body a wide range of opportunities and challenges for learning and growth.

The largest university in the Magnolia State, MSU has a statewide enrollment of more than 21,000 students. and is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Calleges to award baccalaureate, masters, specialists and doctorate degrees.

Established in 1878 as the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Mississippi, the university has traditional strengths in engineering and scientific agriculture but has evolved into a comprehensive institution with a diverse array of programs in teaching, research and service.


The University began as The Agricultural and Mechanical College of the State of Mississippi, one of the national Land-Grant Colleges established after Congress had passed the Morrill Act in 1862. It was created by the Mississippi Legislature on February 28, 1878, to fulfill the mission of offering training in "agriculture, horticulture and the mechanical arts . . . without excluding other scientific and classical studies, including military tactics."

The College received its first students in the fall of 1880 in the presidency of Confederate General Stephen D. Lee. In 1887 Congress passed the Hatch Act, which provided for the establishment of the Agricultural Experiment Station in 1888. Two other pieces of federal legislation provided funds for extending the mission of the College: in 1914, the Smith-Lever Act called for "instruction in practical agriculture and home economics to persons not attendant or resident," thus creating the state-wide effort which led to Extension offices in every county in the State; and, in 1917, the Smith-Hughes Act provided for the training of teachers in vocational education.

By 1932, when the Legislature renamed the College as Mississippi State College, it consisted of the Agricultural Experiment Station (1887), the College of Engineering (1902), the College of Agriculture (1903), the School of Industrial Pedagogy (1909), the School of General Science (1911), the College of Business and Industry (1915), the Mississippi Agricultural Extension Service (1915), and the Division of Continuing Education, (1919). Further, in 1926 the College had received its first accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

By 1958, when the Legislature again renamed the College, as Mississippi State University, the Office of Graduate Studies had been organized (1936), doctoral degree programs had begun (1951), the School of Forest Resources had been established (1954), and the College of Arts and Sciences had been created (1956).

The College of Architecture admitted its first students in 1973. The College of Veterinary Medicine admitted its first class in 1977, and the School of Accountancy was established in 1979.

THE BULLDOGS

Mississippi State University's athletic teams are called Bulldogs, a name earned and maintained over the decades by the tough, tenacious play of student-athletes wearing the Maroon and White. The official school mascot is an American Kennel Club registered English Bulldog, given the inherited title of 'Bully'.

As with most universities, Mississippi State University teams answered to different nicknames through the years. The first squads representing Mississippi A&M College were proud to be called Aggies. When the school officially became Mississippi State College in 1932, the nickname Maroons, for MSU's uniform color, gained prominence. Bulldogs became the official title for State teams in 1961, not long after State College was granted university status.

Yet references to school teams and athletes as Bulldogs actually go back to early in the century, and this nickname was used almost interchangeably with both Aggies and Maroons, since at least 1905.

On November 30 of that year, the A&M football team shut out their arch-rivals from the University of Mississippi 11-0 in Jackson, Miss. The campus newspaper, The Reflector, reported: "After the game, filled with that emotion that accompanies every great victory, there was nothing left for the cadets to do but to complete the great victory by showing sympathy for the dead athletic spirit of the University, by having a military funeral parade.

"A coffin was secured, decorated with University colors and a bulldog pup placed on top. It was then placed on the shoulders of a dozen cadets, and the procession started down Capitol Street, preceded by the brass band playing a very pathetic funeral march."

Other newspaper reports of the victory commented on the 'bulldog' style of play by the A&M eleven, and the Bulldog was soon publicly accepted as a school athletic symbol. Accounts of a 1926 pep rally in Meridian, Miss., had another bulldog parading with students.



BULLY XXI

At Super Bulldog Weekend 2015, the Bulldog family celebrated the passing of the harness, as Bully XXI, known as "Jak," accepted mascot duties from his father Bully XX, fondly called "Champ."

Jak's formal name is "Cristil's Golden Prince," and the American Kennel Club registered English Bulldog was born in October 2014, soon after the legendary Jack Cristil passed away. Naming the newest Bully for the legendary Voice of the Bulldogs who called football and basketball games for 58 years was a fitting choice.

When mascot handlers realized Bully was getting toward retiring age, though he's still in good health, a female bulldog was selected based on her pedigree and history. Following the female's selection, litter of mascot-sired puppies were evaluated.

Use as an official game mascot began in 1935 when coach Major Ralph Sasse, on 'orders' from his team, went to Memphis, Tenn., to select a bulldog. Ptolemy, a gift of the Edgar Webster family, was chosen and the Bulldogs promptly defeated Alabama 20.7

A litter-mate of Ptolemy became the first mascot called 'Bully' shortly after Sasse's team beat mighty Army 13-7 at West Point that same year - perhaps the greatest victory in MSU football history. But Bully I earned other fame the hard way, in 1939 when a campus bus cut short his career.

Days of campus mourning followed, as Bully lay in state in a glass coffin. A half-mile funeral procession accompanied by the Famous Maroon Band and three ROTC battalions went to Scott Field where Bully was buried under the bench at the 50-yard line. Even Life magazine covered the event. Other Bullys have since been buried by campus dorms, fraternity houses, and also at the football stadium.

For years Bully was a target for kidnappers, the last incident occurring prior to the 1974 State-Ole Miss game. The Bulldog team won anyway, 31-13. While early Bullys once roamed campus freely or lived in fraternities, today the official university mascot is housed at the School of Veterinary Medicine when not on duty at State home football games. For all their fierce appearance and reputation, today's mascot bulldogs are good-natured, friendly animals and favorites with children.

A student wearing a Bulldog suit, also answering to Bully, is part of the MSU cheerleading team and assists in stirring up State spirit at games and pep rallies.







THE COWBELL

The most unique and certainly the most resounding symbol of Mississippi State University tradition is the cowbell. Despite decades of attempts by opponents and authorities to banish it from scenes of competition, diehard State fans still celebrate Bulldog victories loudly and proudly with the distinctive sound of ringing cowbells.

The precise origin of the cowbell as a fixture of Mississippi State sports tradition remains unclear to this day. The best records have cowbells gradually introduced to the MSU sports scene in the late 1930s and early 1940s, coinciding with the 'golden age' of Mississippi State football success prior to World War II.

The most popular legend is that during a home football game between State and archrival Ole Miss, a jersey cow wandered onto the playing field. Mississippi State soundly whipped the Rebels that Saturday, and State College students immediately adopted the cow as a good luck charm.

Students are said to have continued bringing a cow to football games for a while, until the practice was eventually discontinued in favor of bringing just the cow's bell.

Whatever the origin, it is certain by the 1950s cowbells were common at MSU games, and by the 1960s were established as the special symbol of MSU. Ironically, the cowbell's popularity grew most rapidly during the long years when State football teams were rarely successful. Flaunting this anachronism from the 'aggie' days was a proud response by students and alumni to outsider scorn of the university's 'cow college' history.

In the 1960s two MSU professors, Earl W. Terrell and Ralph L. Reeves, obliged some students by welding handles on the bells so they could be rung with more convenience and authority. By 1963 the demand for these long-handled cowbells could not be filled by home workshops alone. So, at the suggestion of Reeves, the Student Association bought bells in bulk and the Industrial Education Club agreed to weld on handles. In 1964, the MSU Bookstore began marketing these cowbells with a portion of profits returning to these student organizations.

Today many styles of cowbells are available on campus and around Starkville, with the top-of-the-line being a heavy chrome-plated model with a full Bulldog figurine handle. But experts insist the best and loudest results are produced by a classic long-handled, bicycle-grip bell made of thinner and tightly-welded shells.

Cowbells decorate offices and homes of Mississippi State alumni, and are passed down through generations of Bulldog fans. But they were not heard at Southeastern Conference games - not legally, at least - since the 1974 adoption of a conference rule against 'artificial noisemakers' at football and basketball games. On a 9-1 vote, SEC schools ruled cowbells a disruption and banned them. The ban was lifted prior to the 2010 season.

The ban did little harm to the cowbell's popularity, or to prevent cowbells from being heard outside stadiums in which the Bulldogs are playing. They are now heard at non-conference football contests, as well as other sporting events on campus.



MAROON & WHITE

Maroon and White are the distinctive colors of Mississippi State University athletic teams, dating back over a century to the very first football game ever played by the school's student-athletes.

On November 15, 1895, the first Mississippi A&M football team was preparing for a road trip to Jackson, Tenn., to play Southern Baptist University (now called Union University) the following day. Since every college was supposed to have its own uniform colors, the A&M student body requested that the school's team select a suitable combination.

Considering this choice to be an honor, the inaugural State team gave the privilege to team captain W.M. Matthews. Accounts report that without hesitation Matthews chose Maroon and White.

DR. MARK KEENUM UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT

Dr. Mark Everett Keenum became Mississippi State's 19th president Jan. 5, 2009, following a distinguished public service career.

Now in his ninth year of tenure, Dr. Keenum has guided Mississippi State to unprecedented heights. The university has experienced record enrollment growth – climbing toward nearly 22,000 students. Mississippi State has awarded more than 4,000 degrees at all levels for six straight years.

The campus has expanded and improved on Dr. Keenum's watch. Chief among those projects has been The Mill at MSU – a \$40-million, state-of-the-art conference and meeting complex. A ribbon sutting for the Old Main Academic Centers a new

The campus has expanded and improved on Dr. Keenum's watch. Chief among those projects has been The Mill at MSU – a \$40-million, state-of-the-art conference and meeting complex. A ribbon-cutting for the Old Main Academic Center, a new \$41-million classroom building and multi-level parking garage, was recently celebrated. A \$60-million project featuring two new residence halls and Nusz Hall, which houses the G.V. "Sonny" Montgomery Center for America's Veterans, opened last fall. A \$10-million, fourth-floor expansion of Mitchell Memorial Library to house the Ulysses S. Grant Presidential Library celebrated its official opening this past fall. Mississippi State has completed or initiated capital improvements totaling more than \$700 million since 2009.

A \$55-million expansion and renovation of Dudy Noble Field/Polk-Dement Stadium – home to one of the most storied college baseball programs in America – is also underway. The first phase of the project added the largest video board in the nation to the "Carnegie Hall of College Baseball." The second phase commenced in June at the conclusion of the 2017 season. This major investment will significantly enhance the Dudy Noble fan experience – already described by many as one of the most unique in college sports today.

New construction projects launching over the next two years include a new Music Building and the completion of an Animal and Dairy Science/Poultry Science complex for the Division of Agriculture, Forestry and Veterinary Medicine. Additionally, the university is developing a comprehensive plan to build additional teaching and research lab space to meet growing demand.

lab space to meet growing demand.
Fundraising has reached all-time record levels. MSU's current Infinite Impact capital campaign reached its initial goal three years ahead of schedule. Due to that unprecedented success, the university announced a new goal – \$1 billion by 2020 – the largest campaign goal ever for an educational institution in Mississippi. During his tenure, Dr. Keenum has been instrumental in expanding the MSU Promise Program, which provides need-based scholarship assistance to Mississippi students whose families have limited financial means.

Mississippi State is ranked by the National Science Foundation as a "Top 100" research institution. The most recent research success has been MSU's designation as the Federal Aviation Administration's National Center of Excellence for Unmanned Aircraft Systems and Boeing's decision to locate a composite research center at MSU's Raspet Flight Research Laboratory. In fall 2016, the state of Mississippi became a member of the Pan-Pacific UAS Test Range Complex, one of the FAA's seven national test sites, and Mississippi State researchers will lead this Gulf Coast R&D hub for unmanned aircraft. This past spring, the Department of Homeland Security selected a Mississippi State-led team to operate its demonstration range facility for small unmanned aircraft systems.

In 2016, Dr. Keenum was elected president of the Southeastern Conference, where he is a member of the SEC Executive Committee and continues to serve on the SEC's Content Committee that oversees the highly successful ESPN-SEC Network. He also represents the SEC as a member of the College Football Playoff's (CFP) Board of Managers.

He is also serving as president of the Mississippi Association of Colleges and Universities, which promotes goodwill among the state's public and private colleges and universities and works to stimulate academic and professional cooperation. Mississippi State hosted the organization's 2017 annual conference this fall.

Dr. Keenum travels frequently to Washington, D.C., meeting with Congressional leaders and federal agency heads to pursue research opportunities and broaden the university's influence on the national level. He has also worked closely with state leaders in Jackson in support of higher education in Mississippi.

Mississippi State plays an integral role in economic development locally, statewide, and regionally. Its impact is further felt nationally and internationally through unique collaborative partnerships with peer institutions, business and industry, government agencies, and leading non-governmental organizations. Dr. Keenum leads these efforts because he understands the positive impact the nations major research universities can have in the diverse communities they serve.

A graduate of Mississippi State with degrees in agricultural economics, Dr. Keenum's interest in international food security has strengthened the university's contributions to global economic sustainability. In 2014, he was appointed vice chairman of the Foundation for Food and Agricultural Research by U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Thomas J. Vilsack. That same year along with other university presidents, he signed the Presidents' Commitment to Food and Nutrition Security at the United Nations in New York City. This marks the first time universities around the world began to share a collective focus on ending food insecurity.

Dr. Keenum's passion for international engagement and transformative research and service has positioned Mississippi State as a leader in addressing global food security and poverty, among other critical issues. In 2014 and again in 2016, he was invited to address the United Nations in New York about the crucial roles public research universities play as the global community works to address critical challenges for a growing population.

Dr. Keenum began his career at MSU as a faculty member with the Extension Service

He went on to serve as chief of staff to U.S. Senator Thad Cochran in Washington, D.C. and was Under Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture prior to returning home to Mississippi State.

A graduate of Corinth High School, Dr. Keenum earned an associate in arts degree from Northeast Mississippi Community College in Booneville and was a member of the Northeast Tigers football team. He is married to the former Rhonda Newman of Booneville, also an MSU graduate. They have four children: Rett, Mary Phillips, Katie and Torie.

JOHN COHEN DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

When John Cohen was named Mississippi State University's 17th director of athletics on November 4, 2016, he wasted little time putting his stamp on the department.

The former MSU head baseball coach and two-time Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year has overseen the hiring of four coaches, while nine teams have advanced to postseason since he took over the helm, seven earning Top 25 rankings with women's basketball, women's cross country and baseball finishing in the Top 16.

In all, four sports – women's cross country, women's basketball, women's track and field (indoor and outdoor) – posted or tied their highest NCAA Championships/postseason finish in school history.

"I love Mississippi State University," Cohen said. "As a student-athlete, as a coach, and now with this once in a lifetime opportunity, I feel deeply honored to lead MSU's athletics program. I am profoundly grateful for the chance to lead the totality of MSU athletics as I have tried to lead MSU's baseball program – in daily and dogged pursuit of championships at the highest level."

Cohen, who spent more than two decades coaching college baseball, was named MSU's head baseball coach in July of 2008. Nine years later, Cohen's official role in administration began when he assumed the role of associate athletic director in addition to head baseball coach. The following November, he took charge of an athletic department that has since achieved new heights in athletic, academic, facility and fundraising achievements.

FIRST HIRE

One day after becoming athletics director, Cohen named Andy Cannizaro as MSU's next head baseball coach. Cannizaro, a former Major Leaguer and one of the nation's rising coaching stars in college baseball, led the Bulldogs to a Top 10 ranking and trip to the Super Regionals. Subsequent hires by Cohen include women's soccer coach Tom Anagnost, men's golf coach Dusty Smith and football head coach Joe Moorhead.

During Cohen's short tenure as director of athletics, the athletic department has enjoyed notable success. In April, the women's basketball team advanced to the national championship game after its historic upset of No. 1 ranked UConn to snap an NCAA-record 111-game winning streak, a feat that garnered Vic Schaefer's team an ESPY award in July.

This achievement came after the Bulldogs played in the SEC Tournament finals, a month before the men's tennis team also played for the conference title.

As an athletic department, MSU placed 49th in the Learfield Director's Cup with 490 points to mark the first time in school history to post back-to-back Top 50 finishes.

As athletic director, Cohen is charged with providing leadership, management, and administration for the university's athletic programs. Cohen is currently overseeing the multi-million dollar renovation of famed Dudy Noble Field to make it the premier facility in all of college baseball.

A Tuscaloosa, Ala., native and MSU alumnus, Cohen was a head coach in the SEC for 12 years. His teams have been successful both on the field and in the classroom. At MSU, he led the Bulldogs to a College World Series finals appearance, an SEC regular season championship and an SEC Tournament championship. Since 2009, MSU baseball has had 133 players selected to the SEC Academic Honor Roll, including three straight SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year winners from 2013-15.

"I'm fortunate to know our MSU coaches as friends and colleagues, and to know many of our athletes in all sports," Cohen said. "While baseball has been a huge part of my life, my passion for seeing MSU athletics thrive extends to all sports. I'm grateful to Dr. Keenum and the MSU Family for allowing me to embrace these new and critical responsibilities."

PLAYING DAYS

As a baseball player at MSU, Cohen was a key player on the Bulldogs' 1989 SEC championship team and 1990 College World Series team. He graduated from MSU with a degree in English in 1990 and received a master's degree in sports management from the University of Missouri in 1994.

After a six-year stint with Missouri as a graduate assistant and assistant coach, Cohen was the head coach at Northwestern State University from 1998-2001. Cohen spent two seasons as an assistant baseball coach at the University of Florida before becoming the head coach at the University of Kentucky in 2004, a position he held for five seasons before returning to his alma mater.

While winning 284 games as a head coach at MSU, Cohen demonstrated a keen ability to develop players and coaches. During his tenure, 138 MSU baseball players were selected in the Major League Baseball Draft, including All-American

Brent Rooker this June. His influence can be seen throughout the SEC as four of his former assistants are now or have been head coaches — Brad Bohannon (Alabama), Gary Henderson (Kentucky), Nick Mingione (Kentucky) and Butch Thompson (Auburn).

Cohen is the only coach in SEC history to win an SEC championship, SEC tournament championship, and advance to the College World Series both as a player and head coach. Cohen's 2013 Bulldog Club advanced to the CWS championship series for the first time in MSU history. Currently 31 of Cohen's former players are playing professional baseball. Cohen's 2012 club produced an SEC record-tying eight major leaguers. Eight of the university's top ten all-time marks in baseball season ticket sales have come during Cohen's tenure, including a school record of 5,874 in 2014.

Cohen and his wife, Nelle, are active members of the Starkville community. The couple has two daughters, Jordan Baker and Avery Lawson.


