MATCH PREVIEW

LAST TIME OUT - DRAKE

The University of Minnesota (2-0-1, 0-0-0 B1G) remained undefeated with a 1-0 victory over Drake on the road Thursday night. Senior captain Delaney Stekr slotted home a penalty kick and helped keep the Bulldogs scoreless for the second win of the season. It was another clean sheet performance for junior captain Megan Plaschko, giving her eight clean sheets in 13 career starts. The Minnesota defense held the Bulldogs to just four shots in total, giving Minnesota its third-straight shutout.

"A win is a win," Minnesota head coach Erin Chastain said. "We are certainly going to build from here. I don't think it was our greatest performance, but I still think we generated a good amount of chances. Drake battled tonight, so credit to them. I'd like to see us be able to execute on some of our chances and I'd like to see us play a little bit more like we did in the second half tonight. We'll be looking forward to getting back to work in preparation for Mississippi State next week."

A GOOD FIRST IMPRESSION

First-year head coach Erin Chastain continued her winning ways with the 1-0 victory over Drake. Chastain's 2-0-1 start as head coach of Minnesota marks the first time a Gopher head coach has remained undefeated in their first three matches. Chastain's Gophers have been stingy on the defensive end thus far this season, allowing just six shots on goal in three matches and outshooting their opponents 48-27 in total.

GRITTY GOPHERS

With the 1-0 shutout win over Drake the Gophers extended their season-opening shutout streak to three, marking the first time a Minnesota team has done that to start a season since 2015. That year the team also started 2-0-1 and finished with a record of 12-7-3 and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The shutout streak also is the first for any Chastain coached team to start a season dating back to her first year as a head coach in 2007 at DePaul.

QUICK NOTES VS. MISSISSIPPI STATE AND WYOMING

- Minnesota's matchups with Mississippi State and Wyoming are both firsts with the MSU matchup being the first time the Gophers have taken on an SEC opponent in the regular season since 2019 against Ole Miss
- According to the MSU record book, the Bulldogs matchup with the Gophers is the first against any member of the Big Ten conference
- The 2021 season for Minnesota will be the first under the new leadership of Erin Chastain who returned to her alma mater after serving as the head coach at DePaul for the past 14 seasons
- Neither Mississippi State or Wyoming have a student-athlete who hails from the great state of Minnesota
- The University of Minnesota coaching staff is comprised of four women, making them one of just four staffs across the Power 5 conferences to have an all-female staff

SCOUTING MISSSISSIPPI STATE

It will be another matchup with a squad known as the Bulldogs on Sept. 2 when Mississippi State (2-2-0, 0-0-0 SEC) comes to Elizabeth Lyle Robbie Stadium to take on the Gophers. MSU is coming off a 1-0 win against Southeast Missouri on Aug. 29, at home. James Armstrong's team has scored four times this season with junior midfielder Onyi Echegini leading the way with a pair of those goals. Both of Echegini's goals have turned out to be gamewinners while she also added an assist in the Bulldogs 1-0 loss to Lipscomb in their season opener. Sophomore Maddy Anderson has been the Bulldogs goalkeeper in all four matches this season. The 2020 SEC All-Freshman team member has made 13 saves while allowing a total of three goals with a .813 save percentage.

The Gophers will have to be ready for adjustments as the Bulldogs have scored three of their four goals in the second half and 32 of their 55 shots have coming in the second half. As a program, Mississippi State has made the NCAA Tournament once in its history back in 2018 when the team, then led by Tom Anagnost, finished 9-7-2.

SCOUTING WYOMING

Wyoming will stroll into Minneapolis with a similar start to the season as the Gophers. Also with a first-year head coach in Colleen Corbin the Cowgirls are 3-0-0 with wins over Colorado School of Mines, Omaha and the University of South Dakota. Junior forward Faith Joiner is the lone Wyoming student-athlete to have multiple goals with two. The remaining six goals the Cowgirls have scored this season have come from six different players with Jamie Tatum, a midfielder, adding a pair of assists to total four points this season. In goal it has been redshirt junior Alex Daws all 270 minutes this season. She has only made seven saves and has allowed a total of two goals this season to hold a save percentage of .778.

Similarly to Mississippi State, the Cowgirls have been fond of second half goals this season with five of Wyoming's eight goals coming in the second half. As a program Wyoming has never made the NCAA Tournament since starting NCAA women's soccer in 1995 but owns one Mountain West regular season title back in 2018 when the team finished 12-4-4.

PLASCHKO POWER

Junior captain Megan Plaschko has been perfect for the Gophers when she has been called upon so far this season with three straight shutouts. The Eagan, Minn., native is one of just 13 student-athletes in Division I women's soccer to have three shutouts so far this season and is one of 23 that has a perfect save percentage.

STEKR, GRAY AND BOMAN NAMED BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH

Three individuals from the Gophers were named to the Big Ten Preseason Players to Watch List, announced by the conference office on August 16. Delaney Stekr, Megan Gray and Sophia Boman were named, all firsts for the trio.

Stekr, who was a Big Ten Sportsmanship Award honoree last season, has appeared in 27 matches for the Gophers in her career and has started in 21 of those matches as a defender. Gray enters the 2021 season with 54 matches played with the Maroon and Gold. She's scored three goals in her career including one in Gophers last NCAA Tournament appearance in 2018. Boman rounds off the Gophers honorees after a stellar freshman campaign where she was named to the All-Big Ten Freshman Team. Last year Boman scored two goals and had one assist while starting all 12 matches.

In addition, the conference released the 2021 Big Ten Coaches' Poll where Minnesota found itself sitting 10th among the conference's 14 teams.

UP NEXT

The Gophers will have a split third week of the season to end the non-conference season when they travel to take on Omaha (1-2-0, 0-0-0 Summit) on Sept. 9, before returning home to take on North Dakota (1-1-0, 0-0-0 Summit) on Sept. 12. The match with North Dakota will be streamed on BTN+ at 1 p.m., while the Omaha match will be streamed on OMavs.com.

With a new leader of the program, there came changes to the rest of the coaching staff during the summer months. Chastain brought in new assistant coach Allie Wisner along with retaining Maya Hayes as an assistant. The all-female coaching staff is one of just four among Power 5 women's soccer staffs.

"I had an all-female staff at DePaul as well and it's always been important to me," Chastain said. "Women have been in the minority in the coaching profession for a long time and we still are. There are more and more qualified women coming up the ranks that can be huge parts of program success. We just saw Canada has a female head coach and they just won the gold medal. You're seeing more women coaching in the NWSL and so that's something that's certainly been a priority for me."





HEAD COACH ERIN CHASTAIN: THIS IS HOME

University of Minnesota Athletics Director Mark Coyle announced on June 11, 2021 that Erin Chastain has been named head soccer coach at the University of Minnesota.

Chastain comes to Minnesota with more than 20 years of coaching experience, which includes the last 14 as head coach at DePaul. Prior to her time with the Blue Demons, she previously was an assistant coach at Santa Clara and Northwestern.

Chastain, who was a four-year starter and three-year captain for the Gophers in the 1990s, is the fifth head coach in program history. The Plymouth, Minn., native earned her bachelor's degree from the Carlson School of Management in International Business in 1997.

DePaul achieved tremendous success during Chastain's tenure, which included more than 100 wins and an impressive record of 78-44-26 during the last eight seasons. While at DePaul, Chastain's squad won the Big East regular season championship in 2014 and 2016, claimed the Big East tournament title in 2014, qualified for seven straight conference tournaments and earned berths in the NCAA tournament in 2013 and 2014. The Blue Demons were ranked for the first time in program history under Chastain (No. 20 in 2009) and climbed to a program record No. 7 in 2014.

"I could not be more excited to be named head coach of the Minnesota soccer program," said Chastain. "I am so thankful to President Joan Gabel, director of athletics Mark Coyle, senior associate athletics director Tom McGinnis and the entire search committee for believing in me and trusting me to lead my alma mater. The University of Minnesota is a world-class institution, and I was so fortunate to be a Gopher student-athlete. This program and the entire state of Minnesota mean so much to me, so this really is a dream opportunity for me and my family. I can't wait to meet the team and look forward to getting to work."

Chastain led the Blue Demons to the best season in program history in 2014. That year, DePaul won the Big East regular season championship, was the Big East Tournament Champion and earned a berth in the NCAA tournament. DePaul ended the season with a 16-1-4 record and the fifth-best winning percentage in the country. The Blue Demons set a school record with a 20-game undefeated streak and ended the regular season without a loss.

Chastain was named Big East Coach of the Year in 2014 and was also honored as the NSCAA/United Soccer Coaches Northeast Region Coach of the Year in 2013 and 2014.

Chastain, who serves on the NCAA Women's Soccer Championship Committee, recruited and developed five conference players of the year at DePaul. She also coached one All-American, four Academic All-Americans, one MAC Herman candidate and one CoSIDA Senior Class Finalist.

Chastain has developed professional players as well, as numerous individuals have gone on to play in the National Women's Soccer League or overseas. Her teams also excel in the classroom, as DePaul earned 13 straight United Soccer Coaches Team Academic Awards.

Prior to taking over the DePaul program, Chastain spent five seasons as an assistant coach at Santa Clara. During her tenure with the Broncos, the program reached the NCAA championship game in 2002, the semifinals in 2004 and the quarterfinals in 2005. She also helped guide the program to West Coast Conference titles in four of her five seasons. As the lead recruiter, she landed three classes from 2002-06 that ranked in the nation's top four by Soccer America.

Chastain (then Hussey) was a four-year starter at Minnesota from 1993-96 and three-year captain for the Gophers. She played in all 82 matches during her career and ranks seventh in program history in points (83), eighth in goals (29), tied for seventh in assists (25), tied for sixth in game-winning goals (10) and tied for tenth in shots (178).

She earned second team All-Big Ten honors in 1995 and was a first team honoree in 1996. She was also named third team All-Great Lakes Region in 1996 by the NSCAA and helped lead Minnesota to the 1995 Big Ten Championship and NCAA tournament berths in 1995 and 1996.

Off the field, Chastain was a three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection from 1994-96, and earned Academic All-District honors in 1996.

Chastain and her husband, Chad, have two daughters, Harper and Brooklyn. Chad's sister, Brandi, is one of USA Soccer's all-time greats, having led the United States to the 1999 FIFA Women's World Cup.
