DID YOU KNOW?

Florida is coming off a pair of scoreless ties.

Sept. 17 at Vanderbilt	0-0 2OT
Sept. 19 vs North Florida	0-0 2OT

This is the first time Florida posted scoreless ties in consecutive matches. The most scoreless ties in a single season came in 2018 (3 total).

What's Happening?

It's all Southeastern Conference play for the remainder of the regular season. The Gators open SEC home action Thursday versus Kentucky and then travels for a Sunday meeting at Mississippi State.

- Southeastern Conference home play begins Thursday versus Kentucky. The Wildcats are Florida's most frequent SEC home opening opponent, as Thursday's meeting is the sixth time UF-UK open league home action.
- Then Florida meets its first of two Magnolia State opponents. UF is at Mississippi State Sunday and then Mississippi comes to Gainesville for a Sunday, Oct. 3 match. When UF and MSU last met in 2018, it was a 0-0 double overtime tie in Starkville.

This is Gator Soccer's 27th season as women's athletics celebrates its 50th anniversary at the University of Florida in 2021-22. UF soccer advanced to the NCAA Tournament 22 times and is one of 11 programs to win a NCAA title in the 39-year history of NCAA play. Florida's 14 Southeastern Conference titles leads the league. Florida soccer wears 50th Anniversary warm-up shirts Thursday to kick off the year-long celebration.

Florida advanced to 2020 SEC Second Round play with a 6-5 OT win over Kentucky at the Orange Beach Sportsplex. **Parker Roberts** gave UF an early lead in the 24th minute, but the Wildcats scored three times to take a 3-1 halftime lead. Florida then had a three-goal scoring flurry to take a 4-3 lead off goals from **Cassidy Lindley** (61:12), **Laney Steed** (67:45) and **Deanne Rose** (75:34). UK regained the lead in the 84th minute after a pair of goals in a two-minute span. Roberts headed in the cross from Rose at 88:03 to force overtime. Lindley gave UF its first win in a seven-match span when she touched in the deep cross from Rose at 95:25. The 11 combined goals scored equals both SEC Tournament and Florida program records.

When Florida last played Mississippi State, the two teams played to a scoreless tie on Sept. 18, 2018. Florida had several good looks, as UF outshot MSU 20-15, but couldn't convert any opportunities into scores. The shutout was Florida's third of the season. It was the 25th for senior goalkeeper **Kaylan Marckese**, putting her two away from tying Florida's career solo shutout record. Marckese did finish her career with UF's shutout record (29).

The 2021 Gators consists of 31 players, including seven freshmen and one transfer. Florida returns eight with eight or more starts in last season's 17-match schedule.

Tony Amato is the second coach in Florida's 27-season history. Becky Burleigh, who started the Gator program in 1995, retired from collegiate coaching following the 2020-21 season. Amato starts his 19th collegiate coaching season in 2021, after spending the last eight seasons with the Arizona Wildcats. In his last 11 seasons coaching at the DI level, Amato led his teams to NCAA action six times, with the 2015 Arizona squad advancing to the NCAA Sweet 16.

Florida was 6-8-3 in the pandemic season that spanned both fall 2020 and spring 2021. The Gators were 13th in Southeastern Conference action at 1-6-1 and advanced to the SEC Tournament second round. Top returning points scorer from 2020-21 is graduate **Madison Alexander**, who is taking advantage of the pandemic extra year of eligibility to play a fifth season in 2021. Alexander was third among the Gators last season with 11 points off two goals and a team-high seven assists. Seven other Gators who scored goals last season return in 2021. Of Florida's three goalkeepers, only sophomore **Alexa Goldberg** has seen collegiate action. She appeared in four matches last season with one start.

The Gators' 2021 fall schedule includes six opponents ranked in the United Soccer Coaches preseason top 25 – at No. 1 Florida State (Sept. 2, 5-2 loss), No. 3 North Carolina (Sept. 9, 7-1 loss), No. 17 South Carolina (Oct. 28), at No. 18 Vanderbilt (Sept. 17), at No. 20 South Florida (Aug. 19, 2-1 loss) and No. 23 Mississippi (Oct. 3). Florida lost 2-0 to No. 19 UCF, moved into the top-20 for the Aug. 24 poll. The SEC has five teams among the preseason top 25 – second only to the Atlantic Coast Conference's six.

Kentucky

Kentucky and Florida have played one common opponent this season, as both teams lost 2-1 at top-20 South Florida. Like Florida, the Wildcats have played three overtime matches in 2021 and is 1-0-2 in those extended matches (3-2 OT win versus Murray State; 1-1 2OT at Purdue; 0-0 2OT versus Dayton).

Juniors Jordyn Rhodes and Hannah Richardson share the UK goals lead (8) and Rhodes is the points leader (21). Freshman goalkeeper Laura Nielsen of Odense, Denmark, has started every match and owns a goals against average of 0.890.

Mississippi State

The Bulldogs opened Southeastern Conference play with a 2-0 loss at then No. 6 Louisiana State. In Thursday's Bulldog meeting in Athens, Ga., MSU and Georgia played to a 2-2 2OT tie for the highest scoring match of the day's league action. MSU has met one other team that is among the current United Soccer Coaches top-25, losing 1-0 to Arizona State on Aug. 26.

Junior Onyi Echegini is the Bulldogs' points (6) leader and shares the goals (2) lead with senior Monigo Karnley. Sophomore goalkeeper Maddy Anderson has played every minute this season and owns a goals-against-average of 0.92.

2021 Gator Schedule

The challenges are plenty for Florida soccer in 2021.

- United Soccer Coaches preseason top 25 includes six Gator opponents – at No. 1 Florida State (Sept. 2, 5-2 loss), No. 3 North Carolina (Sept. 9, 7-1 loss), No. 17 South Carolina (Oct. 28), at No. 18 Vanderbilt (Sept. 17), at No. 20 South Florida (Aug. 19/2-0 loss) and No. 23 Mississippi (Oct. 3). Florida lost 2-0 to UCF, who moved into the top 20 on the Aug. 24 poll.

- Of the five Southeastern Conference teams to advance to the 2020 NCAA Tournament, three are among Florida's 10 regular-season league opponents – Mississippi (third round), South Carolina (second round) and Vanderbilt (second round).

Three more 2021 Gator opponents were among last season's 48-team NCAA Tournament field – Florida State (runner-up), North Carolina (semifinal) and South Florida (second round).

- Three SEC teams are among the United Soccer Coaches current top-20 rankings: – No. 5 LSU, No. 11 Auburn and No. 16 Arkansas. The SEC placed five teams among the preseason top 25, second only to the Atlantic Coast Conference's six. Of the preseason ranked SEC teams, Florida faces all but Texas A&M and Arkansas in 2021 regular-season play.

Olympic Gold

Canada's 2020 Olympic soccer gold medal roster included two Gator grads – **Adriana Leon** (2012) and **Deanne Rose** (2017-21).



Canada went to penalty kicks in two of its three final matches and both Gators hit key PKs in those matches. In the quarterfinal round, Canada and Brazil went to PKs after played a scoreless tie. Leon hit the fourth PK as Canada advanced with a 4-3 PK advantage. In the gold medal match, Canada and Sweden played to a 1-1 double overtime tie, forcing PKs to decide the gold medal winner for the first time in Olympic women's soccer history. With Canada trailing 2-1 in PKs, Rose successfully converted her kick in the fifth position. Canada won its first Olympic soccer gold after hitting its sixth PK to take a final 3-2 advantage.

This is the fifth consecutive Olympics that at least one Gator has claimed a medal (5 Gators, seven golds, two bronze).

Two Gators wear the SEC Graduate patch this season. Both have a first in their Gator history.

Madison Alexander graduated cum laude in May of 2021 with a bachelor's degree in Food Science & Human Nutrition-Dietetics. She is now pursuing her master's degree in Health Education & Behavior. **Alexander is the first Gator taking advantage of the extra year of eligibility granted by the NCAA due to the pandemic.** She is the only Gator to start every match of the 2020-21 season.

Kit Loferski wears the SEC Graduate patch for a second consecutive season. She received her bachelor's degree in Fitness & Wellness in August 2020 and is working toward her master's degree in Management. Loferski's first season with the Gators was 2016. Florida's 2020 roster actually runs 32 deep. Just before 2019 preseason camp began, the Gators added - **Brooke Dunn** of Leesburg, Fla.

Nine-year old Brooke, a Gator fan since birth, made her Florida allegiance official with her adoption through the [Friends of Jaclyn](#) organization. She was diagnosed in April of 2018 with neuroblastoma, a cancer of the central nervous system and nerve tissue. The first step of the treatment, chemotherapy, started soon after the diagnosis. The treatment disrupted Brooke's plans to attend the Gators' Orange & Blue game (a big disappointment for Brooke!).

Friends of Jaclyn's mission is "to improve the quality of life for children and families living with pediatric brain tumors and other childhood cancer. Friends of Jaclyn matches children with high school and college athletic teams to provide support for the child and spread awareness of brain tumors throughout the community. Brooke is the 261st child to join a team through the Friends of Jaclyn program.

Two days after her adoption by the Gator program, **Brooke got some further good news. She rang the bell at Shands Pediatrics to signal NEC (no evidence of disease).**
