The Aggies continue SEC action at Ellis Field when they host the Mississippi State Bulldogs at 7 p.m. for the final game of their four-match homestand.

BEST IN TEXAS

The Aggies sport the best soccer team in Texas by every tangible measure. Texas A&M boasts 480 all-time wins, 35 ahead of SMU (445) the only other squad with over 400 wins. Texas A&M's .744 winning percentage is joined by only North Texas (.707) in exceeding the .700 mark. The Aggies' 26 NCAA Tournament appearances nearly matches the combined total of the No. 2 and No. 3 teams on the Lone Star list with Texas (15) and SMU (14).

NEW FACES ON THE STAFF

Texas A&M welcomes a pair of new faces to the coaching staff for the 2022 campaign with the addition of **Alyssa Mautz** as assistant coach and **Ahmad Brown** as volunteer assistant. Mautz is actually a familiar face in Aggieland, starring for Texas A&M from 2008-10. She played 67 matches for the Maroon & White, logging 52 points on 21 goals and 10 assists. She earned All-Big 12 Second Team as a junior followed by All-Big 12 First Team and Big 12 All-Tournament team as a senior. Mautz recently retired from a 10-year playing career with the Chicago Red Stars of the NWSL. Entering this season, she ranked 18th on the NWSL list for career matches played. Brown, a renowned performance analyst, was added to the staff after a successful run at Florida State. In 2021 he helped guide the Seminoles to a College Cup title and an ACC championship. Mautz replaces Lori Stephenson, who retired after 22 seasons on the staff. Brown replaces Nathan Kogut who accepted a position as soccer head coach at Lamar University.

SERIES VS. MISSISSIPPI STATE

The Aggies own a 9-1 edge in the all-time series with all the meetings coming since A&M joined the SEC prior to the 2012 season. Ol' Sarge's charges won the first nine matches with the Bulldogs snapping the win streak last season in Starkville, 2-1. Texas A&M has posted shutouts in six of the 10 matches with the Aggies outscoring the Bulldogs, 30-5.

WINNING

Texas A&M enters the 2022 campaign boasting a winning record in 28 of their 29 seasons. The Maroon & White had a streak of 28 consecutive winning seasons snapped with last year's 7-9-2 finish. Prior to that, the closest the Aggies finished to the .500 mark is the 12-8-2 (.591) record they posted in 2016. The 28-season string ranks sixth all-time among NCAA Division I schools.

WINNERS WIN

The Aggies rank 12th among NCAA Division I programs in all-time victories. Now with 480 wins in their 30th season, the Maroon & White have experienced just one losing campaign.

NWSL STARS

The National Women's Soccer League opening weekend featured an Aggieland flavor as six former Texas A&M standouts saw action on the pitch. Four Aggies earned starting assignments, including Jimena Lopez and Ally Watt with OL Reign, Addie McCain with Kansas City Current and Merritt Mathias with North Carolina Courage. Shea Groom (Houston Dash) and **Alyssa Mautz** (Chicago Red Stars) made appearances off the bench.

Since opening day, Mautz has retired to become an assistant coach with the Aggies and Watt was traded to the Orlando Pride.

When the season opened, Mathias (3rd - 164) and Mautz (18th - 135) both ranked among the NWSL top 20 in career matches played. Mathias has won league titles in 2014 with FC Kansas City and 2018 and 2019 with the Courage. Groom won a Challenge Cup with the Dash in 2020 and was named MVP of the final.

INTERNATIONAL PROFESSIONALS

The Aggies boast four former players performing overseas. Asdis Halldorsdottir (Valur) and Taylor Ziemer (Breidablik) are playing in Iceland. OL Reign has loaned Cosette Morche to French club Issy. The most recent Aggie to turn professional is Barbara Olivieri, who signed with Mexico side CF Monterrey in December.

CATCHING UP

Entering the season with the SEC's second-best all-time winning percentage in league games at .747, trailing just Florida (.783), the Maroon & White have begun catching teams on the league's all-time conference wins list in just their 11th season as a member. With 71 wins under their belt, the Aggies have already passed 28-year league member Mississippi State (47 SEC) and are looking to chase down the next squads on the list including LSU (93 SEC wins in 28 years) and Alabama (92 SEC wins in 29 years).

CANADIAN TRIO

The Aggies have tapped the Vancouver Whitecaps REX Elite pipeline three times in recent years, landing a trio of standouts. **Andersen Williams** was the first Canadian to head to Texas. She has suffered injuries each of the first two seasons, but is expected to contribute on the attack in her third rookie campaign. Last season, **Mia Pante** earned SEC All-Freshman honors and led the Aggies in assist in her first season. Freshman goalkeeper **Bella Lister** was a spring signee for the Maroon & White and is expected to bolster the A&M netminding corps.

BECCERRA NAMED TO TDS PRESEASON FRESHMAN BEST XI

The Texas A&M rookie midfielder **Sydney Becerra** was named to the TopDrawerSoccer.com Preseason Freshman Best XI. Becerra arrives in Aggieland after a prolific club and prep playing career. The Flower Mound, Texas, native has been active with the US Soccer youth national teams, including an invitation to the US Soccer U18 Women's National Team virtual camp in 2021. She took part in U16 Girls National Team training sessions in 2019 and 2020.

Becerra blossomed at Solar Soccer Club, pacing the team to a third-place finish at the ECNL national championship and a first-place finish in the league in 2021. She garnered All-ECNL Texas U17 First Team recognition for her effort.

She played one season at Flower Mound High School, guiding the Jaguars to a 23-1-2 record and a Texas Class A state title in 2020-21. Becerra was named the Texas Girls Soccer Gatorade Player of the Year in 2020-21, in addition earning All-State First Team, District 6-6A Most Valuable Player, All-District 6-6A First Team and UIL Soccer Class 6A All-Tournament Team.

Carolyn Calzada is expected to dazzle on the backline one year after her brother Zach Calzada won the hearts of the 12th Man in his rookie campaign. Zach appeared in 11 games, including 10 starts for the Aggies in 2021, throwing for 2,185 yards and 17 touchdowns. His shining moment came in the A&M's 41-38 upset victory over top-ranked Alabama, earning SEC Offensive Player of the Week, Davey O'Brien Award Player of the Week and Maxwell Award Player of the Week. Zach transferred to Auburn in January 2022.

GUERRIERI RANKS AMONG THE NATION'S WINNINGEST COACHES

Texas A&M head coach **G Guerrieri** ranks among the leaders in winning percentage and victories among active Division I coaches. With a career record of 496-162-44 (.737), he ranks third in victories and eighth in winning percentage (minimum five years as a Division I head coach).

Guerrieri ranks fifth all-time among NCAA Division I coaches in victories, trailing North Carolina's Anson Dorrance (908), Connecticut's Len Tsantiris (570 - retired), Santa Clara's Jerry Smith (525) and Florida's Becky Burleigh (513 - retired).

ATTRACTING A CROWD

The Aggies' Fish Camp Game against New Mexico State drew 6,086 fans, the third-highest attendance for a game at Ellis Field and 11th for any NCAA women's soccer regular-season match. Six of the top 20 matches in regular-season attendance came at Ellis Field. The Aggies also took part in No. 20 on the list, taking a boatload of fans to Austin to give Texas 5,586 fans in 2008.

PANTE PLAYS IN U20 WOMEN'S WORLD CUP

Texas A&M sophomore **Mia Pante** suited up for Canada at the 2022 FIFA Under-20 Women's World Cup. She started all three matches for Canada which finished 0-3 in group play.

It marked the third consecutive U20 Women's World Cup that included an Aggie. Ally Watt played for the United States squad that finished fourth at the 2016 tournament. Jimena Lopez was a starter for the Mexico U20 World Cup squad in 2018.

SHUTOUTS TO START THE SEASON

The Aggies started the season with three consecutive shutouts for the fourth time in school annals. Texas A&M started the 2018 campaign with shutouts against Hawaii (4-0), Loyola Marymount (3-0), BYU (2-0) and San Diego (3-0) - the best start to a season. The Maroon & White also started the 2003 and 2005 campaigns with three consecutive shutouts.

ELLIS FIELD EDGE

The Aggies own a 270-43-12 (.849) all-time record at Ellis Field. The Maroon & White rattled off a 14-home match win streak between 2019-21. The Aggies are 277-43-12 (.852) in all-time home games after posting a 7-0-0 mark at Old Tiger Stadium in 1993.

GOALS FROM EVERYWHERE

The Aggies have had 14 different players find the back of the net through nine matches. **MaKhiya McDonald** leads the squad with five goals and is the only player to record a brace in 2022 with her two goals against McNeese. **Kate Colvin** has three goals and ranks second on the team with four assists. **Maile Hayes**, **Sawyer Dumond** and **Jai Smith** have two goals apiece. Others to notch goals are **Sydney Becerra**, **Carissa Boeckmann**, **Quinn Cornog**, **Georgia Leb**, **Macy Matula**, **Mia Pante**, **Taylor Pounds**, **Karlina Sample** and **Andersen Williams**.

BACK-TO-BACK BARRAGE

The Aggies logged 14 goals against McNeese and Sam Houston. It marked the highest tally in back-to-back matches for the Aggies since 2011 when they scored 16 against Fordham (13) and Iowa State (3). It was the fourth-highest total for Texas A&M in consecutive games.

EARLY SEASON MONSOON

Despite playing to a 0-0 draw against No. 25 Clemson in the season-opener, the Aggies scored 16 goals through the first four matches, the fourth-highest tally in school annals. The Maroon & White scored 19 goals in the first four matches of the 1996 campaign. They scored 18 to start the 1995 campaign and 17 to kickoff 2008.
