Did You Know?

Eight Gators scored 13 goals during the course of the 2024 season.

Already through 13 matches of 2025, **12 Gators scored 23 goals.** That is the most goal scorers through 13 matches since 12 different Gators scored 24 in 2020.

Twelve different scorers is third among the league's teams. Arkansas (13) and Alabama (13) lead followed by Florida (12) and Tennessee (12). Kentucky, Mississippi State and Oklahoma have 11 different players score goals in 2025.

Of the 12 2025 Gator goal scorers, 10 hit their first collegiate goals.

Lena Bailey is the only one of Florida's seven 2025 scorers who came into the season with goals in 2023 (4) and 2024 (2).

Madison Jones scored twice while a Kentucky freshman in 2022 and scored her first as a Gator against Georgia State and again versus No. 9 Arkansas.

What's Happening?

Florida plays host to its fifth top-25 league opponent Friday when No. 12 Mississippi State comes to the Donald R. Dizney Stadium.

Friday is also Gators Senior Night and the careers of Njeri Butts, Charlotte McClure, Lauren McCloskey and Tatum O'Coyne will be celebrated in the post-match ceremony.

Last Match:

Florida sealed a gritty 2-1 victory over Texas Sunday at the Mike A. Myers Stadium and Soccer Field. That win marked the Gators' first league win of 2025 after battling through three consecutive draws versus teams recognized in the United Soccer Coaches poll.

After a scoreless opening half, Florida was awarded a penalty kick in the 50th minute after a video review showed a Texas handball. **Kai Tsakiris** stepped up to successfully covert the shot for her team-leading fourth goal of the season. The Longhorns tied the match in the 57th minute when Ava McDonald's lifted ball from just outside the box was headed in by Molly MacMillan. Another penalty kick, this time awarded in the 66th minute after freshman **Sophia Sindelar** was pulled down in the box, put UF back in the lead. Sophomore **Abby Gemma** stepped up to take the kick and successfully scored her first collegiate goal. She is the 10th Gator to score her first collegiate goal this season and the 12th different UF scorer in 2025.

Man-Up and PKS:

Florida played a man-up for the final 64 minutes at Maryland. It was the second 2025 match the Gators played a man-up, as Towson played with nine field players from 26th minute on. Florida is one of 13 NCAA D1 teams this season playing a man-up in a pair of matches. The Gators' and Georgia State's 105 man-up minutes shares the nation's lead among those 13 teams (Oklahoma State/104 minutes; Georgia State/91; Louisville/81; North Alabama/79 minutes; Oregon State/73; Texas A&M & Little Rock/47; Southeast Louisiana/39, Lamar/34, Santa Clara/28, Washington State/28, Delaware/14 and Marist/3).

The Gators are among 30 D1 teams to take four or more penalty kicks in 2025. Of those 30 teams, Florida (6) and Oklahoma (4) are among the eight to score on each PK attempt. Kentucky leads the nation with nine PKs in 2025, successfully converting seven. Florida's six successful PKs is the most since hitting 5 of 8 in 2012

About Friday's Opponent No. 12 Mississippi State (9-2-1, 4-1-1 SEC)

Mississippi State was 19-3 in 2024 and won its first Southeastern Conference regularseason with a 10-0 record. The Bulldogs 2024 NCAA run ended with a third-round 2-0 home loss to Notre Dame. MSU is picked to finish eighth in the 2025 preseason vote by the league coaches.

Mississippi State is third in the current SEC standings with its 4-1-1 record. The Bulldogs opened league play with a 3-2 win over then No. 1 Tennessee and added more points with wins at Texas (3-0), at Missouri (3-0) and versus Mississippi (2-0) plus a tie versus Auburn (1-1). The only league loss came Sunday at then No. 7 Arkansas (4-2) – ending the Bulldogs SEC regular-season unbeaten streak at 15.

The Gators' 2025 fall schedule includes nine teams that advanced to 2024 NCAA Tournament action – Arkansas (third round), Florida State (second), Georgia (first), Kentucky (second), LSU (first), Mississippi State (third), South Carolina (second), Tennessee (first) and Texas (second).

Friends of Jaclyn Foundation. Twelve-year old Brooke, a Gator fan since birth, made her Florida allegiance official with her adoption through the Friends of Jaclyn organization. She was diagnosed in April of 2018 with neuroblastoma, a cancer of the central nervous system and nerve tissue. The first step of the treatment, chemotherapy, started soon after the diagnosis. Friends of Jaclyn's mission is "to improve the quality of life for children and families living with pediatric brain tumors and other childhood cancer. Friends of Jaclyn matches children with high school and college athletic teams to provide support for the child and spread awareness of brain tumors throughout the community. Brooke is the 261st child to join a team through the Friends of Jaclyn program.

Two days after her adoption by the Gator program, Brooke got some good news. She rang the bell at Shands Pediatrics to signal NEC (no evidence of disease).

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Florida opened the season Thursday with a 4-0 loss at preseason No. 3 Florida State in front of a soggy Seminole Soccer Complex crowd.

Lightning in the area delayed the 2025 season start by an hour. It is not unusual to experience weather delays in this series; most recently the start of the 2022 match was held up 20 minutes. But the weather wasn't totally clear of Tallahassee, as rain started while the teams were announced pre-match. The teams left the field with 8:47 remaining in the opening half due to lightning with the match resuming at 9:55.

Florida is 21-7-3 in season openers. Thursday's meeting the eighth time UF opened a season versus a top-20 team (2-4-2 all-time vs top-20 teams in opener)

Thursday's Scoring:Florida State started the scoring in the 34th minute. Lara Dantas crossed the ball across the face of the goal to find Heather Gilchrist, who headed in the Seminoles' first goal of the season.

Shortly after play resumed, the Seminoles were awarded a free kick at corner of box. The ball sent in by Enasia Colon was touched in by Gilchrist from eight yards at 39:16.

The Seminoles scored again within two minutes off another free kick from Colon. This time, Wrianna Hudson headed it in from six yards.

Second half scoring started in the 64th minute. Riley Giana touched the ball forward to Taylor Suarez, who was wide and just inside the box. Her centering ball was one-touched in by Yuna McCormack from seven yards.

In the 77th minute, Peyton Nourse followed the deflection on her own shot to score from eight yards to close the evening's scoring.

- Tonight's 2 hours, 15 minute total weather delay isn't the all-time record for a UF-FSU meeting. In 1999, the two teams waited out a 2:33 total weather delay in Gainesville.
- Three Gators made their first collegiate start Thursday Skye Barnes, Addy Hess and Kai Tsakiris. Two who transferred to UF for spring 2025 semester Brinley Murphy and Abby Gemma – made their first Gator start Thursday.
- Addy Hess and Kai Tsakiris mark the 24th time in the program's 31 seasons that the opening lineup included a freshman.

Coach Bohon Said:

"I'm such a competitor, so it's really hard for me to sit here and find positives in a five nothing game, especially when it was within striking distance with that rain delay. You got to give Florida State credit, they came out and put two in the back of the net in those last eight minutes of the first half, and that was really frustrating for us. I think three or four of their goals were set pieces, which we actually identified in pre game that we cannot give them set pieces when you have a six foot two center forward for them.

"So disappointed with the execution, but I feel, I still think we're going to accomplish what we want to accomplish out of this, which is a measuring, stick to see this is the level that we have expectations for our program to be at - so to see how far off, where we're off, where we stood up. And I do think there were areas that we stood up probably better than in my tenure here. It gave us some really good insight into moving forward for the rest of the season, but obviously disappointed to come away with a loss." – Florida Head Coach Samantha Bohon

Weather Delay - Again!

Both matches of this season were delayed by lightning. A week ago in Tallahassee, that match was twice delayed for a total of 2 hours and 15 minutes. Tonight, the players were pulled from the pitch after just over 12 minutes of action and returned to play 2 hours and eight minutes later.

Tonight's Scoring:
The Tigers were the first to score after the delay, with Sydney Feiler one-touching in the ball from Kale'a Perry from eight yards in the 20th minute.

Freshman Katie Johnston hit her first collegiate goal off her first collegiate shot in the 31st minute to tie the match. The play started when Madison Jones won the ball and found Johnston about 30 yards from goal. Johnston drove forward about 10 yards before striking a left-footed shot to the left of keeper.

Another collegiate first goal - this time by senior Njeri Butts - came less than three minutes later. Johnston played the ball down the middle, enabling Butts to show her speed as she ran the ball down for a left-footed tap-in at the near post.

The Tigers tied the match in the 42nd minute when Perry scored off the pass from Emely Rubio.

Towson went a player down in the 49th minute when Gracen Houck was given her second vellow card after fouling Johnston on a goal scoring chance

Johnston earned the brace in the 57th minute. Sophomore **Ryleigh Acosta** started the play, getting the ball to freshman **Addy Hess**. Johnston ran down the ball Hess played through the middle to score her second goal of

Another Gator - sophomore Skye Barnes - became the third of the evening to score her first collegiate goal. She headed in the corner kick sent it by Johnston from four yards at the far post in the 68th minute.

- Katie Johnston is the 22nd in Florida's 31 seasons to score multiple goals in the same match as her first collegiate goal. The last was Lauren Donovan who provided both the goals in 2-1 win versus then No. 22 Texas on Oct. 4, 2024. This is the third consecutive season with a double goal effort in the same match as their first Gator goal. Molly Grant and Megan Hinnenkamp both turned in a pair of goals versus Stetson (Aug. 27, 2023). Hinnenkamp turned in three double goal matches in 2023.
- Johnston joins Jill Stevens as the only players in Florida history with six points earned in the match with their first collegiate goal. As a freshman, Stevens hit a hat-trick on Oct. 9, 1998 in Florida's 8-0 win versus Mississippi State for her six points. In addition to her two goals Thursday, Johnston provided the assist on Njeri Butts' and Skye Barnes' goals.
- Two who have seen most of their collegiate minutes as a defender scored tonight. Skye Barnes plays outside back for the Gators, Nieri Butts moved from the backline to a more attacking role for the Gators during the 2024 season. She played as an outside back for Jamaica in a pair of friendly matches versus Chile in February.

Coach Bohon Said:

"A lot of credit to Katherine {Vettori, Towson head coach} and her group. She was like that as a player - really gritty and worked really hard, never gave up - and you could see her team took on that personality so we knew they weren't going to go away easily. That's why we were a little bit frustrated at halftime that we didn't put away more chances because we felt like we could have had a little bit more of a cushion

"But again, shows real sign of growth from last year to this year to put four goals away against a pretty gritty team and have three first time goal scorers is really exciting. GAINESVILLE, Fla. – Gator soccer closed non-conference action Sunday with a 2-1 loss to Georgia State on a soggy evening at the Donald R. Dizney Stadium.

Sunday's start was delayed an hour due to lightning in the area. Light rain started in the opening half that continued throughout the remainder of the match.

This Evening's Scoring

After a scoreless opening half, Florida opened the second with a goal in the 52nd minute. With the Gators attacking the Panthers goal, Reese Gordon cleared the ball from near the six-yard box. Florida's **Madison Jones** stepped up to hit a 22-yard shot from above the center of the box, as her right-footed shot hit the far post and kicked in. It was Jones' first goal as a Gator as she scored twice as a Kentucky freshman in 2022.

"That is a hard finish. That ball in these wet conditions - for her to one-time and keep it that low was one of our hardest chances of the night," Florida Head Coach **Samantha Bohon** said. "So good for her for finishing that. She's been patient and she's a veteran. I've always told these players, your time is going to come. And you know, tonight, that was important for her."

Georgia State scored the next two goals. The goal in the 61st minute started with a free kick just wide of the box and a step above the endline. That free kick by Sunniyah Tucker went to the other side of the box where Carys Fraser lofted it to the middle for Lily Sawyer's scoring header.

Then Aaliyah Faddoul drove down the field to send a deep centering ball. The deflection came off the upraised foot of a Gator to fall in the box where Reese Gordon ran onto it for a one touch to the center of the goal in the $65^{\rm th}$ minute.

With 16 minutes remaining in the second half, it appeared UF's **Megan Hinnenkamp** scored on a short shot but the goal was waved off due to offsides after the video review.

The Gators outshot the Panthers 18-5 Sunday and had a season-high 14 corner kicks. Those numbers had Florida Coach Bohon shaking her head at the opportunities presented.

"Eighteen shots, 14 corners. If you would have told me we would lose a game with those kind of stats, I would have laughed. You know, you got to give them credit, because they were very opportunistic on their chances. Their keeper was unbelievable. She made two or three saves that were just incredible. We hit the post at least twice that I can remember. So I'm not even like frustrated with our team, because we created so many chances," Rohon said

"We just had that probably 10-minute spell where they started to get a little bit of possession, a little bit of confidence and that was after we had scored. We've got to be able to withstand that and keep them off the board. So that was certainly disappointing. The results definitely disappointing. But again, we were so dangerous offensively. It just is really unfortunate that we just couldn't have put more in the back of the net."

The Arkansas at Florida match was the opening event across the league for Southeastern Conference action as most of the teams begin tomorrow night.
