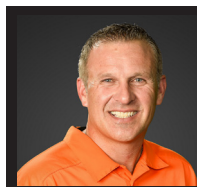

GAME NOTES



Colin Carmichael
Head Coach,
22nd Season

Colin Carmichael has been at OSU since the inception of the women's soccer program in the fall of 1996, and he continues to help lead Cowgirl soccer to new heights and a spot among the nation's elite.

OSU is in the midst of the most successful stretch of seasons in its history as the program is in its 31st year, 22 of those with Carmichael as head coach.

Carmichael, who served as OSU's co-head coach with Karen Hancock during the 2005 and 2006 seasons, entered the 2026 season with a 269-123-55 career record in 21 seasons as the Cowgirls' head coach, compiling a winning percentage of .663. He has led OSU to 12 appearances in the NCAA Women's Soccer Championship, including six straight from 2006-11, and after advancing to the second round of the NCAA tourney four-straight years, the Cowgirls made back-to-back trips to the Elite Eight in 2010 and 2011.

The Cowgirls have been a force in the Big 12 Conference under Carmichael, capturing six league titles. OSU claimed four consecutive conference championships from 2008-11 and added crowns in 2017 and 2019; the Cowgirls won regular season titles in 2008, '11, '17 and '19 and Big 12 Soccer Championship titles in 2009 and 2010.

Carmichael has guided OSU to a 15-12-4 record and four finals appearances at the Big 12 Championship and an 11-9-6 record in NCAA tourney play.

ABOUT OKLAHOMA STATE

- OSU is 1-1-1 on the season and coming off a loss to Oklahoma. Up next, the Cowgirls travel to Starkville, Mississippi, to take on Mississippi State Thursday night in their lone non-conference road game of the regular season. Following that match, OSU returns home to host Grambling State on Sunday.
- The Cowgirls are coming off a 4-13-2 season in 2025 and returns eight players who started at least eight games a year ago, including Preseason All-Big 12 midfielder Laudan Wilson.
- Colin Carmichael entered his 22nd season as OSU's head coach in 2026 with a career record of 269-123-55 (.663).

THREE DECADES

The 2026 season marks the 31st in program history, and over its first three decades, Oklahoma State has built itself into a consistent winner.

- In its first 30 seasons, OSU posted a 352-203-68 (.620) record.
- OSU has made 14 appearances in the NCAA Women's Soccer Championship. The Cowgirls have earned a NCAA tourney berth in 13 of the last 20 years (beginning in 2006).
- From 2006-11, the Cowgirls earned six-straight NCAA tourney bids and advanced to at least the second round each time, including back-to-back Elite Eight appearances in 2010 and 2011.
- From 2008-11, OSU celebrated four consecutive Big 12 championships — two regular season (2008, '11) and two tournament ('09, '10). The Cowgirls also won regular season titles in 2017 and 2019.
- Six Cowgirls have earned All-America honors, with Yolanda Odenyo, AD Franch, Melinda Mercado, Haley Woodard, Kim Rodriguez and Grace Yochum on that elite list.

SCOUTING THE OPPONENTS

- Mississippi State is 3-0-0, with home wins against South Alabama and Southern Miss and a road victory at UAB. The Bulldogs have outscored their opponents by a 9-1 margin.
- Kevin O'Brien is in his first season as MSU's head coach.
- The Cowgirls are 1-1-0 all time against Mississippi State. Last season, the 17th-ranked Bulldogs won a 1-0 contest in Stillwater. The other meeting came in 2010 with OSU winning 6-0 on its home field.
- Grambling State is 0-1-1 and plays at Louisiana-Monroe Thursday before coming to Stillwater.
- Chris Logan is in his first season as the Tigers' head coach.
- This will mark the first-ever meeting between OSU and Grambling.

HOME SWEET HOME

OSU has won over 70 percent of its games in nine seasons at Neal Patterson Stadium, which opened in 2018. The Cowgirls are 53-19-8 on their current home turf.

OSU has gone undefeated at home in seven seasons in its history, the last time coming in 2019.

COWGIRL COUNTRY

OSU's 2026 roster includes players from 13 states as well as Canada, England, Germany and Panama. Six Texans dot the roster, while the Cowgirls have four players each from Oklahoma and Kansas.

NEW FACES

The Cowgirls' 29-player roster counts 12 returning letterwinners and 17 newcomers. Of OSU's new players, eight are Division I transfers, six are freshmen from the prep ranks, two are junior college transfers and one is a transfer from Division II.

I'M HONORED

Three OSU veterans have earned all-conference accolades in their careers. In 2024, Laudan Wilson was an All-Big 12 First Team midfielder, while Gracie Bindbeutel was an All-Big 12 Second Team forward and defender Katelyn Hoppers was named to the Big 12 All-Freshman Team.

The Cowgirls added three all-conference performers via the transfer portal — Bryn Geppert was an All-Southland Conference First Team selection in 2025, Jada Moorman was a two-time All-Southern Conference pick and the SoCon Freshman of the Year and Emily Senatore was twice named to the All-Southland Conference First Team and was the 2025 Southland Player of the Year and Midfielder of the Year.

OSU also brought in a pair of two-time JUCO All-Americans in Emma Jensen and Sherline King. Jensen led Northwest Mississippi Community College to back-to-back NJCAA Division II national championships, while King scored a program record 54 goals in her Jones College career.

Avery Bass capped her career at Division II Central Oklahoma by earning United Soccer Coaches All-Region Third Team honors.

BETTER IN AMERICA'S BRIGHTEST

Keaton Mitchell had a career day in leading the Cowgirls to their first win of the season over SFA.

A transfer from Tennessee, Mitchell had two career goals in 49 games for the Vols. In her second game at OSU, the senior midfielder came off the bench and netted a pair of goals, one in each half, to lead the Cowgirls to the victory over SFA.

Wilson, who missed much of last season with injury, was an All-Big 12 First Team selection as a sophomore in 2024 after scoring five goals and posting nine assists; her assist total ranked second in the Big 12 and was the most assists in a season by a Cowgirl since Jaci Jones had 12 in 2019.

In 53 career games for the Cowgirls, Wilson has recorded eight goals and 16 assists. She is four assists away from cracking the top 10 list in program history.

LOCKDOWN LO

In her first season as OSU's starting goalie as a sophomore in 2025, Logan Marks led the Big 12 with 5.21 saves per game and ranked second in the league with 99 saves, the third most in a season in program history.

Just 23 games into her career, Marks already ranks eighth on OSU's career saves list with 108.

Marks recorded a career-high nine saves and her first clean sheet in Big 12 play against 17th-ranked Arizona State and followed that with an eight-save performance against Arizona.

GRACIE B GOOD

Senior forward Gracie Bindbeutel has endured a career marred by injuries, suffering torn ACLs in both knees that caused her to miss the entire 2023 season and all but five games in 2025.

An All-Big 12 performer in 2024, Bindbeutel scored OSU's first goal of the season in the opener vs. Sam Houston. It marked her first goal since October 10, 2024 vs. Houston and was the seventh of her career.

COACH COLIN

Colin Carmichael has been a member of the OSU coaching staff for each of the program's 31 seasons, including 22 as a head coach. He has been named Big 12 Coach of the Year a conference-record six times.

Carmichael entered the 2026 season with 269 career wins in 21 seasons, ranking third among active Big 12 coaches in wins at their current school behind only BYU's Jennifer Rockwood (474 wins in 31 seasons) and West Virginia's Nikki Izzo-Brown (416 wins in 30 seasons).

PROS

OSU's program has produced 19 players who have played professionally or been professional draft picks. That list includes Anna Beffer, Hannah Chance, Gabriella Coleman, Grace Gordon, AD Franch, Jaidy Gutierrez Campos, Anna Hurley, Jaci Jones, Kasey Langdon, Melinda Mercado, Charmé Morgan, Grace Neville, Xcaret Pineda, Kim Rodriguez, Coumba Sow, Allie Stephenson, Laurene Tresfield, Grace Yochum and Barbara Zágoni.

In March 2023, former OSU All-American Yolanda Odenyo joined the staff of the NWSL's Orlando Pride as an assistant coach, helping lead them to the league title in 2024.

REPRESENT

Sherline King is continuing a trend of Cowgirls competing for national teams; King is currently a member of the Panama National Team.

A number of other OSU standouts have represented their respective countries as members of national teams, including three Cowgirls — AD Franch, Courtney Dike and Coumba Sow — who have been on FIFA Women's World Cup rosters.

Franch joined the United States Women's National Team in 2012 and earned her first-career cap in 2019 at the SheBelieves Cup. The former Cowgirl All-American was on the roster of the 2019 FIFA Women's World Cup champion U.S. squad and won a bronze medal at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, where she started in goal in the U.S.'s medal game against Australia.

Dike was the first-ever Oklahoma State player to appear in the World Cup when she earned two caps for Nigeria in 2015, including starting against the eventual champion United States team. Dike was a four-time All-Big 12 Conference forward for the Cowgirls from 2013-16.

Sow was a starting midfielder for the Switzerland National Team at the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup. Sow was part of the OSU program in 2016 and 2017, scoring three goals in 23 games for the Cowgirls' 2017 Big 12 Conference championship squad.

Other Cowgirls who have earned national team status include:

Former Cowgirl All-American Kim Rodriguez received her first call up to the Mexico National Team in Feb. 2019 and continues to be a part of that team.

Other former Cowgirls who have competed for their respective national teams include Kathrin Lehmann (Switzerland), Peyton Vincze (Wales), Grace Neville (New Zealand), Chloé Joseph (Haiti) and Murphy Sheaff (New Zealand).

TOP OF THE LIST

OSU leads all current Big 12 programs with 107 All-Big 12 selections in its history. That list counts All-Big 12 First and Second Team performers as well as members of the All-Newcomer and All-Freshman Teams. The Cowgirls have 17 more selections than the next closest program (Texas Tech with 90).

Only former Big 12 member Texas, with 124 selections, has more than OSU.

NEAL PATTERSON STADIUM

Neal Patterson Stadium was officially dedicated on Aug. 19, 2018, prior to the Oklahoma State-Oklahoma match. The Cowgirls were 2-1 victors in that contest as an OSU women’s soccer record crowd of 4,122 fans were in attendance. Kim Rodriguez scored the first-ever goal in the stadium when she converted a penalty kick in the 15th minute.

A \$20 million project, Neal Patterson Stadium is a showcase for Cow-girl Soccer and one of the top soccer facilities in the collegiate ranks. It is named for its major benefactor and Oklahoma State alumnus, the late Neal Patterson.

Patterson, who passed away during the summer of 2017, grew up near his family’s farm in Manchester, Okla. He earned a bachelor’s degree in finance and a master’s degree in business from Oklahoma State. He was one of five entrepreneurs who founded Sporting Club, which in 2006 purchased the Sporting KC Major League Soccer franchise. He was also chairman of the board and chief executive officer of Cerner Corporation, a company he co-founded with two colleagues in 1979. Today, Cerner is the world’s largest publicly traded health information technology company with \$4.8 billion in revenues in 2016 and approximately 24,000 associates worldwide. FORTUNE recently named Cerner one of the world’s most admired companies.

The new facility includes club seats, plaza and upper bowl gathering areas and a north end zone terrace area and seating designed specifically for OSU students. Team facilities include locker rooms, meeting areas, kitchen facilities, sports medicine areas and equipment rooms. The stadium can accommodate 2,500 fans in permanent seats.

The west side of the stadium includes 346 reserved chairback seats and 810 reserved bleacher-back seats. There are 552 general admission seats.

The north end zone includes bleacher seating for more than 500 and includes a patio and concourse area and a building housing a weight room for the Cowgirls.

Atop the west side of the stadium are two club levels with a capacity of 80 and two suites with a capacity of 20 guests each. A new press box sits atop the stadium. The west side is anchored by a club area at field level that can host more than 100 and serve as a player lounge and nutrition area on non-game days.

Other unique aspects of Patterson Stadium include:

- A large roof that covers much of the seating areas, providing shade and a soccer-specific feel like that in many international venues;
- Home and visitor bench areas with chairback seating built into the stadium;
- A 26 feet by 40 feet high-definition video scoreboard in the south-east corner of the facility.

“A facility of this magnitude is a game changer for our program,” said OSU head soccer coach Colin Carmichael. “It helps the current student-athletes to be in one of the nicest facilities in the country. Our fans are going to have a much better game day experience. We want it to be a real family atmosphere...”

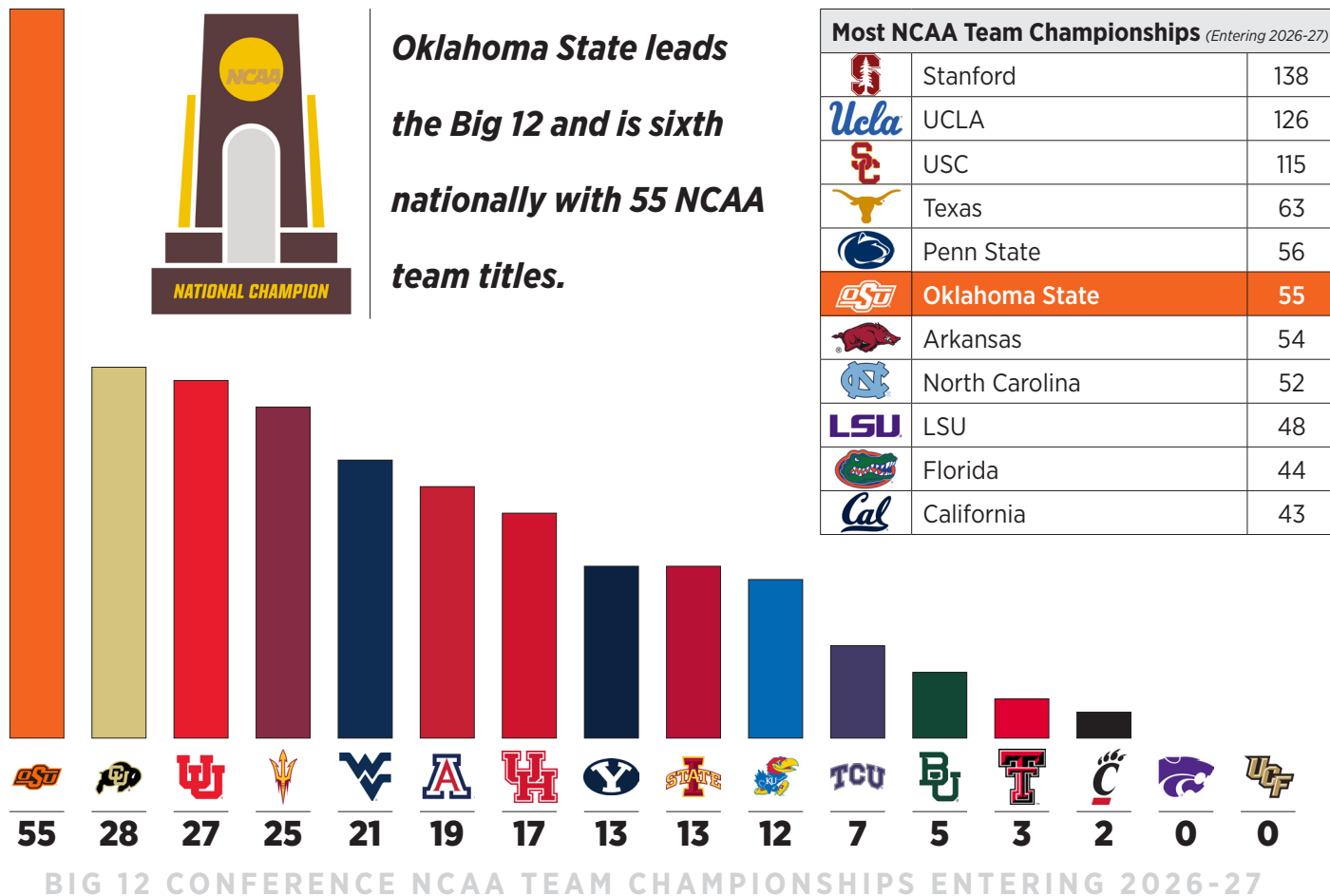
