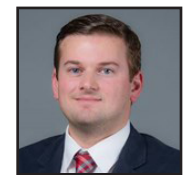

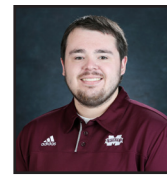

Who to Contact?

The Mississippi State Communications Department is here to serve the media throughout the 2017 Bulldog soccer season. Media members in need of assistance can contact Brian Ogden in the Communications office at (662) 325-0972 or by cell at (972) 977-7459.

MSU Player/Coach Availability

Players and coaches will be made available to the media upon request. Those wishing to set up an interview must contact Brian Ogden via phone or e-mail. On gameday, players and coaches are only available postgame.

For post-practice interviews, media members should contact Brian Ogden no later than 10 p.m. the night before. In most cases, players will be available for a brief time before and after practices which are scheduled during the morning hours of 7:45-10:15 each weekday.

Telephone interviews can also be scheduled with players on a call-back basis during the week with arrangements made through Brian Ogden.

Postgame Interviews

Requested MSU players, along with head coach Tom Anagnost, will be available for interviews approximately 10 minutes after all games near the midfield sideline opposite of the dugouts.

The Mississippi State locker room and field dugouts are off-limits to the media.

Press Box Services

A complete NCAA box score and pertinent game facts are available to members of the working media following the end of the first half and at the conclusion of each game. Media members also have access to game notes, statistics, lineups and rosters prior to the start of each game upon request. A pregame meal is also served in the press box around 45 minutes prior to each game.

Photographers/Videographers

Photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot around the MSU Soccer Field in approved areas. Those wishing to shoot a game must contact Brian Ogden the day before the game to be granted access.

Radio Broadcasts

The MSU Soccer Field press box houses radio lines to support home and visitor radio broadcasts. For more information on the phone lines, please contact Brian Ogden in the Communications office.

MISSISSIPPI STATE SOCCER FIELD

Home to the Mississippi State soccer team since 1995, the Mississippi State Soccer Field gives the Bulldogs one of the finest playing surfaces in the Southeast.

Located on the north side of the Mississippi State University campus, the MSU Soccer Field joins the Mike Sanders Track Complex, DudyNoble Field/Polk-Dement Stadium (baseball), Nusz Park (softball) and the A.J. Pitts Tennis Centre to give MSU one of the finest Olympic sport venues in collegiate athletics.

The facility features a main grandstand area which accommodates more than 500 people, while the grass hillsides that bookend the stands can seat over 1,000 fans for any given contest. The atmosphere is enhanced with a brand-new 18'x32' Daktronics HD video board, which is situated in the northwest corner of the complex.

The program debuted a 2,600 square-foot brick facility in 2008 which houses a concession stand, men's and women's restrooms and a spacious press box.

The press box is divided into four separate work areas, with each equipped with hi-speed internet and telephone access. It is also set up to accommodate television and team video personnel. The MSU Soccer Field also includes covered dugouts for participating teams.

Hailed as one of the top playing surfaces in the Southeastern Conference, the field stretches 114 yards long and 74 yards wide. The regulation NCAA Championship field features Mississippi Pride grass - developed by researchers on the Mississippi State campus - making it one of the top playing surfaces in the country.

Lights were added just after the conclusion of the 2002 campaign, equipping the facility for evening competition and giving it an added amenity that can only translate into better atmospheres.

The atmosphere at the facility has grown over the years, with MSU setting all of the Top 10 attendance marks since 2014. The Bulldogs claimed a new stadium attendance record of 1,327 in the 2015 season against Florida, which stood until the start of the 2017 slate, when a crowd of 1,349 was on hand to witness start of the Tom Anagnost era with a 1-0 MSU win over Stephen F. Austin. That season also saw a record total crowd of 9,016.

MISSISSIPPI STATE SOCCER CLUBHOUSE

Beginning in the 2016 season, Mississippi State soccer took on a new feel when its clubhouse was completed.

The MSU Soccer Clubhouse, a \$1.8 million facility covering nearly 3,000 square feet adjacent to the soccer field, gives the Maroon and White one of the finest buildings of its type in all of college soccer. It also gives the Bulldog soccer program an on-site locker room for the first time in program history.

Past teams had to dress and get treatment for practice and games at Humphrey Coliseum before crossing College View Drive in order to gain access to the field.

It features a 1,000-square-foot player locker room, shower area and bathroom, a 600-square-foot film room/lounge area, a

500-square-foot treatment area, a 300-square-foot equipment and laundry room, a 300-square-foot coaches conference room/locker room and a 250-square-foot kitchen to top it all off.

The addition of the clubhouse adds to one of the best soccer atmospheres in the South and further demonstrates the dedication of the MSU Athletics Department to the soccer program at MSU.

SEASON PREVIEW

Expectations are at an all-time high for the 2018 Mississippi State soccer team after the Tom Anagnost era opened with the best final mark in nearly two decades.

2017 saw MSU go 9-5-4 (2-5-3 in Southeastern Conference play) and finish in a tie for 10th in the league standings.

Anagnost's effect was felt early on, as the Bulldogs set not only a single-game attendance mark in his very first outing as MSU head coach but also a single-season attendance record.



On the pitch, the Bulldogs nearly doubled their 2017 scoring output—scoring 32 goals after netting just 34 the previous two seasons. The Bulldogs were also in a position to win every game they played, with all nine non-victories coming by just one goal or less. State's final RPI of 45 was its best final mark in program history.

To reach the SEC Tournament for the first time since 2004, the Bulldogs will have to navigate through a difficult schedule, both in the non-conference slate and in the always-difficult SEC.

Eleven of the teams the Bulldogs will square off against this season, including exhibitions, made the NCAA Tournament in 2016, with seven of them making it past the first round. Two of those teams made it to the third round or beyond.

A mix of experienced juniors and seniors welcomes one of the largest crops of newcomers in program history to the fold, while a talented group of sophomores also returns to bolster the

Maroon and White side. Of the newcomers, two transfers join 14 freshmen, so a lot of new faces will be relied upon to continue the upward trend of Bulldog soccer.

2017 goals leader and All-SEC Second Team selection MaKayla Waldner returns after a sensational sophomore campaign in which she led the Bulldogs in several offensive categories a year ago, netting 9 goals and attempting a team-high 56 shots with 23 on-target. Her 5 game-winning goals set a program record, and she sits just three shy of tying the career mark.

Brooke McKee, MSU's points leader a season ago, also returns for her senior season. In her first season in Starkville, the Troy transfer immediately provided a spark to the State lineup, scoring a career-high 20 points, including a career-best 8 goals and 4 assists). Also, Olivia Hernandez, a transfer from Arizona State, was a prolific scorer in high school, scoring a district-record 141 goals in her four years. Hernandez returns for her redshirt sophomore campaign after earning a medical hardship last season.

Mauldin helps lead a Bulldog midfield unit that saw the departure of All-SEC selection Mallory Eubanks, who led the squad in assists all four years and earned the highest selection by a Bulldog in the National Women's Soccer League Draft, going 16th overall to the Washington Spirit.

Hayden Oswalt also returns, having played in 13 contests as a sophomore transfer a year ago. Six freshmen (Andrea Compper, Hailey Farrington-Bentil, Liz Fogarty, Laura Galceran, Niah Johnson and Monigo Karnley) join the Maroon and White to help bolster the midfield spot. Compper has the potential to bolster the already-potent Bulldog offense, as the Paris, France, native scored in bunches en route to NJCAA All-American honors in 2017 at Coffeyville CC in Kansas.

The defensive end of the field looks to be the most veteran areas on the squad. Senior Courtney Robicheaux has seen significant time in the backfield for MSU over her previous three years, while

also moving up to become a capable goal-scorer. Sophomores Sam Blanchard and Kristen Malebranche also come back for State after seeing quality playing time as freshmen.

In the net, the Bulldogs look to replicate the success of All-American goalkeeper Catalina Perez, who became one of the top shot-stoppers in not only the conference, but the entire nation in her lone season as a Bulldog. Rhylee DeCrane returns as a fifth-year senior after redshirting in 2017 to provide leadership for a pair of freshmen. Peyton York enrolled in the spring to earn some valuable early experience, while Heloise Ralambosoa—the starting goalkeeper for France's U-23 National Team also joins the Bulldogs.

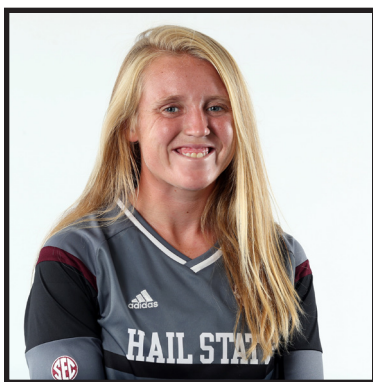
Anagnost's second season kicks off with a pair of road exhibition games in Wisconsin that will help prepare the club for difficult opposition throughout the year—Aug. 9 at Wisconsin and Aug. 11 at Marquette.

The regular season will then kick off on Thursday, Aug. 16 at home against in-state foe Southern Miss. Then, on Sunday, Aug. 19, the Bulldogs will begin a three-match road swing at Stephen F. Austin before heading back east to take on Memphis (Aug. 23) and South Alabama (Aug. 26). MSU will then return home to play three straight home matches against Central Arkansas (Aug. 30), first-time foe Austin Peay (Sept. 2) and Louisiana Tech (Aug. 9).

MSU will kick off SEC play at Auburn on Sept. 14. The Bulldogs will host South Carolina (Sept. 20), Florida (Sept. 27), Alabama (Oct. 7) and Arkansas (Oct. 18), while LSU (Oct. 25) will serve as the regular season finale. In addition to the trip to Auburn, the Bulldogs will also visit Tennessee (Sept. 23), Vanderbilt (Oct. 4), Texas A&M (Oct. 12) and in-state rival Ole Miss (Oct. 21).

If the Bulldogs can survive its gauntlet of a 2018 schedule, it will have a chance to play in the SEC Tournament in Orange Beach, Alabama to be held from Oct. 29-Nov. 4. Should the Bulldogs move past that would mean they would walk a path no MSU team has walked before by going to the NCAA Tournament, set to begin Nov. 9.

TOM ANAGNOST



Head Coach
Second Season at MSU | Kalamazoo College '95

Mississippi State University Director of Athletics John Cohen announced on Dec. 8, 2016 the hiring of Tom Anagnost as the soccer program's new head coach. Anagnost (uh-Nag-Nist) came to MSU from North Carolina State, where he spent the 2016 season as an assistant coach, aiding the Wolfpack to a NCAA Sweet 16 berth.

Anagnost is one of the top Division I head coaches in the country and has shown success everywhere he has been. Prior to MSU, he led both Miami and Central Michigan to a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances, and twice to the second round, once with each program. He spent five years in the classroom as a teacher and educator and has shown a major commitment to academics, increasing his team's GPA each year in charge.

In his inaugural year at the helm of the MSU Soccer program in 2017, the Bulldogs saw immediate and dramatic improvement both on and off the field. On the field, Anagnost led State to its best win percentage in 16 seasons (.611) and had the team on the cusp of reaching its first-ever NCAA Tournament. The Bulldogs finished with its highest RPI in program history at No. 39, which was also the very first time MSU had finished in the top 50. Not only that, the Bulldogs had a chance to win every match and never lost by more than one goal. It capped off the best season by a first-year head coach in the program's history. His first season also produced the program's first All-American in standout goalkeeper Catalina Perez. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs also landed three players to the postseason All-SEC lists for the first time. Mallory Eubanks also became the program's highest player ever selected in the NWSL Draft, going 16th overall to the Washington Spirit. On the offensive side, MSU found the back of the net 32 times—the most in 16 seasons. Its 1.78 goals per game was also the fourth-most in school history. On defense, Anagnost led the Maroon and White to its second-lowest goals allowed total in school history (19, 1.00/game).

In the classroom, his dedication to academics paid off as the Bulldog soccer team shattered its previous team-best GPA with a 3.69 mark in the fall 2017 term. In addition, Eubanks also became the team's first-ever SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Anagnost has also shown a great ability to turn around soccer programs in just a short period of time, as he has showcased this talent in each of his head coaching stops. In his first head-coaching gig at Central Michigan, Anagnost's club earned a second place finish in the Mid-American Conference despite finishing 10th a season before he took over the reins. Anagnost followed up the runner-up showing with back-to-back MAC titles and a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances to cap his time with the Chipewas. At his next stop, Anagnost took Atlantic Coast Conference basement dweller Miami to back-to-back NCAA Tournament berths as he led the squad to the second round in his first season with the club in 2011.

Anagnost spent the prior two seasons as an assistant coach, first with the Michigan Wolverines in 2015 before joining NC State. In Raleigh, Anagnost aided the Wolfpack to a Sweet 16 appearance in his one season at NC State as the squad turned in a 11-9-2 record (4-5-1 ACC) in 2016.

With Michigan, the Wolverines posted a 12-7-2 record (6-3-2 Big Ten) and advanced to the second round of the conference tournament in 2015. Anagnost worked under head coach and former United States Women's National Team coach Greg Ryan. During his time with the Wolverines, Anagnost helped improve the team's NCAA Tournament resume and increased its RPI from the previous year. He played a major part in raising the quality and brand of soccer.

Prior to his assistant coaching jobs, Anagnost was the head coach of the University of Miami (Fla.) women's soccer program for two seasons from 2011-12. He led the Hurricanes to a combined 19-15-5 record on the pitch and two consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including the program's first trip to the NCAA second round in 2011. The Hurricanes also qualified for the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament in 2012, while earning two wins over top-10 teams for the first time in school history.

Before his time in Coral Gables, Fla., Anagnost was the head coach of the Central Michigan program from 2009-10 after earning the job as an interim head coach in 2008 following his successful stint as an assistant with the club in 2007. He guided teams to a combined 45-12-7 record in his three seasons with the

Chippewas and earned a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances. Anagnost was named the Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year in back-to-back seasons in 2008 and 2009. Inside the MAC, Anagnost's clubs turned in a 31-4-6 record in league play.

Anagnost has perfected the art of turning around a program in a short period as he's displayed that at his last two head coaching stops. With CMU, the Chippewas finished 10th overall in the MAC before Anagnost took over the helm as the squad finished 8-10-0 in 2007. Over his three-year span with the club, the Chippewas was finished with one runner-up and two first place finishes in the MAC as the club won an impressive 45 matches under Anagnost. At Miami, Anagnost led the Hurricane's to back-to-back NCAA Tournament berths and the program's first and only second round appearance. Since Anagnost's departure from Miami, the Hurricanes have not advanced to the postseason.

Anagnost has also spent five years in the classroom as a teacher and educator and has shown a major commitment to academics, increasing his team's GPA each year in charge. While with Miami, the Hurricanes improved in the classroom each season under Anagnost's guidance as the club posted the highest GPA in the ACC in 2011 and the best team GPA for Miami since 2000. At the helm with the Chippewas, Anagnost's teams earned two consecutive NSCAA Academic National Championships by posting the highest team GPA in the nation of all divisions and both genders.

Anagnost, a native of Saginaw, Mi., also boasts nine years at the high school level in his home state of Michigan, coaching the Bay City John Glenn program (1999-02), Saginaw Heritage (2000-02) and Flint Powers Catholic (2003-07). He was named Saginaw Valley League Coach of the Year at Saginaw Heritage in 2002 after leading his club to the SVL title, while also earning two more Coach of the Year honors with Flint Powers.

As a collegiate player, Anagnost was a three-time NCAA Division III All-American at Kalamazoo College (1992-95). He graduated with a bachelor's degree in political science with a minor in history in 1995 and later went on to earn a teaching certificate from Saginaw Valley State in 2003. In 2006, he was inducted into the Kalamazoo College Sports Hall of Fame for his contributions over his successful four-year career with the Hornets.

Upon graduating from Kalamazoo, Anagnost played professionally for the Chicago Power of the National Professional Soccer League in 1995 under famed United States and Greek National Team coach Alkis Panagoulas, before playing for the Michigan Bucks of the United States Indoor Soccer League in 1996.

Anagnost holds a Advanced National Coaching Diploma from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America and the United States Soccer Federation.

Matt Kagan, a former assistant of Tom Anagnost at the University of Miami (Fla.), joined the Bulldogs as an associate head coach prior to the 2017 season after spending the previous three seasons as an assistant with Loyola Marymount in Los Angeles.

"Matt is definitely one of the best recruiters in the country and one of the greatest people I've met in the game," Anagnost said. "He is a passionate coach who cares deeply about the team and all the players on it. I trust him in every way and I can't put into words how elated I am to be working with him again."

Kagan was announced to the MSU soccer coaching staff on Dec. 20, 2016. Kagan has served as an assistant coach for LMU (2014-16), Providence College (2013), Miami (2011-12), Evansville (2008-10) and Assumption College (2004). Kagan also has experience as a head coach with Division III Worcester State (2005-07).

"The people I met on my visit, along with the top-notch facilities, make Mississippi State a truly remarkable place," Kagan said. "The opportunity to work with Tom Anagnost and Jason Hamilton again was something I couldn't pass up. I can't wait to get started as we build something very special at MSU."

Under Kagan's guidance in 2017, the Bulldogs reached new heights offensively. Prior to his arrival, State scored just 34 goals combined in the 2015 and 2016 seasons. In 2017, the Bulldogs netted 32 goals—its highest total in 16 seasons. MSU's 1.78 goals per game was also the best since 2001 and was fourth-best in program history. State also had more shots on goal than in recent years, being on target 119 times in 2017—the most since 2013.

Under his tutelage, Mallory Eubanks earned her second-straight All-SEC honor as a midfielder and became the highest Bulldog ever selected in the National Women's Soccer League Draft—being taken 16th overall by the Washington Spirit.

While with LMU, Kagan aided the squad to a NCAA Sweet 16 appearance in 2015, after the club turned in an impressive 15-6-1 record. All three seasons with the Lions were winning seasons as Kagan and LMU earned 35 wins during his tenure. Additionally, Kagan landed the No. 37 ranked recruiting class with the Lions in 2015.

Before his time with LMU, Kagan served as an assistant coach on the Providence College women's soccer coaching staff during the 2013 season. He took over interim head coaching duties in January of 2014 until accepting the position with LMU. While with Providence, Kagan turned the 20th ranked recruiting class in the nation, his third Top 20 as a coach, to boost his recruiting resume. Kagan also oversaw the academics for a Friars' club that earned a 2013 NSCAA Team Academic Award with a GPA of 3.25.

In Coral Gables, Kagan spent two seasons with the Hurricanes from 2011-12 where he helped the Anagnost coached club to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances. In addition, Kagan aided Miami to its first and only second round berth in the NCAA Tournament in 2011. His focused recruiting led to a

pair of Top 20 ranked recruiting class as well while with the Hurricanes.

Prior to his time with Miami, Kagan spent three seasons serving as an assistant coach for the University of Evansville women's soccer program. Already earning an reputation for his recruiting, Kagan landed Canadian National Team Captain Vanessa Legault-Cordisco to the Purple Aces in 2010. Legault-Cordisco was the first national team player to sign with Evansville. The Purple Aces made one NCAA Tournament appearance in 2008 after the club won the Missouri Valley Conference. Kagan and the rest of the Evansville coaching staff were named the MVC Coaching Staff of the Year in 2008.

Kagan directed Worcester State to three-consecutive Division III NCAA Tournament appearances as a head coach. With the Lancers, Kagan compiled a 45-15-3 mark from 2005 through 2007. In his final season with Worcester State, Kagan led the Lancers to a NCAA Sweet 16 berth and a national ranking of No. 21 in the NSCAA poll to cap the 2007 campaign. During his tenure at Worcester State, Kagan also helped develop 19 all-conference players, including a 2007 D3Kicks.com All-American. Kagan was named the 2005 Massachusetts State College Athletic Conference (MASCAC) Coach of the Year.

As a player, Kagan played at Southern New Hampshire University where his team advanced to the NCAA Tournament Division II Championship game and he was named to the Final Four All-Tournament Team in 2002. He received a Bachelor of Science in sports management from SNHU in 2003, before earning a Master of Business Administration from his alma mater in 2007.

Kagan holds an Advanced National Coaching Diploma from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America.

Hailing from Newington, Conn., Kagan was born on Oct. 30, 1981, and is married to wife Jessica Kagan who is a native of Las Vegas, Nev.





JOSH RIFE



Assistant Coach First Season at MSU | Indiana '01

Josh Rife joined the Mississippi State family in July 2018. With a decade of coaching experience to go along with his 11-year playing career, Rife brings a wealth of knowledge to the Bulldog staff. The Honolulu, Hawaii, native earned his Premier Diploma from the United Soccer Coaches Association in 2018.

Rife was previously at Liberty University in Lynchburg, Va., where he served as the Flames' assistant coach for two seasons (2016-17), before being promoted to the associate head coach role in March 2018. During his time with LU, he helped lead the Flames to back-to-back Big South Tournament semifinals, including a league title in 2016. The 2016 Flames also reached the NCAA Tournament for the second time in three seasons.

Prior to his stop at LU, he served as an assistant coach for the Pittsburgh Riverhounds of the United Soccer League (USL). In 2015, the Riverhounds closed out the year tied for second in the league with 53 goals. Rife was also the head coach for the organization's U-23 developmental squad.

Prior to his time with the Riverhounds, Rife was the head coach for the Rochester Lancers (2013-14) of the Major Indoor Soccer League (MISL), becoming the youngest head coach in league history. During his year-long stint, Rife handled the daily operations of the team and was in charge of overseeing the organization's camps and clinics.

In 2008, Rife was hired as an assistant men's soccer coach at NCAA Division II member Palm Beach Atlantic, where he helped guide the Sailfish to an NCCAA National Championship in 2010.

An accomplished soccer player on the professional indoor and outdoor circuit, Rife signed with the Philadelphia KiXX of the MISL on Nov. 4, 2005, and went on to be named to the 2006 All-MISL Rookie Team. On Oct. 19, 2006, the KiXX traded Rife to the Detroit Ignition of the Xtreme Soccer League (XSL). While with the Ignition, Rife was named the XSL Defensive Player of the Year. He led the XSL with 31 shot blocks as Detroit won the league championship.

After his time in the Motor City, Rife played professional indoor soccer with the Milwaukee Wave in the MISL. During the 2009-10 season, he was named second team All-MISL and MISL Defensive Player of Month in January and March. Rife led the MISL with 36 blocked shots and played all 20 games, scoring 11 goals and tallying 28 points.

Rife began his professional playing career in 2003 with the Charlotte Eagles of the USL Professional Division, where he also played alongside Gomez. Rife was instrumental in guiding the team to a USL2 Championship in 2005 and was voted USL2 Defender of the Year in 2006.

Following a 10-year run with the Eagles, Rife played 26 games with the USL's VSI Tampa Bay FC in 2013. After a year in which the team captain earned second team All-USL PRO honors, Rife retired from professional indoor and outdoor soccer.

In eight professional indoor seasons, he played in five finals.

Rife spent the first two years of his collegiate career at TCU (1998-99) before transferring to Indiana. Rife started 46 matches with the Hoosiers, becoming a two-time All-Big Ten Selection (2000-01) while earning first team NSCAA All-Region honors in 2001. Rife helped the team to two College Cups, a Big Ten Tournament championship in 2001 and the 2000 Big Ten regular-season championship.

Rife grew up in Denton, Texas, and attended Denton High School, where he was a four-year varsity starter. He played club soccer for the Texas Longhorns, a Dallas-based soccer club, from the age of nine until he was 18. At the age of 11, he toured Norway, Sweden and Denmark with a Venezuelan youth team and played in a series of tournaments where he garnered local and national attention.

Rife comes to Starkville with his wife, Christy, and two daughters, Maddison and Kilee. A former member of the Charlotte Lady Eagles and a 2008 UNC Wilmington Hall of Fame Inductee, Christy also served as an assistant at Gardner-Webb.



JEREMY SULLIVAN



Volunteer Assistant Coach
First Season at MSU | Jacksonville State '05

Jeremy Sullivan joined the Bulldog family in 2018 after spending 11 seasons at Austin Peay as an assistant and, later, associate head coach. With the Governors, he coached goalkeepers and coordinated recruiting. He will continue working with goalkeepers at MSU.

In 2010, the Governors advanced to the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament championship game after leading the league in goals against average (.687), which ranked No. 23 in the nation, and shutout percentage (.591), which was eighth in the country. Austin Peay set a single-season program record with 13 shutouts.

While at Austin Peay, Sullivan played a large role in recruiting the 2010 class that produced the program's first OVC Freshman of the Year and Offensive Player of the Year, Tatiana Ariza. Her sister, Natalia, was also a three-time first team All-OVC selection and the pair played together for the Colombian national team at the 2012 London Olympics.

Sullivan got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Belmont University in 2005 where he coached the Bruins' goalkeepers. In his two years with the program he also worked as head coach of the Brentwood Eclipse U-13 club team while earning his master's degree in education.

He played collegiately at Wallace State Community College in Hanceville, Ala., where the Lions finished ranked No. 15 in the nation his sophomore year. Sullivan then transferred to Jacksonville State and completed his degree in recreation administration. As an undergraduate, he served as a student assistant coach for three years with the Gamecocks and was the head coach at the Donoho School.

Sullivan holds an Advanced National Diploma from the United Soccer Coaches Association and a Class B license from the USSF. He comes to Starkville along with his wife, Jessica, and their two daughters Lyla and Remi.

Coordinator of Soccer Operations
First Season at MSU | Toledo '15

In preparation for the 2018 season, second-year head coach Tom Anagnost named Geri Siudzinski as coordinator of soccer operations for the Mississippi State soccer program in January.

Siudzinski comes to Starkville after spending two seasons as a graduate assistant coach at NCAA Division II Ashland University in Ashland, Ohio. At AU, she became well-versed in recruiting prospective student-athletes and selling the unique features and benefits of the school's program and institution. In her two seasons, the Eagles compiled a 22-8-6 record and finished second in their league both years.

"We are very excited to add Geri to our soccer family," Anagnost said. "She is a great person, has very good leadership skills and is a role model for our student-athletes. She is hard-working and a go-getter, which is what we want from everyone in our program."

Aside from her work at Ashland, Siudzinski played a vital role in Ohio's club soccer scene. She served as a coach for Internationals Soccer Club in Medina from June 2017-January 2018 and coached Sylvania's Pacesetter Soccer Club from May 2014-June 2016. With both clubs, she generated, designed and implemented training sessions for each specific team while leading training sessions geared toward development and excellence of technique on the ball. Siudzinski also traveled, planned and coached specific teams throughout the season.

She also gained experience as an assistant in the Ohio North Olympic Development program from November 2016-January 2018, where she created and ran training sessions for all different age groups. Siudzinski was also an assistant for two years at the Toledo Football Academy.

Siudzinski currently holds a United States Soccer Federation "D" License

Prior to starting her coaching career, the Perrysburg, Ohio, native was a standout at the University of Toledo, where she served as one of the team's captains and recorded six assists in 21 games as a senior in 2015. In 80 career matches with the Rockets, she netted five goals and added 12 assists.

Siudzinski was also a standout in the classroom at Toledo, earning Ohio Collegiate Soccer Association Academy All-Ohio Team and Mid-American Conference Academic Honor Roll accolades in addition to spending four semesters on the Dean's List. She graduated in May 2016 from UT with a bachelor of science in Public Health and will complete her master's degree from Ashland in May 2018.

"I'm extremely thankful and grateful for the opportunity to be here at Mississippi State," Siudzinski said. "Everything here from the coaching staff to the amazing facilities can make this a championship program. I look forward to learning as much as I can from Tom, Matt and Jeremy. Their experiences and success rates at programs across the country speak volumes to their ability to win and help each student-athlete grow as a player and as a person. I'm excited to get going with the team! Hail State!"

Heading into the season, the Bulldogs were not at a shortage of senior leadership with 10 seniors on the roster. State also welcomed 12 newcomers, including a transfer goalkeeper from the University of Miami in Catalina Perez. With Perez came a player with invaluable international experience, as she represented her native Colombia in the 2015 FIFA World Cup and in the 2016 Summer Olympics.

The 2017 edition of MSU Soccer began with a hot start, as the Anagnost-led Bulldogs won six of their first seven matches with a draw against South Alabama on Sept. 10. MSU fans gave a warm welcome to the new State head coach by setting a program-record crowd of 1,349 to see the Bulldogs blank Stephen F. Austin 1-0.

Weather interrupted a pair of Bulldog matches, with meetings against Houston (Sept. 1) and South Florida (Sept. 7) being cancelled due to travel issues resulting from Hurricanes Harvey and Irma, respectively. State managed to schedule other opponents to make up for the lost outings, defeating Southeast Missouri State 3-1 on Sept. 8 and Mountain West regular season champion San José State 1-0 on Nov. 4.

In its pre-Southeastern Conference slate, the Bulldogs won its lone road contest—a 1-0 decision at Louisiana Tech. Going into league play, the Maroon and White embarked on its best start since 2012 and Anagnost had the best start by a first-year head coach in program history at 6-0-1.

State opened league play with a tough road test in Fayetteville against the Arkansas Razorbacks. The Bulldog defense held tough to the very end, but a late goal sent the Razorbacks past the Bulldogs 1-0.

Just under a week later in MSU's SEC home opener against Missouri, MaKayla Waldner had arguably her best performance of her young Bulldog career. The Dexter, Mo., native attempted a league-high 12 shots, with five on-target. Two of those shots managed to reach the back of the net as she led MSU to a 3-1 victory at the MSU Soccer Field.

The next two conference matches resulted in draws, with Waldner once again coming up in the clutch, scoring an 87th-minute header to tie LSU 2-2. Then, State's match against Auburn resulted in a scoreless draw.

October was a difficult month for the Bulldogs, as they dropped four of six, including a pair of overtime decisions. It began with a hard-fought 3-2 OT loss at No. 3 South Carolina and then a 1-0 loss at home to Kentucky. State then once again found itself in an overtime outing, but dropped a 3-2 decision at Alabama.

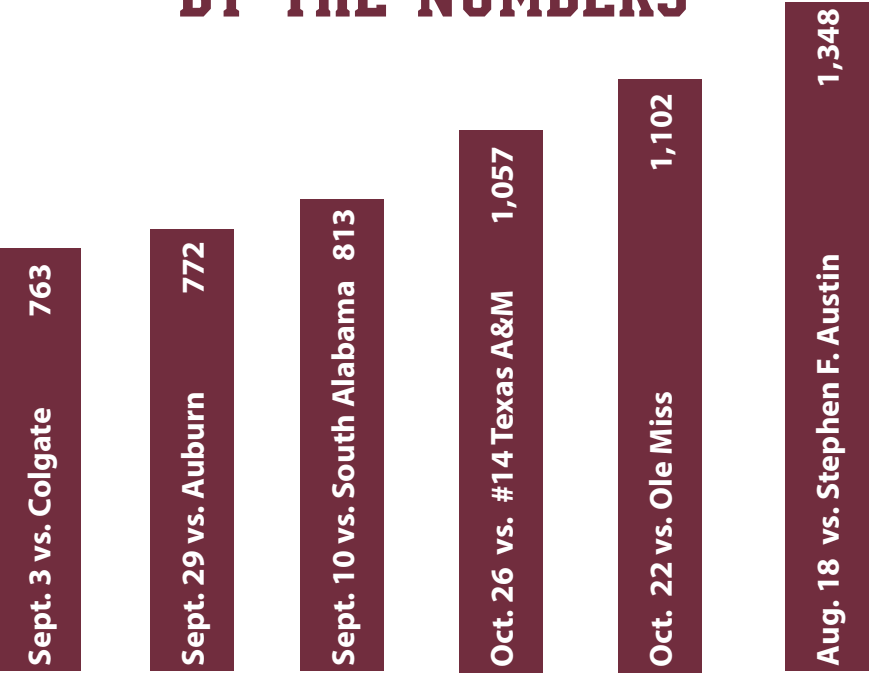
2017 SEASON REVIEW

MSU then moved back into the win column with a dominant showing on the road at Georgia. This time, it was junior Brooke McKee who stole the show. The Madison, Ala., product netted a pair of scores in addition to a Waldner goal to send State past UGA, 3-0. The following Sunday, in the annual battle for the Magnolia Cup against in-state rival Ole Miss, State took the Rebels to the wire en route to a 1-1 draw. McKee scored MSU's lone goal while All-American Catalina Perez hauled in six saves as both players earned SEC Player of the Week honors the following day.

After dropping a 2-1 decision in the SEC finale to Texas A&M that kept them out of the SEC Tournament, State had one last shot at the NCAA Tournament with a makeup game scheduled for Nov. 4 against San Jose State. There, MSU took a 1-0 victory against the visiting Spartans.

The Bulldogs ended the season tied for 10th in the conference, their best finish since 2011. State's 9-5-4 mark was also its best since 2001. Waldner led MSU in goals (9), shots (56), shots on goal (23) and game-winning goals (5), while McKee led State in points (20). Mallory Eubanks, who would be drafted in the second round by the Washington Spirit in January, led State in assists (6) and corner kicks (77). The All-American Perez led State in saves with 68.

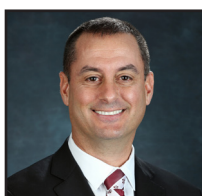

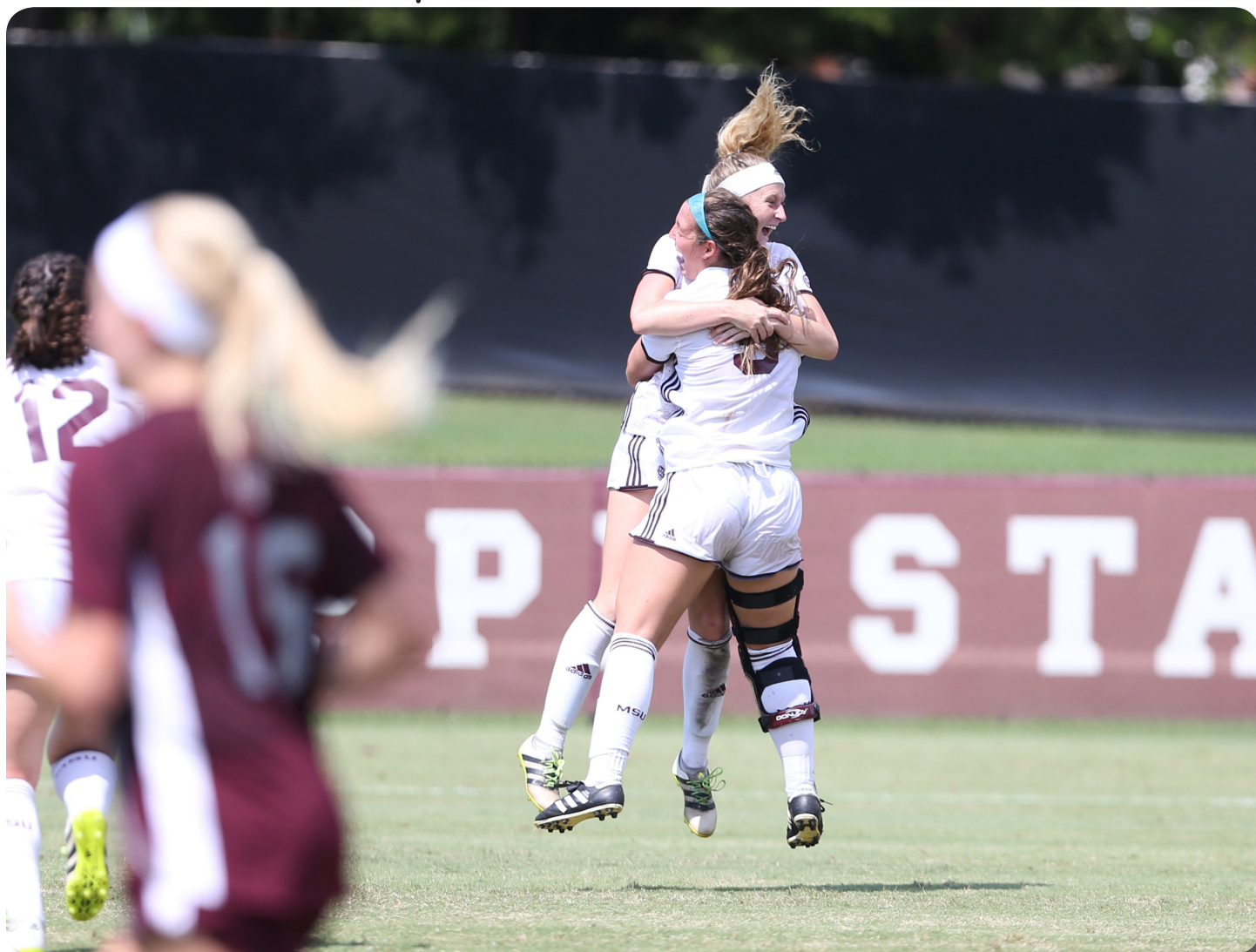

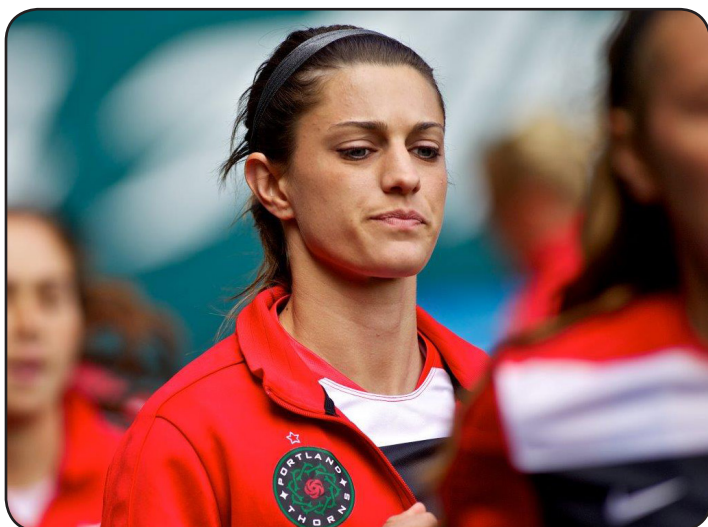

The University

Mississippi State is a comprehensive doctoral-degree-granting institution offering a diverse student body a wide range of opportunities and challenges for learning and growth.

The largest university in the Magnolia State, MSU has a statewide enrollment of more than 21,000 students and is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges to award baccalaureate, masters, specialists and doctorate degrees.

Established in 1878 as the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Mississippi, the university has traditional strengths in engineering and scientific agriculture but has evolved into a comprehensive institution with a diverse array of programs in teaching, research and service.

The University began as The Agricultural and Mechanical College of the State of Mississippi, one of the national Land-Grant Colleges established after Congress had passed the Morrill Act in 1862. It was created by the Mississippi Legislature on February 28, 1878, to fulfill the mission of offering training in "agriculture, horticulture and the mechanical arts . . . without excluding other scientific and classical studies, including military tactics."

The College received its first students in the fall of 1880 in the presidency of Confederate General Stephen D. Lee. In 1887 Congress passed the Hatch Act, which provided for the establishment of the Agricultural Experiment Station in 1888. Two other pieces of federal legislation provided funds for extending the mission of the College: in 1914, the Smith-Lever Act called for "instruction in practical agriculture and home economics to persons not attendant or resident," thus creating the state-wide effort which led to Extension offices in every county in the State; and, in 1917, the Smith-Hughes Act provided for the training of teachers in vocational education.

By 1932, when the Legislature renamed the College as Mississippi State College, it consisted of the Agricultural Experiment Station (1887), the College of Engineering (1902), the College of Agriculture (1903), the School of Industrial Pedagogy (1909), the School of General Science (1911), the College of Business and Industry (1915), the Mississippi Agricultural Extension Service (1915), and the Division of Continuing Education, (1919). Further, in 1926 the College had received its first accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

By 1958, when the Legislature again renamed the College, as Mississippi State University, the Office of Graduate Studies had been organized (1936), doctoral degree programs had begun (1951), the School of Forest Resources had been established (1954), and the College of Arts and Sciences had been created (1956).

The College of Architecture admitted its first students in 1973. The College of Veterinary Medicine admitted its first class in 1977, and the School of Accountancy was established in 1979.



Academics & Student Life



Mississippi State students consistently earn honors such as the prestigious Harry S. Truman Scholarship, awarded for those who will enter public service, and, with 16 Truman Scholars to date, the university has been recognized as one of 38 Truman Honor Institution.

Recently initiated programs are providing opportunities to develop leadership potential and global study options.

The university's Global Leadership Continuum provides "cradle-to-CEO" programming designed to develop leadership across a "global" spectrum that begins with high school and continues through the university experience and into professional life. Included are the Young Guns Leadership Camp for rising high school seniors; the Day One Leadership Community for incoming freshmen, focusing on shared academic and service experiences; and the highly competitive Appalachian Leadership Honors Program for sophomores and juniors.

To complement these efforts, the university has launched a minor in leadership studies open to students in all majors. A university honor code adopted in 2007 institutionalizes a campus culture of integrity and personal responsibility in academic studies. Through the Global Leadership Program, students may experience significantly expanded study abroad opportunities.

The Bulldogs

Mississippi State University's athletic teams are called Bulldogs, a name earned and maintained over the decades by the tough, tenacious play of student-athletes wearing the Maroon and White. The official school mascot is an American Kennel Club-registered English Bulldog, given the inherited title of 'Bully.'

As with most universities, Mississippi State University teams answered to different nicknames through the years. The first squads representing Mississippi A&M College were proud to be called Aggies. When the school officially became Mississippi State College in 1932, the nickname Maroons, for MSU's uniform color, gained prominence. Bulldogs became the official title for State teams in 1961, not long after State College was granted university status.

Yet references to school teams and athletes as Bulldogs actually go back to early in the century, and this nickname was used almost interchangeably with both Aggies and Maroons, since at least 1905.

On November 30 of that year, the A&M football team shut out their arch-rivals from the University of Mississippi 11-0 in Jackson, Miss. The campus newspaper, *The Reflector*, reported: "After the game, filled with that emotion that accompanies every great victory, there was nothing left for the cadets to do but to complete the great victory by showing sympathy for the dead athletic spirit of the University, by having a military funeral parade.

"A coffin was secured, decorated with University colors and a bulldog pup placed on top. It was then placed on the shoulders of a dozen cadets, and the procession started down Capitol Street, preceded by the brass band playing a very pathetic funeral march."

Other newspaper reports of the victory commented on the 'bulldog' style of play by the A&M eleven, and the Bulldog was soon publicly accepted as a school athletic symbol. Accounts of a 1926 pep rally in Meridian, Miss., had another bulldog parading with students.



Bully XXI, "Jak"

At Super Bulldog Weekend 2015 this past April, the Bulldog family celebrated the passing of the harness, as Bully XXI, known as "Jak," accepted mascot duties from his father Bully XX, fondly called "Champ."

Jak's formal name is "Cristil's Golden Prince," and the American Kennel Club-registered English Bulldog was born in October 2014, soon after the legendary Jack Cristil passed away. Naming the newest Bully for the legendary Voice of the Bulldogs who called football and basketball games for 58 years was a fitting choice.

While Jak enters the 2015 season less than a year old, Champ turns 10 around the 2015 season opener. When mascot handlers realized Bully was getting toward retiring age, though he's still in good health, a female bulldog was selected based on her pedigree and history. Following the female's selection, litter of mascot-sired puppies were evaluated.

Jak's responsibilities will be similar to those of previous mascots, she said



Official Mascot In 1935

Use as an official game mascot began in 1935 when coach Major Ralph Sasse, on 'orders' from his team, went to Memphis, Tenn., to select a bulldog. Ptolemy, a gift of the Edgar Webster family, was chosen and the Bulldogs promptly defeated Alabama 20-7.

A litter-mate of Ptolemy became the first mascot called 'Bully' shortly after Sasse's team beat mighty Army 13-7 at West Point that same year - perhaps the greatest victory in MSU football history. But Bully I earned other fame the hard way, in 1939 when a campus bus cut short his career.

Days of campus mourning followed, as Bully lay in state in a glass coffin. A half-mile funeral procession accompanied by the Famous Maroon Band and three ROTC battalions went to Scott Field where Bully was buried under the bench at the 50-yard line. Even *Life* magazine covered the event. Other Bullies have since been buried by campus dorms, fraternity houses, and also at the football stadium.

For years Bully was a target for kidnappers, the last incident occurring prior to the 1974 State-Ole Miss game. The Bulldog team won anyway, 31-13. While early Bullies once roamed campus freely or lived in fraternities, today the official university mascot is housed at the School of Veterinary Medicine when not on duty at State home football games. For all their fierce appearance and reputation, today's mascot bulldogs are good-natured, friendly animals and favorites with children.

A student wearing a Bulldog suit, also answering to Bully, is part of the MSU cheerleading team and assists in stirring up State spirit at games and pep rallies

The Cowbell

The most unique and certainly the most resounding symbol of Mississippi State University tradition is the cowbell. Despite decades of attempts by opponents and authorities to banish it from scenes of competition, diehard State fans still celebrate Bulldog victories loudly and proudly with the distinctive sound of ringing cowbells.

The precise origin of the cowbell as a fixture of Mississippi State sports tradition remains unclear to this day. The best records have cowbells gradually introduced to the MSU sports scene in the late 1930s and early 1940s, coinciding with the 'golden age' of Mississippi State football success prior to World War II.

The most popular legend is that during a home football game between State and archrival Ole Miss, a jersey cow wandered onto the playing field. Mississippi State soundly whipped the Rebels that Saturday, and State College students immediately adopted the cow as a good luck charm.

Students are said to have continued bringing a cow to football games for a while, until the practice was eventually discontinued in favor of bringing just the cow's bell.

Whatever the origin, it is certain by the 1950s cowbells were common at MSU games, and by the 1960s were established as the special symbol of MSU. Ironically, the cowbell's popularity grew most rapidly during the long years when State football teams were rarely successful. Flaunting this anachronism from the 'aggie' days was a proud response by students and alumni to outsider scorn of the university's 'cow college' history.

In the 1960s two MSU professors, Earl W. Terrell and Ralph L. Reeves, obliged some students by welding handles on the bells so they could be rung with more convenience and authority. By 1963 the demand for these long-handled cowbells could not be filled by home workshops alone. So, at the suggestion of Reeves, the Student Association bought bells in bulk and the Industrial Education Club agreed to weld on handles. In 1964, the MSU Bookstore began marketing these cowbells with a portion of profits returning to these student organizations.

Today many styles of cowbells are available on campus and around Starkville, with the top-of-the-line being a heavy chrome-plated model with a full Bulldog figurine handle. But experts insist the best and loudest results are produced by a classic long-handled, bicycle-grip bell made of thinner and tightly-welded shells.

Cowbells decorate offices and homes of Mississippi State alumni, and are passed down through generations of Bulldog fans. But they were not heard at Southeastern Conference games - not legally, at least - since the 1974 adoption of a conference rule against 'artificial noisemakers' at football and basketball games. On a 9-1 vote, SEC schools ruled cowbells a disruption and banned them. The ban was lifted prior to the 2010 season. The ban did little harm to the cowbell's popularity, or to prevent cowbells from being heard outside stadiums in which the Bulldogs are playing.

They are now heard at non-conference football contests, as well as other sporting events on campus.



Maroon & White

Maroon and White are the distinctive colors of Mississippi State University athletic teams, dating back over a century to the very first football game ever played by the school's student-athletes.

On November 15, 1895, the first Mississippi A&M football team was preparing for a road trip to Jackson, Tenn., to play Southern Baptist University (now called Union University) the following day. Since every college was supposed to have its own uniform colors, the A&M student body requested that the school's team select a suitable combination.

Considering this choice to be an honor, the inaugural State team gave the privilege to team captain W.M. Matthews. Accounts report that, without hesitation, Matthews chose Maroon and White.

Dr. Mark E. Keenum

University President (January 2009-present)



Dr. Mark Everett Keenum became Mississippi State's 19th president Jan. 5, 2009, following a distinguished public service career.

Now in his 10th year of tenure, Dr. Keenum has guided Mississippi State to unprecedented heights. The university has experienced record enrollment growth to nearly 22,000 students, and a new all-time record is expected this fall when final enrollment numbers are announced. Mississippi State has awarded more than 4,000 degrees at all levels for seven straight years, and the university is ranked by SmartAsset as the state's Best Value College with graduates earning an

impressive average starting salary of \$47,900 – the highest in the state. The Chronicle of Higher Education recently designated Mississippi State as a "Great College To Work For" after receiving top ratings from employees on workforce practices and policies.

The campus has expanded and improved on Dr. Keenum's watch. Mississippi State has completed or initiated capital improvements totaling more than \$1 billion since 2009. Chief among those projects has been The Mill at MSU – a \$40-million, state-of-the-art conference and meeting complex. The Old Main Academic Center, a new \$41-million classroom building and multi-level parking garage, opened in August 2017. A \$60-million project featuring two new residence halls and Nusz Hall, which houses the G.V. "Sonny" Montgomery Center for America's Veterans, opened the previous fall. A \$10-million, fourth-floor expansion of Mitchell Memorial Library to house the Ulysses S. Grant Presidential Library and the Frank and Virginia Williams Collection of Lincolniana celebrated its official opening in November 2017. In March 2018, the university and its partner, Memphis-based EdR Collegiate Housing, broke ground on the innovative \$67-million College View development. The first-of-its-kind project for any Mississippi university combines student housing with a mix of retail, commercial, and restaurant space.

A \$55-million expansion and renovation of Dudy Noble Field/Polk-Dement Stadium – home to one of the most storied college baseball programs in America – is also nearing completion for the 2019 season. The first phase of the project added the largest video board in the nation to the "Carnegie Hall of College Baseball." The second phase includes the Left Field Lofts and Rooftop Club that will provide fans with unforgettable game day memories. This major investment will significantly enhance the Dudy Noble fan experience – already described by many as one of the most unique in college sports today.

New construction projects launching over the next two years include a new Science and Engineering Complex, Music Building, and the completion of an Animal and Dairy Science/Poultry Science Complex for the Division of Agriculture, Forestry and Veterinary Medicine. Additionally, the university is developing a comprehensive plan to build additional teaching and research lab space to meet growing demand, and investing in campus infrastructure, including new parking facilities, roadways, and technology. Fundraising has reached all-time record levels in recent years. MSU's current Infinite Impact capital campaign reached its initial goal three years ahead of schedule. Due to that unprecedented success, the university announced a new goal – \$1 billion by 2020 – the largest campaign goal ever for an educational institution in Mississippi. During his tenure, Dr. Keenum has been instrumental in expanding the MSU Promise Program, which provides need-based scholarship assistance to Mississippi students whose families have limited financial means.

Dr. Keenum is immediate past president of the Southeastern Conference. During his two-year term, he led the SEC Executive Committee, and he continues to serve on the SEC's Content Committee Board of Directors that oversees the highly successful ESPN-SEC Network. He also represents the SEC as a member of the College Football Playoff's (CFP) Board of Managers.

In 2018, he was elected to serve a six-year term on the Board of Trustees of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History, which is the second-oldest state department of archives and history in the country. A comprehensive historical agency founded in 1902, MDAH collects, preserves, and provides access to the archival resources of the state; administers museums and historic sites, including the new Museum of Mississippi History and the Mississippi Civil Rights Museum; and oversees statewide programs for historic preservation, government records management, and publications.

Dr. Keenum travels frequently to Washington, D.C., meeting with

Congressional leaders and federal agency heads to pursue research opportunities and broaden the university's influence on the national level. He has also worked closely with state leaders in Jackson in support of higher education in Mississippi.

Mississippi State plays an integral role in economic development locally, statewide, and across the region. Its impact is further felt nationally and internationally through unique collaborative partnerships with peer institutions, business and industry, government agencies, and leading non-governmental organizations. Dr. Keenum leads these efforts because he understands the positive impact the nation's major research universities can have in the diverse communities they serve. Mississippi State is ranked by the National Science Foundation as a "Top 100" research institution, and its annual research and development expenditures have exceeded \$239 million. Most recently, MSU R&D expenditures accounted for more than half of all expenditures in the state. This research activity is playing an ever-increasing role in the state's overall economic development efforts.

A graduate of Mississippi State with degrees in agricultural economics, Dr. Keenum's interest in international food security has strengthened the university's contributions to global economic sustainability. In 2014, he was appointed to the Board of Directors of the Foundation for Food and Agricultural Research by U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Thomas J. Vilsack and now serves as chairman. That same year along with other university presidents, he signed the Presidents' Commitment to Food and Nutrition Security at the United Nations in New York City. This marks the first time universities around the world began to share a collective focus on ending food insecurity.

Dr. Keenum's passion for international engagement and transformative research and service has positioned Mississippi State as a leader in addressing global food security and poverty, among other critical issues. In 2014 and again in 2016, he was invited to address the United Nations in New York about the crucial roles public research universities play as the global community works to address critical challenges for a growing population.

In 2018, President Donald J. Trump appointed Dr. Keenum chairman of the Board for International Food and Agricultural Development (BIFAD). BIFAD was created in 1975 under Title XII (Famine Prevention and Freedom from Hunger) of the Foreign Assistance Act. Its mission is to draw on higher education's scientific knowledge and expertise in global food security and world hunger to advise U.S. international assistance efforts.

Dr. Keenum began his career at MSU as a faculty member with the Extension Service and the Department of Agricultural Economics. He went on to serve as chief of staff to U.S. Senator Thad Cochran in Washington, D.C. and was Under Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture prior to returning home to Mississippi State.

A graduate of Corinth High School, Dr. Keenum earned an Associate in Arts degree from Northeast Mississippi Community College in Booneville and was a member of the Northeast Tigers football team. He is married to the former Rhonda Newman of Booneville, also an MSU graduate. They have four children: Rett, Mary Phillips, Katie and Torie.

When John Cohen was named Mississippi State University's 17th director of athletics on November 4, 2016, he wasted little time putting his stamp on the department. Since that time, the former MSU head baseball coach and two-time Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year has overseen the hiring of seven coaches, while 21 teams have advanced to postseason.

During Cohen's short tenure as director of athletics, the athletic department has enjoyed historic success. A record 12 MSU teams advanced to the postseason during the 2017-18 campaign, with seven sports concluding play in the Top

25 and four reaching the Top 10. Under Cohen's watch, State was the only school in the nation who won a bowl game and reached an NCAA Final Four – men's or women's – and the College World Series.

MSU claimed multiple SEC championships in a single athletic year for the first time since 1996. Matt Roberts, the SEC Coach of the Year, guided the men's tennis team to its first SEC Tournament championship since 1996. Vic Schaefer, the 2018 National Coach of the Year, led the women's basketball program to its first SEC regular season title with a perfect 30-0 regular season and a second-straight NCAA national championship game appearance.

Baseball completed one of the most remarkable turnarounds in SEC history, reaching its 10th College World Series and finishing third nationally. The Diamond Dawgs were ranked as high as No. 4 nationally in the final polls, representing the third-highest finish in program history. Meanwhile, the men's track and field program tallied its highest NCAA Outdoor Championships point total since 1982 to claim 10th.

As a result of the Bulldogs' unprecedented athletic success, CBS Sports named MSU the 14th-best athletics program in the country and fourth overall in the SEC for 2017-18. MSU also placed 42nd among the nation's Division I schools in the final Learfield Director's Cup standings, eclipsing the department's previous best of 44th in 2015-16. The top three Director's Cup finishes in school history have occurred in the last three years.

Success carried into the classroom as Bulldog student-athletes generated a school-record 3.08 cumulative GPA for the combined 2017-18 fall and spring semesters. After already producing a school-record fall GPA of 3.15, MSU student-athletes followed that up with a spring GPA of 3.01, the highest spring GPA on record.

"It was a memorable year to be a Bulldog," Cohen said. "I am very proud of our teams, coaches and student-athletes for their collective efforts in setting the highest of standards not only in their sports but also in the classroom and community."

Since becoming Athletic Director, Cohen has been the driving force for numerous state-of-the-art facility projects on campus, including the new \$55 million Dudy Noble Field, which opens in full capacity in the spring of 2019. The project has drawn rave reviews and will feature the Left Field Lofts, a revolutionary college baseball experience with luxury two-bedroom suites offering exquisite views of the new ballpark.

Cohen approved construction of a new \$3.6 million football gameday home locker room and recruiting center inside the north end of Davis Wade Stadium. The 11,100 square-foot locker room, which opens in September 2018, includes custom-built player lockers, separate coaches and staff locker rooms, an expansive athletic training room as well as an equipment room.

In addition, the Templeton Athletic Academic Center underwent a renovation in the summer of 2018 with modern wall graphics and displays.

Cohen has been instrumental in enhancing the gameday experience for Bulldog fans. In the summer of 2018, MSU announced significant price decreases on all food and beverage at concessions for all home venues beginning with the 2018-19 athletic year. State also unveiled a football season ticket price reduction in several sections of Davis Wade Stadium. New LED videoboard displays were installed at the MSU Soccer Field and Newell-Grissom Building in the spring of 2018.

Cohen, who spent more than two decades coaching college baseball,

was named MSU's head baseball coach in July of 2008. Nine years later, Cohen's official role in administration began when he assumed the role of associate athletic director in addition to head baseball coach. The following November, he took charge of an athletic department that has since achieved new heights in athletic, academic, facility, and fundraising achievement.

Success shouldn't come as a surprise as it was never far removed from him during his 12-year run as a head coach in the SEC. His teams have been successful both on the field and in the classroom.

At MSU, he led the Bulldogs to a College World Series finals appearance, an SEC regular season championship and an SEC Tournament championship. In the classroom upon his arrival in 2009, 133 players were selected to the SEC Academic Honor Roll, including three straight SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year winners from 2013-15.

"I'm fortunate to know our MSU coaches as friends and colleagues, and to know many of our athletes in all sports," Cohen said. "While baseball has been a huge part of my life, my passion for seeing MSU athletics thrive extends to all sports. I'm grateful to Dr. Keenum and the MSU Family for allowing me to embrace these new opportunities and responsibilities."

As a baseball player at MSU, Cohen was a key player on the Bulldogs' 1989 SEC championship team and 1990 College World Series team. He graduated from MSU with a degree in English in 1990 and received a master's degree in sports management from the University of Missouri in 1994.

Following a six-year stint with Missouri as a graduate assistant and assistant coach, Cohen was the head coach at Northwestern State University from 1998-2001. Cohen spent two seasons as an assistant baseball coach at the University of Florida before becoming the head coach at the University of Kentucky in 2004, a position he held for five seasons before returning to his alma mater.

While winning 284 games as a head coach at MSU, Cohen demonstrated a keen ability to develop players and coaches. During his tenure, 138 MSU baseball players were selected in the Major League Baseball Draft. Nine of his former Bulldogs have reached the Major Leagues, including Dakota Hudson (Cardinals) in July 2018. His influence can be seen throughout the SEC as four of his former assistants are now or have been head coaches — Brad Bohannon (Alabama), Gary Henderson (Kentucky/Mississippi State), Nick Mingione (Kentucky) and Butch Thompson (Auburn).

Cohen is the only coach in SEC history to win an SEC championship, SEC tournament championship, and advance to the College World Series both as a player and head coach. His 2013 Bulldog club advanced to the CWS championship series for the first time in MSU history. Cohen also had the privilege of being a part of a College World Series as a player, head coach and now athletic director when the Diamond Dawgs reached Omaha in June 2018. His 2012 club produced an SEC record-tying eight Major Leaguers.

Cohen and his wife, Nelle, are active members of the Starkville community. The couple has two children, Jordan and Avery.
