# BOB HARTLEY MEMORIAL FELLOWSHIP Providing Internship Opportunities to Young SIDs

For more than a half century Robert M. "Bob" Hartley dedicated his life's work to promoting Mississippi State athletics. From his hiring as the school's first publicity director in August 1946 to his initial "retirement" as assistant athletic director for communications in June 1985, through his later years as an invaluable consultant for the Mississippi State Department of Athletics, the man we called "Hart" gave special meaning to the words "loyalty" and "devotion to duty."

Mr. Bob's labors of love with MSU have not gone unrecognized. He has taken his place among college athletics' greats as a member of both the university's and the state's sports halls of fame and the College Sports Information Hall of Fame. His willingness to generously give of his talent, his time and his friendship serves as an inspiration to the countless lives he has touched and to those that aspire to follow in his footsteps. In that respect, the Bob Hartley Memorial Fellowship was created by the MSU Department of Athletics to provide internship opportunities for young media relation practitioners.

Stephen Foshee is the seventh recipient of the Bob Hartley Memorial Fellowship. A native of Hoover, Ala., Foshee is in his first season working with the MSU athletic media relations office, currently overseeing video/audio streaming with Maroon to the Max and working with the Bulldog Club. Having earned his bachelor's degree in communication and arts from Union University in 2006, Foshee is now pursuing his master's in sports administration.

Previous recipients of Mississippi State's Bob Hartley Memorial Fellowship include Scott Kuykendall, Larry Little, Brock Turnipseed, René Oakes Garner, Tony Schmidt and Jay Middleton.





# SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

SETTING THE STANDARD FOR INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS IN CROSS COUNTRY AND TRACK & FIELD



In the ever-changing world of collegiate athletics, the tradition of excellence in the Southeastern Conference has remained constant. The SEC boasts a rich history and has dominated track and field like no other conference.

Arkansas finished fifth at the NCAA Cross Country Championships in its quest for a fourth national championship in six years. Georgia finished 25th and Kentucky finished 28th in the race. Arkansas' men captured their 13th straight SEC crown and their amazing 30th consecutive conference title, dating back to 17 straight Southwest Conference titles prior to joining the SEC in 1991. Arkansas' John McDonnell was named SEC Male Cross Country Coach of the Year. The award marked McDonnell's ninth consecutive honor. Thomas Morgan of Kentucky garnered Male Cross Country Athlete of the Year honors and Arkansas' Mike Poe garnered SEC Freshman of the Year honors.

Tennessee came in 24th to lead the SEC at the NCAA Championships. The Lady Vols also won their third SEC title. Auburn's Angela Homan won the SEC Female Athlete of the Year award. Tennessee head coach J.J. Clark earned his third SEC Female Cross Country Coach of the Year honor and Georgia's Kristin Heffelfinger garnered SEC Freshman of the Year honors.

LSU became the first school to sweep the NCAA Indoors men and women's championships. This marks the fifth time that LSU has won the championships in schools history, and the first time since 1990. An SEC team has won the NCAA men's indoor title 12 out of the past 13 seasons. The SEC had three of the top 10 at the NCAA Championships and six of the top 25. Arkansas and Florida were national runner-ups. South Carolina (14th), Auburn (t16th), Ole Miss (t22nd), Georgia (t34th), Alabama (t44th) and Tennessee (t56th) also competed at the National Championships. Florida edged out Arkansas, 128-126, in the SEC Men's Indoor Championships.

The SEC had six of the top 10 at the NCAA Championships and seven of the top 25. LSU become the first school to sweep the NCAA Indoors women and men's championships. LSU won its third straight and 10th NCAA Women's Indoor National title. It was the 14th straight year the SEC has at least one team in the top two of the final results. Nine other SEC schools scored at the national meet including Florida (2nd), Tennessee (4th), Georgia (6th), Arkansas (t10th), South Carolina (t10th), Mississippi State (t21st), Auburn (t38th), Kentucky (t38th), and Vanderbilt (t38th). LSU claimed its 11th SEC Indoor Track & Field Championship, edging out second-place Florida, 52-51.

Arkansas scored 65 points to win its 11th outdoor title and 39th national championship in either indoor track, outdoor track or cross country under coach John McDonnell. Florida (2nd), LSU (3rd), Tennessee (13th), **Mississippi State (20th)**, Auburn (23rd), Georgia (26th), South Carolina (31st), Kentucky (40th) and Ole Miss (60th) also scored at the national meet. Arkansas won its 11th SEC outdoor crown and its 20th outdoor conference title in 23 years with 183 points.

LSU finished second at the NCAA Outdoor National Championships. **Six SEC schools finished in the top 10 of the NCAA Championships** with Florida coming in fifth, Georgia, South Carolina and Tennessee tied for seventh and Arkansas 10th. Other SEC point scorers were, Auburn (18th), Alabama (T22nd), **Mississippi State (T22nd)**, Vanderbilt (48th) and Kentucky (56th). The University of Arkansas Lady Razorbacks won its third SEC Outdoor Championship in five years.



# MEN'S PREVIEW

## **COMBINED EVENTS**

Returning to compete in the combined events for the MSU Bulldogs are senior Darryl Brady and sophomore Martin Lee. Brady, a Vancleave, Miss., native scored a personal best 6,651points at the 2008 SEC Outdoor Championship to finish in seventh place. Lee was not far behind, finishing in eighth place at his first SEC Championships. Joining this powerful duo is freshman Trevarus Christian, a product of Vaiden, Miss., where he won All-State honors in the 200 and 400-meter dashes, high jump and long jump.

#### **DISTANCE**

The MSU distance corps begins the season after an impressive 2008 cross country season. The men finished in sixth place overall, with two runners in the Top 20 at the SEC Championship. The Bulldogs also brought home a sixth place finish from the NCAA South Regional Championship in Knoxville, Tenn. The distance group was led all season by senior Robert Scribner, State's Ione NCAA qualifier. The Tupelo, Miss., native led the Maroon and White all season as the top finisher. Scribner is not alone, as he is joined by returning Bulldogs Adam Lenz, Thoum Mathaing, Daniel Simpkins and Cameron Vincent. All of these vetern runners will continue to lead the Bulldogs distance corps throughout the season.

New to the distance crew are sophomores Allen Gearheart and Nathan Johnson. Johnson, a 2008 redshirt, is looking to compete for the first time in the Maroon and White outdoor track season. Gearheart, a product of Clinton, Miss., hopes to help the Bulldogs to victory in the 2009 season.

#### **JUMPS**

The MSU jumpers are fairly new this year, but will look to senior Allen Cassel and junior Demetrius Cobbins for guidence and leadership. Cassell, a Port Gibson high jumper, finished third at the 2008 SEC Championship and recorded a personal best jump of 7-00 ¼, which qualified him for the NCAA Mideast Regionals. Cobbins recorded a personal best jump of 23-09, and hopes to leap to new bounds for the Bulldogs this season.

The jumping corps has five newcomers to join the group for the 2009 season. Trey Charles of Marietta, Ga., has a high school personal best of 24-2 and hopes to contiune his success with the Bulldogs. Patrick Johnson, from Memphis, will pole vault for MSU, while Joshua Tucker and Kendrick Poullard will both compete in the high jump. Poullard won JUCO All-American honors in both high jump and triple jump.

#### **SPRINTS & MIDDLE DISTANCE**

The men's sprint group is loaded and ready to take on the 2009 season by storm. Returning this year is All-American Kendall May of Tuscaloosa, Ala. May made it all the way to an eighth place finish at last year's 2008 NCAA Championship. He also earned All-SEC and All-Region honors for the year. May is looking to highlight the men's 100-and 200-meter corps this season. The MSU Bulldogs also have World Junior 400-meter runner-up and 400-meter relay champion O'Neal Wilder back on the track. Wilder, a native of Carthage, Miss., returns after a breakout freshman season that included All-SEC and All-Region accolades and a trip to the NCAA Championship meet. Senior John Bailey of Terry, Miss., will also look to guide a fairly young group of sprinters. Bailey earned All-SEC honors in the 200-, 400-, and 4x100-meter relay, and was also a member the the 4x400-meter relay team that competed at NCAA Nationals.

Looking to make their mark on the Bulldog sprint group are freshmen D'Angelo Cherry of Jonesboro, Ga., Garron Hendricks of St. Louis, and Dwight Mullings, brother of past MSU standout Steve Mullings.

Also returning to the track are an exceptional duo of 400-meter hurdlers. Sophomore Emanuel Mayers is coming off a hot freshman season. Mayers finished the 2008 season ranked number two in MSU all-time rankings with All-Region accolades. He also competed for the country of Trinidad in the World Junior Championships, where he became the Trinidad Junior record holder. Senior Delandus O'Neal is looking to finish in the top ranks in his respected events. The Carrollton, Ga., native is hoping to rebound from an injury plagued season and finish his Bulldog career on a high note.

The Middle distance runners are looking to rebuild after loosing three of its most valuable members. Sophomore Matthew Cameron and Junior Michael Chapa will be looked upon to lead the group throughout the season. Cameron is coming off a productive 2008 cross country season and is in good shape to succeed in 2009.

New to this group are Robert Ellis and Allen Gearheart, who have high hopes for their first outdoor season in Maroon and White.

#### **COMBINED EVENTS**

One of the most successful members of the Lady bulldog team belongs to the combined events group. Senior Marrissa Harris of Memphis, Tenn., returns to the track for her final season in Maroon and White. Harris owns the school record for both the indoor pentathlon and outdoor heptathlon. Harris scored 4,059 points at last year's NCAA Indoor Championship to become the third Indoor All-American in school history. She also was the SEC outdoor champion in the heptathlon with 5.600 points scored and finished in 14th place at the 2008 NCAA Outdoor Championships.

Joining Harris is the up-and-coming, multistar LaQuinta Aaron, who finished 5th in last year's SEC Championship meet, scoring 5,174 points in the hepathlon. Also, senior Dorothy Youmans and junior Bridgett Rose will compete for the Lady Bulldogs this season.



21st Season

Al and Jessie Schmidt

Regarded and respected nationwide as an authority on endurance running and training, Al Schmidt enters his 21st season at the helm of the Mississippi State's men's and women's track teams. Since his hiring on Oct. 22, 1988, Schmidt has parlayed his 37 years of collegiate coaching experience into many individual and team accomplishments for MSU, both on and off of the track. In his previous 20 seasons, Schmidt has produced 33 all-Americans and 35 SEC champions.

In 2008, Schmidt coached two athletes to become SEC Champions. Marrissa Harris won the heptathlon with a school record of 5,600 points. Jamil Hubbard won the 400-meter SEC title. During the SEC Outdoor Meet, 14 athletes qualified for the NCAA Regional Meet and 10 athletes scored in their events. The men placed eighth and the women placed 11th

At the NCAA Regional meet, two Bulldogs, Jamil Hubbard and Golden Coachman, won titles in the 400-meter run and in the 800-meter run. O'Neal Wilder took second in the 400-meter behind Hubbard, while Chris Woods took fourth in the 800-meter. The 4x400-meter relay team, consisting of Wilder, Hubbard, Woods, and Emmanuel Mayers, took first. The men's team placed sixth, which was the best finish for the Bulldogs at the meet. The 4x100-meter relay and Kendall May received at-large bids to the NCAA National Meet. Marrissa Harris qualified in the heptathlon.

Out of these athletes, O'Neal Wilder continued his season by competing in the Junior National Championships, where he won the 400-meter run title. At the World Junior Championships, Wilder won the bronze in the 400-meter event. Marrissa Harris continued hers at the NACAC Under-23 Championships, where she won the bronze in the pentathlon.

The highlight of the 2008 season for Schmidt was being named the coach for the U.S. Men's Under-23 team at the NACAC Championships.

In 2007, Schmidt guided five Bulldogs to All-American status. Schmidt also witnessed three school records broken. At the SEC Championships, the men's team had a total of four athletes score 30 points to finish 11th overall. Among those scorers included Golden Coachman and Travis McKay scoring in the 800-meter run and 3000-meter steeplechase, with third and fourth place finishes, respectively.

Out of the 21 events the Bulldogs competed in, 62 of the athletes marked a personal best in their respective event. There were also six regional qualifiers for the men's team and two relay regional marks met. Bruce Davis, Ezra Jones, Nathan Daniels, and Arthur Davis finished fourth at the NCAA Championships, with a time of three minutes, 3.49 seconds.

On 22 separate times during the 2007 season, 15 Lady Bulldogs met their personal best marks, along with seven regional qualifiers. Marrissa Harris finished fourth in the heptathlon at the SEC Championships with a personal-best 5,242 points, along with Jennifer McPherson who finished fourth in the 1500-meter run with a time of 4:20.87, and Michelle Corrigan who took sixth in the 10000-meter run with a time of 37:15.760. A total of 16 Lady Bulldogs scored a total of 19 points for MSU as they finished 11th at the meet.

In 2005, Schmidt witnessed six Bulldogs garner All-America accolades. At the 2005 NCAA Outdoor Championships, Elzie Coleman, Arthur Davis, LaChristopher Lewis and Jamel Ashley ran a school-record 3:01.63 to finish fifth in the 4x400-meter relay. Ashley placed second in the 400, while Lewis took 11th in the long jump to earn his first All-America honor in the event. At the Mideast Regional, Steve Mullings won the 100-meter dash title, repeating his performance from the SEC Championships. Lewis also won the long jump title at the conference meet, while Ashley finished second in the 400-meter dash. Travis McKay finished seventh in the steeplechase, setting the third-best time in school history. As a team, the Bulldogs finished 19th in the last Trackwire 25 of the season.

On the women's side, Meggan Hodge broke the MSU school record in the 3000-meter steeplechase with a 10:46.04 eighth-place finish at the SEC Championships. Jasmine Walls cleared a personal best to tie for second in the high jump. Crystal Averitt ended her career atop the all-time list in the hammer throw, while Lacey Johnson extended her school record in the pole vault.

Three-time All-American Tiffany McWilliams closed out her MSU career in 2004 by becoming the most decorated female athlete in Lady Bulldog track and field history. McWilliams repeated her 2003 feat of winning the outdoor 1500-meter title and also won the NCAA Indoor title in the mile. Behind McWilliams and a strong distance corps, MSU achieved a No. 12 national ranking.

On the men's side, decathlete and All-American Trey Hardee set a school record in the event after tallying 8,041 points in a second-place finish at the NCAA Outdoor Championships. Five Bulldogs were named all-Americans in 2003. Ashley Davis, Lewis and Keston Nelson all earned the recognition following a third-place finish in the 4x400-meter relay at nationals. Ashley picked up the honor in the 400-meter dash in addition to the 4x4.

In 2003, McWilliams became the first woman in MSU track and field history to win a national championship. Running 4:06.75, McWilliams broke an NCAA Championships record en route to winning the 1500-meter run. She was also crowned the SEC indoor champion in the mile run in addition to the outdoor 800- and 1500-meter runs.

At the Outdoor Championships, State tallied the second-highest point total with 20 points. MSU finished in tied for 15th behind Pierre Browne's second-place showing in the 100-meter dash (10.34). Hardee took fifth in the decathlon for his first all-America honor, while Kelvin Harris ran 13.86 in the 110-meter hurdles to earn his first All-America nod.

The men topped all previous indoor squads at the NCAA Indoor Championships. The Bulldogs scored 15 points to score in the top 10 for the first time in school history. Browne won the 60-meter dash title (6.60), while Marquis Davis finished second in the 200 (20.70).

During 2002, Schmidt and the MSU program hosted the SEC Outdoor Championships. At the meet, State's men scored 35 points as a team, the second-highest total of an MSU squad since his arrival. He also witnessed the men's program tally its highest points total since 1991 at the SEC Indoor Championship.

Elisha Williams became the school's first indoor All-American in 2001 after taking second in long jump. Later in the season, Williams became the second woman to become a double All-American in the same year. Williams took fifth in the outdoor long jump. Schmidt also helped Falilatu Ogunkoya finished her MSU career in 2001 as a five-time All-American, and Camille Harper closed out her career as an All-American in the 100-meter dash.

The 1990s saw Aki Bradley benefit from the tutelage of Schmidt. Bradley became a double All-American at the 1994 NCAA Outdoor Championships, placing in both the 100- and 200-meter sprints. In 1992, MSU hosted the SEC Outdoor meet. In the first year Arkansas and South Carolina were members of the conference, the Bulldogs finished seventh overall.

Schmidt's first men's team in 1989 showed immediate improvement, finishing fifth at both the SEC Indoor and Outdoor Championships. It marked the first time in five years the Bulldogs finished in the top half of the conference.

During Schmidt's first three years, he saw Festus Igbinoghene earn six All-America awards in horizontal jumps, including three runner-up finishes in the triple jump.

#### **ACADEMICS**

Under Schmidt, State's squads have also excelled in the classroom. A total of 208 student-athletes have been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll a combined 253 Times. Three athletes - Rob Irwin, Tina Bridgeman and April Ecke- each earned Academic all-America honors. Distance runner Ecke earned the 1995 H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar Athlete of the Year honor after an outstanding career on the track and in the classroom. Chris Boldt earned First Team Academic All-District honors from the College Sports Information Directors of America in 2003, while Matt Denton collected the honor in 2005. Joining Boldt and Denton in 2006 and 2007 was Ryan Irwin who finished First Team Academic all-District for the Men and Joy Griffith who finished First Team Academic all-District for the Women. Zita Magloire finished with Second Team Academic all-District honors in 2006. Also, in 2006 the Lady Bulldogs were selected by the U.S. Track and Field and Cross Country Coaches Association, as an All-Academic Team. They were one of 77 teams nationally and joined four other Southeastern Conference squads for the prestigious honor. In 2007, both cross country teams were selected the Track and Field and Cross Country Coaches Association, as an All-Academic Team. The MState women were one of 158 schools, while the men were one of 98 nationwide that receive the honor. Only six SEC teams had both their male and female teams represented.

#### PRIOR TO MSU

Before coming to MSU, Schmidt was instrumental in the success of Florida State University's track and field program in the mid 1980s. First serving as an assistant women's track coach and head cross country coach, he later became an assistant men's track coach and head cross country coach. Under his guidance, the Lady Seminoles won two national titles, taking the 1984 outdoor and 1985 indoor titles. The FSU women also claimed runner-up honors at the 1983 and 1985 outdoor meets.

Upon earning his bachelor's degree from St. Louis University, Schmidt made his coaching debut as an assistant cross country coach at the University of Missouri-St. Louis before returning to his alma mater as head men's track coach for the next five years. After spending two years in private business, Schmidt returned to the track in 1982 as a graduate assistant at the University of Kansas. Following his one season at KU, he began his sixyear stint at Florida State.

#### **PERSONAL**

In 1997, Schmidt served as a District 9 representative for the NCAA Women's Cross Country Championships. Having rewritten the endurance curriculum for Levels I and II, Schmidt currently serves on the USA Track and Field' Coaches Education Committee. Schmidt, 58, is married to the former Jessie Garfield of St. Louis, Mo. They are the parents of two children - daughter Sara Lynn, a senior at MSU and son, Daniel, a MSU freshman.

n integral part of the Bulldogs' success since his return to Starkville, Steve Dudley begins his seventh year at Mississippi State as the associate head coach for the track and field squads and head coach of the men's cross country team.

Through eight seasons back on campus, Dudley has tutored 19 athletes to All-American status since his return to his alma mater in 2000. Last season, Dudley led eight Bulldog sprinters to regional qualifying marks, including two individuals in the 400-meter dash and two in the 800-meter run. He also coached Jamil Hubbard to become an SEC Champion in the 400-meter dash and coached several athletes to NCAA Regional Champions in the 400-meter dash, the 800-meter run and the 4x400-meter relay last year. Dudley coached Kendall May to an eighth-place finish in the 100-meter dash at the NCAA Championships. He also coached O'Neal Wilder to become a USA Track and Field Jr. National Champion in the 400-meter dash and to a bronze medal at the World Jr. Championships in the 400-meter dash and a gold medal in the 4x400 meter relay. Golden Coachman, Bruce Davis, Chris Woods, Kendall May, John Bailey, Emanuel Mayers and O'Neal Wilder made postseason trips.

The 2007 tandem of MState's 4x400-meter relay team of B. Davis, Nathan Daniels, Arthur Davis and Ezra Jones bested their previous finish from 2006, finishing in three minutes, three seconds to take fourth place. Coachman and the quartet all gained all-America honors. The 2006 edition of State's 4x400-meter relay team of juniors B. Davis, Ezra Jones, A. Davis and Daniels ran 3:05 to finish seventh at the NCAA Outdoor Championships. The finish by the quartet garners A. Davis with his third all-America honor in the event, while B. Davis, Jones and Daniels collected their first. In 2005, Dudley guided MState's 4x400-meter relay squad to a fifth-place finish at the national championships and broke a school record held for more than a decade (3:01.63). As a result, senior Jamel Ashley, freshman Elzie Coleman, Arthur Davis, senior LaChristopher Lewis, Kendall Pyant II and Chris Woods earned all-America status. In the 4x100-meter relay, Ashley, Lewis, sophomore Eliott Morant and Mullings tied a school record with a 39.09 clocking at the Texas Relays. Mullings, Ashley, Davis and Lewis combined to finish third in the event at the SEC Championships. Since the 2003 Penn Relays, the Bulldogs have failed to win the 4x200-meter relay only once. Former Bulldog Steve Mullings posted the fastest regional-qualifying time in the country in the 100meter dash (10.06) and won the Southeastern Conference and Mideast Regional championships. In his final season for the Maroon and White, Jamel Ashley garnered all-America honors with a second-place finish in the 400-meter dash at the national championships. Ashley's 44.75 broke a school record he set a day earlier.

At the 2004 SEC Championships, Ashley, Davis, Keston Nelson and Lewis finished second in the 4x4. Ashley took eighth in the 400 at the national meet, while the 4x4 squad finished third.

Pierre Browne was named the 2003 NCAA Indoor national champion in the 60-meter dash and finished runner-up in the 100 at the outdoor national meet. Marquis Davis finished second in the 200 at the outdoor national meet the same season. Throughout the season, four of his athletes accumulated six all-America honors. Dudley's first season in Starkville saw his athletes earn eight all-America accolades.

In three seasons at Bevill State (Ala.) Community College, Dudley coached three NJCAA national champions and 19 all-Americans. In cross country, the men's and women's squads captured the Region XXII title in 1999. The Bears also won the 1998 Region XXII title en route to a third-place national showing. His 1999 Lady Bear team earned Academic Team of the Year honors, and the men finished second the same season. Twelve Bears earned Academic all-America accolades.

Before entering the coaching ranks, Dudley served as a captain for MSU's track team from 1991-95. While at State, he was named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll for three years (1993-95). He currently ranks fifth on MSU's all-time superlatives list in two categories—the indoor 5000-meter run and the outdoor 10,000-meter run.

The Hamilton, Ala.-native graduated with a bachelor's degree in May 1995. He received his master's degree in environmental geology from State in December 2004.

n his inaugural season with the Lady Bulldogs last season, Bryan Fetzer helped bring Mississippi State women's track and field to a new level. The women's sprints, jumps and combined events athletes completed one of their best seasons under his direction.

Fetzer tutored standout Marrissa Harris to becoming Mississippi State's third indoor All-American in school history. He also led Harris to breaking two indoor school records and becoming an outdoor SEC Champion during the 2008 season. Under his leadership five Lady Bulldogs qualified for the 2008 Mideast Regional, where three finished in the top 10 in their respective events. He also coached the 4x100-meter relay team of LaQuinta Aaron, Harris, Bridgett Rose and Priscilla Gaines to State's first appearance at the Mideast Regional in the relay.

Before coming to Mississippi State he spent three years at Cal building the Golden Bears into a national power. His athletes broke 11 school records in sprints and hurdles. He also helped coach the women's squad to their highest NCAA finishes with an eighth-place showing at the 2007 NCAA Outdoor Championships and 15th at the 2007 indoor championship. Fetzer also served as recruiting coordinator and oversaw the strength training for the men's and women's teams.

Prior to arriving in Berkeley, he spent a season in Muncie, Ind., where he was an assistant women's cross country and track and field coach at Ball State University. Under his guidance, three athletes (long jump-three, 400m, high jump) qualified for the NCAA Regional Championships and one (heptathlon) for the NCAA Outdoor Championships. The season also produced two school records in the multi-events that stood for 10 years.

Preceding his one-year stint at Ball State, Fetzer spent four years as the Director of Track and Field and Cross Country at Gardner-Webb University in Boiling Springs, N.C. From the summer of 1999 to the summer of 2003 at Gardner-Webb, Fetzer started the track and field program and led its transition from NCAA Division II to Division I status. During his tenure, he coached six NCAA National Champions along with twelve All-Americans including; the 2000 IAAF World Leader in the 55m, Julia O'Neal. The women's team produced a pair of top five finishes at the NCAA National Championships in their only year at Division II and additionally finished as the Atlantic Sun Conference runner-up in the school's first year in Division I. After the 2000, season Fetzer was named the USTCA NCAA Division II Women's Southeast Coach of the Year.

Fetzer's collegiate coaching experience started at Ranger College in Ranger, Texas, in both track and field and football. In building the women's track and field program into a national junior college power, he had eight NJCAA National Championships in 1999 and finished no lower than 11th at the NJCAA Championships under his tutelage.

In addition to collegiate athletics, he has consulted and worked on speed and power development and strength training with several professional athletes in the NFL, Arena Football League, WNBA, WUSA, and MLB. One of Fetzer's post-collegiate track athletes, Adam Shunk (Nike), has a lifetime personal-best of 2.30m (high jump) and has been ranked in the IAAF Top 20 World Ranking each of the last two seasons. Fetzer boasts an international experience having, been an assistant coach in 2001 at the World University Games for Uganda as well as serving on staffs at the Commonwealth Games and NACAC Under 25-Championships. Fetzer was also named to the 2008 USATF Men's World Junior Staff, and as a coach at the NACAC Under 25-Championship. He also serves as the secretary for the US Women's Coaches Association.

Fetzer holds a Master's degree in physical education from Tarleton University in Stephenville, Texas, and earned his B.A. in physical education from Canisius College in Buffalo, N.Y., where he was a four-year football letterman and captain his senior year.

ouston Franks returned home to Mississippi State in 2004 as an assistant track and field coach. An accomplished distance runner for the Maroon and White from 1994-98, Franks assists in coaching and developing men's distance runners.

The fifth-year coach is an integral part to the recent success of the MState men's cross country program. This past cross country season, the Bulldogs finished fifth at the Southeastern Conference Cross Country Championship - the best placement by the men's squad since the 1981 season and the best finish since the program was revived in 2003. Working alongside men's head cross country coach Steve Dudley, Franks helped the squad to a season-opening meet win at the Sewanee Invite. The 2005 team also finished second at the Crimson Classic. The men finalized the 2005 slate with an eighth-place spot at the NCAA South Regional.

Prior to returning to Starkville, Franks spent five years at Southwest Missouri State University (now Missouri State University). While at SMS, Franks served as head cross country coach for the Bears. While there, he won three Missouri Valley Conference women's titles. His women's teams finished in the top four at the NCAA Midwest Regional's during his last three years and his men's squads finished in the top half of the conference during all five seasons. During the track and field season, the Bears captured three indoor and outdoor league championships on the women's

Franks was a three-time MVC Coach of the Year in women's cross country. During the 2002-03 season, he was also a part of the first SMS squad since 1993-94 to win the league's coveted Triple Crown championships in cross country and both indoor and outdoor track and

Franks was also a graduate assistant at MSU under Al Schmidt during the 1998-99 season. While an assistant, he developed training programs for distance runners and coordinated team travel, recruiting and meet administration.

While running for the Maroon and White, Franks was considered MSU's top distance runner and was named to the Southeastern Conference's Academic Honor Roll three times. He currently ranks second on MSU's all-time list in the indoor 3000-meter run, fifth in the outdoor 10,000-meter run, and fifth in the 5000-meter run.

Franks is a 1998 MSU graduate with a teaching and coaching degree. He received his master's degree in sports administration from MSU in August 1999.

The Tupelo, Miss., native was a four-year letter winner at Tupelo High School and was named an all-American in cross country his senior season. A state champion in both cross country and the two-mile run, he was also named an All-State selection three times during his track and field career

He and his wife, the former Meggan Hodge, were married in December 2007.

He turned in a personal best 15 feet, six inches in the pole vault competition and placed second in the Southeastern Conference decathlon with 7,041 points. Three-time all-American LaChristopher Lewis returns to the program as a volunteer assistant coach for a second season. Lewis, a four-year letterwinner for the Bulldogs, will assist with the sprinters this season under the direction of Steve Dudley.

Lewis has been to two NCAA Championships for the Bulldogs and finished in the top 20 both times. In 2004, he competed in the long jump and was a member of the 4x400-meter relay team that placed third. In 2005, the Coldwater, Miss.,native, competed in the long jump again and ran third leg on the 4x400-meter relay tandum that took home fifth place and still holds the MSU school record for fastest time (three minutes, 1.67 seconds) in the 4x400-meter relay. Lewis also ran the final leg on the 4x100-meter relay-school record holding team that ran a time of 39.09. Lewis still holds the freshman record in the 400-meter dash, clocking a time of 46.20 in 2002.

Lewis ranks third on the all-time indoor superlatives list in the 200-meter dash, fourth in the pentathlon and first on the 4x400-meter relay.

The former SEC Athlete of the Week and SEC Champion in the long jump was also named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll and, was the recipient of the Jace Lacoste award.





he Mississippi State Bulldogs entered the 2008 season with high hopes of making it a year to remember. Coaches and athletes wanted it to be known that Mississippi State track and field would be a force to recon with and would be a name heard all throughout the season.

The Bulldogs started the year off with a bang, setting five NCAA regional qualifying marks at the first meet of the season. The Bulldog trio of Jamil Hubbard, John Bailey and Kendall May all grabbed regional marks in the 200-meter dash. To round out the regional qualifying day, both MSU relays, the 4x100 and 4x400, ran outstanding season beginning times to already have to push to succeeding heights. With the season stating off on such good notes the men's team knew its initial goals were reachable.

During the season, qualifying regionally became a trend. After opening with five qualifiers, each week it seemed as if another Bulldog ran away from the pack to secure their spot in post-season races. O'Neal Wilder surprised the whole team running a personal best of 21.12 in the 200-meter dash to notch a regional qualification in only his second race of the year. Another surprise came about when Emanuel Mayers ran a time of 52.05 in the 400 hurdles to not only win the Jace Lacoste Invitational, but to also pick up his ticket the 2008 Mideast Regional meet. Distance runners too were cashing in early to get to the regional meet held at the end of May. State's top 800-meter performers, Golden Coachman and Chris Woods, surpassed the rest to qualify.

Sprinters were not the only athletes to fair well during the season. In the field events and multi events Bulldogs were at the top of the pack. The home meet was a weekend for these athletes to shine. High jumper Allen Cassell leaped to new heights and also qualified for the promising meet in May. Cassell jumped a new personal record of 7-00 ¼ to win the event. Also, Kiley Aguar surpassed his personal best in the hammer throw by 30 feet, throwing 183-01 to win first-place honors. In the decathlon, Daryl Brady and Joseph Queen continued to improve week by week, with Brady winning the Alabama Relays and Queen coming in a close second.

the season, running personal best in the 1,500, 3,000, 5,000 and 10,000 respectively. Also, the hot freshman class went on to break freshman records, with Matthew Cameron claiming the 31-year old 1,500-meter run record and Adam Lenz taking the 10,000 record. Also Robert Scribner moved to second all-time in the MSU record books for the 10,000-meter race.

The true test of the season came in Auburn, Ala., at the 2008 Outdoor SEC Championships. The Bulldogs scored 56.20 points to finish eighth. Jamil Hubbard won the 400meter title, with teammates Wilder and Bailey bringing home second and seventh place in the event. Also, May finished eighth in the 100, Mayers finished seventh in the 400 hurdles and Kyle Roberts took ninth and a regional qualifying time in hurdles race. The Bulldogs had seven runners in the 5,000-meter final, with all seven running personal best times. Cassell and Brady both finished strong in the high jump with Cassell finishing third and Brady in eighth. Brady's eighth-place finish added to his seventh place finish in the decathlon. The Bulldogs' other two decathletes ended their season on a high note, with Queen finishing sixth and Martin Lee eighth, both with personal best scores for the event.

The men sent nine Bulldogs to the NCAA Mideast Regional Championships in Fayetteville, Ark., in late May. Success was still on the rise because the 400-, 800-, and 4x400-meter relay crown belonged to them. Both first time regional competitors, May and Mayers faired well on the large stage finishing seventh and eighth in their individual events. The men scored 48 points, finishing in sixth place overall, the highest ever in MSU history.

The men concluded their season by sending seven Bulldogs to the NCAA Outdoor Championship in Des Moines, Iowa. The men's 4x400 meter relay, 400 meter

run and 800 meter run were automatic qualifiers from the regional meet, but the 4x100 relay and 100-meter dash received at-large bids to participate in the national meet. Kendall May finished eighth in the 100-meter dash to earn All-America honors. In the other races, the Bulldogs advanced to either the finals or semi-finals to conclude their seasons.

The Bulldogs can look back on the 2008 season as one to remember with multiple regional and nationally qualifying athletes.

or the 2008 season, the Mississippi State Lady Bulldogs entered the year knowing the sky was the limit. With a fairly young team full of mostly freshmen, sophomores and juniors, the Lady Bulldogs were ready to stake their claim in the track and field world. Having a season that lasted from January to June, they trained hard to prepare themselves for a year to remember.

The indoor season was short but full of highlights. LaQuinta Aaron traveled to Baton Rouge to take first place in the pentathlon at the LSU Invitational, scoring 3,444 points. Wendy Copeland leaped to new bounds at the Kentucky Invite, jumping a personal best of 19 feet 10.75 inches in the long jump. After getting the indoor season underway, the Tyson Invitational in Fayetteville, Ark., was where the Lady Bulldogs really came into their own. Marrissa Harris broke a 10 year old record in the 60-meter hurdles, running a time of 8.55 seconds. Copeland stayed on path to a successful season, finishing in fifth place and the highest overall SEC competitor in the long jump. In the distance events, Simone Domingue finished in the top 10 of the 3,000-meter run setting a personal best time.

The SEC Indoor Championships was where the ladies were put to the test. Harris continued to dominate. One of her best competitions since arriving at Mississippi State, Harris shattered her 60-meter hurdles record running 8.37 seconds in the pentathlon. She also finished second in the pentathlon, and fifth in the long jump. These three performances cashed Harris' ticket to the NCAA Indoor Championships, making her the third female ever to compete in the Championships

for the Maroon and White. Harris' exceptional performances rubbed off on her teammates, because the end results of SEC indoors was overall pleasing. Many personal best marks were created as the women competed in the toughest athletic conference in the nation. Priscilla Gaines ran personal best times in both the 60- and 200-meter dashes. Domingue and Sarah Hammes both competed in the 5,000 and toped personal best times to conclude their first collegiate indoor season.

Harris went on to end the indoor season as she began it, setting records. She earned All-America honors in the pentathlon, becoming the third woman in MSU history to earn those accolades in the indoor meet. She also set a pentathlon school record by scoring 4,059 points.

the indoor season prepared the Lady Bulldogs to enter the outdoor season with a bang. With eight meets before the SEC championships, competing well and earning a spot to the regional championships were on everyone's mind. Home meet success was a bug that the entire team caught. At the first home meet of the season, personal best times and jumps were collected all over the track. Bridgett Rose concluded her day grabbing regional qualifying marks in the 100-meter hurdles. As the season continued, more regional marks were collected. This time it was Copeland and Priscilla Gaines who jumped their way to regionals in the long jump.

After displaying their talents in front of the home crowd, it was off to Texas and Pennsylvania. MSU showed up and showed out at both of the worldly renowned meets. Competing against the toughest competition they have faced this season, the ladies were ready to reintroduce themselves to the track and field world. Domingue took sixth place in the 5,000-meter run at the Texas relays, while Hammes added another personal best competing in the 3,000-meter steeplechase. Also, under the Texas sun Harris shattered another school record and took claim to regional qualifying marks, running13.48 seconds in the 100-meter hurdles, and the 4x200 relay team of Rose, Gabrielle Dillon, Aaron and Harris ran their way to second all-time in MSU history with a time of 1:36.34.

The SEC Championships in Auburn, Ala., would be the ladies' last chance to earn post-season honors and a true test of what they had been working hard for all season. The weekend started with a bang as the hepthaletes took first, fourth, 10th, and 12th place in the event. Harris set another school record for the season scoring, 5,600 points to earn an automatic qualification for the NCAA Championships in June. Aaron also scored a personal best in the event, scoring 5,174 points, to also earn provisional qualifying marks for the NCAA meet. Dorothy Youmans continued scoring points for the Maroon and White finishing in eighthplace in the women's high jump. Continuing success on the track, the 4x100-meter relay finally earned their right to run at regionals, posting a qualifying time of 45.16 seconds in the event. The women concluded the meet scoring 28 points.

At the regional meet both Harris and Copeland jumped their way into the MSU record books. Harris finished fourth, jumping a personal best of 21 feet and half an inch to finish fourth and second best in school history, while Copeland ended her season jumping a personal best of 20 feet, 5 inches to finish in eighth-place and move to third best in school history. The 4x100-meter relay team became the first woman's team to qualify for the regional meet and also to make it the finals in the event and ran 45.30 seconds to finish fifth in the event. The women finished with 18 overall points and sent Harris to the NCAA Championship meet in the heptathlon.

Like most of the season, Harris went into the biggest meet of the year with her head on straight and ready to show the nation what it meant to be a member of the Lady Bulldog track and field team. She concluded her long season finishing in 14<sup>th</sup> in the heptathlon.

The Lady Bulldogs did everything they planned on in 2008. With a fairly young team, it was made known that MSU track and field was growing in the right direction. The ladies went out and competed hard for the Maroon and White knowing that the 2008 season was the building block needed for success in the future.

The Mississippi State Bulldogs began the 2008 Cross Country Season with two first place team finishes at the Sewanee Invite and the MSU invitational. The Bulldogs were led during the 2008 Cross Country Season by senior Robert Scribner and sophomore Adam Lenz. Scribner achieved first place finishes at the first two meets of the season at the Sewanee Invite with a time of 25:40.20 in the 8K and the MSU Invitational with a time of 24:56.93, in which he broke the course record. The Lady Bulldogs traveled to Fayetteville, Ark., for the 2008 Indoor track and field championships. MSU had high hopes for a successful weekend in the world of track and field.

On the first day of competition, Marrissa Harris finished first in the 60-meter hurdles, running a school record and personal-best 8.37 seconds to qualify provisionally for

the NCAA Championships. The Memphisnative also scored 4,044 points to finish runner-up in the pentathlon.

The second day of competition, the Lady Bulldogs put up a fight for the Maroon and White. In the 60-meter dash, sophomore Gabrielle Dillon placed 15th, finishing in 7.57 seconds. Junior Priscilla Gaines crossed the line in 7.72, notching a personal best mark. Sophomore Bridgett Rose hurdled her way to 13th place, finishing the 60-meter hurdles in a personal-best 8.63 seconds.

Gaines also competed in the 200-meter dash, finishing in a personal-best 24.78, moving into fifth place on the all-time list in the competition. Sophomore Wendy Copeland joined Gaines in the 200, running a personal-best 24.97 to round out the Top 25.

Harris leaped 20 feet, two and a quarter inches in the long jump to add another NCAA provisional qualifying mark to her resume. Harris finished fifth in the event.

On the final day of competition, three Lady Bulldogs set new personal records. In the weight throw, sophomore LaTisha Rodgers (43-08) bested her personal-mark set two weeks before the SEC meet in Kentucky. Freshmen Simone Dominigue and Sarah Hammes, both appearing in their first SEC Indoor Championship, improved on their previous career-best marks, finishing in the Top 20 of the 5,000-meter run. Dominigue finished 13th with her time of 17 minutes, 22.42 seconds.

As a team, MSU finished 11th with 12 points.

The MSU women traveled to the Plains of Auburn, Ala., for the 2008 SEC Outdoor Championships. Four Lady Bulldogs began the competition in the heptathlon. Juniors Marrissa Harris and Dorothy Youmans and sophomores LaQuinta Aaron and Bridgett Rose competed in the seven events over the first two days. Harris finished the opening day atop the leader

board with 3,502 points. Aaron posted a strong opening day, finishing second behind Harris with 3,280 points. Rose and Youmans ended the day ranked ninth and 10th, respectively.

On the second day of competition, Harris scored an automatic national qualifying and school-record 5,600 points to win the heptathlon. Aaron finished fourth, scoring a provisional national qualifying 5,174 points, good for third on the all-time list. Rose just missed scoring in her first heptathlon with 4,522 points to finish 10th. Youmans finished 12th despite being hampered by injuries for much of the season.

Freshman Simone Domingue ran in her in first 10,000-meter race in 37:03.51 to finish 11th.

The third day, more points were scored with Youmans' five-feet, five-inch clearance in the high jump to finish eighth. Also, Harris continued her hot streak, finishing fifth in the long jump with a regional qualifying leap of 20-01 ½.

State's women posted their best time of the season in the 4x100-meter relay, running a regional-qualifying 45.16. LaQuinta Aaron, Marrissa Harris, Bridgett Rose and Priscilla Gaines also posted the third-fastest time in school history. Harris closed out her weekend scoring for State in the 100-meter hurdles final. Harris ran a regional qualifying 13.28 to finish fourth.

State's women finished 11th with 28 points.

The Mississippi State Bulldogs traveled to Auburn, Ala., for the 2008 SEC Outdoor Championships. The Bulldogs ended the three-day meet with 56.20 points and in eighth place.

On day one of the competition, Bulldog decathletes Darryl Brady, Martin Lee, and Joseph Queen began competition. In the men's decathlon, Darryl Brady finished the day in seventh place, the highest amongst State's three competitors. Brady won the high jump competition, clearing 6-04 3/4. Senior Joseph Queen set a personal best in the 100-meter dash (11.43), as did Martin Lee (11.37). Lee is eighth after day one.

State took the sixth, seventh and eighth positions in the decathlon. Senior Joseph Queen scored a personal-best 6,775 points to finish as the team's top finisher. Darryl Brady finished seventh and also tallied a new personal record with 6,651 points. Martin Lee (6,641) finished eighth in his first decathlon. The trio laid the tracks for an impressive weekend.

On the third day of competition, State sent three runners to the men's 400-meter dash finals with O'Neal Wilder (46.46) and Jamil Hubbard (46.59) finishing second and third, respectively, and John Bailey (46.67) taking fifth. All three times were regional qualifying marks with Wilder's and Bailey's setting new personal bests for the individuals. Kendall May ran a regional qualifying and personal best 10.35 seconds in the 100-meter dash to take fifth in the opening round.

Of the four runners competing in the men's 1500-meter run, the Bulldogs had two advance to finals and all four competitors set personal bests in the event. Matthew Cameron (3:48.40) and Brandon Smith (3:50.92) finished 11th and 12th, respectively. Michael Chapa (3:51.35) and Ben Blakenship (3:51.45) finished 13th and 14th, narrowly missing the final.

MSU also had three runners in the 3,000-meter steeplechase. Jonathan Rono finished ninth, with Pad Judd following in the 10th position.

On the final day of competition MSU had a brilliant day on the track. Hubbard ran 45.24 seconds to win the 400-meter dash title. Hubbard was followed closely by Wilder, who claimed second in the event, and Bailey was not far behind finishing in seventh.


In the 800-meter run, Golden Coachman (1:48.26) and Chris Woods (1:48.71) posted regional qualifying marks to finish fourth and sixth, respectively.

The Bulldogs' 4x100-meter relay team of May, Bailey, Hubbard and Wilder ran a regional qualifying 39.42 to finish third. All three Bulldogs competing in the 100-meter dash and 400-meter hurdles posted regional qualifying marks. In the 100, May ran 10.37 to finish eighth, while Mayers

(51.35, seventh and a personal best) and Kyle Roberts (51.99, ninth) competed in the 400-meter hurdles.

MSU had seven runners in the men's 5,000-meter final. Of those seven, six set personal-best-marks. MSU's top finisher in the event was Ashenafi Arega (14:31.42), who finished 17th. Also setting personal bests were Robert Scribner, Adam Lenz, Brandon Smith, Pad Judd and Matthew Cameron.

Allen Cassell cleared six feet, eight and three quarter inches to take third in the high jump. Darryl Brady also scored in the event, jumping 6-06 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> to finish eighth. Overall, State's men scored 56.20 points to finish eighth, their best finish since 2005.

# 2008 MIDEAST REGIONAL

Mississippi State Track and Field had one of its best weekends in school history at the 2008 Mideast Regional in Fayetville, Ark. A total of 14 athletes raced to the front of the pack for the maroon and white.

For the men's team seniors Jamil Hubbard and Golden Coachman led the way bringing home NCAA Mideast regional championships in their respected events. Hubbard won the 400-meter dash crown with a time of 45.72 seconds. Coachman ran 1:48.07 edging out an SEC foe Elkana Kosgei from LSU to claim the title.

Elsewhere on the track Bulldogs were running past the competition to give the men 48 points, and a sixth place finish in the meet. This finish was the highest finish in MSU school history. Freshman O'Neal Wilder finished second in the 400-meter dash running 46.20, and Emanual Mayers, a freshman also, finished eighth in the 400 hurdles with a time of 52.22. Junior Kendall May also ran a personal best time of 10.24 in the 100-meter dash to claim seventh place.

The men's 4x400-meter relay team ended the weekend the way it started, on top. The team traded leads throughout the race with Kentucky, until the anchor leg broke away to claim the title and a final time of 3:05.62.

The Lady bulldogs kept with the men's pace and finished the meet with the second highest placing in school history, 18th. Junior Marrissa Harris and sophomore Wendy Copeland leaped to new distances to score points for MSU. Both Harris and Copeland jumped personal-best in the long jump. A jump of 21-00.50 gave Harris a fourth place finish, and Copeland jumped 20-05.25 to finish in eighth. Harris kept scoring for MSU finishing in sixth place in the 100-meter hurdles. Harris' time of 13.05 also set a new MSU school record. The women's 4x100-meter relay also ran a time a 45.30 to claim fifth place.

The MSU track and field team finished the weekend with a total of ten USACCTF Allregion performers and six NCAA Outdoor Championship qualifiers.

### 2008 NCAA OUTDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

Eight Bulldogs and one Lady bulldog made the trip to Des Moines, Iowa for the 2008 NCAA Outdoor Championships. All of MSU competitors entered the meet after running their best of the season at the Mideast Regional Championship. The men finished the year with two NCAA All-Americans, Golden Coachman and Kendall May. Coachman finished eighth in the semi-final round of the 800-meter run and May finished in eighth place in the final round of the 100-meter dash.

In the 400-meter dash O'Neal Wilder made it to the semi-final round in his first ever NCAA championship. He ended his stellar freshman campaign with an eleventh place finish. Seniors Jamil Hubbard and Chris Wood ended their lustrous careers in Maroon and White failing to advance to the semi-finals. Hubbard finished the season with a 17th place finish in the 400-meter dash, while Woods finished the 800-meter run in 25th place.

The men's relay teams finished their season in 11th place. Both the 4x100 and 4x400-meter relay teams ended their season in the preliminary rounds of the competition.

The lone Lady Bulldog began her quest toward NCAA greatness in the heptathlon on a high note. Harris ended day one of competition in fourth place with 3,482 points. The second day of the competition took its toll on first time NCAA Outdoor qualifier, and she finished her 2008 outdoor season with a 14th place finish in the heptathlon.

# Mississippi State University

Mississippi State is a comprehensive land-grant institution and the largest university in Mississippi, with a statewide enrollment of more than 16,000 students.

Established in 1878 as the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Mississippi, the university has traditional strengths in engineering and scientific agriculture but has evolved into a comprehensive institution with a diverse array of programs in teaching, research, and service.



# **Academics and Student Life**

Mississippi State students consistently earn honors such as the prestigious Harry S. Truman Scholarship, awarded for those who will enter public service, and, with 16 Truman Scholars to date, the university has been recognized as a Truman Honor Institution. In the past year, a student team competed for and won first place in a national Challenge X competition to redesign a fuel-efficient and environmentally-friendly SUV.

Recently initiated programs are providing opportunities to develop leadership potential and global study options. The university's Global Leadership Continuum provides "cradle-to-CEO" programming designed to develop leadership



across a "global" spectrum that begins with high school and continues through the university experience and into professional life. Included are the Young Guns Leadership Camp for rising high school seniors; the Day one Leadership Community for incoming freshmen, focusing on shared academic and service experiences; and the highly competitive Appalachian Leadership Honors Program for sophomores and juniors.

To complement these efforts, the university has launched a minor in leadership studies open to students in all majors. A university honor code adopted in 2007 institutionalizes a campus culture of integrity and personal responsibility in academic studies. Through the Global Leadership Program, students may experience significantly expanded study-abroad opportunities.



# **UNIVERSITY STORY**



### Research

Mississippi State faculty researchers attracted \$186.5 million in external funding for 2006-07, up from about \$155 million during the previous year. This funding supported 1,691 sponsored projects in 2007.

Based on the latest rankings available from the National Science Foundation, MSU ranks 7th in the nation in agricultural sciences research expenditures and 44th in engineering. Last year MSU faculty and staff disclosed 80 new technologies resulting in three new start-up companies, nine licenses, and 22 patent applications. The university now holds 77 patents.

In recent years, MSU has established the Thad Cochran Endowment for Entrepreneurship, as well as collaborating with federal agencies and industries to help increase technology-oriented start-up companies. Among the collaborators and sponsors are the U.S. departments of Defense and Energy, NASA, General Electric, Northrop Grumman, EADS/American Eurocopter, Boeing, Raytheon, General Dynamics, Israeli Aerospace Industry, and the Mississippi Technology Alliance.

In a key area of economic interest to Mississippi, MSU's Center for Advanced Vehicular Systems, established in 2001, continues research and development supporting a goal of attracting automotive industries to the state. The center is conducting research in areas that include materials processing, human and systems engineering, alternative power systems, computational manufacturing and design, and advanced learning technologies.

# **Outreach and Service**

From its academic programs to the work of countless individuals, Mississippi State has "extended farther" and gone "beyond the limit" to make a difference in the lives of citizens around the state. In 2006, the university formed the Mississippi State Community Action Team to organize university resources and expertise for quick response to local issues around the state. MSU's Extension Service is the first in the nation to have an interactive videoconferencing system in every county Extension office. Through the Freedom Calls program, the system is being used to connect Mississippians with family members in the U.S. military serving our country in Iraq.

The MSU Extension Service maintains offices in almost every county of the state, and the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station operates 10 branch stations throughout Mississippi. Four strategically located research and extension centers coordinate the delivery of services statewide.

Mississippi State student-athletes have been achievers on the playing fields and off them. For every Bulldog winning all-SEC or All-America honors, another earns recognition for academic achievement.

Players are coached to greatness throughout the MSU athletic program. Bulldog catcher EDWARD EASLEY
(R) was named the winner of the
2007 Coleman Company Johnny
Bench Award as the nation's top
collegiate catcher. Bench (L)
presented Easley with the award.
Easley also won the 2007 Cellular
South Ferriss Trophy as Mississippi's
top collegiate baseball player.

IYHIA McMICHAEL, who concluded her career in 2004, is the only two-time SEC Softball Athlete of the Year in league history.

LAURENT MIQUELARD (L) and JOC SIMMONS won the NCAA men's tennis doubles national championship in 1994. LAWRENCE ROBERTS was the SEC Player of the Year in 2004 and a national finalist for the Wooden Award, given annually to college basketball's top player.

As a relief pitcher with the Boston Red Sox, JONATHAN PAPELBON has been an MLB All-Star in each of his first three seasons.

JERIOUS NORWOOD concluded his football career in 2005 as the school's single-game and career rushing leader. He was named winner of the Conerly Trophy as the state's top college football player, was selected to play in the Senior Bowl, and was taken by the Atlanta Falcons in the NFL Draft.

care for their student-athletes and the school's sports programs. Each has a passion for their specialty, experience as a player and coach, and expertise to instruct at the highest levels. Their goal is to coach champions on the field and mold productive college graduates from the university's classroom.

CHRISTI SANDERS (back left) has the longest, consecutive coaching reign of any head coach at State, with 21 seasons at the helm of the women's golf program. She has twice been named SEC Coach of the Year (1990, 2000).

Former MSU baseball standout JOHN COHEN was introduced as Mississippi State's new baseball skipper in June 2008.

RICK STANSBURY, the winningest coach in MSU basketball history, has guided the Bulldogs to 208 wins and eight post-season appearances in his 10 seasons at State.

Energetic DAN MULLEN became Mississippi State's 32nd head football coach in December, 2008. Mullen, regarded as one of the top young minds in college football today, brings a vast amount of coaching experience with him to the Bulldog program, including two national championships.

NEIL MACDONALD is the only head coach to guide the MState soccer program to an SEC Tournament appearance in his first season (2004).



# Creat-Translars

CLAY HOMAN, a second-team all-SEC performer during his MState playing career, has led the men's golf program to 43 top 10 finishes in five years.

TRACY LANE has the most wins of any head women's tennis coach in MSU history. She directed the 2005 Lady Bulldogs to an SEC Western Division title and has guided MSU to four NCAA Championship berths in her 12 seasons at the State helm.

Returning home to coach his alma-mater, PER NILSSON was apart of the 1993 SEC Championship team.

JAY MILLER is one of the most respected coaches around the country, and a key contributor to USA Softball in various capacities. The NFCA Hall of Famer has directed the State softball program to five NCAA postseason appearances in his six seasons.

Now in his second decade as the head coach of the men's and women's track teams, AL SCHMIDT has coached three MState athletes to national titles.

# MSU has played in the SEC Football

Championship Game, the basketball Final Four, the baseball College World Series, and in numerous NCAA national title events since 1996. The last decade has brought overall achievement unmatched at State, and each new generation adds more hardware to the school's trophy cases.

The 1999 Maroon football team won its first eight games of the season, amassed 10 victories for just the second time in school history, and defeated Clemson in the Peach Bowl at Atlanta. Quarterback Wayne Madkin (above), State's all-time leading passer, was named the bowl game's Most Valuable Offensive Player.

State won the SEC Western

MSU's 1998 men's tennis team was one of two Bulldog squads that reached the NCAA semifinals, losing to perennial national champion Stanford. The '98 team was one of 10 State net teams that earned NCAA Sweet 16 berths from 1991-2001.

State's soccer team captured the 2001 SEC Western Division crown, the first SEC championship of any kind by an MSU women's team. That title came in just the sport's seventh year of existence on the campus.

# BROOK FROM STATE

The "thunder and lightning" duo of Rafael Palmeiro and Will Clark-guided the Bulldog baseball program to SEC regular season and tournament titles, and to a national third-place finish at the College World Series in 1985. The '85 team's finish was the best of MSU's seven CWS squads.

The 1995-96 Mississippi State men's basketball team earned the school's first-ever NCAA Final Four appearance after claiming the program's first SEC Tournament title and winning the SEC Western Division crown.

The Lady Bulldog basketball team has gone to eight postseason appearances under Head Coach Sharon Fanning, including four NCAA Tournament appearances.

TYRONE KEYS (center) starred for the MSU football team from 1977-80, won Super Bowl XX with the Chicago Bears, and is founder and president of All Sports Community Service, a Tampa-based firm that assists high-risk youth.

SAM NICHOLS lettered four years for the MState football team (1973-76) and is currently a Colonel in the United States Army.



# Mississippi State athletes play in some

Mississippi State athletes play in some of the nation's finest facilities. Almost ever Bulldog competition site has either been constructed or renovated in the last 15 years. During that time along, more than \$60 million in facility enhancements have been made.

DAVIS WADE STADIUM AT SCOTT FIELD: Near-sellout crowds have become the norm at Davis Wade Stadium at Scott Field, where the Bulldogs have played before masses reaching 85 percent of stadium capacity. Since the 2000 season when expansion and renovation projects gave the nation's second-oldest stadium a gleaming new look, crowds have grown by nearly 30 percent.



PITTS TENNIS CENTRE: Considered among the finest tennis facilities in the collegiate ranks, the modern, six-court, 1,000-seat A.J. Pitts Tennis Centre recently completed its 25th year serving the men's and women's programs. Recent enhancements at the facility include new locker areas and concession stands (1998) and a permanent press box (2004).

W.O. SPENCER STADIUM/ CARL MADDOX TRACK:

Co-named in honor of a two-time Mississippi State Olympian and a former MSU athletic director, the W.O. Spencer Stadium/Carl Maddox Track has served as host to the Southeastern Conference Outdoor Track and Field Championships three times since 1985, joining Tennessee as the most frequent host for that event during that time.



DUDY NOBLE FIELD, POLK-DEMENT STADIUM: One of the nation's leaders in baseball season ticket sales and attendance, Dudy Noble Field, Polk-Dement Stadium still holds the nation's on-campus single-game attendance mark — 14,991. With a seating capacity of more than 7,000 and more space in the world-famous outfield, Sports Illustrated magazine named the park, the "Best Place To Watch College Baseball" in a 1997 issue.



The 12,000-square foot, hardwood-floored Newell-Grissom Building serves as the home for Mississippi State's volleyball program and serves as a practice facility for both of the school's basketball programs. A state-of-the-art heating and air conditioning system was installed in 2004.

# Great-Places

HUMPHREY COLISEUM: Season ticket sales records and all-time attendance marks have also been set over the past decade by Bulldog and Lady Bulldog hasketball teams in the Humphrey Coliseum, the state's largest oncampus basketball arena. The latest addition to the facility was a \$1.8 million, center-hung, four-sided video scoreboard and jumbotron screen installed in 2004.

### MSU GOLF COURSE:

Nominated by Golfweek and Golf Digest magazines as one of the premier public golf courses in the United States, Mississippi State's championship University Golf Course is the home to the men's and women's programs. The 18-hole course was recently furnished with a 5,000-square-foot clubhouse, complete with locker areas, snack bar, golf shop and classroom.

MSU SOFTBALL FIELD: Constructed in 1997, the Mississi

MSU SOFTBALL FIELD: Constructed in 1997, the Mississippi State Softball Field has undergone almost constant improvement at the northern-most point of campus. Lights were added to the facility in 1998, brick work was added to the dugouts two years later and, in 2001, additional batting cages were built. In 2005, softball moved into a new locker, training and meeting facility adjacent to the park.

MSU SOCCER FIELD: Built in 1995, the lighted Mississippi State Soccer Field gives the Bulldog women one of the finest playing surfaces in the Southeast, a 114-yard long, 72-yard wide regulation NCAA Champion-ship field. The lush turf is Mississippi Pride grass, developed by researchers on the MSU campus.

# ATHLETIC TRAINING FACILITIES

### Jim and Julia Rouse Weight Room

Mississippi State athletes use top-of-the-line weight training machines that are apart of the Jim and Julia Rouse Weight Room located in the Shira Athletic complex.

A 9,000-square foot strength and conditioning room. Equipped with the latest technology in weight training, more than \$350,000 worth of equipment is housed in the Julia and Jim Rouse Weight Room. Jim Rouse, a 1962 graduate of MSU and an original member of the Bulldog Foundation, is the retired vice president of Exxon Mobile.







### **Hollomin Athletic Center**

A 46,000-square foot athletic center, providing Bulldog athletes with a locker room, equipment room and team meeting rooms, as well as a state-of-the-art athletic training area and strength and conditioning facility.



The Holliman Athletic Center is located just east of the Shira Athletic Complex, State's original practice facility, which was constructed in the 1970s.

# ATHLETIC TRAINING FACILITIES



### **Athletic Training Staff**

The medical team begins with the certified athletic trainers (ATC's) who interact with the student athletes on a daily basis. Each full time staff athletic trainer at Mississippi State is certified by the National Athletic Trainers' Association Board of Certification and is licensed in the state of Mississippi.

### **Athletic Training Room**

The Mississippi State Sports Medicine Department consists of six athletic training rooms at various athletic facilities to better serve our student athletes. The athletic training rooms are staffed by our seven full time staff members along with five graduate assistants and 20 student athletic trainers.



The new Columbus Orthopaedic Sports Medicine Center is equipped with the latest in modalities (inground whirlpools, ultrasound, electrical stimulation), rehabilitation equipment (including a Biodex and Hydroworx® therapy pool with an underwater treadmill), an x-ray machine, and a variety of additional equipment necessary to meet the needs of the elite collegiate athlete.


The Team Family Practice Physicians and Orthopedists are available at practice and in the athletic training room almost daily for consultation with the athletic trainers and student athletes.



### John C. Longest Student Health Center

Mississippi State University maintains a full service student health center on campus where our two Team Family Practice Physicians practice. They are supported by a lab, pharmacy, x-ray, physical therapy department, nutritionists, three additional physicians, four nurse practitioners, and a nursing staff.







The Shira Athletic Complex received it's second neighborhood addition in the past four years on Nov. 1 when the Templeton Athletic Academic Center was officially dedicated.

Mississippi State's student-athletes have enjoyed outstanding success in the classroom, and the new \$10 million facility provides state-of-the-art amenities that will help the Bulldogs and Lady Bulldogs continue that success while reaching new levels.

The Templeton Athletic Academic Center includes a large computer lab and individual computer rooms and work stations that will allow student-athletes access to a computer at their convenience. The building also houses academic counselor offices, large study areas, resource rooms, conference rooms and tutor rooms that will allow MState's academic staff the most efficient way to interact with student-athletes.

The two biggest areas of the State's newest facility are a 300-seat dining room and a large foyer that captures many of the team highlights and individual greats that have encompassed Mississippi State's rich athletic history.

Perhaps the greatest attribute of the Templeton Athletic Academic Center is the location. Situated

adjacent to the Shira Complex and Holliman Athletic Center, the facility stands in the heart of MSU's athletic facilities.

The structure is named for Larry Templeton, who served as Mississippi State's director of athletics from 1987-2008. Under his leadership, MState accomplished many great athletic feats. The football team reached six postseason bowl games, the men's basketball squad reached the Final Four and the baseball team went to the NCAA College World Series three times. State teams also claimed five Southeastern Conference championships under his guidance and advanced to NCAA championship play 29 times. The Bulldog softball team made seven of those trips in a nine-year stretch.

With all of the on-field accomplishments under Templeton's watch, State enjoyed even more success in the classroom. During the 2005-06 academic year, MSU's men and women athletes posted the highest combined grade-point average ever recorded in the 18 years of tracking student-athlete grades.

Head coach Jay Miller's softball Dogs have been an integral part of the school's academic success, landing 61 academic all-SEC honorees in his first six seasons. Last season, Chelsea Bramlett became the fourth Bulldog named ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-American, the third selected first team. Miller's 2008 contingent also set an academic record, having 10 named NFCA All-America Scholar-Athlete en route to claiming the eighth-highest grade-point average in Division I softball.

# MSU has played in the SEC Football

Championship Game, the basketball Final Four, the baseball College World Series, and in numerous NCAA national title events since 1996. The last decade has brought overall achievement unmatched at State. and each new generation adds more hardware to the school's trophy cases.

The 1999 Maroon football team won its first eight games of the season, amassed 10 victories for just the second time in school history, and defeated Clemson in the Peach Bowl at Atlanta. Quarterback Wayne Madkin (above), State's all-time leading passer, was named the bowl game's Most Valuable Offensive Player.

State won the SEC Western
Division title in 1998 and held a
fourth-quarter lead on eventual
national champion Tennessee in
the league championship game
at the Georgia Dome. The
Bulldogs' appearance in the
championship game garnered
the school a berth in the 1999
Cotton Bowl



MSU's 1998 men's tennis team was one of two Bulldog squads that reached the NCAA semifinals, losing to perennial national champion Stanford. The '98 team was one of 10 State net teams that earned NCAA Sweet 16 berths from 1991-2001.

State's soccer team captured the 2001 SEC Western Division crown, the first SEC championship of any kind by an MSU women's team. That title came in just the sport's seventh year of existence on the campus.



The "thunder and lightning" duo of Rafael Palmeiro and Will Clark-guided the Bulldog baseball program to SEC regular season and tournament titles, and to a national third-place finish at the College World Series in 1985. The '85 team's finish was the best of MSU's seven CWS squads.

The 1995-96 Mississippi State men's basketball team earned the school's first-ever NCAA Final Four appearance after claiming the program's first SEC Tournament title and winning the SEC Western Division crown.

The Lady Bulldog basketball team has gone to eight postseason appearances under Head Coach Sharon Fanning, including four NCAA Tournament appearances.

The MState men's golf team captured the school's second-consecutive SEC Tournament title in 1997 and participated in NCAA regional competition for just the second time in school history.

# MSU has the largest enrollment in the


MSU has the largest enrollment in the state of Mississippi. Founded as a landgrant institution, its grass, flowers and trees are as prevalent as buildings, sidewalks and parking lots. Large enough to sport diversity in all areas, the university still maintains a warm, friendly atmosphere.

Ruby Hall, a residence hall with the largest single room size in university history, opened opened in August 2006. A co-residential, 160,000-square foot, three-story freshman hall, Ruby is located at the north end of campus, in convenient proximity to the Colvard Union, the Perry Cafeteria, Mitchell Memorial Library, the Sanderson Center and all athletic facilities. Ruby Hall offers students the latest in technology, including Ethernet access, full wireless internet coverage, a refrigerator and microwave, and free cable with HBO in each room.

The Colvard Union is a popular meeting place for MSU students. Whether working on a group project, enjoying the food court, or simply relaxing, the student union is one of the campus' main meeting places.

The Chapel of
Memories and Carillon
Tower were built with
bricks from Old Main
Dormitory, the largest
residence hall in the
country when constructed, later
destroyed by fire in
1959. The Chapel of
Memories, which
hosts numerous
weddings each year, is
one of the most-recognized landmarks on
campus.

# W.O. SPENCER STADIUM / CARL MADDOX TRACK



### W.O. SPENCER STADIUM


Co-named in honor of two-time Olympian and a former MSU athletic director, the W.O. Spencer Stadium/Carl Maddox Track is the home of the Bulldog and Lady Bulldog track and field teams.

Dedicated on Nov. 13, 1982, with Maddox presiding, the W.O. Spencer Track Stadium was originally named in honor of one of MSU's all-time athletic greats.. A former Mississippi A&M track captain (1922) and track coach (1936-47). Spencer participated in the 1924 Olympics in Paris and the 1928 Olympics in Amsterdam. He was a member of the gold medal-winning mile relay team in the 1924 Olympics, and also ran on the steeple relay team in 1928.

### CARL MADDOX TRACK

Carl Maddox Track is a 400-meter, ninelane oval in addition to runways for use in the long jump, triple jump and pole vault events. The oval is a Sika/Bram "Granutan" track and is made of polyurethane, which provides a spike-resistant, highly resilient running surface.

The facility has served as host of three Southeastern Conference Outdoor Track and Field Championships - 1985, 1992 and 2002. MSU uses the facility to host two home meets each spring - The Jace Lacoste Invitational and the Bulldog Invitational along with a high school meet.



### CARL MADDOX TRACK INFIELD

Now in its third decade of service to Mississippi State's track and field program, the Spencer Stadium/Maddox Track was the vision of former MSU director of athletics Carl Maddox. In dire need of a new facility with a limited budget to work from, Maddox negotiated a deal with the Mississippi National Guard to provide all the engineering and much of the labor as a training exercise. The facility was completed at a cost of around \$250,000. The track grandstand, which seats 3,500 fans, was a gift from Leo W. Seal, Jr.

Mississippi State, 1984 Joined MState: January 2009

r. Mark Everett Keenum became Mississippi State's 19th president Jan. 5, 2009, following a distinguished public service career.

After completing his bachelor's and master's degrees in agricultural economics at Mississippi State, Dr. Keenum joined the university faculty in 1984 as a marketing specialist with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service. Two years later, he accepted a position as a research associate with the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station at MSU.

He continued his education at the university, in 1988 receiving a doctorate in agricultural economics, and he joined the faculty of that department as an assistant professor/economist. During his professional tenure at Mississippi State, his primary research and extension work focused on the marketing and economics of aquaculture, specialty crops and forestry. He continued his faculty ties at the university 1997-2006 as an adjunct professor, teaching an annual course on agricultural legislative policy.

Prior to being named president of Mississippi State in November 2008, Dr. Keenum served as Under Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture for two years, where he provided leadership and oversight for the Farm Service Agency, the Risk Management Agency and the Foreign

Agricultural Service. The mission area, comprised of the three agencies, had a total operating budget of \$1.7 billion and approximately \$40 billion in program authority. The three agencies employed more than 16,500 people at more than 2,300 offices nationwide and 98 locations around the globe.

In 1989, Dr. Keenum joined the Washington, D.C., staff of U.S. Senator Thad Cochran as Legislative Assistant for Agriculture and Natural Resources. As Sen. Cochran's adviser on agricultural affairs, he worked on numerous issues important to U.S. agriculture, including the 1990, 1996, and 2002 Farm Bills. From 1996-2006, he served as Chief of Staff for Sen. Cochran. In this role, Dr. Keenum was the chief adviser to the senator on political, legislative and appropriations issues. He also was responsible for managing all administrative and legislative functions of Sen. Cochran's Washington, D.C., office and three Mississippi offices, including direct oversight of the U.S. Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry and the U.S. Senate Committee on Appropriations.

Dr. Keenum and his wife Rhonda have four children.

hen Greg Byrne was named Mississippi State University's 15th Director of Athletics on February 21, 2008, he became the youngest top current athletic administrator in the Southeastern Conference. At 36 years of age, he also became the youngest to lead an athletic program at the NCAA Division I-A level.

Despite his age, Byrne is anything but inexperienced. He has been around successful athletic programs, and the director's chair at those institutions, literally all his life. He is the son of longtime athletic administrator Bill Byrne, currently the Director of Athletics at Texas A&M University.

Byrne, however, has made a name for himself intercollegiate athletics. He has 15 years of professional experience, a resume' that shows progressive growth in both responsibility and achievement. He has been directly involved in raising over \$120 million in gifts during his

career in athletics. He has finalized and implemented an annual giving renovation for athletics at three different institutions. Byrne has also helped in the reorganization of the athletic program at one school while renovating the department's budgeting systems, development, marketing

and compliance programs. Byrne was on the ground floor of resurrecting a football program and athletic department at another institution, one that achieved success for the first time in three decades.

Prior to being named to head State's athletic program, Byrne came to MSU in June 2006 as Associate Athletic Director for External Affairs. In just his first year on the job, Byrne initiated a first-ever volunteer fund-drive that resulted in 969 new Bulldog Club members for Mississippi State. He implemented a priority seating program for football and men's basketball that led to a \$1 million increase in annual giving. He also led the effort to package State's donor and ticketing software, in connection with the department's athletic web site, for fan convenience.

In doing so, MSU became the first Bowl Championship Series school to enlist XOS Technologies for total donor support in those areas. Byrne held a similar position at the University of Kentucky prior to coming to Starkville. As Associate Athletic Director for Development and

Fund-Raising at UK from 2002-05, he managed

the development staff and operated a multi-million dollar budget. He oversaw development efforts that raised annual gifts from \$4 million to \$9 million annually. While in Lexington, Byrne led a \$35 million athletic facility campaign, and participated in the design, funding and marketing for Kentucky's \$30 million basketball practice facility. He worked with a corporate sponsorship team to manage UK marketing and development efforts, including signing one of the nation's top multi-media rights packages.

Byrne was one of four members on the UK search committees that brought new head football and baseball coaches to the Wildcat athletic program. Byrne possibly made his greatest athletic program impact as Associate Athletic Director for Development at Oregon State University from 1998-2002. Managing an eight-person staff, he replaced an antiquated 60-year old fund-raising organization and increased annual giving from \$1 million to over \$5 million in cash during his tenure there. He assisted the Director of Major Gifts in raising more than \$30 million in capital gifts for facilities and budget enhancement while in Corvallis. He participated in securing a \$12.5 million gift to rename the Beavers' football stadium. Byrne was involved in the department's transition of corporate sponsorships for radio, television, stadium and arena signage and game program sales to increase revenue.

Byrne began his athletic fund-raising career as Regional Director of Development at the University of Oregon from 1995 through '98, overseeing development efforts for Portland, Southern and Central Oregon, Northern California and the Oregon coast. While overseeing the Duck's letterman's organization, he participated in raising \$14 million for an indoor football facility and soccer complex.

The energetic Byrne launched his professional career as Special Projects Coordinator for the Fiesta Bowl in Tempe, Ariz., from 1993-95. During that time, he managed a 1,000-person volunteer base for 63 Fiesta Bowl annual events.

A native of Pocatello, Idaho, Byrne earned his bachelor's degree from Arizona State University in 1994. He anticipates receiving his master's degree from Mississippi State this summer. Byrne is married to the former Regina Misa of Junction City, Ore., and the couple has two sons: Nick and Davis.



ANN CARR ASSOCIATE AD/WOMEN'S SPORTS Mississippi State, 1990 Joined MState: 1993

A veteran of 13 years in athletic administration at MSU and a former Lady Bulldog athlete, Ann Carr was named the university's associate athletic director for women's sports in June 2006.

Carr is in her second stint within the State athletic department following seven years as Assistant Athletic Director for Student Life. In that position, she worked with the personal development of MSU's student-athletes in addition to continuing her prior responsibilities as academic counselor for the Bulldog football team.

Carr serves as the director of the department's Life SKills program, which includes the support systems and career programs for all MSU student-athletes and its CHAMPS program (Challenging Athletes' Minds for Personal Success).

As SWA, Carr will oversee the operation and supervision of MSU's women's sport program. Hired in 1993 as an assistant director in the athletic academic office, she returned full-time to MState in 1999 following a one-year stay in a similar capacity at the University

of Southern Mississippi.

A native of Brookhaven, Miss., Carr was a fouryear letter winner on the Mississippi State women's basketball team (1986-90). When Carr finished her women's basketball playing career, she ranked first on the career leaders list in free-throw percentage, shooting 75.8 percent over a four-year span. She also ranked 12th on the career points list, having scored 762 points in her tenure, averaging 8.3 points per contest. In rebounding, Carr brought down 597 boards (6.5 per game) to finish her career sixth on the all-time list in rebounds and rebounding average. She also finished her career holding the individual record in most threepoint field goals made (five) in a single game.

A 1990 graduate of State, she later earned her master's degree in counseling from the institution in

### **EXPANSION OF DAVIS WADE STADIUM-\$30M**
