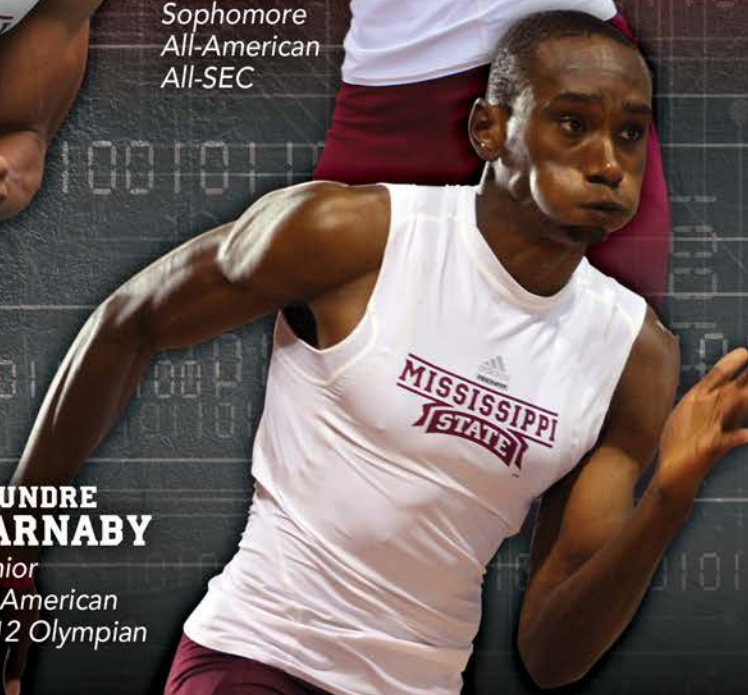

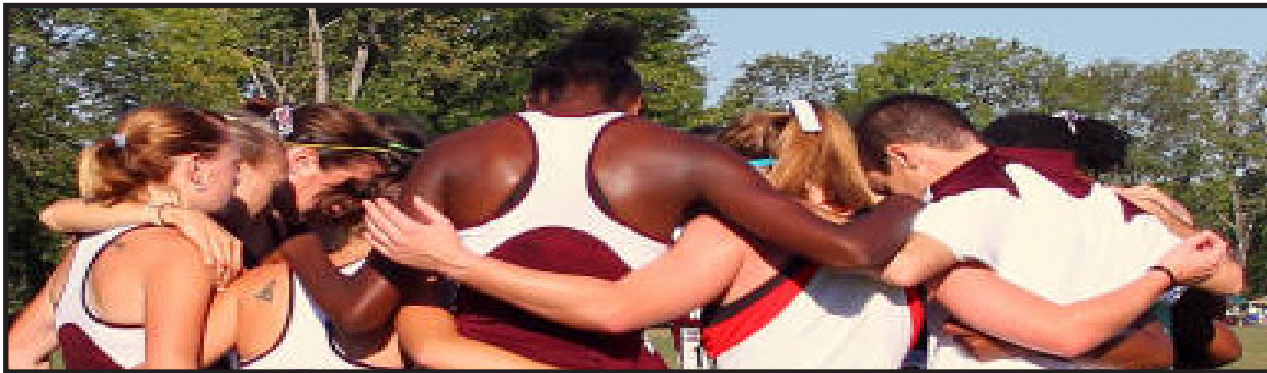

Al Schmidt

Director of Track & Field

Twenty-Fifth Season

St. Louis University, 1975

Al Schmidt is entering his third year as Director of Track and Field for Mississippi State. Regarded and respected nationwide as an authority on endurance running and training, Al Schmidt spent 23 seasons at the helm of Mississippi State's men's and women's track and field teams. Schmidt parlayed his 37 years of collegiate coaching experience into many individual and team accomplishments. In those 23 seasons, Schmidt has produced over 52 All-Americans and over 30 SEC champions.

In his first year as director, Schmidt organized a return of action at the newly renovated Carl Maddox Track and Field Complex. It had been over four years since a meet was held on MSU's campus and when Schmidt got ready to bring it back he did it in a big way. The former coach had always dreamed of hosting a major event in Starkville and on Saturday, March 26, 2011 that dream became a reality, as the first Big Ten/SEC Challenge was held. The Big Ten may have walked away victorious in both men's and women's competitions, but as the Challenge was brought back to Starkville in 2012, the women of the SEC were able to come back with a win.

In addition to the Big Ten/SEC Challenge, Schmidt was instrumental in bringing back two other annual events to MSU. The month of April saw the return of the Bulldog Twilight Invitational as well as the Jace Lacoste Invitational, which is held in memory of a former Bulldog track star.

During his third year as program director in 2012, he saw even more success as the season continued. He finished the season with SEC Championships in two events and 14 athletes in nine events qualifying for the NCAA Championships, while coaching 12 athletes to All-American honors.

Schmidt's final season as head coach at MSU was quite impressive. He coached seven Bulldog All-Americans, saw the Bulldogs have their seventh top 25 finish in the nation in the last nine years. MSU also finished 7th at the SEC Championships and 17th at the NCAA Championships. Nationally ranked every week of the season, MSU's men reached as high as eighth the week they entered the NCAA Championships. The Bulldogs also had a record number of All-SEC Academics in

2010, with 15.

2010 also saw Schmidt coach three Lady Bulldog All-Americans, and see the Lady Bulldogs set records for the most national qualifiers and the most points by the team at the SEC Championships. Additionally, the women had a record number of All-SEC Academics with 18.

In 2009, Schmidt tutored six athletes to All-American status. Marrissa Harris was the lone Lady Bulldog to achieve the honor. The men's 4x100-meter relay team, John Bailey, D'Angelo Cherry, Justin Christian and Dwight Mullings, ran a school record 39.06 seconds to claim fourth place at the NCAA Championships. The men's team added three more All-Americans to the Bulldog team, with Cherry achieving recognition in the 100-meter dash, Mullings in the 400-meter dash, and Emanuel Mayers for his performance in the 400-meter hurdles.

MSU sent 16 athletes to the 2009 Mid-east Regional Championships. Six Lady Bulldogs traveled to Louisville, Ky., to compete for NCAA Championship tickets. Wendy Copeland made her third trip to the post season, qualifying in the long and triple jump and 4x100-meter relay. Ten Bulldogs made the trip to the post season, with two relays (4x100 and 4x400) and the sprint events being the team's focus. Bulldogs Mayers (400-meter hurdles), Mullings (400-meter dash), and the 4x100-meter relay all claimed top honors at the Regional Championships.

In 2008, Schmidt coached two athletes to become SEC Champions. Marrissa Harris won the heptathlon with a school record of 5,600 points. Jamil Hubbard won the 400-meter SEC title. During the SEC Outdoor Meet, 14 athletes qualified for the NCAA Regional Meet and 10 athletes scored in their events. The men placed eighth and the women placed 11th.

At the NCAA Regional meet, two Bulldogs-Jamil Hubbard and Golden Coachman, won titles in the 400- and the 800-meter runs. O'Neal Wilder took second in the 400-meter behind Hubbard, while Chris Woods took fourth in the 800-meter. The 4x400-meter relay team, consisting of Wilder, Hubbard, Woods, and Mayers, took first. The men's team placed sixth. The 4x100-meter relay and Kendall May received at-large bids to the NCAA

National Meet. Marrissa Harris qualified in the heptathlon.

The highlight of the 2008 season for Schmidt was being named the coach for the U.S. Men's Under-23 team at the NA-CAC Championships.

In 2007, Schmidt guided five Bulldogs to All-American status. Schmidt also witnessed three school records broken. At the SEC Championships, the men's team had a total of four athletes score 30 points to finish 11th overall. Among those scorers included Golden Coachman and Travis McKay scoring in the 800-meter run and 3000-meter steeplechase.

Out of the 21 events the Bulldogs competed in, 62 of the athletes marked a personal best in their respective event. There were also six regional qualifiers for the men's team and two relay regional marks met. Bruce Davis, Ezra Jones, Nathan Daniels and Arthur Davis finished fourth at the NCAA Championships, with a time of three minutes, 3.49 seconds.

On 22 separate times during the 2007 season, 15 Lady Bulldogs met their personal best marks, along with seven regional qualifiers. Marrissa Harris finished fourth in the heptathlon at the SEC Championships with a personal-best 5,242 points, along with Jennifer McPherson who finished fourth in the 1500-meter run with a time of 4:20.87, and Michelle Corrigan who took sixth in the 10000-meter run with a time of 37:15.760. A total of 16 Lady Bulldogs scored a total of 19 points for MSU as they finished 11th at the meet.

In 2005, Schmidt witnessed six Bulldogs garner All-America accolades. At the 2005 NCAA Outdoor Championships, Elzie Coleman, Arthur Davis, LaChristopher Lewis and Jamel Ashley ran a school-record 3:01.63 to finish fifth in the 4x400-meter relay. Ashley placed second in the 400, while Lewis took 11th in the long jump to earn his first All-America honor in the event. At the Mid-east Regional, Steve Mullings won the 100-meter dash title. Lewis also won the long jump title, while Ashley finished second in the 400-meter dash. Travis McKay finished seventh in the steeplechase, setting the third-best time in school history. As a team, the Bulldogs finished 19th in the last Trackwire 25 of the season.



On the women's side, Meggan Hodge broke the MSU school record in the 3000-meter steeplechase with a 10:46.04 eighth-place finish at the SEC Championships. Jasmine Walls cleared a personal best to tie for second in the high jump. Crystal Averitt ended her career atop the all-time list in the hammer throw, while Lacey Johnson extended her school record in the pole vault.

Three-time All-American Tiffany McWilliams closed out her MSU career in 2004 by becoming the most decorated female athlete in Lady Bulldog track and field history. McWilliams repeated her 2003 feat of winning the outdoor 1500-meter title and also won the NCAA Indoor title in the mile. Behind McWilliams and a strong distance corps, MSU achieved a No. 12 national ranking.

On the men's side, decathlete and All-American Trey Hardee set a school record in the event after tallying 8,041 points in a second-place finish at the NCAA Outdoor Championships. Five Bulldogs were named All-Americans in 2003. Ashley, Davis, Lewis and Keston Nelson all earned the recognition following a third-place finish in the 4x400-meter relay at nationals. Ashley picked up the honor in the 400-meter dash in addition to the 4x4.

In 2003, McWilliams became the first woman in MSU track and field history to win a national championship. Running 4:06.75, McWilliams broke an NCAA Championships record en route to winning the 1500-meter run. She was also crowned SEC indoor champion in the mile, in addition to the outdoor 800- and 1500-meter runs.

At the Outdoor Championships, State tallied the second-highest point total with 20 points. MSU finished tied for 15th. Hardee took fifth in the decathlon for his first all-America honor, while Kelvin Harris ran 13.86 in the 110-meter hurdles to earn his first All-America nod.

The men topped all previous indoor squads at the NCAA Indoor Championships. The Bulldogs scored 15 points to score in the top 10 for the first time in school history. Browne won the 60-meter dash title (6.60), while Marquis Davis finished second in the 200 (20.70).

During 2002, Schmidt and the MSU program hosted the SEC Outdoor Championships. At the meet, State's men scored 35 points as a team, the second-highest total of an MSU squad since his arrival. He also witnessed the men's program tally its highest points total since 1991 at the SEC Indoor Championship.

Elisha Williams became the school's first indoor all-American in 2001 after taking second in long jump. Later in the season, Williams became the second woman to become a double All-American in the same year. Schmidt also helped Falilatou Ogunkoya finish her MSU career in 2001 as a five-time All-American, and Camille Harper closed out her career as an All-American in the 100-meter dash.

The 1990s saw Aki Bradley benefit from the tutelage of Schmidt. Bradley became a double All-American at the 1994 NCAA Outdoor Championships, placing in both the 100- and 200-meter sprints. In 1992, MSU hosted the SEC Outdoor meet; the Bulldogs finished seventh overall.

Schmidt's first men's team in 1989 showed immediate improvement, finishing fifth at both the SEC Indoor and Outdoor Championships; marking the first time in five years the Bulldogs finished in the top half of the conference.

During Schmidt's first three years, he saw Festus Igbinoehene earn six All-American awards in horizontal jumps, including three runner-up finishes in the triple jump.

ACADEMICS

Under Schmidt, State's squads have also excelled in the classroom. Over 200 student-athletes have been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll. Three athletes - Rob Irwin, Tina Bridgeman and April Ecke- each earned Academic all-America honors. Dis-

tance runner Ecke earned the 1993 H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar Athlete of the Year. Chris Boldt earned First Team Academic All-District honors from the College Sports Information Directors of America in 2003, while Matt Denton collected the honor in 2005. Joining Boldt and Denton in 2006 and 2007 was Ryan Irwin who finished First Team Academic all-District for the Men and Joy Griffith who finished First Team Academic All-District for the Women. Zita Magloire finished with Second Team Academic All-District honors in 2006. Also, in 2006 the Lady Bulldogs were selected by the USTFCCCA, as an All-Academic Team. In 2007, both cross country teams were selected as All-Academic Teams.

PRIOR TO MSU

Before coming to MSU, Schmidt was instrumental in the success of Florida State University's track and field program. First serving as assistant women's track coach and head cross country coach, he later became an assistant men's track coach and head cross country coach. Under his guidance, the Lady Seminoles won two national titles- the 1984 outdoor and 1985 indoor titles. The FSU women also claimed runner-up honors at the 1983 and 1985 outdoor meets.

Upon earning his bachelor's degree from St. Louis University, Schmidt made his coaching debut as an assistant cross country coach at the University of Missouri-St. Louis before returning to his alma mater as head men's track coach for the next five years. After spending two years in private business, Schmidt returned to the track in 1982 as a graduate assistant at the University of Kansas. Following his one season at KU, he began his six-year stint at Florida State.

PERSONAL

In 1997, Schmidt served as a District 9 representative for the NCAA Women's Cross Country Championships. Having rewritten the endurance curriculum for Levels I and II, Schmidt served as the vice-chairman of USA Track and Field' Coaches Education Committee. Schmidt, 59, is married to the former Jessie Garfield of St. Louis, Mo. They are the parents of two children - daughter, Sara Lynne and son, Daniel.

Steve Dudley begins his 13th year at Mississippi State and his third in the role of head coach. Since returning to his alma mater in 2000, Dudley has tutored over 20 athletes to All-American status. Last season, Dudley was an integral part in the accomplishments of both the men's and women's track teams. Dudley wanted to prove that MSU meant business, ending his first season with six athletes named to first or second team All-SEC; three named to the All-Freshman SEC team and had a total of seven athletes garner first, second or honorary All-American honors.

MSU displayed dominance in 2012 during the indoor season with Favian Cowards winning an individual SEC Championship, throwing a personal best 66-05 in the weight throw, and also setting five new school records. The 2012 outdoor season ended with 14 athletes competing in eight events at the NCAA Championship in Iowa. The overall season broke multiple records and set a precedent for the hopeful 2013.

Among the 2011 Maroon and White ranks were a couple of SEC Champions. On the Lady Bulldogs side there was Rochelle Farquharson who was named SEC Freshman Field Event Athlete of the Year after winning the SEC Long Jump Championships. For the Bulldogs it was the 4x400-meter squad of James Harris, Daundre Barnaby, Randy Patterson and O'Neal Wilder who under Dudley's guidance claimed the SEC Championship.

2011 also marked the third year in a row that the Bulldogs finished in the Top 20 at the NCAA Championships and the ninth time in ten years they had finished in the Top 25. It was also the eighth year for the Bulldogs to end the season ranked in the Top 25 nationally, coming in at No. 22.

Helping to earn that No. 22 spot were the nine individual athletes who were ranked in the Top 25 in eight different categories. Harris posted the highest ranking at No. 5 in the high jump, while the men's 4x400-meter quartet of Harris, Wilder, Barnaby and Tavaris Tate finished at No. 6 and the 4x100-meter squad of Kendall May, D'Angelo Cherry, Garren Hendricks and Tate ranked 11th. Also individually ranked were Cherry at 8th in the 100-meter dash, Tate at 21st in the 400-meter dash, Emanuel Mayers at 25th in the 400-meter hurdles and Marcus Jackson at 16th in the high jump.

The Lady Bulldogs ended their 2011 campaign with six athletes ranked nationally. Jessica Merriweather paced the group at 13th in the high jump, followed by Richesa McCaleb

at 17th in the 200-meter dash and Haley Greenwell at 30th in the 10,000-meter run. Also ranked were Rochelle Farquharson at 30th in the long jump and 39th in the triple jump and Taneisha Baker who came in at 38th in the 400-meter dash. In 2010, Dudley watched the Bulldogs earn their seventh Top 25 finish nationally in the last nine years. The Bulldogs also finished seventh at the SEC Championships and 17th at the NCAA Championships. Nationally ranked every week of the season, MSU's men have reached as high as eighth as they entered the NCAA Championships. 2010 the Bulldogs had a record number of All-SEC Academics with 15. The Bulldogs returned 13 All-SEC performers for the 2011 track and field season.

Dudley also saw the Lady Bulldogs set records for the most national qualifiers and the most points by the team at the SEC Championships. Additionally, the women placed a record number of All-SEC Academics performers with 18. 2011 looks to be a good year for the Lady Bulldogs as they return the most point scorers ever, as well as eight All-SEC performers.

Dudley coached seven All-Americans in 2010, including freshman Tavaris Tate. In his first season as a Bulldog, Tate laid an impressive foundation for years to come. Tate began his successes with the indoor season as he set personal records in both the 200- and 400-meter dashes. In the 400m, Tate broke the MSU school record and recorded a NCAA automatic qualifying time. The outdoor season was no different for Tate, as he continued to set personal records. The 400-meter dash was Tate's standout moment, he set a MSU freshman record and an Alabama Relays record. Dudley has always been a great teacher in the relays and 2010 was no different. During the indoor season, Dudley coached Tate, Emmanuel Mayers, Alex Richter, and Dwight Mullings to a MSU school record setting performance in the 4x400-meter relay. The outdoor season was really the time that MSU's relay teams shined as the 4x200-meter team of O'Neal Wilder, Mullings, Tate, and Mayers set a personal record and broke the MSU school record at the Texas Relays; while the 4x400-meter team of Wilder, Mullings, Tate, and Kendall May placed second at the NCAA Championships.

In 2010, Dudley coached Kendall May, Justin Christian, Dwight Mullings, Tavaris Tate to a SEC Championship in the 4x100m relay.



In 2009, Dudley had five Bulldogs earn All-America accolades, including freshman sprinter D'Angelo Cherry who recorded a personal-best 10.07 seconds in the 100-meter dash. He also tutored Emanuel Mayers to a 50.06 second 400-meter hurdle time, good enough for second in MSU history. Dudley has always been a master of relays, and 2009 was no exception. His 4x100-meter relay team finished 5th at the NCAA Championships and his 4x400-meter relay team earned medalist honors at the Mideast Regional Championships.

2008 saw Dudley lead eight Bulldog sprinters to regional qualifying marks, including two individuals in the 400-meter dash and two in the 800-meter run. He also coached Jamil Hubbard to become an SEC Champion in the 400-meter dash and coached several athletes to NCAA Regional Championships in the 400-meter dash, the 800-meter run and the 4x400-meter relay last year. Dudley coached Kendall May to an eighth-place finish in the 100-meter dash at the NCAA Championships. He also coached O'Neal Wilder to become a USA Track and Field Junior National Champion in the 400-meter dash, a bronze medal at the World Jr. Championships in the 400-meter

dash and a gold medal in the 4x400-meter relay. Golden Coachman, Bruce Davis, Chris Woods, Kendall May, John Bailey, Emanuel Mayers and O'Neal Wilder made postseason trips.

The 2007 tandem of State's 4x400-meter relay team of B. Davis, Nathan Daniels, Arthur Davis and Ezra Jones bested their previous finish from 2006, finishing in 3:03 taking fourth place. Coachman and the quartet all gained all-America honors. The 2006 edition of State's 4x400-meter relay team of juniors B. Davis, Jones, A. Davis and Daniels ran 3:05 to finish 7th at the NCAA Outdoor Championships.

In the quartet earned A. Davis his third all-America honor, while B. Davis, Jones and Daniels collected their first. In 2005, Dudley guided State's 4x400-meter relay squad to a fifth-place finish at the national championships and broke a school record held for more than a decade (3:01.63). As a result, senior Jamel Ashley, freshman Elzie Coleman, A. Davis, senior LaChristopher Lewis, Kendall Pyant II and Chris Woods earned all-America status. In the 4x100-meter relay, Ashley, Lewis, sophomore Elliott Morant and Mullings tied a school record with a 39.09 clocking at the Texas Relays. Mullings, Ashley, Davis and Lewis

combined to finish third in the event at the SEC Championships. Since the 2003 Penn Relays, the Bulldogs have failed to win the 4x200-meter relay only once. Former Bulldog Steve Mullings posted the fastest regional-qualifying time in the country in the 100-meter dash (10.06) and won the Southeastern Conference and Mideast Regional championships. In his final season for the Maroon and White, Jamel Ashley garnered all-America honors with a second-place finish in the 400-meter dash at the national championships. Ashley's 44.75 broke a school record he set a day earlier.

At the 2004 SEC Championships, Ashley, Davis, Keston Nelson and Lewis finished second in the 4x4. Ashley took eighth in the 400m at the national meet, while the 4x400 squad finished third.

Pierre Browne was named the 2003 NCAA Indoor National Champion in the 60-meter dash and finished runner-up in the 100m at the outdoor national meet. Marquis Davis finished second in the 200m at the outdoor national meet the same season. Throughout the season, four of Dudley athletes accumulated six all-America honors. In Dudley's first season in Starkville his athletes earn eight all-America accolades.

Steve Thomas made his return to MSU track and field in 2011 as the new assistant coach for jumps. Thomas joined the staff after spending the previous three seasons in the high school ranks at St. Patrick Catholic H.S. Prior to that, he was at the University of Kentucky for two years.

In his second year back at MSU, Thomas found success continually throughout the year. With new and returning athletes, he led MSU jumpers to break school records and receive multiple personal bests at the SEC Indoor Championships. Thomas also flourished in the 2012 outdoor season as he accompanied sophomore Marcus Jackson to Iowa for the NCAA Championship for the high jump.

First year - Thomas had quite the prosperous year as he coached a SEC Champion who was also named the SEC Freshman Field Event Athlete of the Year, placed two on the All-American lists and placed an athlete on the second team All-SEC list. Under the direction of Thomas, Rochelle Farquharson single-handedly placed Lady Bulldog jumps on the map with her performance at the 2011 SEC Outdoor Championships.

On the men's side of things, Thomas had the pleasure of coaching James Harris and Marcus Jackson, two freshmen that also had pretty impressive years. Jackson made his claim for fame at the 2011 Outdoor SEC Championships as he finished second in the high jump to claim second team All-SEC honors and find a spot on the SEC All-Freshman list. Jackson also put on quite the show at the NCAA Championships as he jumped 6-10 $\frac{3}{4}$ to earn second-team All-American honors. It was also at the NCAA Championships that Harris made his impact, as he finished fourth overall to earn All-American honors.

Steve Thomas made his return to MSU track and field in 2011 as the new assistant coach for jumps. Thomas joined the staff after spending the previous three seasons in the high school ranks at St. Patrick Catholic H.S. Prior to that, he was at the University of Kentucky for two years.

While at the University of Kentucky, Thomas made his mark coaching a six-time all-America honoree in the shot put and helping the female throwers produce impressive marks in their quest for championships.

Prior to his work at Kentucky, Thomas served as an assistant coach at the University of Florida where he built upon his already impressive resume by coaching nine All-Americans, six Southeastern Conference champions and a pair of NCAA East Region champions. In his career, he has tutored individuals who have won nearly 40 conference championship titles.

As head coach of both the men's and women's cross

country and track and field programs at University of South Alabama from 1992 to 1998, he received four Sun Belt Conference Coach-of-the-Year awards.

Also at South Alabama, Thomas brought the women's squad to a school-best second place finish at the 1994 Sun Belt Indoor Championships and fourth-place bests in four of his six years at the outdoor meet. He expanded and developed nearly every facet of the Jaguar program, producing 20 Sun Belt Conference Champions and the first NCAA qualifier in the history of the South Alabama.

During his previous tenure as the head field events coach at Mississippi State from 1988 to 1992, Thomas trained two all-Americans and six all-Sec athletes. A group of athletes that combined earned 11 individual conference titles under his direction.

Thomas is known on the international stage for his instruction skills, conducting clinics in Australia, Belgium, England, Germany, Mexico and Switzerland, as well as a two-week clinic in China in 1994.

An all-district distance runner at Oklahoma Christian College, Thomas received his undergraduate there in 1981 before earning his master's degree in education from Stephen F. Austin State University in 1983.

Thomas is a native of Saraland, Ala. He is married to the former Kim Eades, and the couple has one daughter-Kayleigh Lauren.

Houston Franks returned home to Mississippi State in 2004 as an assistant track and field coach. An accomplished distance runner for the Maroon and White from 1994-98, Franks coaches and develops men's distance runners and served his first season as head cross country coach in 2009.

The ninth year as men's cross country head coach and first as women's head coach is an integral part to the recent success of the MSU Lady Bulldog and Bulldog cross country programs. Franks helped the Lady Bulldogs to fifth-place finishes at both the 2010 SEC Championships and the NCAA South Regional, while leading the Bulldogs to seventh and 10th place finishes in the respected events. The fifth-place finish for the Lady Bulldogs at the SEC Championships tied MSU's best finish to date which occurred in 2006.

Also in 2010, Franks coached sophomores Haley Greenwell and Renee Masterson on their way to earning all-SEC and all-Region accolades; along with senior Adam Lenz as he earned all-SEC honors.

In the past five seasons, Franks has tutored the MSU men's distance squads to breaking four school records (indoor 3,000m, outdoor 10,000m, 4x1500-meter relay and 4x800-meter relay), and moving into the MSU all-time ranks in steeplechase, 10,000-, 5,000-, 3,000- and 1500-meter runs, distance medley relay.

Most recently, Franks guided the 2012 men's cross country team to a Top 5 finish at the NCAA South Regional. The Bulldogs spot in fifth not only tied their best regional finish in history, but also placed them ahead of SEC foes Alabama, Auburn, Ole Miss, Tennessee and Vanderbilt.

Prior to returning to Starkville, Franks spent five years at Southwest Missouri State University (now Missouri State University). While at SMS, Franks served as head cross country coach for the Bears and won three Missouri Valley Conference women's titles. His women's teams finished in the top four at the NCAA Midwest Regional's during his last three years and his men's squads finished in the top half of the conference during all five seasons. During the track and field season, the Bears captured three indoor and outdoor league championships on the women's side.

Franks was a three-time MVC Coach of the Year in women's cross country. During the 2002-03 season, he

was also a part of the first SMS squad since 1993-94 to win the league's coveted Triple Crown championships in cross country and both indoor and outdoor track and field.

Franks was also a graduate assistant at MSU under Al Schmidt during the 1998-99 season. While an assistant, he developed training programs for distance runners, coordinated team travel, recruiting, and meet administration.

While running for the Maroon and White, Franks was considered MSU's top distance runner and was named to the Southeastern Conference's Academic Honor Roll three times. He currently ranks fourth on MSU's all-time list in the indoor 3000-meter run.

Franks is a 1998 MSU graduate with a teaching and coaching degree. He received his master's degree in sport administration from MSU in August 2009.

The Tupelo, Miss., native was a four-year letter winner at Tupelo High School and was named an all-American in cross country his senior season. A state champion in both cross country and the two-mile run, he was named an all-State selection three times during his track and field career at THS.

He and his wife, the former Meggan Hodge, were married in December 2007. The couple welcomed their first child, daughter named Madison, in October 2010.

April Thomas enters her fifth season as coach of MSU's throws athletes. During her tenure with the Bulldogs, Thomas has helped heptathlete Marrissa Harris earn indoor and outdoor all-American and all-SEC accolades by tutoring her to personal-best in the shot put. Thomas coached LaQuinta Aaron to personal-best throws in the shot put that helped her earn provisional qualifications in the heptathlon for the 2009 NCAA Outdoor Championships.

Thomas also watched decathletes Darryl Brady and Martin Lee earn Top 8 finishes in the decathlon at the outdoor SEC Championships and also throw personal-best in the shot put and the discus.

Most recently, Thomas led Favian Cowards to all-American honors in the 2012 season, coupled with a ninth-place national finish. Cowards, with guidance from Thomas, threw a personal best 66-05 to win MSU's first SEC Championship in the weight throw. Cowards throw also set a new MSU all-time record and earned her a spot on the 2012 all-SEC team. In 2011, Thomas coached Cowards to top finishes, before seeing the junior conclude her season with a fifth place finish at the SEC Outdoor Championships.

Thomas had the pleasure of seeing Ed Wesela post five regular season victories in 2011 in the shot put, before placing third in the event at the SEC Championships. It was also under Thomas' direction that Wesela was named a member of the 2011 SEC Community Service Team.

In 2010, Thomas coached Cowards through her emergence onto the track and field throwing scene. Thomas tutored Cowards to a personal-best weight throw to earn

eighth-place at the 2009 SEC Indoor Championships, where she earned all-SEC accolades. In 2010, she led Cowards to a school record setting indoor 20-pound weight throw of 59-01 ½, and a 5th place spot on the MSU all-time performance list for the hammer throw.

Additionally in 2010, Thomas guided Wesela to personal-bests in the shot put and discus that helped him earn all-SEC honors in both events.

Thomas comes to MSU after coaching boys' and girls' shot put and discus at Knoxville (Tenn.) Catholic High School. Her primary responsibilities at MSU are coaching throwers. She also coached with the Knoxville Track Club.

A native of Albany, Ga., Thomas earned her degree in sociology from University of Tennessee in 2007. Prior to UT, she competed at Cloud County (Kansas) Community College. At the 2006 SEC Indoor Championships, Thomas finished as runner-up in the shot put. She also has three other Top 5 SEC finishes to her credit in the event. She currently ranks sixth on UT's all-time outdoor performers list in the shot put and seventh in hammer throw, sixth on the all-time indoor weight throw and fifth on the school's all-time indoor performers list in the shot put. Thomas helped UT win the 2005 SEC Indoor Championship. She was part of Tennessee's 2005 NCAA Mideast Regional team that captured the program's first victory at that event.

Garfield Ellenwood II is in his second year as an assistant coach at Mississippi State. He entered this role after serving at Bethune Cookman (B-CU) in Daytona Beach, Florida. Ellenwood arrived at MSU with a wealth of coaching experience on both the national and collegiate level, as well as on the youth-aged circuit as an AAU coach.

While at B-CU, Ellenwood coached Ronnie Ash to the 2009 indoor and outdoor Division I National Championship in both the 60m and 110m hurdles. Also while at B-CU, he helped the men's team move up two places in the outdoor rankings. Prior to his time at B-CU, Ellenwood spent two years as an assistant coach at the University of Las Vegas (UNLV), where he helped guide the Runnin' Rebels women's program into a national competitor. Before UNLV, Ellenwood spent two years as an assistant coach at Campbell University in Buies Creek, N.C., and enjoyed a stint as a volunteer assistant coach at Essex County College in Newark, N.J. Ellenwood also coached track & field athletes in his hometown of Rochester, N.Y., including volunteer efforts with SWAN (Southwest Area

Neighborhood) and the National Youth Sports Program (NYSP).

During his time as a collegiate coach, Ellenwood found time to coach on the international level. During the summer of 2005, he served as an assistant coach at the World Junior Championships in Windsor, Canada. While there, he helped coach six gold medalists and a total of 17 medalists for Team USA. Also in 2005, Ellenwood served as an assistant coach for the 2005 World University Games for the men's track team which competed in Izmir, Turkey. Then in 2006, Ellenwood served as the head coach of the Liberian National Team for the upcoming 2008 Olympics in Beijing, China.

Ellenwood performed on the track professionally as a sprinter. Most recently, representing the United States at the 2002 Penn Relays where he was a member of the USA Red 4x200 meter relay squad. In 2000, Ellenwood competed at the United

Olympic Trials in both the 100 and 200 meter dash competitions and placed fourth overall in 200-meter dash at the United States Indoor Championships.

Ellenwood was an All-America athlete at Seton Hall, where he set a Big East record in the 55-meter dash during the indoor season, as well as finishing third in the event in the 1997 NCAA Indoor Championship. During his career, Ellenwood won five Big East titles and was a three-time All-American.

Off the track, Ellenwood enjoyed a brief stay with the Rochester Brigade during the 2001 Arena Football League season. A native of Rochester, N.Y., he is married to the former Joyce Harris, and the couple has one daughter- Diamond.

Entering his eighth season assisting with the Mississippi State track and field program is Joe Gant. Gant, a former two-year letter winner on the Bulldog track squad in 1974 and 1975, works daily with the MSU decathletes and pole vault competitors. The Vaiden, Miss. native came to State in 1974 after a two-year stint in the junior college ranks in Mississippi. He turned in a personal best 15 feet, six inches in the pole vault competition and placed second in the Southeastern Conference decathlon with 7,041 points. His total in the event is a school record (old javelin).

After his collegiate days, Gant remained in Mississippi in the high school football ranks at Weir High School

The Bulldogs were hungry to return to competition, after the team closed the 2011 season by tying for 20th at the NCAA Championships. Highlighting the 2012 season was James Harris, Marcus Jackson, Tavaris Tate, D'Angelo Cherry, Emanuel Mayers and Daundre Barnaby, who were all named All-Americans at the 2012 NCAA Indoor Championships.

Beginning the season on the road at the Louisiana Classics, a pair of field victories started things off for the Bulldogs as Marcus Jackson and Ed Wesela claimed top billing in the high jump (7-02 ½) and shot put (56-01 ¼) respectively. The Bulldogs picked up a trio of Top 5 distance finishes, and the foursome of Trevarus Christian, Justin Christian, Garren Hendricks and Samuels finished fourth in the 4x100 meter relay.

MSU continued its season hosting the second annual SEC/Big Ten Challenge, where the men captured seven first-place victories. Jarrett Samuels picked up the first Maroon and White victory as he jumped 25-04.50 to post a MSU freshman record and to move to fifth on the MSU all-time list in the long jump. Jason Harper was next as he had a winning triple jump length of 49-01.50. MSU then picked up a pair of victories in the hurdles as Emanuel Mayers crossed the line first in the 400-meter hurdles (50.68) ahead of Nathan Arnett who finished third (51.69). Roles were reversed in the 110-meter hurdles as this time was Arnett (14.01) finishing first ahead of Mayers who was second with a time of 14.14. Tavaris Tate stepped up next, as he claimed victory in the 400-meter dash with a time of 46.07. The Bulldogs' action fell short of topping the Big Ten's performances.

Samuels had been at the top of the leader board in the long jump, and as the team traveled to Austin, Texas for the 85th Clyde Littlefield

Texas Relays, he continued the streak. The freshman can now add collegiate No. 1 to his resume, as he jumped 26-02.50 to claim victory. Other Bulldogs spent the weekend in Oxford for the Ole Miss Invitational, where Jason Harper was the top finisher for the Bulldogs, placing third in the triple jump (51-02.75).

The Battle on the Bayou saw much success from the Bulldogs, as the men finished second to SEC foe LSU. Tavaris Tate and James Harris were the big finishers on the day, as the pair picked up first and second place in the 400-meter dash. Tate who ran 45.45 to claim the victory, also moved into the No. 1 spot on the national collegiate list, while Harris's personal best time of 45.58 placed him second on the day and No.2 in the nation.

When Mississippi State embarked on the Jace Lacoste Invitational they had a goal of honoring a former Bulldog; and when the dust settled they had risen to the challenge by capturing 12 victories and an additional 17 Top 5 finishes. Austin Britton started things off for the Bulldogs as he competed in the javelin. Britton threw a personal best 189-01 to claim victory. James Harris also captured his first victory of the day as he jumped 6-10.75 to take the high jump title. Harris later returned to the track to capture the 100-meter dash crown with a time of 10.64. The Bulldogs continued the winning streak as Ed Wesela (55-08.50) took the shot put, Jason Harper (51-02.75) was first in the triple jump and Nathan Arnett (51.52) led the charge in the 400m hurdles. Emanuel Mayers then claimed second in the 110-meter hurdles, just moments before Tavaris Tate (46.56) and Randy Patterson (48.48) finished second and fifth in the 400-meter dash.

The Bulldogs then headed to the Plains to continue top performances at the War Eagle Invitational in Auburn. Wesela and Samuels

were the two victorious Bulldogs, with Wesela's coming in the discus throw (168-05) and Samuels' putting up the winning length of 24-11.75 in the long jump. Wesela (54-10.75) then picked up a Top 5 finish in the shot put where he finished second. Claiming the next Top 5 finish was John Bourgeois who took fifth in the pole vault (15-07). Bourgeois was followed by fellow field athlete Jason Harper who jumped 50-10.75 to place second in the triple jump. Bobby McIllece (9:42.68) and Nathan Arnett (14.14) then placed third in the 3000-meter steeplechase and 110-meter hurdles respectively.

A sprinter, a hurdler and a distance athlete completed the Top 5 finishes as James Harris (46.31) was second in the 400-meter dash, Emanuel Mayers posted the second place time of 51.01 in the 400-meter hurdles and Julian Duarte (15:26.50) was fourth in the 5000-meter run.

No. 8 in the nation heading into the historic Penn Relays, MSU set out to compete against some of the best teams in the country. Jason Harper had an early start at Franklin Field, as he began competition at 9 a.m. First up in a field of 20 triple jump athletes, and after all was said and done Harper found himself still at the top with a first place jump of 50-07.5. Following right behind Harper was fellow jumper Marcus Jackson. Jackson competed in the high jump where he jumped 7-02.25 to finish fourth.



As a new season began for the Lady Bulldogs, the first meet marked a spot in the record books for one athlete.

Senior Jessica Merriweather began the 2012 season just outside of the Top 5 on the MSU all-time high jump list, but that all changed at the UAB Invitational. With a height of 5-08 the Memphis native jumped her way to a first place finish and into a tie for the number one spot on the all-time list. Also posting top finishes for the Maroon and White women were Katie Huston who finished second in the mile (5:12.47), Keisha Wallace taking third in the 60m hurdles (8.80), Jody-Ann Muir who was fourth in the 200m dash (24.74) and the distance medley team who also placed fourth (12:35.19).

MSU then traveled to Birmingham for the Auburn Invitational, where the Lady Bulldogs saw numerous Top 10 finishes. Favian Cowards was the top

finishing Lady Bulldog with her fifth place finish in the weight throw (61-07 ½). Cowards also competed on Saturday in the shot put (44-04 ¾) where she finished 12th. Joining Cowards in the Top 10 was Erica Bougard with her seventh place finish in the long jump and the 4x400m squad of Brittany Covington, Bougard, Ocian Archer and Kenishia Carey who finished sixth with a time of 3:48.82.

The Lady Bulldogs returned to Alabama for the Birmingham Invitational, where Erica Bougard took first place in the pentathlon. Bougard's 3840 points placed her third on the MSU all-time list and just ahead of teammate Keisha Wallace who finished third with 3559 points.

MSU then hit the Big Apple for action at the New Balance Invitational. Jessica Merriweather jumped 5-08 ¾ to finish fourth in the high jump and set a new all-time record for MSU. Favian Cowards (59-03) finished 11th

in the weight throw, and Jody-Ann Muir's time of 54.81 placed her tenth in the 400-meter dash.

At the Vulcan Invitational in Birmingham, the Lady Bulldogs picked up a victory and four Top 5 finishes. Claiming top honors for the Maroon and White were Katie Huston, Kanishia Carey, Dominique Lockhart and Renee Masterson whose combined efforts led the way in the distance medley relay (11:59.67). Rochelle Farquharson captured two Top 5 finishes, both in the long jump and 60-meter hurdles. Erica Bougard (18-07 ¾) finished fourth in the long jump behind Farquharson.

Following competition in Birmingham, the Lady Bulldogs returned home to prepare for the Championship portion of their schedule, which would begin with the SEC Championships in Lexington, Ky.





As the weather warms, it can only mean one thing for MSU track and field and that is the beginning of the outdoor season. For head coach Steve Dudley it also means the chance to start qualifying for nationals and at the first meet he must have had a nice smile on his face.

Dudley had a goal to immediately start qualifying for nationals and at the very first meet of the outdoor season in Lafayette, La., success was the story of the day as the Bulldogs captured seven wins.

Favian Cowards started things off for the Lady Bulldogs as the senior placed second in the hammer throw with a personal best length of 194-08. The Lady Bulldogs then picked up a trio of Top 5 finishes as Renee Masterson (4:36.75), Dominique Lockhart (4:39.10) and Katie Huston (4:39.78) finished third, fourth and fifth in the 1500-meter run. Next up were a trio of victories as Wallace took the 100-meter hurdles (13.22), Jodie McGuff came across first in the 5000-meter run (17:48.22), and Adrianna Poole (11:29.29) was first in the 3000-meter steeplechase. Rounding out the Top 5 were Brittany Covington (1:01.59) and Ocian Archer (1:03.19), who took third and fourth in the 400-meter hurdles, and Kanishia Carey who was fourth in the 400-meter dash.

The Lady Bulldogs then returned home to host the Big 10-SEC Challenge, where the women picked up multiple Top 5 finishes, starting with a pair of second place finishes by Jody-Ann Muir in the 400-meter dash (54.21) and Covington

in the 400-meter hurdles with a time of 1:00.77. Archer was close on the heels of Covington as she finished fourth in the 400-meter hurdles with a time of 1:01.44. Masterson then picked up a fourth place finish in the 3000-meter run (10:10.24), while Erica Bougard was third in the 100-meter hurdles (13.96) and Alyssa Hall finished third in the high jump with a height of 5-08. Rounding out the Top Fives were Bougard (19-00) and Wallace (18-11.75) who took third and fourth in the long jump, and Ebony Brinker who was fourth in the triple jump (38-00.75).

They say everything is bigger in Texas, and the track and field meets are no exception as competition at the 85th Clyde Littlefield Texas Relays includes some of the biggest names in the sport. Mississippi State lined up with those athletes and left the Lonestar State with a couple of Top 10 finishes. The trip to Texas was highlighted by Bougard's pentathlon performance, where she collected 5382 points to finish fifth in the event, and move to third on MSU's all-time outdoor list.

While some of the women were in Texas, others spent their time at the Ole Miss Invitational in Oxford. Masterson was the top finisher for the Oxford contingency as she claimed victory in the 3000-meter steeplechase (11:00.55).

Distance athletes shined on day one, as MSU returned home to host the Jace Lacoste Invitational April 13-14. Megan Rayford saw only her second round of action this season, as she captured the first victory for the Lady Bulldogs. The fresh-

man threw a personal best 137-02 on her sixth throw to capture victory in the hammer throw and set the pace for the Maroon and White. Rayford continued her first place streak as she took top honors in the discus with her second personal best of the day. Rayford's throw of 144-01 also landed her the No. 4 spot on MSU's all-time list, as she finished just ahead of teammate Favian Cowards who threw a second place length of 133-06.

Cowards saw more success as the Lady Bulldogs traveled to the Plains for the Auburn Invitational. She led the way for the MSU women as she threw 187-04 to place sixth in the hammer throw. Cowards' fellow field teammates were up next as Rochelle Farquharson (19-07) and Erica Bougard (19-04) landed at eighth and 12th respectively in the long jump.

The women rounded out their regular season action in Philadelphia, Penn., as they hit the road for the historic Penn Relays. The Lady Bulldogs competed in three events and in each event that posted a Top 25 finish. Brinker started things off for the women as she posted a tenth best 39-10.75 in the triple jump. Following Brinker was a pair of hurdlers, as Racquel Farquharson (13.80) and Wallace (13.84) finished 13th and 15th in the 100-meter hurdles. Covington, Muir, Bougard and Archer were the only Lady Bulldogs to see action on day three. The quartet joined forces to run 3:39.35 to finish third in the 4x400-meter relay.

The MSU women returned from Pennsylvania and began preparation for SEC Championships May 10-13.

At the beginning of the season, the Mississippi State Bulldog cross country team found themselves picked to finish 11th in the Southeastern Conference. With a team composed mainly of freshman and sophomores, the Bulldogs set out in September to defy their predicted results.

The Bulldogs started the 2012 campaign with a trip to Tennessee for the Sewanee Invitational. Seizing the 8K top finish for the men was Phillip Johnson (26:26.50), who came in third for the Bulldogs. Twins Patrick (26:47.61) and Andrew Monaghan (26:51.26) followed Johnson, crossing the line in seventh and ninth, respectively. Rounding out the Top 10 was Matt Weickert (25:55.55). The Maroon and White squad finished with 36 points, sealing the top spot.

MSU continued its winning ways, as it traveled to Nashville for the Commodore Classic on Sept. 15. The men totaled 183 points to place 5th in the 24-team field after a strong 8K run from John Valentine (22nd, 25:17.22). Following Valentine's Top 25 finish were Johnson (33rd, 25:36.37), Andrew Monaghan (45th, 25:54.02) and Cameron Vernier (46th, 25:54.76). The Bulldogs knocked Alabama, LSU, Ole Miss and Vanderbilt out of the top spots.

A trip to South Bend, Ind., was next for the Maroon and White, as they competed at the 57th Annual Notre Dame Invite. The race proved to be a tough test for the Bulldogs, as they fought their way to a 20th place finish amongst some of the best competition of the season.

After racing at Notre Dame, the Bulldogs headed to Alabama for the Crimson Classic on Oct. 13. Seizing the 8K top finish for the men was Johnson (26:11.17), who came in 12th for the Bulldogs. Valentine (26:11.78) and Vernier (26:12.79) followed Johnson, crossing the line in 13th and 16th, respectively. Rounding out the Top 30 was Jacob Fuller (27th, 26:37.38) and Julian Duarte (29th, 26:40.91). The squad totaled 77 points on the day to finish third.

Upon returning home, the Bulldogs began preparations for their journey through the championship season, beginning with a trip to Nashville for the SEC Championships on Oct. 26. With leadership from junior Vernier (25:09.38, 41st) in the 8K, the men scored 237 points to finish eighth. Rounding out the men's scores behind Vernier were Valentine (25:20.95, 49th), Juan Sanchez (25:26.42, 50th), Johnson (25:27.12, 51st) and Andrew Monaghan (25:37.75, 65th).

After the SEC Championships, MSU concluded its season in Tallahassee, Fla., at the NCAA South Regional. The Bulldogs spot in fifth not only tied their best regional finish in history, but also placed them ahead of SEC foes Alabama, Auburn, Ole Miss, Tennessee and Vanderbilt. Juan Sanchez (31st, 31:35.7) led the way for the men, followed by Cameron Vernier (35th, 31:46.6), John Valentine (46th, 32:02.5), Curtis Kelly (52nd, 32:08.8) and Philip Johnson (57th, 32:13.3).

Picked to finish 11th in the Southeastern Conference, the Lady Bulldogs laced up their running shoes for the 2012 season. Their journey would take them from Tennessee to Alabama to Indiana, and ultimately would end at the NCAA South Regional in Florida.

First up for the Lady Bulldogs was the Sewanee Invitational on Sept. 1 in Rome, Ga. Renee Masterson (22:32.19) led the way for the Lady Bulldogs, finishing first in the 6K, followed by freshman Fabienne Amrhein (22:37.31) in second and Chloe Phillips (22:47.22) in third. Rounding out the Top 5 was Jodie McGuff (22:48.47) and Cornelia Griesche (23:03.33), who finished fourth and fifth, respectively. MSU captured the win with 15 points, while achieving six of the Top 10 places.

The Lady Bulldogs traveled to Nashville for their second meet of the season, the Commodore Classic. Masterson (21:25.57) again paced the Lady Bulldogs, finishing eighth in the 6K, amongst a field of more than 200 runners. McGuff (22:11.53) and Phillips (22:12.44) also had top finishes for the women, rounding out the Top 25 at 24th and 25th, respectively. The team seized a fourth-place finish with 117 points, beating fellow SEC opponents Alabama, Georgia, LSU, South Carolina and Tennessee.

Next the Maroon and White headed to South Bend, Ind. for the 57th Annual Notre Dame Invite on Sept. 28. Facing some of the toughest competition this season, the Bulldogs raced against a total of 10 nationally ranked teams and finished 15th, led once again by Masterson.

Following the trip to Indiana, the MSU women made the short trip east to Tuscaloosa. Senior standout Masterson (18:02.54) paced the team, finishing ninth in the 5K. Phillips (18:05.51), Katie Huston (18:21.03) and McGuff (18:22.75) also had strong finishes for the women, rounding out the Top 20 at 14th, 18th and 20th, respectively, to tally 96 points and a third-place finish for the squad.

Championship season for the Lady Bulldogs began in Nashville at the SEC Championships. Again leading the pack was Masterson, followed by Huston, Phillips, McGuff and Amrhein, as the women navigated the course to a 10th-place finish.

Following the SEC Championships, the team headed to Tallahassee, Fla., for the NCAA South Regional. In its last meet of the season on Nov. 17, MSU captured the ninth-place spot, totaling 328 points. Senior Renee Masterson (37th, 21:04.5), who posted the fastest times for her team at every meet this season, paced the MSU women again in Tallahassee. Crossing the line right behind Masterson was Chloe Phillips (38th, 21:04.6), later followed by Jodie McGuff (80th, 21:48.5), Emma Neigel (87th, 21:55.9) and Katie Huston (92nd, 21:59.3). Four of the top five women all posted their quickest times of the season at Apalachee Regional Park.

Championship season got underway for the Lady Bulldogs in February, as they traveled to Lexington, Ky., for the 2012 SEC Indoor Track and Field Championships.

Erica Bougard embarked on the journey to Lexington ranked third on the MSU all-time pentathlon list, but when action ceased she found herself in the number one spot. Victories and personal bests in the long jump (19-09 $\frac{3}{4}$) and the 800-meter run (2:14.80), along with personal bests in the 60m hurdles (8.57), high jump (5-05 $\frac{3}{4}$) and shot put (32-10 $\frac{1}{2}$) propelled Bougard to a second place finish in the pentathlon (4126), earning her second team All-SEC honors. Not only did Bougard earn a spot on the All-SEC team, but became the first freshman to garner a spot on the SEC All-Freshman team.

Keisha Wallace also navigated the Nutter Field House track in the pentathlon where she finished seventh and earned two points for MSU. Wallace finished the day with three personal bests and fifth-place ranking on the MSU all-time pentathlon list.

On day two, Wallace began with the 60-meter hurdles and posted a sixth-



place finish after turning in a time of 8.39. Wallace's efforts secured her a place in Sunday's finals and placed her just ahead of teammate Racquel Farquharson, who finished 10th with a personal best time of 8.45.

Later in the day, Wallace's long jump performance placed her seventh, with a personal best length of 19-08, to earn two points for the Lady Bulldogs. Wallace's jumps also ranked her fifth on MSU's all-time list.

Jody-Ann Muir also saw action on day two, as she navigated the track in the 400-meter dash. Muir ran a personal best 53.85 to finish eighth and guarantee her a spot in the finals.

Day three for MSU was closed with 22 personal

bests, five school records and an individual SEC Championship. Favian Cowards threw a personal best 66-05 to win MSU's first SEC Championship in the weight throw. Cowards throw also set a MSU all-time record and earned her a spot on the all-SEC team.

Cowards' performance paved the way for the rest of the Lady Bulldogs, who went on to score a school-record 35 points to finish seventh, posting the best overall finish in school history. Florida claimed the SEC Championship title with 132 points.



After posting some impressive times during the regular season, MSU turned its focus to the championship slate of its schedule, and the Lady Bulldogs laced up for the 2012 SEC Outdoor Track and Field Championships in Baton Rouge, La.

Erica Bougard and Wallace were the only pair of MSU athletes to compete on day one. Bougard and

Wallace's day began with the 100-meter hurdles where Wallace finished at the top of the pack with a time of 13.33, while Bougard finished fifth (13.94). Later that day, Bougard high jumped 5-07 to finish fourth, while Wallace was 11th with a height of 4-10.50. Bougard (32-05.50) and Wallace (30-00.25) finished back-to-back in the shot put, coming in at ninth and 10th respectively.

After all was said and done, Bougard had earned a total of 3,327 points to stand at fourth, while Wallace had earned 3,093 points to enter day two in seventh place.

Picking up the Lady Bulldogs' first top five finish and five team points was Favian Cowards. The senior posted a fourth-place finish of 188-02 in the hammer throw. Erica Bougard picked up the second top five finish as she placed fourth in the heptathlon with 5,537 points. Bougard's fourth-place finish came on the heels of the freshman winning both the long jump (20-00.50) and the 800-meter run (2:14.16). Additionally, Bougard earned a spot on the SEC All-Freshman team, as well as earning five points for the Lady Bulldogs. After an injury in the long jump, Wallace was forced to remove herself from day two's competition.

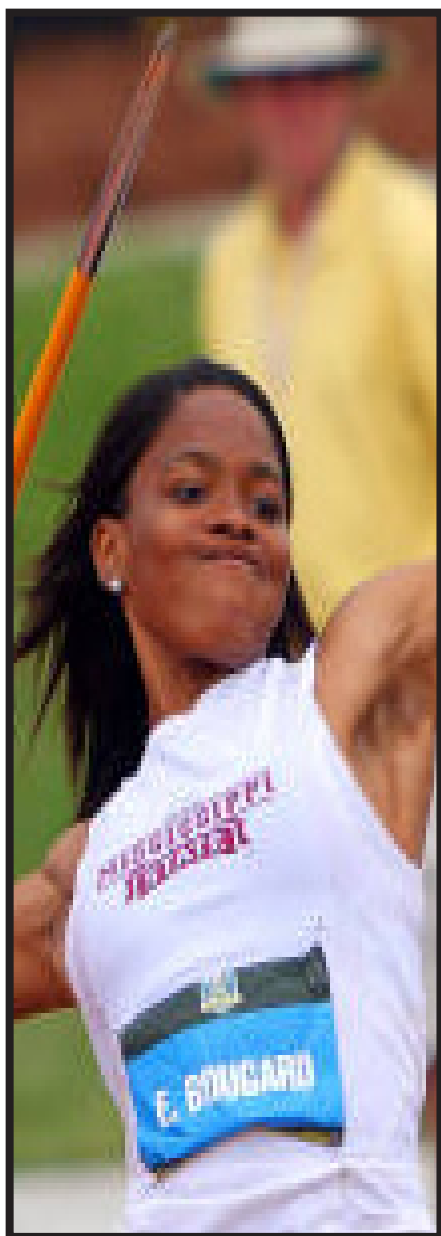
Jodie McGuff closed out the day for the Lady Bulldogs as she finished eighth in the 10,000-meter run (37:13.20), earning one point for the team.

Former SEC Champion Rochelle Farquharson scored the first points of day three. Competing in the long jump, Farquharson posted a jump of 20-07.25 to finish third and score six points for the Lady Bulldogs.

Jody-Ann Muir was the lone Maroon and White woman to secure a spot in the finals. Muir took to the track in the 400-meter dash, where she posted a time of 52.67 to finish third and move on to the finals. Heading into the last day of competition, the Lady Bulldogs were in ninth place with 17 points.

Erica Bougard captured MSU's first honor during the finals, as she earned All-Freshman honors in the heptathlon. Bougard (41-00.25) finished seventh in the triple jump, and Jody-Ann Muir (52.74) added five points to the mix for her fourth place performance in the 400-meter dash.

The Lady Bulldogs closed their time in Baton Rouge with 28 points and a 10th place finish.





After a highly competitive and successful regular season, Mississippi State switched gears toward the championship mode of the schedule, as competition began at the SEC Outdoor Track and Field Championships in Baton Rouge.

Trevarus Christian was the lone Bulldog to see day one action, as he competed in the first five events of the decathlon. Christian's day began with the 100-meter dash where he ran 11.11 to place fifth. Next up was a turn at the long jump where he jumped 23-03.50 to finish seventh, before heading to the shot put ring for an eighth place throw of 33-03.25. Christian then returned to jump, clearing 5-05.25 to finish seventh in the high jump.

The Bulldog ended his day with an eighth place time of 58.98 in the 400-meter dash, to place him eighth overall heading into day two with a total of 3,129 points.

Despite a slight weather delay, action managed to progress on day two of the SEC Outdoor Championships. Christian picked up where he left off on Thursday and captured an eighth-place finish in the decathlon by scoring a total of 4414 points. Christian's eighth place finish earned the first point of the meet for the Bulldogs.

Emanuel Mayers, who missed last year's SEC Championships because of injury, laced up next for the Bulldogs. Proving he was completely healed and back to his old self, Mayers ran 50.46 to finish first in the 400-meter hurdles prelims and secure a spot in Sunday's finals. Nathan Arnett joined Mayers in the 400-meter hurdles and accompanied him in the finals as he placed

placing fourth with a time of 51.04.

On day three of competition, Christian joined forces with teammate Jarrett Samuels to compete in the long jump. Samuels fifth place jump of 25-08.25 scored MSU four points and slightly edged Christian, who jumped 25-03.25 to finish sixth and pick up three points.

James Harris and Daundre Barnaby became the second pair of Maroon and White men to find a spot competing in finals as they laced up for the 400-meter dash. Harris posted a time of 46.47 to finish fourth, while Barnaby ran 46.12 to finish the race in eighth.

A pair of distance athletes closed out day three for MSU. Juan Sanchez closed out qualifying and secured a spot on Sunday in the 1500-meter run with an 11th place time of 3:51.46, while John Valentine (9:11.94) collected the final points of the day as he finished fifth in the 3000-meter steeplechase to earn four points.

Overall, the Bulldogs placed fifth with 61 points, their highest finish since coming in at No. 5 in 1989. Marcus Jackson jumped a personal best 7-03.25 to finish second and earn All-SEC second team honors. Ed Wesela threw a personal best 59-08.25 to finish fourth place in the shot put. The 4x100-meter quartet of D'Angelo Cherry, Samuels, Tavaris Tate and Harris scored the Bulldogs only multi-athlete points, as they earned four points for their fifth place time of 40.16.

Arkansas claimed the conference title with a total of 196 points.

NCAA DIVISION I OUTDOOR QUALIFYING STANDARDS

The championship qualifying procedure allows for a field size of 24 in all individual and relay events at the final championship competition. (Refer to the 2012 Outdoor Track and Field Technical Manual- www.ncaa.org)

QUALIFYING

Qualifying to the final championship competition is accomplished through performance in the preliminary championship competition at each site for events contested at those competitions. Twelve competitors from each individual event and twelve teams from each relay event advance from each preliminary championship competition site to the final championship competition. Qualification, through competition in an event at a preliminary championship competition, is required to participate in that event at the final championship competition. Any individual or relay team must remain eligible for advancement throughout all rounds of the championships. The specific event formula for advancement to the final championship competition, as well as tie breaking procedure, is detailed in the 2012 Outdoor Track and Field Technical Manual.

Qualification for the Heptathlon and Decathlon events of the championship is accomplished through a student-athlete's position on the national descending order list. Based upon declarations, made before the preliminary championship competition, twenty-four student-athletes will be accepted to the final championship competition in each event.



After a successful showing at the SEC Championships, Mississippi State set its sights on national titles, as the Bulldogs traveled to the Sunshine State for the NCAA Outdoor Championships East Region Preliminary. Seventeen MSU athletes competed for top spots at the meet, hosted by the University of North Florida in Jacksonville.

As action wrapped up on day one, the Bulldogs were on their way with seven athletes qualifying for quarterfinals. First to qualify were Emanuel Mayers and Nathan Arnett, who took their turn in the preliminaries of the 400-meter hurdles. Mayers (50.82) posted the fourth-best time of the day to punch his ticket, while Arnett qualified with his 11th place time of 51.26. Following in the footsteps of Mayers and Arnett was D'Angelo Cherry. Posting a time of 10.52, Cherry finished 20th in the 100-meter dash preliminaries and qualified for the quarterfinals.

Rounding out the Bulldog qualifiers was a trio of 400-meter dash athletes. Competing in three different heats, Daundre Barnaby (46.11), Tavaris Tate (46.54) and James Harris (46.59) all earned tickets for the quarterfinals as they finished second, eighth and 11th, respectively.

Jody-Ann Muir was the lone Lady Bulldog qualifier on day one. Posting the fourth best time of the day, Muir ran 52.74 to secure a place in the quarterfinals on day two.

On the second day of competition, Barnaby picked up the



first qualification as he competed in the 400-meter dash quarterfinals. Running in heat three, Barnaby posted a personal best time of 45.85 to capture a heat win and a fifth place finish overall. Barnaby was joined in competition by Tate (46.45) and Harris (50.09), who finished 16th and 27th overall to just miss booking a trip to Iowa. Arnett (50.29) secured his NCAA Championship spot by finishing fourth in the 400-meter hurdles quarterfinal.

Also competing for the Bulldogs on day two were D'Angelo Cherry and Jason Harper. Cherry (10.45) took his turn in the 100-meter dash quarterfinal where he finished just outside qualifying range at 20th, while Harper (48-4.50) finished 34th in the triple jump preliminary.

MSU's next qualification came in the female slate of the 400-meter dash. Jody-Ann Muir posted a personal best 52.00 to finish second in her heat and third overall, punching her ticket

for the NCAA Championships. After fouling her first throw, Favian Cowards stepped back into the cage and threw a personal best 206-5 in the hammer throw to finish third and punch the day's first NCAA Championship ticket. MSU's next qualification came from Marcus Jackson in the high jump. On his fifth jump of the day, Jackson reached 7-2.25 to finish third and move on to the Championships.

In total, MSU qualified 14 athletes in eight events. Individuals who made the NCAA Championship trip were Erica Bougard in the heptathlon, Cowards in the hammer throw, Muir in the 400-meter dash, Arnett in the 400-meter hurdles and Jackson in the high jump. Also making the trek to Iowa will be the 4x100-meter squad of Christian, Samuels, Tate and Cherry, as well as the 4x400-meter quartet of Tate, Barnaby, Mayers and Harris.



In a season that saw Mississippi State capture its highest SEC finish since 1989, the Bulldogs concluded their 2012 campaign at the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships in Des Moines, Iowa.

MSU had 12 athletes compete in eight events- nine men and three women. Jody-Ann Muir was the lone Lady Bulldog on the track day one. Competing in heat one of the 400 meter dash preliminary, Muir posted a seventh-place time of 52.05 to qualify for finals. Justin Christian, Jarrett Samuels, Tavaris Tate and D'Angelo Cherry started day one for the Bulldogs. The foursome laced up for the 4x100 meter preliminary relay and ran 39.45 to finish ninth, barely missing the mark to qualify for finals. Nathan Arnett rounded out Bulldog competition on day one as he ran 50.53 in the 400 meter hurdle preliminary. Arnett's time placed him 10th.

Marcus Jackson surpassed his personal best high jump height of 7-3.25 with a new height of 7-4.25 on day two. Jackson's jump placed him fifth on the day and earned first team All-American honors for the sophomore.

Favian Cowards started the Lady Bulldogs off as she competed in the hammer throw. On her second throw of the day, she reached 206-3 to finish ninth. Day two also marked the beginning of the women's heptathlon, featuring MSU's Erica Bougard. Competing in four events, Bougard closed her day with 3191 points to stand at 20th place heading into the final three events. Highlighting Bougard's



day was a sixth place finish in the 100-meter hurdles (13.64), a height of 5-3 in the high jump where she finished 21st, a 23rd place length of 28-11 in the shot put and a fourth-place time of 24.08 in the 200-meter dash.

MSU's 4x400-meter quartet of Tate, Emanuel Mayers, Daundre Barnaby and James Harris closed out the day with MSU's third-fastest time in school history at 3:02.16 to finish third and secure a place in the finals.

On day three, Muir earned All-American honors, running 52.63 in the 400-meter dash. The junior finished seventh to score two points for her team. Bougard was the only other day-three competitor for the Maroon and White as she wrapped up heptathlon action. After finishing 10th in the long jump (18-11.25) and 21st in the javelin (97-6), the Byhalia, Miss., native was forced to withdraw from competition due to injury.

The Bulldogs ended National Championship competition tied for No. 20 to mark the third-straight year for the Maroon and White to finish in the Top 20 at the Championships, and for nine out of the last ten years for the Bulldogs to finish in the Top 25.

Posting a time of 3:05.85 during finals, the 4X100 quartet finished eighth and ended the 2012 season on a high note en route to garnering All-American honors. The SEC captured both overall titles, as Florida brought home the men's championship just ahead of LSU, while on the women's side LSU held off Oregon to claim the crown. The Bulldogs finished 43rd with five points, while the Lady Bulldogs finished in a three way tie for 60th with two points.

Larry H. Templeton Athletic Academic Center

Dedicated on November 1, 2008, the Templeton Athletic Academic Center is a welcome addition to the Bulldog athletic program. The \$10 million facility is named for former MSU Director of Athletics Larry Templeton.

The facility is an addition to two existing facilities in the athletic wing of the MSU campus - the Shira Complex and the Holliman Athletic Center. It is situated on the south side of those two facilities, and across the street from the Bryan Athletic Administration Building.

The 34,000 square-foot building serves the entire athletic department, houses the Athletic Academics offices and staff, and includes individual computer rooms, tutor work areas, a large open study area and a 300-seat

dining facility with a fully-functioning kitchen.

Templeton, now Athletic Director Emeritus, served 22 years as Director of Athletics and during his tenure helped position MSU Athletics as an innovative, progressive program, with equality in sports for women, new and renovated facilities and keen fiscal management.

During the 1990s almost every sport came away with a best-ever finish. Achievements included six football bowl games, men's basketball's trip to the 1996 NCAA Final Four, three baseball trips to the NCAA College World Series, five Southeastern Conference championships and participation in the NCAA Championships by sport teams 29 times.

Athletic Training Staff

The medical team begins with the certified athletic trainers (ATC's) who interact with the student athletes on a daily basis. Each full time staff athletic trainer at Mississippi State is certified by the National Athletic Trainers' Association Board of Certification and is licensed in the state of Mississippi.

Athletic Training Room

The Mississippi State Sports Medicine Department consists of six athletic training rooms at various athletic facilities to better serve our student athletes. The athletic training rooms are staffed by our seven full time staff members along with five graduate assistants and 20 student athletic trainers.



The new Columbus Orthopaedic Sports Medicine Center is equipped with the latest in modalities (in-ground whirlpools, ultrasound, electrical stimulation), rehabilitation equipment (including a Biodex and Hydroworx® therapy pool with an underwater treadmill), an x-ray machine, and a variety of additional equipment necessary to meet the needs of the elite collegiate athlete.

The Team Family Practice Physicians and Orthopedists are available at practice and in the athletic training room almost daily for consultation with the athletic trainers and student athletes.



John C. Longest Student Health Center

Mississippi State University maintains a full service student health center on campus where our two Team Family Practice Physicians practice. They are supported by a lab, pharmacy, x-ray, physical therapy department, nutritionists, three additional physicians, four nurse practitioners, and a nursing staff.





Mississippi State University

Mississippi State is a comprehensive land-grant institution and the largest university in Mississippi, with a statewide enrollment of more than 16,000 students.

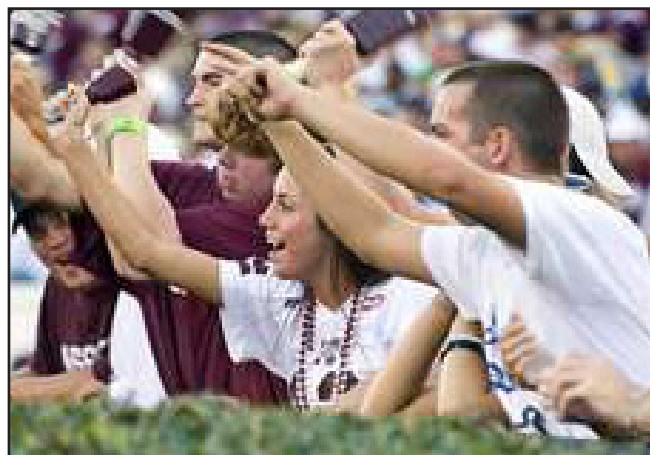
Established in 1878 as the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Mississippi, the university has traditional strengths in engineering and scientific agriculture but has evolved into a comprehensive institution with a diverse array of programs in teaching, research, and service.



Academics and Student Life

Mississippi State students consistently earn honors such as the prestigious Harry S. Truman Scholarship, awarded for those who will enter public service, and, with 16 Truman Scholars to date, the university has been recognized as a Truman Honor Institution. In the past year, a student team competed for and won first place in a national Challenge X competition to redesign a fuel-efficient and environmentally-friendly SUV.

Recently initiated programs are providing opportunities to develop leadership potential and global study options. The university's Global Leadership Continuum provides "cradle-to-CEO" programming designed to develop leadership



across a "global" spectrum that begins with high school and continues through the university experience and into professional life. Included are the Young Guns Leadership Camp for rising high school seniors; the Day one Leadership Community for incoming freshmen, focusing on shared academic and service experiences; and the highly competitive Appalachian Leadership Honors Program for sophomores and juniors.

To complement these efforts, the university has launched a minor in leadership studies open to students in all majors. A university honor code adopted in 2007 institutionalizes a campus culture of integrity and personal responsibility in academic studies. Through the Global Leadership Program, students may experience significantly expanded study-abroad opportunities.





Research

Mississippi State faculty researchers attracted \$186.5 million in external funding for 2006-07, up from about \$155 million during the previous year. This funding supported 1,691 sponsored projects in 2007.

Based on the latest rankings available from the National Science Foundation, MSU ranks 7th in the nation in agricultural sciences research expenditures and 44th in engineering. Last year MSU faculty and staff disclosed 80 new technologies resulting in three new start-up companies, nine licenses, and 22 patent applications. The university now holds 77 patents.

In recent years, MSU has established the Thad Cochran Endowment for Entrepreneurship, as well as collaborating with federal agencies and industries to help increase technology-oriented start-up companies. Among the collaborators and sponsors are the U.S. departments of Defense and Energy, NASA, General Electric, Northrop Grumman, EADS/American Eurocopter, Boeing, Raytheon, General Dynamics, Israeli Aerospace Industry, and the Mississippi Technology Alliance.

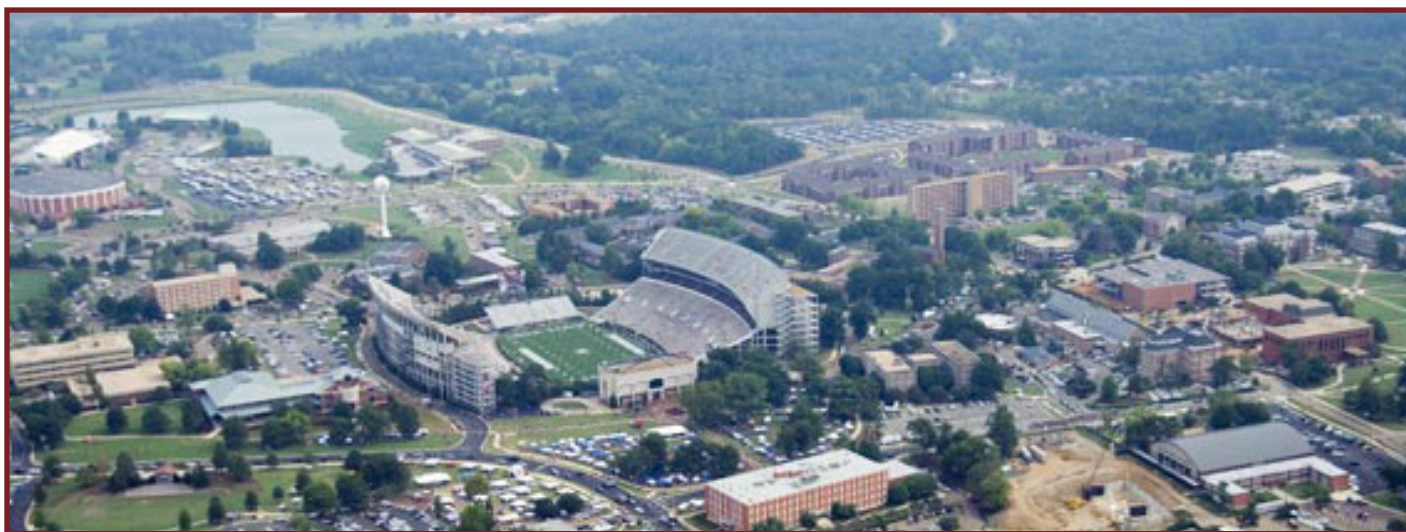
In a key area of economic interest to Mississippi, MSU's Center for Advanced Vehicular Systems, established in 2001, continues research and

development supporting a goal of attracting automotive industries to the state. The center is conducting research in areas that include materials processing, human and systems engineering, alternative power systems, computational manufacturing and design, and advanced learning technologies.

Outreach and Service

From its academic programs to the work of countless individuals, Mississippi State has "extended farther" and gone "beyond the limit" to make a difference in the lives of citizens around the state. In 2006, the university formed the Mississippi State Community Action Team to organize university resources and expertise for quick response to local issues around the state. MSU's Extension Service is the first in the nation to have an interactive videoconferencing system in every county Extension office. Through the Freedom Calls program, the system is being used to connect Mississippians with family members in the U.S. military serving our country in Iraq.

The MSU Extension Service maintains offices in almost every county of the state, and the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station operates 10 branch stations throughout Mississippi. Four strategically located research and extension centers coordinate the delivery of services statewide.





Dr. Mark Keenum
UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT
Mississippi State, 1984

Dr. Mark Everett Keenum became Mississippi State's 19th president Jan. 5, 2009, following a distinguished public service career.

After completing his bachelor's and master's degrees in agricultural economics at Mississippi State, Dr. Keenum joined the university faculty in 1984 as a marketing specialist with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service. Two years later, he accepted a position as a research associate with the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station at MSU.

He continued his education at the university, in 1988 receiving a doctorate in agricultural economics, and he joined the faculty of that department as an assistant professor/economist. During his professional tenure at Mississippi State, his primary research and extension work focused on the marketing and economics of aquaculture, specialty crops and forestry. He continued his faculty ties at the university 1997-2006 as an adjunct professor, teaching an annual course on agricultural legislative policy.

Prior to being named president of Mississippi State in November 2008, Dr. Keenum served as Under Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture for two years, where he provided leadership and oversight for the Farm Service Agency, the Risk Management Agency and the Foreign Agricultural Service. The mission area, comprised of the three agencies, had a total operating budget of \$1.7 billion and approximately \$40 billion in program authority. The three agencies employed more than 16,500 people at more than 2,300 offices nationwide and 98 locations around the globe.

In 1989, Dr. Keenum joined the Washington, D.C., staff of U.S. Senator Thad Cochran as Legislative Assistant for Agriculture and Natural Resources. As Sen. Cochran's adviser on agricultural affairs, he worked on numerous issues important to U.S. agriculture, including the 1990, 1996, and 2002 Farm Bills. From 1996-2006, he served as Chief of Staff for Sen. Cochran. In this role, Dr. Keenum was the chief adviser to the senator on political, legislative and appropriations issues. He also was responsible for managing all administrative and legislative functions of Sen. Cochran's Washington, D.C., office and three Mississippi offices, including direct oversight of the U.S. Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry and the U.S. Senate Committee on Appropriations.

Dr. Keenum and his wife Rhonda have four children.



Scott Stricklin
ATHLETIC DIRECTOR
Mississippi State, 1992

A lifelong dream was fulfilled on May 7, 2010, when Scott Stricklin was formally introduced as Mississippi State's director of athletics, the 16th in school history.

As Stricklin begins to enthusiastically tackle his new job of leading the MSU athletic department, he certainly isn't a stranger to the Bulldog family or college athletics.

A 1992 graduate of Mississippi State, the Jackson, Miss., native's resume is highlighted by 22 years of experience on the collegiate level in various capacities at five different universities. The last two years, he's faithfully served as Senior Associate Athletics Director for External Affairs at his alma mater, overseeing fundraising, football and men's basketball scheduling, managing MSU's all-sport agreement with Adidas, facility planning, and serving as the administrative sport liaison for men's basketball and softball. It's those type of day-to-day tasks that's prepared the personable Stricklin to take over the top seat in the Mississippi State athletic department.

Yet it's a journey that started during his formidable days as a dedicated and tireless worker in the media relations department that's led to his highly-respected career coming full circle. Prior to graduating, Stricklin's stint in the MSU media relations office included three seasons (1990-92) as the media contact for the highly successful and nationally-renowned baseball program. Upon graduation, he was named assistant media relations director at his alma mater.

He continued his climb up the ladder of success when he was named associate media relations director at Auburn, where from 1993-98 he served as the primary baseball contact and the secondary football contact. He also spent the 1993-94 season handling the publicity for the Tigers' nationally-ranked women's basketball team.

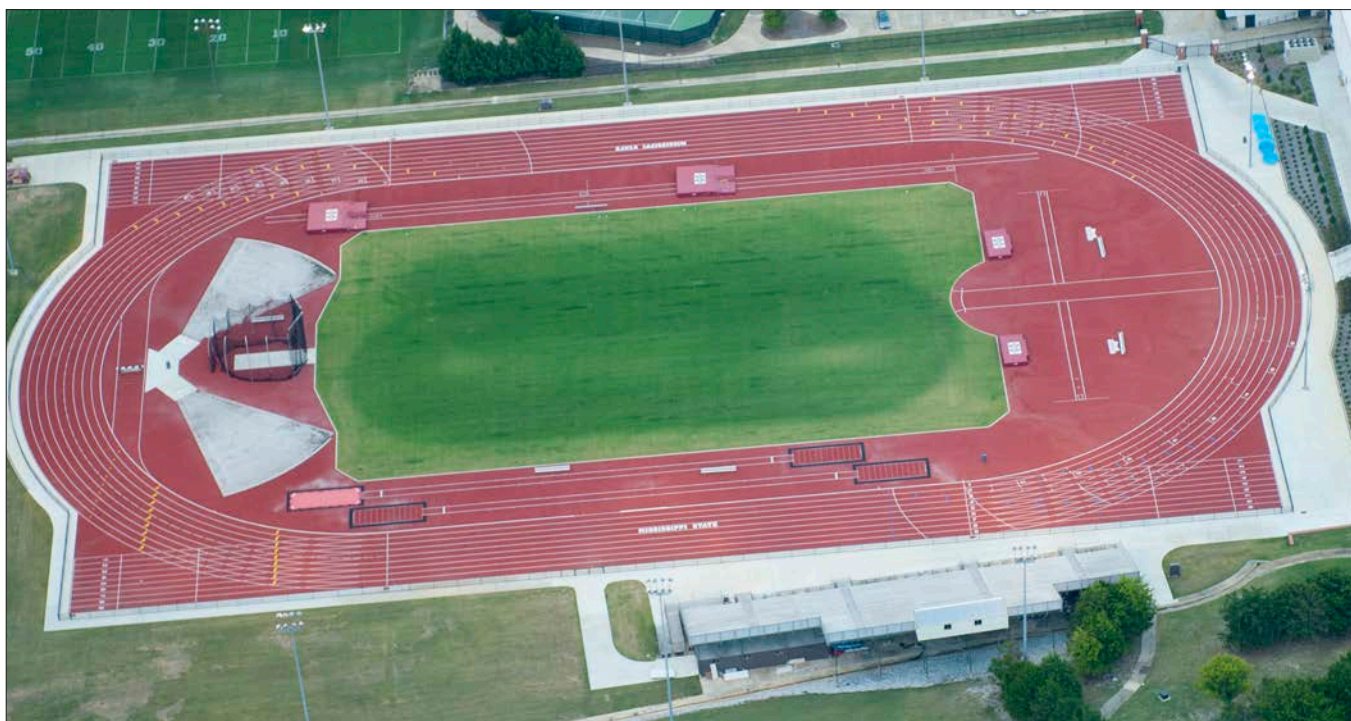
In 1998, Stricklin left Auburn to become Assistant Athletics Director at Tulane, where he served as the primary media contact for the Green Wave's 1998 12-0 football team. Next came a four-year run in the Big 12 Conference at Baylor (1999-2003) as Assistant AD for Communications and Marketing.
