## Al Schmidt

### Director of Track & Field Twenty-Sixth Season St. Louis University, 1975

**A**l Schmidt is entering his fourth year as Director of Track and Field for Mississippi State. Regarded and respected nationwide as an authority on endurance running and training, Al Schmidt spent 23 seasons at the helm of Mississippi State's men's and women's track and field teams. Schmidt parlayed his 38 years of collegiate coaching experience into many individual and team accomplishments. In those 24 seasons, Schmidt has produced nearly 60 All-Americans and over 30 SEC champions.

In his first year as director, Schmidt organized a return of action at the newly renovated Carl Maddox Track and Field Complex. It had been over four years since a meet was held on MSU's campus and when Schmidt got ready to bring it back he did it in a big way. The former coach had always dreamed of hosting a major event in Starkville and on Saturday, March 26, 2011 that dream became a reality, as the first Big Ten/SEC Challenge was held. The Big Ten may have walked away victorious in both men's and women's competitions, but as the Challenge was brought back to Starkville in 2012 and 2013, the SEC teams were able to come back with wins.

During the 2013 season, Schmidt was instrumental in guiding the Bulldogs to produce nine All-Americans, 14 school records and 42 Top 5 all-time performances. MSU saw a season that sent 12 athletes to NCAA Outdoor Championships, while claiming two individual national titles during the indoor campaign.

In addition to the Big Ten/SEC Challenge, Schmidt was instrumental in bringing back two other annual events to MSU. The month of April 2012 saw the return of the Bulldog Twilight Invitational as well as the Jace Lacoste Invitational, which is held in memory of a former Bulldog track star.

During his third year as program director in 2012, he saw even more success as the season continued. He finished the season with SEC Championships in two events and 14 athletes in nine events qualifying for the NCAA Championships, while coaching 12 athletes to All-American honors.

Schmidt's final season as head coach at MSU was quite impressive. He coached seven Bulldog All-Americans, saw the

Bulldogs have their seventh top 25 finish in the nation in the last nine years. MSU also finished 7th at the SEC Championships and 17th at the NCAA Championships. Nationally ranked every week of the season, MSU's men reached as high as eighth the week they entered the NCAA Championships. The Bulldogs also had a record number of All-SEC Academics in 2010, with 15.

2010 also saw Schmidt coach three Lady Bulldog All-Americans, and see the Lady Bulldogs set records for the most national qualifiers and the most points by the team at the SEC Championships. Additionally, the women had a record number of All-SEC Academics with 18.

In 2009, Schmidt tutored six athletes to All-American status. Marris Harris was the lone Lady Bulldog to achieve the honor. The men's 4x100-meter relay team, John Bailey, D'Angelo Cherry, Justin Christian and Dwight Mullings, ran a school record 39.06 seconds to claim fourth place at the NCAA Championships. The men's team added three more All-Americans to the Bulldog team, with Cherry achieving recognition in the 100-meter dash, Mullings in the 400-meter dash, and Emanuel Mayers for his performance in the 400-meter hurdles.

MSU sent 16 athletes to the 2009 Mideast Regional Championships. Six Lady Bulldogs traveled to Louisville, Ky., to compete for NCAA Championship tickets. Wendy Copeland made her third trip to the post season, qualifying in the long and triple jump and 4x100-meter relay. Ten Bulldogs made the trip to the post season, with two relays (4x100 and 4x400) and the sprint events being the team's focus. Bulldogs Mayers (400-meter hurdles), Mullings (400-meter dash), and the 4x100-meter relay all claimed top honors at the Regional Championships.

In 2008, Schmidt coached two athletes to become SEC Champions. Marris Harris won the heptathlon with a school record of 5,600 points. Jamil Hubbard won the 400-meter SEC title. During the SEC Outdoor Meet, 14 athletes qualified for the NCAA Regional Meet and 10 athletes scored in their events. The men placed eighth and the women placed 11th.

At the NCAA Regional meet, two Bulldogs, Jamil Hubbard and Golden

Coachman, won titles in the 400- and the 800-meter runs. O'Neal Wilder took second in the 400-meter behind Hubbard, while Chris Woods took fourth in the 800-meter. The 4x400-meter relay team, consisting of Wilder, Hubbard, Woods, and Mayers, took first. The men's team placed sixth. The 4x100-meter relay and Kendall May received at-large bids to the NCAA National Meet. Marris Harris qualified in the heptathlon.

The highlight of the 2008 season for Schmidt was being named the coach for the U.S. Men's Under-23 team at the NACAC Championships.

In 2007, Schmidt guided five Bulldogs to All-American status. Schmidt also witnessed three school records broken. At the SEC Championships, the men's team had a total of four athletes score 30 points to finish 11th overall. Among those scorers included Golden Coachman and Travis McKay scoring in the 800-meter run and 3000-meter steeplechase.

Out of the 21 events the Bulldogs competed in, 62 of the athletes marked a personal best in their respective event. There were also six regional qualifiers for the men's team and two relay regional marks met. Bruce Davis, Ezra Jones, Nathan Daniels and Arthur Davis finished fourth at the NCAA Championships, with a time of three minutes, 3.49 seconds.

On 22 separate times during the 2007 season, 15 Lady Bulldogs met their personal best marks, along with seven regional qualifiers. Marris Harris finished fourth in the heptathlon at the SEC Championships with a personal-best 5,242 points, along with Jennifer McPherson who finished fourth in the 1500-meter run with a time of 4:20.87, and Michelle Corrigan who took sixth in the 10000-meter run with a time of 37:15.760. A total of 16 Lady Bulldogs scored a total of 19 points for MSU as they finished 11th at the meet.

In 2005, Schmidt witnessed six Bulldogs garner All-America accolades. At the 2005 NCAA Outdoor Championships, Elzie Coleman, Arthur Davis, LaChristopher Lewis and Jamel Ashley ran a school-record 3:01.63 to finish fifth in the 4x400-meter relay. Ashley placed second in the 400, while Lewis took 11th in the long jump to earn his first All-America honor in the event. At the Mideast Regional, Steve





On the women's side, Meggan Hodge broke the MSU school record in the 3000-meter steeplechase with a 10:46.04 eighth-place finish at the SEC Championships. Jasmine Walls cleared a personal best to tie for second in the high jump. Crystal Averitt ended her career atop the all-time list in the hammer throw, while Lacey Johnson extended her school record in the pole vault.

Three-time All-American Tiffany McWilliams closed out her MSU career in 2004 by becoming the most decorated female athlete in Lady Bulldog track and field history. McWilliams repeated her 2003 feat of winning the outdoor 1500-meter title and also won the NCAA Indoor title in the mile. Behind McWilliams and a strong distance corps, MSU achieved a No. 12 national ranking.

On the men's side, decathlete and All-American Trey Hardee set a school record in the event after tallying 8,041 points in a second-place finish at the NCAA Outdoor Championships. Five Bulldogs were named All-Americans in 2003. Ashley, Davis, Lewis and Keston Nelson all earned the recognition following a third-place finish in the 4x400-meter relay at nationals. Ashley picked up the honor in the 400-meter dash in addition to the 4x4.

In 2003, McWilliams became the first woman in MSU track and field history to win a national championship. Running 4:06.75, McWilliams broke an NCAA Championships record en route to winning the 1500-meter run. She was also crowned SEC indoor champion in the mile, in addition to the outdoor 800- and 1500-meter runs.

At the Outdoor Championships, State tallied the second-highest point total with 20 points. MSU finished tied for 15th. Hardee took fifth in the decathlon for his first all-America honor, while Kelvin Harris ran 13.86 in the 110-meter hurdles to earn his first All-America nod.

The men topped all previous indoor squads at the NCAA Indoor Championships. The Bulldogs scored 15 points to score in the top 10 for the first time in school history. Browne won the 60-meter dash title (6.60), while Marquis Davis finished second in the 200 (20.70).

During 2002, Schmidt and the MSU program hosted the SEC Outdoor Championships. At the meet, State's men scored 35 points as a team, the second-highest total of an MSU squad since his arrival. He also witnessed the men's program tally its highest points total since 1991 at the SEC Indoor Championship.

Elisha Williams became the school's first indoor all-American in 2001 after taking second in long jump. Later in the season, Williams became the second woman to become a double All-American in the same year. Schmidt also helped Falilatu Ogunkoya finish her MSU career in 2001 as a five-time All-American, and Camille Harper closed out her career as an All-American in the 100-meter dash.

The 1990s saw Aki Bradley benefit from the tutelage of Schmidt. Bradley became a double All-American at the 1994 NCAA Outdoor Championships, placing in both the 100- and 200-meter sprints. In 1992, MSU hosted the SEC Outdoor meet; the Bulldogs finished seventh overall.

Schmidt's first men's team in 1989 showed immediate improvement, finishing fifth at both the SEC Indoor and Outdoor Championships; marking the first time in five years the Bulldogs finished in the top half of the conference.

During Schmidt's first three years, he saw Festus Igbinoghene earn six All-American awards in horizontal jumps, including three runner-up finishes in the triple jump.

#### ACADEMICS

Under Schmidt, State's squads have also excelled in the classroom. Over 200 student-athletes have been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll. Three athletes - Rob Irwin, Tina Bridgeman and April Ecke- each earned Academic all-America honors. Distance runner Ecke earned the 1993 H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar

Athlete of the Year. Chris Boldt earned First Team Academic All-District honors from the College Sports Information Directors of America in 2003, while Matt Denton collected the honor in 2005. Joining Boldt and Denton in 2006 and 2007 was Ryan Irwin who finished First Team Academic all-District for the Men and Joy Griffith who finished First Team Academic All-District for the Women. Zita Magloire finished with Second Team Academic All-District honors in 2006. Also, in 2006 the Lady Bulldogs were selected by the USTFCCA, as an All-Academic Team. In 2007, both cross country teams were selected as All-Academic Teams.

#### PRIOR TO MSU

Before coming to MSU, Schmidt was instrumental in the success of Florida State University's track and field program. First serving as assistant women's track coach and head cross country coach, he later became an assistant men's track coach and head cross country coach. Under his guidance, the Lady Seminoles won two national titles- the 1984 outdoor and 1985 indoor titles. The FSU women also claimed runner-up honors at the 1983 and 1985 outdoor meets.

Upon earning his bachelor's degree from St. Louis University, Schmidt made his coaching debut as an assistant cross country coach at the University of Missouri-St. Louis before returning to his alma mater as head men's track coach for the next five years. After spending two years in private business, Schmidt returned to the track in 1982 as a graduate assistant at the University of Kansas. Following his one season at KU, he began his six-year stint at Florida State.

#### PERSONAL

In 1997, Schmidt served as a District 9 representative for the NCAA Women's Cross Country Championships. Having rewritten the endurance curriculum for Levels I and II, Schmidt served as the vice-chairman of USA Track and Field's Coaches Education Committee. Schmidt, 59, is married to the former Jessie Garfield of St. Louis, Mo. They are the parents of two children - daughter, Sara Lynne and son, Daniel.

## Steve Dudley

Steve Dudley begins his 14th year at Mississippi State and his third in the role of head coach. Since returning to his alma mater in 2000, Dudley has tutored nearly 30 athletes to All-American status. Last season, Dudley was an integral part in the accomplishments of both the men's and women's track teams. Dudley wanted to prove that MSU meant business, ending his first season with six athletes named to first or second team All-SEC; three named to the All-Freshman SEC team and had a total of seven athletes garner first, second or honorary All-American honors.

During the 2013 season, Dudley was instrumental in guiding the Bulldogs to produce nine All-Americans, 14 school records and 42 Top 5 all-time performances. MSU saw a season that sent 12 athletes to NCAA Outdoor Championships, while claiming two individual national titles during the indoor campaign. The head coach led sophomore Erica Bougard to capture the NCAA Indoor Pentathlon Champion title with a school-record 4,399 points. He also aided senior D'Angelo Cherry in earning the indoor national title in the 60-meter dash. Under Dudley's guidance in 2013, the Bulldogs received both national and international attention, sending numerous athletes to both the Pan American Junior Championships, as well as the IAAF World Championships in Moscow, Russia.

In 2012, MSU displayed dominance during the indoor season with Favian Cowards winning an individual SEC Championship, throwing a personal best 66-05 in the weight throw, and also setting five new school records. The 2012 outdoor season ended with 14 athletes competing in eight events at the NCAA Championship in Iowa. The overall season broke multiple records and set a precedent for the hopeful 2013.

Among the 2011 Maroon and White ranks were a couple of SEC Champions. On the Lady Bulldogs side there was Rochelle Farquharson who was named SEC Freshman Field Event Athlete of the Year after winning the SEC Long Jump Championships. For the Bulldogs it was the 4x400-meter squad of James Harris, Daundre Barnaby, Randy Patterson and O'Neal Wilder who under Dudley's guidance claimed the SEC Championship.

2011 also marked the third year in a row that the Bulldogs finished in the Top 20 at the NCAA Championships and the ninth time in ten years they had finished in the Top 25. It was also the eighth year for the Bulldogs to end the season

ranked in the Top 25 nationally, coming in at No. 22.

Helping to earn that No. 22 spot were the nine individual athletes who were ranked in the Top 25 in eight different categories. Harris posted the highest ranking at No. 5 in the high jump, while the men's 4x400-meter quartet of Harris, Wilder, Barnaby and Tavaris Tate finished at No. 6 and the 4x100-meter squad of Kendall May, D'Angelo Cherry, Garren Hendricks and Tate ranked 11th. Also individually ranked were Cherry at 8th in the 100-meter dash, Tate at 21st in the 400-meter dash, Emanuel Mayers at 25th in the 400-meter hurdles and Marcus Jackson at 16th in the high jump.

The Lady Bulldogs ended their 2011 campaign with six athletes ranked nationally. Jessica Merriweather paced the group at 13th in the high jump, followed by Richesa McCaleb at 17th in the 200-meter dash and Haley Greenwell at 30th in the 10,000-meter run. Also ranked were Rochelle Farquharson at 30th in the long jump and 39th in the triple jump and Taneisha Baker who came in at 38th in the 400-meter dash.

In 2010, Dudley watched the Bulldogs earn their seventh Top 25 finish nationally in the last nine years. The Bulldogs also finished seventh at the SEC Championships and 17th at the NCAA Championships. Nationally ranked every week of the season, MSU's men have reached as high as eighth as they entered the NCAA Championships. 2010 the Bulldogs had a record number of All-SEC Academics with 15. The Bulldogs returned 13 All-SEC performers for the 2011 track and field season.

Dudley also saw the Lady Bulldogs set records for the most national qualifiers and the most points by the team at the SEC Championships. Additionally, the women placed a record number of All-SEC Academics performers with 18. 2011 looks to be a good year for the Lady Bulldogs as they return the most point scorers ever, as well as eight All-SEC performers.

Dudley coached seven All-Americans in 2010, including freshman Tavaris Tate. In his first season as a Bulldog, Tate laid an impressive foundation for years to come. Tate began his successes with the indoor season as he set personal records in both the 200- and 400-meter dashes. In the 400m, Tate broke the MSU school record and recorded a NCAA automatic qualifying time. The outdoor season was no different for Tate, as he continued to set personal records. The 400-meter dash was Tate's standout moment, he set a MSU freshman record and an Alabama Relays record. Dudley has





always been a great teacher in the relays and 2010 was no different. During the indoor season, Dudley coached Tate, Emmanuel Mayers, Alex Richter, and Dwight Mullings to a MSU school record setting performance in the 4x400-meter relay. The outdoor season was really the time that MSU's relay teams shined as the 4x200-meter team of O'Neal Wilder, Mullings, Tate, and Mayers set a personal record and broke the MSU school record at the Texas Relays; while the 4x400-meter team of Wilder, Mullings, Tate, and Kendall May placed second at the NCAA Championships.

In 2010, Dudley coached Kendall May, Justin Christian, Dwight Mullings, Tavaris Tate to a SEC Championship in the 4x100m relay. In 2009, Dudley had five Bulldogs earn All-America accolades, including freshman sprinter D'Angelo Cherry who recorded a personal-best 10.07 seconds in the 100-meter dash. He also tutored Emanuel Mayers to a 50.06 second 400-meter hurdle time, good enough for second in MSU history. Dudley has always been a master of relays, and 2009 was a prime example. His 4x100-meter relay team finished 5th at the NCAA Championships and his 4x400-meter relay team earned medalist honors at the Mideast Regional Championships.

2008 saw Dudley lead eight Bulldog sprinters to regional qualifying marks, including two individuals in the 400-meter dash and two in the 800-meter run. He also coached Jamil Hubbard to become an SEC Champion in the 400-meter dash and coached several athletes to NCAA Regional Championships in the 400-meter dash, the 800-meter run and the 4x400-meter relay last year. Dudley coached Kendall May to an eighth-place finish in the 100-meter dash at the NCAA Championships. He also coached O'Neal Wilder to become a USA Track and Field Junior National Champion in the 400-meter dash, a bronze medal at the World Jr. Championships in the 400-meter

dash and a gold medal in the 4x400-meter relay. Golden Coachman, Bruce Davis, Chris Woods, Kendall May, John Bailey, Emanuel Mayers and O'Neal Wilder made postseason trips.

The 2007 tandem of State's 4x400-meter relay team of B. Davis, Nathan Daniels, Arthur Davis and Ezra Jones bested their previous finish from 2006, finishing in 3:03 taking fourth place. Coachman and the quartet all gained all-America honors. The 2006 edition of State's 4x400-meter relay team of juniors B. Davis, Jones, A. Davis and Daniels ran 3:05 to finish 7th at the NCAA Outdoor Championships.

In the quartet earned A. Davis his third all-America honor, while B. Davis, Jones and Daniels collected their first. In 2005, Dudley guided State's 4x400-meter relay squad to a fifth-place finish at the national championships and broke a school record held for more than a decade (3:01.63). As a result, senior Jamel Ashley, freshman Elzie Coleman, A. Davis, senior LaChristopher Lewis, Kendall Pyant II and Chris Woods earned all-America status. In the 4x100-meter relay, Ashley, Lewis, sophomore Elliott Morant and Mullings tied a school record with a 39.09 clocking at the Texas Relays. Mullings, Ashley, Davis and Lewis combined to finish third in the event at the SEC Championships. Since the 2003 Penn Relays, the Bulldogs have failed to win the 4x200-meter relay only once. Former Bulldog Steve Mullings posted the fastest regional-qualifying time in the country in the 100-meter dash (10.06) and won the

Southeastern Conference and Mideast Regional championships. In his final season for the Maroon and White, Jamel Ashley garnered all-America honors with a second-place finish in the 400-meter dash at the national championships. Ashley's 44.75 broke a school record he set a day earlier.

At the 2004 SEC Championships, Ashley, Davis, Keston Nelson and Lewis finished second in the 4x4. Ashley took eighth in the 400m at the national meet, while the 4x400 squad finished third.

Pierre Browne was named the 2003 NCAA Indoor National Champion in the 60-meter dash and finished runner-up in the 100m at the outdoor national meet. Marquis Davis finished second in the 200m at the outdoor national meet the same season. Throughout the season, four of Dudley's athletes accumulated six all-America honors. In Dudley's first season in Starkville his athletes earn eight all-America accolades.

# Steve Thomas

Steve Thomas made his return to MSU track and field in 2011 as the new assistant coach for jumps. Thomas joined the staff after spending the previous three seasons in the high school ranks at St. Patrick Catholic H.S. Prior to that, he was at the University of Kentucky for two years.

During the 2013 season, Thomas guided jumpers Erica Bougard, Ebony Brinker, Jason Harper and Marcus Jackson to earn high accolades at an elite level. Jackson set the indoor school record in 2013 with a high jump of 7-06, and entered the SEC Outdoor Championships, where he placed third, as the No. 4 high jumper in the NCAA. Bougard also rewrote the record book as she set the MSU indoor record in the triple jump (41-09.5) and jumped a school-best 5-11.5 in the high jump during the outdoor season. Thomas also coached triple jumpers Brinker and Jason Harper to top performances on the year. The two Bulldogs both made their way onto MSU's Top 5 all-time list with personal-best leaps.

In his second year back at MSU, Thomas found success continually throughout the year. With new and returning athletes, he led MSU jumpers to break school records and receive multiple personal bests at the SEC Indoor Championships. Thomas also flourished in the 2012 outdoor season as he accompanied sophomore Marcus Jackson to Iowa for the NCAA Championship for the high jump.

His first season, Thomas had quite the prosperous year as he coached a SEC Champion who was also named the SEC Freshman Field Event Athlete of the Year, placed two on the All-American lists and placed an athlete on the second team All-SEC list. Under the direction of Thomas, Rochelle Farquharson single-handedly placed Lady Bulldog jumps on the map with her performance at the 2011 SEC Outdoor Championships.

On the men's side of things, Thomas had the pleasure of coaching James Harris and Marcus Jackson, two freshmen that also had pretty impressive years. Jackson made his claim for fame at the 2011 Outdoor SEC Championships as he finished second in the high jump to claim second team All-SEC honors and find a spot on the SEC All-Freshman list. Jackson also put on quite the show at the NCAA Championships as he jumped 6-10 ¾ to earn second-team All-American honors. It was also at the NCAA Championships that Harris made his impact, as he finished fourth overall to earn All-American honors. Steve Thomas made his return to MSU track and field in 2011 as the new assistant coach for jumps. Thomas joined the staff after spending the previous three seasons in the high school ranks at St. Patrick Catholic H.S. Prior to that, he was at the University of Kentucky for two years.

While at the University of Kentucky, Thomas made his mark coaching a six-time all-America honoree in the shot put and helping the female throwers produce impressive marks in their quest for championships.

Prior to his work at Kentucky, Thomas served as an assistant coach at the University of Florida where he built upon his already impressive resume by coaching nine All-Americans, six Southeastern Conference champions and a pair of NCAA East

Region champions. In his career, he has tutored individuals who have won nearly 40 conference championship titles.

As head coach of both the men's and women's cross country and track and field programs at University of South Alabama from 1992 to 1998, he received four Sun Belt Conference Coach-of-the-Year awards.

Also at South Alabama, Thomas brought the women's squad to a school-best second place finish at the 1994 Sun Belt Indoor Championships and fourth-place bests in four of his six years at the outdoor meet. He expanded and developed nearly every facet of the Jaguar program, producing 20 Sun Belt Conference Champions and the first NCAA qualifier in the history of the South Alabama.

During his previous tenure as the head field events coach at Mississippi State from 1988 to 1992, Thomas trained two all-Americans and six all-Sec athletes. A group of athletes that combined earned 11 individual conference titles under his direction.

Thomas is known on the international stage for his instruction skills, conducting clinics in Australia, Belgium, England, Germany, Mexico and Switzerland, as well as a two-week clinic in China in 1994.

An all-district distance runner at Oklahoma Christian College, Thomas received his undergraduate there in 1981 before earning his master's degree in education from Stephen F. Austin State University in 1983.

Thomas is a native of Saraland, Ala. He is married to the former Kim Eades, and the couple has one daughter- Kayleigh Lauren.

## Houston Franks

**H**ouston Franks returned home to Mississippi State in 2004 as an assistant track and field coach. An accomplished distance runner for the Maroon and White from 1994-98, Franks coaches and develops men's distance runners and served his first season as head cross country coach in 2009.

Entering his 10th year as men's cross country head coach and third as women's head coach, he has been an integral part to the recent success of the MSU Lady Bulldog and Bulldog cross country programs. Franks helped the Lady Bulldogs to fifth-place finishes at both the 2010 SEC Championships and the NCAA South Regional, while leading the Bulldogs to seventh and 10th place finishes in the respected events. The fifth-place finish for the Lady Bulldogs at the SEC Championships tied MSU's best finish to date which occurred in 2006.

Also in 2010, Franks coached sophomores Haley Greenwell and Renee Masterson on their way to earning all-SEC and all-Region accolades; along with senior Adam Lenz as he earned all-SEC honors.

In the past six seasons, Franks has tutored the MSU men's distance squads to breaking four school records (indoor 3,000m, outdoor 10,000m, 4x1500-meter relay and 4x800-meter relay), and moving into the MSU all-time ranks in steeplechase, 10,000-, 5,000-, 3,000- and 1500-meter runs, distance medley relay.

Most recently, Franks coached the 2013 men's and women's cross country teams to seventh-place NCAA South Regional finishes. At the meet, the MSU women out-scored conference competitors Auburn and Tennessee, while the MSU men topped rivals Alabama and Ole Miss. Each squad raced in a field comprised of nearly 30 teams and 200 athletes.

Franks guided the 2012 men's cross country team to a Top 5 finish at the NCAA South Regional. The Bulldogs spot in fifth not only tied their best regional finish in history, but also placed them ahead of SEC foes Alabama, Auburn, Ole Miss, Tennessee and Vanderbilt.

Prior to returning to Starkville, Franks spent five years at Southwest Missouri State University (now Missouri State University). While at SMS, Franks served as head cross country coach for the Bears and won three Missouri Valley Conference women's titles. His women's teams finished in the top four at the NCAA Midwest Regional's during his last three years and his men's squads finished in the top half of the conference during all five seasons. During the track and field season, the Bears captured three indoor and outdoor league championships on the women's side.

Franks was a three-time MVC Coach of the Year in

women's cross country. During the 2002-03 season, he was also a part of the first SMS squad since 1993-94 to win the league's coveted Triple Crown championships in cross country and both indoor and outdoor track and field.

Franks was also a graduate assistant at MSU under Al Schmidt during the 1998-99 season. While an assistant, he developed training programs for distance runners, coordinated team travel, recruiting, and meet administration. While running for the Maroon and White, Franks was considered MSU's top distance runner and was named to the Southeastern Conference's Academic Honor Roll three times. He currently ranks fourth on MSU's all-time list in the indoor 3000-meter run.

Franks is a 1998 MSU graduate with a teaching and coaching degree. He received his master's degree in sport administration from MSU in August 2009.

The Tupelo, Miss., native was a four-year letter winner at Tupelo High School and was named an all-American in cross country his senior season. A state champion in both cross country and the two-mile run, he was named an all-State selection three times during his track and field career at THS.

He and his wife, the former Meggan Hodge, were married in December 2007. The couple welcomed their first child, daughter named Madison, in October 2010.

April Thomas enters her fifth season as coach of MSU's throws athletes. During her tenure with the Bulldogs, Thomas helped heptathlete Marrissa Harris earn indoor and outdoor all-American and all-SEC accolades by tutoring her to a personal-best in the shot put. Thomas coached LaQuinta Aaron to personal-best throws in the shot put that helped her earn provisional qualifications in the heptathlon for the 2009 NCAA Outdoor Championships.

Thomas also watched decathletes Darryl Brady and Martin Lee earn Top 8 finishes in the decathlon at the 2009 Outdoor SEC Championships and also throw personal-best in the shot put and the discus.

Most recently, Thomas guided newcomer Piotr Antosik all the way to the 2013 NCAA Outdoor Championships in Eugene, Ore. There, Antosik threw 210-0 to finish 18th in the javelin. Earlier in the season, Thomas helped Antosik land a spot in MSU's Top 5 all-time with a javelin performance of 226-0.

Thomas led Favian Cowards to all-American honors in the 2012 season, coupled with a ninth-place national finish. Cowards, with guidance from Thomas, threw a personal best 66-05 to win MSU's first SEC Championship in the weight throw. Cowards throw also set a new MSU all-time record and earned her a spot on the 2012 all-SEC team. In 2011, Thomas coached Cowards to top finishes, before seeing the junior conclude her season with a fifth place finish at the SEC Outdoor Championships.

Thomas had the pleasure of seeing Ed Wesela post five regular season victories in 2011 in the shot put, before placing third in the event at the SEC Championships. It was also under Thomas' direction that Wesela was named a member of the 2011 SEC Community Service Team.

In 2010, Thomas coached Cowards through her emergence onto the track and field throwing scene. Thomas tutored Cowards to a personal-best weight throw to earn eighth-place at the 2009 SEC Indoor Championships, where she earned all-SEC accolades. In 2010, she led Cowards to a school record setting indoor 20-pound weight throw of 59-01 ½, and a 5th place spot on the MSU all-time performance list for the hammer throw.

Additionally in 2010, Thomas guided Wesela to personal-bests in the shot put and discus that helped him earn all-SEC honors in both events.

Thomas comes to MSU after coaching boys' and girls' shot put and discus at Knoxville (Tenn.) Catholic High

School. Her primary responsibilities at MSU are coaching throwers. She also coached with the Knoxville Track Club.

A native of Albany, Ga., Thomas earned her degree in sociology from University of Tennessee in 2007. Prior to UT, she competed at Cloud County (Kansas) Community College. At the 2006 SEC Indoor Championships, Thomas finished as runner-up in the shot put. She also has three other Top 5 SEC finishes to her credit in the event. She currently ranks sixth on UT's all-time outdoor performers list in the shot put and seventh in hammer throw, sixth on the all-time indoor weight throw and fifth on the school's all-time indoor performers list in the shot put. Thomas helped UT win the 2005 SEC Indoor Championship. She was part of Tennessee's 2005 NCAA Mideast Regional team that captured the program's first victory at that event.

A veteran at the national and international level for over 25 years and coaching 28 collegiate national champion squads, and numerous All-Americans and 15 Olympic Medalists and 17 World Championships Medalists at several of the nation's most prestigious programs.

Silvey, who was inducted as a coach into the National Junior College Hall of Fame (2005) has a unique quality of having won 19 team championships in the SEC, Big-12 and PAC-10 conferences. Individually, his resume boasts 26 World Championship competitors, 34 Olympians and numerous NJCAA & NCAA All-Americans.

At the international level, Coach Silvey served as the Zambia Olympic Coach for Track and Field in the 1992 and 1996 Olympiads, and produced its first ever Olympic medal in the sport of track and field with Samuel Matete in the 400 hurdles (silver medal). Silvey also served as the head coach for Zambia at the 1993 World Championships in Stuttgart, Germany as Samuel Matete again won the World Championship Silver Medal.

Silvey served as Recruiting Coordinator and Assistant Track Coach for Texas Tech University from 2004 to 2007. While with the Red Raiders, Silvey Helped lead the 2005 men's outdoor team to it's first ever Big-12 Conference Championship. Silvey's sprinters, hurdlers and relays scored over 100 of the 149.50 points that won the schools first ever Big-12 championship for the Red Raiders. The 2007 men's outdoor track team also finished as Big 12 Runner-up this past season. Silvey's impact on Texas Tech University resulted in nine new school records during his 3 years with the Red Raiders.

While at the University of Oregon from 2001-2003, Silvey made a quick impact on a struggling program. During Silvey's first year, the men's team jumped from fifth place to second place at the 2002 PAC-10 Outdoor championships. In Silvey's final season with the Ducks, the men's team claimed the 2003 PAC-10 Championship, an accomplishment not seen in 12 years. Silvey's two solid recruiting classes also produced another PAC-10 Conference Championship in 2005.

Prior to his arrival in Eugene, Silvey built his reputation at two of the nations top track and field programs, the University of Arkansas and Blinn College. While at those schools, he was a part of 28 NCAA national team championships, including a stretch of 13 straight years before leaving the Razorbacks after the 2000 outdoor campaign.

As the Sprints/Hurdles/Relays mentor at the University of Arkansas from the fall of 1994 through the 2000 outdoor season, he was part of 13 NCAA indoor and outdoor track & field and cross country team titles and 17 SEC team championships. His athletes won 15 All-American honors (including one NCAA champion and three NCAA runner-up) and 13 outdoor track and field SEC individual titles.

Prior to arriving in Fayetteville, he was five-time national coach of the year at Blinn College, where his squads won 15 national Championships in seven years. At the Brenham, Texas institution,

Silvey produced 164 All-Americans, 128 individual national champions and 27 relay champions. His cross country program added a national championship 1993 and another in 1994. Silvey's 1992 and 1993 Blinn College teams were voted the "Outstanding Team" at the Texas Relays, and the 1992 team also added the crown of "USA Men's National Relay Ranking Champions," according to Track and Field News.

Prior to his stint at Blinn, Silvey served as men's and women's assistant track coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas A&M University from 1984 to 1987. Silvey helped position the Aggies rise to national prominence, as A&M finished among the top six NCAA men's squads twice during his stay. Silvey's star-studded recruiting classes at Texas A&M included world-class track athletes, such as 200-meter Olympian Floyd Heard, 1993 World Championships 100-meter silver medalist Andre Cason and Olympic shot put champions Randy Barnes (1996) and Mike Stulce (1992).

Silvey also has eight years of experience coaching on the high school level in Iowa, Texas and Louisiana.

A 1980 graduate of Truman State University (Kirksville, Mo.) with a bachelor's degree in environmental science education, he added a master's degree from Texas A&M University in physical education in 1987.

Before returning to coaching in Fall 2013 at Mississippi State, Silvey spent five years in a private business in Dallas, Texas. During this time, he published 19 books on speed training and track and field topics.

Gant, a former two-year letter winner on the Bulldog track squad in 1974 and 1975, works daily with the MSU decathletes and pole vault competitors. The Vaiden, Miss. native came to State in 1974 after a two-year stint in the junior college ranks in Mississippi. He turned in a personal best 15 feet, six inches in the pole vault competition and placed second in the Southeastern Conference decathlon with 7,041 points. His total in the event is a school record (old javelin).

After his collegiate days, Gant remained in Mississippi in the high school football ranks at Weir High School in Choctaw County, Miss. While at WHS, Gant led the Lions to five Class 1A State Championships. His quintet of state titles is second all time in the Mississippi High School Athletic Association's coaching laurels. He is the only coach in Mississippi to have won that many at one school.

His nephew, Jamie Gant, played two seasons for the MSU Diamond Dogs from 2003-04.

The Bulldogs kicked off their outdoor campaign as they hosted the 2013 Conference Challenge, featuring seven teams in a conference showdown at MSU's Carl Maddox Track Facility. The Southeastern Conference captured both men's and women's wins at the home meet. Working along side SEC foes Tennessee and Ole Miss, MSU donned six first-place finishes to help give the conference 360 points for the women and 287 for the men. Marcus Jackson, who was runner-up in the high jump at 2013 NCAA Indoors, kicked off his outdoor season by clearing 7-02.50 in the event and earning another first-place finish for the Bulldogs. Also excelling in field action was Jason Harper, who won the triple jump with a leap of 49-05.00.

MSU continued its season on the road in Austin, Texas. The 86th Clyde Littlefield Texas Relays were highlighted by a win from the 1600-meter sprint medley team at Mike A. Myers Stadium. The quartet comprised of Tavaris Tate, Scottie Hearn, Daundre Barnaby and Brandon McBride posted a time of 3:18.09 to win the sprint medley. Newcomer Pitor Antosik threw for 213-08 in the javelin, a performance which ranked third on the school's all-time list. On the last day of action, the 4x400-meter relay team posted a time of 3:05.35 to win after shaving three seconds off its qualifying time.

After top performances in Austin, the Bulldogs then traveled to Tuscaloosa ranked 13th in the nation. The men picked up three individual victories at Alabama. Harper bested the field in the triple jump with a 50-2.00 and picked up 10 points for the Bulldogs. Nathan Arnett ran a 14.17 in the 110-meter hurdles to pick up the win, while Barnaby was victorious in the 400-meter dash with a team season-best 46.32. Arnett also tacked on a top three showing in the 400-meter



hurdles, finishing second with a 51.19. A.J. Ward added a second-place finish in the long jump with a 23-4.00.

Remaining No. 13 in the country, the squad hit the road again to LSU. The Maroon and White men were led by strong showings in the field, as Ward long jumped 23-05.50 to boast a second-place finish, followed by teammates Harper and Jarrett Samuels who tied for third after jumping 21-10.50. The 4x400-meter relay team clocked a third-place finish. The men's foursome posted a 3:06.86 in the event. Tate, Barnaby, McBride and Patterson's time was just over a second more than their season-best 3:05.35, a time that ranked fifth in the NCAA.

The Bulldogs remained on the road the following weekend, posting Top 3 times and scores in all events in which they competed at the Mississippi Open in Oxford. Highlighted by Tate's first-place finish in the 400-meter dash, coach Steve Dudley's squad saw a day full of success. Juan Sanchez also earned a spot in first for the Bulldogs, as he finished the 1500-meter run in 3:49.10. Following Sanchez, freshman Patrick Monaghan clocked a 3:53.91 to finish third.

In the field, Pitor Antosik threw the javelin for 204-07.00, a score which ranked fifth on MSU's all-time list.

In the last meet of the regular season, MSU traveled to Philadelphia for the 119th Penn Relays. John Valentine was the top-finishing Bulldog as he jumped hurdles, splashed through water and ran multiple laps to post a third-place time of 9:10.59 in the 3,000-meter steeplechase. The Bulldogs sprint medley quartet of Tate, Samuels, Barnaby and McBride clocked a 3:18.32 at Franklin Field to finish second out of 34 teams. Hearn proved his leadership on the track as he finished third in a field of 50 hurdlers. His time of 51.76 in the college 400-meter hurdles championships placed him ahead of teammate Arnett (54.15), who finished 29th. MSU field athletes also excelled on the final day of action as Jackson cleared 7-02.50 in the high jump to garner a second-place finish. Jackson, who entered the competition as the third-ranked high jumper in the NCAA, finished only behind 2012 Olympic bronze medalist Derek Drouin of Indiana.





**M**SU kicked off the season in Birmingham, and posting top finishes for the Maroon and White women at the Panther Indoor Icebreaker were Katie Houston, finishing second in the mile (5:03.31), Ocian Archer, taking third in the 400m dash (56:45) and Kanishia Carey, who was just behind Archer in fourth (57.13). At the Crimson Tide Indoor Opener in January, Bougard finished Top 3 in three of her five pentathlon events and posted a top score (8.44) in the 60-meter hurdles.

As the Lady Bulldogs traveled back to Alabama for the Auburn Indoor Invitation, the quartet of Chloe Phillips, Brittany Covington, Emma Neigel and Houston posted a time of 11:56.01 in the 4000-meter distance medley to improve upon

the Invitational record of 12:15.75.

The MSU women continued their success on the season at the Amory Collegiate Invitation as Ebony Brinker (39-09.25) picked up a third-place finish in the triple jump and Muir posted a top speed of 54.23 seconds in the 400-meter dash.

In February, the Lady Bulldogs captured attention at the Tyson Invitational at Arkansas with Alyssa Hall's first-place high jump victory (5-09.75) and Bougard's third-place performance (5-07.75). The 4x400-meter relay team of Archer, Muir, Bougard and Carey raced in 3:41.21 seconds to give the MSU women a fourth-placed finish.

Leading into 2013 Southeastern Conference Indoor Championships, MSU found itself ranked No. 25 in the country by the U.S.

Track and Field and Cross Country Coaches Association Computer Team Rankings.

The Lady Bulldogs re-wrote the record books as they capped their 2013 Indoor campaign claiming an individual national title by Erica Bougard. The only woman to represent MSU at NCAA Indoors, Bougard entered the meet ranked fourth nationally in the pentathlon and second in the SEC. Her total of 4,399 points at the meet marked the best in school history. Capturing 10 team points on her own, Bougard's efforts landed MSU a No. 20 finish overall, while the men earned a spot in 12th with 18 points to finish ahead of SEC foes Alabama, Auburn, Georgia, LSU and Ole Miss.





As the weather warms, it can only mean one thing for MSU track and field, and that is the beginning of the outdoor season.

MSU coach Steve Dudley had a goal to immediately start qualifying for nationals. The MSU women opened the outdoor season at home with the Conference Challenge, where success was the story of the day. Working along side SEC foes Tennessee and Ole Miss, MSU donned six first-place finishes to help give the conference 360 points for the women. The challengers comprised of Illinois, Purdue, Louisiana Tech and Missouri State, claimed 217 on the women's side. Highlighted by strong field performances and leadership from distance veterans, the Maroon and White squads were vital in aiding the SEC to victories. Allison Storey threw for 40.53 meters in the javelin to win the event and grab 10 points for the conference. Ebony Brinker also won her field event, after posting 38-09.00 in the triple jump, while Alyssa Hall finished second in the high jump, clearing 5-05.00. With help from Cornelia Griesche (10:47.39) and Adrianna Poole (11:08.19) in the women's 3000-meter steeplechase, the pair collected 10 points, finishing second and fifth, respectively.

After sweeping the competition at home, State hit the road and headed to Austin for the 86th Clyde Littlefield Texas Relays. To open action on day one, All-American Erica Bougard began part one of a two-day heptathlon competition. She finished with 3,570 points on the day after winning the 100-meter hurdles, high jump and 200-meter dash. On day two, she captured a heptathlon win by collecting a total of 5,649 points at Mike A. Myers Stadium. MSU's momentum only continued as javelin thrower Storey posted 138-10 to place her second on the school's all-time performer list. Her personal-best throw placed her eighth

overall. Also seeing action for the women was Griesche, who ran in the 3000-meter steeplechase. The freshman clocked 10:39.41 to land a fifth-place finish. Day three was highlighted by Jody-Ann Muir, Kanishia Carey, Bougard and Ocian Archer's time of 3:39.39 in the 4x400-meter relay prelims, a speed that ranks 5th in MSU history and placed them 12th. To close out their time in Texas, Hall cleared 5-07 in the high jump to warrant a fourth-place finish, and the Lady Bulldog 4x400-relay team posted a 3:39.05 in the finals to finish sixth.

Next, MSU took a short trip east to Tuscaloosa for the Alabama Crimson Tide Invite. Muir picked up multiple victories, running a 54.00 in the 400-meter dash and team season-best 23.89 in the 200-meter dash. Bougard added a second-place finish in both the long jump (20-2.25) and the 100-meter hurdles (13.80). Fellow sophomore Brinker also picked up a second-place finish with a 40-1.50 in the triple jump. Dudley's squad would only continue its success traveling across the Southeastern Conference.

After a strong showing at Alabama, the ladies took their talents to Baton Rouge for more top performances. Muir and Carey posted top speeds for the Lady Bulldogs. Muir's time of 53.25 placed her second in the 400-meter dash, while Carey finished third in the 800-meter run, turning in a 2:11.24. Freshman pole vaulter Megan Walker garnered a second-place performance after she cleared 12-09.00. Brinker and Hall also saw Top 3 finishes in their respective events. Brinker's 40-08.25 landed her third in the triple jump and Hall cleared 5-07.25 in the high jump.

Continuing its tour of the SEC, MSU's next stop was in Oxford for the Mississippi Open, hosted by rival Ole Miss. The Lady Bulldogs captured multiple

wins, as Storey posted a season-best 139-02.00 in the javelin throw, and Hall neared her best high jump clearance this year at 5-07.00. Chloe Phillips (4:25.66) and Emma Neigel (4:33.59) paced distance runners in the 1500-meter run, finishing second and third, respectively. Brinker and Sydney Rodkey garnered a pair of Top 3 field performances, as Brinker leaped a personal-best 40-09.75 in the triple jump and Rodkey pole vaulted 11-06.50.

To close the regular outdoor season, the women finished at one of the nation's most historic meets, the 119th Penn Relays in Philadelphia, Penn. Competing against some of the country's most elite athletes, MSU shined. In front of a crowd of 48, 871 fans, Archer, Muir, Ste'yce McNeil and Bougard finished second in the women's 4x400-meter relay college competition at Franklin Field. Their time of 3:34.88 was not only the quartet's best race of the season, but it also broke a school record previously set in 2010 (3:36.43). The women's performance placed MSU ahead of SEC foes Kentucky and South Carolina in the event. Bougard (19-00.75) also finished 10th in the college long jump championships, while Hall's clearance of 5-06.00 in the high jump placed her 11th. Later on, Sojourner Ewing donned a sixth-place performance in the long jump college competition with a leap of 19-04.25. Maroon and White distance athletes also saw action on day two, as Phillips, Fabienne Amrhein, Neigel and Renee Masterson teamed up to race a 18:20.90 in the college 4x1500-meter championship. The quartet's time landed them a spot in seventh, while adding another commendable finish to MSU's showing in Philadelphia.

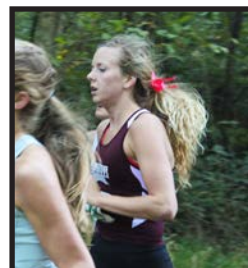
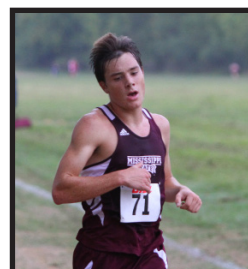
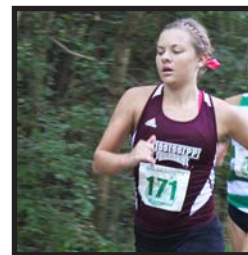

At the beginning of the season, the Mississippi State Bulldog cross country team found themselves picked to finish 11th in the Southeastern Conference, and the Bulldogs set out in September to defy their predicted results.

Under the lights of the Mike Rose Soccer Complex in Memphis, Tenn., the Mississippi State men's country team kicked off the 2013 campaign by sweeping the Memphis Twilight hosted by Christian Brothers University. Leading the way for the men was senior John Valentine, who captured the 4.2 mile run title with a time of 21:08.62, with fellow senior Juan Sanchez (21:52.07) following behind in seventh place. Junior Mike Clark (22:05.92) and sophomore Mathew Dunn (22:06.79) rounded out the top 15, finishing in the 14th and 15th positions, respectively. The men captured the win with 55 total points, beating out second place Morehead State, who finished with 60 points.

MSU then continued its success in the Volunteer State with a Top 5 finish at the Commodore Classic in Nashville. The men recorded a second-place finish in the 8K run as the Bulldogs topped conference foe Ole Miss. Valentine (25:11.16) led the way for MSU with a third-place finish. Cameron Vernier finished 10th with a time of 25:27.05, and Patrick Monaghan rounded out the Top 20 with a time of 25:34.74.

The winning ways continued in their largest non-conference meet of the season as MSU showcased an unrivaled performance to claim a first-place team finish at the Charlotte Invitational on Sept. 28. The Maroon and White squad totaled 48 points to sweep the 8K Gold Race competition. Led by Valentine (3rd, 25:12.20), the Bulldogs landed five in the Top 20 out of 197 athletes. Following Valentine was junior Vernier (25:19.60) and Sanchez (25:32.80), who finished sixth and 10th, respectively. Twins Patrick (15th, 25:38.40) and Andrew Monaghan (19th, 25:41.10) rounded out the Top 20.

In their final event before the Southeastern Conference Championships, the men posted 110 at Harry Pritchett Running Park in Tuscaloosa to earn a fourth-place finish at the Crimson Classic. Seizing the top 8K finish for the Bulldog men was Valentine, clocking a 24:47.93 to finish sixth. In his debut for the Maroon and White, freshman Damian Roszko followed Valentine to post a spot in seventh with a time of 24:53.64. Nearly half of MSU's men finished in the Top 30 in a competitive field of nearly 200 runners. The Bulldogs beat out conference rivals Alabama, LSU and Vanderbilt.

Upon returning home, the Bulldogs began preparations for their journey through the championship season, beginning with a trip to Gainesville for the SEC Championships on Nov. 1. Led by Valentine the 8K (24:47.22), the Bulldogs totaled 229 points to finish ninth. The MSU men placed ahead of conference foes, Alabama, LSU, Ole Miss and Vanderbilt.

Concluding the 2013 season, the MSU men captured a seventh-place finish at the NCAA South Regional hosted by the University of Alabama. Junior Damian Roszko led the way for MSU, posting a time of 30:26.34 in his first-ever 10K to finish 12th. The Bulldogs also saw leadership from senior John Valentine (26th, 30:46.89), who has provided top scores for the team all season. The men earned 242 as they topped rivals Alabama and Ole Miss.

Picked to finish 11th in the Southeastern Conference, the Lady Bulldogs laced up their running shoes for the 2013 season. Their journey would take them from Tennessee to North Carolina, and ultimately would end at the NCAA South Regional in Alabama.

First up for the Lady Bulldogs was the Memphis Twilight on Aug. 31. Sophomore Cornelia Griesche (18:01.85) led the way with a fifth-place finish. Senior Katie Huston (18:02.89) followed closely behind in sixth, while juniors Emma Neigel (18:11.93) and Jodie McGuff (18:12.93) rounded out the top 10 at ninth and 10th, respectively. Despite not having a runner capture the individual women's title, the Lady Bulldogs still took home the team title with a final total of 44 points. Southeastern Conference rival Ole Miss finished in second place with a total of 53 points.

MSU then took its talents to Nashville, where the Lady Bulldogs totaled 100 points on the day for a fourth-place finish in the 5K at the Commodore Classic. Neigel (17:33.47) led the way for the MSU women with an eighth-place finish, while Griesche (17:39.23) finished 13th.

Following their showing in Tennessee, the MSU women traveled to the Charlotte Invitational in North Carolina for their largest non-conference meet of the season. In a field of 30 teams and 206 women, the Lady Bulldogs dominated to earn the Top 2 spots as Neigel clocked a 21:24.00 in the 6K Gold Race to finish in first, followed by Huston (2nd, 21:27.60). The women also saw leadership from newcomer Lisa Ziegler, who posted a time of 21:47.90 to finish 10th.

Next, a short trip to Alabama resulted in big results for the squad as it tallied 80 points to secure a second-place finish at the Crimson Classic on Oct. 18. Huston (17:34.84) led the way for the Lady Bulldogs, finishing eighth in the 5K, followed by Neigel (9th, 17:40.26). Griesche (17:47.45) and freshmen Rhianwedd Price (17:53.90) and Ziegler (18:04.54) also had strong finishes for the women, rounding out the Top 30 at 16th, 22nd and 30th, respectively. Overall, the MSU women finished ahead of SEC foes Tennessee, Auburn, Vanderbilt and LSU.

Championship season began for Coach Houston Franks' team in Gainesville at the SEC Championships. The Lady Bulldogs executed strong pack running as a handful crossed the line in 31st, 32nd, 39th, 43rd, 49th and 50th. Griesche followed Neigel, clocking a time of 21:32.35 to finish 32nd. Ziegler (39th, 21:43.85), Huston (43rd, 21:46.46) and McGuff (49th, 21:54.67) rounded out MSU's Top 5 runners. The women's 10th-place finish (191 points) landed them above rivals Auburn, Georgia, LSU and South Carolina.

To wrap up the 2013 campaign, the Lady Bulldogs totaled 198 points to garner a seventh-place finish at the NCAA South Regional hosted by the University of Alabama. The women out-scored conference competitors Auburn and Tennessee as paced by freshman Rhianwedd Price (12th, 20:33.58) in the 6K.

Sophomore Erica Bougard captured four personal bests in the women's pentathlon on day one of the 2013 Southeastern Conference Indoor Championships at Randal Tyson Track Center, highlighted by wins in the 60-meter hurdles and the long jump.

The only woman to compete for the MSU indoor track and field team on day one, Bougard entered the meet ranked fourth nationally in the pentathlon and second in the SEC. Heading into the final event of the competition, Bougard found herself in second with an outstanding 3,582 points. After concluding the day with a second-place spot in the 800-meter run (2:16.09), Bougard was later disqualified in the event from stepping out of bounds. With the loss of 877 points, the Lady Bulldog fell to a 13th-place finish. Bougard began the day posting an impressive personal-best time of 8.35 seconds in the 60-meter hurdles to capture the win in the event. With 1,050 points, the Byhalia, Miss., native was tied for first in the pentathlon heading into the high jump. In similar fashion, the young pentathlete earned another personal record, clearing 5'10" on her first attempt in the high jump to add 953 points to her total. After two events, Bougard found herself second on the leaderboard with 2,003 points. Up next for the Lady Bulldog was the shot put. Bougard's personal record of 36'00.75" gave her a ninth-place finish, but allowed her



to maintain her spot in second, moving into the long jump. There, the MSU standout excelled with an all-time best jump of 21'01.25". Her remarkable performance was the best of the day for the lady jumpers.

Day two of SEC Championships saw a variety of action from MSU, as the women claimed three personal bests and advanced two others into day three's finals. Bougard continued to shine on Saturday, seizing the runner-up title in the women's long jump. A valued leader for the Lady Bulldogs, Bougard jumped 20-05.75 on the day and picked up eight points for the team. The sophomore also earned herself a spot in the 60-meter hurdles finals with a time of 8.40 seconds. Young pole vaulter Megan Walker posted a score of 12-07.50 in her conference-championships debut to set a personal record

and finish 10th in the conference. Later in the day, junior Chloe Phillip's time of 4:51.67 in the mile prelims gave her a personal best and broke into the Top 4 on MSU's all-time indoor list. Running the 400-meter dash prelims in a season-best 53.87, senior Jody-Ann Muir also qualified for finals.

Day three saw more records broken for Maroon and White. Bougard broke a fourteen-year-old school record in the triple jump with an outstanding 41-09.25 leap on the final day. The Mississippi State indoor track and field team also turned in a time of 3:39.28 in the 4x400-meter relay to set a season best and school record. The quartet consisted of Bougard, Ocian Archer, Muir and Kanishia Carey.

MSU's 18 points landed them 11th in the conference.





After posting some impressive times during the regular season, MSU turned its focus to the championship slate of its schedule, and the Lady Bulldogs laced up for the 2013 Southeastern Conference Outdoor Track and Field Championships in Columbia, Mo.

With four events completed, sophomore Erica Bougard stood second in the women's heptathlon after day one of the SEC Championships at Audrey J. Walton Stadium. Her performances highlighted wins in the 100-meter hurdles and 200-meter dash, and Bougard was the only athlete to compete for the Mississippi State track and field team on the first day. She entered the meet ranked ninth nationally

in the heptathlon and third in the SEC. Taking an early lead in the competition, the Lady Bulldog won the first event, clocking a 13.40 in the 100-meter hurdles. Bougard's time, which was just shy of her personal-best 13.39, earned her 1,065 points. The Byhalia, Miss., native then picked up 928 points in the high jump, clearing 5-09.25 to finish second. After two events, Bougard rested in second on the leaderboard. Up next for Bougard was the shot put. Her toss of 35-01.25 placed her in tenth, but allowed her to maintain her spot in second moving into the 200-meter dash. There, the MSU standout excelled with a personal-best 23.93, which stood as the fastest time of the day for the women and earned her 987 points.

Coming into the remainder of the competition on day two with 3,555 points, Bougard claimed the runner-up title in the heptathlon with 5,786 points, a new personal best and MSU record. The Lady Bulldog posted a top performance in the long jump at 19-08.75, the best of the afternoon for the lady leapers. Sophomore Ocian Archer also excelled for the women, posting a personal-best 1:00.24 in the 400-meter hurdles. Her speed placed her first in her heat, fifth overall, and allowed her to automatically qualify for the finals.

Despite rainy weather on days one and two, the sun shined on day three of SECs, and so did

the MSU women, qualifying three athletes to event finals. Bougard continued her momentum from early success, leaping an outdoor all-time best 20-11.75 to finish second in the long jump finals. In doing so, she added another eight points to the team's total. In the women's 3000-meter steeplechase, freshman Cornelia Griesche posted a 10:30.43 to garner a fifth-place finish and earn four points for the women. Finishing second in her heat and sixth overall, Jody-Ann Muir turned in a time of 53.17 in the women's 400-meter prelims to earn herself a spot in day-four finals.

On the final day of action at the 2013 Championships, the women collected four Top 10 finishes, highlighted by outstanding field performances. Ebony Brinker and Bougard picked up two sets of points in the triple jump. Bougard posted a 41-05 to finish seventh, while Brinker's 41-09.75, a lifetime best for the sophomore, ranked fifth on the MSU performance list. The two ladies combined for five points. Throwing a lifetime-best 145-05, junior Allison Storey posted a seventh-place finish in the javelin, which scored also scored two points. Meanwhile, Archer also set a personal record as she finished seventh in the women's 400-meter hurdles finals with a time of 59.82, grabbing two points for the MSU women. In the 400-meter finals, senior Muir contributed to the women's point total, tallying on three with her time of 53.83, which placed her sixth.

The women's 35 total points garnered a spot in 10th to close out their time in Missouri.





After a highly competitive and successful regular season, Mississippi State switched gears toward the championship mode of the schedule, as competition began at the SEC Outdoor Track and Field Championships in Columbia, Mo., on May 9.

Scottie Hearn, who entered the meet ranked No. 18 nationally in the 400-meter hurdles, posted the top time of 51.02 on the day. His speed automatically advanced him to the finals and bumped him to a No. 13 ranking in the NCAA. Later in the evening, young Bulldog Brandon McBride posted a 1:50.17 in the 800-meter run. His time placed him in ninth, and he just missed the event finals, as only the top eight advance.

Despite rainy weather on days one and two of competition, the sun shined on day three of the outdoor championships, and so did MSU as athletes continued to qualify for finals.

After advancing to the men's javelin finals, Piotr Antosik threw for a personal-best 224-00 to place fourth overall. His performance also picked up the first points for the Maroon and White, giving the Bulldogs five points. To kick off the men's running events on day three, distance veteran Juan Sanchez clocked a 3:51.75 in the men's 1500-meter run prelims. His time placed him sixth overall and qualified him for the event finals.

Coach Steve Dudley's men sat in 11th

with five points heading into the final day of SECs.

Marcus Jackson, who entered the competition as the No. 4 high jumper in the NCAA and best in the conference, returned home with a third-place finish. The Carrollton, Miss., native cleared a best of 7-00.50 on the day, and his performance earned six points for Dudley's men.

Junior Jason Harper leaped a personal-best 52-02.75 in the triple jump to garner a third-place finish as well, as he collected six more points for the Bulldogs.

Only a freshman, young hurdler Hearn clocked a 50.56 in the men's 400-meter hurdles finals after running a 51.02 in the prelims. His time was not only a personal best, but moved him into the NCAA's Top 5 for the season.

After finishing sixth in the prelims, Sanchez earned three points for the men as his speed of 3:52.34 landed him sixth in the men's 1500-meter finals.

To close out weekend action at Audrey J. Walton Stadium, the Maroon and White 4x400-meter relay team saw a successful outcome. Turning in a Top 5 performance, Tavaris Tate, Randy Patterson, Daundre Barnaby and McBride sealed a fourth-place finish, clocking a 3:05.59.

The Bulldogs totaled 33 points on the weekend to finish 11th in the conference.

## NCAA DIVISION I OUTDOOR QUALIFYING STANDARDS

The championship qualifying procedure allows for a field size of 24 in all individual and relay events at the final championship competition. (Refer to the 2013 Outdoor Track and Field Technical Manual- [www.ncaa.org](http://www.ncaa.org))

### QUALIFYING

Qualifying to the final championship competition is accomplished through performance in the preliminary championship competition at each site for events contested at those competitions. Twelve competitors from each individual event and twelve teams from each relay event advance from each preliminary championship competition site to the final championship competition. Qualification, through competition in an event at a preliminary championship competition, is required to participate in that event at the final championship competition. Any individual or relay team must remain eligible for advancement throughout all rounds of the championships. The specific event formula for advancement to the final championship competition, as well as tie breaking procedure, is detailed in the 2013 Outdoor Track and Field Technical Manual.

Qualification for the Heptathlon and Decathlon events of the championship is accomplished through a student-athlete's position on the national descending order list. Based upon declarations, made before the preliminary championship competition, twenty-four student-athletes will be accepted to the final championship competition in each event.





After a successful showing at the SEC Championships, Mississippi State set its sights on national titles, as the Bulldogs traveled to the Sunshine State for the NCAA Outdoor Championships East Region Preliminary. Seventeen MSU athletes competed for top spots at the meet, hosted by North Carolina A&T in Greensboro N.C.

Scottie Hearn, the freshman standout from Meridian, Miss., posted the top time of the day in the qualifying round of the 400-meter hurdles at 50.63. Hearn wasn't the only MSU runner to dominate the day, as senior Daundre Barnaby was tops in the 400-meter dash prelims with a season-best time of 45.71. The Lady Bulldogs saw outstanding advancement as well. All-American Erica Bougard finished second in the long jump with a personal-best leap of 20-07.00. With her placement, she punched her ticket to the finals in Oregon on June 5. On the track, All-American Jody-Ann Muir placed third in the 400-meter dash at 52.08 to qualify for the finals.

On day two, Mississippi State maintained its momentum from the previous day as it punched



four more tickets to the NCAA Track & Field nationals in Eugene, Ore. Olympian Barnaby ran 46.61 in the 400-meter dash to place sixth, while on the women's side Muir posted a time of 52.02 to cross the finish line third.

In the 400-meter hurdles, Hearn earned a chance for his first taste of competing for a national title after qualifying with a time of 51.91 to finish ninth. In field event action, Piotr Antosik threw a personal best 226-00 in the javelin to finish 11th.

Call it continued success on the final day of the NCAA East Preliminary Round as the Bulldogs advanced four more events to the nationals. Jason Harper, a junior from Milford, Del.,

jumpstarted the Bulldogs' day as he placed eighth in the triple jump with a leap of 50-08.00. Then it was the All-American Marcus Jackson showcasing his talents, as he finished tied for first in the high jump at 7-01.50, his third-best jump of the year. On the track, MSU advanced in both the men's and women's 4x400-meter relay. The women's foursome of Ste'yce McNeil, Muir, Ocian Archer and Bougard posted a time of 3:34.29 to place 10th, while the men's team of Tavaris Tate, Randy Patterson, Barnaby and Brandon McBride finished second at 3:05.88.

In all, Mississippi State qualified to compete in eight events at the NCAA Outdoor Championships.



In a season that saw Mississippi State produce 14 school records and 42 Top 5 all-time performances, having success at the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships in Eugene, Ore., was no surprise.

MSU had 13 athletes compete in ten events.

As a freshman, Jody-Ann Muir ended her season with All-American honors. As a senior, she concluded her heralded career in the same fashion. On day one of NCAAs at Hayward Field, Muir advanced to the finals of the 400-meter dash after finishing sixth in the field of 24 in the semis with a time of 52.03. Her time was her second best, as she posted a 52.02 mark at the preliminary round two weeks prior in Greensboro, the second-fastest time in school history.

Also on day one, Daundre Barnaby failed to qualify for the finals of the 400m-dash as a false start led to his disqualification. In the 400m-hurdles, Scottie Hearn fell short of advancing to the finals with his time of 52.68.

On day two at Hayward Field, sophomore Erica Bougard totaled 3,581 points in four of the seven heptathlon events to put herself second overall behind SEC champion Makeba Alcide of Arkansas (3,685). Bougard, who won the NCAA indoor pentathlon title in March 2013, was in fifth place entering the 200-meter dash, but ran a personal-best time of 23.84 to climb to second in the standings. In the other three events, she ran 13.37 in the 100-meter



hurdles, leaped 5-08.75 in the high jump and threw 36-04 in the shot put.

The only other events MSU competed in on day two were the semifinals of the men's and women's 4x400. However, neither team qualified for the finals. The women's foursome of Brittany Covington, Muir, Ste'yce McNeil and Ocian Archer ran 3:52.77, while the men's team of Tavaris Tate, Randy Patterson, Barnaby and Brandon McBride just missed on making the final eight as they posted a time of 3:06.17.

Bougard, hailing from Byhalia, Miss., captured a fourth-place finish in the heptathlon with a school-record 5,976 points, breaking the mark of 5,786 she set last year. Meanwhile, Muir, a senior from Jamaica, placed sixth in the 400-meter dash with a time of 52.56 on day three of action.

As a result, the Lady Bulldogs found themselves in 24th place overall with eight points.

In other MSU action, Marcus Jackson placed 10th in the high

jump at 7-02.50.

To close out the Bulldogs' time in Oregon, Piotr Antosik threw 210-0 to finish 18th in the javelin. Furthermore, Jason Harper, the junior from Milford, Del., placed 12th in the triple jump with a leap of 51-7  $\frac{3}{4}$ , the second-longest jump of his career. Florida's Omar Craddock repeated as champion at 55-6  $\frac{1}{4}$ .

In the overall standings, Florida and Texas A&M tied for the title with 53 points, while Arkansas finished third with 46.5 points. The MSU men didn't score. On the women's side, Kansas won in convincing fashion with 60 points, followed by Texas A&M and Oregon with 44 and 43 points, respectively.

The Lady Bulldogs finished 32nd with eight points after placing 60th last year with two points. Bougard and Muir provided all the scoring by finishing fourth in the heptathlon and sixth in the 400-meter dash, respectively, on day two of competition.

## Larry H. Templeton Athletic Academic Center

Dedicated on November 1, 2008, the Templeton Athletic Academic Center is a welcome addition to the Bulldog athletic program. The \$10 million facility is named for former MSU Director of Athletics Larry Templeton.

The facility is an addition to two existing facilities in the athletic wing of the MSU campus - the Shira Complex and the Holliman Athletic Center. It is situated on the south side of those two facilities, and across the street from the Bryan Athletic Administration Building.

The 34,000 square-foot building serves the entire athletic department, houses the Athletic Academics offices and staff, and includes individual computer rooms, tutor work areas, a large open study area and a 300-seat

dining facility with a fully-functioning kitchen.

Templeton, now Athletic Director Emeritus, served 22 years as Director of Athletics and during his tenure helped position MSU Athletics as an innovative, progressive program, with equality in sports for women, new and renovated facilities and keen fiscal management.

During the 1990s almost every sport came away with a best-ever finish. Achievements included six football bowl games, men's basketball's trip to the 1996 NCAA Final Four, three baseball trips to the NCAA College World Series, five Southeastern Conference championships and participation in the NCAA Championships by sport teams 29 times.

### **Jim and Julia Rouse Weight Room**

Mississippi State athletes use top-of-the-line weight training machines that are apart of the Jim and Julia Rouse Weight Room located in the Shira Athletic complex.

A 9,000-square foot strength and conditioning room. Equipped with the latest technology in weight training, more than \$350,000 worth of equipment is housed in the Julia and Jim Rouse Weight Room. Jim Rouse, a 1962 graduate of MSU and an original member of the Bulldog Foundation, is the retired vice president of Exxon Mobile.



### **Holliman Athletic Center**

A 46,000-square foot athletic center, providing Bulldog athletes with a locker room, equipment room and team meeting rooms, as well as a state-of-the-art athletic training area and strength and conditioning facility.



The Holliman Athletic Center is located just east of the Shira Athletic Complex, State's original practice facility, which was constructed in the 1970s.



### **Athletic Training Staff**

The medical team begins with the certified athletic trainers (ATC's) who interact with the student athletes on a daily basis. Each full time staff athletic trainer at Mississippi State is certified by the National Athletic Trainers' Association Board of Certification and is licensed in the state of Mississippi.

### **Athletic Training Room**

The Mississippi State Sports Medicine Department consists of six athletic training rooms at various athletic facilities to better serve our student athletes. The athletic training rooms are staffed by our seven full time staff members along with five graduate assistants and 20 student athletic trainers.



The new Columbus Orthopaedic Sports Medicine Center is equipped with the latest in modalities (in-ground whirlpools, ultrasound, electrical stimulation), rehabilitation equipment (including a Biodex and Hydroworx® therapy pool with an underwater treadmill), an x-ray machine, and a variety of additional equipment necessary to meet the needs of the elite collegiate athlete.

The Team Family Practice Physicians and Orthopedists are available at practice and in the athletic training room almost daily for consultation with the athletic trainers and student athletes.



### **John C. Longest Student Health Center**

Mississippi State University maintains a full service student health center on campus where our two Team Family Practice Physicians practice. They are supported by a lab, pharmacy, x-ray, physical therapy department, nutritionists, three additional physicians, four nurse practitioners, and a nursing staff.



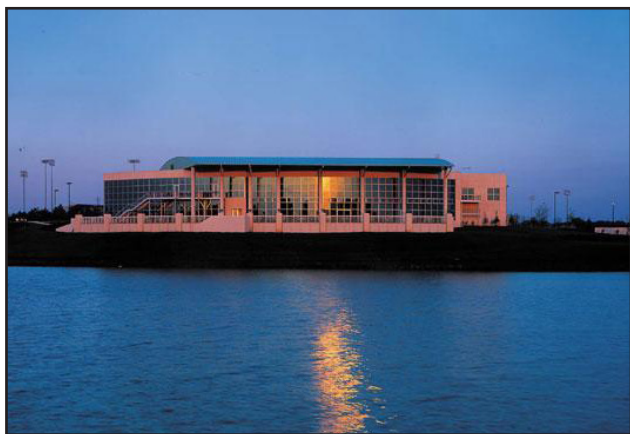




## Mississippi State University

Mississippi State is a comprehensive land-grant institution and the largest university in Mississippi, with a statewide enrollment of more than 16,000 students.

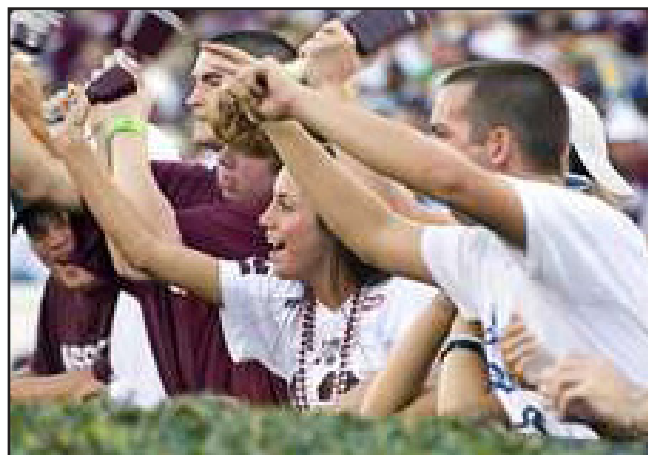
Established in 1878 as the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Mississippi, the university has traditional strengths in engineering and scientific agriculture but has evolved into a comprehensive institution with a diverse array of programs in teaching, research, and service.



## Academics and Student Life

Mississippi State students consistently earn honors such as the prestigious Harry S. Truman Scholarship, awarded for those who will enter public service, and, with 16 Truman Scholars to date, the university has been recognized as a Truman Honor Institution. In the past year, a student team competed for and won first place in a national Challenge X competition to redesign a fuel-efficient and environmentally-friendly SUV.

Recently initiated programs are providing opportunities to develop leadership potential and global study options. The university's Global Leadership Continuum provides "cradle-to-CEO" programming designed to develop leadership



across a "global" spectrum that begins with high school and continues through the university experience and into professional life. Included are the Young Guns Leadership Camp for rising high school seniors; the Day one Leadership Community for incoming freshmen, focusing on shared academic and service experiences; and the highly competitive Appalachian Leadership Honors Program for sophomores and juniors.

To complement these efforts, the university has launched a minor in leadership studies open to students in all majors. A university honor code adopted in 2007 institutionalizes a campus culture of integrity and personal responsibility in academic studies. Through the Global Leadership Program, students may experience significantly expanded study-abroad opportunities.







## Research

Mississippi State faculty researchers attracted \$186.5 million in external funding for 2006-07, up from about \$155 million during the previous year. This funding supported 1,691 sponsored projects in 2007.

Based on the latest rankings available from the National Science Foundation, MSU ranks 7th in the nation in agricultural sciences research expenditures and 44th in engineering. Last year MSU faculty and staff disclosed 80 new technologies resulting in three new start-up companies, nine licenses, and 22 patent applications. The university now holds 77 patents.

In recent years, MSU has established the Thad Cochran Endowment for Entrepreneurship, as well as collaborating with federal agencies and industries to help increase technology-oriented start-up companies. Among the collaborators and sponsors are the U.S. departments of Defense and Energy, NASA, General Electric, Northrop Grumman, EADS/American Eurocopter, Boeing, Raytheon, General Dynamics, Israeli Aerospace Industry, and the Mississippi Technology Alliance.

In a key area of economic interest to Mississippi, MSU's Center for Advanced Vehicular Systems, established in 2001, continues research and

development supporting a goal of attracting automotive industries to the state. The center is conducting research in areas that include materials processing, human and systems engineering, alternative power systems, computational manufacturing and design, and advanced learning technologies.

## Outreach and Service

From its academic programs to the work of countless individuals, Mississippi State has "extended farther" and gone "beyond the limit" to make a difference in the lives of citizens around the state. In 2006, the university formed the Mississippi State Community Action Team to organize university resources and expertise for quick response to local issues around the state. MSU's Extension Service is the first in the nation to have an interactive videoconferencing system in every county Extension office. Through the Freedom Calls program, the system is being used to connect Mississippians with family members in the U.S. military serving our country in Iraq.

The MSU Extension Service maintains offices in almost every county of the state, and the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station operates 10 branch stations throughout Mississippi. Four strategically located research and extension centers coordinate the delivery of services statewide.





**Dr. Mark Keenum**  
UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT  
Mississippi State, 1984

Dr. Mark Everett Keenum became Mississippi State's 19th president Jan. 5, 2009, following a distinguished public service career.

After completing his bachelor's and master's degrees in agricultural economics at Mississippi State, Dr. Keenum joined the university faculty in 1984 as a marketing specialist with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service. Two years later, he accepted a position as a research associate with the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station at MSU.

He continued his education at the university, in 1988 receiving a doctorate in agricultural economics, and he joined the faculty of that department as an assistant professor/economist. During his professional tenure at Mississippi State, his primary research and extension work focused on the marketing and economics of aquaculture, specialty crops and forestry. He continued his faculty ties at the university 1997-2006 as an adjunct professor, teaching an annual course on agricultural legislative policy.

Prior to being named president of Mississippi State in November 2008, Dr. Keenum served as Under Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture for two years, where he provided leadership and oversight for the Farm Service Agency, the Risk Management Agency and the Foreign Agricultural Service. The mission area, comprised of the three agencies, had a total operating budget of \$1.7 billion and approximately \$40 billion in program authority. The three agencies employed more than 16,500 people at more than 2,300 offices nationwide and 98 locations around the globe.

In 1989, Dr. Keenum joined the Washington, D.C., staff of U.S. Senator Thad Cochran as Legislative Assistant for Agriculture and Natural Resources. As Sen. Cochran's adviser on agricultural affairs, he worked on numerous issues important to U.S. agriculture, including the 1990, 1996, and 2002 Farm Bills. From 1996-2006, he served as Chief of Staff for Sen. Cochran. In this role, Dr. Keenum was the chief adviser to the senator on political, legislative and appropriations issues. He also was responsible for managing all administrative and legislative functions of Sen. Cochran's Washington, D.C., office and three Mississippi offices, including direct oversight of the U.S. Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry and the U.S. Senate Committee on Appropriations.

Dr. Keenum and his wife Rhonda have four children.



**Scott Stricklin**  
ATHLETIC DIRECTOR  
Mississippi State, 1992

A lifelong dream was fulfilled on May 7, 2010, when Scott Stricklin was formally introduced as Mississippi State's director of athletics, the 16th in school history.

As Stricklin begins to enthusiastically tackle his new job of leading the MSU athletic department, he certainly isn't a stranger to the Bulldog family or college athletics.

A 1992 graduate of Mississippi State, the Jackson, Miss., native's resume is highlighted by 22 years of experience on the collegiate level in various capacities at five different universities. The last two years, he's faithfully served as Senior Associate Athletics Director for External Affairs at his alma mater, overseeing fundraising, football and men's basketball scheduling, managing MSU's all-sport agreement with Adidas, facility planning, and serving as the administrative sport liaison for men's basketball and softball. It's those type of day-to-day tasks that's prepared the personable Stricklin to take over the top seat in the Mississippi State athletic department.

Yet it's a journey that started during his formidable days as a dedicated and tireless worker in the media relations department that's led to his highly-respected career coming full circle. Prior to graduating, Stricklin's stint in the MSU media relations office included three seasons (1990-92) as the media contact for the highly successful and nationally-renowned baseball program. Upon graduation, he was named assistant media relations director at his alma mater.

He continued his climb up the ladder of success when he was named associate media relations director at Auburn, where from 1993-98 he served as the primary baseball contact and the secondary football contact. He also spent the 1993-94 season handling the publicity for the Tigers' nationally-ranked women's basketball team.

In 1998, Stricklin left Auburn to become Assistant Athletics Director at Tulane, where he served as the primary media contact for the Green Wave's 1998 12-0 football team. Next came a four-year run in the Big 12 Conference at Baylor (1999-2003) as Assistant AD for Communications and Marketing.

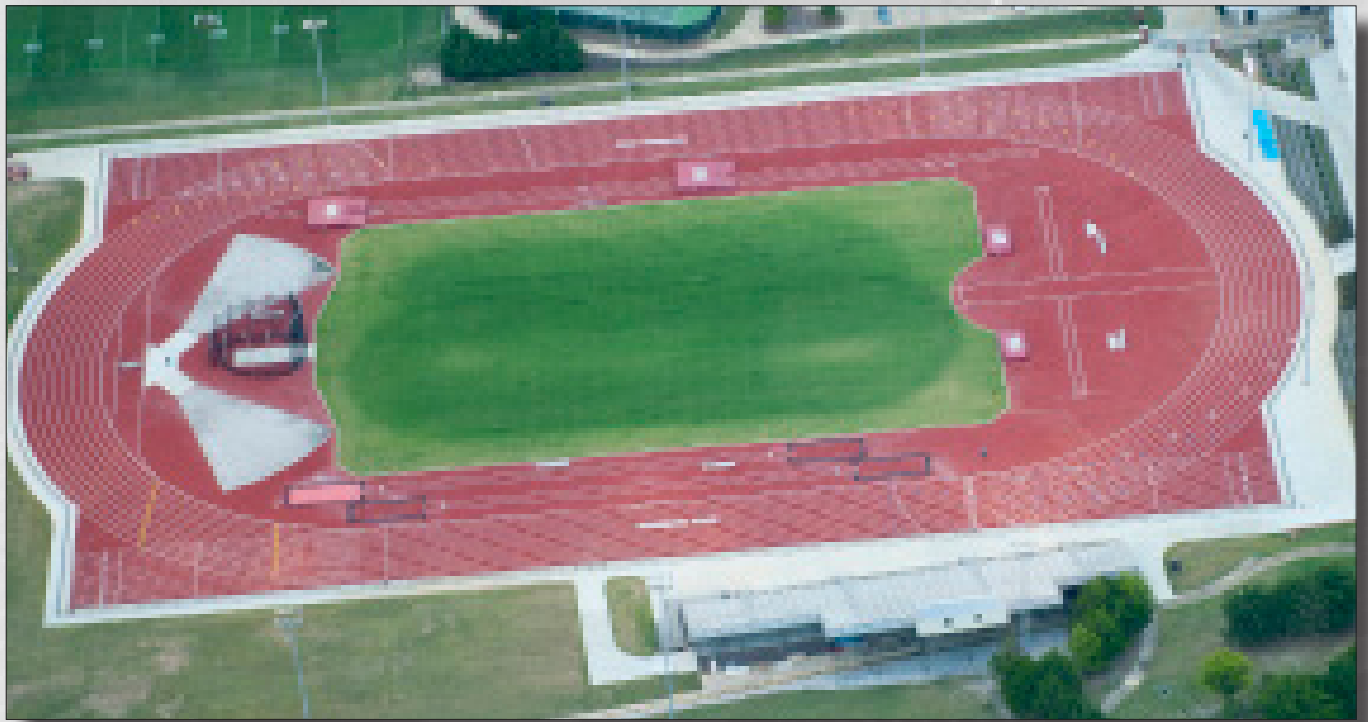

*The Bulldogs' state of the art, \$3 million track renovation open spring of 2011. The new facility features a completely remodeled, nine-lane track surface and field event areas.*

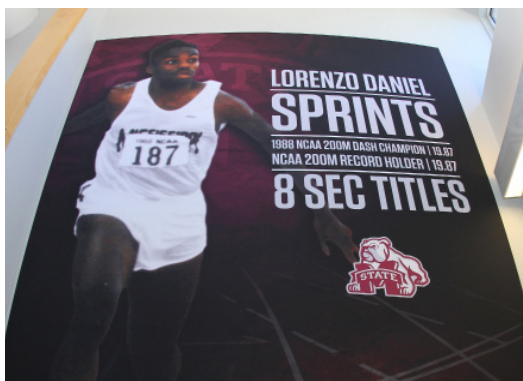
