Steve Dudley

Head Coach

15th Season (5th as Head Coach)

Mississippi State, 1995

Steve Dudley begins his 15th year at Mississippi State and his fifth in the role of head coach. Since returning to his alma mater in 2000, Dudley has tutored over 20 athletes to All-American status.

Throughout his tenure as head coach, Dudley has coached three athletes to become national champions, including Brandon McBride who was the indoor and outdoor 800-meter run national champion last season. He coached both Erica Bougard who won the 2013 Indoor pentathlon title and D'angelo Cherry to the 2013 Indoor 60-meter dash.

Dudley has individually coached 18 male and seven female athletes to All-American titles during his duration of head coach.

Throughout the 2014 season, Dudley was an integral part in the accomplishments of both the men and women's track teams. Dudley wanted to prove that MSU meant business. He ended his first season with six athletes named to first or second team All-SEC; three named to the All-Freshman SEC team and had a total of seven athletes earn first, second or honorary All-American honors.

After the 2014 season, MSU track and field had eight athletes achieve All-American status. Out of these eight Dudley coached two athletes, including two-time national champion in the 800-meter run Brandon McBride. MSU track and field also saw 19 athletes qualify to compete in the 2014 Indoor and Outdoor National Championships. The MSU women's team earned 10th overall at the Indoor NCAA National Championships under Dudley's and his coach staff's guidance. This was the highest ranking in school history.

Dudley, whose event focus is sprints, has seen numerous athletes through his 15 years achieve All-American status. In the 2013 season alone Dudley coached 12 out of 22

All-American Bulldogs. Also in the 2013 season, MSU had 14 school records and 42 Top 5 all-time performances. MSU saw a season

that sent 12 athletes to NCAA Outdoor Championships, while claiming two individual national titles during the indoor campaign. The head coach led sophomore Erica Bougard to capture the NCAA Indoor Pentathlon Champion title with a school-record 4,399 points. He also aided senior D'Angelo Cherry in earning the indoor nation title in the 60-meter dash. Under Dudley's guidance in 2013, the Bulldogs received both national and international attention, sending numerous athletes.

When he was named head coach in 2010, Dudley had plenty experience in coaching national champion athletes and All-Americans. Prior to being named the head coach of the MSU track and field teams, Dudley served as an assistant coach from 2000 to 2009 under Al Schmidt.

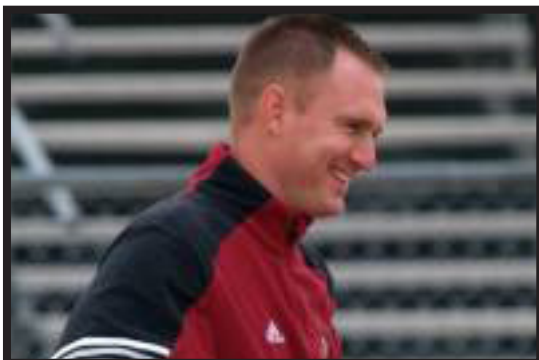
In his very first season as an assistant coach, Dudley had eight athletes earn all-America accolades. His success continued throughout the years.

Dudley coached Pierre Browne who was named the 2003 NCAA Indoor National Champion in the 60-meter dash and finished runner-up in the 100m at the outdoor national meet. That same season Dudley had six athletes acquire All-American honors. Another key season as an assistant coach come in 2005 when Dudley guided State's 4x400-meter relay squad to a fifth-place finish at the national championships. That same season he garnered six All-Americans

As an assistant coach in 2008, Dudley lead eight Bulldog sprinters to the regional qualifying marks. During that same season, he coached O'Neal Wilder to become a USA Track and Field Junior National Champion in the 400-meter dash, a bronze medal at the World Jr. Championships in the 400-meter dash and a gold medal in the 4x400 meter relay.

Dudley coached five more Bulldogs to earn All-American accolades in 2009. Dudley has always been a master of relays, and 2009 was no was a prime example. His 4x100-meter relay team finished 5th at the NCAA Championships and his 4x400-meter relay team earned medalist honors at the Midwest Regional Championships.

Prior to his coaching time at MSU, Dudley spent three seasons at Beville State (Ala.) Community College. Dudley coached three NJCAA national champions and 19 all-Americans throughout his duration at Beville State. In cross country, the men's and women's squads captured the Region XXII title in 1999.



The Bears also won the 1998 Region XXII title en route to a third-place national showing. His 1999 Lady Bear team earned Academic Team of the Year honors, and the men finished second the same season. Twelve Bears earned Academic all-America accolades.

For Dudley it is not only about what his athletes can do on the track, but also what they can do in the classroom. Since becoming head

coach, MSU has had 86 athletes make the SEC honor roll.

Before entering the coaching ranks, Dudley served as a captain for MSU's track team from 1991-95. While at State, he was named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll for three years (1993-95).

The Hamilton, Ala., native graduated with a bachelor's degree in May 1995. He received his master's degree in environmental geology

also from State in December 2004.

Along with coaching, Dudley also serves as a member of the Mississippi State faculty.

Dudley is married to the former Tiffany McWilliams, who ran track and field for MSU and was a three-time NCAA National Champion in the 2003 and 2004 Outdoor 1500-meter run and in the 204 Indoor mile run.

Assistant Coach

Fifth Season

Oklahoma Christian College, 1981

Steve Thomas made his return to MSU track and field in 2011 as the new assistant coach for jumps. Thomas joined the staff after spending the previous three seasons in the high school ranks at St. Patrick Catholic H.S. Prior to that, he was at the University of Kentucky for two years.

Thomas had great success during the 2014 season. He coached Erica Bougard in the pentathlon, which in the SEC Indoor Championships she broke school history by becoming the first MSU athlete to win the SEC pentathlon title, after posting a personal-best 4,458 points.

At the end of the 2014 season, Thomas had coached four athletes who were named All-Americans including, Bougard, Marucs Jackson, Jason Harper and Rochelle Farquharson.

During the 2013 season, Thomas guided jumpers Bougard, Ebony Brinker, Harper and Jackson to earn high accolades at an elite level. Jackson set the indoor school record in 2013 with a high jump of 7-06, and entered the SEC Outdoor Championships, where he placed third, as the No. 4 high jumper in the NCAA. Bougard also rewrote the record book as she set the MSU indoor record in the triple jump (41-09.5) and jumped a school-best 5-11.5 in the high jump during the outdoor season. Thomas also coached triple jumpers Brinker and Jason Harper to top performances on the year. The two Bulldogs both made their way onto MSU's Top 5 all-time list with personal best leaps.

In his second year back at MSU, Thomas found success continually throughout the year. With new and returning athletes, he led MSU jumpers to break school records and receive multiple personal bests at the SEC Indoor Championships. Thomas also flourished in the 2012 outdoor season as he accompanied sophomore Marcus Jackson to Iowa for the NCAA Championship for the high jump.

His first season, Thomas had quite the prosperous year as he coached a SEC Champion who was also named the SEC Freshman Field Event Athlete of the Year, placed two on the All-American lists and placed an athlete on the second team All-SEC list. Under the direction of Thomas, Farquharson single-handedly placed Lady Bulldog jumps on the map with her performance at the 2011 SEC Outdoor Championships.

On the men's side of things, Thomas had the pleasure of coaching James Harris and Jackson, two freshmen that also had pretty impressive years. Jackson made his claim for fame at the 2011 Outdoor SEC Championships as he finished second in the high jump to claim second team All-SEC honors and find a spot on the SEC All-Freshman list. Jackson also put on quite the show at the NCAA Championships as he jumped 6-10 $\frac{3}{4}$ to earn second-team All-American honors. It was also at the NCAA Championships that Harris made his impact, as he finished fourth overall to earn All-American honors.

Steve Thomas made his return to MSU track and field in 2011 as the new assistant coach for jumps. Thomas joined the staff after spending the previous three seasons in the high school ranks at St. Patrick Catholic H.S. Prior to that, he was at the University of Kentucky for two years.

While at the University of Kentucky, Thomas made his mark coaching a six-time all-America honoree in the shot put and helping the female throwers produce impressive marks in their quest for championships.

Prior to his work at Kentucky, Thomas served as an assistant coach

at the University of Florida where he built upon his already impressive resume by coaching nine All-Americans, six Southeastern Conference champions and a pair of NCAA East Region champions. In his career, he has tutored individuals who have won nearly 40 conference championship titles.

As head coach of both the men's and women's cross country and track and field programs at University of South Alabama from 1992 to 1998, he received four Sun Belt Conference Coach-of-the-Year awards.

Also at South Alabama, Thomas brought the women's squad to a school-best second place finish at the 1994 Sun Belt Indoor Championships and fourth-place bests in four of his six years at the outdoor meet. He expanded and developed nearly every facet of the Jaguar program, producing 20 Sun Belt Conference Champions and the first NCAA qualifier in the history of the South Alabama.

During his previous tenure as the head field events coach at Mississippi State from 1988 to 1992, Thomas trained two all-Americans and six all-Sec athletes. A group of athletes that combined earned 11 individual conference titles under his direction.

Thomas is known on the international stage for his instruction skills, conducting clinics in Australia, Belgium, England, Germany, Mexico and Switzerland, as well as a two-week clinic in China in 1994.

An all-district distance runner at Oklahoma Christian College, Thomas received his undergraduate there in 1981 before earning his master's degree in education from Stephen F. Austin State University in 1983.

Thomas is a native of Saraland, Ala. He is married to the former Kim Eades, and the couple has one daughter- Kayleigh Lauren.

Houston Franks returned home to Mississippi State in 2004 as an assistant track and field coach. An accomplished distance runner for the Maroon and White from 1994-98, Franks coaches and develops men's distance runners and served his first season as head cross country coach in 2009.

Entering his eleventh season as the men's head cross country coach and his fourth as the women's head coach, Franks has been an integral part to the recent success of the MSU Bulldog's cross country programs. Franks helped lead the women's team to a fifth place finish in the 2014 SEC Championships, where Rhianwedd Price finished fourth individually and earned first team all-SEC. Franks also coached senior Damian Roszko who earned second team all-SEC.

Franks coached Cornelia Griesche throughout her sophomore track and field season on her way to earning an All-American honorable mention.

In the 2014 cross country season, Franks produced his cross country first All-American at MSU since becoming head coach. Rhianwedd Price placed 24th at the NCAA National Championships earning the title.

During the 2013 campaign, Franks coached sophomores Haley Greenwell and Renee Masterson on their way to earning all-SEC and all-Region accolades; along with senior Adam Lenz as he earned all-SEC honors.

In his ninth year as men's cross country head coach and first as women's head coach, Franks helped the Lady Bulldogs to fifth-place finishes at both the 2010 SEC Championships and the NCAA South Regional, while leading the Bulldogs to seventh and 10th place finishes in the respected events. The fifth-place finish for the Lady Bulldogs at the SEC Championships tied MSU's best finish to date which occurred in 2006.

Also in 2010, Franks coached sophomores Haley Greenwell and Renee Masterson on their way to earning all-SEC and all-Region accolades; along with senior Adam Lenz as he earned all-SEC honors.

In the past five seasons, Franks has tutored the MSU men's distance squads to breaking four school records (indoor 3,000m, outdoor 10,000m, 4x1500-meter relay and 4x800-meter relay), and moving into the MSU all-time ranks in steeplechase, 10,000-, 5,000-, 3,000- and 1500-meter runs, distance medley relay.

Most recently, Franks guided the 2012 men's cross country team to a Top 5 finish at the NCAA South Regional. The Bulldogs spot in fifth not only tied their best regional finish in history, but also placed them ahead of SEC foes Alabama, Auburn, Ole Miss, Tennessee and Vanderbilt.

Prior to returning to Starkville, Franks spent five years at Southwest Missouri State University (now Missouri State University). While at SMS, Franks served as head cross country coach for the Bears and won three Missouri Valley Conference women's titles. His women's teams finished in the top four at the NCAA Midwest Regional's during his last three years and his men's squads finished in the top half of the conference during all five seasons. During the track and field season, the Bears captured three

indoor and outdoor league championships on the women's side.

Franks was a three-time MVC Coach of the Year in women's cross country. During the 2002-03 season, he was also a part of the first SMS squad since 1993-94 to win the league's coveted Triple Crown championships in cross country and both indoor and outdoor track and field.

Franks was also a graduate assistant at MSU under Al Schmidt during the 1998-99 season. While an assistant, he developed training programs for distance runners, coordinated team travel, recruiting, and meet administration.

While running for the Maroon and White, Franks was considered MSU's top distance runner and was named to the Southeastern Conference's Academic Honor Roll three times. He currently ranks fourth on MSU's all-time list in the indoor 3000-meter run.

Franks is a 1998 MSU graduate with a teaching and coaching degree. He received his master's degree in sport administration from MSU in August 2009.

The Tupelo, Miss., native was a four-year letter winner at Tupelo High School and was named an all-American in cross country his senior season. A state champion in both cross country and the two-mile run, he was named an all-State selection three times during his track and field career at THS.

He and his wife, the former Meggan Hodge, were married in December 2007. The couple welcomed their first child, daughter named Madison, in October 2010 and their second child, Patrick Houston, in August 2014.

April Thomas enters her fifth season as coach of MSU's throws athletes. During her tenure with the Bulldogs, Thomas has helped heptathlete Marrissa Harris earn indoor and outdoor all-American and all-SEC accolades by tutoring her to personal-best in the shot put. Thomas coached LaQuinta Aaron to personal-best throws in the shot put that helped her earn provisional qualifications in the heptathlon for the 2009 NCAA Outdoor Championships.

Thomas also watched decathletes Darryl Brady and Martin Lee earn Top 8 finishes in the decathlon at the outdoor SEC Championships and also throw personal-best in the shot put and the discus.

After completing her fourth season with the Bulldogs, Thomas aided in the success of Erica Bougard as she earned the 2014 SEC pentathlon title and was named a first team All-American. Thomas also coached Tautvydas Kieras who broke the school record in discus (186-05.00) at the 2014 Golden Eagle Classic.

In 2013 Thomas guided newcomer Piotr Antosik all the way to the NCAA Outdoor Championships in Eugene, Ore. There, Antosik threw 210-0 to finish 18th in the javelin. Earlier in the season, Thomas helped Antosik land a spot in MSU's Top 5 all-time with a javelin performance of 226-0.

Thomas led Favian Cowards to all-American honors in the 2012 season, coupled with a ninth-place national finish. Cowards, with guidance from Thomas, threw a personal best 66-05 to win MSU's first SEC Championship in the weight throw. Cowards throw also set a new MSU all-time record and earned her a spot on the 2012 all-SEC team. In 2011, Thomas coached Cowards to top finishes, before seeing the junior conclude her season with a fifth place finish at the SEC Outdoor Championships.

Thomas had the pleasure of seeing Ed Wesela post five regular season victories in 2011 in the shot put, before placing third in the event at the SEC Championships. It was also under Thomas' direction that Wesela was named a member of the 2011 SEC Community Service Team.

In 2010, Thomas coached Cowards through her emergence onto the track and field throwing scene. Thomas tutored Cowards to a personal-best weight throw to earn eighth-place at the 2009 SEC Indoor Championships, where she earned all-SEC accolades. In 2010, she led Cowards to a school record setting indoor 20-pound weight throw of 59-01 ½, and a 5th place spot on the MSU all-time performance list for the hammer throw.

Additionally in 2010, Thomas guided Wesela to personal-bests in the shot put and discus that helped him earn all-SEC honors in both events.

Thomas comes to MSU after coaching boys' and girls' shot put and discus at Knoxville (Tenn.) Catholic High School. Her primary responsibilities at MSU are coaching throwers. She also coached with the Knoxville Track Club.

A native of Albany, Ga., Thomas earned her degree in sociology from University of Tennessee in 2007. Prior to UT, she competed at Cloud County (Kansas) Community College. At the 2006 SEC Indoor Championships, Thomas finished as runner-up in the shot put. She also has three other Top 5 SEC finishes to her credit in the event. She currently ranks sixth on UT's all-time outdoor performers list in the shot put and seventh in hammer throw, sixth on the all-time indoor weight throw and fifth on the school's all-time indoor performers list in the shot put. Thomas helped UT win the 2005 SEC Indoor Championship. She was part of Tennessee's 2005 NCAA Mid-east Regional team that captured the program's first victory at that event.

A veteran at the national and international level for over 25 years and coaching 28 collegiate national champion squads, and numerous All-Americans and 15 Olympic Medalists and 17 World Championships Medalists at several of the nation's most prestigious programs.

Silvey, who was inducted as a coach into the National Junior College Hall of Fame (2005) has a unique quality of having won 19 team championships in the SEC, Big-12 and PAC-10 conferences. Individually, his resume boasts 26 World Championship competitors, 34 Olympians and numerous NJCAA & NCAA All-Americans.

At the international level, Coach Silvey served as the Zambia Olympic Coach for Track and Field in the 1992 and 1996 Olympiads, and produced its first ever Olympic medal in the sport of track and field with Samuel Matete in the 400 hurdles (silver medal). Silvey also served as the head coach for Zambia at the 1993 World Championships in Stuttgart, Germany as Samuel Matete again won the World Championship Silver Medal.

Silvey served as Recruiting Coordinator and Assistant Track Coach for Texas Tech University from 2004 to 2007. While with the Red Raiders, Silvey Helped lead the 2005 men's outdoor team to it's first ever Big-12 Conference Championship. Silvey's sprinters, hurdlers and relays scored over 100 of the 149.50 points that won the schools first ever Big-12 championship for the Red Raiders. The 2007 men's outdoor track team also finished as Big 12 Runner-up this past season. Silvey's impact on Texas Tech University resulted in nine new school records during his 3 years with the Red Raiders.

While at the University of Oregon from 2001-2003, Silvey made a quick impact on a struggling program. During Silvey's first year, the men's team jumped from fifth place to second place at the 2002 PAC-10 Outdoor championships. In Silvey's final season with the Ducks, the men's team claimed the 2003 PAC-10 Championship, an accomplishment not seen in 12 years. Silvey's two solid recruiting classes also produced another PAC-10 Conference Championship in 2005.

Prior to his arrival in Eugene, Silvey

built his reputation at two of the nations top track and field programs, the University of Arkansas and Blinn College. While at those schools, he was a part of 28 NCAA national team championships, including a stretch of 13 straight years before leaving the Razorbacks after the 2000 outdoor campaign.

As the Sprints/Hurdles/Relays mentor at the University of Arkansas from the fall of 1994 through the 2000 outdoor season, he was part of 13 NCAA indoor and outdoor track & field and cross country team titles and 17 SEC team championships. His athletes won 15 All-American honors (including one NCAA champion and three NCAA runner-up) and 13 outdoor track and field SEC individual titles. The 2000 season was perhaps the finest by his athletes who posted one of the nation's top times in the 4X100-meter relay (39.27), a collegiate record in the sprint medley relay (3:12.13), took second in the NCAA 4x400-meter Final (3:02.02) and won the prestigious Penn Relays. His team's shuttle relay owned the fastest time in the world that season (55.37), which included DeMarcus Brown, who was an All-American in the 110 hurdles and owned a collegiate best of 13.72. One of three Hogs that ran 13.75 or faster that year under his guidance, while All-American 400-meter hurdler Samuel Glover owned a best of 49.08.

Prior to arriving in Fayetteville, he was five-time national coach of the year at Blinn College, where his squads won 15 national Championships in seven years. At the Brenham, Texas institution, Silvey produced 164 All-Americans, 128 individual national champions and 27 relay championships. His cross country program added a national championship 1993 and another in 1994. Silvey's 1992 and 1993 Blinn College teams were voted the "Outstanding Team" at the Texas Relays, and the 1992 team also added the crown of "USA Men's National Relay Ranking Champions," according to Track and Field News.

Prior to his stint at Blinn, Silvey served as men's and women's assistant track coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas A&M University from 1984 to 1987. Silvey helped position the Aggies

rise to national prominence, as A&M finished among the top six NCAA men's squads twice during his stay.

A 1980 graduate of Truman State University (Kirksville, Mo.) with a bachelor's degree in environmental science education, he added a master's degree from Texas A&M University in physical education in 1987.

Before returning to coaching in Fall 2013 at Mississippi State, Silvey spent five years in a private business in Dallas, Texas. During this time, he published 19 books on speed training and track and field topics.

2014 MEN'S OUTDOOR SEASON REVIEW

To open its outdoor campaign, the Mississippi State track and field team saw three freshmen compete in the men's decathlon competition on day one of the Alabama Relays.

The trio, comprised of Carl Pittman, Zach Taylor and JaQuarius Wilson, set the bar high on the first day of action with top finishes in the first five of ten events.

Taylor led the Bulldogs to a solid start, clocking a 10.91 to win the 100-meter run. Later, the newcomer's speed landed him a second-place finish in the 400-meter dash (49.21). The Rock Hill, S.C., native totaled 3,478 points on the day.

With a first-place leap in the long jump, Wilson (22-01.00) gave MSU its second-straight win in the competition before heading into the shot put. There, he posted the best Bulldog score with a toss of 36-04.00 to finish fifth. Wilson earned 3,350 points on Thursday.

Pittman's best performances on day one came on the track as he finished ninth in the 400-meter dash (51.78) and 11th in the 100-meter dash (11.76). He collected 2,836 points through five events in his outdoor debut.

On day two, it was the quartet of Scottie Hearn, Marshall Nunn, Alistair Moona and Steve Shoto who dominated the competition, capturing a first-place finish in the men's 1600-meter sprint medley relay. The foursome's time of 3:23.37 garnered the most convincing win of the evening.

Javon Davis and Hearn posted second- and third-place times, respectively, in the men's 400-meter hurdles. Davis crossed the line in 52.14, while Hearn followed at 52.63.

MSU men's distance runners Damian Roszko (3:47.78, 4th) and Andrew Monaghan (3:51.97, 9th), as day three of the Alabama Relays ended.

This concluded the Alabama Relays as the Bulldogs turned their attention to the Texas Relays.

To begin the Texas Relays, Senior veteran John Valentine donned a ninth-place finish in the men's 3000-meter steeplechase after posting a 9:33.42 in the event.

Davis clocked a 52.02 to finish second in his heat of the University men's 400-meter hurdles prelims. His time placed him fifth overall and advanced him to tomorrow's event finals set for 7 p.m.

The foursome of Roszko, Patrick Monaghan, Juan Sanchez and Hearn earned a spot in eighth in the men's 4x800-meter relay with a time of 7:38.25.

Patrick Monaghan, Scottie Hearn, McBride and Roszko posted a speed of 9:49.18 to finish fifth in the men's University distance medley relay on day two of the Texas Relays.

After qualifying for the 400-meter hurdles finals the day prior in the prelims (52.02), Davis raced a 51.64 to finish fifth in Friday's finals. His speed marked a season best.

On the final day, the Maroon and White men's 4x400-meter relay team garnered a second-place finish in the University section. The quartet of Moona, Hearn, Dustin James II and Brandon McBride turned in a time of 3:06.77 to close out the meet for MSU. McBride flew by competitors on the final leg of the event to secure the team's No. 2 spot.

At the Battle of the Bayou, MSU's Roszko notched a first-place finish with a time of 8:17.95 in the

men's 3000-meter run. Sophomore Antavious McGhee won the men's high jump, clearing a personal-best 6-09.75.

Hearn collected the fourth win of the day for MSU as he ran a season-best 51.61 in the men's 400-meter hurdles. Javon Davis garnered a top-5 finish in the men's 110-meter hurdles, posting a 14.24, also a season best.

The men's 4x100-meter relay posted a third-place time of 41.32. The quartet included Davis, Moona, Nunn and Taylor. MSU captured fifth place with 74 points.

Success continued for Mississippi State track and field as the Bulldogs showcased talent at both Mt. SAC Relays and LSU Alumni Gold, while shattering



school records.

Out west in the Golden State, McBride became the NCAA leader in the men's 800-meter run by clocking a lifetime-best 1:45.35 in the event. The sophomore finished fourth overall (first for collegiate runners) en route to posting a time that ranks as the fastest speed in MSU history.

Roszko closed out action in California, donning a 14:13.53 in the men's 5000-meter run to land a spot in third on the school's all-time performance list. He finished 14th in the event.

In the men's discus, Tautvydas Kieras threw 178-00.00, just three inches shy of the MSU record, to rank second on the all-time performance list. His toss earned him a spot in third on the day.

Curtis Kelly (4:03.57) and Philip Johnson (4:10.94) finished third and fifth, respectively, in the men's 1500-meter run (B section).

Mississippi State track and field kicked off the 120th Penn Relays with one distance runner in the competition.

In the men's Olympic development 5000-meter run, sophomore Andrew Monaghan posted a 14:39.12 to finish seventh for collegiate runners.

The following day had more action for the Bulldogs.

Placing third in the college men's sprint medley championship of America was Davis, Moona, Hearn and McBride, who clocked a 3:18.41. The foursome's time topped that of Southeastern Conference foes Texas A&M and South Carolina.

At the Southern Miss Invite, four members

of the Mississippi State squad finished first in their events.

Distance duo Mike Clark (16:03.05) and Matt Weickert (16:13.66) finished first and second, respectively, in the men's 5000-meter run.

Three Bulldogs finished in the top 5 in the men's 1500-meter run as Carson Britton won the event with a speed of 4:09.87.

Pittman garnered a personal best in the men's pole vault, winning the event with a height of 14-00.00. Britton won the men's javelin, throwing 201-09.00.

Rounding out the collection of wins by the Maroon and White was Kieras, who tossed a personal-best 186-05.00 in the men's discus.

Other top finishes included AJ Ward's second-place mark of 23-04.50 in the men's long jump. Wilson followed just behind him in third at 21-05.50.

Under the lights at W.O. Spencer Stadium, Mississippi State track and field opened the 2014 Jace Lacoste Invitational with individual wins from the men's team.

Valentine notched a win for the men in the 5000-meter run of 14:50.05.

On day two, the team captured a second-place team finish.

Winning the men's javelin, Piotr Antosik threw for 215-00. Following him in second was Austin Britton with a mark of 196-04. Tautvydas Kieras turned in a throw of 184-07 to finish third in the men's discus.

Davis (14.14) and Hearn (51.04) won the men's 110-meter hurdles and 400-meter hurdles, respectively. Davis followed Hearn in the 400-meter hurdles with a second-place time of 51.61.

Charles Taylor (10.70) and Nunn (10.74) clocked personal bests to finish third and fifth in the men's 100-meter dash.

To close out this year's Jace Lacoste Invitational, the Bulldog 4x400-meter relay team earned commendable finishes. The men's quartet of McBride, Hearn, Moona and James II ran a 3:10.00 for a spot in second.

The events from day one and two led to MSU scoring 156 points earning a second place team finish behind Alabama (184).



2014 WOMEN'S INDOOR SEASON REVIEW

As the 2014 indoor campaign began, the Mississippi State track and field team used the University of Alabama at Birmingham's Blazer Invite to start the season off on the right foot.

Junior sprinter Ocian Archer clocked a 1:14.70 in the 500-meter dash to garner a first-place finish in a field of nearly 50 runners. Freshman Kaeilin Kersh followed in 17th with a time of 1:18.65.

Also with top performances in the 60-meter hurdles prelims included sophomore Ste'yce McNeil (8.57), junior Erica Bougard (8.59) and senior Keisha Wallace (8.71). The three women finished second, fourth and seventh, respectively, and each earned a spot in tomorrow's event finals slated for 11:50 a.m.

In field events, junior Ebony Brinker leaped 39-01.25 to place 12th in the triple jump, while sophomore Sydney Rodkey's 10-11.75 in the pole vault landed her a spot in 19th.

Carrying momentum from its success on day one, the Mississippi State track and field team again excelled during Saturday's competition at the UAB Blazer Invite.

After clocking a second-place finish (2:52.08) in the 1000-meter run on Friday, freshman Rhianwedd Price donned another commendable race as she finished second in the 800-meter run (2:10.67). Just behind her were teammates Katie Huston (2:13.50) and Emma Neigel (2:17.22), who finished 10th and 11th, respectively.

A trio of Bulldog hurdlers qualified for the 60-meter finals on Friday, and continued to dominate the competition on Saturday. After advancing from a field of nearly 40 athletes, Bougard (8.45), McNeil (8.63) and Wallace (8.73) garnered third, fourth and seventh-place times in the event finals, respectively.

Mississippi State indoor track and field captured four Top 10 finishes at the Auburn Indoor Invitational, highlighted by a broken meet record.

Junior Brinker had a leap of 1-05.25 in the triple jump to set the Auburn Indoor Invitational

record (previously 40-09.75). Her near personal-best (41-06.25) jump ranks third on MSU's all-time performance list, and placed her ahead of athletes from Southeastern Conference teams Auburn, LSU, Ole Miss and Vanderbilt.

With unrivaled performances in the women's long jump, Mississippi State track and field rolled over its competition on day one of the Vanderbilt Indoor Invitational.

Off the track, a pair of MSU jumpers had successful showings to qualify for NCAA Indoor Nationals. All-American Bougard (21-11.00) posted first-place in the long jump to earn a spot in the NCAA Championships in Albuquerque, N.M. Farquharson posted a 19-11.75 to finish third in the women's long jump competition.

After sweeping the competition on day one of the Vanderbilt Indoor Invitational, Mississippi State track and field carried its momentum into day two of the competition.

The women's success was highlighted by a win in the 400-meter relay. The quartet of Archer, Bougard, Shayla Luckett and McNeil ran a 3:44.76 to garner the best time of the day.

Freshman Rhianwedd Price and Euricka Hardy also saw top performances. Price finished second in the one mile (4:39.08) and Hardy placed fifth in the 60-meter dash with a time of 7.64 to close out the meet.

In one of its largest meets this season, Mississippi State was in the spotlight on day one of the New Balance Armory Collegiate Invitational as the MSU women's distance medley relay team clocked an 11:38.93 to win the event.

Huston led the quartet, running the 1200-meter leg, while Luckett ran second (400 meters), Kersh ran third (800 meters), and Neigel, who ran 1600 meters, anchored the race.

With more than 100 universities in attendance from across the nation, the MSU women saw another big win as Price took first in the 1000-meter run championship, posting a 2:47.32.

Freshman Hardy also garnered a top score

for the Lady Bulldogs during the women's 60-meter dash college section. The Oma, Miss., native finished second with a time of 7.57.

Experiencing the Big Apple in style, Mississippi State track and field carried its momentum from a successful day one to capture second-place finishes at the New Balance Armory Collegiate Invitational on Saturday.

Competing against 101 universities from across the country, the Maroon and White topped Southeastern Conference rivals Alabama, Missouri, Ole Miss, South Carolina and Vanderbilt. The MSU women tallied 62 points on the weekend to finish behind No. 7 Arkansas, while the men totaled 59 points, nearly outscoring No. 4 Wisconsin (62 points).

Price posted a third-place time of 4:41.75 in the women's one mile championship, a speed that places her third on MSU's all-time performance list.

In its first time back at the Randal Tyson Track Center since last year's Southeastern Conference Indoor Championships, the Mississippi State track and field team picked up right where it left off in the Big Apple last weekend.

Earning a first-place finish was Rhianwedd Price in the women's one mile championship. The freshman, who most recently earned USTFCCCA Individual All-Academic honors, clocked a time of 4:39.37 to place her second on MSU's all-time performance list in the event.

Huston (4:52.73) and Neigel (5:02.50) finished second and 11th, respectively, in the women's one mile college section. Huston's time garnered a personal best in the event.

To close out the 2014 Tyson Invitational, the Mississippi State track and field team posted wins in the women's distance medley relay and 3000-meter run.

The MSU women's distance medley relay, comprised of Huston, Bougard, Archer and Price, captured the win in 11:15.34. With the first-place finish, the women broke an 11-year-old school record (previously 11:18.04) and were ahead of Southeastern Conference foes Arkansas, LSU, Missouri, Tennessee and Vanderbilt. Their speed will likely rank the foursome Top 15 in the nation.

Griesche also found herself ahead of the pack, winning the women's 3000-meter run in 9:38.97. Neigel (9:48.81), Ziegler (9:56.87) and McGuff (10:11.96) followed Griesche in second, seventh and 14th, respectively.

Off the track, triple jumper Brinker garnered a fourth-place finish. Brinker's leap of 41-08.50 landed her No. 3 on MSU's all-time indoor performance list.

The Tyson Invitational concluded the 2014 track and field indoor season for the Bulldogs.

2014 WOMEN'S OUTDOOR SEASON REVIEW

With a win in the 400-meter hurdles began day two of the Alabama Relays for the Mississippi State's women's team after not seeing action on day one.

Junior Ocian Archer clocked a 1:00.07 in the women's 400-meter hurdles to win the event. Her speed was just shy of her personal-best 59.82 as she posted the highest finish of the day for the MSU women.

Also boasting top performances were distance runners Cornelia Griesche (4:29.26) and Emma Neigel (4:29.49). The pair finished second and third, respectively, in the women's 1500-meter run en route to setting personal bests. Freshman Lisa Ziegler followed in 8th with a time of 4:33.39.

Keisha Wallace clinched the 100-meter hurdles after posting a time of 13.75 on the final day of the John Mitchell Alabama Relays.

At one of the most historic track events in the country, the Mississippi State track and field team boasted top times on Thursday at Mike A. Myers Stadium to open action at the 87th Clyde Littlefield Texas Relays.

Griesche led for MSU as she turned in a personal-best time of 10:21.78 in the women's 3000-meter steeplechase en route to breaking the school record and winning the event. Following her in third, Ziegler ran a 10:25.25. Ziegler's time landed her second on the school's all-time outdoor performance list.

The MSU women's 4x800-meter relay team posted a time of 8:49.30 to garner a third-place finish. The quartet consisted of Archer, Rhianwedd Price, Katie Huston and Neigel.

MSU's day two of the Texas Relays was highlighted by the women's third-place finish in the University distance medley relay. The quartet of Huston, McNeil, Archer and Price turned in a time of 10:30.08, good for third on the school's all-time outdoor performance list.

Senior Rochelle Farquharson landed a mark of 20-05.00 in the women's University long jump (Section A) to finish fourth.

LSU hosted its fourth-annual Battle on the Bayou, where Mississippi State track and field collected numerous personal bests en route to breaking two school records.

Neigel won the women's 3000-meter steeplechase, setting a school-record 10:19.70. Her record-breaking performance comes just a week after Griesche set the MSU record at Texas Relays (10:21.78).

Rodkey tied the MSU record in the women's pole vault with a career-best 12-02.50. Her clearance earned her a sixth-place finish.

Jodie McGuff paced fifth for the women on the track, boasting a personal-best 10:03.65 in the women's 3000-meter run.

Competing alongside foes Ole Miss and Southern Mississippi, MSU took part in the Boarder Wars.

Hurdlers Wallace (13.14) and McNeil (13.53) both clocked season bests in the women's 100-meter hurdles to garner first- and third-place finishes, respectively. Together, the pair earned seven points.

McNeil later ran a personal-best 59.57 to finish second in the women's 400-meter hurdles to help the state of Mississippi take home bragging rights.

Mississippi State went on to boast top performances at the Mt. SAC Relays at Hilmer Lodge Stadium at Mt. San Antonio College.

Griesche's 3000-meter steeplechase race highlighted the day as she garnered a first-place time of 10:04.05 to crush the MSU record (previously 10:19.70).

Donning a personal-best, Price posted a 4:16.11 in the women's 1500-meter run (Olympic Development Elite division) to win the event.

Success continued for Mississippi State track and field as the Bulldogs showcased talent at the Mt. SAC Relays.

Ziegler broke her own freshman record in the women's 3000-meter steeplechase, turning in a time of 10:18.51 to finish fourth.

Farquharson won the women's long jump (Invitational division) with a season-best 21-03.25.

Madison Milhoan boasted a second-place finish in the women's 1500-meter run (B section), running a 4:45.14.

In front of 21,422 fans, Mississippi State track and field kicked off the 120th Penn Relays on Friday with two top-10 finishes at Franklin Field.

Ziegler finished first for collegiate runners (sixth overall) in the Olympic development women's 5000-meter run with a time of 16:43.83. Her speed ranks second all-time at MSU.

Farquharson's 20-08.50 in the long jump also highlighted the day for the Bulldogs as she garnered a second-place finish in the event.

Carrying momentum from top performances on day one, Mississippi State track and field continued its success on day two of the 120th Penn Relays, donning another set of top-10 finishes.

Leading the way for the Bulldogs was Ebony Brinker, who won the college women's triple jump with a leap of 41-06.00.

After splitting action at Penn Relays and the Golden Eagle Classic on Saturday, Mississippi State track and field captured six wins at Southern Miss to close out the weekend.

Alzola donned two winning performances on the day with first-place times in the women's 100-meter dash (12.33) and 200-meter dash (24.84).

Kersh (2:31.45) and Milhoan (4:46.98) tallied two more wins in the women's 800-meter run and 1500-meter run, respectively.

In the women's 5000-meter run, McGuff ran an 18:22.09 to capture another win for MSU.

Clearing a personal-best 12-06.00, Sydney

Rodkey won the women's pole vault with a mark that ranks second all-time on the school's outdoor performance list.

Haley Reynolds finished second in the women's shot put at 43-11.25 and third in the women's discus with a personal-best throw of 140-01.00.

McGuff clocked a 17:45.37 to win the women's 5000-meter run.

In the field, Reynolds saw a fourth-place finish in the women's hammer throw, tossing 121-09.00, while women's pole vaulter Rodkey cleared 12-05.50 to finish sixth.

The Jace Lacoste Invitational concluded the Bulldogs' 2014 outdoor season.

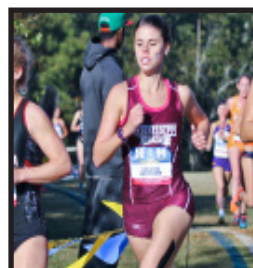

2014 MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY SEASON REVIEW

In the pre-season SEC polls, the Mississippi State men's cross country team were projected to finish 11th overall.

The 2014 campaign began on Aug. 30 at the Memphis Twilight where the men recorded a first place-finish with two coming in the Top 10 (Damian Roszko 1st, 20:02.56; Curtis Kelly 7th, 20:33.59).

Following the first place finish the men's squad headed to Nashville to compete in the Commodore Classic on Oct. 4. The men placed seventh overall with Roszko earning ninth individually (24:58.45). Rounding out MSU's Top 5 were Curtis Kelly (18th, 25:20.53), Patrick Monaghan (61st, 26:03.02), Mathew Dunn (63rd, 26:04.86), and Branden Nosker (105th, 26:52.1).

From Nashville the Maroon and White traveled to Bethlehem, Penn. to take part in the Paul Short Invitational on Oct. 4. Competing against over 100 teams the men's team brought home a 31st place finish. Roszko finished 28th (24:27) respectively. Behind Roszko was Dunn who finished 178th. (25:48), respectively.

To end the regular season MSU traveled a short trip to Tuscaloosa to compete in the Crimson Classic. Roszko led the team once again, individually he placed 7th (25:16.05). As a team MSU earned 12th, with Mathew Dunn finishing in 47th (26:12.14).

Again the Bulldogs traveled to Tuscaloosa, this time to compete in the SEC Championships. The men finished higher than predicted, earning a spot in the Top 10. The men placed 9th as a team, ahead of Florida, Georgia, Vanderbilt and LSU. Roszko earned All-SEC second team after coming in 13th (24:54.91). Behind Roszko was Kelly who finished 43rd with a time of 25:37.00.

After the SEC Championships, the Bulldogs headed to the NCAA South Regionals in Tallahassee, Fla., which was held on Nov. 14. MSU concluded its season after earning 14th. Roszko earned All-Region with a 17th finish (30:57.60) at the end of his senior season. MSU's Top 5 included Andrew Monaghan (58th, 31:50.10), Mathew Dunn (65th, 31:58.00), Patrick Monaghan (82nd, 32:18.20) and Curtis Kelly (91st, 32:28.10).

2014 WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY SEASON REVIEW

Slated to finish sixth in the SEC, the Mississippi State women's cross country team began the 2014 season on Aug. 30 at the Memphis Twilight.

The women finished first overall after claiming three of the Top Five finishes. Rhianwedd Price led the way in first place (17:05.67), followed by Lisa Ziegler in second (17:53.77) and Cornelia Griesche in fourth (17:55.67). Not far behind was senior Jodie McGuff earning tenth (18:53.30). Finishing in the Top 30, Carly Terp (19, 18:52.90), Mia Meydrich (23, 18:59.04) and Rachel Caulkins (26, 19:16.26) all made their MSU debut.

After a successful first place finish in Memphis, the Bulldogs went on to record a second place finish at the Commodore Classic on Sept. 13. Price claimed second overall with a time of 16:57.77. Ziegler ran a strong race to finish 16th (17:31.42). Also finishing in the Top-20 individually, Griesche placed 19th (17:37.49).

From Nashville, MSU headed to Bethlehem, Penn. to compete in the Paul Short Invitational on Oct. 4. After earning 10th individually, Price, led the Bulldogs to finish 11th overall. Price's time of 20:17 marked her personal best time in the 6K. Ziegler earned 27th with a time of 20:53.

The Bulldog's returned to South to compete in the Crimson Classic in Tuscaloosa. This marked MSU's last regular season meet. The Bulldogs finished fourth overall with three competitor finishing in the Top 10 (Price 2nd, 17:15.12; Ziegler 9th, 17:45.03; Griesche 10th, 17:45.54).

With the regular season at a close, MSU headed back to Tuscaloosa on Oct. 31 to compete in the 2014 SEC Cross Country Championships. The women's team returned home with a fifth place finish. Price recorded a fourth place finish (19:53.79), earning her a spot on the Women's All-SEC First Team. This was the highest recorded individual finish in MSU school history.

As the championship season continued, Mississippi State competed in the NCAA South Regionals in Tallahassee, Fla. on Nov. 14. The women predicted to finish in the Top 5 brought home a sixth place-finish. However, Price's season was far from over after earning 3rd individually (19:37.20). This automatically qualified Price for Nationals and she also made the All-Region team. Ziegler (21st, 20:23.20 and Griesche (22nd, 20:24.80) were also named to the All-Region team. Running her last meet as a Bulldog, Carmen Brothers finished in MSU's Top 5 recording a personal best in the 6K (99th, 21:32.60).

The team's season had concluded, but Price went on to represent MSU in the NCAA National Championships in Terre Haute, Ind. on Nov. 22. Price completed the 2014 season as an NCAA All-American after coming in 24th at nationals.

WOMEN'S 2014 SEC INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS REVIEW

On day one of the 2014 Southeastern Conference Indoor Championships, Erica Bougard broke school history by becoming the first MSU athlete to win the SEC pentathlon title, after posting a personal-best 4,458 points.

Bougard entered the meet rank third nationally in the event. She placed first in the long jump (20-01.75) and second in the high jump as she cleared 5-10.00 to tie a personal record. Bougard also tossed a personal-best 40-11.50 in the shot put to garner a spot in second.

They Byhalia, Miss. native was the only woman to compete for MSU on day one of the championships, which placed MSU second with 10 points after the conclusion of the first day.

Day two was as eventful as day one as Rochelle Farquharson captured another title for MSU. Farquharson earned a new personal-best 21-00.75 to land her the title. Finishing behind Farquharson, Bougard claimed ninth in the long jump with a mark of 19-09.75.

Distance runner Cornelia Griesche placed seventh in the women's 3000-meter run clocking 9:35.79. In her championship debut, freshman Liza Ziegler followed Griesche in 16th (9:52.91). Junior Emma Neigel was 18th at 9:55.61.

Continuing day two, senior

Keisha Wallace posted the best 60-meter hurdles time for the Maroon and White women, finishing 12th in the prelims (8:45). Her speed narrowly missed the cut to advance to Saturday's event finals.

With 22 points the Bulldogs ended day two in fourth place.

Entering day three the MSU women's track and field team continued its success. Farquharson

placed fifth in the triple jump as she earned a new personal-best of 42-04.00 to break the MSU indoor record. Junior Ebony Brinker followed Farquharson in ninth with a personal-best 41-06.50, a leap that landed her second on the school's all-time indoor performance list.

The women's distance medley relay clocked an 11:18.63 to capture third place. The quartet, comprised of Erica Bougard, Katie Huston, Ocian Archer, and Rhianwedd Price, had a time that was three second shy of its season best (11:15.34).

Griesche continued her success at the SEC Championships posting the fastest

5000-meter run time for the MSU women. Her speed of 16:58.36 earned her a spot in 13th in a field of 34 runners.

After collecting ten points on the final day, the MSU women's team earned a total of 32 points for an eight-place



finish at the SEC Indoor Championships. The team finished above Missouri, Alabama, Auburn, South Carolina and Vanderbilt.



2014 WOMEN'S SEC OUTDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS REVIEW

On the first day of the 2014 Southeastern Conference Championships, the MSU women's team did not have any athletes compete.

The second day held success for the Bulldogs' as Rhianwedd Price advanced to the finals of the 800-meter run. The freshman from the United Kingdom placed fourth after running a personal-best 2:06.21.

Collecting her second conference crown of the 2014 campaign, Rochelle Farquharson claimed the women's long jump title on day three of the SEC Outdoor Track and Field Championships.

The senior posted the best leap of the day at Kentucky Track and Field Complex with a mark of 21-02.50. Farquharson also owns the SEC Indoor title after jumping 21-00.75 at the championships in February. This marks her second career SEC Outdoor long jump title, as she also earned the honor in 2011.

In the women's 3000-meter steeplechase, sophomore Cornelia Griesche improved her MSU record (previously 10:04.05) by racing a personal-best 10:00.58 to earn a second-place finish. Freshman Lisa Ziegler (10:45.25) and junior Emma Neigel (11:06.20) finished 10th and 13th, respectively, behind Griesche.

Freshman standout Price clocked a 4:23.33 to finish 11th in the women's 15000-meter run prelims, a speed that sends her to Sunday's finals. Additionally, Price

will see action tomorrow in the women's 800-meter run finals, following a personal-best 2:06.21 in prelims on Friday.

Hurdler Keisha Wallace also garnered a qualifying time, running a 13.31 in the women's 100-meter hurdles prelims. She will compete in the event finals Sunday at 2:40 p.m. ET.

The MSU women will look to land a top-5 spot in the conference as Dudley's squad sits sixth overall (18 points) going into the final day of competition.

On the final day, Price posted a 4:18.07 in the women's 1500-meter run finals, shredding more than five seconds off of her qualifying time. Finishing sixth, the freshman earned three points for the MSU women. Later in the day, Price picked up another point with an eighth-place time of 2:08.60 in the women's 800-meter run finals.

Senior Wallace saw a speed of 13.38 in the women's 100-meter hurdles finals, garnering a fifth-place finish, good for five team points.

The Maroon and White squads totaled 26 points to finish in 11th place.



2014 MEN'S OUTDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS REVIEW

A pair of Bulldogs represented the Mississippi State track and field team on day one of the 2014 Southeastern Conference Outdoor Championships.

Freshmen Zach Taylor and JaQuarius Wilson saw action in the men's decathlon, completing five of the ten events in their championships debut.

Totaling 3,620 points, Taylor, who currently sits in seventh, posted a first-place finish in the 100-meter dash, clocking a 10.92 (878 points). The Rock Hill, S.C., native followed up with a leap of 22-01.50 in the long jump to garner 753 points. With a toss of 33-07.25 in the shot put, Taylor gained another 500 points to his total before boasting a clearance of 6-00.50 in the high jump. The freshman's speed capped his day with a second-place time of 49.71 in the 400-meter dash.

Wilson started off the competition by grabbing 728 points in the 100-meter dash at 11.62. His leap of 21-04.75 in the long jump earned him another 702 points before tossing 31-04.75 in the shot put. To finish the competition on day one, Wilson cleared 6-00.50 in the high jump and ran a 51.66 in the 400-meter dash to total 3,291 points.

On day two of the championships there was no one faster than Brandon McBride in the 800-meter run.

In the preliminary round of the SEC Outdoor Championships at the Kentucky Track and Field Complex, the sophomore from Windsor, Ontario, ran a top time of 1:47.13 to earn his spot in the finals.

McBride wasn't the only MSU standout to advance to the finals.

In the 400-meter hurdles, both Jovan Davis and Scottie Hearn punched their tickets with times of 51.58 and 51.85 to finish third and fourth, respectively.

MSU also got on the scoreboard, thanks to Taylor in the Decath-

lon. The freshman from Rock Hill, S.C., finished eighth to give his team one point after collecting a personal best 6,764 points. Also competing was Wilson, who had a personal best 6,205 points.

MSU had four athletes compete on the third day of the championships.

Middle distance runners Patrick Monaghan (3:52.31) and Damian Roszko (3:53.35) continued the trend, finishing seventh and eighth, respectively, in the men's 1500-meter run to solidify a spot in the finals.

In the field, junior Tautvydas Kieras turned in a toss of 180-05 in the men's discus for a spot in seventh.

To round out action, the Bulldog 4x400-meter relay team ran a 3:09.02 to gain two points in a finish of seventh. The quartet consisted of Hearn, Alistair Moona, McBride and Steve Shoto.

On the final day of the 2014 SEC Outdoor Championships, Mississippi State track and field captured its second SEC champion during the four-day event as sophomore McBride won the men's 800-meter run.

McBride, who entered the meet as the NCAA's fastest runner in the event, clocked a 1:47.59 to claim the crown.

Also on Sunday, Hearn earned a third-place finish in the men's 400-meter hurdles finals, boasting a season-best 50.66. His speed gave the Bulldogs six points. Junior Davis followed him in fourth at 50.90, collecting another five points.

MSU concluded the championships with 26 points landing them in 11th place.

NCAA DIVISION I OUTDOOR QUALIFYING STANDARDS

The championship qualifying procedure allows for a field size of 24 in all individual and relay events at the final championship competition.

(Refer to the 2015 Outdoor Track and Field Technical Manual- www.ncaa.org)

QUALIFYING

Qualifying to the final championship competition is accomplished through performance in the preliminary championship competition at each site for events contested at those competitions. Twelve competitors from each individual event and twelve teams from each relay event advance from each preliminary championship competition site to the final championship competition. Qualification, through competition in an event at a preliminary championship competition, is required to participate in that event at the final championship competition. Any individual or relay team must remain eligible for advancement throughout all rounds of the championships. The specific event formula for advancement to the final championship competition, as well as tie breaking procedure, is detailed in the 2014 Outdoor Track and Field Technical Manual.

Qualification for the Heptathlon and Decathlon events of the championship is accomplished through a student-athlete's position on the national descending order list. Based upon declarations, made before the preliminary championship competition, twenty-four student-athletes will be accepted to the final championship competition in each event.

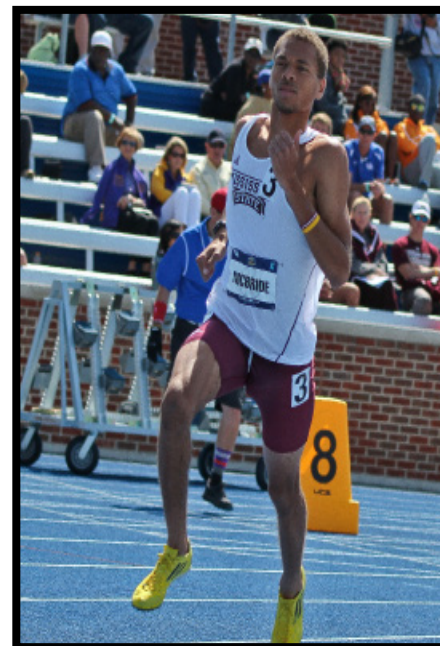
No one has been able to keep up with Brandon McBride all year, and Wednesday was no different at the NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships.

Larry H. Templeton Athletic Academic Center

Dedicated on November 1, 2008, the Templeton Athletic Academic Center is a welcome addition to the Bulldog athletic program. The \$10 million facility is named for former MSU Director of Athletics Larry Templeton.

The facility is an addition to two existing facilities in the athletic wing of the MSU campus - the Shira Complex and the Holliman Athletic Center. It is situated on the south side of those two facilities, and across the street from the Bryan Athletic Administration Building.

The 34,000 square-foot building serves the entire athletic department, houses the Athletic Academics offices and staff, and includes individual computer rooms, tutor work areas, a large open study area and a 300-seat dining facility with a fully-functioning kitchen.

Templeton, now Athletic Director Emeritus, served 22 years as Director of Athletics and during his tenure helped position MSU Athletics as an innovative, progressive program, with equality in sports for women, new and renovated facilities and keen fiscal management.

During the 1990s almost every sport came away with a best-ever finish. Achievements included six football bowl games, men's basketball's trip to the 1996 NCAA Final Four, three baseball trips to the NCAA College World Series, five Southeastern Conference championships and participation in the NCAA Championships by sport teams 29 times.

Jim and Julia Rouse Weight Room

Mississippi State athletes use top-of-the-line weight training machines that are apart of the Jim and Julia Rouse Weight Room located in the Shira Athletic complex.

A 9,000-square foot strength and conditioning room. Equipped with the latest technology in weight training, more than \$350,000 worth of equipment is housed in the Julia and Jim Rouse Weight Room. Jim Rouse, a 1962 graduate of MSU and an original member of the Bulldog Foundation, is the retired vice president of Exxon Mobile.



Holliman Athletic Center

A 46,000-square foot athletic center, providing Bulldog athletes with a locker room, equipment room and team meeting rooms, as well as a state-of-the-art athletic training area and strength and conditioning facility.



The Holliman Athletic Center is located just east of the Shira Athletic Complex, State's original practice facility, which was constructed in the 1970s.

Athletic Training Staff

The medical team begins with the certified athletic trainers (ATC's) who interact with the student athletes on a daily basis. Each full time staff athletic trainer at Mississippi State is certified by the National Athletic Trainers' Association Board of Certification and is licensed in the state of Mississippi.

Athletic Training Room

The Mississippi State Sports Medicine Department consists of six athletic training rooms at various athletic facilities to better serve our student athletes. The athletic training rooms are staffed by our seven full time staff members along with five graduate assistants and 20 student athletic trainers.



The new Columbus Orthopaedic Sports Medicine Center is equipped with the latest in modalities (in-ground whirlpools, ultrasound, electrical stimulation), rehabilitation equipment (including a Biodex and Hydroworx® therapy pool with an underwater treadmill), an x-ray machine, and a variety of additional equipment necessary to meet the needs of the elite collegiate athlete.

The Team Family Practice Physicians and Orthopedists are available at practice and in the athletic training room almost daily for consultation with the athletic trainers and student athletes.



John C. Longest Student Health Center

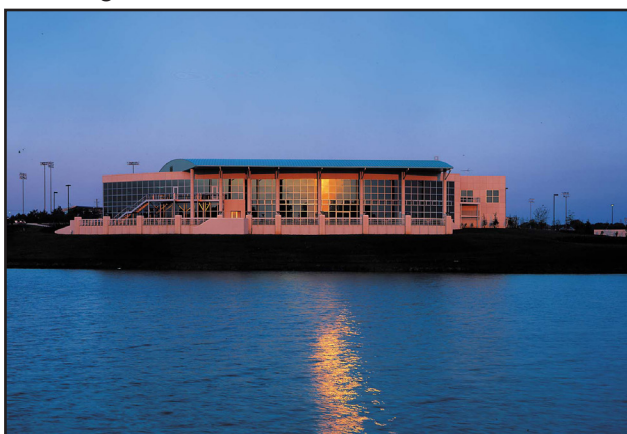

Mississippi State University

Mississippi State is a comprehensive land-grant institution and the largest university in Mississippi, with a statewide enrollment of more than 16,000 students.

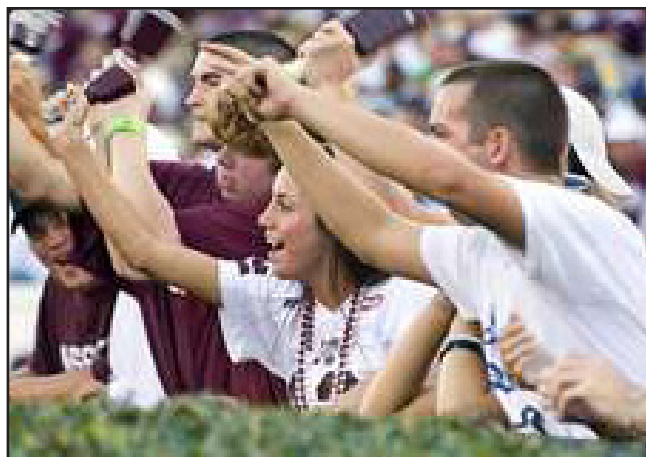
Established in 1878 as the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Mississippi, the university has traditional strengths in engineering and scientific agriculture but has evolved into a comprehensive institution with a diverse array of programs in teaching, research, and service.



Academics and Student Life

Mississippi State students consistently earn honors such as the prestigious Harry S. Truman Scholarship, awarded for those who will enter public service, and, with 16 Truman Scholars to date, the university has been recognized as a Truman Honor Institution. In the past year, a student team competed for and won first place in a national Challenge X competition to redesign a fuel-efficient and environmentally-friendly SUV.

Recently initiated programs are providing opportunities to develop leadership potential and global study options. The university's Global Leadership Continuum provides "cradle-to-CEO" programming designed to develop leadership



across a "global" spectrum that begins with high school and continues through the university experience and into professional life. Included are the Young Guns Leadership Camp for rising high school seniors; the Day one Leadership Community for incoming freshmen, focusing on shared academic and service experiences; and the highly competitive Appalachian Leadership Honors Program for sophomores and juniors.

To complement these efforts, the university has launched a minor in leadership studies open to students in all majors. A university honor code adopted in 2007 institutionalizes a campus culture of integrity and personal responsibility in academic studies. Through the Global Leadership Program, students may experience significantly expanded study-abroad opportunities.

Research

Mississippi State faculty researchers attracted \$186.5 million in external funding for 2006-07, up from about \$155 million during the previous year. This funding supported 1,691 sponsored projects in 2007.

Based on the latest rankings available from the National Science Foundation, MSU ranks 7th in the nation in agricultural sciences research expenditures and 44th in engineering. Last year MSU faculty and staff disclosed 80 new technologies resulting in three new start-up companies, nine licenses, and 22 patent applications. The university now holds 77 patents.

In recent years, MSU has established the Thad Cochran Endowment for Entrepreneurship, as well as collaborating with federal agencies and industries to help increase technology-oriented start-up companies. Among the collaborators and sponsors are the U.S. departments of Defense and Energy, NASA, General Electric, Northrop Grumman, EADS/American Eurocopter, Boeing, Raytheon, General Dynamics, Israeli Aerospace Industry, and the Mississippi Technology Alliance.

In a key area of economic interest to Mississippi, MSU's Center for Advanced Vehicular Systems, established in 2001, continues research and development supporting a goal of attracting automotive

industries to the state. The center is conducting research in areas that include materials processing, human and systems engineering, alternative power systems, computational manufacturing and design, and advanced learning technologies.

Outreach and Service

From its academic programs to the work of countless individuals, Mississippi State has "extended farther" and gone "beyond the limit" to make a difference in the lives of citizens around the state. In 2006, the university formed the Mississippi State Community Action Team to organize university resources and expertise for quick response to local issues around the state. MSU's Extension Service is the first in the nation to have an interactive videoconferencing system in every county Extension office. Through the Freedom Calls program, the system is being used to connect Mississippians with family members in the U.S. military serving our country in Iraq.

The MSU Extension Service maintains offices in almost every county of the state, and the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station operates 10 branch stations throughout Mississippi. Four strategically located research and extension centers coordinate the delivery of services statewide.

UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT
Mississippi State, 1984

Dr. Mark Everett Keenum became Mississippi State's 19th president Jan. 5, 2009, following a distinguished public service career.

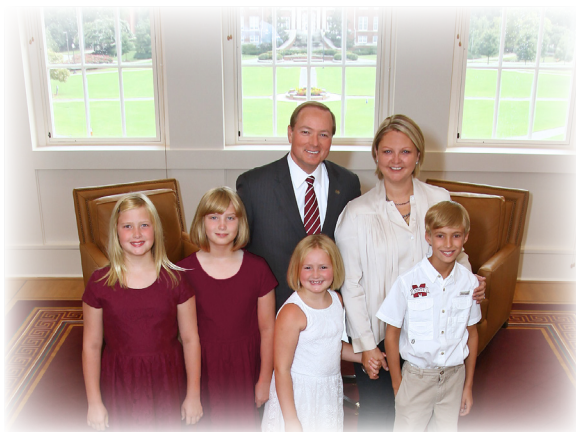
After completing his bachelor's and master's degrees in agricultural economics at Mississippi State, Dr. Keenum joined the university faculty in 1984 as a marketing specialist with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service. Two years later, he accepted a position as a research associate with the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station at MSU.

He continued his education at the university, in 1988 receiving a doctorate in agricultural economics, and he joined the faculty of that department as an assistant professor/economist. During his professional tenure at Mississippi State, his primary research and extension work focused on the marketing and economics of aquaculture, specialty crops and forestry. He continued his faculty ties at the university 1997-2006 as an adjunct professor, teaching an annual course on agricultural legislative policy.

Prior to being named president of Mississippi State in November 2008, Dr. Keenum served as Under Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture for two years, where he provided leadership and oversight for the Farm Service Agency, the Risk Management Agency and the Foreign Agricultural Service. The mission area, comprised of the three agencies, had a total operating budget of \$1.7 billion and approximately \$40 billion in program authority. The three agencies employed more than 16,500 people at more than 2,300 offices nationwide and 98 locations around the globe.

In 1989, Dr. Keenum joined the Washington, D.C., staff of U.S. Senator Thad Cochran as Legislative Assistant for Agriculture and Natural Resources. As Sen. Cochran's adviser on agricultural affairs, he worked on numerous issues important to U.S. agriculture, including the 1990, 1996, and 2002 Farm Bills. From 1996-2006, he served as Chief of Staff for Sen. Cochran. In this role, Dr. Keenum was the chief adviser to the senator on political, legislative and appropriations issues. He also was responsible for managing all administrative and legislative functions of Sen. Cochran's Washington, D.C., office and three Mississippi offices, including direct oversight of the U.S. Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry and the U.S. Senate Committee on Appropriations.

Dr. Keenum and his wife Rhonda have four children.



Scott Stricklin
ATHLETIC DIRECTOR
Mississippi State, 1992

A lifelong dream was fulfilled on May 7, 2010, when Scott Stricklin was formally introduced as Mississippi State's director of athletics, the 16th in school history.

As Stricklin begins to enthusiastically tackle his new job of leading the MSU athletic department, he certainly isn't a stranger to the Bulldog family or college athletics.

A 1992 graduate of Mississippi State, the Jackson, Miss., native's resume is highlighted by 22 years of experience on the collegiate level in various capacities at five different universities. The last two years, he's faithfully served as Senior Associate Athletics Director for External Affairs at his alma mater, overseeing fundraising, football and men's basketball scheduling, managing MSU's all-sport agreement with Adidas, facility planning, and serving as the administrative sport liaison for men's basketball and softball. It's those type of day-to-day tasks that's prepared the personable Stricklin to take over the top seat in the Mississippi State athletic department.

Yet it's a journey that started during his formidable days as a dedicated and tireless worker in the media relations department that's led to his highly-respected career coming full circle. Prior to graduating, Stricklin's stint in the MSU media relations office included three seasons (1990-92) as the media contact for the highly successful and nationally-renowned baseball program. Upon graduation, he was named assistant media relations director at his alma mater.

He continued his climb up the ladder of success when he was named associate media relations director at Auburn, where from 1993-98 he served as the primary baseball contact and the secondary football contact. He also spent the 1993-94 season handling the publicity for the Tigers' nationally-ranked women's basketball team.

In 1998, Stricklin left Auburn to become Assistant Athletics Director at Tulane, where he served as the primary media contact for the Green Wave's 1998 12-0 football team. Next came a four-year run in the Big 12 Conference at Baylor (1999-2003) as Assistant AD for Communications and Marketing.

In 2003, Stricklin returned to the Southeastern Conference at Kentucky and spent five seasons as the Associate AD for Media Relations, where he oversaw the day-to-day publicity of the tradition-rich Wildcat basketball program. It was his last stop before returning to Mississippi State in the Spring of 2008.

Stricklin, is married to the former Anne Howell, the youngest daughter of Basketball Hall of Fame member Bailey Howell. The couple has two daughters, Abby and Sophie.
