# STEVE DUDLEY

Steve Dudley begins his 16th year at Mississippi State and his sixth in the role of head coach. Since returning to his alma mater in 2000, Dudley has tutored over 50 athletes to All-American status.

Throughout his tenure as head coach, Dudley has coached three athletes to become national champions, including Brandon McBride who was the indoor and outdoor 800-meter run national champion during the 2014 season. He coached both Erica Bougard who won the 2013 Indoor pentathlon title and D'angelo Cherry to the 2013 Indoor 60-meter dash title.

Under Dudley's guidance, the MSU men's track and field team saw its highest finish since 1923 at the 2015 NCAA Outdoor Championships when the team placed 8th, scoring 20 points. The women's team had its highest finish at the 2015 NCAA Outdoor Championships with a 18th-place finish.

Throughout the 2014 season, Dudley was an integral part in the accomplishments of both the men and women's track teams. Dudley wanted to prove that MSU meant business. He ended his first season with six athletes named to first or second team All-SEC; three named to the All-Freshman SEC team and had a total of seven athletes earn first, second or honorary All-American honors.

After the 2014 season, MSU track and field had eight athletes achieve All-American status. Out of these eight Dudley coached two athletes, including two-time national champion in the 800-meter run Brandon McBride. MSU track and field also saw 19 athletes qualify to compete in the 2014 Indoor and Outdoor National Championships. The MSU women's team earned 10th overall at the Indoor NCAA National Championships under Dudley's and his coach staff's guidance. This was the highest ranking in school history.

Dudley, whose event focus is sprints, has seen numerous athletes through his 15 years achieve All-American status. In the 2013 season alone Dudley coached 12 out of 22 All-American Bulldogs. Also in the 2013 season, MSU had 14 school records and 42 Top 5 all-time performances. MSU saw a season that sent 12 athletes to NCAA Outdoor Championships, while claiming two individual national titles during the indoor campaign. The head coach led sophomore Erica Bougard to capture the NCAA Indoor Pentathlon Champion title with a school-record 4,399 points. He also aided senior D'Angelo Cherry in earning the indoor nation title in the 60-meter dash. Under Dudley's guidance in 2013, the Bulldogs received both national and international attention, sending numerous athletes.

When he was named head coach in 2010, Dudley had plenty experience in coaching national champion athletes and All-Americans. Prior to being named the head coach of the MSU track and field teams, Dudley served as an assistant coach from 2000 to 2009 under Al Schmidt.

In his very first season as an assistant coach, Dudley had eight athletes earn all-America accolades. His success continued throughout the years.

Dudley coached Pierre Browne who was named the 2003 NCAA Indoor National Champion in the 60-meter dash and finished runner-up in the 100m at the outdoor national meet. That same season Dudley had six athletes acquire All-American honors. Another key season as an assistant coach come in 2005 when Dudley guided State's 4x400-meter relay squad to a fifth-place finish at the national championships. That same season he garnered six All-Americans

As an assistant coach in 2008, Dudley lead eight Bulldog sprinters to the regional qualifying marks. During that same season, he coached O'Neal Wilder to become a USA Track and Field Junior National Champion in the 400-meter dash, a bronze medal at the World Jr. Championships in the 400-meter dash and a gold medal in the 4x400 meter relay.

Dudley coached five more Bulldogs to earn All-American accolades in 2009. Dudley has always been a master of relays, and 2009 was no was a prime example. His 4x100-meter relay team finished 5th at the NCAA Championships and his 4x400-meter relay team earned medalist honors at the Mideast Regional Championships.

Prior to his coaching time at MSU, Dudley spent three seasons at Beville State (Ala.) Community College. Dudley coached three NJCAA national champions and 19 all-Americans throughout his duration at Beville State. In cross country, the men's and women's squads captured the Region XXII title in 1999. The Bears also won the 1998 Region XXII title en route to a third-place national showing. His 1999 Lady Bear team earned Academic Team of the Year honors, and the men finished second the same season. Twelve Bears earned Academic all-America accolades.

For Dudley it is not only about what his athletes can do on the track, but also what they can do in the classroom. Since becoming head coach, MSU has had 86 athletes make the SEC honor roll.

Before entering the coaching ranks, Dudley served as a captain for MSU's track team from 1991-95. While at State, he was named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll for three years (1993-95).

Before entering the coaching ranks, Dudley served as a captain for MSU's track team from 1991-95. While at State, he was named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll for three years (1993-95).

The Hamilton, Ala., native graduated with a bachelor's degree in May 1995. He received his master's degree in environmental geology also from State in December 2004.

Along with coaching, Dudley also serves as a member of the

Mississippi State faculty.

Dudley is married to the former Tiffany McWilliams, who ran track and field for MSU and was a three-time NCAA National Champion in the 2003 and 2004 Outdoor 1500-meter run and in the 2004 Indoor mile run.

# HOUSTON FRANKS



## HOUSTON FRANKS AT A GLANCE

Houston Franks returned to Mississippi State in 2004 as an assistant track and field coach. An accomplished distance runner for the Maroon and White from 1994-98, Franks coaches and develops men's distance runners and served his first season as head cross country coach in 2009. Franks has been a fundamental part to the recent success of the MSU cross country and distance track and field programs.

### MSU Cross Country Head Coach

During the 2014 campaign, Franks coached Price to All-American accolades after she finished 24th at the NCAA Championships. Price was the first athlete under Franks to receive All-American honors and the second female in school history.

The women's team finished sixth at the NCAA South Regionals in 2014. Franks coached Price and three other runners to be named to the All-Region teams. Franks had 11 cross country athletes break personal-bests during the 2014 campaign.

In 2012, Franks guided the men's cross country team to a Top 5 finish at the NCAA South Regional. The Bulldogs spot in fifth not only tied their best regional finish in history, but also placed them ahead of SEC foes Alabama, Auburn, Ole Miss, Tennessee and Vanderbilt.

Franks helped the women's cross country earn fifth-place finishes at both the 2010 SEC Championships and the NCAA South Regional, while leading the Bulldogs to seventh and 10th place finishes in the respected events. The fifth-place finish for the Lady Bulldogs at the SEC Championships tied MSU's best finish to date which occurred in 2006. Also in 2010, Franks coached sophomores Renee Masterson and Greenwell on their way to earning all-SEC and all-Region accolades; along with senior Adam Lenz as he earned all-SEC honors.

### MSU Track & Field Assistant Coach

Coming off the best women's track and field season

in program history, Franks' coached MSU standout Rhianwedd Price to one of the best seasons in school history. Price finished first at the NCAA Track and Field Outdoor Championships in the 1500m run after running a personal-best time of 4:09.56. Her victory led to the highest women's finish in school history at 18th place. Price was the first NCAA Champion under Franks' guidance.

Other distance runners Frank's coached to the 2015 NCAA Championships include Marta Freitas and Cornelia Griesche. Freitas competed in the 1500m run finals alongside Price and earned a 12th-place finish, while Griesche finished 16th overall in the 3000m steeplechase. Griesche set the school record in the steeplechase at the NCAA East Preliminaries to qualify for nationals with a time of 9:58.06.

Also making an appearance at the NCAA East Preliminaries was distance runner Damian Roszko. Roszko competed in the 10,000m run, which he holds the second-fastest time in school history (29:25.35). At the preliminaries, Roszko finished 41st with a time of 31:26.31.

Franks coached Price her freshman year in track and field in the 800-meter run and 1500-meter run, both of which she holds the schools second fastest times. Three other distance runners also made their way in to the record book to hold the Top 3 times in the 3000-meter steeplechase, including Cornelia Griesche (10:00.58), Lisa Ziegler (10:18.51) and Emma Neigel (10:19.70). Griesche went on to receive honorable mention All-American accolades in the event.

On the men's side of the 2014 outdoor campaign, Franks coached Damian Roszko, who worked his way into the record books in the 5000-meter run with a time of 14:13.53 for the fourth fastest time.

Previously in the 2013 season, Franks had coached John Valentine to earn second in MSU school record books in the 5000-meter run with a time of 14:24.82.

Also working their way into the record books during

the 2014 season, Roszko finished with the third best time in the mile in MSU school history with 4:07.61, while teammate Patrick Monaghan earned the second best time at 4:07.18.

During the 2011 Indoor Track and Field season, Franks guided sophomore Haley Greenwell to a third-place spot on the MSU all-time list for the 5,000-meter run, but it was during the 2011 Outdoor Track and Field season that Franks really saw Greenwell shine. The Lady Bulldog raced her way to the top of the MSU all-time list for the 10,000-meter run, while posting a 3rd place finish at the SEC Championships and a 17th place finish at the NCAA Championships. Franks' coaching paid off at the end of the season, as Greenwell was named an honorable mention all-American.

### Past

Prior to returning to Starkville, Franks spent five years at Southwest Missouri State University (now Missouri State University). While at SMS, Franks served as head cross country coach for the Bears and won three Missouri Valley Conference women's titles. His women's teams finished in the top four at the NCAA Midwest Regional's during his last three years and his men's squads finished in the top half of the conference during all five seasons. During the track and field season, the Bears captured three indoor and outdoor league championships on the women's side. Franks was a three-time MVC Coach of the Year in women's cross country. During the 2002-03 season, he was also a part of the first SMS squad since 1993-94 to win the league's coveted Triple Crown championships in cross country and both indoor and outdoor track and field.

# STEVE SILVEY

**A** veteran at the national and international level for over 25 years and coaching 28 collegiate national champion squads, and numerous All-Americans and 15 Olympic Medalists and 17 World Championships Medalists at several of the nation's most prestigious programs.

Silvey, who was inducted as a coach into the National Junior College Hall of Fame (2005) has a unique quality of having won 19 team championships in the SEC, Big-12 and PAC-10 conferences. Individually, his resume boasts 26 World Championship competitors, 34 Olympians and numerous NJCAA & NCAA All-Americans.

At the international level, Coach Silvey served as the Zambia Olympic Coach for Track and Field in the 1992 and 1996 Olympics, and produced its first ever Olympic medal in the sport of track and field with Samuel Matete in the 400 hurdles (silver medal). Silvey also served as the head coach for Zambia at the 1993 World Championships in Stuttgart, Germany as Samuel Matete again won the World Championship Silver Medal.

Silvey served as Recruiting Coordinator and Assistant Track Coach for Texas Tech University from 2004 to 2007. While with the Red Raiders, Silvey helped lead the 2005 men's outdoor team to its first ever Big-12 Conference Championship. Silvey's sprinters, hurdlers and relays scored over 100 of the 149.50 points that won the schools first ever Big-12 championship for the Red Raiders. The 2007 men's outdoor track team also finished as Big 12 Runner-up this past season. Silvey's impact on Texas Tech University resulted in nine new school records during his 3 years with the Red Raiders.

While at the University of Oregon from 2001-2003, Silvey made a quick impact on a struggling program. During Silvey's first year, the men's team jumped from fifth place to second place at the 2002 PAC-10 Outdoor championships. In Silvey's final season with the Ducks, the men's team claimed the 2003 PAC-10 Championship, an accomplishment not seen in 12 years. Silvey's two solid recruiting classes also produced another PAC-10 Conference Championship in 2005.

Prior to his arrival in Eugene, Silvey built his reputation at two of the nations top track and field programs, the University of Arkansas and Blinn College. While at those schools, he was a part of 28 NCAA national team championships, including a stretch of 13 straight years before leaving the Razorbacks after the 2000 outdoor

campaign.

As the Sprints/Hurdles/Relays mentor at the University of Arkansas from the fall of 1994 through the 2000 outdoor season, he was part of 13 NCAA indoor and outdoor track & field and cross country team titles and 17 SEC team championships. His athletes won 15 All-American honors (including one NCAA champion and three NCAA runner-up) and 13 outdoor track and field SEC individual titles. The 2000 season was perhaps the finest by his athletes who posted one of the nation's top times in the 4X100-meter relay (39.27), a collegiate record in the sprint medley relay (3:12.13), took second in the NCAA 4x400-meter Final (3:02.02) and won the prestigious Penn Relays. His team's shuttle relay owned the fastest time in the world that season (55.37), which included DeMarcus Brown, who was an All-American in the 110 hurdles and owned a collegiate best of 13.72. One of three Hogs that ran 13.75 or faster that year under his guidance, while All-American 400-meter hurdler Samuel Glover owned a best of 49.08.

Prior to arriving in Fayetteville, he was five-time national coach of the year at Blinn College, where his squads won 15 national Championships in seven years. At the Brenham, Texas institution, Silvey produced 164 All-Americans, 128 individual national champions and 27 relay champions. His cross country program added a national championship 1993 and another in 1994. Silvey's 1992 and 1993 Blinn College teams were voted the "Outstanding Team" at the Texas Relays, and the 1992 team also added the crown of "USA Men's National Relay Ranking Champions," according to Track and Field News.

Prior to his stint at Blinn, Silvey served as men's and women's assistant track coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas A&M University from 1984 to 1987. Silvey helped position the Aggies rise to national prominence, as A&M finished among the top six NCAA men's squads twice during his stay.

A 1980 graduate of Truman State University (Kirksville, Mo.) with a bachelor's degree in environmental science education, he added a master's degree from Texas A&M University in physical education in 1987.

Before returning to coaching in Fall 2013 at Mississippi State, Silvey spent five years in a private business in Dallas, Texas. During this time, he published 19 books on speed training and track and field topics.

**A**pril Thomas enters her SIXTH season as coach of MSU's throws athletes. During her tenure with the Bulldogs. In her most recent season, Thomas coached Curtis Thompson in the javelin. Thompson finished third in the event at the 2015 NCAA Outdoor

Thomas has helped heptathlete Marrison Harris earn indoor and outdoor all-American and all-SEC accolades by tutoring her to personal-best in the shot put. Thomas coached LaQuinta Aaron to personal-best throws in the shot put that helped her earn provisional qualifications in the heptathlon for the 2009 NCAA Outdoor Championships.

Thomas also watched decathletes Darryl Brady and Martin Lee earn Top 8 finishes in the decathlon at the outdoor SEC Championships and also throw personal-best in the shot put and the discus.

After completing her fourth season with the Bulldogs, Thomas aided in the success of Erica Bougard as she earned the 2014 SEC pentathlon title and was named a first team All-American. Thomas also coached Tautvydas Kieras who broke the school record in discus (186-05.00) at the 2014 Golden Eagle Classic.

In 2013 Thomas guided newcomer Piotr Antosik all the way to the NCAA Outdoor Championships in Eugene, Ore. There, Antosik threw 210-0 to finish 18th in the javelin. Earlier in the season, Thomas helped Antosik land a spot in MSU's Top 5 all-time with a javelin performance of 226-0.

Thomas led Favian Cowards to all-American honors in the 2012 season, coupled with a ninth-place national finish. Cowards, with guidance from Thomas, threw a personal best 66-05 to win MSU's first SEC Championship in the weight throw. Cowards throw also set a new MSU all-time record and earned her a spot on the 2012 all-SEC team. In 2011, Thomas coached Cowards to top finishes, before seeing the junior conclude her season with a fifth place finish at the SEC Outdoor Championships.

Thomas had the pleasure of seeing Ed Wesela post five regular season victories in 2011 in the shot put, before placing third in the event at the SEC Championships. It was also under Thomas' direction that Wesela was named a member of the 2011 SEC Community Service Team.

In 2010, Thomas coached Cowards through her emergence onto

the track and field throwing scene. Thomas tutored Cowards to a personal-best weight throw to earn eighth-place at the 2009 SEC Indoor Championships, where she earned all-SEC accolades. In 2010, she led Cowards to a school record setting indoor 20-pound weight throw of 59-01 ½, and a 5th place spot on the MSU all-time performance list for the hammer throw.

Additionally in 2010, Thomas guided Wesela to personal-bests in the shot put and discus that helped him earn all-SEC honors in both events.

Thomas comes to MSU after coaching boys' and girls' shot put and discus at Knoxville (Tenn.) Catholic High School. Her primary responsibilities at MSU are coaching throwers. She also coached with the Knoxville Track Club.

A native of Albany, Ga., Thomas earned her degree in sociology from University of Tennessee in 2007. Prior to UT, she competed at Cloud County (Kansas) Community College. At the 2006 SEC Indoor Championships, Thomas finished as runner-up in the shot put. She also has three other Top 5 SEC finishes to her credit in the event. She currently ranks sixth on UT's all-time outdoor performers list in the shot put and seventh in hammer throw, sixth on the all-time indoor weight throw and fifth on the school's all-time indoor performers list in the shot put. Thomas helped UT win the 2005 SEC Indoor Championship. She was part of Tennessee's 2005 NCAA Mideast Regional team that captured the program's first victory at that event.

Steve Thomas made his return to MSU track and field in 2011 as the new assistant coach for jumps. Thomas joined the staff after spending the previous three seasons in the high school ranks at St. Patrick Catholic H.S. Prior to that, he was at the University of Kentucky for two years.

Thomas had great success during the 2014 season. He coached Erica Bougard in the pentathlon, which in the SEC Indoor Championships she broke school history by becoming the first MSU athlete to win the SEC pentathlon title, after posting a personal-best 4,458 points.

At the end of the 2014 season, Thomas had coached four athletes who were named All-Americans including, Bougard, Marcus Jackson, Jason Harper and Rochelle Farquharson.

During the 2013 season, Thomas guided jumpers Bougard, Ebony Brinker, Harper and Jackson to earn high accolades at an elite level. Jackson set the indoor school record in 2013 with a high jump of 7-06, and entered the SEC Outdoor Championships, where he placed third, as the No. 4 high jumper in the NCAA. Bougard also rewrote the record book as she set the MSU indoor record in the triple jump (41-09.5) and jumped a school-best 5-11.5 in the high jump during the outdoor season. Thomas also coached triple jumpers Brinker and Jason Harper to top performances on the year. The two Bulldogs both made their way onto MSU's Top 5 all-time list with personal best leaps.

In his second year back at MSU, Thomas found success continually throughout the year. With new and returning athletes, he led MSU jumpers to break school records and receive multiple personal bests at the SEC Indoor Championships. Thomas also flourished in the 2012 outdoor season as he accompanied sophomore Marcus Jackson to Iowa for the NCAA Championship for the high jump.

His first season, Thomas had quite the prosperous year as he coached a SEC Champion who was also named the SEC Freshman Field Event Athlete of the Year, placed two on the All-American lists and placed an athlete on the second team All-SEC list. Under the direction of Thomas, Farquharson single-handedly placed Lady Bulldog jumps on the map with her performance at the 2011 SEC Outdoor Championships.

On the men's side of things, Thomas had the pleasure of coaching James Harris and Jackson, two freshmen that also had pretty impressive years. Jackson made his claim for fame at the 2011 Outdoor SEC Championships as he finished second in the high jump to claim second team All-SEC honors and find a spot on the SEC All-Freshman list. Jackson

also put on quite the show at the NCAA Championships as he jumped 6-10 ¾ to earn second-team All-American honors. It was also at the NCAA Championships that Harris made his impact, as he finished fourth overall to earn All-American honors.

Steve Thomas made his return to MSU track and field in 2011 as the new assistant coach for jumps. Thomas joined the staff after spending the previous three seasons in the high school ranks at St. Patrick Catholic H.S. Prior to that, he was at the University of Kentucky for two years.

While at the University of Kentucky, Thomas made his mark coaching a six-time all-America honoree in the shot put and helping the female throwers produce impressive marks in their quest for championships.

Prior to his work at Kentucky, Thomas served as an assistant coach at the University of Florida where he built upon his already impressive resume by coaching nine All-Americans, six Southeastern Conference champions and a pair of NCAA East Region champions. In his career, he has tutored individuals who have won nearly 40 conference championship titles.

As head coach of both the men's and women's cross country and track and field programs at University of South Alabama from 1992 to 1998, he received four Sun Belt Conference Coach-of-the-Year awards.

Also at South Alabama, Thomas brought the women's squad to a school-best second place finish at the 1994 Sun Belt Indoor Championships and fourth-place bests in four of his six years at the outdoor meet. He expanded and developed nearly every facet of the Jaguar program, producing 20 Sun Belt Conference Champions and the first NCAA qualifier in the history of the South Alabama.

During his previous tenure as the head field events coach at Mississippi State from 1988 to 1992, Thomas trained two all-Americans and six all-SEC athletes. A group of athletes that combined earned 11 individual conference titles under his direction.

Thomas is known on the international stage for his instruction skills, conducting clinics in Australia, Belgium, England, Germany, Mexico and Switzerland, as well as a two-week clinic in China in 1994.

An all-district distance runner at Oklahoma Christian College, Thomas received his undergraduate there in 1981 before earning his master's degree in education from Stephen F. Austin State University in 1983.

Thomas is a native of Saraland, Ala. He is married to the former Kim Eades, and the couple has one daughter- Kayleigh Lauren.

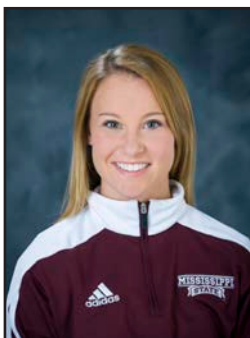

## 2015 INDOOR SEASON REVIEW

### MEN'S REVIEW

With two individual wins, the Mississippi State men's track and field team kicked off the 2015 indoor season at the UAB Invite.

True freshman Willie Reed finished first in the long jump with a leap of 24-00.25, while senior Jason Harper earned first in the triple jump after jumping 52-03.25.

From UAB the Bulldogs traveled to Nashville for the Commodore Invitational, where the team picked up two wins. Jovan Davis ran 7.95 in the 60m hurdles finals to claim first in the event. Sophomore Charles Taylor also finished first in the 200m dash with a time of 21.73.

At the Samford Multi Invitational, sophomore Jaquarius Wilson captured first in the heptathlon, while teammates Zahcary Taylor and Jesse Austin captured third and fourth, respectively. After scoring 2,866 points on day one, Wilson went on to capture the win with a total of 5,068 points.

Jovan Davis finished second in the 60m hurdles with a time of 7.90, while scottie Hearn placed second in the 400m dash with a time of 48.09 at the Vanderbilt Invitational. The men's 4x400m relay, comprised of Hearn, Charles Taylor, Dustin James II and Rodrigo Rocha ran 3:13.10 to finish third.

Making his 2015 indoor season debut at the New Balance Invitational, junior Brandon McBride ran the nation's leading time in the collegiate 500-meter run with a time of 1:01.40. Distance runner Andrew Monaghan finished second in the 3000-meter run with a time of 8:26.59. The 4x800m relay team of Steve Shoto, Damian Roszko, Brandon McBride and Andrew Monaghan finished second with a time of 7:33.05. In the men's 4x200-meter relay, Jovan Davis, Charles Taylor, Juston Waters and Zachary Taylor also led the Bulldogs to a second-place finish after running a time of 1:27.52. The men's squad finished fourth overall at the invitational.

Splitting the weekend between a pair of meets, the track and field team concluded Day 1 with Damian Roszko running the second-fastest time in MSU school history in the 5000m run. Roszko placed first in the 5000m run with a time of 14:19.77 at the Spire Invitational. Also on the track, Steve Shoto placed second in the 600m run with a time of 1:19.22. Day 2 began with McBride running an MSU school record in the 800m run for the first time for the 2015 season.

In the Samford Invitational, junior Seth Peace cleared 6-08.75 to finish second.

Ultimately the women's team would break numerous school records during the 2015 season that would lead to school record finishes in the post season.

To begin the indoor season, senior Ebony Brinker set a school record in the triple jump at the UAB Invite with a leap of 42-04.25. Finishing first along with Brinker, Abigail Dill recorded a first-place victory in the high jump after clearing 5-06.50. Freshman Tiffany Flynn made her Mississippi State debut in the triple jump. She finished second overall behind Brinker with a leap of 42-02.00, which is the third-best jump in program history.

Next up for the women's team was the Commodore Classic where the women's team recorded three first-place finishes. First the 4x800m relay team comprised of Ocian Archer, Shayla Luckett, Emma Neigel and Rhianwedd Price ran 9:00.22 to earn their victory on Day 1. During Day 2, Luckett earned first in the 200m dash with a time of 24.23, while teammate Ste'yce McNeil finished first in the 60m hurdles with a time of 8.34.

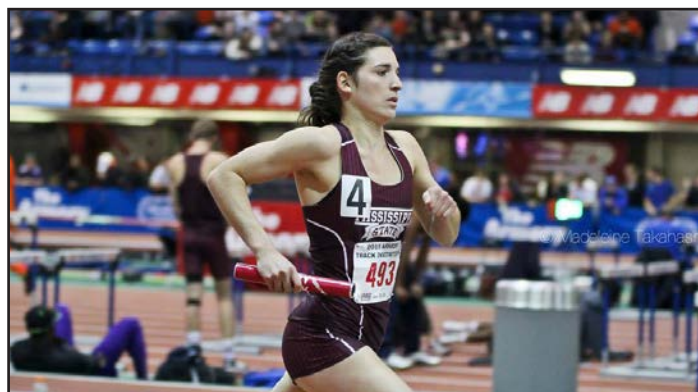
Making her 2015 indoor track and field season debut, senior Erica Bougard captured first place in the pentathlon at the Samford Multi Invitational. Bougard brought home the win after earning 4,419 points.

The MSU 4x400 relay team recorded a time of 3:38.04 to break the school record, which earned first place at the Vanderbilt Invitational. The foursome included, Shayla Luckett, Ocian Archer, Erica Bougard and Ste'yce McNeil. McNeil also finished second in the 60m dash and Luckett placed second in the 400m dash.

After Nashville, the Maroon and White headed to New York for the New Balance Invitational where the women brought home first place overall. Leading the way was junior Ste'yce McNeil, who recorded the third fastest time in MSU school history after running a time of 8.25 in the 60-meter hurdles. Prior to winning the 60-meter hurdles, McNeil was apart of the foursome who placed first in the 4x200-meter relays with a time of 1:36.43. Alongside with McNeil was Erica Bougard, Shayla Luckett and Euricka Hardy. Sophomore Rhianwedd Price ran a personal-best of 2:24.65 in 1000-meter run to finish second. The women's 4x800-meter relay ran a time of 8:56.57 to also place first. The foursome was comprised of Price, Ocian Archer, Cornelia Griesche and Emma Neigel.

Splitting the weekend between a pair of meets, Ocian Archer ran a time of 1:32.51 in the 600m run to finish fifth at the Spire Invitational. Ste'yce McNeil finished second in the 60m hurdles, running a time of 8.25 in the finals.

In the Samford Invitational in Birmingham, Ala., senior Abigail Dill cleared 5-05.00 in the high jump to finish fourth. On the track in Birmingham, sophomore Euricka Hardy finished sixth in the 60m dash finals with a time of 7.72.





## WOMEN'S REVIEW

Two Mississippi State track and field athletes broke school records on day one of the SEC Track and Field Indoor Championships in Lexington on Friday.

After running a school record time of 8.03 in the 60m hurdles, senior Erica Bougard placed second to qualify for the finals on Saturday. Ste'yce McNeil ran a time of 8.43 to place 11th.

Bougard scored 4,376 points to finish second in the pentathlon. Placing first in the 60m hurdles, Bougard ran a time of 8.20 to earn 1,084 points. She then went on to place 11th in the high jump after clearing 5-05.25. With a personal-best throw of 40-00.75 in the shot put, Bougard finished seventh to earn 675 points. In the long jump, Bougard tallied a second-place showing with a leap of 20-02.25 before running a time of 2:13.44 in the 800m dash to place second.

In the pole vault, Sydney Rodkey also broke a school record after clearing 12-08.75 to finish 10th.

Sophomore Rhianwedd Price placed first in the mile run after running a time of 4:45.67. Price was followed by teammate Emma Neigel in 10th after running a time of 4:51.99. Both Price and Neigel qualified for the finals on Saturday.

Also in the mile run were junior Madison Milhoan (5:05.13) and freshman Mia Meydrich (5:06.34), who finished 21st and 22nd, respectively.

With a season-best time of 7.64, Euricka Hardy finished 27th in the 60m dash before running a time of 25.29 in the 200m dash to place 31st.

Three runners represented MSU in the 400m dash, Shayla Luckett (54.72), Ocian Archer (56.05) and Kimari Martin (57.12) placed 17th, 25th and 37th.

To finish the running events for day one, Cornelia Griesche ran a time of 9:41.54 to finish ninth in the 3000m run, while Carly Terp (10:39.28) finished 25th.

In the field, Bougard placed eighth in the long jump with a leap of 20-03.75. Rochelle Farquharson (19-05.25) finished 13th

while teammate Tiffany Flynn (19-01.25) placed 17th.

After breaking numerous records over the weekend, the No. 18 Mississippi State women's track and field team brought home seventh place, the highest finish at the SEC Indoor Championships in school history, scoring a total of 36.70 points.

In her last appearance at the SEC Indoor Championships, senior Erica Bougard broke her second school record of the weekend after clearing 5-11.25 in the high jump. Bougard finished fourth, while teammates Logan Boss (5-05.75) and Abigail Dill (5-05.75) finished eighth and 16th, respectively.

On the track, Bougard finished third in the finals of the 60m hurdles, running a time of 8.14. Bougard was also chosen as the SEC women's MVP.

Close to breaking the school record of 4:32.24 in the mile, sophomore Rhianwedd Price ran a personal-best of 4:32.74 to place second. Also in the mile, senior Emma Neigel ran a time of 5:14.79 to finish 10th.

With a time of 17:11.65, Lisa Ziegler placed 19th in the 5000m run.

Tying her personal-best in the triple jump, senior Ebony Brinker finished sixth with a leap of 42-04.25. Placing 11th with a jump of 41-05.25 was freshman Tiffany Flynn.

The Bulldog distance medley relay team placed fourth after running a time of 11:26.86, the third fastest time in MSU school history. The DMR team was comprised of Bougard, Price, Cornelia Griesche and Ocian Archer.

In the final event of the day, the MSU 4x400m relay team, made up of Archer, Shayla Luckett, Ste'yce McNeil and Kimari Martin, came in 10th place running a time of 3:42.57.





## 2015 INDOOR NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS REVIEW

### MEN'S REVIEW

Looking to defend his title, junior Brandon McBride was set to represent the Mississippi State men's team at the 2015 NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships in Fayetteville, Ark..

As a sophomore, McBride won the 2014 NCAA 800m Indoor Championship after running a time of 1:48.17.

The Windsor, Ontario, native entered the 2015 meet with the third-best time in the nation at 1:46.80. McBride ran the school-record time earlier in the season at the Spire Invitational.

During the preliminaries round, McBride ran 1:48.48 to finish fifth and qualify for the final round.

In the finals, McBride ran a time of 1:47.16 to finish fourth unable to reclaim his title.

The men's team finished tied for 38th with five points.



### WOMEN'S REVIEW

On the track was Erica Bougard in the 60m hurdles. Bougard ran a time of 8.16 to finish seventh and qualify for the finals tomorrow. In the field, Bougard had a leap of 20-02.25 in the long jump to place ninth overall.

Sophomore Rhianwedd Price ran a time of 4:36.39 in the mile run to qualify for finals, but due to a minor lane violation was disqualified from the event.

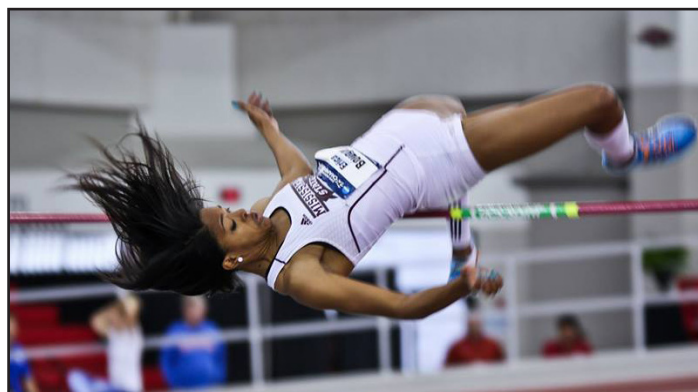
Starting day two for the Bulldogs was senior Erica Bougard in the pentathlon. Bougard placed second overall after scoring 4,566 points, the sixth best score in college history. In the 60m hurdles, Bougard ran a time of 8.16 to score 1,093 points. Following the hurdles, Bougard went on to place first in the high jump after clearing 6-00.00, a new MSU school record, to score 1,016 points.

Bougard earned 692 points in the pentathlon shot put after a personal-best throw of 40-10.50 to place eight. In the long jump, Bougard finished fourth after a leap of 20-02.25 to score 899 points. Bougard then ran a time of 2:16.93 to place fifth with 866 points, finishing out the pentathlon to claim second.

With the conclusion of the pentathlon, Bougard turned attention toward the finals of the 60m hurdles where she recorded a sixth-place finish with a time of 8.25.

In the field for the Bulldogs, senior Ebony Brinker finished 13th in the triple jump with a leap of 41-00.25.

The No. 12 women's team finished the meet in 21st with 11 points.



## MEN'S REVIEW

Participating in seven different meets throughout the outdoor season, the Mississippi State men's track and field team saw success through the campaign breaking four school records along the way to what would be the best season in program history.

Starting out in Tuscaloosa, the Maroon and White captured four wins at the Alabama Relays. Jovan Davis finished first in the 110m hurdles with a time of 14.24, while Scottie Hearn ran 51.11 to place first in the 400m hurdles. The sprint medley relay team comprised of Hearn, Juston Waters, Alfred Larry and Charles Taylor clocked a time of 3:24.09 finishing first. In the field, Marcus Jackson cleared 7-03.00 in the high jump collecting the first-place finish.

The following week the Bulldogs traveled back to Tuscaloosa for the Crimson Tide Invitational where Hearn and Jackson both finished first again. Hearn ran 51.56 in the 400m hurdles, while Jackson set the MSU school record in the high jump after clearing a height of 7-05.75.

Hearn, still undefeated in the 400m hurdles, went on to win the event at the Florida Relays with a time of 49.68. Also undefeated, Jackson finished first for the third-consecutive week in the high jump tying his personal-best 7-05.75.

The Bulldogs returned to Starkville to host the Border Clash, where the team captured four wins in four events. On the track, Davis ran a time of 51.44 in the 400m hurdles finishing first. Hearn, Larry, Charles Taylor and Brandon McBride ran a time of 3:07.77 to bring home first place in the 4x400m relay. In the field for the Bulldogs, Jackson secured first place in the high jump after clearing 7-00.50. Freshman Curtis Thompson finished first in the javelin after throwing 216-06.

Traveling to California for the Mt. SAC Relays, 2014 NCAA Indoor and Outdoor 800m Champion Brandon McBride made his first appearance in the event running a time of 1:46.28. Clocking a time of 50.20 in the 400m hurdles Hearn captured first, while Davis finished seventh with a time of 51.80.

Back in Mississippi, the Maroon and White competed in the Southern Miss Invitational where Tautvydas Kieras threw a school record 196-11 in the discus to bring home first place. Kieras also finished first in the shot put after throwing 54-06.50. Davis also brought home the win in the 110m hurdles with a time of 14.32. Junior Seth Peace captured his first win of the season after clearing 7-00.25 in the high jump.

Returning home for the last regular meet of the season, the Bulldogs played host to the Jace LaCoste Invitational where the team finished first in eight events. Running 3:54.38, Damian Roszko finished first in the 1500m run for the first time during the season. With a time of 14.10, Jovan Davis finished first in the 110m hurdles. Hearn, Larry, Charles Taylor and Juston Waters finished first in the 4x400m relay with a time of 3:09.60. Three Bulldogs picked up four wins in the field for MSU. Kieras finished first in both the discus and the shot put with throws of 177-00 and 56-05.75. Throwing his regular season personal-best, Thompson secured first in the javelin with a throw of 225-10. With the conclusion of the Jace LaCoste, the MSU teams turned attention toward the SEC Championships.



## WOMEN'S REVIEW

Four school records and numerous personal-bests were broken during the 2015 Mississippi State women's track and field regular campaign which led to the best season in program history.

In the first meet of the season, the Alabama Relays, the team shined with freshman Logan Boss bringing home a first-place victory in the high jump with a clearance of 5-08.75. Her height is the fifth-best in school history and also the freshman record. Also capturing a win at the first meet was Ste'yce McNeil, Shayla Luckett, Euricka Hardy and Brianna Smith in the 4x200m relay after running a time of 1:37.10. McNeil also placed first in the 100m hurdles with a time of 13.83.

The Bulldogs returned to Tuscaloosa the following weekend for the Crimson Tide Invitational marking the season debut of Erica Bougard. Bougard recorded two victories in the 400m dash and 100m hurdles. Cornelia Griesche captured the win in the 1500m run with a time of 4:29.17, while teammate Emma Neigel ran 10:35.43 to place first in the 3000m steeplechase. The women's 4x4100m relay team, made up of McNeil, Luckett, Euricka Hardy and Tiffany Flynn finished first with a time of 46.35.

Running the 1500m run for the first time in the 2015 season, Rhianwedd Price strided to first place at the Flordiy Relays with a time of 4:11.67. Distance runner Cornelia Griesche competed in the 3000m steeplechase for the first time as well and also captured the first-place victory after running 10:04.03.

Competing at home for the first time in the Border Clash, the Bulldogs stoodout as senior Ocian Archer broke the 400m hurdles school record for the first time that season. Archer ran 59.19 to set the record and earn first in the event before going on to finish first in the 4x40m relay with teammates McNeil, Kaelin Kersh and Kimari Martin. Another record set at the Border Clash was in the triple jump after senior Ebony Brinker jumped 41-09.25 in the triple jump. Bougard also won the 100m hurdles with a time of 13.29, while Price ran 2:05.00 to finish first in the 800m run.

At the Mt. SAC relays in Walnut, Calif., Bougard saw her first action in the heptathlon for the 2015 season. She earned first place with 5,962 points. The 4x400m relay team comprised of Archer, McNeil, Luckett and Martin also earned a first-place victory with a time of 3:36.43.

From California, the Bulldogs traveled back to Mississippi to compete in the Southern Miss Invitational, where three Bulldogs brought home first place. Ste'yce McNeil ran 59.74 to bring home the victory in the 400m hurdles, while Marta Freitas ran 4:26.67 in the 1500m run to also finish first. In the pole vault, Sydney Rodkey cleared 12-06.00 to win the event.

The last meet of the 2015 regular season, the Jace LaCoste Invitational, took place at MSU's home track, the Mike Sanders Track and Field Complex, where the Bulldogs claimed 12 event wins. Claiming first in the 400m hurdles, Archer broke the school record in the event for the second time that season running 58.29. McNeil was hot on her trail finishing second with a time of 58.38. Erica Bougard cleared a personal-best 6-00 at that time in the high jump to finish first. Distance runner Emma Neigel claimed the 3000m steeplechase victory with a time of 11:05.53, while Freitas brought home the 1500m run win and Price finished first in the 800m run. Running the last regular season meet of her college career, Luckett finished first in the 400m dash with a time of 53.36. In the field, Brinker also finished first in the triple jump, while Bougard captured the javelin victory and Rodkey got the pole vault win.

With the conclusion of the regular season, the Bulldogs turned attention toward the start of the post season.





## 2015 SEC CHAMPIONSHIPS REVIEW

### MEN'S REVIEW

Set to host the 2015 SEC Outdoor Track and Field Championships, the Mississippi State men's team had many athletes contribute to the overall success of the meet.

Rain delays didn't stop junior Scottie Hearn from achieving his goal as he was crowned the 2015 SEC 400m Hurdle Champion. Hearn ran a personal-best 49.39 to tie the school record in the event finals to claim his victory. Running alongside Hearn was Jovan Davis who also ran a personal-best 50.14, which is the fourth-best time in program history, to claim fifth place.

Another standout Bulldog competing was Zachary Taylor in the decathlon. Out of the 10 total events Taylor set personal-bests in eight of the events, leading him to an overall second-place finish in the decathlon. He scored a personal-best 7,466 points, the third-best in MSU history. Taylor began competition running a personal-best 10.65 in the 100m dash. He went on to jump 21-11.75 in the long jump, before throwing a personal-best 38-01.50 in the shot put. In the high jump, Taylor cleared 6-00.75 and completed Day 1 running a personal-best 48.57 in the 400m dash. To begin Day 2 Taylor ran another personal-best 15.24 in the 110m hurdles. In the discus, Taylor threw 134-01. He cleared 14-05.25 in the pole vault, threw 172-04 in the javelin and claimed his second-place finish by running a personal-best 4:23.51 in the 1500m run.

Competing in the finals, Alfred Larry ran 46.47 in the 400m dash to finish seventh at the championships. He ran a personal-best 45.93 in the preliminaries to earn his spot in the finals.

Brandon McBride, looking to defend his title from 2014, placed second in the 800m run with a time of 1:46.43.

Earning points for the team, senior Damian Roszko placed sixth in the 10,000m final after running 30:21.23.

In the field four Bulldogs contributed to the team's overall point total. With a personal-best throw of 248-01 in the javelin, freshman Curtis Thompson finished fourth. His throw ranks second in program history.

Tautvydas Keiras threw 185-00 in the discus to finish fifth, while Jason Harper jumped 52-02.75 in the triple jump to place seventh.

In his last appearance in the SEC Championships, senior Marcus Jackson cleared 6-10.25 to capture fifth place in the high jump.

Overall the MSU men's track and field team scored 52 points at the championships to finish eighth.



### WOMEN'S REVIEW

As the Mississippi State women's track and field team prepared for the 2015 SEC Championships they had one major advantage, the meet would be hosted on their home track.

Setting a meet record four times and five personal-bests, Erica Bougard was able to capture the 2015 SEC heptathlon champion title. Bougard scored a meet record and career-best 6,250 points to claim her victory. She ran the best time of 13.11 in the 100m hurdles to kick off events on Day 1 of the meet. She went on to clear a school record 6-00.75 in the high jump, throw a personal-best 38-04.00 in the shot put and run another personal-best 23.48 in the 200m dash to conclude Day 1. The second day started with Bougard having the best jump at 20-11.75 in the long jump before throwing 103-10 in the javelin and capturing her title after running a personal-best 2:11.00 in the 800m run.

After the completion of the heptathlon, Bougard went on to finish third in the 100m hurdles with a personal-best time of 13.02. Teammate Ste'yce McNeil finished seventh with a time of 13.28.

Senior Shayla Luckett also ran a personal-best time of 52.74 in the 400m dash to finish fourth overall. McNeil also competed in the 400m hurdle finals and finished in sixth place after running 58.52.

Distance runners Rhianwedd Price and Marta Freitas made it to the finals in both the 800m run and the 1500m run. Price claimed the 1500m runner-up with a time of 4:18.32, while Freitas finished third with a time of 4:19.38. In the 800m run, Freitas placed seventh with a time of 2:07.67 and Price finished ninth with a time of 2:13.81.

In the 3000m steeplechase, Cornelia Griesche earned runner-up with a time of 10:04.00.

Representing the Maroon and White in the field was Ebony Brinker. Brinker finished eighth in the triple jump finals after a school record leap of 41-11.25. Freshman Tiffany Flynn finished 13th in the event after a personal-best 40-09.50. Flynn also had a personal-best leap of 19-11.50 in the long jump to place 10th.

Senior Abigail Dill and freshman Logan Boss tied for 13th in the high jump after clearing 5-05.00 in the event. Sasha-Gaye Marston competed in both the discus throw and shot put for the Bulldogs. Marston placed 14th in the discus with a throw of 140-08 and 11th in the shot put after a throw of 42-10.25.

With 51 points, the women's team finished in eighth place, the highest finish at the SEC Championships in program history.



## MEN'S REVIEW

During the 2014-15 post season, the Mississippi State men's track and field team saw the most successful season since 1923. The men's team had 10 athletes qualify for the NCAA East Preliminaries in nine events. Eight athletes went on to qualify for nationals in seven different events.

The first athlete to qualify for the NCAA Championships was freshman Curtis Thompson. Thompson threw 225-06 in the javelin to earn his punch his ticket to Eugene, Ore. His throw was 10th at preliminaries.

Also in the competing in the field for the Bulldogs was senior Marcus Jackson and junior transfer Seth Peace in the high jump. Jackson was able to clear 6-11.75 to earn a spot in the Top 12 to compete in nationals. Peace fell just short and cleared 6-10.25 bringing his first season with the Bulldogs to an end.

Tautvydas Kieras was another Bulldog who saw his season end at the preliminaries. After breaking the MSU school record in the discus during the regular season, Kieras threw 178-00 at the prelims to finish 23rd.

On the track, SEC 400m hurdles Champion Scottie Hearn competed in the event and qualified for the NCAA Championships with a time of 49.94. His teammate Jovan Davis ran 52.08 to finish 26th unable to qualify.

At the time of the preliminaries, Brandon McBride was the reigning 800m run NCAA Champion after winning during the 2014 season. McBride qualified for nationals in the event after running 1:45.97, the best time at the preliminaries.

Alfred Larry was another Bulldog who saw success at the preliminaries in Jacksonville, Fla. Larry ran 45.92 in the 400m dash to finish ninth, securing him a spot in Oregon.

Davis, Hearn, McBride and Larry went on to compete in the men's 4x400m relay team. The foursome ran a time of 3:04.45 to finish fourth and continue their season on the national stage.

Seniors Jason Harper and Damian Roskzo also competed in the preliminaries for the Maroon and White, but were unable to continue their seasons in Oregon. Harper finished 25th in the triple jump with a leap of 49-06.25, while Roskzo ran 31:26.31 in the 10,000m run to place 41st.



## WOMEN'S REVIEW

Sending 12 athletes to compete in 10 events, the Mississippi State women's track and field team had multiple athletes qualify for the national stage at the NCAA East Preliminaries.

At the preliminaries, Erica Bougard competed in three separate events having already qualified for the NCAA Championships in the heptathlon. She also qualified for the championships in the 100m hurdles, the high jump and the 4x400m relay.

In the 100m hurdles quarterfinals, Bougard ran a personal-best 12.99 to finish third overall. Teammate Ste'yce McNeil ran a time of 13.31 in the quarterfinals to finish 15th, just short of the qualifying 12.

Bougard went on to compete in the high jump where she finished sixth to qualify after clearing a height of 5-11.50. Competing alongside Bougard was freshman Logan Boss who cleared 5-08.25 finishing 20th bringing her season to an end.

Ending the preliminaries for Bougard, she ran the first leg of the MSU 4x400m relay with teammates Kimari Martin, Ocian Archer and Shayla Luckett. The foursome finished 12th making the cut for nationals with a school record time of 3:32.13.

Also seeing success on the track, distance runners Rhianwedd Price and Marta Freitas finished first and second overall in the 1500m run quarterfinals. At the time, Price ran a personal-best 4:10.95 to qualify, while Freitas also ran her personal-best in the event with a time of 4:13.17.

In the 3000m steeplechase, Cornelia Griesche finished 10th with a school record time, at that time, of 9:58.06 to qualify for nationals for the second year in a row in the event.

Prior to running the 4x400m relay, Shayla Luckett competed in the 400m dash quarterfinals. She finished 16th with a time of 52.89 bringing her senior season in the event to an end.

Ste'yce McNeil competed in both the 100m hurdles and 400m hurdles, but finished 15th and 32nd unable to qualify for either.

In the field for the Bulldogs, senior Ebony Brinker broke the school record in the triple jump with a leap of 41-11.50 to finish 12th and earn her ticket to Oregon. Tiffany Flynn competed with Brinker and finished 19th with a leap of 41-04.25. Flynn also competed in the long jump where she finished 41st with a jump of 18-04.25

Sasha-Gaye Marston competed in the discus throw at the preliminaries. She finished 44th after a throw of 143-07 bringing her season to an end.





## 2015 OUTDOOR NCAA PRELIMINARIES REVIEW

### MEN'S REVIEW

With four Top Eight individual finishes, the Mississippi State men's team had the highest finish in program history since 1923. The men finished eighth overall with 20 points.

Earning the first points for the Bulldogs was freshman Curtis Thompson, who finished third in the javelin with a throw of 247-05. His third-place victory captured six points for the Bulldogs.

Senior Marcus Jackson competed in the high jump finals and earned five team points. His best clearance was 7-03.25 to earn fourth place.

Also receiving points for the team was junior Brandon McBride. McBride, who was the 800m champion in 2014, was unable to defend his title, but captured 3 points for the team after finishing sixth in the event with a time of 1:50.11.

The men's 4x400m relay team comprised of McBride, Scottie Hearn, Charles Taylor and Alfred Larry recorded a third-place victory in the finals with a time of 3:04.96.

Prior to the 4x400m relay, Hearn competed in the 400m hurdle semifinals. He earned ninth place with a time of 50.29, falling just one spot short of the finals.

Larry competed in the 400m dash semifinals and finished 11th after running a time of 46.19 to finish his season in the event.

Multi athlete Zachary Taylor also represented the Maroon and White in Oregon. Taylor competed in the decathlon and finished 13th overall with 7,376 points.

The overall winner of the 2015 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships was host Oregon with 85 points.



### WOMEN'S REVIEW

Under the guidance of coach Steve Dudley, the Mississippi State women's track and field team recorded the highest finish in program history at the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships. With a team total of 15 points, the women finished 18th overall.

Sophomore Rhianwedd Price led the way for the team as she claimed the 1500m run title with a personal-best time of 4:09.56 to earn 10 team points. Competing alongside Price in the 1500m run was Marta Freitas. Freitas finished 12th in the event with a time of 4:41.03.

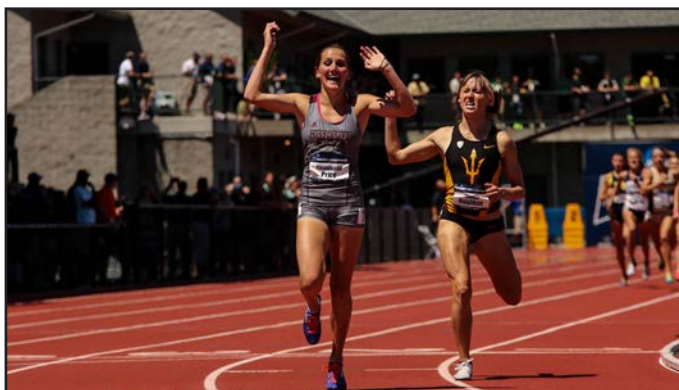
In the heptathlon, Erica Bougard recorded a fourth-place finish to earn five team points. She earned 6,050 points total in the event. Bougard also competed in the 100m hurdles and high jump. She finished 15th in the hurdles with a time of 13.19, while she captured 17th place in the high jump after clearing 6-09.75.

Distance runner Corenlia Griesche competed in the 3000m steeplechase at the championships for the second year in a row. Unable to make the finals, she finished 16th in the semifinals with a time of 10:19.36.

Also on the track for the Bulldogs was Kimari Martin, Ste'yce McNeil, Ocian Archer and Shayla Luckett in the 4x400m relay. The foursome finished 11th in the event with a time of 3:35.48, the third fastest time in school history.

Competing in the field for the Maroon and White was senior Ebony Brinker. Brinker had a leap of 39-08.75 in the triple jump to bring home 23rd place.

Bringing home the 2015 women's championship trophy was host Oregon with a total of 59 points.



## MEN'S REVIEW

### Brandon McBride

After the completion of his junior season at Mississippi State, Brandon McBride headed home to Canada to compete in the Pan American Games. McBride finished fifth in the 800m semifinals with a time of 1:49.65, falling just one spot short of qualifying for the finals.

Despite being unable to make it to the finals at the Pan American Games, McBride was still named to the Athletics Canada Team to compete in the IAAF World Championships.

### Curtis Thompson

Ending his freshman season on the national stage, Curtis Thompson went on to compete in the Junior and Senior Pan American Games in Eugene, Ore. During the 2015 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships, Thompson placed third in the javelin with a throw of 247-05.

At the Senior Pan American Games the Florence, N.J., native finished @@, while he went on to place first in the Junior Pan American Games for the second year in a row.



## WOMEN'S REVIEW

### Erica Bougard

After a personal-best performance in the heptathlon at the 2015 SEC Outdoor Track & Field Championships, Erica Bougard continued her success at the Senior Pan American Games in Eugene Oregon. The Byhalia, Miss., native had a new personal-best and MSU school record points of 6,280, placing her third qualifying her for Team USA.

As a member of Team USA, Bougard was set to compete in the heptathlon at IAAF World Championships in Beijing, China in August 2015.

Bougard ran a time of 13.28 in the 100m hurdles to finish seventh earning 1,083 points. She went on to clear 6-00 in the high jump for 1,016 points before throwing 37-05 in the shot put for 621 points. In the 200m, Bougard ran 24.41 and jumped 20-03.50 in the long jump. She threw 115-00 for 573 points in the javelin. Bougard did not compete in the 800m run of the heptathlon.

### Marta Freitas

With a standout first season with the Bulldogs that ended in Eugene, Ore., at the NCAA Championships, Marta Freitas earned a spot on Team Portugal and went to compete at the European Championships and the Under 23 European Championships. She ended her summer competition after breaking her personal-best in the 800m run with a time of 2:08.76.

### Cornelia Griesche

During the 2015 outdoor track and field post season Cornelia Griesche set the Mississippi State 3000m steeplechase record with a time of 9:58.06 to qualify for nationals. However, she broke the record once again while competing for her home country, Germany, at the 2015 European Athletics U23 Championships. Her time of 9:57.75 landed her at third place in the prelims, qualifying for finals where she finished 13th overall.

### Rhianwedd Price

In May 2015 Rhianwedd Price became the NCAA 1500m Champion after running a personal-best 4:09.56, but that wasn't the end of her competition for the year. Price went on to compete for her home country, Great Britain, in the European Championships. The sophomore finished third overall in the 1500m run with a time of 4:16.59.



## 2015 WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY SEASON REVIEW

### WOMEN'S SEASON REVIEW

What would become the most historical season in program history, the Mississippi State women's cross country team kicked off the 2015 season with the Memphis Twilight. The team placed third with 77 points led by sophomore Mia Meydrich who finished fifth overall with a time of 17:37.16. Not far behind Meydrich was junior Lisa Zielger in eighth clocking a time of 17:41.68. Capturing the third, fourth and fifth spots for MSU were freshman Shannon Fair, freshman Kristy Terp and senior Madison Milhoan in 12th, 23rd and 44th, respectively.

From Memphis the Bulldogs traveled to Nashville for the Commodore Classic where they placed third with 95 points. Senior Marta Freitas made her MSU cross country debut capturing second overall with a time of 17:02.20. Finishing behind Freitas was Ziegler in 10th with a time of 17:20.30 and senior Cornelia Griesch in 15th clocking a time of 17:28.90. Earning 17th, Meydrich ran a time of 17:49.30 to finish fourth for the Bulldogs. Rounding out MSU's Top 5 was Fair in 57th with a time 18:00.60. Also competing for the Bulldogs were freshman Antonia Hehr (81st, 18:24.80), Milhoan (140th, 19:11.40) and Terp (179th, 19:45.10).

Following the Commodore Classic, MSU competed in the Panorama Farms Invite where Freitas captured MSU's first spot again coming in at 11th with a time of 17:25.20. Griesche finished 12th recording a time of 17:28.50. Junior Rhianwedd Price made her season debut at this meet where she clocked a time of 17:41.00 to finish 17th. Finishing 21st, Meydrich ran a time of 17:48.90, immediately followed by Ziegler in 22nd with a time of 17:49.60. Hehr (37th, 18:16.30), Fair (39th, 18:17.30), Ffion Price (44th, 18:25.10) and Terp (75th, 19:17.50) also competed for the Bulldogs. Overall the team finished second with 83 points, only behind host Virginia who scored 30 points.

Next up for the Bulldogs was the Pre-NCAA meet in Louisville, Ky. The team captured 247 points to earn fifth place out of 45 teams. Again Freitas finished first for the Bulldogs with a time of 20:15.20 to place 12th. Rhianwedd Price recorded a 14th-place finish after running a time of 20:17.70. In the third spot for the Maroon and White, Griesche ran a time of 20:57.70 to earn 69th place. Ffion Price finished fourth for the Bulldogs and 82nd overall with a time of 21:02.60. Rounding out MSU's Top 5 was Meydrich in 86th with a time of 21:03.00. Ziegler ran a time of 21:07.40 to finish 97th, while Fair placed 137th with a time of 21:21.60. Two Bulldogs also competed in the Open Individual Pre-NCAA meet. Hehr finished ninth with a time of 21:42.20, while Milhoan placed 78th recording a time of 23:15.60.

The Bulldogs began postseason in College Sta-

tion with the SEC Championships. Recording the highest finish in school history the Bulldogs captured second with 95 points. Arkansas earned first with 38 points. Earning Second-Team All-SEC honors, Freitas finished ninth with a time of 20:14.30. Finishing second for MSU was Griesche in 17th recording a time of 20:33.90. Placing back-to-back in 22nd, 23rd and 24th was Rhianwedd Price (20:33.90), Lisa Ziegler (20:35.70) and Mia Meydrich (20:37.49). Earning the sixth and seventh spots for the Bulldogs were Ffion Price in 32nd with a time of 20:51.30 and Fair in 39th recording a time of 21:01.80. Hehr posted a time of 22:04.00 to finish 91st.

Continuing to make history, the women's squad recorded a program-best finish at the NCAA South Regionals, earning second automatically punching its ticket to nationals. The team scored 78 points with Freitas, Rhianwedd Price, Griesche and Meydrich earning All-Region accolades. Freitas led the way in sixth with a time of 20:25.84. Not far behind, Rhianwedd Price claimed 10th after clocking a time of 20:34.34. Clinching a 15th spot finish with a time of 20:41.33 was Griesche. Recording a 17th-place finish was Meydrich with a time of 20:43.59. Rounding out MSU's Top 5 was Lisa Ziegler in 34th posting a time of 21:17.50. In the sixth and seventh spots for MSU was Ffion Price (21:27.48) and Shannon Fair (21:35.03) in 39th and 52nd, respectively.

Marking its first ever appearance at the NCAA Championships, the No. 20 MSU women's team finished 17th after scoring 405 points. Freitas became the third All-American in school history after clocking a time of 20:26.70 to place 37th. In 50th, Rhianwedd Price posted a time of 20:32.30, while Griesche ran a time of 21:01.10 to place 125th. Meydrich recorded a 162nd-place finish with a time of 21:16.20. With a time of 21:19.50, Ziegler captured 169th place. Ffion Price finished 188th with a time of 21:20.80, while Fair clocked a time of 21:48.40 to place 213th.

## 2015 MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY SEASON REVIEW

### MEN'S SEASON REVIEW

To begin the 2015 Mississippi State men's cross country season, the team would travel to Memphis to compete in the Memphis Twilight 4-mile run. The team captured third place scoring 109 points. Senior Andrew Monaghan led the way in third place with a time of 20:12.67. Finishing back-to-back in 14th and 15th were seniors Patrick Monaghan and Mathew Dunn in the second and third spots for MSU. Sophomore Branden Nosker captured 38th with a time of 21:01.63, while freshman JT Mackay made his MSU debut finishing 41st clocking a time of 21:03.29. Also competing was Pierce Rose (52nd, 21:15.23), Caden Foos (72nd, 21:34.17), Tristan Orman (73rd, 21:35.67), Quintin Resier (74th, 21:36.51), Curtis Kelly (91st, 21:54.99) and Zachary Weaver (118th, 22:21.28).

With 12 runners set to compete, the men's team traveled to Nashville for the Commodore Classic capturing 10th place after scoring 243 points. Recording a time of 25:36.40, Dunn finished in the top spot for MSU and 30th overall. In his MSU debut, freshman Emilio Perco came in second for MSU and 37th overall after running a time of 25:48.50. Andrew Monaghan and Patrick Monaghan placed 47th and 68th in the third and fourth spots for MSU. Rounding out the Top 5 was Curtis Kelly in 70th with a time of 26:26.60. Nosker (75th, 26:31.00), Mackay (94th, 26:42.90), Orman (97th, 26:47.00), Rose (113th, 27:26.90), Resier (129th, 27:26.90), Weaver (153rd, 27:45.70) and Foos (166th, 28:21.80) also represented MSU on the course.

Scoring 303 points, the team finished 11th at the Panorama Farms Invite with Andrew Monaghan leading the way once again. He posted a time of 25:05.90 to finish 45th. With a time of 25:12.40, Dunn placed 50th, while Patrick Monaghan earned 73rd recording a time of 25:53.00. In the fourth spot for MSU was Nosker with a time 25:56.90 in 75th overall. Finishing fifth for MSU was Mackay in 91st posting a time of 26:26.60. Also in attendance was Kelly (93rd, 26:28.00), Rose (96th, 26:35.70) and Perco (101st, 26:51.70).

Up next was the Crimson Classic where the team finished 15th with 384 points. Leading the way for the Maroon and White was Dunn in 33rd after recording a time of 25:30.60. In second for the Bull-

dogs was Mackay with a time of 26:14.10 to finish 80th overall. Andrew Monaghan (26:15.81) captured 82nd with Nosker (26:18.87) not far behind in 88th. Finishing fifth for MSU and 104th overall was Orman clocking a time of 26:29.88. Resier (112th, 26:36.14), Foos (119th, 26:43.30), Perco (126th, 26:52.11), Rose (145th, 27:18.22) and Weaver (150th, 27:32.09) were competing on the course.

With the regular season coming to a close, the MSU men's team began post season with the SEC Championships in College Station. After scoring 280 points, the team brought home a 10th-place. Capturing the first spot for MSU was Andrew Monaghan with a personal-best 24:26.20 to place 29th. Not far behind Monaghan was Dunn in 32nd also with a personal-best 24:32.00. With a time of 25:18.70, Nosker placed 73rd, while Kelly finished 78th with a time of 25:32.90. Completing MSU's scoring five was Patrick Monaghan in 92nd after posting a time of 25:54.20. In the sixth and seventh spots for MSU were Orman (25:57.50) and Rose (26:16.20) placing 94th and 102nd, respectively.

In the last meet of the season, the men's squad headed to the NCAA South Regionals in Tuscaloosa. Scoring 317 points, the team placed 13th in the meet. In the first spot for MSU was senior Dunn in his final race for the Maroon and White. Dunn ran a time of 31:47.13 to finish 30th overall. Also in his last meet for the Bulldogs was senior Andrew Monaghan, who finished 54th after clocking a time of 32:23.68. Capturing the third spot for MSU was Kelly in 78th finishing with a time of 32:50.65. Mackay finished 81st with a time of 32:53.20, while Nosker ran 32:58.62 placing 84th. Also in competition for the Bulldogs was Tristan Orman who placed 88th with a time of 33:05.43.

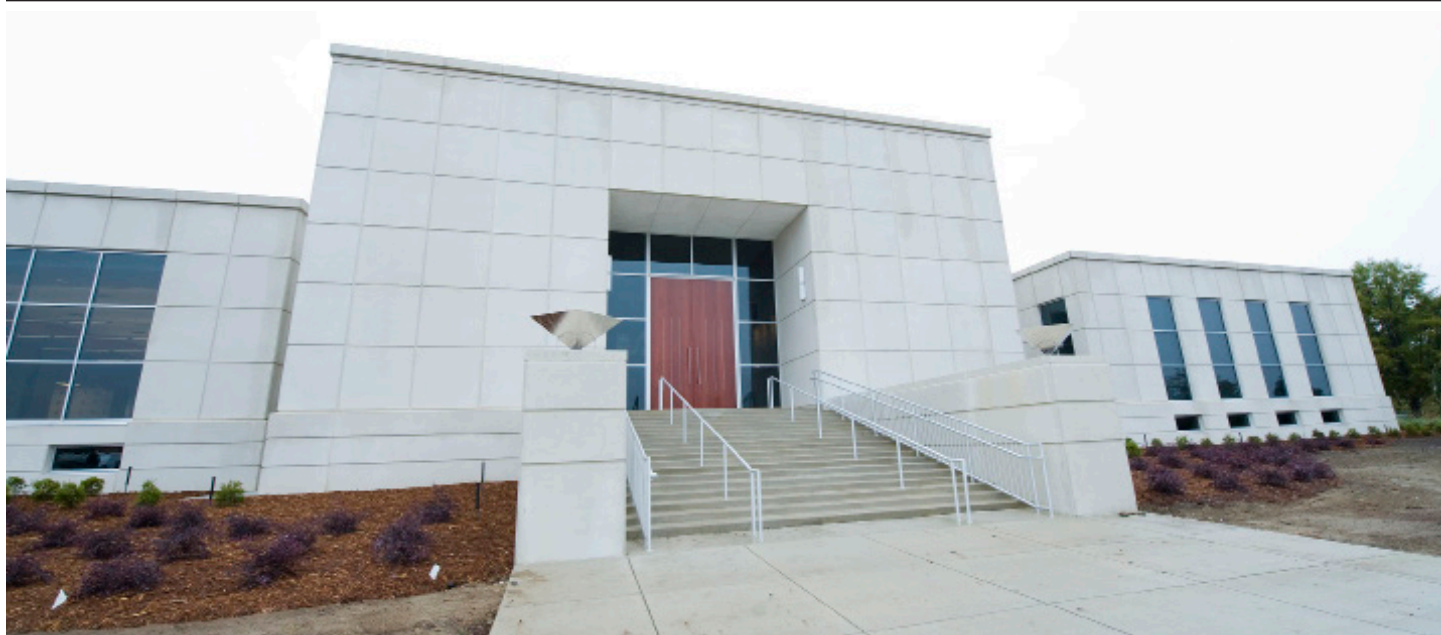

# ATHLETIC ACADEMIC CENTER

## LARRY H. TEMPLETON ATHLETIC ACADEMIC CENTER



Dedicated on November 1, 2008, the Templeton Athletic Academic Center is a welcome addition to the Bulldog athletic program. The \$10 million facility is named for former MSU Director of Athletics Larry Templeton.

The facility is an addition to two existing facilities in the athletic wing of the MSU campus - the Shira Complex and the Holliman Athletic Center. It is situated on the south side of those two facilities, and across the street from the Bryan Athletic Administration Building.

The 34,000 square-foot building serves the entire athletic department, houses the Athletic Academics offices and staff, and includes individual computer rooms, tutor work areas, a large open study area

and a 300-seat dining facility with a fully-functioning kitchen.

Templeton, now Athletic Director Emeritus, served 22 years as Director of Athletics and during his tenure helped position MSU Athletics as an innovative, progressive program, with equality in sports for women, new and renovated facilities and keen fiscal management.

During the 1990s almost every sport came away with a best-ever finish. Achievements included six football bowl games, men's basketball's trip to the 1996 NCAA Final Four, three baseball trips to the NCAA College World Series, five Southeastern Conference championships and participation in the NCAA Championships by sport teams 29 times.

### ATHLETIC TRAINING ROOM

The Mississippi State Sports Medicine Department consists of six athletic training rooms at various athletic facilities to better serve our student athletes. The athletic training rooms are staffed by our seven full time staff members along with five graduate assistants and 20 student athletic trainers.

The new Columbus Orthopaedic Sports Medicine Center is equipped with the latest in modalities (in-ground whirlpools, ultrasound, electrical stimulation), rehabilitation equipment (including a Biodex and Hydroworx® therapy pool with an underwater treadmill), an x-ray machine, and a variety of additional equipment necessary to meet the needs of the elite collegiate athlete.

The Team Family Practice Physicians and Orthopedists are available at practice and in the athletic training room almost daily for consultation with the athletic trainers and student athletes.



### JOHN C. LONGEST STUDENT HEALTH CENTER

---

Mississippi State University maintains a full service student health center on campus where our two Team Family Practice Physicians practice. They are supported by a lab, pharmacy, x-ray, physical therapy department, nutritionists, three additional physicians, four nurse practitioners, and a nursing staff.



## MISSISSIPPI STATE UNIVERSITY

Mississippi State is a comprehensive land-grant institution and the largest university in Mississippi, with a statewide enrollment of more than 16,000 students.

Established in 1878 as the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Mississippi, the university has traditional strengths in engineering and scientific agriculture but has evolved into a comprehensive institution with a diverse array of programs in teaching, research, and service.



## ACADEMICS & STUDENT LIFE

Mississippi State students consistently earn honors such as the prestigious Harry S. Truman Scholarship, awarded for those who will enter public service, and, with 16 Truman Scholars to date, the university has been recognized as a Truman Honor Institution. In the past year, a student team competed for and won first place in a national Challenge X competition to redesign a fuel-efficient and environmentally-friendly SUV.

Recently initiated programs are providing opportunities to develop leadership potential and global study options. The university's Global Leadership Continuum provides "cradle-to-CEO" programming designed to develop leadership across a "global" spectrum that begins with high school and continues through the university experience and into professional life. Included are the Young Guns Leadership Camp for rising high school seniors; the Day one Leadership Community for incoming freshmen, focusing on shared academic and service experiences; and the highly competitive Appalachian Leadership Honors Program for sophomores and juniors.

To complement these efforts, the university has launched a minor in leadership studies open to students in all majors. A university honor code adopted in 2007 institutionalizes a campus culture of integrity

and personal responsibility in academic studies. Through the Global Leadership Program, students may experience significantly expanded study-abroad opportunities.





Mississippi State faculty researchers attracted \$186.5 million in external funding for 2006-07, up from about \$155 million during the previous year. This funding supported 1,691 sponsored projects in 2007.

Based on the latest rankings available from the National Science Foundation, MSU ranks 7th in the nation in agricultural sciences research expenditures and 44th in engineering. Last year MSU faculty and staff disclosed 80 new technologies resulting in three new start-up companies, nine licenses, and 22 patent applications. The university now holds 77 patents.

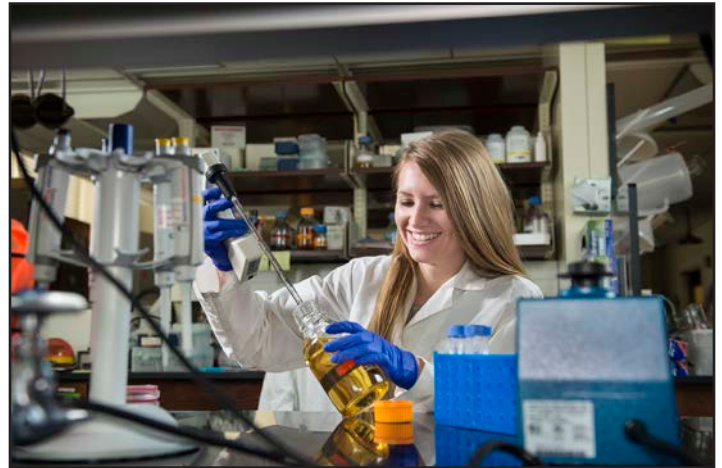
In recent years, MSU has established the Thad Cochran Endowment for Entrepreneurship, as well as collaborating with federal agencies and industries to help increase technology-oriented start-up companies. Among the collaborators and sponsors are the U.S. departments of Defense and Energy, NASA, General Electric, Northrop Grumman, EADS/American Eurocopter, Boeing, Raytheon, General Dynamics, Israeli Aerospace Industry, and the Mississippi Technology Alliance.

In a key area of economic interest to Mississippi, MSU's Center for Advanced Vehicular Systems, established in 2001, continues research and development supporting a goal of attracting automotive industries to the state. The center is conducting research in areas that include materials processing, human and systems engineering, alternative power systems, computational manufacturing and design, and advanced learning technologies.

From its academic programs to the work of countless individuals, Mississippi State has "extended farther" and gone "beyond the limit" to make a difference in the lives of citizens around the state. In 2006, the university formed the Mississippi State Community Action Team to organize university resources and

expertise for quick response to local issues around the state. MSU's Extension Service is the first in the nation to have an interactive videoconferencing system in every county Extension office. Through the Freedom Calls program, the system is being used to connect Mississippians with family members in the U.S. military serving our country in Iraq.

The MSU Extension Service maintains offices in almost every county of the state, and the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station operates 10 branch stations throughout Mississippi. Four strategically located research and extension centers coordinate the delivery of services statewide.



## UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT

## DR. MARK E. KEENUM



Dr. Mark Everett Keenum became Mississippi State's 19th president Jan. 5, 2009, following a distinguished public service career.

Dr. Keenum has guided Mississippi State to unprecedented heights during his six-year tenure. The university has experienced record enrollment growth to more than 20,000 students. The freshman

class of fall 2014 was almost 3,000, and the average ACT score for 2014 was a record 24.4. During 2011-12, Mississippi State awarded more than 4,000 degrees at all levels for the first time in its history, and followed that with 4,222 degrees in 2014-15.

The campus has expanded and improved on Keenum's watch. Major renovations of historic Lee Hall and Davis Wade Stadium were completed by August 2014. Construction of a new classroom building with built-in parking and a Fresh Foods concept cafeteria began in 2014. In 2015, construction is under way on two new residence halls, the new G.V. "Sonny" Montgomery Center for America's Veterans, a Wise Center classroom building, and an expansion of Mitchell Memorial Library is set to begin this fall.

Since 2009, fundraising has reached all-time record levels, with private giving exceeding \$80 million a year in fiscal years 2011, 2012 and 2013 and grew to \$108.8 million in fiscal year 2014. In fall 2013, the university formally announced Infinite Impact: the Campaign for Mississippi State with a goal of \$600 million by 2018. To date, more than \$530 million of that goal had been met. Dr. Keenum has also been instrumental in expanding the MSU Promise Program, which provides need-based scholarship assistance to Mississippi students whose families have limited financial means.

Mississippi State has strengthened its role as the flagship research university in the state. The most recent research success has been MSU's designation as the Federal Aviation Administration's National Center of Excellence in Unmanned Aerial Systems and Boeing's decision to locate a composite research center at MSU's Raspet Flight Lab. The Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching classifies

MSU as a university with "very high research activity," the only such designation in Mississippi. Dr. Keenum travels frequently to Washington, D.C., meeting with Congressional leaders and federal agency heads to pursue research opportunities and broaden the university's influence on the national level. He has also worked closely with state leaders in support of higher education in

Mississippi.

Keenum serves as vice-chairman of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools' Commission on Colleges' Executive Council. SACS-COC is the recognized regional accrediting body in the 11 U.S. Southern states (Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas and Virginia) and in Latin America for those institutions of higher education that award associate, baccalaureate, master's or doctoral degrees.

He also is a member of the American Public Land-Grant Universities Board of Directors. Based in Washington, D.C., the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities (APLU) is a research and advocacy organization of public research universities, land-grant institutions, and state university systems with member campuses in all 50 states, U.S. territories and the District of Columbia. Keenum has also been appointed vice chairman of the Foundation for Food and Agricultural Research by U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Thomas J. Vilsack.

In 2015, Keenum was named to the College Football Playoff's (CFP) Board of Managers and elected vice president of the Southeastern Conference. He remains a member of the SEC Executive Committee and continues to serve on the SEC's Content Committee that oversees the SEC Network.

A graduate of Mississippi State University with degrees in agricultural economics, Dr. Keenum began his career at MSU as a faculty member with the Extension Service and the Department of Agricultural Economics. He went on to serve as chief of staff to U.S. Senator Thad Cochran in Washington, D.C. and was Under Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture prior to returning home to Mississippi State.

He graduated from Corinth (MS) High School and earned an associate of arts degree from Northeast Mississippi Community College in Booneville and was a member of the Northeast Tigers football team.

Dr. Keenum is married to the former Rhonda Newman of Booneville, also an MSU graduate. They have four children: Rett, Mary Phillips, Katie and Torie.

# SCOTT STRICKLIN



Now in his third decade in intercollegiate athletics, Director of Athletics Scott Stricklin has overseen a wave of momentum within the Mississippi State fan base during his tenure. From his first day on the job in May 2010, Stricklin, with a focus on the student-athlete, a commitment to great integrity, and a dedication to promoting MSU aggressively, has facilitated a stretch of unparalleled Bulldog success.

With an investment of over \$130 million in facilities, a strong roster of successful coaches, and significant increases in Bulldog Club membership and donations, MSU Athletics has achieved its highest-ever Learfield Director's Cup finish while consistently seeing the majority of its teams compete in post-season championships.

In an era that has seen 30-consecutive sellouts at Davis Wade Stadium and impressive football facility enhancements, Coach Dan Mullen's team has played in five-consecutive bowl games, while the Bulldogs spent five-straight weeks in 2014 ranked No. 1 in the polls for the first time in school history.

The sports of tennis, baseball, basketball, softball, men's and women's golf and track and field have each excelled and advanced to NCAA postseason play under Stricklin's leadership. During the 2014-15 academic year, 11 Mississippi State sports advanced to NCAA postseason play, with eight earning Top 25 rankings during the season, while the women's golf team ascended all the way to No. 1 in the fall. The year was capped by All-American Rhianwedd Price winning the 1500-meter run at the NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships in Oregon, one year after Brandon McBride claimed the crown in the 800-meter run and two years removed from the baseball team playing for the national championship in Omaha.

In addition, 2015 also saw two MSU coaches earn SEC Coach of the Year honors in Mullen and Vic Schaefer, who led the Bulldogs to a school record 27 wins en route to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

In the classroom, Bulldog students continue to excel. In the 2014-15 academic year, Mississippi State's men and women athletes posted a combined GPA of 3.0, the highest in school history. Also in 2015, Bulldog students again excelled in the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate, with all 16 sports far exceeding the minimum standard.

Stricklin has overseen record fundraising for Bulldog Athletics, which has produced new facilities such as the \$11.7 million Mize Pavilion at Humphrey Coliseum, the \$25 million Leo W. Seal Jr. Football Complex, as well as \$75 million in expansion and upgrades to Davis Wade Stadium that were completed prior to the start of the 2014 campaign.

The Davis Wade Stadium expansion and renovation pushed capacity to 61,337, making it the largest on campus football stadium in the state of Mississippi. In addition to innovative premium seating options, a new brick facade and updated west concourse, complete with renovated restrooms and concessions, now greets fans attending games at historic Scott Field.

In the spring 2015, a \$6 million renovation began on both the tennis and softball complexes, while a \$40 million upgrade to Dudy Noble Field is in the planning process. In addition, construction is nearly completed for the new \$2.2 million Mississippi State Golf Center at Old Waverly, one of the South's premier golf courses. The project includes a 6,300-square foot team clubhouse with locker rooms, players' lounge, coaches' offices and indoor putting center, along with a 2,431-square

foot indoor hitting bay.

Stricklin's vision also drew attention when he announced the university is partnering with financial guru Dave Ramsey to help educate student-athletes in the area of personal finance. Ramsey's "Foundations in Personal Finance College Edition" curriculum is now being incorporated into teaching MSU student-athletes the basics of finance.

His attention to detail has also proven to be vital in the hiring process, as he received rave reviews with the hiring of men's basketball coach Ben Howland, who comes to MSU after leading Northern Arizona, Pittsburgh and UCLA to the NCAA Tournament, including 3 straight Final Four appearances with the Bruins.

In addition to engaging with Bulldog fans through personal interactions and social media, Stricklin has also emerged as a regional and national leader in college athletics. He serves as chair of the SEC's Working Group on Fan Experience, and has served as the SEC's representative on the NCAA Division I Leadership Council.

Stricklin certainly wasn't a stranger to the Bulldog family or college athletics when he took over the reins at State in 2010.

A 1992 graduate of Mississippi State, the Jackson, Miss., native's resume is highlighted by 25 years of experience on the collegiate level in various capacities at five different universities. In the two years prior to becoming athletic director, he served as Senior Associate Athletics Director for External Affairs at his alma mater, overseeing fundraising, football and men's basketball scheduling, managing MSU's all-sport agreement with Adidas, facility planning, and serving as the administrative sport liaison for men's basketball and softball.

It was those types of day-to-day tasks that prepared the personable Stricklin to take over the top seat in the Mississippi State athletic department. Yet it's a journey that started during his formative days as a dedicated and tireless worker in the Mississippi State media relations department that has led to his highly-respected career coming full circle.

Prior to graduating, Stricklin's stint in the MSU media relations office included three seasons (1990-92) as the media contact for the nationally-renown baseball program. Upon graduation, he was named Assistant Media Relations Director at his alma mater.

In 1993, he was named Associate Media Relations Director at Auburn, where he served from 1993-98. In 1998, Stricklin left Auburn to become Assistant Athletics Director at Tulane, where he served as the primary media contact for the Green Wave's 1998 12-0 football team. Next came a four-year run in the Big 12 Conference at Baylor (1999-2003) as Assistant AD for Communications and Marketing.

In 2003, Stricklin returned to the Southeastern Conference at Kentucky and spent five seasons as the Associate AD for Media Relations, where he oversaw the day-to-day publicity of the tradition-rich Wildcat basketball program. It was his last stop before returning to Mississippi State in the spring of 2008.

Stricklin, 45, is married to the former Anne Howell, the youngest daughter of Basketball Hall of Fame member Bailey Howell. The couple has two daughters, Abby and Sophie.

# MIKE SANDERS TRACK COMPLEX



On Friday, April 10, 2015, the Mississippi State University track was named the Mike Sanders Track Complex after former track standout Michael W. Sanders.

Over the past four years, the track stadium at MSU has seen many enhancements. A brick grandstand was added in 2013 and holds about 3,000 people.

MSU played host to for the 2015 SEC Outdoor Track and Field Championships on May 14-16 at the newly dedicated Mike Sanders Track Complex. Also during the 2015 season, MSU hosted the Border Clash and the Jace LaCoste Invitational.

## MIKE SANDERS

An MSU alumnus, Sanders began his college career in 1960 after receiving a dual scholarship for football and track and field. His football career was ended due to injuries, but he was able to continue track and field during his time at MSU. In his sophomore year, he and fellow members of the MSU track team competed in and won the 1962 SEC championship. He is a member of the university's M-Club for his achievements in track.

After college Sanders went on to work in the family business, Jimmy Sanders Inc., one of the South's largest agriculture input supply and distribution businesses. Sanders would eventually become president and CEO. Sanders has served on the boards for the Alumni Foundation, the MSU Foundation, and the Bulldog Club. Since graduation with a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education in 1964, Mike has been a member of the MSU Alumni Association and continues ties with his fraternity, Sigma Chi.

In 2014, Sanders was named the Mississippi State National Alumnus of the Year. Today Sanders resides in Cleveland, Miss., with his wife Nan Long Sanders. Together the couple has two children, Michael W. Sanders and Amanda Sanders Turner, along with Sander's daughter Ellen Sanders Voelkel and six grandchildren.

## W.O. SPENCER STADIUM

The dedication of the W.O. Spencer Track Stadium took place on Nov. 13, 1982. Named after two-time Olympian and former Mississippi State track and field athlete W.O. Spencer. His generous donations gave the MSU track program a grandstand that seated 3,500 fans.

Spencer lettered four years in in track and three in cross country under former

coach E.C. "Billy" Hayes. During his time on the track and field team, he served as the 1922 season captain and was the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association mile champion in 1921 and 1922.

In the 1924 Olympic games in Paris, Spencer placed first in the mile relay team and finished third in the steeplechase in the 1928 games in Amsterdam.

After his competition year, Spencer went on to become the MSU track and field coach from 1936 through 1947, minus four years while serving on active military duty.

Spencer was installed in the Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame in Jackson in 1968 and in 1971 was inducted into the MSU Sports Hall of Fame.

## CARL MADDOX TRACK/INFIELD

Work was completed on Mississippi State's \$3.2 million renovation to the Carl Maddox Track at W.O. Spencer Stadium in 2011 in time for several MSU home meets during that spring, including the SEC/Big 10 Challenge in March.

The state-of-the-art facility features nine lanes, a steeplechase water jump and high jump, pole vault and long/triple jump areas, in addition to a javelin runway and shot put, hammer and discus throw rings.
