MATCH NOTES

NO. 25 VOLLEYBALL TREKS TO THE MAGNOLIA STATE

- The No. 25 ranked University of Missouri volleyball team (18-6, 9-3 SEC) wraps its regular-season road slate this weekend with a trip to the Magnolia State. Mizzou will face Ole Miss (16-9, 6-7 SEC) Friday in Oxford before heading to Starkville for a meeting with Mississippi State (10-13, 4-10 SEC) Sunday.
- Match times are set for 6:30 p.m., CT at the Gillom Athletic Performance Center Friday before a 2 p.m., CT SEC road finale at the Newell-Grissom Building.
- Both matches will be featured on SEC Network+. Jake Hromada (play-by-play), Brittney McLaughlin (analyst) and Keiran Lencheski (reporter) will be on the call at Ole Miss.
- MU is ranked in the top-25 for the second-straight week this season. The Tigers previously received votes four times this season (preseason, Sept. 2, Oct. 28 and now Nov. 4) before breaching the top-25 on Nov. 11.
- MU is ranked 22nd this season for RPI (fourth highest SEC school).
- Mizzou welcomed a season-high 6,379 fans to the Hearnest Center Friday (Nov. 15) against Florida. It marked the fifth 3,000-plus match in 2024 and is the fourth-highest Mizzou Volleyball crowd in program history and the largest since Nov. 27, 2013 (vs. Arkansas). MU ranks 21st in the nation for average attendance (3,095) this season.
- The Tigers have matched their SEC (9) and overall win (18) totals from 2023, when Dawn Sullivan was named SEC Coach of the Year. Mizzou last picked up double-digit SEC wins in 2020 with 15.
- The Tigers rank first overall in the SEC for assists per set (13.75, second in NCAA) and kills per set (14.55, fourth in NCAA). Mizzou is also first in the SEC for assists (1,251), kills (1,324). MU is also second in the conference for hitting percentage (.297, eighth in NCAA) and aces (166, 1.82 aces per set).
- In league action, Mizzou is first in the SEC for assists (13.69 assists/set, 671) and kills (14.43 kills/set, 707) while ranking third for aces (1.61 aces/set) and hitting percentage (.275).
- Missouri is fourth in the SEC standings with a 9-3 record behind Texas (10-3 SEC), Florida (11-3 SEC), and Kentucky (12-2).

SERIES HISTORY

- Missouri leads the all-time series with Ole Miss, 18-11. The two teams split the 2023 series with each team winning in their respective building.
- Mizzou overcame Ole Miss in five sets Oct. 15, 2023, before dropping a four-set decision in Oxford, Mississippi, on Oct. 29.
- MU last beat Ole Miss in Oxford, Mississippi, 3-2, and, 3-1, Nov. 20-21, 2020.
- Mizzou leads the all-time series with Mississippi State, 16-4.
- Missouri most recently swept MSU, Nov. 3, 2023, in Columbia, Missouri.
- The Tigers last beat the Bulldogs in Starkville, Mississippi, with a pair of 3-0 sweeps March 24-25, 2021.

FLORIDA RECAP

- Missouri most recently dropped a hard-fought, five-set battle to No. 21 Florida on Nov. 15.
- The Tigers welcomed its fourth-largest crowd in program history (6,379) and the largest crowd since Nov. 27, 2013 (vs. Arkansas, 7,437 fans).
- Mychael Vernon led Mizzou with 17 kills along with seven digs and a block, ace and assist.
- Jordan Iliff logged 14 kills and nine digs in a near double-double. She also added six blocks, two aces and an assist.
- Janet deMarrais was the third Tiger in double-digits offensively with 10.
- Colleen Finney notched a career-best matching seven blocks to go with nine kills (.438) and two digs. It was the second-straight seven-block match for Finney.
- Maya Sands led Missouri defensively with 23 digs, marking her third straight outing exceeding 16 digs. Sands also added four assists Friday.
- Marina Crownover dished out 47 assists, her ninth straight performance with at least 37 assists. The Austin, Texas, native, added six digs, two blocks and a kill.
- Regan Haith finished with seven kills (.308) and four blocks. Haith has posted seven or more kills in two of the last three matches. She has also posted four or more blocks in each of the last four matches.

- Kiaraliz Perez Catala tallied 13 digs Friday. It marked her fourth double-digit dig match as a Missouri Tiger.
- The loss marked the conclusion of a nine-match win streak, which was the longest since the 2016 season where Missouri won 13 in a row (nine SEC matches).

BLOCK PARTY

- Mizzou has registered 11 or more blocks in each of the last two matches.
- MU most recently posted 11 against No. 21 Florida on Nov. 15.
- Colleen Finney notched seven while Jordan Iliff had six followed by Regan Haith (4) and Marina Crownover (2).
- The Tigers registered a season-best 11.5 blocks against South Carolina (Nov. 10).
- The block totals are the most for Missouri since notching 12 against Georgia on Nov. 5, 2023.

DEMARRAIS ON A TEAR

- Janet deMarrais has finished in double-digits attacking in each of the last eight matches.
- She most recently notched 10 kills with a block against No. 21 Florida.
- deMarrais, a junior from Colleyville, Texas, is third on Mizzou offensively with 254 kills (2.79 kills/set) this season (133 kills in SEC play).

COLLEEN FINNEY

- Colleen Finney has totaled a career-best matching seven total blocks in each of the last two matches for Mizzou.
- She most recently notched the feat against No. 21 Florida, adding nine kills (.438) and two digs.
- For Finney, a graduate middle blocker from Blythewood, South Carolina, it marked her fourth time in her career with seven total blocks.
- She has posted five or more kills in each of the last seven matches including 10 kills (.500) against Georgia (Nov. 6) for her second double-digit kill match of the season.
- She is second on Mizzou with 64.0 total blocks (0.72 blocks/set).
- In SEC play, Finney is hitting .387 which ranks fourth in the conference.



MARINA CROWNOVER

- Marina Crownover dished out 47 assists in No. 25 Mizzou's five-set match against No. 21 Florida on Nov. 15. The Austin, Texas, native, added six digs, two blocks and a kill in the top-25 matchup.
- Crownover has registered 37 or more assists in each of the last nine matches.
- The redshirt sophomore setter recorded 57 assists with seven digs, two kills and an ace as Mizzou hit a season-best during SEC play .378 against Georgia (11/6).
- Crownover, the three-time SEC Setter of the Week this season, paces the league during SEC matches with 11.86 assists per set (581 assists). Overall, she is second in the SEC with 10.79 assists/set (863 assists, eighth in SEC).
- Crownover registered a career-best 61 assists at Arkansas (Oct. 25). She has compiled eight double-doubles in 2024 over 18 starts (22 total matches, started in all 12 SEC matches).

JORDAN ILIFF

- Jordan Iliff has finished in double-digits offensively in eight of the last 10 matches. In 2024, she has totaled double-digit kills in all but five matches (19 of 24).
- Iliff most recently logged 14 kills and nine digs against Florida. Iliff also added six blocks, two aces and an assist.
- With two aces, she moved into fourth all-time in Mizzou program history with 58 aces in 2024 (tied with Yvette Buhlig, 1992). Shen Danru registered a program-best 64 aces in 2002.
- Iliff notched a Mizzou program-best nine service aces at Texas A&M (Sept. 29) to go with 15 kills and 10 digs.
- Iliff also reached 500 career digs in the match against Georgia (Nov. 6), tallying her 11th double-double of the season with 18 kills (.371) and 12 digs, two aces, a block and an assist.
- The St. Louis native competed in her 100th career match as a Missouri Tiger at Arkansas (10/25) and surpassed 1,000 career kills and 100 career aces against Alabama on Oct. 11.
- Iliff ranks first in the SEC (third in the NCAA) with 0.64 aces per set and 58 aces (seventh in the NCAA). In SEC-only matches, she is first in the league with 0.59 aces/set (29 aces).
- She is also sixth in the conference for points (424.5, 4.66 points/set, ninth) and ninth for kills (344, 3.78 kills/set, 12th).
- During league play, Iliff has 4.42 points per set (216.5 points) and is averaging 3.53 kills per set (173 kills).

MYCHAEAL VERNON

- Mychael Vernon led No. 25 Mizzou with 17 kills along with seven digs, a block, an ace and an assist in its five-set match against No. 21 Florida on Nov. 15.
- Vernon has registered 14 or more kills in each of the last nine matches.
- She finished with 20 kills on a .349 hitting percentage to pace the Mizzou offense against Georgia (11/6). She also had five digs, two assists, two blocks and an ace.
- Vernon ranks third in the SEC during league play with 4.69 kills per set (230 kills) and 5.19 points per set (254.5 points). Overall, Vernon is third in the SEC for points (435.5)

and total kills (390).

- Vernon notched a career-best 37 kills against Arkansas (10/25) to surpass Paola Ampudia's 35 kills (Oct. 24, 2009, at Kansas) to become MU's single-match program record holder. She also finished with 38.0 points which also is a Mizzou single-match record.
- She was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 30 and has finished in double-digits kills in all but two matches this season (22 of 24).
- She is also 45 kills away from 1,500 in her career.

MAYA SANDS

- Junior Maya Sands led Missouri defensively with 23 digs and four assists against No. 21 Florida (Nov. 15).
- She has totaled 16 or more digs in each of the last three matches. She has also finished with double-digit digs in every match this season.
- Sands leads the SEC during league play with 4.61 digs per set and 226 digs. Overall, in 2024, she is first in the SEC with 4.64 digs per set and second with 422 total digs.
- The Rock Falls, Illinois, native and 2023 SEC Libero of the Year surpassed 1,000 career digs earlier in the season (vs. NC State, Sept. 1) and is 36 digs away from notching 1,000 as a Missouri Tiger.

VOLLEYBALL SIGNS FIVE FOR NATIONAL SIGNING DAY

- Missouri announced Thursday the signing of five student-athletes for National Signing Day. Maca Lobaglio, Paige Felder, Asia Harvey, Ashley Euston, and Zoey Matias have all inked with the Tigers and will head to Missouri ahead of the 2025 campaign.

ABOUT THE TIGERS

- The 2024 campaign marks the second for head coach Dawn Sullivan who led the Tigers to their first NCAA Tournament berth since 2020 as she was selected SEC Coach of the Year this past fall.
- During her first season, Sullivan guided Missouri to an impressive 18-13 mark including a .500 (9-9) record in SEC play, surpassing the Tigers' combined win total from the past two seasons (nine in 2022, five in 2021).
- In SEC play, Missouri went on both three-match and four-match win streaks in 2023, while also securing five wins over top-50 AVCA (based on KPI, Pablo, and RPI rankings) teams and nine wins over top-100 AVCA teams including two ranked wins over Auburn (#23 and #24, Oct. 20 & Nov. 12).
- The eight-win overall improvement from 2022 (nine wins), tied for 12th nationally and ranked second among Power Five institutions.
- Mizzou returns six of seven starters from 2023 including a trio of All-SEC performers in Maya Sands (SEC Libero of the Year), Jordan Iliff and Sierra Dudley. Sands and Iliff also earned AVCA Southeast All-Region recognition.



ABOUT THE TIGERS

- Following Mizzou's trip to Mississippi, the Tigers return home to Columbia to wrap the 2024 regular season.
- MU will host No. 12 Kentucky Wednesday, Nov. 27 for Fansgiving at the Hearn Center. Mizzou then takes on Auburn on Senior Night Saturday, Nov. 30 in the regular-season finale.

Dawn Sullivan was named the eighth volleyball head coach in University of Missouri history, Director of Athletics Desirée Reed-Francois announced Dec. 18, 2022.

Sullivan enters her second year at the helm of the program after leading Mizzou to its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2020, while earning Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year honors for her efforts in the 2023 campaign.

During her first season, Sullivan guided Missouri to an impressive 18-13 mark including a .500 (9-9) record in SEC play, surpassing the Tigers' combined win total from the past two seasons (nine in 2022, five in 2021).

In SEC play, Missouri went on both three-match and four-match win streaks in 2023, while also securing five wins over top-50 AVCA (based on KPI, Pablo, and RPI rankings) teams and nine wins over top-100 AVCA teams including two ranked wins over Auburn (#23 and #24, Oct. 20 & Nov. 12).

The eight-win overall improvement from 2022 (nine wins), tied for 12th nationally and ranked second among Power Five institutions and helped propel Missouri to the NCAA Tournament. The Tigers secured a first-round win over Delaware before being eliminated by top-seed Nebraska.

Under her guidance, three Tigers earned All-SEC honors, while two received 2023 AVCA Southeast All-Region recognition.

Sophomore libero Maya Sands was named SEC Libero of the Year and selected to the All-SEC Team. Additionally, she also earned a spot on the 2023 Southeast All-Region Team. Sands paced the SEC with a career-best 542 digs (4.71 digs/set) in 2023. She ranked 32nd in the NCAA for digs and produced double-digit digs in every match of Mizzou's regular season (29 of 31 total matches).

Junior right side Jordan Iliff was also tabbed as an All-SEC team member, after leading the Tigers in 2023 with a career-best 388 kills (3.40 kills/set, 10th in the SEC), which ranked seventh in the SEC. She also accounted for 468 of Mizzou's points (4.11 points/set, eighth in the SEC) for sixth in the league. Iliff was also named an AVCA Southeast All-Region Honorable Mention for her play in 2023.

Freshman setter Sierra Dudley made her way onto the seven-member All-Freshman Team. Dudley posted 20 or more assists in 17 straight matches in 2023, with nine or more assists in every SEC contest including 30 or more assists in 14-straight matches from Sept. 24 to Nov. 12. She was the top true freshman setter in the conference in 2023.

Sullivan was recognized for Missouri's impressive improvement in 2023, earning SEC Coach of the Year along with Jason Watson of Arkansas, Craig Skinner of Kentucky and Eve Rackham Watt of Tennessee.

Sullivan is the third Missouri Volleyball Coach to earn the award after Wayne Kreklow earned the distinction in 2013 and 2016. The Coach of the Year honor is the third in Sullivan's career and her second straight after being tabbed Mountain West Coach of the Year in 2020 and 2022.

Sullivan took over the Tigers program after five seasons as the head coach at UNLV, where she boasted a 109-38 (.741) mark as a head coach. She led the Rebels to the 2022 Mountain West Conference Championship, five-straight postseason appearances and 20 or more wins in four of five seasons, including 54 victories over the last two seasons.

An All-America player at Kansas State, Sullivan has spent all but five years of her career in the Midwest with coaching stints at Iowa State and Illinois State.

Sullivan, named Mountain West Coach of the Year twice, left UNLV as the second most winningest coach in program history with 109 wins. She was the fastest to break the 100-win plateau, achieving the feat in just 136 matches. The Rebels won the Mountain West Championship in spring 2021 and fall 2022 and were the winners of the 2021 National Invitational Volleyball Championship. Overall, she led UNLV to five-straight postseason appearances, including NCAA bids in 2020 and 2022.

AT UNLV (2018-22)

The 2022 UNLV squad won the Mountain West regular-season title and qualified for the NCAA Tournament. The Rebels went 17-1 in conference play, beating the longest win streak in program history, which was 12 wins in-a-row, set in the shortened Spring 2021 season.

Sullivan was named the 2022 MWC Coach of the Year while Isabel Martin was awarded the league's Player of the Year and Jhenna Gabriel earned MWC Newcomer of the Year. Martin, Gabriel, and Gabrielle Arrette-Ramos were selected first-team all-conference, and Jordyn Freeman was an Honorable Mention honoree.

Martin was also named an American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) All-America Honorable Mention and selected to the AVCA's 2022 Pacific South All-Region Team.

Statistically speaking, UNLV ended the season ranked 12th in the NCAA for match win-loss percentage with .839, sat 28th in hitting percentage (.263), 30th for kills per set (13.85) and 44th in the nation for assists per set with 12.71. The Rebels ranked second in the MWC for hitting efficiency (.263), second for both assists per set (12.71) and in kills per set (13.85), they also sat third for digs with 14.42 per set.

Sullivan helped Mariena Hayden become the program's first back-to-back conference player of the year (Spring 2021 & Fall 2021 Mountain West), as well as American Volleyball Coaches Association Honorable Mention All-American and Pacific South All-Region Team honoree for back-to-back seasons. Moreover, Hayden has also become only the fourth Rebel to be tabbed an all-conference team performer three straight years.

Additionally, Kate Brennan was named to the all-conference team in Spring 2021 after being an honorable mention selection the previous two seasons. Macy Smith was also named to the Spring 2021 All-MW Team, while Shelby Capltonch garnered Honorable Mention status.

During the Spring 2021 season, Sullivan guided the Rebels to the best start in program history (13-0) and, in turn, extended the longest win streak to 13 matches after the team's win over Illinois State in the first round of the



NCAA Championship. Unfortunately, the streak was snapped in the second round of the tournament by eventual national champion and No. 2 seed Kentucky.

During the Fall 2021 season, Sullivan helped the Rebels to the best single-season record in program history with 28 wins, including the 2021 NIVC title.

The Rebels led the MW in five statistical categories in 2021, sitting atop the conference in aces per set, assists per set, hitting percentage, kills per set and winning percentage. Meanwhile, they were 32nd or better in all five of those, including sixth in hitting percentage (.298) and seventh in winning percentage (.929). Hayden led the country in aces per set and in service aces.

Sullivan became the fastest coach in program history to 50 wins - with a victory over San Jose State on March 19, 2021 - doing so in only 73 tries. Her 42 combined victories during the 2018 and 2019 seasons were the most in that time frame for any head coach at UNLV. Additionally, those 22- and 20-win totals from years one and two, respectively, matched the most 20-win seasons by a Rebel head coach, tying Allison Keeley (2004-10) and Cindy Frederick (2011-17).

In Sullivan's first season at the helm of the Rebel program, she led the Scarlet & Gray to an overall record of 22-12 and a fifth-place finish (10-8) in the Mountain West. The team earned an at-large berth in the NIVC and advanced to the semifinals after it defeated UC Irvine, Fresno State and Portland. Coincidentally, the final match of the year took place against her old squad, the Iowa State Cyclones in Ames, Iowa.

Delving deeper, those 22 wins in 2019 helped UNLV post a plus-14-win differential from the previous season's eight-win haul, which marked the largest improvement by an NCAA Division squad that season.

The Rebels concluded 2019 ranked in the top 100 of eight different NCAA statistical categories, such as: first in aces (251), third in aces per set (1.93), 38th in team kills (1,655), 61st in team assists (1,526), 66th in hitting percentage (.235), 67th in team total attacks (4,369), 80th in winning percentage (.647) and 99th in team digs (1,827).

Individually, Hayden led the NCAA in aces (114) and aces per set (0.90) and finished the year second overall in points (690.0), fifth in points per set (5.43) and 10th in total kills (543). Hayden's 114 aces were not only a UNLV single-season record, but they were the third most recorded by an NCAA student-athlete since the 25-point scoring format was adopted in 2008.

Sullivan earned her first career win against Southern Utah, a 3-0 sweep of the Thunderbirds, during the season-opening UNLV Invitational on Aug. 24, 2019. With the addition of 21 more triumphs, she became the second-winningest first-year coach in program history with 22.

In 2019, UNLV began the season slowly with a 4-9 showing before it turned things around with a nine-match win streak that evolved into a run of 16 wins in 18 contests to finish to the campaign. In all, the Rebels went 20-11 overall and finished third in the MW behind a 15-3 mark.

After opening the conference portion of the season with a pair of losses to Wyoming and then-No. 17 Colorado State, UNLV began 16-2 stretch with a 3-1 win at San Diego State, which was the catalyst to rewriting four single-season records: 15 conference wins, eight conference wins, eight-match road win streak and eight-match conference road win streak.

Statistically speaking, UNLV was ranked in the top 100 nine times: second in aces (241), fifth in aces per set (1.88), 21st in team kills (1,688) and team

assists (1,568), 52nd in team total attacks (4,358), 71st in hitting percentage (.233), 79th in winning percentage (.645), 83rd in assists per set (12.25) and 85th in kills per set (13.19).

Once again, Hayden excelled under Sullivan's tutelage, finishing the 2019 campaign first in aces per set (0.69), third in service aces (70), 39th in points per set (4.70), 78th in kills per set (3.76) and 80th in points (479.5) despite missing time due to an injury.

AS A PLAYER

Sullivan was a standout player at K-State from 1996-99, helping lead the Wildcats to their first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance in 1996 - the first of four straight during her playing career. She earned second-team All-America honors in 1999 and was inducted into the Wildcats' Athletics Hall of Fame in 2016.

Sullivan totaled total of 1,611 kills and 1,258 digs, which rank as the third and fourth-most, respectively, in Kansas State program history. She is one of only five KSU players to record 1,000 kills and 1,000 digs in a career.

As a senior, she served as a team captain and was later named an All-American and to the All-Big 12 Team. She also earned Academic All-Big 12 honors in each of her four years. Following graduation, Sullivan played professionally for the Grand Rapids Force of the United States Professional Volleyball League.

Sullivan and her husband, Josh, have three daughters (Katie, Sarah, and Emily) and one son (Matthew).

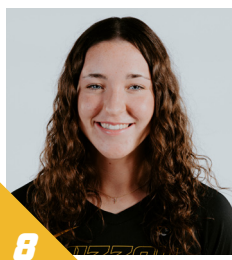
