



2005 SEASON IN REVIEW

Mississippi State University's volleyball program made significant gains and reached numerous noteworthy milestones during the 2005 campaign, State's second under the leadership of Tina Seals.

The Volleyball Bulldogs posted a 15-12 mark, their first winning season since 2000 and their second in the last 13 seasons.

A strong stretch run finish by the Bulldogs helped Mississippi State set a school record for wins in Southeastern Conference play. State claimed four of its last six league battles to finish the year with a 6-10 Southeastern Conference record, bettering the school record-tying five-win showing in league play from 2004. During that '05 stretch MSU notched back-to-back-to-back conference wins for the first time in school history. Of perhaps greater significance, State claimed its highest league finish in school history --- seventh place --- and advanced to the SEC Tournament for the first time since 1998, the last season before the tournament became an eight-team event.

For the first time in school history Mississippi State played all 12 of its home matches at the Newell-Grissom Building, including the 2005 MSU/Microtel Classic. The Bulldogs notched wins in seven of their 12 home contests, a record for wins in nine seasons at the Newell-Grissom Building and two wins shy of tying the overall school record for MSU home-court victories.

With a roster that featured five returning starters and a host of talented new players, Mississippi State opened the year with a nine-match win streak, capturing the championships of tournaments hosted by Virginia Tech and Dayton and taking runner-up honors in the MSU/Microtel Classic. Cooper and Orshi Kriegel represented MSU on the all-tournament team with Kriegel earning MVP honors at the Hokie Fall Invitational in Blacksburg, Va. A week later in Dayton, Ohio, Orshi Kriegel, her sister Eva, and Rachel Cooper made the all-tournament team at the Marriott Flyer Invitational, with Cooper claiming her first career tourney MVP award. Jamie Joyner and Cooper earned all-tourney honors at the MSU/Microtel Classic. The Bulldogs, who opened the year with a No. 155 national computer ranking (RickKern.com), zipped to a school-best No. 66 ranking and remained in the top 100 for much of the first half of the season thanks to a 9-1 start in non-conference play.

The Bulldogs opened SEC competition on the homecourt against perennial league power Florida, claiming the opening

game in a 3-1 loss to the sixth-ranked Gators. State's win in the opening game snapped a string of 18 consecutive straight-set UF wins in the series. The Bulldogs blanked Auburn for their first league win Oct. 7, registered a pair of shutouts against instate rival Mississippi for their second straight series sweep of the Rebels, and sandwiched a pair of wins over Georgia around a home schedule-ending win over SEC West co-champ LSU. It marked the first time MSU had topped Georgia twice in one season since 1979, with the 3-2 win in Athens on the final weekend nailing down a No. 7 league finish and an SEC Tournament berth for Mississippi State.

State's stay in the 2005 SEC Tournament in Tuscaloosa, Ala., was a brief one. The Bulldogs dropped a straight-sets decision to one of the league's top clubs, defending SEC champ and No. 2 tournament seed Tennessee.

There were many who contributed to the Bulldogs' success on the volleyball court in 2005, but none played a more prominent role than did senior outside hitter Rachel Cooper.

The Roscoe, Ill., native sparked the MSU offense with a team-leading 387 kills, eighth-most in the Southeastern Conference and ranked second on the MSU defense with 254 digs. A solid candidate for all-conference honors, Cooper concluded her MSU career ranked third in both kills (1,405) and attack attempts (4,131) and claimed career top 10 status in both digs and service aces.

Leading the way among Mississippi State's talented newcomers was sophomore Eva Kriegel, younger sister of State's talented outside hitter Orshi Kriegel. The younger of the Hungarian-born Kriegel sisters earned a place in the MSU record book after becoming the first player in State's 31-year volleyball history to register multiple triple-doubles in a season. Eva Kriegel, who took over as MSU's starting setter, hit the double digit mark in kills, assists and digs in a match four times. Older sister Orshi recorded a triple-double in 2005 as well, giving MSU's first sister tandem five of the program's seven triple-double performances.

A handful of Bulldogs joined team kills leader Rachel Cooper in team-leading statistical totals in 2005. Middle blocker Erin Seago fashioned a superb team-best .319 hitting percentage, ninth-highest in the SEC. Orshi Kriegel paced the club with 598 assists and helped MSU rank first in the league at the service stripe for the second straight year when she piled up 47 aces, third-most by an SEC player in '05. Libero Megan Lukasek led the MSU defense with 395 digs, seventh-most in the SEC, while Nicole Palazzo led MSU charge at the net with 14 solo blocks, 78

assists and 92 total blocks.

Mississippi State volleyball's tradition of excellence in academics crew in 2005 with five players — Rachel Cooper, Jamie Joyner, Orshi Kriegel, Andrea Mead and Erin Seago earning SEC Volleyball Academic Honor Roll honors. Underclassmen Nicole Palazzo and Lialah Putman claimed positions on the SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll while Cooper, Joyner, Kriegel and Seago qualified for ESPN The Magazine Academic All-American team consideration.
