SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

Mississippi State University is a charter member of the Southeastern Conference, a pioneer in the integration of higher education and athletic competition and a national leader as intercollegiate athletics marches on into the 21st century.

The SEC, with its storied 74-year history of athletic achievements and academic excellence, has built perhaps the greatest tradition of any intercollegiate athletic league in the nation since the conference's inception in 1933.

Centrally headquartered in Birmingham, Ala., the Southeastern Conference is comprised of 12 universities that span a nine-state area, conducting championships in 11 women's and nine men's sports. The member schools are split into two divisions. Mississippi State is joined in the SEC West by in-state rival Mississippi, Louisiana State, Alabama, Auburn and Arkansas. The SEC's Eastern Division features Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, South Carolina, Tennessee and Vanderbilt. All but Arkansas and South Carolina were among 13 charter members of the SEC, with those schools joining the league for competition in 1991-92.

Since the Southeastern Conference conducted its first volleyball championship tournament in 1979, the sport has enjoyed steady growth in both popularity and strength. During the decade of the 1990s SEC volleyball blossomed into a formidable force on the national scene, and in 2005 a league record-six SEC teams — Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Kentucky, Louisiana State and Tennessee — advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

The conference has sent at least two teams to the NCAA Tournament in every season the last 16 years, with an SEC team reaching NCAA volleyball's Final Four nine times of the last 15 seasons and came within a win of Final Four placement four times over that span.

In 2005, perennial power Florida captured its 12th Southeastern Conference Tournament Championship, claimed its 15th overall league title and made its 16th appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

But the Gators did not carry the league banner alone into NCAA postseason play. Tennessee, which shared the '04 league title with Florida, represented also represented the SEC East as did Kentucky, making its first postseason trip since 1993. SEC West co-champs Arkansas and Louisiana State along with Alabama also made the 2005 NCAA tourney field.

Since the inaugu-

ral SEC volleyball championship in 1979-80, many changes have occurred in the conference with volleyball. The addition of Arkansas and South Carolina to the league in 1991 brought the divisional format to the sport with five teams competing in the Eastern Division and six teams in the Western Division. The most significant change in recent years came in 1999 with the league adopting an eight-team format for its three-day conference tournament. In 2002 the SEC began a 16-match league scheduling format. The league scheduling evolves further this fall when the SEC expands its conference schedule to 20 matches and discontinues the season-ending league tournament.

Volleyball has enjoyed a steady increase in popularity and interest in the Southeastern Conference, mirroring the sport's growth nationwide. Exposure for SEC volleyball got a major boost in 1995 when Southeastern Conference volleyball made its debut on SEC-TV (FOX Sports Net South, FOX Sports Net Southwest and Sun Network) on a tape-delay basis.

That coverage has grown in recent years to include live telecasts of regular season matches along with the broadcast of the SEC Tournament championship match. SEC-TV telecasts are beamed to more than 22 million cable subscribers in the SEC's nine-state region.

SEC coaches and administrators voted to discontinue the league's postseason tournament for 2006, ending a 27-year for the event. This year's regular season league champ will earn the Southeastern Conference's automatic qualifying berth for the 2006 NCAA Tournament.

More about SEC Volleyball...

- The 2005 season marked the 16th consecutive season in which the SEC has placed at least two teams in the NCAA Tournament. a record-breaking six SEC volleyball teams advanced to NCAA postseason play in 2005, bettering the previous league-high of four teams.
- Nine of 11 SEC teams posted double-digit win totals in 2005, with five reaching 20 wins or better. Florida led the way with 33 victories.
- Florida made its 16th NCAA tournament appearance and its 15th straight in 2005.
- Eight SEC players earned AVCA All-America team honors in 2005 while nine earned all-district plaudits.
- In the past 15 years, 837 student-athletes have earned selection to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

2006 SEC VOLLEYBALL ON SEC-TV

Five regular season matchups involving eight of the SEC's 11 teams are included in this fall's SEC volleyball television lineup on SEC-TV.

Mississippi State is featured on this fall's TV slate, for SEC volleyball its sixth SEC-TV appearance in the last nine seasons. The Bulldogs travel to Columbia, S.C., October 15 for an interdivisional meeting with the South Carolina Gamecocks.

SEC-TV is broadcast on FOX Sports Net South, FOX Sports Net Southwest and the Florida-based Sun Network, reaching more than 22 million households throughout the region.
