Tina (Burcham) Seals, who during her collegiate career became one of Mississippi State University's first standout volleyball performers, is in her third season as head coach of the Volleyball Bulldogs.

Seals joined the Mississippi State University Athletic Department family in March 2004, becoming the ninth head coach in the program's 32-year history.

Over the span of two short seasons, the Florence, Ala., native has engineered an impressive resurgence in the Mississippi State volleyball program.

In her first season at the MSU helm Seals guided the Bulldogs to one of the program's biggest turnarounds. Inheriting a team that posted a 3-23 showing in 2003, Seals directed her initial Mississippi State team to a 14-16 overall worksheet in 2004, an 11-win improvement. That team, picked by league coaches for a last place finish in the rugged Southeastern Conference, tied a school record with five league wins and finished tied for eighth in the overall league standings, just missing a berth in the eight-team field of the SEC tournament.

MSU was ranked No. 267 nationally by RichKern.com prior to the start of the '04 campaign and finished at No. 156.

Seals' 2005 edition climbed further up the ladder, posting a 15-12 worksheet, the program's seventh winning campaign in 31 seasons and only its second in 13 seasons. Along the way the Bulldogs established a school record with six SEC wins and earned the school's first berth in the SEC Tournament since qualification standards were put in place following the 1998 season.

During the '05 season RichKern.com ranked the Bulldogs as high as No. 66 --- the highest in-season national ranking ever for a Mississippi State volleyball. After spending much of the year ranked in the top 100, State finished the year at No. 111, also a school-best. The '06 Bulldogs begin the year with a Pablo system ranking of No. 77.

Prior to coming to MSU Seals enjoyed a highly-successful 12-year run as head volleyball coach at Northwest-Shoals Community College in Muscle Shoals, Ala.

A native of Florence, Ala., she launched her coaching career at Northwest-Shoals Community College in 1992, the inaugural year for the sport at NW-SCC. She quickly built the program into a perennial power in the Alabama junior college ranks, compiling a remarkable 444-137 record (.764) in 12 seasons.



Seals' first team posted a 28-12 record and finished runner-up in Alabama. Her teams won 30 or more matches over the next 11 seasons, first eclipsing the 40-win mark with a 47-7 mark in 1999 and later re-setting the school win record with a 51-5 worksheet in 2001.

Her final Northwest-Shoals team compiled a 40-15 record, captured the Alabama state championship and advanced to the 2003 NJCAA tournament.

Seals teams dominated the junior college scene in Alabama. In 12 seasons the Patriots claimed seven state titles and registered four second place finishes. Her last five teams concluded play with top 20 rankings, including the 2000 edition that posted a 47-9 record and a school-highest No. 2 national ranking.

Seals guided the Patriots to the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Division I or



Division II national volleyball tournament seven times during her term there. And she directed NW-SCC to top 10 national rankings in three of her last five seasons at Northwest-Shoals.

Eight players coached by Seals have been accorded All-America team honors 10 times during Seals' term at Northwest-Shoals, including Anisha Hill, a two-time first-team All-American selection in 2002 and 2003. Ten of her players also earned Academic All-America team honors.

Seals' accomplishments have not gone unnoticed. She has been honored as the Tachikara/AVCA Regional Coach of the Year in 1999, 2000 and 2002 and seven times has received the Alabama Junior College Coach of the Year award. During her term at NW-SCC Seals tutored nearly 50 players that advanced their volleyball careers with athletic scholarships at four-year colleges and universities.

Seals signed a volleyball scholarship with Mississippi State University in 1981 following a stellar prep career at Bradshaw High School, where she was a three-sport athlete. She earned all-state honors in volleyball and also competed in basketball and on the BHS track team.

She was recruited

to Mississippi State by coach Gina Jacobellis and played her first two seasons at MSU for coach Lynn Keiser (1981 and 1982). Seals concluded her playing career competing her final two seasons for coach Vivian Langley, becoming one of MSU's initial four-year letterwinners in volleyball. She served as team captain in 1982, 1983 and 1984.

Following her sophomore season she was selected to play for the touring Athletes in Action volleyball team that competed in China and Japan in the summer of 1983. The successful AIA Asian tour helped advance her career and set the stage for a career-best senior season at Mississippi State in 1984, a season in which she paced the Bulldogs with 387 kills and a .316 hitting percentage, still the fourth-best single season hitting mark in 29 seasons of Mississippi State volleyball. For her exploits Seals was accorded first-team All-Southeastern Conference honors as a senior, becoming the first Mississippi State player to earn such distinction.

The MSU standout was also a member of the MSU softball team during her college career, earning a varsity letter as an outfielder in 1983.

Seals got her first taste of coaching as an undergraduate assistant on Langley's MSU volleyball staff in 1985 team before earning a bachelor's degree in civil engineering in 1987.

Following

graduation she worked four years as an engineer with the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA). Her involvement with volleyball continued during that span when she formed and directed a club volleyball program in Muscle Shoals. She later earned her master's degree in math education at the University of North Alabama in 1994.

During her MSU career she met and married Tony Seals, a native of Winfield, Ala., and a 1986 graduate of Mississippi State University. They are the parents of a daughter, Tracey Marie, a sophomore at Starkville High School.

Jozsef Forman is in his third season on the Mississippi State volleyball coaching staff, having joined the Volleyball Bulldogs' coaching team in July 2004.

A native of Bonyhad, Hungary, Forman is a veteran of 15 seasons of coaching volleyball. Regarded as one of the sports' top tacticians, Forman came to Starkville from Waco, Texas, where he served in 2003 as an assistant coach at Baylor University.

At Mississippi State, Forman works primarily with Bulldog setters. He also assists with the coordination and evaluation of team practices, directs opponent scouting and tape exchange, team travel, and oversees MSU's international recruiting efforts.

Prior to his coaching stint at Baylor, Forman established himself as one of Europe's top volleyball coaches during a successful coaching run at the international level.

During 1990, 1991, 1994 and 1999 his club teams finished among the top eight in the European Championships and won the Central European Championship in 2000.

He returned to his native Hungary this summer to serve as head coach of the Hungarian Men's National Team, which defeated Serbia-Montenegro, runners-up in 2005 World League Championships.

Forman, 40, also enjoyed a successful two-year term as head coach for the Hungarian Junior National Team in 1992 and 1993 before taking the helm of the Hungarian Women's National Team for four years. His 1993 Junior National Team finished 10th in the 1992 European Championship and went on to place fifth in the World Championship held in Brazil.

Four years later he guided the Hungarian Senior National Team to wins over host Canada, Germany, and the United States en route to a first-place finish in the 1997 Canada Cup.

After graduating from Semmelweis University in Hungary in 1989, Forman began his coaching career as the head coach of the Vasas Sports Club. He guided that team to the 1990 Hungarian Cup title and a fifth-place finish in the European Championships. A year later, while serving on the staff with famed Chinese coach Sun De Lee, Forman's Vasas team again captured the Hungarian Cup and posted another fifth-place finish in the European Championships.

He then returned to his alma mater, Semmelweis University, where he served from 1991 until 1999 as an assistant professor in physical education and sports sciences. During his first two years there he coached the Budapest school's volleyball team, posting top eight finishes in the Hungarian Championships in both 1992 and 1993.

Forman returned to club volleyball coaching the next season, guiding Tungsram Sport Club to a runner-up finish in the Hungarian Championships and a fifth-place finish in the European Championships. He later coached three seasons with Budapest's BSE Club (1996 to 1999) and then established the NrK-Nyregyhaza Club, developing a team that became middle Europe's top women's volleyball club. Forman's teams claimed both the Hungarian Championship and the Hungarian Cup three years running (2000, 2001 and 2002).

Prior to beginning his coaching career Forman played volleyball 10 years with the U. Dozsa Sport Club (1978 to 1983) and the Hungarian University of Physical Education team (1984 to 1988).

He is married to the former Agnes Hargitai of Budapest, Hungary, and they have two sons — Peter, 12, and Adam, 9.



In his second season on the Mississippi State volleyball coaching staff is Alabama native Chris Cothran.

Cothran, 35, with more than 15 years experience in coaching and athletic administration, is in his second coaching association with MSU head coach Tina Seals.

At Mississippi State Cothran oversees individual skill development. He also serves as MSU's national recruiting coordinator, is the primary staff liaison with the office of athletic academics and assists with the operations of the MSU volleyball camps.

He previously served for four years (2000 to 2003) as an assistant coach on Seals' staff at Northwest-Shoals (Ala.) Community College. At NW-Shoals he helped guide the Patriots to four consecutive NJCAA Region XXII volleyball championships while posting a 162-34 combined regular season record over the four-year span.

He served from 2001 until 2003 as volleyball commissioner at the Alabama Sports Festival in Mobile, Ala. Over the past seven years Cothran has been active on the volleyball camp circuit, serving as a camp coach or clinician at more than 80 volleyball camps and clinics in Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia, Indiana, Illinois, Virginia and Texas.

Prior to joining Tina Seals' coaching staff at Northwest-Shoals, Cothran launched his coaching career at his high school alma mater in Centre, Ala., Cherokee County High School. There he served as assistant volleyball coach from 1997 to 1999, helping CCHS to three straight Elite Eight and state top five finishes, and as an assistant basketball coach in 1999 and 2000.

He served as president of the Shorter College club volleyball team in Rome, Ga., (1990 to 1993) and coached teams in both Jacksonville, Ala. (1998) and Muscle Shoals, Ala. (2003). He worked in a variety of capacities with the Boys and Girls Clubs of Rome, Ga. (1991 to 1996, 1998) and in Gainesville, Ga. (1996-97). In recognition of his work with the Boys and Girls Clubs, he was selected as an Olympic Torchbearer prior to the 1996 Olympic games in Atlanta. He served as the executive director of the summer youth program in Centre, Ala., in 1999.

Cothran earned a bachelor of science degree in general studies at Shorter College in 2001.

Since leaving Northwest-Shoals, Cothran worked as an individual trainer for volleyball players in the Muscle Shoals area, developed and conducted team and individual volleyball camps and launched two new club volleyball teams in Northern Alabama.

He is married to the former Melissa Lehman of Wadesville, Ind., and they are the parents of a daughter, Elena "Ellie" Camille, born April 1, 2006.

Overseeing the publicity needs of the Volleyball Bulldogs is Joe Dier, who this year begins his 21st year on the Mississippi State Athletic Department staff and his 11th as the primary media relations contact for the Bulldog volleyball program.

Dier, 53, has been affiliated with Mississippi State athletics since 1978. A 1975 graduate of Mississippi State University, Dier followed the late Bob Hartley and Bo Carter as MSU's third full-time sports information director in November 1986, initially serving as the primary media contact for all 15 Mississippi State sports.

He served as media coordinator for MSU-hosted NCAA regional baseball tournaments in 1987, 1988, 1989, 1990 and 1992 and for MSU's 1991 Liberty Bowl football team. In 1992 Dier began a four-year term as editor of the weekly athletic department publication *Dawgs' Bite*, returning to sports information work in July 1996.

Born in Baton Rouge, La., Dier is the son of a career Air Force chaplain and traveled extensively with his family to military assignments in Washington, British Columbia, Oregon, Alabama, Florida, Okinawa, Mississippi and Alaska.

He is married to the former Kim Monroe of Starkville, a teacher in the Starkville public schools, and they are the parents of a son, Reed Burton, age 15, is a sophomore at Starkville High School.



During the later portion of her stay in the Jackson area, Moore also served on the women's softball coaching staff at Belhaven College during the 1998 and 1999 seasons. In addition to her coaching and recruiting duties with the Blazers, she served as tutor coordinator for Belhaven's department of athletics.

Moore also serves as academic counselor for MSU men's basketball, men's and women's tennis, and men's and women's cross country/track and field teams.
