MISSISSIPPI STATE CONTINUES HOMESTAND WITH IN-STATE ALCORN STATE

- Mississippi State and Alcorn State will tip off for the 13th time in program history on Sunday.
- Mississippi State last played and defeated Alcorn State, 77-42, inside Humphrey Coliseum in the 2023-24 season opener on Nov. 6, 2023.
- Mississippi State leads the series 10-2 overall and 7-1 inside Humphrey Coliseum. Including Sunday, the last seven meetings between the two programs have come at home for Mississippi State.
- Mississippi State has won the last five games in the series. With a win on Sunday, Mississippi State will have won nine of the last 10.
- Including Sunday, the two in-state programs have only faced each other five times since the 1984-85 season with three of the five meetings occurring since the 2021-22 season.
- Graduate student guard Jerkaila Jordan recorded 26 points and a career-high 13 rebounds for her fifth-career double-double at the time in the meeting with Alcorn State last season on Nov. 6, 2023. Jordan was one of three players Jessika Carter and Erynn Barnum to record double-doubles in the game.
- Mississippi State recorded 70 rebounds in last season's meeting with Alcorn State, outrebounding their opponent 70-34, the most rebounds under Head Coach Sam Purcell and the second-highest single-game total in program history.
- Mississippi State looks to dominate inside against Alcorn State after it recorded a 33-5 advantage in second-chance points and 42-18 in points in the paint against the Lady Braves last season.

MISSISSIPPI STATE IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY UNDER PURCELL

- Mississippi State is 18-1 in non-conference home games inside Humphrey Coliseum under Head Coach Sam Purcell.
- Mississippi State has won eight of its last nine non-conference games (excluding SEC Tournament) dating back to the 2023-24 season.
- Mississippi State is 29-6 in non-conference games overall (excluding SEC Tournament) under Purcell.

MISSISSIPPI STATE VS THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI

- Mississippi State makes it a point of emphasis to try to play Division I programs within the state of Mississippi. Not including SEC opponent Ole Miss, Mississippi State has played the other Mississippi Division I programs 28 times since 2010. Mississippi State owns a 27-1 record.
- Mississippi State has faced four of the five other Division 1 women's basketball programs in the state under Purcell Ole Miss (1-3), Alcorn State (1-0), Mississippi Valley State (2-0), Jackson State (1-0).
- Since 2010, Mississippi State owns a 49-9 record against ALL Division I programs in Mississippi.
- Mississippi State will play Alcorn State and Ole Miss in 2024-25.

JORDAN PRIMED FOR FINAL STATEMENT

- Graduate student guard Jerkaila Jordan returns for her fourth season at Mississippi State, fifth overall, after she was named to the 2024 All-SEC Second Team and averaged 16.2 points, 5.9 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 2.1 steals on 44.5 percent from the field (213-479), 33.3 percent from three (40-120) and 79.1 percent from the free throw line (102-129) in 30.8 minutes per game in 2023-24.
- Her points, rebounds, assists, steals, blocks and minutes totals in 2023-24 were all career-highs.
- Jordan earned a spot on the 2025 Preseason Coaches' All-SEC Second Team on Oct. 24, a list that is voted on by the conference head coaches. She has been named to the Preseason Coaches' All-SEC list each of the last two seasons.
- Jordan was the only player in the SEC to average at least 15.0 points (16.2), 5.0 rebounds (5.9), 2.0 assists (2.4) and 2.0 steals (2.1) per game in 2023-24.
- Jordan's 16.2 points per game ranked 10th, her 2.1 steals per game were sixth and her 568 total points finished fourth in the SEC in 2023-24. Her 16.2 points and 2.1 steals per game are each the fourth-best returning mark in the SEC in 2024-25.
- Jordan averaged 24.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists, 2.5 steals and 2.0 blocks on 50.0 percent from the field (20-40) and 44.4 percent from three (4-9) against top-10 opponents (at No. 1/1 SC. vs. No. 9/9 LSU) in 2023-24.
- Jordan averaged 17.5 points, 6.4 rebounds, 2.2 assists and 1.8 steals in 30.4 minutes per game in 18 non-conference games (excluding the SEC Tournament game) in 2023-24.
- She stands seventh with 203 steals (three steals shy of sole possession of sixth - Lisa Scott, 205), ninth with 137 threes made (two threes shy of sole possession of eighth - Meadow Overstreet, 138) and 12th with 1,358 points (43 points shy sole possession of 11th -Morgan Williams, 1,400) in Mississippi State career ranks. Her career average of 2.1 steals per game is fifth in program history.
- Jordan was the only Bulldog to start all 35 games in 2023-24. She has started all 98 games at Mississippi State from 2021-24, and all 125 in her career.
- She recorded a team-high plus/minus ratio of +303 in 2023-24.
- Jordan has scored 10 or more points in 91 of 125 career games (72.8 percent).

POWE PRIMED FOR JUNIOR SEASON JUMP

- Junior guard/forward Debreasha Powe enters her third season at Mississippi State after she was one of three players in the SEC in 2023-24 and the latest Mississippi State player since Andra Espinoza-Hunter in 2018-19 to knock down 65-plus threes on a 40.0 percent or better rate.
- Alabama's Aaliyah Nye and South Carolina's Te-Hina Paopao are the only other players in the SEC to connect on 65-plus threes at a 40.0 percent of better rate in 2023-24.
- Powe posted 16 points on 6-10 from the field and 4-7 from three-point range, in addition to seven rebounds in a team-high 31 minutes in the season opener against Memphis on Nov. 7. She also recorded team-highs with four assists and three blocks. The four made threes marks her 14th career game with three or more
- Powe has finished top-five on the team in plus/minus ratio each season (+188 in 2023-24 (5th), +358 in 2022-23 (1st)) and led Mississippi State with a plus/minus of +36 in the season opener against Memphis on Nov. 7.
- Powe has started nearly every game since her true freshman season, in which she was named to the 2023 All-SEC Freshman Team. She has started 67 of 68 games played in, missing the only

- game of her career against Mississippi Valley State on Dec. 29, 2023, in three seasons under Head Coach Sam Purcell.
- Her 66 threes in 2023-24 were a team best and ranked fourth in the SEC. It was a 28 threes made increase after she hit 42 in 2022-23.
- Her 40.0 percent from three was a team best, ranked third in the SEC and was a +9.8 percent increase from her freshman season.
- Powe's field-goal percentage (41.2 from 39.5), three-point percentage (40.0 from 30.2), free-throw percentage (78.1 from 76.5) and points per game (8.9 from 8.2) all improved from her freshman to sophomore season.
- With 112 career threes made, Powe is now only eight threes shy from entering the top-10 (nine shy of sole possession of 10th -Stacie Farris, 120) in program history in threes made.
- Powe averaged 8.9 points, 3.3 rebounds, 1.0 assists on 41.2 percent from the field (105-255), 40.0 percent from three (66-165) and 78.1 percent from the free throw line (25-32) in 26.5 minutes per game in 2023-24. Her 8.9 points per game ranked fifth on the team, while her 26.5 minutes were fourth.

RUSSELL READY TO BREAK OUT

- Graduate student quard/forward Eniya Russell reintroduced herself to the Mississippi State fans in her Bulldog debut with a career-high and game-high 26 points on 10-15 from the field and 4-8 from three, in addition to three rebounds and an assist in 25 minutes in the season opener against Memphis on Nov. 7.
- In addition to the points, her threes made and attempted were double her previous career-highs of two made and four attempted, respectively, which she achieved last at Kentucky in 2023-24. It also marked her third career start and her fifth career game with 20 or more points.
- The 26 points marked the most in a Mississippi State debut since at least the 1983-84 season (records weren't able to confirm all time with any season prior to 1983-84).
- After a career season at Kentucky in 2023-24, Russell transferred to Mississippi State for her final season in 2024-25. Russell was rated the No. 24 transfer portal prospect in the 2024 class by ESPN (Charlie Creme).
- Russell played in 32 games with two starts at Kentucky in 2023-24. She averaged 10.1 points, 3.6 rebounds and 1.5 assists in 20.7 minutes per game. Her points, rebounds, assists, minutes, steals averages and free-throw percentage were all career-highs.
- Russell posted 14.5 points, 4.0 rebounds, 2.0 steals and 2.5 steals on 44.0 percent from the field in two games against Mississippi State while at Kentucky in 2023-24.
- She also played in 49 games in two seasons at South Carolina from 2020-22, where she won the 2022 NCAA Championship.
- Russell was a 2020 McDonald's All-American, five-star and the No. 43 overall recruit in 2020 class by espnW HoopGurlz.

OKOT'S DOUBLE-DOUBLE DAWGS DEBUT

• Junior center Madina Okot made her NCAA collegiate and Mississippi State debut with a dominant double-double of 14 points on 5-8 from the field and 17 rebounds, six of which were offensive, and three blocks in 23 minutes in the season opener against Memphis on Nov. 7.

MISSISSIPPI STATE PUTS PORTAL POWER ON DISPLAY

- Head Coach Sam Purcell and his staff has navigated the portal successfully since arriving to Mississippi State and the 2024 class remains no exception.
- The transfers combined for 71 of Mississippi State's 100 points

- in the season opener against Memphis on Nov. 7. Three transfers were in double-figures in graduate student guard/forward Eniya Russell with a game-high 26 points, junior center Madina Okot with 14 points and redshirt junior guard Destiney McPhaul with 11 points. Junior guard Denim DeShields and graduate student guard/ forward Chander Prater each finished with nine points.
- · Mississippi State added seven transfers Denim DeShields (UAB), Destiney McPhaul (Northwest Florida State College), Eniya Russell (Kentucky), Terren Ward (Georgia Southern), Chandler Prater (Oklahoma State), Kayla Thomas (Georgia Southern) and Madina Okot (Zetech University - Kenya).
- The five transfers Denim DeShields (UAB), Eniya Russell (Kentucky/South Carolina), Terren Ward (Georgia Southern), Chandler Prater (Oklahoma State/Kansas), Kayla Thomas (Georgia Southern/ Penn State) - who have Division I playing experience entered the 2024-25 season with 431 games played and 179 starts.
- Russell (Kentucky) was ranked as the No. 24 transfer in the 2024 class by ESPN (Charlie Creme), while Ward (Georgia Southern) was named in the also mentioned/honorable mention section.
- McPhaul (Northwest Florida State College) was ranked as the top guard and second overall junior college prospect in the 2024 class by JUCO World Exposure. She was named a 2024 National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) First Team All-American in 2023-24.

MISSISSIPPI STATE BY THE NUMBERS

- Mississippi State returns 962 of its 2,647 points (36.3 percent), 394 of its 1,421 rebounds (27.7 percent), 125 of its 599 assists (25.1 percent), 107 of its 270 steals (39.6 percent), 71 of its 162 blocks (43.8 percent) and 2,205 of its 7,050 minutes (31.3 percent) from
- · With the addition of its five transfers with Division I playing experience, Mississippi State adds 1,599 points, 627 rebounds, 293 assists, 133 steals, 58 blocks and 3,182 minutes from 2023-24.
- The roster entered the 2024-25 season with 163 career starts at Mississippi State - all by two players Jerkaila Jordan (97) and Debreasha Powe (66).

MISSISSIPPI STATE LIGHTS IT UP ON OFFENSE

- Mississippi State ranked top-five in the SEC in multiple offensive categories in 2023-24. The Bulldogs ranked second in assists (17.1) and assist/turnover ratio (+1.2), third in field-goal percentage (44.9) and three-point field-goal percentage (35.0), fourth in scoring offense (75.6), scoring margin (+9.9) and freethrow percentage (73.0).
- Mississippi State has ranked top-five in the SEC in scoring offense, scoring margin, field-goal percentage, three-point fieldgoal percentage and assists each of Head Coach Sam Purcell's two seasons at Mississippi State.
- Mississippi State converted on 50.7 percent (37-73) from the field in the season opener against Memphis on Nov. 7, the 18th time (18-0) eclipsing the 50.0-percent mark under Purcell.
- · Mississippi State scored 100 points for the third time overall and the second time in a season opener under Purcell.
- After leading 36-25 at halftime, Mississippi State outscored Memphis 64-31 in the second half and posted consecutive quarters with 30 or more points (34 - 30, 30 - 40). It marked the most points in a half for Mississippi State since it scored 66 in the first half against Troy on Nov. 18, 2019 and the first time with consecutive quarters of 30 or more points since Nov. 15, 2019 against Murray
- · Mississippi State has averaged at least 70.0 points per game each season since 2016-17.

THE HUMP - AN ELITE HOME-COURT ADVANTAGE

- With one of the best home court advantages in the nation, Mississippi State has ranked in the top-25 nationally in final average home attendance each of the last nine seasons.
- Mississippi State ranked 25th nationally with a final average home attendance of 5,109 in 2023-24, its best average since 2019-20.
- Mississippi State has ranked in the top-five in the SEC in final average home attendance in every season, excluding 2020-21 due to COVID-19, since 2013-14.
- The attendance of 9,121 vs. LSU on Jan. 29, 2024 was the largest under Head Coach Sam Purcell and marked his first sellout. It was the program's largest crowd since Jan. 14, 2020.
- Mississippi State is 28-7 overall at home, 10-6 in SEC and 18-1 in non-conference, under Purcell. Entering the 2024-25 season, Mississippi State is 136-23 in home games and 78-3 in non-conference home games over the last 10 seasons.
- Mississippi State has won 10 or more home games in 12 of the last 13 seasons, since 2011-12, with the only exception being a 7-4 home record in the shortened COVID-19 2020-21 season.
- Mississippi State is 476-215 (.689) all time inside Humphrey Coliseum. Women's basketball will be playing its 50th season inside Humphrey Coliseum in 2024-25.

COACH PURCELL SPECIAL THROUGH TWO SEASONS

- Sam Purcell is the only head coach in program history and one of six in SEC women's basketball since 2000 to record consecutive seasons with 20 or more wins in each of their first two seasons. Other SEC women's basketball head coaches since 2000 to surpass the 20-win mark in each of their first two seasons were Pokey Chatman, Nikki Fargas, Kim Mulkey (LSU), Holly Warlick (Tennessee) and Melanie Balcomb (Vanderbilt).
- Purcell totaled the most overall wins (45 10 more than the next), most SEC wins (17 - 7 more than the next) and most NCAA
 Tournament wins (2 - no other head coach has recorded one) of any head coach through their first two seasons in program history.
- With a 1-0 start, Purcell now only needs 17 wins and five SEC wins in 2024-25 to have the most overall wins and most SEC wins of any head coach in program history through their first three seasons.
- With a 1-0 start, Purcell is four wins away from 50 for his career and with a 5-0 start would be the fastest coach in program history to eclipse the mark in 73 total games. The next closest would be Vic Schaefer who accomplished the feat in 81 games.
- Purcell is the first head coach in program history to play in the NCAA tournament in either of his first two seasons (2023 NCAA Tournament, Second Round).
- With a win over No. 9/9 LSU on Jan. 29, 2024, Purcell earned

his first win over a top-25 and top-10 opponent as a head coach. It was Mississippi State's first top-10 win since a road win at No. 10 Texas, 67-49, on Dec. 2, 2018. It was also the first sellout crowd of his tenure with 9,121 fans in attendance.

- In 2022-23, Purcell became the winningest head coach in their debut season at Mississippi State with a 22-11 overall record. He received the distinction when he earned his 16th win. Purcell led Mississippi State to the NCAA Tournament appearance in his first season following a three-year absence for the Bulldogs. Mississippi State became the first team in NCAA women's basketball history to advance to the Round of 32 after starting in the First Four round.
- He recorded the most SEC wins by a Mississippi State head coach in their debut season with nine. The nine conference wins by Purcell almost doubled the previous high of five wins by Vic Schafer. Purcell is also the only head coach in program history with a winning SEC record in year one.
- Coach Purcell's 22 wins in his debut season in 2022-23 were the second most among all rookie head coaches at the Division I level.

PURCELL ADDS VICTORIA VIVIANS TO STAFF

- Head Coach Sam Purcell hired Mississippi State legend Victoria
 Vivians as an Assistant Coach/Director of Scouting on June 17, 2024.
- Vivians just finished her seventh season in the WNBA, sixth active after she missed 2019 due to injury, and her first with Seattle Storm, where she made her playoff debut against the Las Vegas

Aces in the 2024 Playoffs.

- A part of the winningest class in program history, Vivians helped transform Mississippi State into a national power from 2014-18 and was instrumental in compiling 126 wins and four-straight NCAA
 Tournament berths, including consecutive NCAA National Championship game appearances in 2017 and 2018. She helped surpass the program record for wins in each of her four seasons, a run that was capped off with a nation-best 37-2 record in 2017-18.
- Vivians received All-America honors in each of her four seasons and in 2018 she became the first Bulldog to be named an Associated Press First Team All-American since LaToya Thomas in 2003.
- Vivians was also a three-time All-SEC First Team selection and one of only three players in program history to be named All-SEC four times over her career.
- She became the fourth player from Mississippi State at the time to be taken in the first round of the WNBA Draft when she was selected eighth overall by the Indiana Fever in 2018.
- A five-star recruit out of Scott Central High School in Carthage, Miss, Vivians was a two-time Mississippi's Miss Basketball and 2013-14 Gatorade Player of the Year honoree.
- Vivians was crowned the 2017 Mississippi State Homecoming Queen and was a four-time SEC Academic Honor Roll selection.
 She graduated with a bachelor's degree in Human Development and Family Science in 2018.
- Vivians remains the only player to win the CSpire Gillom Trophy, which is awarded to the best female player in Mississippi, in each of four seasons and the only player to win it more than twice.

- The win over No. 9/9 LSU on Jan. 29, 2024 was Purcell's first win over a top-25 and top-10 opponent as a head coach. It was Mississippi State's first top-10 win since a win at No. 10 Texas on Dec. 2, 2018. It was also the first sellout crowd of his tenure with 9,121 fans inside Humphrey Coliseum.

MSU LANDS TOP JUCO GUARD IN MCPHAUL

- Junior guard Destiney McPhaul was ranked as the top guard and second overall junior college prospect in the 2024 class by JUCO World Exposure.
- In her Mississippi State and NCAA collegiate debut, McPhaul added 11 points, four rebounds, three assists and a team-high three steals in 22 minutes off the bench in the season opener against Memphis on Nov. 7.
- McPhaul was named a 2024 National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) First Team All-American after she averaged 13.2 points, 4.8 assists and 3.0 rebounds in 31.7 minutes per game. Due to her success at the junior college level, McPhaul will have her jersey commemorated this season at the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in Knoxville, Tenn.
- McPhaul helped quide Northwest Florida State College to consecutive National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Championship game appearances.
- McPhaul improved her points average (12.0 to 14.4), field-goal (45.1 to 49.4), three-point (31.4 to 36.2) and free-throw percentage (66.4 to 82.3) from her freshman to her sophomore season, while she decreased her turnovers by 1.0 per game (2.9 to 1.9).
- McPhaul totaled 30 points on 10-20 from the field and 10-12 from the free-throw line in 44 minutes in the NJCAA Division I Championship game with Purcell in attendance. The four-game run over the NJCAA Division I tournament saw her average 25.5 points per game with three performances of 25-plus points.
- McPhaul led the team in points, assists and steals averages, while her rebounds per game ranked third. Her 137 assists ranked 29th in the NJCAA and her 475 points were the fourth-most single-season total in Northwest Florida State College program history.
- McPhaul practiced and redshirted with Temple in 2021-22 due to NCAA Transfer rules before deciding to transfer to Northwest Florida State College after she previously signed to Virginia Tech.

• Junior guard Denim DeShields comes from a very athletic family. Her mother, Tisha, was a 1991 NCAA Outdoor All-American in the heptathlon at Tennessee and is a member of the Delaware Track and Field Hall of Fame. Her father, Delino, was drafted out of high school with 12th overall pick in the first round of the 1987 MLB June Amateur Draft and played 13 major league seasons. Her brother, Delino Jr., was selected with the eighth overall pick in the first round of the 2010 MLB June Amateur Draft by the Houston Astros.

Her sister, Diamond, was an multi-time All-American and All-SEC selection at Tennessee after she transferred from North Carolina. where she was the 2014 National Freshman of the Year by multiple outlets, and the third overall pick in the first round of the 2018 WNBA Draft by the Chicago Sky. She won 2021 WNBA Championship with the Sky and just completed her seventh season in the WNBA.

- Graduate student guard Jerkaila Jordan's older brother, Jerrae is a defensive back who played football at UNLV and currently plays at Washington State.
- Senior forward/center Kayla Thomas' mother, Tenicka, was a three-sport athlete and played volleyball, basketball and ran track and field at Mississippi Valley State, was named a two-time Mississippi Valley State Female Athlete of the Year and was inducted into the Mississippi Valley State Hall of Fame in 2008.
- · Junior guard/forward Debreasha Powe's twin brother, Demarcus, plays basketball at Belhaven University and played at East Central Community College and Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College.
- Sophomore forward/center Quanirah Montague's brother, Jahleem, played basketball at Palm Beach State Community College and Longwood.

- Graduate student guard Jerkaila Jordan is interested in a career in law enforcement after basketball and shadowed the Starkville Police Department on a ride along earlier this offseason.

- Powe put her broadcasting talents on display at 2025 SEC Basketball Tipoff, where she took over the mic with Brooke Weisbrod on the SEC Now set. Powe currently interns as a sideline reporter at French Camp Academy football games and in the production rooms with the Mississippi State Athletics Broadcast staff.
- Majoring in Business Administration and Entrepreneurship, junior guard Denim DeShields has always had an entrepreneurial spirit. She grew up selling paper doughnuts around the neighborhood and spent a summer in Chicago living with her sister and braiding hair at a local salon. She still braids hair when she finds the time and after her playing career is completed, DeShields plans to explore opening her own business.

DESHIELDS READY TO COMMAND STATE'S OFFENSE

- Junior guard Demin DeShields was one of the top point guards in the transfer portal this offseason and is now ready to command Mississippi State's offense in 2024-25.
- DeShields made her Mississippi State debut against Memphis on Monday, Nov. 7 with nine points on 3-5 from the field and 3-3 from the free throw line, in addition to two assists and two steals in 28 minutes.
- DeShields started 61 of 63 games over two seasons at UAB from 2022-24. She was a two-time All-Conference selection over two different conference affiliations, Conference USA and American Athletic Conference, and was named to 2023 Conference USA All-Freshman and 2024 American Athletic Conference All-Conference Third Team.
- DeShields averaged 13.4 points, 5.3 assists and 3.0 rebounds on 42.5 percent from the field (161-379) and 78.4 percent from the free throw line (91-116) in 33.3 minutes per game at UAB in 2023-24. She set new career-bests in points, assists, rebounds, minutes averages, field-goal and free-throw percentage.
- Her 170 assists in 2023-24 were the fourth-best single-season total in UAB program history. She ranked top-three in the conference in assists per game in each of her first two seasons.
- DeShields led the AAC with 5.3 assists per game in 2023-24.
- DeShields' +1.4 assist/turnover ratio in 2023-24 ranked seventh in the AAC, her 33.3 minutes per game ranked sixth, while her 13.4 points per game and 42.5 field-goal percentage each were 13th.
- She was the only player in the AAC to record two 10-plus assist performances in 2023-24.
- DeShields improved her points (13.0 to 13.4), assists (4.3 to 5.3), rebounds (2.9 to 3.0), minutes averages (30.0 to 33.3), fieldgoal (40.8 to 42.5) and free-throw percentage (69.4 to 79.4) from her freshman to her sophomore season.
- DeShields led her team in assists per game and has finished top two in points per game in each of her first two seasons. She has recorded a pair of double-doubles, one in each of her two seasons, both points-assists.

HEAD COACH SAM PURCELL



Sam Purcell was named the ninth head coach in Mississippi State women's basketball history on Saturday, March 12, 2022. The 2024-25 season will be his third year as a head coach and his third at the helm of the women's basketball program at Mississippi State.

In 2023-24, Purcell led Mississippi State to a 23-12 record, 8-8 SEC, and became the only head coach in program history and one of six in the SEC women's basketball since 2000 to surpass the 20-win mark in each of their first two seasons. Purcell has totaled the most wins (45), most SEC wins (17) and most NCAA Tournament wins (2) of any head coach through their first two seasons in program history.

Purcell coached a pair of Bulldogs to All-Conference honors during the 2023-24 season. He led graduate student Jessika Carter to 2024 All-SEC Second Team and 2024 WBCA Honorable All-American accolades. Carter was selected with the 23rd overall pick in the Second Round of the 2024 WNBA Draft by the New York Liberty and was the ninth overall player to be drafted to the WNBA and the first under Purcell at Mississippi State. She was the first player from Mississippi State to be drafted since both Teaira McCowan and Anriel Howard were selected in 2019.

Purcell also led now graduate student guard Jerkaila Jordan, who returns for her fifth season in 2024-25, to 2024 All-SEC Second Team honors. Jordan set career-highs in points, rebounds, assists, steals, blocks and minutes totals in 2023-24 were all career-highs and was the only player in the SEC to average at least 15.0 points, 5.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 2.0 steals per game in 2023-24.

With a win over No. 9/9 LSU on Jan. 29, 2024, Purcell earned his first win over a top-25 and top-10 opponent as a head coach. It was Mississippi State's first top-10 win since a win at No. 10 Texas on Dec. 2, 2018. It was also the first sellout crowd of his tenure with 9,121 fans inside Humphrey Coliseum.

Mississippi State opened its second season under Purcell in 2023-24 ranked in the Associated Press Preseason Top-25 poll at No. 25, the program's first time listed in the preseason poll since 2020-21. The preseason spot also marked a return to the AP top-25 poll after a 44-week absence. Mississippi State earned its highest rankings of the season when it was ranked No. 21 in both the week four editions of the AP Poll on Nov. 21 and the USA Today Coaches' Poll on Nov. 22. The No. 21 ranking in the AP Poll tied the program's best in the poll since Jan. 25, 2021, while it tied the program's best ranking in the USA Today Coaches' Poll since Jan. 26, 2021.

Under Purcell, Assistant Coaches Michelle Clark-Heard and Corry Irvin went on the earn head coaching positions at Mercer and Chicago State, respectively, while Graduate Assistant Luke Carns went on to be named Director of Player Personnel at Texas State following the 2023-24 season. It marked the latest staff under Purcell to advance their career after Assistant A.D. of Women's Basketball Joi Williams was named Men's Basketball Chief of Staff at South Florida and Graduate Assistant Kelby Jones earned an Assistant Coach position at Oklahoma State, each following the 2022-23 season.

Purcell's first season as a head coach was a season of 'firsts' for the up-and-coming coaching star. A handful of those 'firsts' included his first game as a head coach, his first win, and his first NCAA Tournament appearance. But it also came with firsts for the Mississippi State women's basketball program that saw Purcell become the winningest first-year head coach in program history.

In his first season sitting in the head chair, Purcell became the winningest head coach at Mississippi State in their debut season with 22 wins while also becoming the first to have a winning record in the SEC after going 9-7 and finishing fifth in the toughest conference in the country. Most impressive, though, is that he guided the Bulldogs to the NCAA Tournament following a three-year hiatus.

In leading the team to the Big Dance in his first season, Purcell set the standard at Mississippi State, as no coach in program history had made the NCAA Tournament before their third season leading the program. On top of that, Purcell became the fastest coach at Mississippi State to win a pair of NCAA Tournament games. In winning two tournament games, Mississippi State became the first team in NCAA Women's Basketball history to advance to the tournament's Second Round after starting in the First Four round.

Purcell helped guide a pair of Bulldogs to All-Conference honors during the 2022-23 season. He coached Jessika Carter to Second Team All-SEC honors and a place on the SEC All-Defensive Team. Carter had a career season under Purcell, setting career bests in points scored (458), blocked shots (65) and assists (42). He also led Debreasha Powe to the SEC All-Freshmen team after a promising rookie campaign for the Mississippi native.

Known as an elite recruiter, Purcell hit the ground running in year one, signing the nation's 16th-ranked recruiting class despite not having the luxury of an entire season of recruiting. His 2023 signing class, which ranked as the second-best class in program history, only behind the 2018 class, featured three EspnW HoopGurlz top-100 recruits.

Before he arrived in Starkville, Purcell spent nine seasons at Louisville under the direction of future hall of famer Jeff Walz. While on the staff at Louisville, Purcell helped guide the Cardinals to a 266-48 overall record with eight NCAA Tournament appearances, seven Sweet 16s, five Elite Eights and two Final Fours. He also helped lead Louisville to four ACC Regular Season Championships and the 2018 ACC Tournament title, their first tournament crown since 1993.

Promoted to associate coach in 2017-18, Purcell played a critical role in guiding Louisville to a program-best 36-3 overall record that included an ACC Regular Season and Tournament Championship. The Cardinals opened the year going 20-0, marking the best start in program history. They then earned a No. 2 ranking in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll and defeated opponents by an average of 27.5 points per game. During the 2020-21 season, Purcell helped the Cardinals to a 16-0 start and the first-ever No. 1 ranking in the USA Today Top 25 Coaches Poll in program history.

Purcell helped the Louisville offense consistently rank among the nation's best. In every season but one at Louisville, the offense ranked inside the top 40 in points per game while averaging more than 72.2 points per game during that time. The impressive scoring margins that Louisville won games by more than a +16.0-scoring margin in each of his last five seasons there – was mainly due to a strong emphasis on defense. Under the guidance of Purcell, the Cardinals allowed opponents to average more than 60 points per contest just twice.

Purcell led the recruiting efforts at Louisville and he has landed the nation's top recruit on two separate occasions with two different programs. Purcell inked top-rated prospect Kaela Davis in 2013 at Georgia Tech and Asia Durr at Louisville in 2015.

All nine signing classes that Purcell helped recruit were ranked in the top 15 by ESPN. Of those nine classes, four were ranked inside the top 10, highlighted by the No. 1 class in 2015, the No. 4 class in 2017, the No. 6 class in 2016 and the No. 8 class in 2014. Even more impressive, of the 15 McDonald's All-Americans in Louisville's history, 13 were recruited by Purcell.

Before his time at Louisville, Purcell had stops at Georgia Tech, Tulsa and Auburn. Purcell has learned from some of the best minds in college basketball, including Jeff Walz, Nell Fortner (former Auburn and current Georgia Tech head coach and the head coach of the 1996 Olympic Team) and Joe Ciampi (25-year head coach at Auburn, 2005 Hall of Fame inductee and Purcell's father-in-law).



- DeShields recorded nine points on 3-5 from the field and 3-3 from the free throw line, in addition to two assists and two steals in her Mississippi State debut in the season opener against Memphis (Nov. 7).
- DeShields has elite acceleration and a quick first step, boasting a blistering 1.52-second 10-yard acceleration split. She also has a 3.51-second 3/4 court sprint, 28" standing vertical, 5' 5.5" wingspan, 6' 10" standing reach and a 26.5" approach jump (running vertical).

CAREER

- DeShields started 61 of 63 games over two seasons at UAB from 2022-24. She was a two-time All-Conference selection over two different conference affiliations, Conference USA and American Athletic Conference, after she named to 2023 Conference USA All-Freshman and 2024 American Athletic Conference All-Conference Third Team.
- DeShields averaged 13.4 points, 5.3 assists and 3.0 rebounds on 42.5 percent from the field (161-379) and 78.4 percent from the free throw line (91-116) in 33.3 minutes per game at UAB in 2023-24. She set new career-bests in points, assists, rebounds, minutes averages, field-goal and free-throw percentage.

- DeShields is majoring in Business Administration and Entrepreneurship. She has always had an entrepreneurial spirit, grew up selling paper doughnuts around the neighborhood and spent a summer in Chicago living with her sister and braiding hair at a salon, still currently braids hair. After her playing career is completed, DeShields plans to explore opening her own business.
- DeShields is comes from a very athletic family. Her mother, Tisha, was a 1991 NCAA Outdoor All-American in the heptathlon at Tennessee and is a member of the Delaware Track and Field Hall of Fame. Her father, Delino, was drafted out of high school with 12th overall pick in the first round of the 1987 MLB June Amateur Draft and played 13 major league seasons. Her brother, Delino Jr., was selected with the eighth overall pick in the first round of the 2010 MLB June Amateur Draft by the Houston Astros. Her sister, Diamond, was an multi-time All-American and All-SEC selection at Tennessee after she transferred from North Carolina, where she was the 2014 National Freshman of the Year by multiple outlets, and the third overall pick in the first round of the 2018 WNBA Draft by the Chicago Sky. She won 2021 WNBA Championship with the Sky and just completed her seventh season in the WNBA.

- Jordan was named to the 2025 Preseason Coaches' All-SEC Second Team for the second straight season.
- An elite athlete, Jordan boasts a 26.7" standing vertical, 3.46-second court sprint and a 1.59-second 10-yard acceleration split. She also has a 5' 9" wingspan, 7' 4" standing reach, 9" 6.5" approach height (running vertical height) and a 26.5" approach jump (running vertical).
- Jordan and Shakirah Edwards earned the 'Top Dawg' Award, which is awarded to the two players who reflects elite metrics in the weight room
 and conditioning sessions throughout the offseason. Jordan has won the award three times at Mississippi State.
- Jordan joined Debreasha Powe as the two student-athletes selected to represent Mississippi State at 2025 SEC Basketball Tipoff. It was her second straight appearance at the event in Birmingham.

CAREER

- Jordan was named to the 2024 All-SEC Second Team after averaging 16.2 points, 5.9 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 2.1 steals on 44.5 percent from the field (213-479), 33.3 percent from three (40-120) and 79.1 percent from the free throw line (102-129) in 30.8 minutes per game in 2023-24. Her points, rebounds, assists, steals, blocks and minutes totals in 2023-24 were all career-highs.
- Jordan was the only player in the SEC to average at least 15.0 points, 5.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 2.0 steals per game in 2023-24. Her 16.2 points and 2.1 steals per game are each the fourth-best returning mark in the SEC in 2024-25.
- Jordan's 16.2 points per game in 2023-24 ranked 10th in the SEC, her 2.1 steals per game ranked sixth and her 568 total points were fourth.
- Jordan averaged 17.1 points, 6.3 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 1.7 steals in 30.5 minutes per game in the 19 non-conference contests in 2023-24. Those numbers remained consistent with 16.4 points, 5.7 rebounds, 2.1 steals and 2.8 steals on 46.4 percent from the field (58-125), 35.1 percent from three (13-37) and 77.8 percent from the line (35-45) in 27.3 minutes per game in non-conference home games.
- Jordan averaged 24.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists, 2.5 steals and 2.0 blocks on 50.0 percent from the field (20-40) and 44.4 percent from three (4-9) against top-10 opponents in 2023-24.
- Jordan ranks seventh with 203 steals, ninth with 137 threes made and 12th with 1,358 points in Mississippi State program history. Her career average of 2.1 steals per game stands fifth in program history.
- Jordan recorded a team-high plus/minus ratio of +303 (+8.7 per game) in 2023-24.
- Jordan was the only Bulldog to start all 35 games in 2023-24. She has started all 98 games at Mississippi State and all 125 in her career.
- Jordan scored 10 or more points in 27 games, 20 or more in 11 and 30 or more in 2023-24. She concluded 2023-24 with a career-high 36 points in 37 minutes in the WBIT Quarterfinals at Penn State on March 28, 2024. Jordan has scored 10 or more points in 91 of 124 career games (73.4 percent).
- Jordan pulled down five or more rebounds in 21 games and 10 or more in seven in 2023-24. She finished with seven double-doubles in 2023-24 to extend her career total to 11 after entering with four over her previous three seasons combined.
- After basketball, Jordan is interested in a career in law enforcement and recently toured the Starkville Police Department.

- Posted 16 points on 6-10 from the field and 4-7 from behind the arc, her 14th career game with three or more threes made, in addition to seven rebounds, four assists and three blocks in 31 minutes in the season opener against Memphis (Nov. 7). Her assists, blocks, minutes and plus/minus ratio of +36 were all team highs.
- · Powe joined Jerkaila Jordan as the two student-athletes selected to represent Mississippi State at 2025 SEC Basketball Tipoff, where she displayed her broadcasting talents by taking over the mic with Brooke Weisbrod on SEC Network.

CAREER

- Powe has started 67 of 68 games played in, only missing one contest, in three seasons under Purcell. Powe has started nearly every game since her collegiate debut as a true freshman.
- Powe's 66 threes were a team best and ranked fourth in the SEC in 2023-24. Her 40.0 percent from three was also a team best, ranked third in the SEC and was a +9.8 percent increase from her freshman season. Powe has ranked either first or second on the team in threes made in both seasons - 42 in 2022-23 and 66 in 2023-24.
- Powe was one of three players in the SEC in 2023-24 and the latest Mississippi State player since Andra Espinoza-Hunter in 2018-19 to knock down 65-plus threes on a 40.0 percent or better rate. She hit three-plus threes in 10 games and five-plus in three games in 2023-24.
- Powe's field-goal percentage (41.2 from 39.5), three-point percentage (40.0 from 30.2), free-throw percentage (78.1 from 76.5) and points per game (8.9 from 8.2) all improved from her freshman to sophomore season.
- Powe has finished top-five on the team in plus/minus ratio each season (+188 in 2023-24, +358 in 2022-23).
- Following her sophomore season in 2023-24, Powe is only 12 threes shy from entering the top-10 in program history in threes made.
- Powe averaged 8.9 points, 3.3 rebounds, 1.0 assists on 41.2 percent from the field (105-255), 40.0 percent from three (66-165) and 78.1 percent from the free throw line (25-32) in 26.5 minutes per game in 2023-24.
- One of the top high school recruits in Mississippi in 2022 class, No. 84 overall, Powe committed under the previous staff and was one of the first players that Purcell visited in his UHaul when he arrived at Mississippi State.
- Majoring in Communication-Broadcast and Digital Journalism, Powe intends to pursue a career as a sports analyst after basketball and is inspired by ESPN's Andraya Carter, who visited the team to provide media training ahead of the 2023-24 season. Powe currently interns as a sideline reporter at French Camp Academy football games and with the Mississippi State Athletics Broadcast staff.
- When Powe was in seventh grade, she attended a basketball camp at Mississippi State and was paired up in group led by now Mississippi State Assistant Coach/Director of Scouting and WNBA Seattle Storm's Victoria Vivians and WNBA Dallas Wings' Teaira McCowan. Powe still has the picture of her with Vivians and McCowan from the camp back home.
- Powe was the 2021-22 Mississippi Gatorade Player of the Year in her senior season at Meridian High School, other SEC notables include Texas' Madison Booker (2022-23, 2020-21), Mississippi State's Victoria Vivians (2011-12, 2013-14), LaToya Thomas (1997-98, 1998-99), Tan White (2000-01) and Texas A&M's Joni Taylor (1996-97).
- Her twin brother Demarcus plays basketball at Belhaven University, also played at East Central Community College and Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College.
- Writes a bible verse on her wrist before every game.
