THE FAST BREAK

■ **No. 8 Oklahoma (13-1)** hosts its first SEC home game on Sunday when it welcomes **Mississippi State (14-1)** to Lloyd Noble Center. Tip is set for 2 p.m. CT on SECN+ with **Chad McKee** and **Bryndon Manzer** calling the action. Fans can tune in on the Sooner Sports Radio Network (107.7 FM) with **Brian Brinkley** and **Carolyn Baker** or listen in Spanish with **Luis Rendon** on Los Sooners Radio (1560 AM). Both radio broadcasts will also stream on the Varsity App.

■ Oklahoma enters riding a **12-game winning streak**, the second-longest in program history behind only the 2008-09 Final Four team's 20-game run. Over the stretch, the Sooners have been historic, reaching 100 points a program-record six times and averaging **98.3 points per game**. OU is outscoring opponents by 39.4 points per contest, shooting nearly 20% better than the opposition with four Power Five wins and two over ranked foes.

■ OU moved up to No. 8 in last Monday's AP Top 25 poll (no polls this week) and checked in at No. 9 in the USA Today Coaches Poll on Tuesday, marking a run of seven straight weeks in the AP Top 10, the program's longest run since 2008-09. **The Sooners have now appeared in the AP Top 25 for 36 consecutive weeks, the eighth-longest active streak nationally** and the fourth-longest in program history, and their 28 straight weeks inside the AP top 20 is tied with North Carolina for the seventh-longest active run in the country.

■ Oklahoma boasts one of the nation's most explosive offenses, **ranking second nationally at 94.5 PPG and fifth in assists per game (21.6 APG)**. The Sooners' starting five ranks second in the country in scoring at 72.1 PPG, trailing only No. 3 South Carolina. All five starters average double figures, led by **Aaliyah Chavez (19.0 PPG)** and **Raegan Beers (17.6 PPG)**. OU ranks top-five nationally in fast break points (20.9), second-chance points (18.1) and paint points (47.1), while also sitting 16th in ORTG (115.7).

■ Oklahoma's defense remains among the nation's most disruptive, ranking **second nationally in opponent field goal percentage (30.6%)**. The Sooners hold teams 12.0% below their season shooting average and **12.5 points under their scoring norm**. OU ranks sixth nationally in blocks per game (6.6) and 26th in steals (12.5), while its **74.1 defensive rating (opponent points per 100 possessions) is eighth nationally**. The Sooners have not allowed an opponent to shoot better than 42% this season and have won 37 straight games when holding teams under 70 points.

NOTE OF THE NIGHT

■ **Sunday's matchup is the only game of the weekend featuring two teams riding winning streaks of 10 or more**, as Oklahoma enters on a 12-game run while Mississippi State has won 10 straight. Beyond the overall streaks, the Sooners bring a **13-game home winning streak at Lloyd Noble Center** and have **won eight consecutive regular-season games against SEC opponents** dating back to last year. The road ahead remains daunting, as **OU's next four games after the Bulldogs depart Norman all come against top-15 teams with a combined 56-5 (.918) record (70-6 when including MSST)**.

LAST TIME OUT

■ Oklahoma (13-1, 1-0 SEC) won its 12th straight game on Thursday night, defeating Texas A&M, 72-50, in College Station to open SEC play. The 12-game winning streak is the program's second longest, trailing only a 20-game run in 2008-09. The win also extended OU's road winning streak to six dating back to last season, the fifth-longest active streak in the country.

■ OU's defense again showed why it ranks among the nation's elite, holding Texas A&M to 50 points, the lowest opponent total in a conference game for the Sooners since 2020. Oklahoma, which entered the day second nationally in opponent field goal percentage, limited the Aggies to 26% shooting, 15% below their season average. Freshman Aaliyah Chavez shined in her SEC debut, scoring a game-high 20 points on 8 of 18 shooting while matching a career high with seven rebounds and adding six assists, two steals and a +20 plus-minus in 34 minutes.

■ OU leads the all-time series 2-1, but the teams have split the matchups since 2021, with OU winning in 2021 and Mississippi State claiming a win in SEC play last season.

■ Jerkaila Jordan scored 24 points, 18 in the second half, and Mississippi State held on for a 81-77 win over No. 10 Oklahoma. Raegan Beers had 19 points and 10 rebounds, Payton Verhulst scored 15 points and Liz Scott added 12 for Oklahoma.

WHAT'S ON THE LINE

■ A win would push OU's winning streak to 13 in a row, extending the second-longest streak in program history, trailing only a 20-game run by the 2008-09 Final Four team.

■ A victory would extend OU's home winning streak to 14 (would be tied for 11th in NCAA) and mark the program's ninth straight win in the regular season against SEC foes.

■ A win over the Bulldogs moves OU to 2-0 for the first time in SEC play. It would secure the second 2-0 start (2023-24) in conference play under Baranczyk.

A RÉSUMÉ WORTH REVIEWING

■ Oklahoma owns **two Quad 1 wins** (NC State, Oklahoma State) and one Quad 2 victory (Texas A&M). **The Sooners' two Q1 wins are tied for eighth nationally, while their three combined Q1-Q2 wins rank 15th.**

■ Wins Above Bubble (WAB), a key NCAA selection metric, measures wins above an average bubble team. **Oklahoma's 2.13 WAB ranks 18th nationally.**

PRESEASON SNAPSHOT

- Under Jennie Baranczyk, Oklahoma has met or exceeded its preseason placement in the league's preseason poll in each of her four seasons in Norman. Across her 13 full seasons as a head coach – nine at Drake and four at OU – her teams have done so 11 times. **OU was picked fourth in this year's SEC coaches preseason poll and fifth by the league's media.**

- Oklahoma signed the nation's No. 8 recruiting class in 2025, highlighted by three top-70 prospects in 247Sports' final rankings: No. 1 Aaliyah Chavez, No. 34 Keziah Lofton and No. 61 Brooklyn Stewart. The class also included international signees Emma Tolan (Ireland) and Daffa Cissoko (France), OU's first international players since 2019-20.
- Oklahoma entered the season with its highest preseason AP ranking since 2009-10, opening at No. 6. The Sooners had appeared in the final AP poll in each of the previous four seasons, including a No. 11 finish last year – their best since 2009-10.

STACKED SEC

- The Southeastern Conference is once again proving why it's the premier league in women's basketball. Half of the preseason AP top 10 featured SEC teams, including the then-sixth-ranked Sooners. **In the latest AP poll, the SEC landed eight teams in the top 20.**

- Five of the 12 players on the preseason AP All-America list hail from the SEC, including OU's Raegan Beers (honorable mention). All five All-SEC First Team selections helped Team USA win gold at the 2025 FIBA AmeriCup, where Jennie Baranczyk served as an assistant coach.
- Last season, the SEC set a conference record with 24 total basketball teams earning NCAA Tournament bids, 14 on the men's side and 10 on the women's, breaking the previous mark of 16 set in 2024.
- The league boasts a nation-high nine teams with one loss or less on the season, including both Oklahoma and Mississippi State.** The road ahead remains daunting, as **OU's four games after the Bulldogs depart Norman all come against top-15 teams with a combined 56-5 (.918) record.**

PULSE OF THE POLLS

- OU moved up to No. 8 in last Monday's AP Top 25 poll (no polls this week) and checked in at No. 9 in the USA Today Coaches Poll on Tuesday, marking a run of seven straight weeks in the AP Top 10, the program's longest run since 2008-09. **The Sooners have now appeared in the AP Top 25 for 36 consecutive weeks, the eighth-longest active streak nationally** and the fourth-longest in program history, and their 28 straight weeks inside the AP top 20 is tied with North Carolina for the seventh-longest active run in the country. A new AP Poll is released an hour prior to tip on Monday (12/22).

- OU opened the season at No. 6 in the AP poll, its highest preseason ranking since 2009-10. The Sooners have appeared in the final AP poll in each of the last four seasons, including a No. 11 finish last year – their best since 2009-10. This year marked OU's seventh preseason top-10 ranking (2002, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2011, 2024, 2025).

- Oklahoma carries a 36-week active streak in the AP poll (8th longest in NCAA), the fourth-longest run in program history and the program's longest stretch since a 40-week span from 2015-17.**

- OU's streak of 28 straight weeks inside the top 20 is tied with North Carolina for the seventh-longest active run in the nation.

STAR-STUDDED ROSTER

- Oklahoma features one of the nation's most talented rosters based on recruiting rankings. Four of OU's five starters were five-star prospects and McDonald's All-Americans, while the lone non-five-star starter, Zya Vann, was a top-50 recruit in ESPN's rankings.

- The four McDonald's All-Americans in OU's starting lineup are the program's most in a season since 2017-18.**

- All nine of OU's American players were top-100 recruits in either ESPN or 247Sports rankings: Aaliyah Chavez (No. 1), Raegan Beers (No. 10), Payton Verhulst (No. 12), Sahara Williams (No. 23), Zya Vann (No. 46), Keziah Lofton (No. 50), Brooklyn Stewart (No. 66), Caya Smith (No. 72) and Beatrice Culliton (No. 96).

THE CRIMSON AND CREAM SCORING MACHINE

■ If you want to see one of the fastest and most prolific offenses in the country, watch OU basketball. The Sooners are the only team to average at least 82.0 points per game over the last five seasons (Baranczyk era) and set the school record last year with 84.7 PPG. This season, they're on pace to shatter the record again and average 94.5 points per game.

■ **Oklahoma's 94.5 points per game rank second nationally powered by 21.6 assists per game (5th NCAA).** The Sooners play fast – leading the nation in adjusted pace at 81.0 possessions/game – and rank in the top-five nationally in fast break points (20.9), second-chance points (18.1) and paint points (47.1), while also sitting 16th in ORTG (115.7). Ball security has taken a major step forward with a 14.8% turnover rate (19th NCAA) and a 1.47 assist-to-turnover ratio (14th NCAA).

■ Baranczyk's teams are built for offense and the numbers back it up. Under her leadership, **Oklahoma has scored 90+ points 49 times (2nd most in NCAA since 21-22) and is 46-3 in those contests**, with all three losses coming against top-15 opponents. The Sooners have reached the 100-point mark 17 times under Baranczyk, the third-most nationally since 2021, including a program record six times this season. Oklahoma entered SEC play riding a program-record nine straight games scoring 90+ points, but saw the streak snapped at Texas A&M.

■ All five Oklahoma starters average double figures, as the Sooners' starting five ranks second nationally in scoring at 72.1 points per game. OU is one of just 14 teams in the country to start the same lineup in every game this season.

SOONER STOPPERS

■ One of the nation's most best defenses, **OU ranks second nationally in opponent field goal percentage (30.6%)**, holding teams 12.0% below their season shooting average and 12.5 points under their typical scoring output.

■ The Sooners pressure at every level, sitting sixth nationally in blocks per game (6.6) and 26th in steals (12.5). They recently held Maryland Eastern Shore to 17.9% shooting – the second-lowest mark by an OU opponent ever – and own the **eight best defensive rating (74.1) in the country**.

■ **OU has held 13 of its 14 opponents under 40% shooting, one of just five teams nationally to do so in at least 92% of its games. Mississippi State is one of the five (14 of 15 games).**

■ One of the nation's top defensive teams in the paint, **OU allows opponents to score a nation-low 30.2% of their points inside and just 18.3 paint points per game (3rd NCAA)**. Sooner opponents **shoot only 32.2% in the painted area**, the lowest percentage in the country. OU has also recorded seven games with 7+ blocks (6th most NCAA), including a Baranczyk-era high 12 against NC Central on December 22.

■ Sophomore Caya Smith has been especially disruptive on the defensive end and is the only player in the country with 31 or more steals while playing 16.0 minutes per game or less. **The starting OU backcourt of Zya Vann and Aaliyah Chavez has combined for 65 steals, good for a combined 4.6 takeaways per game. The Sooners score 23.1 points off turnovers per game, good for 25th in the nation.** Oklahoma is one of two SEC schools (Texas) with three players that have 25 steals this season.

KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS

■ Over the last four seasons, Oklahoma has been at its best when defending at a high level. The Sooners are **67-2** under Jennie Baranczyk when holding opponents under 70 points and **83-4** when scoring at least 80 on the other end. When scoring fewer than 80, OU is 31-31 since 2021. **OU has won 73 straight games dating back to 2015 when holding opponents under 60 points.**

■ The clearest recipe for success has come through efficiency. **OU is 98-4 (.961) under Baranczyk when shooting a higher percentage than its opponent (won 22 straight)** and is 81-5 when holding opponents under 40% from the field since 2021.

■ Since 2021, Oklahoma is 42-10 (.808) when turning it over 15 times or less and 8-1 in 2025-26. The Sooners have won 16 in a row when turning it over more than their opponent, the longest active streak in the country.

BOARD WOMAN GETS PAID

- OU leads the country in rebounds per game (52.36) and pulls down a nation-leading 35.7 defensive boards per contest. The Sooners own a +15.0 rebounding margin, good for fifth in the country.
- Under Baranczyk, Oklahoma is 42-1 when grabbing 50 or more rebounds, with the only loss coming to Kentucky on Feb. 2, 2025. OU has posted 50+ rebounds 23 times since the start of the 2024-25 season – the most in the country during that span.
- Since 2021-22, OU is 89-15 when winning the rebounding battle and has **won 20 straight games when outrebounding its opponent**.
- The Sooners have posted 60+ rebounds in back-to-back games for the first time this season and the second time of the Baranczyk era, totaling 60 vs. NC Central and 63 vs. Texas A&M. **Overall, OU leads the nation with four 60-rebound games, the most by any team in a season since Troy recorded five in 2022-23.**

SOONER MAGIC COMEBACKS

- The Sooners have used that famous Sooner Magic to **come back from double-digit deficits and win 18 times** in the Baranczyk era, including seven times vs. ranked opponents.

- Oklahoma is no stranger to winning close games - it is **16-1 in games decided by one possession** (3 pts or less) under Baranczyk, winning on a last-possession shot five times. All eight of OU's opening eight games were decided by double digits.
- Since the beginning of the 2021-22 season, Oklahoma has a **34-12 record in contests decided by single digits and is 1-0 this year**.
- Twelve of OU's 13 wins this year have come by 15 points or more, with the only exception being a five-point win over NC State in overtime. The Sooners have six wins by 40 points or more (5th most NCAA) on the campaign.

BUILT AROUND BEERS

■ **Raegan Beers**, Oklahoma's All-American center, has continued her dominance in the paint and solidified herself as one of the nation's top players. She scores **17.6 points per game** on **59.4%** shooting and adds **10.8 rebounds per game**. In 14 games, **she has recorded 11 double-doubles, including seven with 20 points, both of which are good for the most in the country.**

■ An All-SEC First Team selection last year, perhaps no post in the country is more efficient than Beers, who ranks fifth nationally in player efficiency rating (40.9), good for second in the SEC and best among all posts in the league.

■ Oklahoma remains the queen of the double-double. Courtney Paris set the NCAA standard with 112 straight during her legendary career, and now Raegan Beers is carrying the torch, **leading all active Division I players with 56 career double-doubles**. Her performance against Florida State on Nov. 30 made her just the second Sooner ever – alongside Paris – to record five consecutive double-doubles in a season. **Beers has posted a double-double in four straight games - a feat that only her and Paris have accomplished at OU.**

■ Beers has been especially dominant over the Sooners' 12-game winning streak, averaging 17.5 points and 10.6 rebounds while shooting 58.8% and 83% at the free throw line. The center also posts 1.2 blocks per game during the run. She has posted notable games against Florida State (14pts/11reb/2blk), NC State (21pts/12reb), Little Rock (26pts/15reb/5ast), Oklahoma State (22pts/12reb/2blk) and Texas A&M (14pts/12reb/5ast). **She was named SEC Player of the Week on Dec. 16 after her performances against Little Rock and OSU.**

■ In 18 games against teams ranked or receiving votes as a Sooner, Beers averages 16.7 points on 60.4% shooting, 10.1 rebounds, 1.4 assists and 1.1 blocks per game. In those games the center has posted 10 double-doubles including against UConn, Kentucky (2x), Alabama, Vanderbilt, Michigan, Louisville and more.

■ Last season, Beers delivered a dominant debut campaign at Oklahoma, earning Honorable Mention All-America honors (AP, USBWA, WBCA), All-SEC First Team and Lisa Leslie Award finalist recognition. The center started all 33 games, averaging 17.3 points, 9.4 rebounds and a program-record 63.4% shooting. **The nation's most efficient post last year, she became the first Division I player in at least 25 years to average 17+ points and 9+ rebounds while shooting over 63% in under 25 minutes per game**, recording 15 double-doubles and 13 games of 20+ points.

■ Since the start of the last season, Beers been the most efficient and productive post in the country. She is the only player to score 750+ points, grab 400+ rebounds and shoot over 60% while playing fewer than 1150 minutes – no other player has reached those marks in under 1,350 minutes.

■ Beers collected her 1,000th rebound on 12/11 against Little Rock, becoming the fourth active Division I player to eclipse 1,000 career boards. **She is the only player in the country with 1,700 career points and 1,000 career rebounds**.

WELCOME TO THE CHAVEZ SHOW

■ The nation's **No. 1 overall recruit per 247Sports, USA Today and Prospects Nation** – and the unanimous 2025 national high school player of the year – **Aaliyah Chavez** arrived at Oklahoma as one of the most decorated signees in program history. A two-time Gatorade Texas Player of the Year, McDonald's All-American and Jordan Brand Classic and Nike Hoop Summit pick, she averaged 34.9 points, 9.1 rebounds, 4.3 assists and 3.7 steals as a senior while leading Monterey High School to a 5A Division II state title. She finished her prep career with 4,796 points, ranking 14th in ESPN's all-time scoring records, and became the **first No. 1 recruit ever to sign with OU**.

■ **Chavez leads OU with 19.0 points per game – the top scoring mark among all true freshmen nationally and the only true freshman ranked inside the top 80 nationally in scoring (she ranks 34th)**. She also leads the Sooners in assists (4.5 APG), adds 4.1 rebounds per game and ranks third in the SEC in made 3-pointers (40) and has made a 3-pointer in every game to open her career. She leads the nation with 19 transition 3-pointers.

■ Chavez is one of only four players nationally – and the only freshman – averaging at least 19.0 points, 4.5 assists and 4.0 rebounds per game. **She is on pace to join Hannah Hidalgo, Paige Bueckers and Caitlin Clark as freshmen since 2009 to average 19.0 PPG, 4.5 APG and 4.0 RPG**.

■ A four-time SEC Freshman of the Week and one-time National Freshman of the Week honoree, Chavez is chasing history. Courtney Paris set the OU record with nine FOTW selections, and Chavez's four are tied with a handful of Sooners for the second most. Kentucky's Rhyne Howard set an SEC record with eight honors.

■ Chavez is the only freshman guard in the country with three 29-point games (29 vs. KC; 29 vs. FSU; 33 vs. NCST) this season. Her 29-point, seven 3-pointer, six-assist showing vs. Florida State made her the first freshman since Caitlin Clark in 2021 to hit those marks. **After shooting 26.5% in her first two collegiate games, she has converted 45% from the field, 38% from 3 and 85% at the line over the last 11 games**.

■ Chavez's six games of 20 points or more are the most among all true freshmen and rank seventh among all SEC players.

■ She was named to the preseason watch lists for the Tamika Catchings National Freshman of the Year Award, Naismith Trophy National Player of the Year, Wooden Award and Nancy Lieberman Point Guard of the Year Award.

THE ZYA FACTOR

■ OU sophomore guard **Zya Vann** is enjoying a breakout season. After averaging 6.9 points and 2.4 rebounds per game off the bench as a freshman, Vann has elevated her production as a starter, scoring **11.3 points per game on 44% shooting**, including **39% from three**. The Edmond, Okla., native also averages **4.3 rebounds, 2.2 assists and 2.6 steals** per contest.

■ Vann has been especially strong over OU's last five games, averaging 12.6 points on 46% shooting while adding 5.4 rebounds and 3.6 steals per game. That stretch includes a **career-high 21 points and her first career double-double (21 points, 10 rebounds) against NC Central on Dec. 22**, along with a 19-point performance versus Little Rock. **She has scored in double figures in nine of her last 12 games**.

■ While her offensive growth has been notable, Vann's defense continues to set her apart. She has recorded nine multi-steal games, and her **five performances with at least four steals are tied for the 15th most nationally**. Vann set a Baranczyk-era high with seven steals against Coppin State and added six steals in the first half versus NC Central. In five games against Power Five opponents this season, she has totaled 12 steals.

THE COMPLETE GUARD: PAYTON VERHULST

- The most complete guard in the country and a candidate for the Ann Meyers Drysdale Award (nation's best shooting guard), **Payton Verhulst** has continued her strong play in her final season. She averages 10.6 points, 6.4 rebounds, 3.1 assists, 1.4 steals and 1.0 blocks per game – **one of three players nationally to hit that mark and the only shooting guard in the country**. Last season she ranked **third nationally** among all shooting guards in DRAPM (Defensive Regularized Adjusted Plus/Minus) at **3.7**, and this year the Sooners rank in the **99th percentile in defensive rating** when she is on the floor.
- Verhulst, a preseason All-SEC Second Team selection, built on her 2024 Big 12 Newcomer of the Year and All-America honorable mention campaign with another standout season last year. She averaged 14.9 points, 5.7 rebounds, 3.9 assists, and 1.4 steals in 2024-25, becoming one of just two players nationally to average at least 14.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, and 4.0 assists in under 30 minutes per game.
- Verhulst broke out in OU's win over East Texas A&M on Nov. 19, becoming the only player in the country this season to post a double-double with 17 points, 10 rebounds, 5 assists and 3 steals in less than 28 minutes.
- One of the nation's top perimeter shooters, Verhulst has logged 23 games with three or more 3-pointers since the start of the 2023-24 season. Her 83 made threes ranked second in the SEC last year, highlighted by a career-high 38-point outing vs. Missouri that included six triples.
- A versatile playmaker and one of OU's four McDonald's All-Americans, Verhulst notched a 29-point, 10-rebound, 10-assist triple-double against No. 13 Duke last season, becoming one of just two players (joining Caitlin Clark) since 1999 to post a 25-point triple-double vs. a ranked opponent.
- Verhulst isn't just excelling on the court, the redshirt senior was named to the **Kay Yow Foundation's 2025-26 Servant Leader Class**, an honor recognizing student-athletes who embody leadership, selflessness and service. She wears a Kay Yow Servant Leader patch on her jersey, signifying her place among just 64 women's basketball players nationwide to earn the distinction. Her younger sister, Addie, battled and beat a rare ovarian germ cell tumor in 2024.
- The guard was a five-star prospect in high school and a decorated USA Basketball gold medalist, earning MVP honors at the 2019 FIBA Americas U16 Championship and winning gold again at the 2021 FIBA U19 World Cup. She comes from a strong basketball lineage, as her mother, Robin, played women's basketball at Duke, her father, David, played men's basketball at Rockhurst, her sister Ashton played women's basketball at UCF, and her sister Kirston is a freshman at Middle Tennessee State.

THE SAHARA SPARK

- Former five-star recruit in the 2024 class **Sahara Williams** has elevated her play this season and is having a career year, averaging career highs in points (13.6), rebounds (8.4), assists (3.9), steals (1.1) and blocks (0.7). **Williams is the one of two Power Five players (Addy Brown - Iowa State/Sarah Strong - UConn) averaging at least 13.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and 3.5 assists per game.**
- Williams has started every game of her career and averaged 10.6 points, 4.8 rebounds and 2.2 assists last season. She elevated her play in SEC action, scoring in double figures 13 times over the final 20 games. **Dating back to last season, she has scored in double figures in 21 of her last 26 games.**
- In the win over East Texas A&M on Nov. 19, she joined Raegan Beers as the only Sooners in the last 15 seasons to record a 20-point double-double with 4+ assists while shooting 80%. Williams posted 22 points on 8-for-9 shooting (2-for-2 from deep) with 11 rebounds, four assists and a block.
- Williams has starred on the international stage, winning gold medals with Team USA at the 2022 and 2023 FIBA 3x3 U18 World Cups. She competed with the 2025 USA Women's National 3x3 Team at the FIBA 3x3 World Cup and helped the U.S. to a runner-up finish in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia, during the 2025 Women's 3x3 Series.

UP NEXT

- The Sooners remain in Norman to host No. 14 Ole Miss (14-2, 1-0 SEC) at Lloyd Noble Center on Thursday at 6 p.m. on SEC Network+.
- The Sooners defeated the Rebels last season in Oxford, 66-56, without Raegan Beers playing in the game. Since 2021, OU is 3-0 against Ole Miss, winning each game by exactly 10 points.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

- Lloyd Noble Center opened in 1976 and has earned a reputation as one of the toughest places to play in college basketball. It has been home to countless Sooner legends including Stacey Dales, Aaryn Ellenberg, Courtney Paris, Danielle Robinson and Phylesha Whaley who helped shape the rise of Oklahoma women's basketball.
- The arena is where Oklahoma set a school record with 26 consecutive home wins during a three year stretch from 1984-86. For more than 50 years, the Lloyd Noble Center has served as the foundation for the program's remarkable growth.
- Nearly five million fans have entered the Lloyd Noble Center since its doors first opened, all expecting to witness a Sooner victory. Oklahoma owns a 483-175 (.733) all-time record at the venue, a mark that reflects true home-court dominance. Under Jennie Baranczyk, the Sooners are 63-10 at the arena.
- The facility received a major renovation in 2024 that added a world class locker room, improved recovery spaces and enhanced team areas to give student athletes a championship level environment.

Jennie Baranczyk was named the ninth head coach of the Oklahoma women's basketball program on April 10, 2021. She is in her fifth season in Norman in 2025-26 after leading the program through four of its most successful seasons.

Baranczyk (**pronounced buh-RON-check**), a 14-year head coaching veteran, spent nine seasons at Drake before beginning her tenure at Oklahoma in 2021-22. In four seasons with the Sooners, she has restored the program's national standing, guiding OU to four consecutive NCAA Tournaments, a 2025 Sweet 16 appearance and two conference championships.

Her teams have posted 20-win seasons in 10 of the last 11 years, including four straight in Norman. She has led her teams to seven total NCAA Tournaments and coached 36 all-conference selections over the last 13 seasons.

In 2025, Baranczyk led Oklahoma through its first season in the Southeastern Conference. The Sooners went 27-8, earned a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament and advanced to the program's first Sweet 16 since 2013. OU went 11-5 in league play, tying for fourth in the SEC and advancing to the conference tournament semifinals.

She brought in the nation's top transfer, Raegan Beers, who earned first-team All-SEC and All-America honors. Payton Verhulst added second-team All-SEC recognition and the staff secured the No. 5 recruiting class for 2025, highlighted by top-ranked prospect and Gatorade National Player of the Year Aaliyah Chavez.

In 2023-24, Baranczyk led Oklahoma to a second straight Big 12 regular season title and the program's first outright championship since 2009. The Sooners went 15-3 in league play and 23-10 overall. Baranczyk earned Big 12 Coach of the Year honors and was a semifinalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year award. OU earned a No. 5 seed in the NCAA Tournament and advanced to the second round.

Skylar Vann became OU's first Big 12 Player of the Year since Courtney Paris in 2009, while Payton Verhulst was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Year. Vann and Verhulst both earned All-Big 12 First Team and All-America honors. Additionally, Nevaeh Tot and Sahara Williams earned All-Big 12 honorable mentions.

In her second season, she guided the Sooners to a share of the 2022-23 Big 12 regular season title with a 14-4 league mark and 26-7 overall record. OU reached the NCAA Tournament for a second consecutive year, earning a program-record six sweeps in conference play and posting the program's most Big 12 wins in 13 seasons.

Madi Williams earned unanimous All-Big 12 First Team honors, while Taylor Robertson and Ana Llanusa were named to the second team and Skylar Vann earned honorable mention. Vann repeated as Big 12 Sixth Player of the Year and Beatrice Culliton made the Big 12 All-Freshman Team. Williams became OU's first WNBA Draft pick since 2013 and joined Robertson on the AP and WBCA All-America lists.

In her first season, Baranczyk orchestrated one of the nation's top turnarounds. She led the Sooners to a 25-9 record and an NCAA second-round appearance, improving the program by 13 wins from the previous season. She was named a WBCA National Coach of

the Year finalist as the team reached 20 wins faster than all but two teams in program history and rose to No. 12 in the AP Poll.

She became the only first-year head coach in OU history to sweep Baylor and Oklahoma State and added a win over Texas. Her four top-25 victories were the most by a first-year Sooner head coach and the most for the program since 2010.

Robertson and Williams were unanimous All-Big 12 First Team picks, the first OU duo to accomplish the feat since 2012. Vann was named Big 12 Sixth Player of the Year and Kelbie Washington earned All-Freshman honors. Robertson earned All-America honorable mention, becoming OU's first All-American since 2014.

Prior to Oklahoma, Baranczyk went 192-96 at Drake, where she led the Bulldogs to three NCAA Tournament appearances, six straight 20-win seasons and back-to-back undefeated Missouri Valley Conference regular seasons. A two-time MVC Coach of the Year and the 2017 ESPNW Mid-Major Coach of the Year, she produced 24 all-conference selections and oversaw one of the most dominant three-year runs in league history with a 53-1 record from 2017-19.

She began her coaching career with stints as an assistant at Kansas State, Marquette and Colorado, helping each program to postseason play and a WNIT championship at both Kansas State and Marquette.

A standout at Iowa from 2000-04, Baranczyk was a three-time All-Big Ten selection and helped the Hawkeyes to three NCAA Tournaments and the 2001 Big Ten Tournament title. She remains the only player in program history ranked in the top 10 in points, rebounds, assists, steals and blocks.

She earned her bachelor's degree in communication studies from Iowa in 2004 and received the Big Ten's Medal of Honor. Baranczyk earned a master's degree in counseling and student development from Kansas State in 2006. She and her husband Scott have a son Eli and two daughters Jordi and Hope.
