### GAME SET-UP

#### THE MATCH-UP...

- No. 15/15 Tennessee (14-3, 6-0 SEC) is back at Food City Center on Thursday night, as Mississippi State (15-6, 2-5 SEC) pays a midweek visit for the teams' second meeting this season.
- The Lady Vols, who were off Monday after their game at No. 17/17 Ole Miss was postponed, face the Bulldogs at 6:30 p.m. ET in a contest that will be broadcast on SECN+ and available on the Lady Vol Radio Network and SiriusXM Satellite Radio (Ch. 384).
- UT enters on a seven-game winning streak and has been victorious in nine of its last 10 after edging No. 11/12 Kentucky, 60-58, in Knoxville last Thursday night.
- Kim Caldwell's squad remains as the only SEC team without a blemish in league play entering Thursday's slate of games.
- MSU, meanwhile, has dropped five of its past six, but it did beat (then) No. 7 Kentucky on Jan. 18, 71-59, and pushed No. 5 Vandy before falling, 89-85, on Jan. 15.
- UT improved to 42-8 in the series after prevailing, 90-80, in Starkville on Jan. 8.
- The Lady Vols have won the past three match-ups and five of the last six vs. MSU.

#### LOOK AT THE LADY VOL...

- Through Jan. 26, UT stands atop the SEC standings and is No. 17 in the NET.
- Tennessee is led by 6-0 redshirt junior guard Talaysia Cooper (14.4 ppg., 5.7 rpg., 41 apg., 3.4 spg., 29 3FGs), 6-4 senior forward Janiah Barker (14.3 ppg., 6.9 rpg., 19 3FGs), freshman guard Mia Pauldo (12.1 ppg., 43 assts./20 TOS, 35 3FGs) and senior forward Zee Spearman (11.3 ppg., 6.9 rpg., 18 3FGs).
- Senior guard Nya Robertson (8.2 ppg., 2.8 rpg., 32 3FGs) is right behind them.
- The Lady Vols rank No. 6 nationally in threes made per game (9.7), with seven games of 10+ treys made (2x in SEC play).
- UT is No. 8 nationally in offensive rebounds per game (16.7) and No. 19 in total rebounds per contest (42.7).
- Tennessee is No. 25 nationally in steals per game (11.9), No. 23 in TO margin (6.47) and No. 21 in TOS forced per contest (21.59), carding 10+ steals on 12 occasions and forcing 20+ turnovers 11 times.
- UT is No. 24 in NCAA scoring offense (79.4) and No. 23 in scoring margin (19.1).
- The Big Orange bench contributes 26.6 points per contest, ranking No. 31 nationally.

#### TRENDING...

- Tennessee is aiming for its eighth straight victory, which would rank as the second longest streak of the Caldwell era behind last year's 13-0 season-opening spree.
- The Lady Vols are seeking a 7-0 SEC start for the first time since 2022-23.
- UT is trying to improve to 9-0 in Knoxville in 2025-26, to record its longest home streak of the Caldwell era and to post its most home wins in a row since a nine-game string from 12/20/21 to 2/24/22.
- Tennessee notched its first back-to-back wins over ranked teams since 2021-22.
- UT has risen to No. 2 in scoring defense in SEC games (61.33) after holding four of its last five league foes under 60 points.
- The Lady Vols rank No. 2 vs. SEC foes in field goal pct. defense (.372) and three-point field goal pct. defense (.235).
- In SEC play, Mia Pauldo ranks No. 11 overall and second among freshmen in scoring at 16.0 ppg.
- UT has committed an average of only 9.7 turnovers in its past three games.
- After combining for 23 vs. Alabama, Tennessee's highly-touted freshmen tallied 38 of the Big Orange's 60 points vs. UK.

## HOME SWEET HOME

- This is the 39th season that the Tennessee women's and men's basketball teams have called Food City Center home. The Lady Vols own a remarkable 540-64 record (.894) in the venue through the Kentucky game.
- Kim Caldwell officially is 21-4 all-time in games played on The Summitt through Jan. 22, including 14-0 vs. non-conference opponents.
- The game vs. Winthrop on Dec. 14, 2025, marked the 600th Lady Vol game played at the Food City Center since they opened with a 102-59 victory over Stetson on Dec. 3, 1987, as part of a doubleheader with the Tennessee's men's team.
- The Lady Vols have built a combined 694-88 (.887) home mark in contests played at Food City Center, Stokely Athletics Center and Alumni Gym through the Kentucky contest.
- The 500th win in this venue alone came on Jan. 1, 2023, via an 89-76 victory over Alabama.

## DRAWING BIG CROWDS

- Tennessee stands at No. 4 in NCAA women's basketball for average home attendance at 10,589 per game in 2025-26 through Kentucky after finishing 2024-25 at No. 5 with 10,647 fans per game over 17 contests at Food City Center.

- Through Jan. 22, the Lady Vols have drawn home crowds of 10,000-plus in six regular season games, with a season-most 12,551 on hand vs. Kentucky.
- They had eight gatherings of 10K plus a year ago, which stood as the most since nine in 2015-16.
- The Nov. 7 attendance of 10,671 vs. ETSU was the largest in a home opener for Tennessee since 10,913 were on hand on Nov. 15, 2012, against Rice.
- UT's exhibition game attendance of 10,159 vs. Columbus State on Oct. 29, 2025, was the most for an exhibition contest since 10,507 fans were on hand for the Nov. 4, 2013, tilt vs. Carson-Newman.

## WEARING SUMMITT BLUE VS. STATE

- Tennessee will wear its "Summitt Blue" uniforms on Thursday night vs. Mississippi State
- Summitt Blue stands alongside "Smokey Grey" and "Dark Mode" (formerly Anthracite) as the three accent or alternate colors on Tennessee Athletics' official color palette.
- The history of how blue became part of the Lady Vol brand is documented on page 11 of this notes package.
- UT is 8-4 all-time wearing its "Summitt Blue" uniforms, including 1-1 in 2022-23, 3-1 in 2023-24, 2-2 in 2024-25 and 2-0 in 2025-26.
- The Lady Vols won at UT Martin on Nov. 9 (72-61) and prevailed at Stanford on Dec. 3 (65-62) while wearing "Summitt Blue" this season.
- All-time, the Lady Vols are 4-1 at home in blue, 3-2 on the road and 1-1 at neutral sites through 12/3/25.

## UPCOMING PROMOS

- The first 250 UT students at Thursday night's Mississippi State game will receive a Summitt Blue Homefield shirt.
- The Texas A&M game on Feb. 19 will be UT's Play4Kay contest.

## FAMILIAR FACES

- Tennessee assistant coach Gabe Lazo was an associate head coach at Mississippi State and spent two seasons in Starkville before joining Kim Caldwell's Lady Vol staff prior to the 2024-25 season.
- Lazo helped the Bulldogs to a pair of 20-win seasons, a top-15 prep signing class and a top-three portal class.
- At UT, he has helped Kim Caldwell sign a highly-regarded five-player portal class in spring 2024, ESPN's No. 2 prep group in 2025, one of the top portal classes in 2025 and the No. 9 prep signing group in 2026.
- Second-year Mississippi State assistant coach Samantha Williams spent three seasons at Tennessee on Kellie Harper's staff from 2021-24 and previously worked with MSU head coach Sam Purcell when they were assistants at Louisville.

## STREAKING ALONG IN SEC PLAY

- Tennessee carries several streaks into Thursday's game.
- The Big Orange will attempt to extend its current winning streak to eight consecutive.
- The Lady Vols are trying to win their seventh straight in league play, stay unbeaten and retain their position atop the SEC standings.
- UT also will attempt to improve to 9-0 at home, establishing its longest home streak under Kim Caldwell.

## TENNESSEE IN SEC PLAY

- UT is 462-110 (.808) in SEC regular-season games through the Kentucky game, featuring the best conference record by far all-time among league schools.
- In 2025-26, Tennessee stands at 6-0 in league play through Jan. 22, including 3-0 at home and 3-0 on the road.

## LADY VOL POINTS OF PRIDE

- THE ONLY TEAM IN ALL 43:** Tennessee is the only women's basketball program to compete in all 43 NCAA Tournaments.

- WINNINGEST PROGRAM:** The Lady Vols have the most all-time wins by a women's basketball program in NCAA DI history, standing at 1,509-400 through the Kentucky game.

- MOST NCAA TOURNEY GAMES:** The Lady Vols have played more games in the NCAA Tournament than any other program, appearing in 168 postseason contests and standing 133-35 in those games entering 2025-26.

- WNBA FIRST ROUND FACTORY:** Rickea Jackson became the 46th Lady Vol to be drafted and the 21st first-rounder in the WNBA Draft, going fourth to Los Angeles in 2024. Tennessee is one of only three schools all-time to produce first-rounders in the four consecutive drafts with Rennia Davis, Rae Burrell, Jordan Horston and Jackson moving on to the professional ranks from 2021-24.

- FIFTEEN UT OLYMPIC PLAYERS:** Cierra Burdick became the 15th Lady Vol in history to make an Olympic Team as a basketball player, serving as captain of the USA's 2024 3x3 team. She and her teammates brought home a bronze medal from Paris, and Burdick was in the front of the boat with other U.S. athletes, including LeBron James and Coco Gauff, as they motored down the Seine during the opening ceremonies.

- HALL OF FAMERS:** Tennessee has 10 former players and three former coaches enshrined in the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame. Candace Parker will join them this summer. Pat Summitt, Tamika Catchings and 1976 U.S. Olympians Summitt (player/UT Martin graduate) Cindy Brogdon and Trish Roberts are members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball of Fame.

- 100 PERCENT GRAD. RATE:** Every Lady Vol who has completed her eligibility at UT has left with a degree, with 172 earning the right to sign the "Graduation Pole" in the locker room.

- Kim Caldwell is 14-8 all-time in regular season SEC games through Jan. 22, 2026, standing 7-4 at home and 7-4 on the road.
- The Lady Vols were 8-8 (t8th) in SEC play, including 4-4 at home and 4-4 on the road, in her first season at UT in 2025-26.
- Tennessee owns league bests of 18 regular-season championships and 17 SEC tourney titles through the years. South Carolina is second with nine each.

#### HOLDING SEC FOES TO 60 AND FEWER

- Tennessee has held four of its first six SEC opponents under 60 points in 2025-26 and ranks No. 2 in conference games in scoring defense at 61.33 ppg.
- By comparison, the Lady Vols did not hold any league foe under 60 during regular season SEC play in 2024-25. It did limit Texas A&M to 37 in the SEC Tournament.
- UT has held Auburn, Arkansas, No. 21/21 Alabama and No. 11/12 Kentucky to 56, 50, 59 and 58, respectively, this season.
- It has been since 2022-23 (5 times) that the Big Orange held as many opponents to 60 points or fewer in league games in a season.

#### COOPER ON DEFENSIVE POTY WATCH LIST

- Talaysia Cooper is on the Naismith Women's College Defensive Player of the Year Watch List, announced on Jan. 27.
- Cooper was a top-10 semifinalist last season and a 2025 SEC All-Defensive Team choice.
- At the top of UT's press, Cooper is a key reason why Tennessee averages 11.9 steals per game, forces 21.59 turnovers per contest and has forced foes into 17 10-second halfcourt violations.
- She also has been instrumental in the Lady Vols' half-court defense, enabling her team to hold four of its first six SEC opponents to fewer than 60 points and limit teams to 61.3 ppg. and 37.2-percent shooting in league play.

#### FRESHMAN MIA PAULDO STEPPING UP

- Freshman guard Mia Pauldo has been a key to Tennessee winning nine of its past 10 games, including seven in a row and a 6-0 start in SEC play.
- She has scored in double figures nine times and re-

corded four career-high scoring efforts.

- She leads the Lady Vols at 15.7 ppg. during that span.
- She is shooting 44% FG / 36% 3FG / 94% FT over the past 10 games and has totaled 31 assists, 13 turnovers and five games with 0 turnovers.
- Pauldo has made 30 of 32 free-throw attempts, dating back to the Stanford game on Dec. 3.
- She is second in SEC freshman scoring in six league games (16.0 ppg.) and 11th overall among all players.
- Pauldo scored 10 in the fourth quarter in UT's road win over No. 21/21 Alabama on Jan. 18 and nine in the final frame in last Thursday's home victory over No. 11/12 Kentucky.

#### A LOOK AT OUR LAST GAME

- No. 17/17 Tennessee's highly-touted freshman class combined for 38 points, and the Lady Vols held an SEC opponent below 60 points for the fourth time in five games, seizing a 60-58 victory over No. 11/12 Kentucky in front of a season-high crowd of 12,551 last Thursday night at Food City Center.
- The Wildcats (17-4, 4-3 SEC) had the ball with a chance to tie or win it with eight seconds left in the game, but UT knocked the ball loose and forced a jump ball. With two seconds left, UK had alternate possession and another opportunity, but redshirt junior Talaysia Cooper forced UK's 21st turnover to end the threat and deliver the Big Orange (14-3, 6-0 SEC) its first back-to-back wins over ranked teams since the 2021-22 season and extend its winning streak to seven games.
- Freshman guard Mia Pauldo continued her strong play since the calendar turned to December, firing in 21 points as the only Tennessee player to score in double figures. Fellow rookie guards Deniya Prawl and Jaida Civil offered Pauldo support, with Prawl contributing an SEC high of nine and Civil chipping in eight. Civil also led the squad in rebounds with nine and tied for the lead in assists with three, as the Lady Vols persevered without injured senior forward Janiah Barker, the team's second-leading scorer.
- UK, which was without its star forward Teonni Key, was paced by three players scoring in double digits. Amelia Hassett tallied 16, while Jordan Obi produced a 14-point, 11-rebound double-double and Tonie Morgan added 13 points. UK's leading scorer, Clara Strack, was

held to nine points, but she pulled down a game-best 15 boards.

#### NOTES FROM THE KENTUCKY GAME

• **PRESSING DEFENSE:** The Lady Vols were stiff defensively against the Wildcats, holding their fourth SEC opponent in the past five contests to fewer than 60 points. UT limited Kentucky to its second-lowest scoring effort all year with 58 points. Their low of 51 came vs. Alabama. UT's defense was strong all game, holding the Wildcats to their lowest first-half output this season and tying the lowest half the Wildcats have had in either half this year. The seven points Tennessee surrendered in the first quarter marked its best opening frame defensive effort in SEC play, and UK's 22 first-half points were only two away from the low of 20 allowed vs. Arkansas in the second half as the lowest surrendered in either half during the current campaign.

• **MIA MAKING HER MARK:** Mia Pauldo's 21 points paced UT for the second time this season, joining her effort of 26 at Mississippi State on Jan. 8. Pauldo has been on fire in SEC play, averaging 16 points per game over the six-game stretch. The freshman has been especially clutch in the fourth quarter of the past two games, scoring 10 against #21/21 Alabama and nine versus #11/12 UK. Pauldo now has scored 10 or more points in 11 games this season, and five of them have come during conference play.

• **TURNING THEM OVER:** Tennessee has now hurried 11 opponents into 20+ turnovers on the season after forcing 21 against the Big Blue. The Lady Vols are causing an average of 21.59 miscues a game and rank in the top 25 nationally for turnovers forced per contest. UT also came up with 11 steals vs. UK, marking the 12th time the Big Orange has tallied 10 or more in 2025-26.

• **FRESHMEN CAME TO PLAY:** A total of 38 of UT's points came from its highly-regarded freshman class in the win against Kentucky. Mia Pauldo, Deniya Prawl and Jaida Civil were the leading scorers for the Big Orange, and they started it with 21 of the Lady Vols' 29 first-half points. They finished with 38 of the team's 60.

#### FRESHMAN IMPACT VS. ARKANSAS, TOO

- UConn leads the series, 17-10, and holds a 3-2 advantage in games played in Hartford, with UT earning its last victory there on Jan. 6, 2007, 70-64.

**A SNAP SHOT, IF YOU HAVEN'T SEEN US...**

- The Lady Vols press on defense, force turnovers and backcourt violations, and try to generate easy buckets.
- Tennessee employs an uptempo offense that relies on reads in halfcourt, drives and opportunities for layups or kick-outs for open three-pointers.
- The pace is fast, and all-out effort is expected of players, so frequent and sometime multiple substitutions will be the norm throughout the game and are needed by the players to catch their breath and recover.
- Often, opponents become fatigued by the tempo and fade as the game wears on.
- UT was 24-10 and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 a year ago in Kim Caldwell's first season at the helm.
- In a year that saw her start a new job and also give birth to her first child (a son, Conor) on Jan. 20, Tennessee picked up notable wins in 2024-25 over UConn, Ohio State, Florida State and Iowa.
- The Lady Vols signed the No. 2 2025 high school signing class, with McDonald's All-Americans Mia Pauldo, Deniya Prawl and Jaida Civil leading the way.
- Caldwell added a top portal group as well, including Janiah Barker, Nya Robertson and Jersey Wolfenbarger.
- Prior to UT, Caldwell led Glenville State to seven NCAA appearances in as many years, including final fours in 2022 and 2023 and an NCAA Division II title in 2022, before sweeping Sun Belt regular season and tournament crowns en route to NCAA Division I Maggie Dixon Rookie Coach of the Year distinction and an NCAA DI berth in her only season at Marshall in 2023-24.

**ONE OF THE FASTEST TO 250 WINS**

- In the SEC opener vs. Florida on Jan. 1, Kim Caldwell reached 250 career victories in her 10th season as a head coach.
- One of the youngest to ever do that, Caldwell hit 250 wins at the age of 37 years, one month and eight days.
- She is one of only nine active coaches at all levels of NCAA women's basketball to reach 250 victories by her 10th season as a head coach.
- Caldwell ranks third among active NCAA Division I women's coaches in career winning percentage (.853) and is ninth among active women's coaches from all NCAA divisions with at least a complete season of head coaching experience.
- Caldwell has a career record of 255-44 (.853) entering Thursday's game, including 38-13 in her second year at Tennessee and 64-20 in her third season at the DI level (26-7 at Marshall in 2023-24).
- Including a COVID year in which her team played only 16 games, Caldwell entered 2025-26 averaging 26.8 wins per season. Her teams at Glenville State won 30+ on four occasions.

- Tennessee stands at No. 17 in the NCAA's NET rankings as of Jan. 27.
- The Big Orange's next three opponents, Mississippi State, UConn and Georgia, are slotted at No. 34, No. 1 and No. 32, respectively.
- The Lady Vols' top NET victories are over No. 14 Kentucky, No. 28 Alabama, No. 34 Mississippi State, No. 36 Stanford, No. 54 Florida, No. 67 Auburn and No. 93 Belmont.

- The breakdown includes the 8th toughest for past opposition (220-113, .661) and No. 1 toughest for future opposition (170-36, .825).
- Kim Caldwell entered 2025-26 with her team ticketed to play the top six teams in the AP Preseason Top 25, seven of the top 10 and 11 total ranked squads.
- On the preseason slate, the Lady Vols were at No. 1 UConn, at No. 2 South Carolina, at No. 3 UCLA, vs. No. 4 Texas in Starkville, at No. 5 LSU, at No. 6 Oklahoma and vs. No. 9 NC State in Greensboro, N.C.
- The other preseason ranked challenges included games at No. 12 Ole Miss, vs. No. 19 Vanderbilt in Knoxville, vs. No. 20 Louisville in Brooklyn, N.Y., and vs. No. 24 Kentucky in Knoxville.

- Tennessee has a 42-8 all-time record vs. Mississippi State after winning five of the past six meetings, including a 90-80 decision in Starkville on Jan. 8, 2026.
- UT is 19-3 vs. MSU in Knoxville, 19-3 vs. the Bulldogs in Starkville and 4-2 at neutral sites.
- The Bulldogs last won in Knoxville in 2020, marking only their third all-time victory on Rocky Top in the series. UT has won the past three on The Summitt.
- State has a 2-0 record in overtime games between these programs, winning a 65-63 affair in Starkville on Jan. 29, 2016, and a 91-90 double-overtime thriller at Humphrey Coliseum on Feb. 26, 2023.
- UT and MSU have faced off six times in the SEC Tournament, with the Lady Vols owning a 4-2 record.

**LAST TIME WE MET**

- Freshman guard Mia Pauldo scored a career-high 26 points to lead four players in double figures, as hot-shooting No. 20/22 Tennessee prevailed over Mississippi State, 90-80, on Jan. 8, 2026, in Starkville.
- Pauldo finished eight of 12 from the field and eight of nine from the free-throw line to tie for the eighth-best scoring effort by a freshman in UT history. Also in double figures for the Lady Vols (11-3, 3-0) were senior forward Janiah Barker with 18 and senior forward Zee Spearman and redshirt junior Talaysia Cooper with 14 each, as UT shot 50.7 percent vs. the Bulldogs and carded its second-straight game making over 50 percent of its shots.
- MSU (14-3, 1-2 SEC) was paced by Kharyssa Richardson and Madison Francis, who each finished with 22 points, with Francis adding a game-high 13 rebounds. Destiney McPhaul also scored in double figures, tossing in 14.

**LAST TIME WE PLAYED IN KNOXVILLE**

- No. 15 Tennessee shot 46 percent from beyond the arc, connecting on 12 of 26 attempts, to hand Mississippi State an 86-73 loss on Jan. 16, 2025, in Knoxville.
- Ruby Whitehorn made eight of 16 shots from the field, including two of five tries from three-point range, to lead UT (15-2, 3-2 SEC) with a season-high 20 points. Samara Spencer hit four treys and had 18 points, while Talaysia Cooper added a 16-point, 10-rebound double-double and Jewel Spear tossed in 13 on 4-of-6 marksmanship from long range.
- The Bulldogs (15-4, 2-3 SEC) placed three players in double figures, led by 17 points from Jerkaila Jordan. Debreasha Powe and Destiney McPhaul chipped in with 16 and 11, respectively.

**GETTING IT DONE ACADEMICALLY**

- Lady Vol basketball is enjoying success off the court as well, carding its best team grade point average for the fall semester covering the 2013-25 time period.
- After recording a 3.37 mark in 2023 and a 3.39 effort in 2024, UT women's hoops posted a 3.46 GPA for fall 2025.
- As a whole, UT Athletics had all 16 teams earn a team GPA of 3.0 or higher for the sixth consecutive semester.
- The overall UT student-athlete GPA of 3.49 and number of dean's list members (283) also stand as bests during that period.

**FIFTEEN DIFFERENT STARTING FIVES**

- Tennessee has utilized 15 different starting lineup combinations in 17 games after opening the year with differing first fives in its initial 14 games of the 2025-26 campaign.
- Ten different Lady Vols have been in the starting five.
- Zee Spearman has started 15 contests to lead the Big Orange, while Talaysia Cooper has 13 and Janiah Barker and Mia Pauldo have 12 each.
- Mia Pauldo started in the opener vs. NC State and was the first freshman to start for Tennessee in an opener since Marta Suarez did so on Nov. 28, 2020, and the 24th to do so all time.
- Mia Pauldo and Jaida Civil are the freshmen with the most starts, with 12 and nine, respectively.
- UT used 17 different starting combos a year ago, and 10 different players were in the 2024-25 starting lineup.

**WE'LL TAKE THAT, PLEASE AND THANK YOU!**

- Tennessee is averaging 11.9 steals per game and ranks No. 25 nationally in that category.
- The Lady Vols have recorded double digits in steals vs. 12 of 17 opponents in 2025-26 (including five straight from Nov. 7-23) and vs. 30 foes total during the Kim Caldwell era.
- The Big Orange has notched 10+ in four SEC games.
- UT's total of 23 steals vs. Coppin State on Nov. 23 was its most this season and the third time the program has eclipsed 20 during the Kim Caldwell era along with 27 vs. Samford (11/5/24) and 22 vs. NC Central (12/14/24).
- Talaysia Cooper's career-best 10 steals vs. Stanford on Dec. 3 tied for No. 2 in school history and No. 8 in SEC history. Michelle Marciak holds the UT record at 11.
- Cooper (4) and Janiah Barker (1) have recorded games with five or more steals this season.
- Tennessee finished with 385 steals in 34 games in 2024-25 for the 10th highest total in school history.
- UT's season total of double-digit steals efforts a year ago came to 18 after it grabbed 15 vs. Ohio State on March 23 in the NCAA Second Round.
- The Lady Vol record for most 10+ steal performances in a season is 35, which occurred in 1997-98. No. 2 is 28 (2007-08, 1988-89, while No. 3 is 26 in 2006-07.

**TURNING THEM OVER**

- The Big Orange women are forcing 21.59 turnovers per game vs. their foes to rank No. 21 nationally.
- UT has forced 11 opponents into 20+ turnovers, hurrying Coppin State into 36 and Stanford into 30. Two SEC foes have had 20+, led with a high of 26 by Arkansas.
- The total vs. Coppin was the fourth-most of the Kim Caldwell era behind efforts of 44 (NC Central, 12/14/24) and 37 (Samford, 11/5/24 & Western Carolina, 11/26/24).
- The Stanford game marked the 10th time in Caldwell's tenure Tennessee has caused 30 or more turnovers after UT did so eight times in 2024-25.
- UT forced 754 turnovers (most by the program since 784 in 2007-08) and finished No. 9 nationally and No. 1 in the SEC in TOs forced per game at 22.18 last season.
- Twenty-one of UT's 34 foes in 2024-25 committed at least 20 miscues.
- The 44 miscues by N.C. Central in 2024-25 marked only the fifth time in program annals that a team committed 40 or more. The others: Hawaii Pacific (50, 1985-86), Memphis (46, 1998-99), Stetson (42, 1989-90) and Charlotte (40, 1992-93).

**GENERATING POINTS OFF TURNOVERS**

- Tennessee is beating its opponents, 24.7 to 14.0 per game in points off turnovers and has won that battle in 13 of 17 games (exceptions: UCLA, Auburn, Miss. St.).
- The +44-point differential vs. Coppin State (57-13) on Nov. 23 was the largest of the season for Tennessee.
- The Lady Vols outscored Arkansas, 25-6, on points off turnovers, holding a foe to its lowest total of the year.
- Versus ranked teams, UT won points-off-turnovers vs. No. 9/8 NC State (16-9), lost vs. No. 3/3 UCLA (29-13), won vs. #16/17 Louisville (26-22), won vs. No. 21/21 Alabama (20-9) and won vs. #11/12 Kentucky (13-0).
- As a direct result of opponents' turnovers in 2024-25, UT generated 29.0 points per game off those miscues vs. its opposition (while allowing 13.6 ppg.).

**HITTING THE BOARDS**

- Tennessee has won the battle of the boards in 10 of 17 games and has a 42.7 to 38.1 differential (+4.6) through the Kentucky game.
- The Big Orange women rank No. 19 nationally in rebounds per game (42.71).
- UT has a season high of 54 rebounds vs. Winthrop, and its SEC best is 49 vs. Florida and Arkansas.
- The Lady Vols limited Florida and UT Martin to season-low rebound totals of 26.
- UT has had more offensive rebounds than its opponents in 13 of 17 games (exceptions: Louisville, Auburn, Miss. St., Alabama) and is averaging 16.7 o-boards per contest to rank No. 8 nationally.
- Its biggest offensive board margin was +15 (20-5) vs. Florida, with +13 (23-12) vs. Belmont ranking second.
- Tennessee has grabbed 15 or more offensive rebounds in every game except three (Auburn, Alabama, Kentucky), including a high of 23 vs. Belmont, and has three contests of +20 (23-Belmont, 20-Fla., 20-Ark.).
- The Lady Vols are 9-1 in games where they had more rebounds than their opponents and are 11-2 in contests where they had more offensive rebounds.
- A year ago, UT finished No. 3 nationally and second in the league in offensive rebounds per contest at 16.9, with two efforts of 30+.

- The Lady Vols have made 10+ threes on seven occasions and have done so for the second-most times in school history.
- UT hit 10 or more three-pointers a program-best 18 times in 2024-25. The previous high was six times.
- Tennessee ranks No. 6 nationally in three-pointers made per game (9.7) and No. 3 in threes attempted per game (31.9).
- The Big Orange's season high of 18 makes came vs. Southern Indiana, checking in at No. 2 in school history and tying for No. 3 in SEC history.

- UT has allowed 14 20+ point quarters, including four vs. No. 3/3 UCLA (Q: 26 / 2Q: 23 / 3Q: 27 / 4Q: 23), three vs. No. 16/17 Louisville (Q: 24 / 3Q: 22 / 4Q: 26) and two vs. No. 9/8 NC State (Q: 25 / 3Q: 23) and Miss. State (3Q: 22 / 4Q: 21).
- Tennessee has held foes to 15 single-digit quarters, with Coppin State's four (4Q) being the lowest and Kentucky's seven (1Q) the fewest by an SEC opponent.
- UT has held five opponents (ETSU, MTSU, Coppin St., Winthrop, Southern Indiana) to single-digit scoring in two quarters.
- Last season, Tennessee scored 20 or more points in 94 of 136 quarters.
- Tennessee reached 30 points in a quarter on 10 occasions in 2024-25, including 42 points vs. N.C. Central (3Q) and 41 vs. Tulsa (2Q), which rank as the No. 2 and 3 totals in school history.

- Barker, meanwhile, has tallied 10 or more on 13 occasions including 20 against MTSU and 25 vs. No. 3/3 UCLA. She also had a 20-point, 10-rebound double-double vs. Winthrop.
- Mia Pauldo (11), Zee Spearman (10), Nya Robertson (5), Jaida Civil (3), Alyssa Latham (3), Mya Pauldo (1) and Deniya Prawl (1) also have scored 10+ in games in 2025-26.
- That makes it nine total double-figure scorers for Tennessee.
- UT had eight different players hit double figures last season.

- The fourth of those was a 19-point, 10-steal, six-assist

showing vs. Stanford in which she tied for the No. 2 steal total in UT history and No. 8 mark in SEC annals.

- The third of those was an 11-point, 11-rebound, nine-assist, seven-steal performance that flirted with both a triple-double and quadruple-double.
- In the opener vs. No. 9/8 NC State, she led Tennessee with 23 points, tied her career best with 11 rebounds and added a then-career-high seven assists.
- Against Belmont, she fired in 22 points and pulled down a career-high 14 boards.
- She now has seven career double-doubles and 14 games with 20 or more points.

- Janiah Barker is averaging 14.3 ppg. and 6.9 rpg. in 16 games, producing a career-high effort of 25 points vs. No. 3/3 UCLA on Nov. 30, a double-double of 20 points and 12 rebounds at Middle Tennessee on Nov. 20 and a double-double of 20 points and 10 rebounds vs. Winthrop.
- Barker has two double-doubles as a Lady Vol and 18 during her career.

- Barker, who now has 1,000, scored 228 of those at UT.
- Nya Robertson has scored 1,495 points combined in stints at George Washington, SMU and Tennessee and is five shy of 1,500. She has tallied 140 as a Lady Vol.

- Zee Spearman (938) stands 62 from reaching 1K and has scored 591 on Rocky Top.
- All-time, Tennessee has had 50 players score 1,000 points while wearing a Lady Vol uniform, with Ricke Jackson (35th, 1,176) and Tamari Key (48th, 1,040) joining that club in 2023-24.

- With 16 points and 10 rebounds vs. Florida, she carded her second double-double of the season, her fourth as a Lady Vol and the 10th of her career.

Janiah Barker scored 17 at Auburn, 18 at Mississippi State, 13 vs. Arkansas and 10 at Alabama to average 13.4 ppg. during SEC play. She also is coming off three of her best passing games of the year, dishing out four assists each vs. Mississippi State and Arkansas and two vs. Alabama before missing the Kentucky game.

- Zee Spearman, meanwhile, has been in double figures in four of six contests, including an effort of 20 points, eight rebounds, three assists, three steals and two blocks vs. Arkansas.
- Spearman had 14 points and five rebounds the game before at Mississippi State and 10 points, four rebounds and three assists at Alabama, carding her best back-to-back efforts of the campaign.
- Alyssa Latham suffered an injury that slowed her for a couple of games, but she is healthy and returned to the type of output that led her to card points/rebounds games of 10/5 vs. Winthrop, 10/6 vs. Southern Indiana and 9/8 vs. Florida over a four-game span. She exhibited that with a season-high 12 points at Alabama on Jan. 18.

#### NYA FROM DEEP

- Nya Robertson, who joined the team following two

seasons at George Washington and 2024-25 at SMU, second for Tennessee with 32 three-pointers made and is fifth in scoring at 8.2 ppg.

- Robertson has scored in double figures five times thus far, including a pair of 20+ efforts.
- On Nov. 23, she turned in a record-breaking performance vs. Coppin State, connecting for a Lady Vol-record 10 three-pointers in 16 attempts to tie her career high with 32 points in the win over the Eagles.
- In addition to being a UT best, the 10 makes also ranked third in SEC history, and the 16 attempts were the second most in Lady Vol annals.
- She was named Tennessee Sports Writers Association Player of the Week on Nov. 24 after that effort.
- Robertson had another big outing vs. Southern Indiana on Dec. 22, firing in six three-pointers and finishing with 20 points.
- She is tied for the team lead with five games of making three or more treys.

- Janiah Barker and Nya Robertson, who came to UT via the portal this season, have started 12 and 11 games, respectively.

• Barker is second on the team in scoring (14.3 ppg.) and is tied for first in rebounding (6.9 rpg.).

- After hitting six three-pointers all last season at UCLA, Barker has made 19 in 17 games at Tennessee.
- Robertson is fifth in scoring at 8.2 ppg. and fourth in assists (1.4 apg.).
- With 32 three-pointers, Robertson is second for UT, hitting 10 of those in 16 attempts vs. Coppin State on Nov. 23.
- The third transfer, Jersey Wolfsbarger, is contributing 1.5 ppg. and 2.0 rpg. as a reserve.
- The trio came to Rocky Top from UCLA, SMU and LSU, respectively.
- Barker was the 2025 Big 10 Sixth Player of the Year, while Robertson was All-ACC Second Team last season.

- Until the Coppin State game, the Lady Vols hadn't started three freshmen in a contest since Dec. 28, 2012, in their win against Davidson when Bashaara Graves, Jasmine Jones and Nia Moore got the nod.
- Mia Pauldo started the season opener vs. NC State and finished with 10 points, while Civil came off the bench to contribute 13 points and four rebounds.
- Mia Pauldo (11) and Civil (3) each have multiple games scoring in double figures, while Mya Pauldo and Prawl have done so once. The latter two posted career bests of 10 and 15 points, respectively, vs. Middle Tennessee.
- Mia Pauldo, who fired in career bests of 14 points at Stanford, 18 points/10 assists vs. Winthrop, 19 vs. Southern Indiana and 26 vs. Mississippi State, is second on the team in scoring at 12.1 ppg. after dropping 21 on Kentucky. Civil is sixth at 5.6 ppg. Mia Pauldo also is first in threes made with 35, hitting five in nine attempts vs. Southern Indiana.
- Tennessee played four freshmen (except Lauren Hurst) in the season opener, and they combined for 25 points, 13 rebounds, four assists and one steal vs. NC State.
- All five appeared vs. ETSU, collaborating for 25 points, 13 rebounds, eight assists and five steals.
- Hurst has played in 11 games, producing bests of five points on four occasions. Most recently vs. Arkansas, she hit two field goals, including a trey, tallying five points and career bests of five rebounds and 19 minutes along with an assist and steal. She also had five points vs. MTSU, Winthrop and Florida.
- Mia Pauldo, Prawl and Civil were the No. 9, 17 and 20 recruits in the country in the class of 2025, while Hurst and Mya Pauldo checked in at No. 45 and No. 57.

#### MIA EMERGING AS AWARDS CANDIDATE

- Mia Pauldo is second on the team in scoring at 12.0 ppg. and is tied for first in SEC play at 16.0 ppg., ranking 10th among all players and second among freshmen in league play.
- She has scored in double figures 11 times, including in nine of the past 10 contests.
- She made eight of 12 field goal attempts and eight of nine free-throw tries to card a career-best 26 points at Mississippi State on Jan. 8.
- She dropped a personal SEC-best 21 points on Kentucky, contributing nine in the fourth quarter.
- Pauldo's overall scoring-best progression included 10 and 12 in the first two games vs. NC State and ETSU, respectively, 14 at Stanford, 18 vs. Winthrop, 19 vs. Southern Indiana and 26 at Mississippi State.
- Plagued by foul trouble, she scored 10 of her 13 points in the fourth quarter at No. 21 Alabama, hitting five straight points to help Tennessee overturn a one-point, final-frame deficit and close out the game with a 17-5 run to win, 70-59.
- Pauldo has 43 assists vs. 20 turnovers for a team-leading assist/turnover ratio of 2.2 with seven games featuring zero turnovers.
- She averages 2.6 rpg., 2.5 apg. and 1.3 spg., while shooting 40.4 percent from the field, 33.3 on threes and 90 from the free-throw line.

#### 2X NATIONAL ACCLAIM FOR MIA PAULDO

- Mia Pauldo earned U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) Tamika Catchings National Co-Freshman of the Week and SEC Freshman of the Week twice this season.
- Pauldo averaged 22.0 points, 3.5 assists, 3.0 rebounds and 2.0 steals while shooting 54 percent from the field and 90 percent at the free-throw line in the Lady Vols' victories over Mississippi State and Arkansas to earn her second recognition on Jan. 13.
- Her first honor (as a co-winner for both awards) came on Dec. 16, when she recorded a career high in points for the second straight game, tallying 18 and tacking on career bests of 10 assists and four steals to help spur the Lady Vols to their finest all-around performance of the season in a 112-40 victory over Winthrop.

#### WATCH LISTS, TOO, FOR MIA PAULDO

- Freshman guard Mia Pauldo was named to the USBWA Tamika Catchings National Freshman of the Year Award Watch List.
- Pauldo, who was rated as the No. 9 prospect in the 2025 high school signing class by ESPN, also has been named an espnW Women's College Basketball Top 10

Impact Freshman by ESPN's Shane Laflin.

- Pauldo is ranked No. 4 on that list of college rookies.

#### MILESTONE VICTORY

- The Lady Vols' victory over Coppin State on Nov. 23 gave them a 1,500-398 mark in 81 recorded years of program history.
- UT stands 1,509-400 entering the Ole Miss game.
- As the all-time wins leader in NCAA women's basketball at any level, Tennessee became the first to hit 1,500 victories on Nov. 23, 2025.
- UConn opened 2025-26 with 1,341 wins and stood 154 wins behind UT, followed by Stanford (1,256), James Madison (1,255) and Texas (1,251).
- The first documented UT women's basketball victory occurred in 1907, when a team coached by Thomas Snoddy Myers beat Central High School, 28-0, on Feb. 16 that season.

#### DEFICITS OVERCOME BY TENNESSEE

- The largest deficit (23) as well as first-half (23), half-time (20) and second-half deficit (20/18:17/2H) overcome for a win by UT were vs. Rutgers (55-51) on Jan. 3, 2009. UT trailed, 31-8, with 2:15 left in the first half.
- That second-half deficit overcome was tied by UT coming from 20 down in the third quarter to beat Stetson on Dec. 5, 2018.
- In its biggest postseason rally in school history, UT rallied from 17-down for a 52-46 win over Virginia in the 1996 Elite Eight to reach the Final Four and win the Lady Vols' fourth NCAA title.
- UT also had a 17-point postseason comeback vs. Gonzaga in Spokane, Wash., on March 28, 2015, with UT trailing by 17, 57-40, with 6:34 remaining in the NCAA Sweet 16 and going on to win, 73-69, in OT.
- More recently, the Lady Vols came from 17-down in the second quarter, 14-down at the half and 16-down early in the third frame vs. #4/3 LSU, 69-67, on March 5, 2023, in the SEC Tournament semifinals in Greenville, S.C.
- Tennessee repeated that on Jan. 7, 2024, erasing a 17-point, second-quarter deficit and 10-point half-time gap to defeat Kentucky, 87-69, in Knoxville.
- UT also came from 16 down in the second quarter, 12 at the half and 15 in the third quarter to take down No. 2/3 South Carolina on Feb. 18, 2021, 75-67, for another more recent epic comeback.
- UT's biggest lost lead is 23, which evaporated in an 84-70 loss at Notre Dame on Jan. 17, 2018. The Lady Vols more recently lost a lead of 17 vs. Georgia (3Q, 1/14/21).
- UT's best-ever game-opening run (22-0) came on Dec. 27, 2022, vs. Wofford, and its second-best is believed to be a 20-0 burst vs. N.C. Central on Nov. 14, 2024.
- An opponent's best game-opening run (19-0) came on Jan. 22, 2007, vs. Duke in Knoxville. Georgia had an 11-0 game-opening run on March 2, 2025.

## SUMMIT BLUE UNIFORMS

- In conjunction with the 50th anniversary of Title IX, Tennessee Athletics' updated brand standards renamed the blue accent color historically associated with the Lady Vols "Summitt Blue."
- Four teams debuted the Summitt Blue uniforms during the 2022-23 academic year - a collection dubbed the "Summitt Legacy" series.
- During fall 2022, the Tennessee soccer and volleyball teams were the first to compete in the new Summitt Blue jerseys.
- The Lady Vol basketball team followed suit with a full Summitt Blue uniform vs Georgia, and the softball squad's jersey rotation also featured a Summitt Blue option in spring 2023.
- Summitt Blue stands alongside "Smokey Grey" and "Dark Mode" (formerly Anthracite) as the three accent colors on Tennessee Athletics' official color palette.
- "Tennessee's history as a worldwide leader in women's athletics, along with the Lady Vols' unique legacy of excellence are traditions we are proud to celebrate," Tennessee Vice Chancellor/Director of Athletics Danny White said. "As some of our teams saw their new Summitt Blue uniforms for the first time, they reacted with a joy and enthusiasm that extended to our fans and proud alumni."
- The first version of the Lady Vols' blue accent color appeared in 1968 when then-coach Joan Cronan set out to obtain jerseys for the women's basketball team. At the time, no company offered an orange uniform, so Cronan opted for Columbia blue uniforms with orange lettering when the Lady Vols played at home.
- Later, when orange uniforms became available, UT switched to the traditional orange jerseys but a touch of Summitt Blue has remained.
- Blue also has appeared on Tennessee men's uniforms in the past, as the men's basketball program used a shade of blue as an accent color on its jerseys during the head coaching tenure of Ray Mears in the 1960s.
- Tennessee Football wore blue accessories in 2022 vs. UT Martin, 2023 vs. UConn and 2024 vs. Mississippi State.
- In addition to commemorating the anniversary of Title IX vs. UT Martin, the Summitt Blue color honored the late, legendary Lady Vols head coach Pat Summitt, who was a graduate of UTM and played basketball there.
- UT is 8-4 all-time wearing its "Summitt Blue" uniforms, including 1-1 in 2022-23, 3-1 in 2023-24, 2-2 in 2024-25 and 2-0 in 2025-26.
- All-time, the Lady Vols are 4-1 at home, 3-2 on the road and 1-1 at neutral sites through 12/3/25.

**LADY VOL VS. IN-STATE FOES**

- The Tennessee women are now 270-64-1 all-time vs. four-year college teams from the Volunteer State through the Middle Tennessee game.
- The Lady Vols, who are 4-0 this season vs. in-state foes, defeated East Tennessee State at home (Nov. 7 -- W, 97-47), UT Martin on the road (Nov. 9 -- W, 72-61), Belmont at home (Nov. 13 -- W, 68-58) and Middle Tennessee (Nov. 20 -- W, 85-41) on the road.
- They also are slated to entertain Vanderbilt on March 1 in the regular-season finale.
- The Lady Vols were 3-2 last season after beating UT Martin (Nov. 7) and MTSU (Nov. 12) at home and Memphis on the road (Dec. 18), and losing at Vandy (Jan. 19) and vs. Vandy in the SEC Tournament (Mar. 6).
- UT has won 42 of the last 46 over schools from within the state border, with the lone setbacks during that run being a 76-69 loss to Vanderbilt in Knoxville on Feb. 28, 2019, a 73-62 loss to Middle Tennessee in Huntsville, Ala., on Dec. 6, 2023, a 71-70 loss to Vandy in Nashville on Jan. 19, 2025, and an 84-76 defeat by Vanderbilt on March 6, 2025, at the SEC Tournament.

**CALDWELL NAVIGATING YEAR TWO**

- As she faces year two as head coach of the Lady Vols, Kim Caldwell welcomed back two starters and two reserves from a year ago. Senior Kaliya Wynn also returned after missing last season with an injury.
- Added to that core, the Lady Vol staff signed a consensus top-two high school class and a top-rated transfer class as well.
- As a result, Caldwell's second Tennessee squad was ranked No. 7 by ESPN, No. 8 by Associated Press and No. 9 in the USA TODAY Sports/WBCA Coaches poll in the preseason.
- The Lady Vols were picked to finish fourth in the SEC by the media and fifth by the league's coaches.

**LADY VOL LAND ESPN'S NO. 7 2026 CLASS**

- The Lady Vols signed the No. 7-rated signing group for 2026. Coming on the heels of last season's No. 2 class, it gives Tennessee its first back-to-back top-10 signing classes since 2018 (No. 4) and 2019 (No. 9).
- Inkling with UT were 6-foot-3 forward Oliviyah "Big Oh" Edwards of Tacoma, Wash., and 6-1 guard Gabby Minus from Dacula, Ga.
- Edwards, only the second player from the state of Washington to join the UT women's program, is ranked as the nation's No. 2 prospect in the SportsCenter NEXT 100 and is rated No. 5 by 247Sports. The five-star Lin-

coln High School product chose Tennessee over South Carolina, LSU, USC, Florida and Washington.

• Minus, meanwhile, hails from the same town as current Lady Vol Zee Spearman but attends Hebron Christian Academy. She is ranked No. 45 by 247Sports and No. 62 in the SportsCenter NEXT 100. The No. 3 player in the state of Georgia and four-star prospect chose the Lady Vols over Baylor, Florida, Clemson and Georgia.

**A SUCCESSFUL DEBUT AT THE HELM**

- Kim Caldwell guided the Lady Vols to a 24-10 record (8-8 SEC, 8th), NCAA Sweet 16 finish and final AP and Coaches Poll rankings of 15th and 16th, respectively, in her first season at the Power 4 level in 2024-25 and did so while expecting her first child.
- UT had begun the year unranked in either poll.
- Among the team's triumphs, victories over eventual NCAA champ UConn as well as Ohio State, Iowa and Florida State.
- The 80-76 home win over No. 5 UConn in front of 16,215 fans on Feb. 6 ended a four-game head-to-head losing streak and gave the Lady Vols their first victory over the Huskies since 2007 in a series that had been dormant until 2020.
- In the NCAA Tournament, the No. 5 seed Lady Vols advanced to the Sweet 16. They blew out No. 12 seed South Florida, 101-66, and handed No. 4 seed Ohio State its only home loss of the season before falling to No. 1 seed Texas in the regional semifinal, 67-59, in Birmingham.
- Her first Lady Vol unit set various NCAA, SEC and UT records for three-pointers made and attempted, and it put up 86.6 points per game to post the No. 4 scoring average in program history while attracting 10,647 fans per contest to watch the exciting style of play.
- Kim Caldwell's 13-0 start last season was the best opening run ever by a coach in her first season leading the Lady Vols.

**TALENTED DUO TOPS RETURNING CORE**

- UT returned its No. 1 and No. 3 scorers and top-two rebounders in redshirt junior Talaysia Cooper and senior Zee Spearman.
- Leading the way is Cooper, a 6-foot All-SEC Second Team and SEC All-Defensive Team guard a year ago. Cooper put up 16.6 ppg., 5.6 rpg., 3.2 apg. and 3.1 spg. while hitting 36 three-pointers in her first season at UT after transferring from South Carolina.
- Zee Spearman, a 6-4 forward, returns after producing 11.7 ppg. and 6.0 rpg. while sinking 24 treys in her Lady Vol debut in 2024-25 after arriving from Miami.

**THREE KEY RESERVES ARE BACK, TOO**

- Kaniya Boyd, a 5-9 redshirt sophomore (4.0 ppg., 1.3 spg., 1.3 apg.) and 6-2 junior forward Alyssa Latham (3.9 ppg., 3.7 rpg.) are back after playing key roles off the bench last season.
- Boyd saw action in 33 games and started four as a redshirt freshman, while Latham appeared in 34 contests and earned five starts as a sophomore in her first season on Rocky Top.
- Also back is 6-0 redshirt senior guard Kaiya Wynn (4.4 ppg., 2.6 rpg.), who was sidelined in 2024-25 due to an Achilles injury (right) suffered in preseason practice.
- Wynn has played in 94 games as a Lady Vol and has a history as a good defender and ball handler and someone who can get to the rim.

**TOP-RANKED PORTAL CLASS ARRIVES**

- Caldwell added three highly-regarded veteran players via the portal, earning the No. 1 spot by ESPN in its early 2025 transfer portal rankings.
- Janiah Barker, a 6-4 senior forward and the 2025 Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year, made the move to Knoxville after averaging 7.4 ppg. and 6.0 rpg. last season while helping UCLA to the NCAA Final Four. She was rated No. 8 by ESPN in its 2025 transfer impact rankings.
- Nya Robertson, a 5-7 senior guard, arrived from SMU after landing All-ACC Second Team kudos for an 18.5 ppg. average, 111 free throws and 62 treys in 2024-25.
- Jersey Wolfenbarger, a 6-5 senior forward, carded 4.6 ppg. and 3.4 rpg. while shooting 63 percent from the field last season at LSU.
- World Exposure Report listed Barker at No. 4, Robert-

son and No. 10 and Wolfenbarger at No. 46 in its transfer portal rankings

**ELITE ROOKIE CLASS ON DECK**

- The Lady Vols welcomed a five-player high school class rated No. 1 by 247Sports and No. 2 by ESPN, including No. 9 Mia Pauldo (5-6 guard), No. 17 Deniya Prawl (6-2 guard), No. 20 Jaida Civil (6-0 guard), No. 45 Lauren Hurst (6-3 guard/forward) and No. 57 Mya Pauldo (5-6 guard).
- The group represents Tennessee's first signing class since 2017 with two or more top-15 prospects and the first with three rated among the top 35 since the Lady Vols inked three top-12 high school standouts en route to the nation's No. 1 overall group in 2017. Additionally, this marks UT's first group with four top-50 rated signees since landing four in 2018.
- Also, this is the first time the Lady Vols have been ranked top 10 in recruiting by any organization since 2019 (No. 9/ESPN), in the top five since 2018 (No. 4/ESPN) and in the top two since 2017 (No. 1/ESPN).

**CALDWELL ELEVATING TALENT LEVEL**

- Tennessee features six McDonald's All-Americans on its roster, including three 2025 honorees (Jaida Civil, Mia Pauldo, Deniya Prawl), two from 2022 (Janiah Barker, Talaysia Cooper) and one from 2021 (Jersey Wolfenbarger).
- The six McDonald's A-As stand as the highest number on a Lady Vol roster since having six in 2018-19.
- All told, the 2025-26 roster includes 12 top-75 players, with nine of them in the top 50, eight in the top 40, seven among the top 30, six among the top 20, three in the top 15 and three within the top 10 in their classes.
- UT's top 75 ESPN players include **2021** (7. Jersey Wolfenbarger), **2022** (3. Janiah Barker, 18. Talaysia Cooper, 30. Zee Spearman, 62. Kaiya Wynn), **2023** (72. Alyssa Latham), **2024** (35. Kaniya Boyd) and **2025** (9. Mia Pauldo, 17. Deniya Prawl, 19. Jaida Civil, 45. Lauren Hurst, 57. Mya Pauldo).

**TWIN BACKCOURT**

- Tennessee features its first-ever set of twins on the women's basketball roster.
- Mia and Mya Pauldo hail from Paterson, N.J., and are known as Twin Back Court.
- The 5-6 dynamos, who never considered attending different colleges, are playmakers on the court and outgoing personalities away from the game who are always happy to engage with fans.
- Both were active with traditional and social media while in high school and inked their own NIL deal while still playing for Morris Catholic High School.
- Mia was rated the No. 9 prospect in the class of 2025 by ESPN, while Mya came in at No. 57 after fighting through some injuries late in her prep career. They now look to make their mark on Rocky Top.

**HOOPING HURSTS NOTCH SIBLING FIRST**

- Lady Vol freshman Lauren Hurst, a 6-foot-3 guard/forward, and Vol redshirt senior Grant Hurst, a 6-foot-2 guard, are the first brother-sister hoops duo to play at Tennessee at the same time.
- They also are only the second brother/sister basketball tandem in Tennessee history as a whole, joining E.J. (2020-21) and Nicky (2004-2008) Anosike.
- While the Anosike siblings both played at UT, they were not on campus at the same time. A total of 12 years separated their appearances.
- The Hurst siblings hail from Cleveland, Tenn., a little over an hour south of Knoxville on I-75.
- Their parents are Matt and Wendy Hurst, who each played basketball at NCAA Division II Mars Hill College in North Carolina. Wendy played volleyball there too.
- Lauren Hurst played basketball and volleyball in high school, ranking as the No. 1 player in the state in each.
- Lauren and Grant have a sister, Addison, who plays volleyball at South Alabama.

**FAMILIAR FORMER LEAGUE FOES**

- Two players with SEC experience at other schools in the league will make their Tennessee's debuts this season.
- Senior forwards Janiah Barker and Jersey Wolfenbarger have made their way to Rocky Top after stops at two previous schools each.

- Barker was the Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year in 2024-25 at UCLA, helping the Bruins to the NCAA Final Four.
- Prior to heading west, the 6-foot-4 product of Marietta, Ga., was a standout for two seasons at SEC foe Texas A&M, earning SEC All-Freshman status in 2022-23.
- Wolfenbarger, meanwhile, has made two league stops, playing at LSU last season after spending her first two collegiate seasons at Arkansas.
- The native of Fort Smith, Arkansas, Wolfenbarger was a member of the SEC All-Freshman Team in 2021-22.

#### RECRUITED TWICE BY THE SAME COACH

- Nya Robertson joined the Lady Vols as a transfer from SMU, where she spent the 2024-25 campaign and earned All-ACC Second-Team acclaim after averaging 18.6 ppg. and making 62 three-pointers and 111 free throws as a junior last season.
- UT assistant Gabe Lazo, the coach who originally recruited Robertson out of high school in Fort Worth, Texas, successfully earned her signature for a second time to join the Lady Vols.
- The first time around, Lazo was an assistant at George Washington University in Washington, D.C. and convinced Robertson to make the trek from the Lone Star State to the nation's capital in 2022.

#### PRAWL IS FIRST LADY VOL FROM CANADA

- Deniya Prawl is the first prospect from Canada to play basketball for the Lady Vols.
- Prawl, a 6-foot-2 freshman from Toronto, came by way of IMG Academy in Bradenton, Florida.
- In addition to having an international player from north of the U.S. border, the Lady Vols have had two others from Australia, one from England and two from Spain.

#### KEY LOSSES FROM A YEAR AGO

- UT lost three starters from 2024-25, including 5-10 guard Jewel Spear (12.5 ppg., 77 3FG), 6-0 guard Ruby Whitehorn (11.6 ppg., 4.0 rpg., 25 3FGs) and 5-7 guard Samara Spencer (10.6 ppg., 4.6 apg., 66 3FG). Whitehorn was dismissed from the team on Nov. 2, 2025, after failing to meet Lady Vol standards.
- It also graduated three other veteran contributors in 6-1 guard/forward Tess Darby (6.4 ppg., 58 3FGs), 6-2 forward Sara Puckett (4.6 ppg., 3.1 rpg.) and 6-5 forward Jillian Hollingshead (3.4 ppg., 3.0 rpg.).
- Darby (228) and Spear (146) finished their careers ranked No. 5 and No. 10 for career three-pointers made at UT, while Spear's total in 2024-25 tied for fifth-most in a season by a Lady Vol, and Darby ended up 10th.

#### CANDACE PARKER HEADED TO THE WBHOF

- Lady Vol great Candace Parker (2004-08) has been announced as a 2026 inductee into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame.
- The Tennessee Theatre in Knoxville will host the induction ceremony on Saturday, June 27, 2026.
- Parker will become the 11th former UT player to be enshrined in the WBHOF.
- Three coaches and three administrators also are inductees, giving Tennessee Athletics 17 members.

#### LADY VOLLS ON NAISMITH H.O.F. BALLOT

- Four LVFLs have been announced as eligible individual candidates for induction into the next Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame induction class.
- Bridgette Gordon, Chamique Holdsclaw, Candace Parker and Michelle Snow are on the list.
- The 1996 U.S. Olympic Team, which included LVFLs Carla McGhee and Nikki McCray-Penson, also is eligible. That squad won gold in Atlanta.

#### CATCHINGS EARNS NCAA'S SILVER ANNIV. AWARD

- LVFL and hall-of-famer Tamika Catchings was presented the Silver Anniversary Award at NCAA Honors 2026 on Jan. 14 at the Gaylord National Resort and Convention Center, located just outside Washington, D.C.
- The Silver Anniversary Award celebrates the achievements and contributions of former student-athletes who have excelled in their professional lives and continue to exemplify the values of collegiate athletics.
- Marking 25 years since the conclusion of their college sports careers, distinguished alumni are recognized for continued excellence.

#### RICKEA EARNS TEAM USA INVITE

- Rickea Jackson will be among 10 players making their USA Basketball Senior National Team camp debuts Dec. 12-14, as training camp is held in Durham, N.C.
- The camp is an evaluation opportunity for the USA Basketball coaching staff.
- Jackson, who starred at UT from 2022-24 and was a 2024 first-round pick by the Los Angeles Sparks, has represented USA Basketball several times, including as a gold-medal winner at the 2019 FIBA 3x3 U18 Women's World Cup and as a silver-medal winner at the 2023 FIBA Women's AmeriCup, where a college-age USA squad competed against countries featuring their potential Olympic teams.

#### A HISTORY OF SUCCESS FOR CALDWELL

- Kim Caldwell is in her 10th season as a head coach with an overall record of 255-44 including 163-21 in conference games. She finished 24-10 (8-8 SEC/t8th) in 2024-25 during her first season at Tennessee and is 14-3 (6-0 SEC) in 2025-26 thus far.
- Caldwell was announced as UT's new head coach on April 7, 2024, becoming the fourth leader of the Lady Vols during the NCAA era.
- She has carded eight 20-win seasons in nine complete seasons, with a 12-4 record during the COVID-19 shortened 2020-21 season standing as the only year where she didn't hit 20.
- In 2024-25, Caldwell finished just a win shy of reaching the 25-win plateau. She has hit 25+ six times already and has four 30-win seasons to her credit.
- With an 8-0 record after beating N.C. Central on Dec. 14, 2024, she recorded the best opening by a Lady Vol head coach in her first year leading the program. She extended the mark to 13-0 before her first loss.
- She has directed teams to nine NCAA Tournaments (2 DI, 7 DII), one NCAA title (NCAA DII, 2022), two NCAA Final Fours (NCAA DII, 2022 & 2023), seven conference championships and five conference tournament crowns in eight years as a head coach.
- The Parkersburg, W. Va., native arrived in Knoxville after leading Marshall to a 26-7 record (17-1 in the Sun Belt Conference) in 2023-24, a sweep of SBC regular season and tournament titles and the school's first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 1997.
- She was named 2024 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year and Spalding Maggie Dixon WBCA Division I Rookie Coach of the Year for her impressive job with the Thundering Herd.
- Prior to that, she guided Glendale State (W. Va.) to a 191-24 (.888) mark in seven campaigns, earning the Pat Summitt Trophy as the NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year after guiding the Pioneers to a 35-1 record and the 2021-22 national championship.

#### GREAT START IN YEAR ONE FOR CALDWELL

- Tennessee started 13-0 last season before suffering a loss vs. Oklahoma on Jan. 5, opening a year at least 10-0 for the 13th time in program history and marking the best opening since UT was 15-0 in 2017-18.
- The 13-0 start marked the seventh occasion a Lady Vol team had stayed unbeaten that long.

#### CALDWELL'S SECOND-BEST SEASON START

- UT's 13-0 start in 2024-25 was the second-best opening

of a season in Kim Caldwell's nine years as head coach.

- The win over Florida State on Dec. 4 enabled her to break a tie for second best with the 2018-19 Glendale State team beginning that year at 5-0 en route to 30-3.
- Top honors go to her 2021-22 GSU squad that started 29-0 on its way to 35-1 and an NCAA Div. II national title.
- In 2023-24, Caldwell's Marshall team began the year 0-1 and 2-5 before reeling off a 24-2 record the rest of the way en route to 26-7 and a sweep of Sun Belt Conference titles.
- Other starts include 3-0 in 2016-17, 2022-23 as well as 1-0 in 2020-21, 2019-20 and 2017-18 and 0-1 in 2025-26.

#### CALDWELL HITS 20 WINS AGAIN

- Kim Caldwell carded her eighth 20-win season as a head coach in 2024-25 and first as leader of the Lady Vols.
- The only season she didn't reach 20 was during a 12-4 2020-21 year at Glendale State when the schedule was limited to 16 games due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- She has reached 25 wins six times and had 30 or more on four occasions. Caldwell finished last season one victory shy of hitting 25 for the seventh time in her career.

#### COACHING STAFF STABILITY

- Kim Caldwell retained every member of her coaching staff from season one at Tennessee, providing stability and consistency heading into year two.
- Back are assistants Roman Tubner and Gabe Lazo, associate head coaches at Alabama and Mississippi State, who made the move to Knoxville prior to last season.
- Jenna Burdette and Angel Rizor, who followed Caldwell to Tennessee after each served as assistants alongside her at Glendale State and Marshall, return in 2025-26.
- The fifth assistant, Lexie Barrier, came to UT after spending two years at JMU. She previously worked at Marshall as an assistant in 2021-22 alongside Jenna Burdette prior to Caldwell's arrival and is in year two at UT.
- Maggie Stanley and Mashayla Cecil, who also came from Marshall, are back. Stanley moved from graduate assistant to assistant director of operations/special assistant to the head coach, while Cecil attacks year two as a G.A. Cecil also played for Caldwell at Glendale State from 2019-22.
- Nolan Harvath, who served as Caldwell's director of

strength and conditioning at Glenville State from 2018-20, returns as UT's director of sports performance.

#### COACHING WITH HER FATHER

- Kim Caldwell played for her father, Scott Stephens, in high school at Parkersburg South in West Virginia.
- Stephens led PSHS to three state titles and coached his three daughters: Kim, Anne and Jill. They played college basketball at Glenville State (2007-11), Cincinnati (2002-06) and Cincinnati (2005-09), respectively.
- When Caldwell was named head coach at her alma mater prior to the 2016-17 season, Stephens left his high school job to become her assistant at GSU.
- Her first four Mountain Empire Conference regular season titles and first three MEC Tournament titles came with him beside her on the bench.
- Sadly, Stephens passed away on Nov. 21, 2020, after a battle with cancer at the age of 65.

#### CALDWELL'S SPOUSE ON UT MEN'S STAFF

- Kim Caldwell's husband, Justin Caldwell, is in his second season as player development coordinator for Rick Barnes on the Tennessee men's basketball staff.
- A veteran coach, Caldwell possesses over a decade of experience across the Division I, Division II, high school and youth levels, including five years as a collegiate head coach. Caldwell spent the 2023-24 campaign as an assistant at Marshall University, while Kim was the head coach of the women's program.
- Justin was the men's head coach at Glenville State from 2018-23 while Kim was the women's coach in the last five of her seven seasons there from 2016-23.
- Justin starred at Glenville State from 2010-11 after playing his first three years at West Virginia Wesleyan. His senior season at Glenville State coincided with the final season of Kim's four-year playing career at GSU.
- Justin and Kim Caldwell became parents to son Conor on Jan. 20, 2025, during their first season at UT.

#### CALDWELL NCAA HISTORY AS A COACH

- Kim Caldwell made her ninth different NCAA Tournament appearance as a head coach and first with UT, owning a 14-7 combined record between her time at NCAA Division I and Division II schools.
- She made her second trip to NCAA Division I March Madness in 2024-25, owning a 2-2 postseason record at this level after her 2023-24 Marshall team lost in the first round to Virginia Tech (92-49) in 2023-24 and her Tennessee squad beat South Florida, 101-66, and No. 15/13 Ohio State, 82-67, in the 2025 NCAA First & Second Rounds before falling to Texas, 67-59, in the Sweet 16.
- From 2016-17 to 2022-23, Caldwell led her Glenville State (W. Va.) teams to seven NCAA Division II Tournament bids, forging a 12-5 mark in those contests.
- Caldwell's teams advanced to two NCAA Division II Final Fours (2022, 2023), with her 2021-22 squad winning a national championship.
- Her 2021-22 team went 6-0 in NCAA play, while her 2022-23 squad was 5-1. Her 2017-18 and 2018-19 units finished 1-1, while her 2016-17 and 2020-21 ensembles went 0-1. The 2019-20 tourney was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### CALDWELL AS AN NCAA STUDENT-ATHLETE

- Kim Caldwell helped lead Glenville State to an NCAA Tournament berth as a senior in 2010-11.
- That squad, led by head coach Bunky Harkleroad, finished 23-10 overall and 17-5 in the West Virginia Inter-collegiate Athletic Conference, making the program's first NCAA appearance since 2006-07.
- Then known by her maiden name of Kim Stephens, she averaged 7.5 ppg., was second on the team with a career-high 73 three-pointers and appeared in all 33 contests for the Pioneers.

#### EYEING MORE THAN THE STREAK

- Tennessee seeks to keep its streak of NCAA Tournament appearances perfect.
- The Lady Vols are the only program to make every NCAA Tourney and will take aim at their 44th straight berth.
- UT made the Sweet 16 in Kim Caldwell's first season at the Power 4 level.
- The program's goals are to advance past that round and put itself in position to make an Elite 8 and Final Four

and compete for the Big Orange's ninth NCAA title.

- Kim Caldwell has taken her teams at Glenville State, Marshall and Tennessee to the NCAA Tournament each year during her nine complete seasons as a head coach.

#### LOOKING BACK TO LAST SEASON

##### BIG WINS IN YEAR ONE FOR CALDWELL

- Kim Caldwell's first season at the helm of the UT program included key victories over eventual NCAA champ UConn as well as #15/13 Ohio State, #17/20 Iowa, No. 18/19 Alabama and RV/RV Florida State.
- The win over No. 5 UConn stopped a four-game head-to-head losing streak and gave the Lady Vols their first victory over the Huskies since 2007 in a series that had been dormant until 2020.
- Tennessee picked up its fourth ranked win of the year during the NCAA Second Round over Ohio State, handing the Buckeyes their first home loss all season.
- The win over OSU was UT's first win over a ranked team on the road since the Lady Vols beat No. 13/13 Georgia in Athens, 63-55, on Jan. 23, 2022.
- The victory over the No. 15/13 Buckeyes was only the third road win ever for the Lady Vols during the NCAA Tournament, following a 1996 Mideast Regional Elite Eight triumph at Virginia, 52-46, and a 2016 NCAA Second Round victory at Arizona State, 75-64.

##### LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD

- Tennessee averaged 86.6 points per game in 2024-25, ranking as the No. 4 total in Lady Vol history and the eighth-best all-time in SEC women's basketball.
- The Big Orange's average ranked third nationally and first in the league last season.
- UT defeated NC Central, 139-59, on Dec. 14, setting SEC and school records for the most points in a game. It ranked as the fifth-most in NCAA history.
- By scoring 101 points in the NCAA First Round vs. South Florida, UT matched the program record of seven (1987-88) for most games scoring 100 points or more in a season.
- UT's all-time top three scoring averages for a season are 88.9 (1987-88), 88.8 (1997-98) and 86.8 (1998-99).
- Five times Kim Caldwell's teams have led the nation in scoring, with all five coming at Glenville State in 2019-20 (106.8), 2018-19 (102.3), 2020-21 (98.4), 2021-22 (95.5) and her first season as a head coach, 2016-17 (94.1). She was No. 4 in NCAA Division I in 2023-24 at Marshall (85.3).
- UT scored 89+ or more points in each of the first five games of a season for the first time in school history.
- It also marked only the third time Tennessee scored 89+ in five straight games at any point.
- UT then scored 89+ in six straight games for the first time in school history from Dec. 14 to Jan. 2.
- UT had five straight contests of 89+ points in 2024-25 (11/5 to 11/26), 1997-98 (1/6 to 1/20) and 1987-88 (12/13 to 1/3).
- It had four-game 89+ runs in 1993-94 (1/2 to 1/13), 2000-01 (2/1 to 2/11) and 2024-25 (12/14 to 12/21).

##### ECLIPSING THE CENTURY MARK SEVEN TIMES

- Tennessee scored 100+ points seven times in 2024-25, tying the program record for most trips to the century mark with the 1987-88 squad.
- That gave the program 94 all-time regular-season scoring efforts of 100 or more points through 2024-25.
- UT had 101 in the opener vs. Samford on Nov. 5, 109 vs. Liberty on Nov. 16, 102 vs. Western Carolina on Nov. 26, a school and SEC-record 139 vs. N.C. Central on Dec. 14, 102 vs. Tulsa on Dec. 21, 114 vs. Winthrop on Dec. 29 and

101 vs. South Florida.

- The 2024-25 season marked the first time in history the Lady Vols hit the century mark three times in their first five contests of a season, four occasions in their first eight games and six times in their first 12 tilts.
- That fourth 100-point effort in 2024-25 equaled the total of Tennessee's previous six seasons combined and marked the 12th occasion of tallying triple digits three or more times in a campaign.
- The last time Tennessee had back-to-back trips above the century mark before last season was in 2017-18 (Alabama State & Troy).
- UT has now done that seven times, including twice in 2024-25 (1987-88, 1994-95, 1999-2000, 2000-01, 2017-18, 2024-25).
- The squad had 109 vs. Liberty and 102 vs. Western Carolina on Nov. 16 and 25 and followed with 102 vs. Tulsa and 114 vs. Winthrop on Dec. 21 and 29.
- The Lady Vols have never reeled off three straight games of 100+ in their history.

- Against N.C. Central on Dec. 14, Tennessee drained 30 three-pointers, setting school, SEC and NCAA records for a game. That total also was higher than the bests for NCAA men's basketball as well as the WNBA and NBA.
- The Lady Vols also attempted 63 threes in that contest, setting UT and SEC records for that as well.
- Samara Spencer's nine three-pointers made vs. NC Central set a school record and tied for fifth-most in SEC history.

- Tennessee had an incredible, record-breaking performance vs. North Carolina Central on Dec. 14, 2024.
- The Lady Vols reset NCAA DI, SEC and UT records for three pointers in a game with 30 and SEC and UT bests for treys attempted with 63.
- ESPN reported that the 30 threes also were the most in NCAA DI men's history and both the WNBA and NBA.
- UT also reset SEC and program records for points in a game (139) and tied a school best for most points in a first half (69).
- Samara Spencer rewrote the Lady Vol mark for three pointers made with nine vs. NCCU en route to a 33-point, 10-assist double-double.

**NOT A BAD SECOND-BEST TREY DAY**

- Tennessee's 16 three-pointers vs. South Florida in the NCAA First Round would have tied the Lady Vol single-game record, if not for the eye-popping 30-trey outburst vs. N.C. Central earlier this season.
- It did tie for second best in program annals and ranked as the second most in NCAA Tournament history behind Washington's 18 in Seattle vs. Oklahoma on March 20, 2017, in the NCAA Second Round.
- UT is one of seven schools to card 16 in tourney play.
- The Lady Vols' 16 threes and 37 attempts vs. USF broke Lady Vol NCAA Tournament records, eclipsing previous bests of 12 (vs. Oral Roberts, 3/23/08, 1st Rd.) and 29 (vs. Oral Roberts, 3/23/08, 1st Rd.), respectively.

**UT'S FIRST-EVER 50-TREY TRIO**

- Jewel Spear (77), Samara Spencer (66) and Tess Darby (58) gave UT its first-ever trio to hit 50 or more treys each in the same season in 2024-25.
- The last time UT had three or more with 40+ deep balls, Angie Bjorklund (73), Meighan Simmons (63) and Shekinna Stricklen (42) accomplished that feat during the 2010-11 campaign.
- The finger prints of Darby and Spear are all over Tennessee's three-point records, including game, season and career marks.
- Darby (228) and Spear (146) finished fifth and 10th, respectively, on UT's career three-pointers made list.
- Darby (626) and Spear (388) also tied for third and finished ninth, respectively in career threes attempted.
- Spear, meanwhile, tied for fifth on the UT single-season

list with 77 threes made last season, while Darby's total of 70 from 2022-23 stands 10th.

- In season attempts, Spear's 203 from 2024-25 and her 185 from 2023-24 stand third and ninth, respectively, in Lady Vol history.
- On the single-game makes list, Spencer is atop it with nine makes (vs. N.C. Central), while Spear's six vs. Texas A&M (1/2/25) and Oklahoma (1/5/25) tie her for 12th.
- For most treys attempted in a game, Darby and Spencer are fifth with 13 each vs. N.C. Central (12/14/25), and Spear is 10th with 12 vs. Samford (11/5/24).
- Spear tied the best single-game three-point percentage of 1.000 with the most makes (6-6) vs. Alabama on March 8, 2024.

**FACILITY RECORDS TOOK A HIT**

- Tennessee broke or tied seven different facility women's records at Food City Center last season.
- UT's 139 points vs. N.C. Central broke the old mark of 133 vs. UT Martin (11/19/99).
- The Lady Vols' 69 first-half points vs. N.C. Central broke a school record of 64 set last season vs. Liberty (11/16/24). That mark had supplanted the previous best of 63 that was set vs. Central Arkansas (11/15/15).
- Tennessee's 30 three pointers snapped the old record of 15 vs. Lamar (12/1/10) and Chattanooga (11/15/10).
- The Big Orange's 63 three-point attempts vs. N.C. Central crushed totals of 42 (Middle Tenn.), 41 (Western Carolina), 39 (UT Martin) and 38 (Liberty) from last season and the old standard of 36 vs. Lamar (12/1/10).
- The 63 also toppled an overall women's mark in the venue, as Colorado State previously had launched 44 long balls on Dec. 11, 2019.
- Samara Spencer's nine three pointers broke the old mark of eight, set by Ariel Massengale vs. Vanderbilt 3/1/15 and Meighan Simmons vs. Lamar (12/1/10).
- Tennessee also matched the arena women's steals best of 27 vs. Samford on Nov. 5. The Lady Vols also had 27 vs. LSU on Feb. 22, 1998.

**PRESS CAUSES STRESS, VIOLATIONS**

- Tennessee's press resulted in 30 10-second violations by opponents through 34 games last season.
- UT forced a season-most five violations against Western Carolina on Nov. 26 and initiated four vs. Missouri on Feb. 2 and vs. Texas A&M on March 5.
- The Lady Vols surpassed 2023-24's total of those calls (1) in the first game of 2024-25 when Samford was whistled twice for failing to cross the timeline in the required 10 seconds.
- Coach Kim Caldwell's squad followed by forcing two more violations vs. UT Martin, with its total of four in 2024-25 through two games even ranking ahead of the Big Orange's combined total for both the 2022-23 and 2023-24 seasons (1).
- Against, Middle Tennessee, the Big Orange defense prevented the Blue Raiders from advancing the ball across the timeline in 10 seconds on one occasion, giving Tennessee five for the season and tying its combined total of violations caused over the previous five years (5).
- With UT not utilizing a press in most cases, the breakdowns of 10-second infractions by opponents during that five-year span were 0 in 2019-20, 0 in 2020-21, 4 in 2021-22, 0 in 2022-23 and 1 in 2023-24.

**ATTENDANCE ON THE RISE**

- Tennessee averaged 10,647 in attendance, ranking fifth nationally in 2024-25 for its highest national placement since finishing second in 2017-18.
- It stands as UT's highest average since 2013-14, when the Big Orange drew 11,038 per contest.
- The crowd of 16,215 vs. UConn was the largest home crowd since Feb. 26, 2012, when 18,563 were on hand vs. Florida in the last home game of the legendary Pat Summitt's career.

**THE ONLY SCHOOL IN ALL 43**

- The Lady Vols made their 43rd consecutive NCAA Tournament, continuing as the only school to appear in every Division I tourney.
- Tennessee was an at-large qualifier for the 2025 NCAA Tournament, finishing in a tie for eighth in the SEC regular season.
- UT earned a No. 5 NCAA seed and drew higher than a four seed for just the sixth time ever.

- The Lady Vols now are 133-35 in NCAA Tournament play, and they rank first in games played (168) and second in victories (133) in NCAA tourney history.
- The Big Orange advanced to its 37th Sweet 16 all-time, which is the most of any team.
- Tennessee is second behind UConn in winning percentage at .792 in NCAA Tourney play.

**2025 SEC POSTSEASON HONORS**

- Redshirt sophomore Talaysia Cooper was a member of the Coaches All-SEC Second Team for the first time.
- She also made her debut on the USA TODAY Sports Network All-SEC Second Team.
- Additionally, Cooper was named to the Coaches SEC All-Defensive Team for the initial time.
- Tess Darby became the first Lady Vol to be named to the SEC Women's Basketball Community Service Team three times.

**UT ALWAYS STRONG IN THE CLASSROOM**

- For the third year in a row, nine or more Lady Vols were named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll. A total of 11 off the 15-member 2024-25 squad made the list.
- Making the squad again in 2024-25 were returnees Edie Darby, Tess Darby, Sara Puckett, Jewel Spear, Avery Strickland, Destinée Wells and Kaiya Wynn.
- Picking up acclaim for the first time as Lady Vols were Favor Ayodele, Alyssa Latham, Zee Spearman and Samara Spencer.
- Puckett was chosen for the second time as a member of the College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-District Team.
- The Lady Vols once again earned "Special Mention" status for their collective 3.323 grade point average as part of the WBCA's 2024-25 Academic Team Honor Roll.
- That was an improvement over the 3.301 recorded in 2023-24.

**WINNING 20 GAMES FOR THE 48TH TIME**

- Tennessee (24-10) reached the 20-win plateau for the 48th time, dating back to 1974.
- Win number 20 came on Feb. 20, as the No. 15/13 Lady Vols defeated No. 18/19 Alabama in Knoxville, 88-80.
- It marked Tennessee's fifth 20-win season in the past six years, with the 2020-21 total of 17 wins impacted by several COVID-related game cancelations that prevented the Lady Vols from getting to 20.

# HEAD COACH KIM CALDWELL



Kim Caldwell is in her second season as the women's basketball head coach at the University of Tennessee. She was announced on April 7, 2024, as the fourth leader of the Lady Volunteers during the NCAA era.

A rising star in the profession, Caldwell has quickly forged a reputation as an elite head coach at three different stops now after making her debut at the game's highest level as the skipper of the all-time winningest program in women's hoops at UT. She previously led NCAA Division II Glenville State and DI Marshall to championship seasons with a high-octane approach on both ends of the floor.

Simply put, Caldwell is a winner. Entering her 10th season as a head coach, she has compiled an impressive 241-41 (.855) career record. Those numbers include an astounding 157-21 (.882) mark in conference games. Along the way, her teams have earned berths in nine NCAA Tournaments, and she directed those squads to one national championship, two NCAA DII Final Fours, seven conference championships and five conference tournament titles.

Statistically, her teams have excelled in scoring, three-point shooting, offensive rebounding and steals. As a head coach, her squads have led the nation five times in scoring, finishing second twice and never placing below fourth in points per game. Her squads have been the top team on four occasions in three-pointers made per game, never placing lower than fifth. In steals per game, Caldwell's units have finished below fourth only once (2024-25).

Her first year on Rocky Top saw Caldwell guide her club to a 24-10 overall record and an 8-8 mark in SEC play, carding notable wins over Florida State, Iowa, Ohio State and eventual NCAA champ UConn, the first by UT over the Huskies since 2007 in the interrupted series. The Big Orange advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 and finished the season ranked 15th and 16th, respectively, in the AP and USA TODAY/WBCA Coaches Polls. Those accomplishments came while Caldwell carried her first child and gave birth during the season, missing only the Texas game and returning vs. South Carolina.

Caldwell carded her eighth 20-win season in nine years (exception was COVID year) and recorded the best opening ever by a Lady Vol head coach in her first year of leading the program (8-0) and extended it to 13-0. That marked her second-best opening to a campaign behind a 29-0 start at Glenville State in 2021-22.

Caldwell's initial team at Tennessee set school and SEC records for points (139), three-pointers made (30) and threes attempted (63) vs. N.C. Central on Dec. 14. The treys made also eclipsed NCAA (M/W), NBA and WNBA bests, while the point total ranked fifth in NCAA women's history.

Additionally, UT tallied the most treys made (343) and attempted (1,054) in a season at UT, also setting SEC bests in those areas. UT's 86.6 points per game in Caldwell's first campaign stood fourth in school annals and eighth in the SEC record book.

Caldwell's first edition produced an All-SEC Second Team and SEC All-Defensive Team performer in Talaysia Cooper. It also featured Sara Puckett and Jewel Spear earning CSC Academic All-District accolades and 11 of her 15 players receiving SEC Academic Honor Roll distinction.

After the season, Zee Spearman was chosen for the USA's 2025 FIBA 3x3 Nations League Americas squad (Chile) and the 2025 FIBA 3x3 U23 World Cup Team (China). Spearman is Caldwell's first player to compete with USA Basketball.

On the recruiting front, Caldwell and her staff have seen the benefits of their hard work pay off early during her tenure. Her first portal class featured Zee Spearman and Ruby Whitehorn playing lead roles for the 2024-25 squad. UT then signed a 2025 high school class ranked No. 1 or 2 (Mia Pauldo, Deniya Prawl, Jaida Civil, Lauren Hurst, Mya Pauldo) and added the top portal class of 2025 (Janiah Barker, Nya Robertson, Jersey Wolfenbarger), according to ESPN.

Prior to coming to Tennessee, Caldwell guided Marshall to a 26-7 overall record and 17-1 league mark in her only season there in 2023-24. She was named the WBCA's Spalding Maggie Dixon NCAA Division I Rookie Coach of the Year and the Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year after piloting the Thundering Herd to both the league's regular season and tournament titles as well as the school's second NCAA Tournament berth ever and first since 1997.

After being picked ninth in the Sun Belt Conference preseason poll, Marshall proceeded to generate 85.3 points per game (4th in NCAA) and force 24.2 turnovers per contest in notching a program best for wins. Caldwell's victory total stands as the most by a first-year coach in MU women's hoops history and marked the first 20-win regular-season campaign by the school since 1990-91.

Caldwell got her start as a head coach at her alma mater under her maiden name of Kim Stephens. She led Glenville State to the 2021-22 NCAA Division II National Championship in her sixth year at the school and helped the Pioneers earn seven overall NCAA Tournament berths.

For the 2021-22 season's accomplishment, she was presented the Pat Summitt Trophy, which goes to the WBCA's NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year. Caldwell also earned the 2022 Furfari Award, which is presented to West Virginia's College Coach of the Year in all sports by the West Virginia Sports Writers Association. She also won that award in 2019 and 2024 (while at Marshall) as well.

In seven seasons with the Pioneers, from 2016-23, the 2011 GSU graduate compiled a 191-24 mark, including a 132-12 slate in the Mountain East Conference (MEC). Her final two editions forged a 68-4 combined record, including the 35-1 national championship season (22-0 in league play) in 2021-22, and a 33-3 outcome after advancing to the national semifinals in 2022-23. Her final unit there led NCAA Division II in points per game (91.2) and turnovers forced (27.3).

She guided Glenville State to six MEC regular season titles (2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2022, 2023) and four MEC Tournament trophies (2018, 2019, 2020, 2023), earning MEC Coach of the Year honors four times in 2018, 2019, 2022 and 2023. Her first four league titles came with her father, Scott Stephens, serving as her assistant coach before he passed away on Nov. 21, 2020.

Prior to her stint at GSU, she worked as an assistant at Sacramento State for three seasons from 2013-16 under Bunky Harkleroad, for the 2012-13 season at Glenville State as an assistant to Harkleroad and began her college coaching career at Ohio Valley University, filling a role as an assistant there from 2011-12.

A native of Parkersburg, W.Va., Caldwell played high school basketball for her dad at Parkersburg South High School, where he led that program to three state titles during a 13-year career. Her sisters Anne and Jill also played at PSHS before going on to collegiate careers at the University of Cincinnati from 2002-06 and 2005-09, respectively.

As a collegiate player, Caldwell (then Stephens) helped lead Glenville State to the 2010-11 West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Championship as a player and earn an NCAA Division



II Tournament berth. She was named the WVIAC Student-Athlete of the Year that season and academically made the WVIAC Commissioner's Honor Roll as a junior and senior.

Caldwell is married to Justin Caldwell, who was

head coach of the men's basketball program at Greenville State from 2018-23 and served as a men's hoops assistant at Marshall in 2023-24. He joined Rick Barnes' men's basketball staff at Tennessee on Sept. 20, 2024, when he was named player de-

velopment coordinator for the Volunteers.

The Caldwells are the parents of a son, Conor Scott, who was born on Jan. 20, 2025.
