TIPPING IT OFF

LAST TIME OUT

- Mississippi State won their third consecutive game to open the season when they took down Mississippi Valley State, 107-43.
- The 107 points that the Bulldogs scored marked the highest total scored in the Sam Purcell era at Mississippi State.
- Chandler Prater finished with a career high 25 points on 6-11 shooting, and tied a career-high with four makes from distance. She also collected five rebounds and five assists and went 9-9 from the charity stripe.
- Prater's performance was the fourth 25, 5 and 5 performance in the SEC this season.
- Favour Nwaedozzi collected a career-high 16 rebounds. It was the most rebounds in a single game by any player in the SEC this season.
- Madison Francis earned season-highs of 17 points and eight rebounds, as well as collecting five blocks. It was her second 5+ block performance of the season.
- Francis leads the country with 12 total blocks on the season (as of Nov. 11).

SCOUTING THE OPPONENT - GEORGIA STATE

- Jackson State moved to 1-1 on the season after blowing a halftime lead to Tennessee Tech, 59-53.
- The Tigers see scoring throughout their lineup, as they average 47.0

bench points per game. That total puts them atop the SWAC and ranks eighth among the nation.

- The Tigers also lead the SWAC in assists per game, scoring defense and scoring offense, among many other categories.

A PHYSICAL BRAND OF BASKETBALL

- The Bulldogs have been aggressive in getting to the basket this season.
- State is averaging 26.0 free throw attempts per game, which ranks fifth in the SEC and 42nd in the nation.
- The Bulldogs have shot 30+ free throws in two games this season. Prior to this season, State had not shot 30+ free throws since December 29, 2023.
- Against Mississippi Valley on November 9, the Bulldogs hit 25 of 31 free throws. It was the first time State had hit 25+ since they played Grambling State on December 4, 2022.
- Alternatively, Mississippi State is playing sound defense. They rank atop the SEC in fouls per game, averaging only 13.3 per game. That total ranks 33rd nationally.
- State is shooting 74.4 percent on the season from the charity stripe, ranking fifth in the SEC.

BLOCK U!

- The Bulldogs rank second in the SEC and seventh nationally with 8.7 blocks per game.
- Eight different Bulldogs have collected a block through the first three games of the season - five of those have picked up multiple.
- Madison Francis leads the charge and the nation with 12 total blocks on the year.
- Favour Nwaedozi has picked up four blocks, Kharyssa Richardson has gained three and Chandler Prater and Destiney McPhaul have rejected two shots a piece.
- The single-season block total is held by two Bulldogs - Martha Alwal (2013-14) and Chanel Mokango (2008-09). They both collected 97 blocks in a season. Alwal did so at 2.7 BPG, while Mokango did it at 2.9 BPG.

NEW FACES DONNING THE MAROON AND WHITE

- Nine new faces will be wearing the Maroon and White for the first time during the 2025-26 season.
- Coach Purcell brought in the second-best high school recruiting class in program history when he signed the 10th-ranked class according to ESPN. This includes F **Madison Francis** (No. 38), F **Nataliyah Gray** (No. 93) and G **Jaylah Lampley** (No. 37).
- The trio follows behind the 2019 signing class, which finished ranked sixth.
- Six players entered the transfer portal and found their destination in Starkville: G **Trayanna Crisp**, G **Awa Fane**, G **Saniyah King**, F **Favour Nwaedozi**, F **Kharyssa Richardson** and F/C **Faith Wylder**.

The Bulldogs see two active returners in **Chandler Prater** and **Destiney McPhaul**. **Rocio Jiménez** rounds out the roster as the third returner but had not seen action due to injury.

PRATER SET TO ANCHOR THE SQUAD

- Chandler Prater returns for her second season in the Maroon and White, and her seventh season overall, making her one of the longest tenured players in all of college basketball.
- Prater collected a career-high 25 points against Mississippi Valley State (Nov. 9), marking the third time in her career that she had collected 20 or more.
- Prater also knocked down a career-high tying four three pointers in the contest. She also collected five rebounds and five assists, making her just the fourth SEC player to collect a 25, 5 and 5 statline this seson.
- The graduate posted eight points and seven rebounds in her seasn-debut against Davidson (Nov. 3).
- Prater was named a "Top Dawg" by Strength and Conditioning Coach Kaiti Jones for her work in the weight room and on the court.
- After rehabbing an achilles injury during the 2023-24 season, Prater's Mississippi State debut also served as a return to the

floor.

- In her first action since November 22, 2023, Prater collected nine points and nine rebounds in her MSU debut against Memphis on November 7, 2024.
- Prater finished the season averaging 6.4 points per game, 4.2 rebounds
- Throughout the 2024-25 season, Prater began to take on a larger role. She became a regular starter after making her third start as a Bulldog against LSU on February 2, 2025 and remained in the starting lineup for the remainder of the regular season and the SEC Tournament.
- From that point, Prater increased her production in nearly every category. Below is a list of Prater's averages in the 22 games before making the start and her averages over the last 12 games of the season.

- Prater finished in double-figures 13 times during the 2024-25 season, five of which came in the last 12 games.
- She proved to be a rebounding force for the Bulldogs, collecting 5+ rebounds 13 times during the season. She collected a season-high nine rebounds three times.

MCPHAUL READY TO PRODUCE

- Destiney McPhaul is entering her second season in the Maroon and White after coming to Starkville as the No. 1 Ranked JUCO Transfer in 2024.
- McPhaul made a huge impact in the season-opener against Davidson, collecting a career-high 20 points on 60% shooting. She also grabbed five rebounds, dished two assists and swiped two steals.
- She wasn't satisfied with the performance however - in a postgame media session, McPhaul said she played decent, but pointed to aspects of her game where she felt she could play better.
- McPhaul averaged 8.1 ponts, 2.7 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 1.2 steals per game during the 2024-25 campaign.
- McPhaul's breakout moment as a Bulldog came in the SEC Tournament last season, where she collected a caeerer-high 19 points against Missouri on 77.8 percent shooting from the field, including going 4-5 from distance.
- McPhaul's performance was apart of a 31-0 run for the Bulldogs, who eventually would take down Missouri 75-55 and advance to the second round of the SEC Tournament.
- Coach Sam Purcell has stated the opportunity that McPhaul has this season. With the departure of All-SEC Second Team Member Jerkaila Jordan, McPhaul will return to her natural

- McPhaul has stated in media availabilites that she was happy to do anything to help the team last season, including playing the point guard spot, but that she feels more comfortable at the two.

OPPORTUNITY.

- Coach Sam Purcell has repeated one word constantly when talking about the 2025-26 season. Opportunity.
- The Bulldogs have the opportunity to play against opponents in the strongest conference in the country - the SEC. In the preseason AP Poll, five of the top 10 teams are from the Southeastern Conference. Purcell believes the strength of the conference will make his team battle-tested to where they will be playing their best basketball come March.
- With only two active returners and one returning starter, many players get the opportunity to step up and provide an impact that they weren't given the chance to do at previous schools.

KING AT THE POINT

- Saniyah King will facilitate the Bulldog offense at the point this season.
- In her freshman season at Howard University, King started in 31 of 32 games and averaged 11.5 points, 4.5 assists and 3.1 rebounds per game.
- King scored in double figures 20 times, including a season-high 25. She dished out 5+ assists 17 times last season.
- King totaled 145 assists throughout the season, which were the secnd-most assists in the nation by any freshman during the 2024-25 season.
- King earned MEAC Rookie of the Year honors and was named Rookie of the Week 11 times during the 2024-25 season.

FRANCIS TURNING HEADS

- Forward Madison Francis is slated to make a big impact in her freshman season for the Bulldogs.
- Francis collected career-highs with 17 points and eight rebounds, while tallying 5 blocks, her second 5+ block performance of hte season against Mississippi Valley State (Nov. 9).
- In her collegiate debut, Francis collected eight points and SIX blocks. It marked the first six block performance of any Bulldog since 2023.
- Francis was selected to attend SEC Media Days alongside Graduate Chandler Prater and Senior Kharyssa Richardson, an event that freshmen rarely attend.
- Francis says her selection to attend the event reinforces the trust that Coach Sam Purcell has given her early in her Bulldog career.
- Francis went viral before stepping foot in Starkville, as she threw down dunks in games during her high school career at Lancaster High. During her career, Francis did a bit of everything.

In just her senior season, she averaged 32 points, 14.8 rebounds, 5.1 steals, 4.5 blocks and 3.9 assists per game.

- The forward from Lancaster, N.Y., also has gained experience that not many high school recruits get. She played with the 2024 USA Women's U18 National Team and won gold at the FIBA U18 AmeriCup.
- Franics was also selected to play in the 2025 USA Women's Nike Hoop Summit, an honor only 12 high school players across the nation received.

LAMPLEY DISPLAYS ELITE BALL KNOWLEDGE

- Freshman Jaylah Lampley made a huge impact in her collegiate debut, as she posted 11 points and six rebounds.
- Coach Sam Purcell has raved about Lampley's basketball IQ and knowing when to make the right plays.
- He credits it to her upbringing, as her mother is a high school basketball coach, and coached Jaylah during her time in high school.

FROM NIGERIA, TO JAPAN AND NOW STARKVILLE

- Junior forward Favour Nwaedozi is arguably one of the more interesting transfer stories across the nation.
- Nwaedozi collected 17 points and 10 rebounds against Georgia State (Nov. 7), earning her second double-double.
- In her first game for the Bulldogs, Nwaedozi collected a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds.
- Originally from Delta, Nigeria, Nwaedozi moved to Japan. She attenended Hakuho Girls' High School in Yokohama, Japan. From there, she began her collegiate career at Mukogawa Women's University in Nishinomiya, a six hour drive from Yokohama.
- In MUW's spring season, Nwaedozi averaged 26 points and 17 rebounds per game.
- Coach Sam Purcell credits his staff and connections they have made to finding Nwaedozi. When watching film, all it took for the Bulldogs to be interested in Nwaedozi was watching the way she ran the floor, Coach Purcell said in a media session.
- Nwaedozi signed to the Bulldogs and moved to Starkville, where she experienced a 14 hour time change.
- Now in the Maroon and White, Nwaedozi is slated to make an instant impact for the Bulldogs.

STRONG SCHEDULE AHEAD FOR THE BULLDOGS

- The schedule for this year's Bulldog squad proves to be one of the toughest in the league, as State is scheduled to face eight teams ranked inside the top 25 of the preseason AP poll.
- Five of those eight matchups against preseason top 25 teams take place away from Humphrey Coliseum:

NEW ROSTER, NO PROBLEM.

- This year's roster sees nine new faces and only three returners (two active), tying Mississippi State for the second-least returning

experience in the SEC. and putting Coach Sam Purcell in a familiar situation.

- In the previous three seasons of his tenure, Coach Purcell was able to earn a bid to the NCAA Tournament in two of those seasons: his debut 2022-23 roster and last seasons 24-25 roster. Below is a list of the roster outlook of both of those teams:

'22-23 NCAA Tournament Team:

- Seven Newcomers (Five Transfers), Eight Returners (Six Active)

'24-25 NCAA Tournament Team

- 10 Newcomers (Seven Transfers), Four Returners (Three Active)

PORTAL PROWESS

- Once again, Coach Sam Purcell and his staff took advantage of the transfer portal, bringing in six new faces from many different levels of the game.
- Four players made the jump to Mississippi State from the Division 1 ranks - Trayanna Crisp (North Carolina), Saniyah King (Howard), Kharyssa Richardson (Ole Miss) and Faith Wylder (Stony Brook).
- Coach Purcell brought in a NJCAA All-American for the second straight season when Awa Fane (Panola College) committed to the Bulldogs.
- The most interesting transfer story for the Bulldogs is Favour Nwaedoz, who transferred to Starkville after playing two seasons at Mukogawa Women's University in Nishinomiya, Hyogo, Japan.

AN ELITE FRESHMAN CLASS

- Coach Sam Purcell and his staff brought in the second-highest ranking recruiting class in program history with the 10th ranked signing class.
- In that class are freshmen (No. 38) Madison Francis, (No. 93) Nataliyah Gray and (No. 37) Jaylah Lampley.
- The best MSU signing class is the sixth-ranked 2019 class, making the 2025 signing class only the second top-10 class in MSU history.

PURCELL'S CONTINUED SUCCESS

- In his first three seasons at the helm, Coach Sam Purcell has guided the Bulldogs to three 20+ win seasons, making him the first coach in program history to do such.
- Coach Purcell is one of three active SEC coaches who have won 20+ games in their first three seasons at their current SEC schools.

- Coach Purcell has led the Bulldogs to the NCAA Tournament twice in three seasons. No other coach in program history had

taken a State team to the NCAA Tournament in their first three seasons.

- Entering 2025-26, Coach Purcell has won 67 overall games and 24 SEC games. Both marks are program bests of any coach through their first three seasons.
- Sam Purcell is the only head coach in program history and one of six in SEC women's basketball since 2000 to record consecutive seasons with 20 or more wins in each of their first three seasons as an SEC Head Coach. Other SEC women's basketball head coaches since 2000 to surpass the 20-win mark in each of their first three seasons were Pokey Chatman, Nikki Fargas, Kim Mulkey (LSU), Holly Warlick (Tennessee) and Melanie Balcomb (Vanderbilt).

RICHARDSON & CRISP MAKING MSU HOME SENIOR YEAR

- Forward Kharyssa Richardson and Guard Trayanna Crisp have taken similar but different paths to Starkville, but are both set to make a impact for the Bulldogs this year.
- The duo are both on their third school. Richardson is no stranger to the Bulldogs, as she has played in the Southeastern Conference for all three of her prior seasons.
- Richardson played her freshman season at Auburn and made the 94 mile drive to Starkville from Oxford after spending the last two seasons at Ole Miss.
- Crisp stayed in her home state of Arizona for her freshman and sophomore seasons, playing for Arizona State. Last season, she played at North Carolina.
- Coach Sam Purcell has talked about the duo in media sessions and has reminded the success that these two in the past.
- As a freshman at Auburn, Richardson started in 27 of 28 games played. She averaged 7.2 points and 4.7 rebounds per game.
- Crisp started in 35 games during her two seasons at Arizona State, including 28 of 31 games played her sophomore season. Most notably, she averaged 12.1 points, 2.9 rebounds and 2.3 assists her sophomore year.

- Since the duo both transferred to Starkville, Coach Purcell has talked about getting them both back to playing back to those numbers.

- Francis took the advertisements as her sign that Mississippi State was the place for her. Coach Sam Purcell recalls the phone call he received from Francis as her saying those billboards were the signs she prayed for that Mississippi State was indeed the right place for her.

- In each season at the helm of the Bulldog women's program, Coach Sam Purcell has identified a mantra to guide the team into the season.
- This year the manta is DRIVE, which also serves as an acronym. (Determination, Resilience, Impact, Virtuousness, Excellence)
- Coach Purcell is challenging his team to have a serious drive this season. He says playing in the SEC requires 100% effort, night in and night out.

HUMPHREY COLISEUM AND THE ELITE BULLDOG FANBASE

- Humphrey Coliseum has been home to crowds that have finished the season in the top-25 of average attendance for 10 consecutive seasons.
- Only 11 programs in the nation have been inside the top-25 of average attendance for the past 10 seasons. This total does not include the 2020-21 season, where attendance was restricted due to COVID-19.
- Under head coach Sam Purcell, the Bulldogs hold a .775 winning percentage at home. (.38-11)

HEAD COACH SAM PURCELL



Sam Purcell was named the ninth head coach in Mississippi State women's basketball history on Saturday, March 12, 2022. The 2025-26 season will be his fourth year as a head coach and his fourth leading the women's basketball program at Mississippi State.

THE 2024-25 SEASON SAW PURCELL LEAD MISSISSIPPI STATE BACK TO THE NCAA TOURNAMENT FOR THE SECOND TIME IN HIS THREE SEASONS AT THE HELM. The Bulldogs concluded the season with a 22-12 record, the third straight season they have finished with 20+ wins.

Purcell continued an excellent start to his young career as a head coach. **WITH ONLY THREE RETURNING PLAYERS FROM THE 2023-24 ROSTER, HE BECAME THE ONLY COACH IN PROGRAM HISTORY TO GUIDE HIS FIRST THREE TEAMS TO 20 OR MORE WINS. PURCELL HAS TOTALED THE MOST WINS (67), SEC WINS (24) AND MOST NCAA TOURNAMENT WINS (3) OF ANY COACH THROUGH THEIR FIRST THREE SEASONS IN PROGRAM HISTORY.**

Purcell guided Jerkaila Jordan to the tops of the Mississippi State record book during their time together. She concluded her career in the Maroon and White second in program history with 273 steals and fifth with 1,899 points. She brought home her second straight All-SEC Second Team Honor for her performance on the 2024-25 campaign.

After signing what was the second-best recruiting class in program history in his inaugural season, Purcell bested it in year three. The 2025 high school signing class ranked 10th among the nation and included two ESPNW top 50 recruits and one top 100 recruit.

With a win against Mercer on Nov. 20, 2024, Purcell became the fastest head coach to reach 50 wins at Mississippi State, achieving the mark in 73 games, which is eight faster than the next.

In 2023-24, Purcell led Mississippi State to a 23-12 record, 8-8 SEC, and became the only head coach in program history and one of six in the SEC women's basketball since 2000 to surpass the 20-win mark in each of their first two seasons. Purcell totaled the most wins (45), most SEC wins (17) and most NCAA Tournament wins (2) of any head coach through their first two seasons in program history.

Purcell **COACHED A PAIR OF BULLDOGS TO ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS DURING THE 2023-24 SEASON.** He led graduate student Jessika Carter to 2024 All-SEC Second Team and 2024 WBCA Honorable All-American accolades. Carter was selected with the 23rd overall pick in the Second Round of the 2024 WNBA Draft by the New York Liberty and was the ninth overall player to be drafted to the WNBA and the first under Purcell at Mississippi State. She was the first player from Mississippi State to be drafted since both Teaira McCowan and Anriel Howard were selected in 2019.

Purcell also led guard Jerkaila Jordan to 2024 All-SEC Second Team honors. Jordan set career-highs in points, rebounds, assists, steals, blocks and minutes totals in 2023-24 were all career-highs and was the only player in the SEC to average at least 15.0 points, 5.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 2.0 steals per game in 2023-24.

With a win over No. 9/9 LSU on Jan. 29, 2024, Purcell earned his first win over a top-25 and top-10 opponent as a head coach. It was Mississippi State's first top-10 win since a win at No. 10 Texas on Dec. 2, 2018. It was also the first sellout crowd of his tenure with 9,121 fans inside Humphrey Coliseum.

Mississippi State opened its second season under Purcell in 2023-24 ranked in the Associated Press Preseason Top-25 poll at No. 25, the program's first time listed in the preseason poll since 2020-21. The preseason spot also marked a return to the AP Top-25 poll after a 44-week absence. Mississippi State earned its highest rankings of the season when it was ranked No. 21 in both the week four editions of the AP Poll on Nov. 21 and the USA Today Coaches Poll on Nov. 22. The No. 21 ranking in the AP Poll tied the program's best in the poll since Jan. 25, 2021, while it tied the program's best ranking in the USA Today Coaches Poll since Jan. 26, 2021.

Under Purcell, Assistant Coaches Michelle Clark-Heard and Corry Irvin went on to earn head coaching positions at Mercer and Chicago State, respectively, while Graduate Assistant Luke Carns went on to be named Director of Player Personnel at Texas State following the 2023-24 season. It marked the latest staff under Purcell to advance their career after Assistant A.D. of Women's Basketball Joi Williams was named Men's Basketball Chief of Staff at South Florida and Graduate Assistant Kelby Jones earned an Assistant Coach position at Oklahoma State, each following the 2022-23 season.

Purcell's first season as a head coach was a season of 'firsts' for the up-and-coming coaching star. A handful of those 'firsts' included his first game as a head coach, his first win, and his first NCAA Tournament appearance. But it also came with firsts for the Mississippi State women's basketball program that saw **PURCELL BECOME THE WINNINGEST FIRST-YEAR HEAD COACH IN PROGRAM HISTORY.**

In his first season sitting in the head chair, **PURCELL BECAME THE WINNINGEST HEAD COACH AT MISSISSIPPI STATE IN THEIR DEBUT SEASON WITH 22 WINS WHILE ALSO BECOMING THE FIRST TO HAVE A WINNING RECORD IN THE SEC AFTER GOING 9-7 AND FINISHING FIFTH IN THE TOUGHEST CONFERENCE IN THE COUNTRY.** Most impressive, though, is that he guided the Bulldogs to the NCAA Tournament following a three-year hiatus.

In leading the team to the Big Dance in his first season, Purcell set the standard at Mississippi State, as no coach in program history had made the NCAA Tournament before their third season leading the program. On top of that, **PURCELL BECAME THE FASTEST COACH AT MISSISSIPPI STATE TO WIN A PAIR OF NCAA TOURNAMENT GAMES.** In winning two tournament games, **MISSISSIPPI STATE BECAME THE FIRST TEAM IN NCAA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL HISTORY TO ADVANCE TO THE TOURNAMENT'S SECOND ROUND AFTER STARTING IN THE FIRST FOUR ROUND.**

Purcell helped guide a pair of Bulldogs to All-Conference honors during the 2022-23 season. He coached Jessika Carter to Second Team All-SEC honors and a place on the SEC All-Defensive Team. Carter had a career season under Purcell, setting career bests in points scored (458), blocked shots (65) and assists (42). He also led Debreasha Powe to the SEC All-Freshmen team after a promising rookie campaign for the Mississippi native.

Before he arrived in Starkville, Purcell spent nine seasons at Louisville under the direction of future hall of famer Jeff Walz. While on the staff at Louisville, Purcell helped guide the Cardinals to a 266-48 overall record with eight NCAA Tournament appearances, seven Sweet 16s, five Elite Eights and two Final Fours. He also helped lead Louisville to four ACC Regular Season Championships and the 2018 ACC Tournament title, their first tournament crown since 1993.

Promoted to associate coach in 2017-18, Purcell played a critical role in guiding Louisville to a program-best 36-3 overall record that included an ACC Regular Season and Tournament Championship. The Cardinals opened the year going 20-0, marking the best start in program history. They then earned a No. 2 ranking in the Associated Press Top-25 Poll and defeated opponents by an average of 27.5 points per game. During the 2020-21 season, Purcell helped the

Cardinals to a 16-0 start and the first-ever No. 1 ranking in the USA Today Top 25 Coaches Poll in program history.

Purcell helped the Louisville offense consistently rank among the nation’s best. In every season but one at Louisville, the offense ranked inside the top 40 in points per game while averaging more than 72.2 points per game during that time. The impressive scoring margins that Louisville won games by – more than a +16.0-scoring margin in each of his last five seasons there.

Purcell led the recruiting efforts at Louisville and he has landed the nation’s top recruit on two separate occasions with two different programs. Purcell inked top-rated prospect Kaela Davis in 2013 at Georgia Tech and Asia Durr at Louisville in 2015.

All nine signing classes that Purcell helped recruit were ranked in the top 15 by ESPN. Of those nine classes, four were ranked inside the top 10, highlighted by the No. 1 class in 2015, the No. 4 class in 2017, the No. 6 class in 2016 and the No. 8 class in 2014. Even more impressive, of the 15 McDonald’s All-Americans in Louisville’s history, 13 were recruited by Purcell.

Before his time at Louisville, Purcell had stops at Georgia Tech, Tulsa and Auburn. Purcell has learned from some of the best minds in college basketball, including Jeff Walz, Nell Fortner (former Auburn and current Georgia Tech head coach and the head coach of the 1996 Olympic Team) and Joe Ciampi (25-year head coach at Auburn, 2005 Hall of Fame inductee and Purcell’s father-in-law).

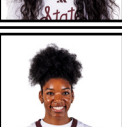
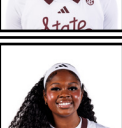
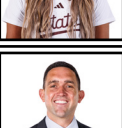
