## BULLDOG BITES

- Since the start of the 2016-17 campaign, Mississippi State owns 139 wins, which is the fourth-most victories in all of Division I behind UConn (151), Baylor (146) and Louisville (144).
- Mississippi State wants to dominate the paint every game, and the offense's primary goal is to get the ball down low for a basket. MSU is outscoring opposing teams 544-330 in the paint, which is an average margin of more than 15.3 points per game.
- The Bulldogs also average 6.9 threes per game this year, which ranks third all-time in MSU history for a single season. State only averaged more 3-pointers during the 2017-18 (7.1 3FG/game) and the 2009-10 (7.2 3FG/game) campaigns. State has been efficient from beyond the arc, shooting a .361 clip, which ranks fourth in program history for a single season.
- Rickeya Jackson, who was named to the Wooden Award Midseason Top 25 watch list, is averaging a team-best 15.6 points, 4.6 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game. The sophomore forward owns two 30-point efforts and 10 games with 20+ points during her career.
- One of the most efficient posts in the country, Jessika Carter ranks 25th among active Division I players in career field goal percentage (.550). She owns 17 career double-doubles, leads the team rebounding (8.9 rpg) and is second in scoring (15.0).
- The duo of Carter and Jackson has been a scoring nightmare for opposing defenses the last two seasons, with the two combining for 18 games with 20+ points. Jackson's 10 such performances ranks 11th in MSU history since 1999, while Carter's eight 20-point games stands as the 16th most.
- After ranking eighth in the country and leading the SEC in assist/turnover ratio (2.80) last season, Myah Taylor picked up right where she left off, ranking 20th in the country and leading the SEC with a 2.86 assist/turnover ratio.
- Between her scoring and assists, Taylor has been a major factor in State's offense this season. In fact, she has accounted for more than 25 percent of MSU's total scoring in seven contests, including two games during SEC play when she accounted for 50 percent or more of the team's scoring.
- Because of their play this season, Carter, Jackson and Taylor were recognized as finalists for their Naismith Starting Five position awards. Jackson and Carter have also been tabbed to National Player of the Year watch lists. Combined, the trio averages 40.1 points, 16.4 rebounds and 7.2 assists per game.
- A scoring threat and spark off the bench for Mississippi State, Aliyah Matharu is making a strong case for SEC Sixth Woman of the Year. She is averaging 9.9 points, 3.2 rebounds, 1.7 assists and 1.4 steals per game this year.

## TAYLOR EXCELLING AS MSU'S FLOOR GENERAL

- Redshirt Junior **Myah Taylor** entered this season as one of the top point guards in the country, and she continues to earn that recognition with her play this year.
- After being challenged to be more of a scorer by Coach McCray-Penson, Taylor has improved her scoring this season, finishing in double figures seven times this year after only posting six such games in the previous two seasons combined.
- While her assists per game are slightly down as a result of her uptick in scoring, Taylor continues to find her teammates for an open shot with seven performances with 5+ assists.
- Between her scoring and assists, Taylor has been a major factor in State's offense this season. In fact, she has accounted for more than 25 percent of MSU's total scoring in seven contests, including two games during SEC play when she has accounted for 50 percent of the team's scoring.
- The Olive Branch, Miss., native ranks 20th in the country and leads the SEC with a 2.86 assist/turnover ratio. Last year, she ranked eighth nationally and led the league with a 2.80 ratio.
- Defensively, she leads the Bulldogs in steals (23) and boasts four blocks. She has recorded multiple steals in seven games.

## JACKSON, CARTER GOING FOR 20+ POINTS

- The All-SEC duo of **Jessika Carter** and **Rickea Jackson** has been a scoring nightmare for opposing defenses the last two seasons, with the two combining for 18 games with 20+ points.
- Jackson owns 10 career games with at least 20 points, with nine of those performances coming against SEC foes. Carter has eclipsed the 20-point margin eight times in her career.
- This season, the duo has combined for five 20-point games.

## CARTER CLIMBING THE LEADERBOARDS

- Junior **Jessika Carter** has developed into one of the top post players in the country, and a large part of that has to do with her efficient scoring and her ability to protect the paint on defense. In the MSU record books, Carter ranks inside the top 10 in field goal percentage (3rd), blocks per game (4th) and total blocks (5th).
- This year, she ranks 42nd in Division I in field goal percentage (.521) and sixth in the SEC in blocks per game (1.43).
- Carter owns four career games with five or more blocks and recorded multiple blocks in a game 19 times last year.

## BIG THREE: BY THE NUMBERS

- It's no secret that State's Big Three of **Jessika Carter**, **Rickea Jackson** and **Myah Taylor** is the backbone to the team's success on the hardwood. When they are at the top of their game, Mississippi State is one of the best teams in the country.
- Because of their play this season, all three were recognized as finalists for their Naismith Starting Five position awards. Jackson and Carter have also been tabbed to National Player of the Year watch lists.
- Combined, the trio averages 40.1 points, 16.4 rebounds and 7.2 assists per game. In the five main statistical categories, at least one of the three is the team leader, as Jackson leads the team in scoring, Carter paces the team in rebounds and blocks and Taylor in assists and steals.
- Taylor (21) and Jackson (17) account for 39 percent of MSU's total 3-pointers on the year (38 of 97).
- During SEC play, each member of State's Big Three is averaging double-digit scoring and is shooting 42 percent or better from the field.
- For the year, the trio has posted a total of 31 double-figure performances, and one member has been the team's scoring leader in every game.

# STATE'S BIG THREE



### THE MCCRAY WAY RINGS IN NEW ERA IN STARKVILLE

- On April 11, 2020, **Nikki McCray-Penson** was introduced as the eighth women's basketball head coach at Mississippi State.
- The Collierville, Tennessee, native is considered one of the top rising stars in women's college basketball having both playing and coaching experience in multiple Final Fours.
- McCray-Penson has won championships at all levels of her basketball career. As a coach, she's has been a part of one national championship, four conference championships and four conference tournament championships. As a player, she was a two-time Olympic gold medalist and 1998 World Cup gold medalist while competing for Team USA. She led her Columbus Quest team to the 1997 ABL Championship. During college, she helped Tennessee win three SEC regular-season championships and two SEC Tournament titles.
- The Women's Basketball Hall of Famer enjoyed a prolific and decorated playing career. The three-time WNBA All-Star spent nine years in the league. Prior to the WNBA, she played two seasons in the ABL, where she earned MVP honors during her championship season.
- During her collegiate career at Tennessee, McCray-Penson spearheaded legendary coach **Pat Summitt's** teams to four NCAA Tournament appearances. The two-time All-American garnered SEC Player of the Year honors as a junior and senior, joining **Chamique Holdsclaw** and **Meighan Simmons** as the only three Lady Vols to ever win the yearly award twice.
- Before coming to Starkville, the 2020 C-USA Coach of the Year most recently finished her third season at Old Dominion, where she led the Monarchs to a 24-6 record. It was the second season in a row that ODU won at least 20 games, an accomplishment that hadn't been achieved since 2006-08.
- Prior to becoming a head coach, McCray-Penson served on staff as an assistant coach at South Carolina, where she helped the Gamecocks claim their first-ever National Championship in 2017. South Carolina earned six-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances during her tenure, reaching five Sweet 16s, two Elite Eights and two Final Fours. During her last four seasons in Columbia, she helped lead the Gamecocks to four-straight SEC regular-season championships and three SEC Tournament titles.
- Part of South Carolina's success on the hardwood was a result of McCray-Penson's ability to identify talent as the assistant recruiting coordinator. Regarded as one of the top recruiters in the country, she helped land the No. 2 class and the top player in the nation in 2014.
- In her first coaching job, McCray-Penson played a big role in guiding Western Kentucky to back-to-back postseason appearances and a 2008 Sun Belt Tournament championship as an assistant coach. She was also the program's head recruiting coordinator and signed one of WKU's top all-time classes in 2007-08.



### STATE AMONG WINNINGEST PROGRAMS IN DIVISION I SINCE 2016-17

- Since the start of the 2016-17 campaign, Mississippi State owns 139 wins, which is the fourth-most victories in all of Division I.
- UConn ranks first, Baylor is second on the list, and Louisville stands at third.
- During the stretch, State has appeared in two national title games, made three-consecutive Elite Eights and won three SEC championships.
- After posting 34 wins in 2016-17, the Bulldogs recorded a program-record 37 victories during the 2017-18 campaign. State followed that season up with 33 wins in 2018-19 and 27 in 2019-20.
- Mississippi State has won eight matchups against teams on the list during the last four seasons and owns a 5-2 record against the other top five teams.

### BULLDOGS SHATTER SINGLE-GAME 3-POINTERS RECORD

- In its game against Troy on Dec. 14, Mississippi State knocked down a program-record 18 3-pointers.
- That mark also matched the SEC single-game record, joining Missouri (18 vs. Bradley, 2013, & 18 vs. Auburn, 2013) atop the conference leaderboards.
- The previous record was 14 threes against Iowa State on Nov. 23, 2001. The Bulldogs' 37 3-point attempts also set a program record, besting the previous mark of 36 against Savannah State on Feb. 8, 2007.

### MSU PLACING A GREATER EMPHASIS ON 3-POINTERS

- While Mississippi State's primary goal on offense is to attack the paint, the Bulldogs have placed an emphasis on being able to knock down 3-pointers when opponents pack the paint on defense.
- The Bulldogs average 6.9 threes per game for the season, which ranks third all-time in MSU history for a single season. State only averaged more 3-pointers during the 2017-18 (7.1 3FG/game) and the 2009-10 (7.2 3FG/game) campaigns.
- Along with the increase in threes, MSU has also been very efficient. On the year, Mississippi State is shooting a .361 clip from deep, which ranks fourth in program history.

## STATE WINNING THE SCORING BATTLE IN THE PAINT

- It's no secret. Mississippi State wants to dominate the paint every game, and the offense's primary goal is to get the ball down low for a basket.
- On the year, MSU is outscoring opposing teams 544-330 in the paint. That's an average margin of more than 15.3 points per game.
- State's 544 points in the paint accounts for 52 percent of its total scoring this season, despite a greater emphasis on shooting 3-pointers on offense compared to past years.
- The Bulldogs have won the scoring battle in the paint in 11 of their 14 games this season.
- MSU has scored 40-plus points in the paint during five games this year, including two games with more than 60 points.

## SEC SIXTH WOMAN OF THE YEAR? A CASE FOR MATHARU

- A scoring threat and spark off the bench for Mississippi State, Aliyah Matharu is making a strong case for SEC Sixth Woman of the Year.
- The sophomore guard is ranks third on the team in scoring with 9.9 points per game. She's shooting 47 percent from the floor and 38 percent from beyond the arc.
- She's finished with double-digit scoring in six contests this year, including three games during SEC play. She posted a season-high 19 points against Kentucky and dropped 17 points with the help of three 3-pointers at Arkansas.
- Matharu has increased her production in other areas since last year, averaging 3.2 rebounds, 1.7 assists and 1.4 steals per game.
- The Washington, D.C., native has recorded five games with at least five rebounds, eight contests with multiple assists and six performances with multiple steals.

## MISSISSIPPI STATE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

### MCDONALD'S ALL-AMERICAN TRIO HIGHLIGHTS ROSTER

- Prior to the 2019 class, the Mississippi State women's basketball team had never signed a McDonald's All-American. Entering this season, the Bulldogs boast three All-Americans.
- Sophomore **Rickea Jackson** became the first McDonald's All-American signee to join the program. As a freshman, Jackson led State in scoring with 15.1 ppg and ranked third on the team with 5.1 rpg.
- After sitting out last season due to NCAA transfer rules, **Sidney Cooks** is eligible to play for the Bulldogs this year. The 2017 McDonald's All-American is one of the most versatile post players in the country, possessing the ability to score at all three levels. At Michigan, she averaged 9.5 ppg and 4.6 rpg while shooting 38 percent from beyond the arc.
- The third McDonald's All-American is freshman **Madison Hayes**. The Chattanooga, Tennessee, native was the No. 28 player in the 2020 signing class according to espnW. The all-around player amassed 3,055 points, 1,583 rebounds, 459 assists, 457 steals and 241 blocks during her four-year prep career.



### GODFREY JOINS BULLDOGS AS MIDYEAR ENROLLEE

- A top-40 prospect in the class of 2021, guard **KN'isha Godfrey** joined the Mississippi State women's basketball roster as a midyear enrollee on Dec. 25. While she is eligible to play this season, a decision on whether or not she will compete has yet to be made.
- A three-time player of the year out of Tampa Bay Tech High School, Godfrey signed with the Bulldogs on Nov. 13 as the eight-ranked point guard in the country by espnW.
- As a junior, Godfrey averaged 12.1 points, 3.8 steals, 3.6 assists and 2.1 rebounds per game. During her sophomore campaign, she helped lead Tampa Bay Tech to the Florida 8A title, the first-ever state championship for the program. She averaged 8.1 points, 3.5 assists, 3.4 rebounds and 2.8 steals per game during the season.
- Godfrey posted 12.7 points, 2.5 steals, 2.2 assists and 1.7 rebounds per game as a freshman. During her career, she's led her team to three district titles, two regional championships, two final four appearances in the playoffs and one state championship.

### STATE SIGNS FOUR IN CLASS OF 2021

- In her first class, **Nikki McCray-Penson** and her staff inked some of the nation's top players for the 2021 signing class.
- The class is highlighted by three top-100 prospects, including four-star guard **KN'isha Godfrey**, who plays at one of the top high schools in the country. The Bulldogs also signed do-it-all guard **Mia Moore**, who recorded a quadruple-double as a sophomore, along with **Jasmine Shavers**, who was coached by former NBA star **Jason Terry**. State closed out the early signing period by adding athletic forward **Denae Carter**.
- **Denae Carter** is coming off a junior campaign that saw her average 16.6 points, 7.1 rebounds, 2.7 steals, 2.1 assists and 1.8 blocks per game. She led St. Basil Academy to the state playoffs with a 24-3 record and was tabbed to the 2020 Class 3A All-State second team and was named ACAA League MVP.

- Ranked as the No. 52 player in the country by Prospect Nation, **Mia Moore** entered her senior season as a four-star guard from St. Francis High School in Alpharetta, Georgia. She was tabbed GACA Class 1A North All-State as a junior after averaging 13.7 points, 4.3 steals, 4.1 rebounds and 3.9 assists per game.
- Rated as the No. 55 player in the country by espnW, **Jasmine "Jazz" Shavers** is a four-star guard from Mesquite, Texas. She was named the Dallas Morning News No. 1 area recruit for the class of 2021 after being named the District 11-6A Offensive Player of the Year and TGCA All-State Team as a junior after averaging 18.9 points, 5.6 rebounds, 3.5 steals and 3.3 assists per game.

### ROSTER BREAKDOWN

- Mississippi State's 2020-21 roster features 12 players representing 10 states, Washington, D.C. as well as Germany.
- State's roster is highlighted by players from all over the country, with Bulldogs coming to Starkville from California, Georgia, Florida, Louisiana, Michigan, Mississippi, Ohio, Tennessee, Virginia and Wisconsin.
- State has one graduate, one senior, four juniors, three sophomores and three freshmen.
- Mississippi State has three returning starters from a year ago in **Jessika Carter**, **Rickea Jackson** and **Myah Taylor**. Carter and Taylor both started all 33 games for the Bulldogs.
- For the eighth-straight year, State's roster will include at least one foreign player with **Charlotte Kohl** coming to Starkville from Giessen, Germany. **Chinwe Okorie** (Nigeria) played for the Bulldogs from 2013-17, while **Chloe Bibby** (Australia) was on the roster from 2017-20.
- Freshman **KN'isha Godfrey** joined the team in December as a midyear enrollee. She is not pictured below.
