DOUG NOVAK ELEVATED TO INTERIM HEAD COACH

- On Tuesday, Oct. 12, 2021, Doug Novak was named interim head coach of the Mississippi State women's basketball program after Nikki McCray-Penson stepped down due to health concerns. Novak becomes the ninth women's basketball head coach at Mississippi State.
- Doug Novak was hired by Nikki McCray-Penson on Sept. 7 as her Associate Head Coach
- Novak came to Starkville following eight seasons as the head coach of the men's program at Bethel University near Minneapolis, Minnesota.
- While at Bethel University, he posted a record of 131-68 with two MIAC Titles and an NCAA Tournament appearance
- He guided 19 players to All-MIAC honors including an MIAC Player of the Year and First Team All-American

STATE AMONG WINNINGEST PROGRAMS IN DIVISION I**SINCE 2016-17**

- Since the start of the 2016-17 campaign, Mississippi State owns 141 wins, which is tied for the sixth-most victories in all of Division I.
- During the stretch, State has appeared in two national title games, made three-consecutive Elite Eights and won three SEC championships.
- After posting 34 wins in 2016-17, the Bulldogs recorded a program-record 37 victories during the 2017-18 campaign. State followed that season up with 33 wins in 2018-19 and 27 in 2019-20.
- Mississippi State has won eight matchups against teams on the list during the last five seasons.

BULLDOGS SHATTER SINGLE-GAME 3-POINTERS RECORD

- In its game against Troy on Dec. 14, Mississippi State knocked down a program-record 18 3-pointers.
- That mark also matched the SEC single-game record, joining Missouri (18 vs. Bradley, 2013, & 18 vs. Auburn, 2013).
- The previous record was 14 threes against Iowa State on Nov. 23, 2001. The Bulldogs' 37 3-point attempts also set a program record, besting the previous mark of 36 against Savannah State on Feb. 8, 2007.

MSU PLACING A GREATER EMPHASIS ON 3-POINTERS

- While State's primary goal on offense is to attack the paint, the Bulldogs placed an emphasis on being able to knock down 3-pointers when opponents pack the paint.
- The Bulldogs averaged 6.4 threes per game, which ranked fifth all-time in MSU history for a single season. State only averaged more 3-pointers during the 2009-10 (7.2), 2017-18 (7.1), 2004-05 (6.8) and 1999-2000 (6.6) campaigns.

- Along with the increase in threes, MSU was also efficient. On the year, Mississippi State shot a .339 clip from deep, which ranked eighth in program history.

TAYLOR EXCELLING AS MSU'S FLOOR GENERAL

- Redshirt senior **Myah Taylor** entered last season as one of the top point guards in the country, and she continued to earn that recognition with her play throughout the season.
- After being challenged to be more of a scorer, Taylor improved her scoring, finishing in double figures 11 times this year after only posting six such games in the previous two seasons combined.
- While her assists per game were slightly down as a result of her uptick in scoring, Taylor continued to find her teammates for an open shot with eight performances with 5+ assists.
- Between her scoring and assists, Taylor was a major factor in State's offense. In fact, she accounted for more than 25 percent of MSU's total scoring in 10 contests, including two games during SEC play when she has accounted for 50 percent of the team's scoring.
- The Olive Branch, Miss., native ranked 29th in the country and fourth in the SEC with a 2.36 assist/turnover ratio. Last year, she ranked eighth nationally and led the SEC with a 2.80 ratio.
- Defensively, she led the Bulldogs in steals (31) and boasts six blocks. She recorded multiple steals in nine games.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- As has become common place at Mississippi State, the preseason watch lists were littered with State players.
- Myah Taylor was named to the Nancy Lieberman Award watch list after being one of 10 finalists for the award last season. Anastasia Hayes, one of MSU's newest members, was also honored by being named to the preseason watch list. The Nancy Lieberman Award is given to the nation's best point guard.
- Rickeya Jackson was voted to the Preseason All-SEC First Team by the League's 14 head coaches. Jackson was also named to the Cheryl Miller Award watch list, an award given annually to the best small forward in the country.

STATE SIGNS FOUR IN CLASS OF 2021

- Mississippi State inked some of the nation's top players for its 2021 signing class.
- The class was highlighted by three top-100 prospects, including four-star guard **KN'isha Godfrey**, who played at one of the top high schools in the country. Godfrey also enrolled early last season and saw action in one game.
- The Bulldogs also signed do-it-all guard **Mia Moore**, who recorded a quadruple-double as a sophomore, along with **Jasmine Shavers**, who was coached by former NBA star **Jason Terry**. State closed out the early signing period by adding athletic forward **Denae Carter**.
- Denae Carter** was named the 2021 Pa. Sportswriters' Class 3A All-State First Team as a senior after averaging 21.0 ppg. She led St. Basil Academy to the state playoffs and a 24-3 record and was named the ACAA League MVP as a junior.
- Ranked as the No. 52 player in the country by Prospect Nation, **Mia Moore** and was rated as a four-star guard from St. Francis High School in Alpharetta, Georgia. She was tabbed GACA Class 1A North All-State as a junior after averaging 13.7 points, 4.3 steals, 4.1 rebounds and 3.9 assists per game. Led her team to two State Championships.
- Rated as the No. 55 player in the country by ESPNW, **Jasmine "Jazz" Shavers** is a four-star guard from Mesquite, Texas. She was named the Dallas Morning News No. 1 area recruit for the class of 2021 after being named the District 11-6A Offensive Player of the Year and TGCA All-State Team as a junior after averaging 18.9 points, 5.6 rebounds, 3.5 steals and 3.3 assists per game.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

- Mississippi State's roster features 15 players representing 10 states and Germany.
- State's roster is highlighted by players from all over the country, with Bulldogs coming to Starkville from New Jersey, Georgia, Florida, Louisiana, Michigan, Mississippi, Ohio, Tennessee, Pennsylvania and Texas.
- State has two graduates, three senior, three juniors, three sophomores and four freshmen.
- Mississippi State has three returning starters from a year ago in **Jessika Carter**, **Rickea Jackson** and **Myah Taylor**. Carter and Taylor both started all 33 games for the Bulldogs.
- For the eighth-straight year, State's roster will include at least one foreign player with **Charlotte Kohl** coming to Starkville from Giessen, Germany. **Chinwe Okorie** (Nigeria) played for the Bulldogs from 2013-17, while **Chloe Bibby** (Australia) was on the roster from 2017-20.
- Freshman **KN'isha Godfrey** joined the team in December as a midyear enrollee.
- After sitting out last season due to NCAA transfer rules, **Ashley Jones** is eligible to play for the Bulldogs this year. Jones was named the 2020 AAC Newcomer of the Year and earned Second Team All-ACC honors after averaging 16.0 ppg, 4.5 rebounds and 4.3 assists.
- State will have three sisters on its roster during the 2021-22 season in Anastasia Hayes, Aislynn Hayes and Alasia Hayes. Anastasia is a redshirt senior and spent the last three seasons at Middle Tennessee State. She played her freshman season at Tennessee and was named the SEC

Sixth Woman of the Year. Last season Anastasia finished second in the NCAA in scoring average (26.5 ppg) while also earning C-USA Player of the Year and First Team honors. Her sister Aislynn also played at MTSU and earned Second Team All-CUSA honors last season. As a freshman she was named the C-USA Freshman of the Year. The youngest of the trio is Alasia who played in 13 games last season at Notre Dame.

- JerKaila Jordan**, a former 5-star recruit by ESPN in 2020, was named the AAC Freshman of the Year last season and earned All-AAC First Team honors after averaging 16.7 ppg and 2.3 stelas per contest.
- Raven Farely** is a former McDonalds All-American. She spent her first two years of college at LSU before spending the last two seasons at St. Johns.

Doug Novak was named the interim head coach of the Mississippi State Women's Basketball team on Tuesday, October 12, 2021 after Nikki McCray-Penson stepped down due to health concerns. Novak was hired at Mississippi State on Tuesday, Sept. 7 as the associate head coach.

Novak possesses nearly three decades of coaching experience, most recently as the head coach at Bethel University in Minnesota for the past eight seasons and as the top assistant coach at The Citadel and Tulane for seven seasons on the men's side.

Novak's Bethel teams won 65.8 percent of their games (131-68), highlighted by seven consecutive MIAC playoff appearances. The Royals made six trips to the semifinals and three runs to the championship game. Bethel captured a share of the program's first-ever MIAC regular season championship, second-ever MIAC playoff championship and second-ever NCAA Tournament appearance in 2016-17.

A point of pride for Novak is player development. He had 17 MIAC All-Conference honorees during his Bethel tenure. Kyle Zimmerman secured the MIAC's Most Valuable Player, coupled with an NABC All-America First-Team and D3Hoops.com All-America Third-Team selection in 2014-15.

Novak graduated from the University of Tennessee in 1990 with a degree in Psychology. He then earned his Masters degree in Counseling in 1992 from Clemson University.
