MSU BEGINS 32nd NCAA POSTSEASON IN TALLAHASSEE

Mississippi State (39-22) sets sail on its 32nd NCAA postseason journey with this weekend's competition in the 2012 NCAA Tallahassee Regional. The Bulldogs posted a 5-1 mark in capturing its seventh SEC Tournament title last week in Hoover, Ala., earning the league's automatic qualifying berth in the 64-team field of the 2012 NCAA Tournament.

MSU enters the tournament as the No. 2 seed, opening the double-elimination event Friday (11 a.m. CDT) against No. 3 seed Samford (39-21). No. 4 seed UAB (32-28) meets No. 1 seed (No. 3 national seed) tournament host Florida State (43-15) Friday at 5 p.m. (CDT).

Game times (all CDT) are 11 a.m. and 6 p.m. Saturday, 11 a.m. and 5 p.m. Sunday and, if necessary, 5 p.m. Monday. ESPN3 is providing live online video coverage, with Nick Belmonte and Adam Amin describing the action.

THIRD NCAA VISIT TO DICK HOWSER STADIUM

The Diamond Dogs are making their third NCAA tourney visit to Florida State's 6,700-seat Dick Howser Stadium, where it's been a feast or famine situation in the past for State. MSU went 2&Q in the 1993 NCAA East Regional, bowing to Notre Dame 15-1 and dropping a disputed 2-1 decision to Long Beach State. State feasted in its 2007 visit to Tallahassee, topping Stetson 6-3 and host Florida State 3-0 and 9-4. MSU went on to host and sweep another ACC foe, Clemson, in Super Regional competition at Dudy Noble Field and advance to the program's eighth appearance in the NCAA College World Series in Omaha, Neb.

DOGS GRIND OUT 5-1 MARK TO WIN 7th SECT TITLE

The Diamond Dogs picked up their 33rd NCAA postseason berth the old fashioned way --- they earned it. As the No. 7 seed, State played six midday games in six consecutive games, opening with wins over Arkansas (9-1) and LSU (3-2) before bowing to Kentucky (1-5). MSU then reeled off wins in a pair of elimination games, topping LSU (4-3 in 10 innings) and Kentucky (2-1) before claiming the title with the team's sixth shutout of the season in the finale against Vanderbilt (3-0).

KINGS OF THE HILL

Eleven Mississippi State pitchers combined for a remarkable 1.96 earned run average over six games (55 innings) in the SEC Tournament. Here are a few notable performances from the Bulldog moundsmen:

Freshman Brandon Woodruff (1-2, 2.65) --- drew starts in two of MSU's six games, registering his first career win in State's tourney-opening 9-1 win over the 16th-ranked Arkansas Razorbacks. In two games (8.0 IP) he did not allow a run and scattered three hits.

Freshman Ross Mitchell (2-0, 1.02) --- Piled up a staff-most 9.2 scoreless innings, all in relief, with seven strikeouts, to earn "iron man" status on the weekend among MSU's hurlers.

Freshman Jonathan Holder (2-0, 0.00, 9 saves) --- Recorded three saves (vs. Arkansas, LSU and Kentucky) and a win (vs LSU) in four relief appearances (4.2 IP). The SEC All-Tournament Team selection extended his career-best streak of consecutive scoreless innings pitched to a school-record 27.1.

Junior Chris Stratton (11-1, 2.21) --- Notched his SEC-leading 11th win and fanned eight in a 3-2 win over LSU and registered the final out in the Sunday championship game to earn his first career save.

Senior Caleb Reed (1-5, 2.56) --- Also made four relief appearances, allowing one run in 6.2 innings of relief in his 87th, 88th, 89th and 90th career relief appearances.

SECOND HALF TURNAROUND

A three-game series sweep of Tennessee (Apr. 19-21) launched a second-half turnaround that propelled Mississippi State to the 2012 NCAA Tournament.

After a 5-10 start to the 2012 SEC campaign, the Bulldogs won four of their final five league series to tie Arkansas for second place in the SEC West (16-14 SEC). State claimed wins in 18 of its final 24 games. The MSU pitching corps, backed by a defense that fielded at a .977 clip and turned 25 double plays, fashioned a 1.58 ERA.

Sophomore lead-off hitter Adam Frazier tallied 37 hits and hit at a .425 clip down the stretch to spark the run offensively.

John Cohen, who guided Mississippi State to a No. 15 national ranking and within eight outs of a trip to the 2011 NCAA College World Series, is his fourth season as the Bulldogs' skipper in 2012.

A native of Tuscaloosa, Ala., Cohen returned to Mississippi State as the Bulldogs' 16th head baseball coach in 2008, completing an 18-year journey from Bulldog player to MSU head coach.

Cohen was an all-SEC outfielder under the legendary Ron Polk during his baseball career at Mississippi State and was a key component on Bulldog teams that over a three-year span won a school-best 148 games. The 1989 Diamond Dog edition established a school record with 54 wins while the 1990 edition advanced to college baseball's coveted "Final Eight" at the prestigious NCAA College World Series.

This is Cohen's 21st season in the collegiate coaching ranks and 13th as a head coach. He returned to State in 2008 following a successful five-year head coaching stint at Kentucky (2004-08).

In Lexington he earned SEC and national coach of the year honors after guiding the 2006 Wildcats to a school-record 44-win season and the school's first SEC baseball championship.

Regarded as one of the sports' more innovative coaches, Cohen's coaching resume also includes successful stints at Missouri (1992-97), Northwestern State (1998-2001) and Florida (2002-03).

Cohen's first three Mississippi State recruiting classes have garnered top 25 national ranking. That recruiting success paid big dividends in 2011. The Bulldogs swept to a 3-0 mark in winning the NCAA Atlanta Regional and a weekend later advanced to the championship game of the Gainesville Super Regional, where State challenged for the program's ninth advancement to the NCAA College World Series. State's 2008-2009 recruiting class earned a No. 8 national ranking by baseball recruiting class at State since 2000.

In a short span at Mississippi State Cohen has built a solid foundation for success while directing the Bulldogs' return to national prominence on

the diamond.

He has assembled a well-respected and highly-skilled staff featuring coaches well-versed in Mississippi State University's colorful and tradition-rich baseball history, the Magnolia State's high school and junior college programs, the highly competitive SEC, and the realm of college recruiting.

The Bulldog skipper has been a driving force behind more than \$2 million worth of impressive facility improvements at Dudy Noble Field. Listed among those enhancements are the complete rebuilding of the field and its drainage and irrigation system, the renovation of the team locker room, a resurfacing of the stadium grandstand, complete with all-new maroon chair back seating, and in 2012 a new stadium-wide sound system.

His commitment to excellence in the classroom is reflected in the team's recently-attained all-time highest 3.35 team semester grade point average, 47 selections to the SEC Academic Honor Roll in his first three years, and a pair of Academic All-American selections in 2010, MSU's first since 2000.

Cohen is noted as one of the sport's mostly highly sought-after featured speakers and clinicians and has traversed the nation sharing his baseball expertise at clinics and conventions in 30 states. He maintains a hefty schedule of speaking engagements at alumni gatherings, civic organization meetings and at baseball banquets on a variety of levels in the Magnolia State and beyond.

Cohen is the fifth Mississippi State grad to serve as the Bulldogs' head baseball coach and one of only three SEC grads currently coaching in the league. Cohen played on MSU's 1990 SEC Tournament title team and last week directed his alma mater to its seventh SECT crown, becoming the first in the SEC to do so to both play on and coach for play on and serve as head coach for coach on an SEC Tournament championship team at his alma mater to an SEC

Cohen, 45 is married to the former Nelle Bashinsky, also a native of Tuscaloosa, Ala. They have two daughters — Jordan Baker and Avery Lawson.

FRAZIER ON 2012 USA BASEBALL NATIONAL COLLEGIATE TEAM

Sophomore shortstop Adam Frazier has never traveled outside the United States. That's likely to change in the months ahead.

The Bulldog infielder from Bishop, Ga., has been named to the 2012 USA Baseball National Collegiate Team, coached by Tennessee head coach Dave Serrano. The team's 30-day, 20-game summer schedule includes a five-game series against the Cuban national team in Havana, Cuba, and participation in the 26th annual Haarlem Baseball Week in the Netherlands.

"It's a real honor and like a dream come true to be competing on a team wearing a jersey with USA on the front," he said. "I was speechless when Coach Cohen told me about it," he said.

Frazier, the only Bulldog to have started all 61 games this year, ranks third in the SEC with 88 hits and a .376 batting average. He leads the SEC with 211 assists and 48 walks, ranks second with a .484 on-base percentage, sixth with 76 hits and second with 40 double plays fielded.

"Adam has worked hard to put himself in a position for an honor like this, and he is most deserving of it," said Mississippi State head baseball coach John Cohen "And it really is an honor, especially when you consider the huge pool of talented college players they have to choose from. This is an experience of a lifetime and we are really proud of his being selected to the USA team."

Frazier becomes the latest addition to the list of Mississippi State players selected in years past to compete for

USA Baseball. That group includes the likes of eventual Major League performers Will Clark (1984), Carlton Loewer (1993), Matt Ginter (1998) and Eric DuBose (1995-96).

The National Collegiate Team begins its preseason training camp June 24 in Cary, N.C.

LUIS POLLORENA NAMED TO 2012 SEC COMMUNITY SERVICE TEAM

Junior pitcher Luis Polloreña of Laredo, Texas, has been named to the 2012 SEC Baseball Community Service Team.

Polloreña, who fashioned a 4-0 record and a 1.50 earned run average during the regular season, has been active in numerous community service events and activities in the Starkville area and at home in Texas.

He's participated in the Breakfast of Champions campaign at both Sudduth Elementary school and Henderson/Ward-Stewart Elementary School, promoting the importance of morning nutrition among area youth. At Starkville High School he's served as a motivational speaker with the school's Fellowship of Christian Athletes chapter.

Polloreña participated in the MCT2 Rally, encouraging local third graders to perform at a high level on their state tests.

He's also worked with numerous MSU M-Club sponsored events, including the organization's annual Thanksgiving Food Drive and Bully's Book Blitz, a program of encouragement for young readers in the Starkville schools.

Cavalcade of accolades for Chris Stratton

The honors continue to accrue for Mississippi State pitching standout Chris Stratton.

This week the Tupelo, Miss., native was honored as the SEC Pitcher of the Year and became the first Bulldog pitcher to earn that award and the first to earn first-team All-Southeastern Conference honors since 2003 (current Chicago Cubs hurler Paul Maholm).

Also this week Stratton was listed among 30 semifinalists for the Golden Spikes Award. That collection of talented players will be reduced to three finalists June 5 and announced July 6 on MLB.com.

Closer to home, Stratton was named May 14 the recipient of the ninth C Spire/Ferriss Trophy, presented to the top collegiate baseball player in the Magnolia State. He bested two other finalists for the award, Delta State pitcher Colton Mitchell from Lake, Miss., and Ole Miss second baseman Alex Yarbrough of Allen, Texas.

The award is named in honor of former Mississippi State and Boston Red Sox pitching standout and former Delta State coaching great Dave "Boo" Ferriss, who was on hand for this year's presentation in Jackson, Miss.

Stratton is one of two baseball players from the Southeastern Conference to earn academic all-district honors and is among 88 candidates nationwide for 2012 CoSIDA/Capital One Academic All-America team honors.

The Bulldog hurler is also a semifinalist for another high national honors, the Dick Howser Award, presented by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association. It is named for the late Dick Howser, former Florida State player and coaching standout who went on to manage the New York Yankees and Kansas City Royals.

Season ticket sales surpass 5,500 mark again

The MSU Athletic Ticket Office reports the distribution of 5,493 baseball season tickets, surpassing last year's total (5,448) and ranking as the fourth-most in school history. State set a school record with the sale of 5,632 baseball season tickets in 2010. Four of the top six baseball season ticket sales marks have now come in the past four years. MSU has eclipsed the 5,000 mark in baseball season ticket sales 11 consecutive years and the 5,500 mark twice in the last four years.

Florida, Arkansas picked to win divisional titles

Defending SEC tri-champion Florida and defending SEC West winner Arkansas were the preseason choices of the league's baseball coaches to capture their respective divisional titles in 2012. In the 15th annual SEC Coaches' Pre-season Poll, Florida, national runner-up to South Carolina in the 2011 NCAA College World Series in 2010, was the pick to claim this year's SEC baseball pennant.

Mississippi State was projected to finish fifth in the SEC Western Division.

34th season for Jim Ellis, "voice of the Bulldogs"

Veteran MSU sportscaster Jim Ellis is in his 34th season as the radio voice of Mississippi State baseball. The West Point, Miss., native, a 1969 MSU grad, began his affiliation with MSU baseball in 1979 and is largely responsible for the creation and growth of the MSU Baseball Radio Network, one of the nation's most established baseball radio networks.

The network, with more than a dozen affiliates in three states, features a 40-game broadcast schedule of weekend conference games and select non-conference contests. The network broadcast schedule and most non-network broadcasts are heard locally on WKBB-FM (100.9) in nearby West Point, Miss.

Since becoming the "voice of the Baseball Bulldogs" in 1979, Ellis has broadcast all 120 of Mississippi State's NCAA postseason games, including 93 regional games, all nine of MSU's NCAA Super Regional games and 21 of MSU's 23 games NCAA College World Series games.

In 2011 he followed recently-retired MSU broadcasting legend Jack Cristil as the lead broadcaster for MSU football and basketball, and this year is joined in the baseball broadcast booth by Nanih Waiya, Miss., native and MSU grad Bart Gregory, who has been a part of the Mississippi State broadcasting team for 11 years working with football, men's and women's basketball and baseball broadcasts.

A NEW ERA: The Bulldogs continue to sport the SEC's best and the NCAA's fourth-best staff earned run average, 2.58. MSU ranks just off Missouri State's NCAA-leading pace (2.51). State registered its 22nd double-figure strikeout game in a 3-2 win over LSU in the SEC Tournament. MSU shares the SEC leads and ranks tied for third in the NCAA with 516 strikeouts. State registered a season-high 19 punchouts in the second game of the season (vs. Washington State, Feb. 19) and in 22 of 61 games have reached double digit strikeout totals, most recently against LSU (May 23). Oddly enough, the only game in which Bulldog pitchers have failed to record a strikeout was Kendall Graveman's SEC season-first complete-game gem in the series-ending 7-1 win at LSU. Graveman got 19 groundball outs and was aided by a season-high four double plays.

HOLDEN 'EM, HOLDER: Freshman right-hander Jonathan Holder (2-0, 0.00, 9 saves) has emerged as one of the nation's top relief men late in the season. The rookie righty registered three saves and a win in four relief appearances (4.2 no-hit innings) in the SEC Tournament. Along the way he broke the school record for consecutive scoreless innings pitched (26.1), a mark set in 1988 by another Gulf Coast product, Long Beach's Bobby Reed. Holder has now registered seven saves and a win in his last eight appearances, all of those against SEC opponents. He has not allowed a run, earned or otherwise, in 27.2 innings of relief (22 appearances) and has fanned 28 batters over that span while holding opponents to .159 hitting.

MAY I ASSIST YOU: Sophomore outfielder Hunter Renfroe (.257), who enjoyed a team-best 7-for-13 (.538) series at Florida, registered his SEC-leading ninth outfield assist in last Wednesday's SECT win over LSU. Renfroe's 10 assists this year include an assist in an early season game while catching.

MAY I ASSIST YOU 2: Bulldog sophomore shortstop Adam Frazier (.376) leads the SEC with 211 assists overall and has fielded 48 of MSU's 68 double plays, second-most in the SEC behind teammate Wes Rea (.245) with 55.

INJURY BUG BITING: A ninth-inning outfield collision in the Apr. 28 MSU-Ole Miss game between C.T. Bradford and Brent Brownlee returned Bradford to the Bulldog DL with an injured shoulder for the remainder of the season. State avoided the injury bug the first three weeks of the season, but all that changed the first week of March, with senior outfielder Brent Brownlee (knee cap), sophomore third baseman Daryl Norris (knee cap), soph center fielder C.T. Bradford (shoulder) and sophomore outfielder Taylor Stark (hamstring) going to the DL. Five opening day starters, including pitcher Ben Bracewell, missed playing time. All have subsequently returned to the MSU lineup in various degrees of wellness. Outfielder/infielder Demarcus Henderson joined the Bulldog DL with a fractured hand (HBP, then scored winning run vs. South Alabama, Apr. 10) but returned after missing 27 starts.

SACRIFICIAL DOGS: The lost art of bunting has been found in Starkville. Mississippi State enters NCAA postseason play with a Southeastern Conference-leading 63 sacrifice hits. Fifteen different Bulldogs have successfully joined the bunting game seven each by Sam Frost and Mitch Slaughter.

COHEN'S 100TH WIN AT MSU: State closed out its 17-game season-opening homestand Mar. 11 with a 3-1 win over Mercer. It was win No. 100 as MSU skipper for John Cohen. In his fourth season as MSU skipper, Cohen is 125-110. He is 447-305-1 in 13 seasons as a collegiate head coach and in 21 seasons of coaching has been associated with teams that have compiled a 714-492-2 record. Including a 148-55 mark as a player as State, Cohen has been associated with 273 Bulldog wins in his Mississippi State career.

DOGS 2ND IN NCAA IN DPS: Through 61 games MSU's defense leads the SEC and stands second in the NCAA with 68 double plays. Illinois finished its 2012 season with 69 double plays. State tied for 10th in the SEC last season with 40 double plays.

HIT ME WITH YOUR BEST SHOT: Seventeen Bulldogs have now combined for 97 HBPs through 61 games, tops in the SEC and seventh in the NCAA. Trey Porter leads the way with 15, just ahead of sophomore first baseman Wes Rea (12) and junior catcher Mitch Slaughter (11).

FRAZIER LEADS HITS PARADE: Sophomore middle infielder Adam Frazier piled up 12 hits in the SEC Tournament last week and needs a dozen more to become the fourth MSU player all-time to reach the century mark in hits. Frazier stands third in the SEC with 88 safeties. He has hit safely in 51 of MSU's 61 games and has reached base with walks in four other games. His .484 on-base percentage ranks second in the SEC.

LINEUP VARIETY: Thanks in part to injuries, MSU head coach John Cohen has used 38 different starting lineups in 61 regular season games. Middle infielder Adam Frazier has started all 61 games and first baseman Rea has started 60 of the 61 games (missed a start in game 48 vs. Mississippi Valley State (May 8).

IRON MAN MITCH: Junior catcher Mitch Slaughter caught every inning of all six MSU games in last week's SEC Tournament during the midday heat in Hoover, Ala. In 55 innings he received 832 pitches. He's started all but two games behind the dish in 2012.

CHART-CLIMBER CALEB REED: Senior relief pitcher Caleb Reed continues to scale several MSU career pitching charts after earning his 8th save of the year in a Sunday's series-clincher against Ole Miss. He stands third at MSU with 90 relief appearances and 94 overall mound stints. His eight saves gives him his second top-10 saves season and his 20 career saves is the third-most at MSU. All 20 of Reed's saves have come over his junior and senior seasons when he has compiled a 1.82 ERA with 111 strikeouts in 57 relief appearances (23 ER/113.2 IP).

A PINCH OF PINCH-HITTING: There have been few successes in the pinch-hitting category for the Bulldogs in 2012. State's pinch-hitters are 2-for-25 (Sam Frost vs. Ark. & Phillip Casey at Ala).

TRIPLE (PLAY) TROUBLE: Over a 12-day span in March Mississippi State hit into not one but two triple plays --- smash line-outs to the opposing first baseman who then stepped on the bag at first to double off one runner and then relayed on to the shortstop covering at second to double off another runner and complete the defensive trifecta. The triple plays came in MSU's first road game of the year, a 4-3 loss at Southeastern Louisiana (Mar. 13), and seven games later in an 11-inning 8-5 loss at home to No. 3 Arkansas (Mar. 25).

WALKS IN THE PARK: Fifteen Bulldogs have been issued a combined 248 walks through 61 games, the most in the SEC. Sophomore shortstop Adam Frazier rates as the best in the SEC at drawing the free passes, having been issued an SEC-best 48 free passes. He has drawn walks in 33 of 61 games, including four vs. Alcorn State (3-27). Frazier drew three walks in 38 freshman year games played.

WALK-OFFS IN THE PARK: The Diamond Dogs registered sixth walk-off win of the season with a 10-inning 3-2 win against LSU (May 23) in the SEC Tournament.

Tyler Moore becomes 48th Bulldog in the Bigs

For the fourth time in four years a former Mississippi State player has made his debut in Major League Baseball.

Former Bulldog first baseman Tyler Moore (2008), called up by the Washington Nationals late Apr. 28, and a day later became the 48th baseball player with Mississippi State ties to play or coach at professional baseball's highest levels when he drew a start in the Washington Nationals' Apr. 29 game at Los Angeles.

The Brandon, Miss., native and former Meridian (Miss.) Community College standout started in left field and went 1-for-3 with a single in his second career at-bat during his Major League debut. Moore, who hit .299 in 2008 and paced MSU with 14 home runs and 46 RBI, had hit 84 home runs in four seasons of minor league baseball at the time of his call-up.

Catcher Craig Tatum (Cincinnati, 2009), first baseman Mitch Moreland (Texas, 2010) and pitcher Alan Johnson (Colorado, 2011) are the other former Mississippi State players who have made their MLB debuts in the last four years.

Moore joins five other former Bulldogs active on the Major League level --- pitcher Paul Maholm (Chicago Cubs), first base coach Chris Maloney (St. Louis Cardinals), first baseman Mitch Moreland (Texas Rangers), pitcher Jonathan Papelbon (Philadelphia Phillies), and manager Nat Showalter (Baltimore Orioles).

In the off-season, pitcher Paul Maholm signed with the Chicago Cubs, relief ace Jonathan Papelbon inked with the Philadelphia Phillies and catcher Craig Tatum signed with the Arizona Diamondbacks.

Stratton, Graveman, Holder earn SEC honors

A trio of Bulldog pitchers were among the recipients of Southeastern Conference honors announced this week in Birmingham.

Junior right-hander Chris Stratton was honored as the Southeastern Conference Pitcher of the Year. The Tupelo, Miss., native leads the SEC with 11 wins and a 2.21 earned run average and ranks second in the SEC with 123 strikeouts. He's registered the most strikeouts by a Bulldog pitcher since Eric DuBose whiffed 145 batters in 1997. Stratton also earned first-team All-SEC honors, the first MSU pitcher to receive first-team All-SEC accolades since Paul Maholm (2203).

Freshman relief pitcher Jonathan Holder earned SEC All-Freshman Team, the sixth All-Freshman Team pick for State since 2007, while junior pitcher Kendall Graveman became the first MSU player to receive SEC All-Defensive Team honors.

Following Sunday's successful run in the SEC Tournament in Hoover, Ala., sophomore shortstop Adam Frazier was named tournament MVP and was joined by freshman outfielder Demarcus Henderson and rookie relief man Jonathan Holder on the all-tournament team.

LARGEST OPENING DAY ATTENDANCE SINCE '01

Mississippi State's 2012 season-opener against Washington State drew one of the biggest opening-day crowds in years to Dudy Noble Field, Polk-DeMent Stadium.

The MSU-WSU game drew 3,449 fans, the largest attendance at an MSU home lid-lifter since 2001 when 4,258 watched the Bulldogs battle Notre Dame in the inaugural NBC Classic. State set a record for the biggest actual attendance for a season-opener at Dudy Noble Field with 4,472 on hands to watch then-MSU senior MSU player John Cohen and the Bulldogs open their 1990 campaign against Birmingham-Southern.

WEEKLY SEC HONORS

Demarcus Henderson SEC Freshman of the Week
Outfielder Demarcus Henderson (Waynesboro, Miss.) is the SEC Freshman Player of the Week for Mar. 12.

Henderson extended his personal-best and team season-best matching hitting streak to eight games March 11, and with seven hits on the week raised his seasonal batting average to a club-leading .412. Henderson notched his second and third multiple-hit games in helping the Bulldogs four games during the week.

The Bulldog outfielder is the fourth MSU yearling all-time to earn the award, joining pitcher Chris Stratton (2010) and two-time infielding honorees Brandon Turner (2007) and Daryl Norris (2011).

Henderson hit .438 with a .500 on-base percentage over a five-game span as the Bulldogs climbed to 14-3 for their best start since the 2006 campaign.

Chris Stratton: National, SEC Pitcher of the Week

A remarkable career-best 17-strikeout pitching performance at No. 10 LSU on SEC opening night last (Mar. 16) netted Chris Stratton Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week, SEC Pitcher of the Week, NCBWA National Pitcher of the Week and SEBaseball.com SEC Co-Pitcher of the Week.

The Tupelo, Miss., product, making his first start of the campaign and matched with LSU ace Kevin Gausman, held LSU to a run on four hits and .138 hitting, fanning all nine LSU starters, two Tiger batters three times each and recorded a trio of three-strikeout innings. At one stretch he retired 16 consecutive batters, 11 via strikeout.

"What a great way to start your conference year," said MSU head coach John Cohen. "It was one of the greatest college pitching performances I've ever seen. To walk the first batter of the game and then come back to pitch virtually a flawless game from that point on shows Chris' maturity and growth as a pitcher."

Both Stratton and Gausman left the game to standing ovations at Alex Box Stadium after 8-2/3 innings of mound work.

The 17 strikeouts by Stratton ranks as the most in the SEC this season and the most by a Bulldog pitcher since B.J. Wallace rang up 19 punchouts against Nicholls State in the 1992 NCAA Mid-east Regional held at Dudy Noble Field.

Stratton earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors in 2010 after tossing seven innings of three-hit, seven-strikeout ball in a season-ending win at LSU.

Kendall Graveman: SEC Pitcher of the Week

A sterling complete-game pitching performance in a series-clinching win over Tennessee garnered SEC Pitcher of the Week honors for junior pitcher Kendall Graveman.

In his league-leading second route-going performance and 10th start of the season, Graveman scattered three hits, walked two and matched a career-best with eight strikeouts as Mississippi State clinched its Super Bulldog Weekend series against Tennessee (4-20) with a 7-1 win at Dudy Noble Field. He retired 13 of the last 14 batters he faced and only three of his 101 pitches left the infield, two on singles and one on a fly ball caught in left field.

It is the first career SEC weekly honor for the Alexander City, Ala., product and the second for a Bulldog pitcher in 2012.

Chris Stratton: SEC Pitcher of the Week

This week and for the second time this season MSU junior Chris Stratton of Tupelo, Miss., was honored as the SEC Pitcher of the Week. MSU junior pitcher Kendall Graveman received the same honor last week.

Stratton (9-0, 2.19) recorded a career-first complete-game shutout in a series-opening 4-0 win over in-state SEC rival Ole Miss. Stratton scattered five hits, struck out seven and walked one, the first batter he faced during his efficient 104-pitch outing at Dudy Noble Field. The route-going performance was the second of his career. Stratton went the distance in an 11-7 freshman year win over Tennessee. It was also the second consecutive nine-inning effort by the Bulldog right-hander, who allowed a run on four hits in a no-decision start and extra-inning MSU win over Tennessee April 19.

He joins former MSU pitching standouts Jeff Brantley (1985) and Alan Johnson (2003) as the only MSU hurlers to receive the honor twice in a season. Johnson was so-honored a school-best three times in 2003.

Jacob Lindgren: SEC Freshman of the Week

Pitcher Jacob Lindgren (2-2, 2.75) has become the fourth Mississippi State baseball player to earn a weekly honor by the Southeastern Conference this season.

This rookie lefty from Bay St. Louis, Miss., was named the Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Week Sunday after turning in a career-best pitching performance and earning his initial SEC win in Saturday's series sweep-clinching win over the No. 2 Kentucky Wildcats.

The former St. Stanislaus High School standout struck out a season-high seven, allowed one run and scattered three singles over 5-1/3 innings of pitching. The win was the 16th in league play this season for Mississippi State, their most SEC victories since 2001, and the 34th win overall, matching last year's final regular-season record (34-21).

A pair of UK runs had scored when Lindgren entered the game. He quickly registered the final out of the frame to end the Kentucky rally and then held the Wildcats scoreless over the next five frames. Lindgren ended his day's pitching after giving up a single to open the ninth. Senior Caleb Reed then came on to close out the game.
