TODAY'S MATCHUP

Braves Journey to Starkville for a Tough SEC Matchup

Today, the Braves gear up for their first road test of the season against SEC opponent Mississippi State. This will be second ever meeting between the Braves and the Bulldogs since the 2010 season with the Bulldogs defeating the Braves 49-16. Head coach Jay Hopson and his Braves are coming off a 63-12 victory over Edward Waters last weekend at Spinks-Casem Stadium. With the win, Coach Hopson is now 2-0 in season openers and it was also the first time in 10 years the Braves were able to score over 60 points. Offensively, the Braves recorded over 400 yards of total offense. Arnold Walker led the Braves with 75 yards on 16 carries and scoring a single game career-high three touchdowns. Sophomore John Gibbs, Jr. completed 15 of his 20 passing attempts for 184 yards and one touchdown. Gibbs, Jr. also accumulated 59 yards on three carries and rushed for a 34-yard touchdown. Senior wide receiver Tavoris Doss caught the only receiving touchdown for the Braves for 28 yards. He finished the game with three catches for 59 yards. On the defensive side of the ball, the Braves managed to force four turnovers. Will Thomas led the Braves defense with 5.5 tackles. Sophomore cornerback Anthony Williams, Jr. recorded two tackles along with an interception and a forced fumble. Defensive lineman, Kenry Tolbert scored a touchdown on a defense after picking up a fumble and carrying it 24 yards to the endzone.

Mississippi State is coming off a devastating loss to Oklahoma State 21-3 in the Advocare Texas Kickoff in Houston, Texas. The Bulldogs running game was held to 111 yards on the ground led by LaDarius Perkins with 50 yards on 16 carries. Jameon Lewis led the Bulldogs with 5 catches for 55 yards and combined for 148 all-purpose yards. Deontae Skinner was the lone defensive player with 10 tackles for the game.

MCCRANEY BREAKS FRESHMAN RECORD

Freshman kicker Haiden McCraney posted a perfect 8-for-8 in PAT attempts in the Braves season opener vs. Edward Waters last Saturday. With the perfect game, McCraney breaks the freshman school record for most made PATs in a game.

HOPSON BEGINS SECOND SEASON

Head coach Jay Hopson enters his second year at the helm of the Braves. After 4-7 2012 campaign, Hopson and the Braves set their eyes on Houston, Texas for the 2013 SWAC Football Championship game in Reliant Stadium.

FOUR SENIORS RETURN FOR THE 2013 SEASON

The Braves open the 2013 campaign with only four seniors listed on the roster. Arnold Walker, Jamison Knox, Terrance Green, and Tavoris Doss. These four have hung around for the pass four years under three different head coaches with the exception of Walker whose been under four head coaches. This is the final go around for them and they would love nothing more than to play for a SWAC title in December.

FIVE QUARTERBACKS ENTER PRESEASON CAMP

Aug. 5th turned out to be an interesting day once everyone settled in and realized five quarterbacks were at camp. Sophomore John Gibbs, Jr. returns after a stellar freshman season not knowing he had to battle to earn his starting spot back. Zerick Rollins, Jr. and Houston transfer T.J. Menning are expected to challenge Gibbs for the starting job. Also, 2013 signees Khadarel Hodge and Lenorris Footman come in fresh out of high school with tons of talent looking to mix up the rotation.

ROBERSON TRANSITIONS TO D-LINE

Junior Deion Roberson will have to learn some new tricks at a new position this fall. After recording his best season yet, Roberson was asked to move to the defensive line to give the Braves more pressure in the backfield. He finished the 2013 season with 40 tackles and a team-high 15 tackles for a loss which also ranked him sixth in the conference. Continuing to make tackles shouldn't be a problem for Roberson but can he handle going one-on-one with 300-pound linemen.

BRAVES PICKED TO FINISH 5TH IN SWAC EAST

The 2013 SWAC Football Media Day was filled with plenty of excitement as coaches and players from around the conference reunited once again in Birmingham, Ala. for the announcing of the 2013 All-SWAC Preseason Teams and predicted order of finish. In the SWAC Eastern Division, the Braves were picked to finish fifth after completing the 2012 season with a 4-7 overall and 4-5 SWAC record. It was no surprise to Coach Hopson where he thought his team was finished because of last year's performance but he knows anything can happen in the SWAC throughout the season.

KNOX EARNS PRESEASON HONORS

Senior defensive back Jamison Knox was selected to the 2013 SWAC Preseason All-SWAC 2nd Team Defense. Knox capped off another amazing season in 2012 accounting for 37 tackles, nine pass deflections, and seven pass break-ups. He also intercepted two passes and had two tackles for a loss. Starting as a true freshman since the 2010 season, he is now the Braves leader in the secondary unit.

TWO NEW FACES JOIN THE BRAVES STAFF

During the spring, head coach Jay Hopson hired two outstanding coaches to take come in after the departure of Doc Gamble and Mark McHale. Joining the Braves coaching staff is wide receivers coach Mickey Joseph coach and offensive line coach Erik Losey. Joseph, who is no stranger to the SWAC, comes in after spending two seasons as the head coach at Langston University. Losey will make the transition back to his college position after spending a season as the running backs coach at Campbell University.

DEFENSIVE BACKS REGAIN NATIONAL ATTENTION

It's been many years since anyone mentioned the name "DB University." Well now Braves fans have a reason to revive the title because there's a new crop of defensive backs in Lorman. Last season, the Braves secondary led the SWAC and finished 4th in the FCS rankings in pass defense after only allowing 156.0 yards per game. The Braves return everyone in the secondary except Jacques Caldwell. Senior Jamison Knox is the leader of the crop, while juniors Devon Francois and Hendrick Taylor, along with sophomore Anthony Williams, Jr. complete one of the best secondary's in the country this upcoming season.

JAY HOPSON
Head Coach
2nd Season • 4-7
Ole Miss, 1992

As a proven leader and visionary, Jay Hopson enters his second season as the head coach of the Braves. In his first season as the “Chief,” Hopson led the Braves to a 4-7 record after the Braves finished 2-8 in 2011. His team opened up the season with a 22-21 victory over Grambling State snapping the Braves four-game losing streak to the Tigers since 2007. Not only did he start his head coaching career off on the right foot, Hopson and his team also won a few more intriguing games during the 2012 season which included wins over Alabama A&M (undefeated at the present time), 21-20, Southern, 20-17 and Texas Southern, 34-24 (this win snapped a four-game losing skid against the Tigers).

Prior to his arrival on “The Reservation,” Hopson served as the defensive coordinator at the University of Memphis. During his tenure as the defensive coordinator at Memphis, Hopson helped two of his most consistent safeties, Darius Davis and Marcus Ball, to becoming the heart and soul of the Tigers defense. Ball led the secondary and was ranked third on the team in tackles with 66, while also recording two interceptions and two pass breakups. In addition, Hopson helped guide linebacker Jamon Hughes to First Team All-Conference USA honors in 2010. Hughes ranked third nationally with 147 tackles.

In 2008 and 2009, Hopson held the position as the linebackers coach at Michigan. Under Hopson, three of the top five tacklers for the 2009 season were linebacker Stevie Brown, Obi Ezeh, and Jonas Mouton. Ezeh was a semifinalist for the Butkus Award that season.

No stranger to the Conference USA, Hopson has had two stints with the defense at Southern Miss. Prior to Michigan, he spent three seasons as defensive coordinator, defensive backs, and middle linebackers coach at Southern Miss from 2005-07. In 2007, he was named the All-American Football Foundation Top Assistant Coach.

As the coordinator for the Golden Eagles, Hopson’s defensive units led the Conference USA in scoring defense each of his three season. The Golden Eagles participated in three bowl games under Hopson, the 2005 New Orleans Bowl, the 2006 GMAC Bowl, and the 2007 Papajohns.com Bowl. In 2005, Southern Miss captured the Conference USA East title.

In 2005, Hopson’s defensive led the nation in fumble recoveries and led the Conference USA in scoring defense. He coached a pair of All-Conference USA defensive backs, including Trevis Coley and Brandon Sumrall. Both players recorded career highs in tackles, as Coley posted 10 and Sumrall 88. In addition, Kevis Coley was named the 2005 Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year. As a whole, the secondary posted 15 interceptions and 40 pass breakups.

In 2006, the Golden Eagles led the Conference USA in scoring defense for the second straight year and set a school record with seven touchdowns. USM also led the conference in pass efficiency defense, opponent’s third-down conversions and redzone defense.

Prior to his appointment as defensive coordinator, Hopson coached the defensive backs for the Golden Eagles from 2001-03. In each year of his tenure, USM ranked in the top-15 nationally in scoring defense. The Golden Eagles participated in the Houston Bowl in 2002 and won the Conference USA in 2003, which sent Southern Miss to Memphis, Tenn. to participate in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl.

While the 2001 season was a success against the pass, the 2002 defense was even better. It led the nation in fewest passing touchdowns allowed (6) and finished as the No. 4 team in pass efficiency defense and was ranked No. 10 in pass defense.

In 2003, his group of defensive backs helped the Golden Eagles win their fourth Conference USA championship and make a third trip to the Liberty Bowl. Southern Miss was tied for second nationally in fewest passing touchdowns allowed (9) and earned a No. 5 national ranking in pass defense and a No. 13 ranking in pass efficiency defense.

In 2004, Hopson worked the 2004 campaign at his alma mater, Ole Miss as the defensive backs coach and was the programs recruiting coordinator before returning to Hattiesburg for his second stint at USM-his first as a coordinator. The Rebels pass defense improved from 109th nationally in 2003 to 49th during the 2004 campaign.

Hopson's coaching resume also includes positions at Marshall (1996-2000) and Delta State (1993) as defensive backs coach. He was a member of the Herd's 1996 NCAA I-AA National Championship staff and coached the team to four-straight Mid-American Conference championships. In 1996, Marshall led the Southern Conference in scoring defense and pass efficiency defense. In 1999, the Herd secondary led the nation in interceptions. Additionally, from 1997-1999, Marshall's defense led the MAC in scoring defense and pass efficiency defense.

Hopson also held defensive graduate positions at Florida (1995), LSU (1994) and Tulane (1992). He helped the Gators to the Southeastern Conference championship and played for the national championship in the Fiesta Bowl.

During his career, Hopson has coached numerous all-conference players and three All-Americans. Two of his players have been nominated for the Jim Thorpe Award and two of his players were named to *Sports Illustrated* All-Bowl Team.

Hopson was a four-year letterwinner as a defensive back at Ole Miss from 1988-91, playing free safety for one season before moving to strong safety for his final three years. He was a four-time Academic All-SEC honor roll selection and was named to the CoSIDA District VI Academic All-America team as a senior in 1991.

He was also a member of the Student Athletic Advisory Committee and was a recipient of the John Howard Vaught Award in 1991. Hopson was a speaker at the American Football Coaches Association Convention in January 2000.

Hopson graduated from Ole Miss with a bachelor's degree in business administration (1992) and received his master's degree of health in physical education and recreation from Delta State (1994).

Hopson and his wife, Michelle, have two daughters, Virginia and Hannah.
