Ole Miss (3-8, 0-7) vs. Mississippi State (6-5, 3-4)



DATE: Friday, November 23, 2007

TIME: 11:30 a.m. CT

SITE (CAPACITY): Davis Wade Stadium/Scott Field (55,082); Starkville, Miss.

POLLS: Neither Ole Miss nor Mississippi State appear in the top-25 rankings.

SERIES INFO: This game will be the 104th meeting of one of the nation's most-played rivalries. Ole Miss holds a 59-38-6 advantage in the series dating back to 1901. The Ole Miss-Mississippi State series is tied with the North Carolina-Wake Forest series for the 16th longest in NCAA Division I-A history. The rivalry is also listed as the 10th longest uninterrupted series, as the NCAA considers Friday's game the 92nd consecutive year that the two schools have faced each other. Neither team, however, fielded a squad in 1943 due to World War II. Friday's game will be the 80th "Battle of the Golden Egg," as the two schools started playing for the trophy in 1927. Ole Miss holds a 53-21-5 advantage in the "Egg Bowl." The home team has won seven of the last eight games. Ole Miss has taken four of the last five in the series, including last year's 20-17 triumph in Oxford. The series is tied at 8-8 in the last 15 meetings since the series returned to campus sites in 1991, after being played yearly in Jackson from 1973-1990. The Rebels hold a 20-10-3 advantage in games played in Starkville.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR: Senior RB BenJarvus Green-Ellis has topped the 1,000-yard rushing mark for the second straight year ... He is averaging 92.7 yards per game with four 100-yard games ... QB Brent Schaeffer and WR Shay Hodge have connected for TDs in back-to-back games ... Sophomore DE Greg Hardy ranks third in the nation in both sacks (1.11 pg) and TFLs (2.00 pg) ... For the first time since 2000, the Bulldogs enter the Egg Bowl with a better overall record than the Rebels ... Ole Miss is looking to avoid its first winless SEC season since 1982 ... This will mark the Rebels' fifth TV appearance of the year and third on Lincoln Financial.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH ED ORGERON: Ed Orgeron (Northwestern State, 1984) is in his third season as the Ole Miss head coach, having been hired on Dec. 16, 2004. He has a career coaching record of 10-24. Ole Miss is Orgeron's first career head coaching position, although he possesses over 20 years of college coaching experience, most recently as an assistant head coach on USC's 2003 and 2004 national champion teams. Orgeron is 1-1 against Mississippi State as a head coach.

MISSISSIPPI STATE HEAD COACH SYLVESTER CROOM: Sylvester Croom is in his fourth season as the head coach at Mississippi State. He has led the Bulldogs to a 15-30 record, in this his first career head coaching assignment. Prior to taking the position at Mississippi State, Croom spent three seasons from 2001-2003 as an assistant coach with the Green Bay Packers. Croom also served on NFL coaching staffs with Tampa Bay (1987-1990), Indianapolis (1991) and San Diego (1992-1996). Croom started his coaching career as a graduate assistant on Paul "Bear" Bryant's staff at Alabama in 1976. He then served as an assistant for the Crimson Tide from 1977-1986. Croom is 1-2 versus the Rebels.

MISSISSIPPI STATE SCOUTING REPORT: With SEC victories over Auburn, Kentucky and Alabama, the Bulldogs are bowl eligible for the first time since 2000. State is coming off a 45-31 loss to Arkansas Saturday in Little Rock. The MSU offense averages 140.3 rushing yards and 168.0 passing yards per game. Sophomore RB Anthony Dixon directs the ground game with 954 yards and an SEC-high 13 TDs. True freshman QB Wesley Carroll has settled in at signal-caller and completed 113-of-209 passes for 1,223 yards with eight TDs and five interceptions. Senior Tony Burks and junior Jamayel Smith lead the receiving corps with 30 catches for 418 yards and 28 for 455, respectively. The Bulldogs rank fifth in the conference in both total defense (343.3 ypg) and pass defense (188.3 ypg). Jamar Chaney is the top tackler with 73 total stops, while fellow junior LB Dominic Douglas has recorded 69 tackles with eight TFLs. Senior DL Titus Brown is among the SEC leaders with 12 TFLs and eight sacks, and sophomore DB Anthony Johnson boasts three interceptions and eight pass break-ups. Junior K Adam Carlson has converted 8-of-11 field goals and 30-of-31 PATs.

November 25, 2006 • Oxford, Miss.
Ole Miss 20, Mississippi State 17: Marshay Green returned a punt 47 yards for a TD late in the fourth quarter to give Ole Miss a 20-17 win in the Egg Bowl. Brent Schaeffer tossed a TD pass to DE Greg Hardy early in the game, and the Rebels held on with the help of two short field goals by Joshua Shene. MSU kicker Adam Carlson missed a 51-yard field goal that would have tied the game as time expired.

November 26, 2005 • Starkville, Miss.
Mississippi State 35, Ole Miss 14: Jerious Norwood scored four touchdowns leading the Bulldogs to a 35-14 victory in the Egg Bowl. Norwood rushed for 204 yards and three touchdowns on 34 carries, and caught a 5-yard scoring pass from Mike Henig and helped Mississippi State outrush Ole Miss 304-31.

November 27, 2004 • Oxford, Miss.
Ole Miss 20, Mississippi State 3: The Ole Miss defense allowed no first downs and just nine yards of total offense over the first 27 minutes in a 20-3 victory over Mississippi State. The Rebels forced four

turnovers and limited MSU to 1-for-12 on third down. Freshman QB Robert Lane found TE Lawrence Lilly on a four-yard TD pass on the 15th play of a 78-yard drive in the first quarter and sprinted to the end zone from two yards on the 16th play of a 98-yard drive in the fourth.

November 27, 2003 • Starkville, Miss.
Ole Miss 31, Mississippi State 0: QB Eli Manning passed for 260 yards and three TDs, and the Ole Miss defense limited Mississippi State to 192 yards of total offense in a 31-0 win over the Bulldogs. WR Chris Collins caught eight passes for 113 yards, including a 23-yard TD pass in the third quarter to complete the scoring.

November 28, 2002 • Oxford, Miss.
Ole Miss 24, Mississippi State 12: QB Eli Manning connected with WR Chris Collins for two TD passes to lead Ole Miss to a 24-12 win on Thanksgiving night. Manning was 16-of-29 for 207 yards with two TDs, two INTs and also scored on a one-yard run. Collins finished with four catches for 130 yards, including a 77-yard TD reception.

THE START OF THE GOLDEN EGG: The Golden Egg was first proposed by members of Sigma Iota, an Ole Miss honorary society in 1927. Sigma Iota proposed that a trophy be awarded in a dignified ceremony designed to calm excited fans, after Ole Miss fans stormed the field at Starkville's Scott Field following the Rebels' 7-6 win in the 1926 contest.

The 1926 win snapped a 13-game losing streak to then Mississippi A&M, and was just Ole Miss' fifth win in 23 tries. Following the game, Ole Miss fans made a dash for the goal posts, while Aggie fans took after them with cane bottom chairs and fights broke out. The mayhem continued until most of the chairs were splintered.

After Sigma Iota made its proposal, Mississippi A&M approved the suggestion, and Ole Miss, two weeks before the game, officially added its approval. The trophy, to be called "The Golden Egg," would be a regulation-size gold-plated football mounted on a pedestal. Cost approximately \$250 would be shared by both schools.

On Thanksgiving Day, 1927, the first "Battle of the Golden Egg" was waged before a crowd of 14,000 in Oxford. The Rebels won 20-12 and the symbol of supremacy in the series was born.

ORIGINS OF THE NAME: The term "Egg Bowl" can be traced back to 1978, when Executive Sports Editor of the **Clarion-Ledger** Tom Patterson decided to spice up the 1978 meeting. A year earlier, the **Clarion-Ledger** headline on game day had been "Egg Bowl Is Up For Scramble," and the following day it was "Egg Bowl '77: State 18, Ole Miss 14." With the Rebels 4-6 and the Bulldogs 6-4 and apparently out of the bowl picture heading into the 1978 game, Patterson instructed his staff to follow the "Egg Bowl" theme throughout the week. The result was an award winning special section on Sunday, which recounted in great detail the Rebels' stunning 27-7 victory over the heavily-favored Bulldogs. While the game is still officially the "Battle of the Golden Egg," most members of the of the media now refer to the annual game simply as the "Egg Bowl."

"EGG BOWL" FACT: After being played on the Saturday following Thanksgiving the last two seasons, the "Egg Bowl" will be played the Friday after the holiday this year. From 1998 through 2003, the game was played on Thanksgiving Night and was televised nationally by ESPN. The two teams split those six meetings on Thanksgiving, with the Rebels winning the last two, 24-12 in 2002 in Oxford and 31-0 in 2003 in Starkville.

SENIOR FAREWELL: This game versus Mississippi State will mark the final appearance in a Rebel uniform for the 17 seniors on this year's team. REBEL NOTEBOOK

- The crowd of 61,118 at the home finale against LSU was the fourth-largest in Vaught-Hemingway Stadium history.
- Ole Miss is 0-7 in SEC play for the first time in program history. The Rebels have gone winless in conference play five times, most recently in 1982 when the team played only six league games and finished the league slate 0-6.
- The Rebel football program is three wins short of 600 ... Ole Miss boasts an all-time record of 597-459-35 (.566 winning percentage).
- This is the 113th football season at The University of Mississippi dating back to 1893 ... Ole Miss did not field teams in 1897 due to an epidemic of yellow fever, and also in 1943 when football was abolished at all Mississippi state-supported institutions by the Board of Trustees.

DEBUTS: A total of 25 players have made their Ole Miss debuts this year, including nine true freshmen in **Colby Arceneaux** (DB), **Lionel Breaux** (DB), **Johnny Brown** (DB), **Fon Ingram** (DB), **Ted Laurent** (DL), **Lawon Scott** (DL), **Chris Strong** (LB), **LaDerrick Vaughn** (DE) and **Scottie Williams** (LB). Other players seeing their first action this fall include **Christian Albarracin** (Sr., K); **Ben Benedetto** (RFR., DL) **Lamar Brumfield** (So., LB); **Derrick Davis** (RFR., RB); **David Densmore** (RFR., DL); **Tony Fein** (Jr., LB); **George Helow** (RFR., DB), **Reggie Hicks** (RFR., RB); **Kentrell Lockett** (RFR., DL); **Jacarious Lucas** (Jr., WR), **Ashlee Palmer** (Jr., LB); **Jamie Phillips** (So., LB); **Justin Sparks** (So., P); **Markeith Summers** (RFR., DB); **Allen Walker** (RFR., LB) and **Josh Zettergren** (Sr., WR).

CAPTAINS: Serving as team captains for the LSU were **BenJarvus Green-Ellis** (Sr., RB), **Robert Lane** (Sr., TE) and **Jamarca Sanford** (Jr., DB).

1,000 AGAIN: With 53 yards against LSU, senior RB **BenJarvus Green-Ellis** has topped the 1,000-yard rushing mark for the second straight season with 1,020 yards. He is only the second player in school history to reach the 1,000-yard single-season mark twice in his career, joining Kayo Dottley (1949 and 1950). Green-Ellis is on pace to finish the year with 1,113 yards, which would be the second-highest single-season total in school history

behind Dottley's 1,312 in 1949. Green-Ellis is sixth on the career list with 2,020 yards.

ONE-MAN SHOW: Senior QB **Brent Schaeffer** put on a total offensive display against the top-ranked Tigers Saturday and turned in a career performance. Despite playing only three quarters, Schaeffer came off the bench to rush for 94 yards and throw for 208 — both career highs. He completed 13-of-28 passes with two interceptions and a 33-yard TD toss to Shay Hodge, making consecutive games for the duo to hook up for a score. As part of some fourth-quarter heroics, Schaeffer tossed the TD and rushed for another for his first scoring run since his Rebel debut in the 2006 season opener against Memphis.

2,000 IN SITE: With 1,979 passing yards this season, senior QB **Seth Adams** needs just 21 more in the Egg Bowl to become the seventh player in school history to reach the 2,000-yard plateau in a season. The feat has been reached nine times by a Rebel passer, most recently Eli Manning in 2003. This year, Adams has registered five 200-yard games and the Rebels' first two 300-yard outings since 2004.

OTHER OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Ole Miss' 466 yards of total offense, 265 through the air and 201 on the ground were all the most surrendered this year by LSU, who came in leading the nation in total defense ... The Rebels outgained the Tigers in total offense, 466 to 396.
- Sophomore WR **Shay Hodge** hauled in four passes for 90 yards with his fifth TD of the year against LSU ... He has hauled in scoring tosses from Brent Schaeffer in consecutive games ... Hodge tops Ole Miss in receptions with 41.
- Starting for the second straight game on Saturday, sophomore WR **Dexter McCluster** topped the team in receptions with five for 73 yards ... He has caught at least two passes in each game since his return seven games ago.
- Junior **Mike Wallace** had his streak of 21 straight games with a catch come to an end Saturday ... Despite no receptions against the Tigers, Wallace still ranks eighth in the SEC in receiving yards per game at 64.3, and he leads the league in yards per catch at 19.1.
- Senior QB **Seth Adams** posted season lows in com-

pletions and passing yards in the LSU game, finishing 4-of-11 for 57 yards with an interception.

- Senior RB **BenJarvus Green-Ellis** has posted four 100-yard games this season and eight in his career ... Green-Ellis ranks fourth in the SEC rushing at 92.7 yards per game.

- The Ole Miss offense posted its second-most yards of the season against Alabama with 420.

- The Rebels' 534 total yards against Missouri was the most in the **Ed Orgeron** era, and the most since 567 total yards against Wyoming in 2004 ... It also marked the first time since the 2004 Wyoming game that Ole Miss has had a 100-yard rusher (**BenJarvus Green-Ellis**, 226) and 100-yard receiver (**Mike Wallace**, 136).

BACK IN THE BACKFIELD: After missing two games, sophomore DL **Greg Hardy** picked up where he left off Saturday, terrorizing the backfield. Hardy notched two sacks against LSU, giving him three games this year with multiple QB sacks, 10.0 total sacks and 18.0 tackles for loss. Hardy tops the SEC and ranks third in the NCAA in both sacks (1.11 pg) and TFLs (2.00 pg) and is also the conference leader in forced fumbles (0.33 pg).

PERIA ON THE PROWL: Junior DL **Peria Jerry** has been a force of late, totaling 10.0 TFLs and 39 total tackles in the last seven games. Facing top-ranked LSU, Jerry equaled his career highs of eight tackles and six solos, including one TFL and a pass break-up. He is fifth in the SEC in TFLs with 13.5.

OTHER DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Junior DB **Jamarca Sanford** led the unit Saturday with 10 total tackles ... Sanford has 34 stops in the last three games and has reached double-digit stops in five games.

- Sophomore DB **Cassius Vaughn** was credited with a career-best seven solo stops against LSU.

- The Rebel defense recorded its first shutout under **Ed Orgeron** against Louisiana Tech and first since the 2003 regular-season finale at Mississippi State (31-0).

- In the win over Memphis, the Rebels intercepted four passes for the first time since the 2004 Wyoming game ... Ole Miss totaled three interceptions the entire 2006 season.

POINTS FROM EVERYWHERE: The Rebels have had five TDs this year that were not scored on offense — a punt return against LSU (**Marshay Green**), a kickoff return against Northwestern State (**Mike Wallace**), a blocked field goal return against Louisiana Tech (**Dustin Mouzon**), and an interception return (**Mouzon**) and blocked punt recovery (**Kendrick Lewis**) against Memphis.

STREAKING SHENE: Sophomore **K Joshua Shene** has been perfect the last three games, nailing all three field goals and eight extra points. After missing the lone

PAT of his career in the season opener at Memphis, Shene has converted 21 consecutive attempts and is 42-of-43 in his career. He has connected on 11-of-16 FGs this year and leads the team in scoring with 55 points.

SPECIALTY NOTES

- Ole Miss had a return for a TD for the second consecutive game ... After **Mike Wallace** took a kickoff back 77 yards for a score against Northwestern State, **Marshay Green** returned a punt 44 yards for a TD in the LSU game ... It marked Green's second career punt return for score (Mississippi State, 2006).

- With Trindon Holliday's 98-yard return in the first quarter, Ole Miss allowed a kickoff return for a TD for the first time since last year's Arkansas game (Felix Jones, 100 yards).

BLOCK PARTY: Ole Miss has blocked three kicks this year — two punts and one field goal. Against Alabama, junior DB **Dustin Mouzon** broke free for the first punt block of his career in the third quarter. The ball bounced out of bounds at the Alabama eight yardline to set up a Rebel TD. Mouzon was also active on special teams against Louisiana Tech. Under three minutes left in the game, senior DL **Brandon Jenkins** registered his first career block on a Bulldog 37-yard FG attempt, and

Mouzon recovered and returned it 55 yards for the TD. In addition, the Rebels scored on special teams in the opener at Memphis, blocking a punt for a TD for the first time since 1995. Junior DB **Jamarca Sanford** got his first career block, and sophomore DB **Kendrick Lewis** recovered it in the end zone for his first TD. The Rebels have blocked eight kicks in **Ed Orgeron's** three years as Ole Miss coach.

MORE MOUZON: Junior DB **Dustin Mouzon** has not taken an offensive snap this year but has two TDs. Against Louisiana Tech, Mouzon scored on special teams when he recovered a blocked field goal and jetted 55 yards for the touchdown. In the opener against Memphis, he reached pay dirt on defense, returning an interception 99 yards for a TD. It tied the third-longest interception return in school history and was the longest by a Rebel since Louis Guy's 103-yard return in 1962. Mouzon finished the Memphis game with two picks, six solo stops and a fumble recovery in earning **SEC Defensive Player of the Week** honors. He became the first Rebel with two interceptions in the same game since Von Hutchins against Arkansas State in 2002, and Mouzon is first to earn weekly honors by the league since LB Rory Johnson following last year's Vanderbilt game.

Ole Miss has announced a two-game upcoming series with UAB. The Blazers will come to Oxford on Oct. 17, 2009, and the Rebels make the return trip to Birmingham on Sept. 8, 2012. Although the two schools have never faced, Ole Miss has played eight games at UAB's home of Legion Field against the Alabama Crimson Tide, with the last coming in 1977.

COOK HONORED FOR COMMUNITY WORK:

Ole Miss junior FB Jason Cook was recently selected to the 2007 American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team, and last week, he was distinguished as the SEC Community Service Team Player of the Week. An English major from Suwanee, Ga., Cook has been a vital part of the "Reading with the Rebels" program at local city, county and private schools. He has participated in the Oxford Pantry Food Drive, helped collect toys for "Toys for Tots," which was sponsored by the Marine ROTC at Ole Miss and other community service activities.

GRADUATING REBELS:

Five student-athletes on the Ole Miss football team have already received their undergraduate degrees. K Christian Albarracin has earned his B.A. in accountancy, while OL Marcus Cohen has his B.A. in African American studies. DL **Jeremy Garrett** has been selected as the 2007 recipient of the Chucky Mullins Courage Award, which goes to a rising senior defensive player each year. The award, sponsored by Phi Beta Sigma fraternity, honors the late Chucky Mullins, who had his Ole Miss career come to an end during the 1989 Homecoming game against Vanderbilt when he was paralyzed after making a tackle. After returning to his studies at Ole Miss, Mullins passed away on May 6, 1991. Garrett, who wears No. 54, will have the honor of wearing a "38" patch on his jersey during his senior campaign. Mullins wore No. 38 as a player at Ole Miss.

On Aug. 4, former Rebel **Gene Hickerson** was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio. The 6-foot-3, 248 pounder lettered three years at Ole Miss (1955-57) before anchoring

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) -- Behind second-half heroics by Brent Schaeffer, Ole Miss outgained No. 1 LSU 466 to 396 yards in total offense but fell short on the scoreboard, 41-24, at a packed Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) - Marshay Green returned a punt 47 yards for a touch-down late in the fourth quarter to give Ole Miss a 20-17 win over Mississippi State in the Egg Bowl.

Trindon Holliday returned a kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown, and LSU (10-1, 6-1) forced two turnovers during goal-line stands. Craig Steltz had rally ending interceptions late in each half, and Jacob Hester and Charles Scott each rushed for touchdowns after unsuccessful Ole Miss outside kicks in the fourth quarter to ensure the win. Colt David added second-half field goals of 48 and 43 yards as well.

The game featured little offense, but the Rebels (4-8, 2-6 SEC) managed a touchdown pass to defensive end Greg Hardy early in the game and held on to the victory with the help of two short field goals by Joshua Shene.

Ole Miss backup Schaeffer added some juice to the offense in relief, hitting several long passes and cutting LSU's lead to 10 with a serpentine 38-yard scoring run mid-way through the fourth.

Mississippi State kicker Adam Carlson missed a 51-yard field goal that would have tied the game as time expired.

Steltz picked off Schaeffer's errant pass on Ole Miss' next drive with 5:05, however. And Hester punched it in from 2-yards out to secure the win, though Schaeffer would hit Shay Hodge with a 33-yard touchdown pass with 2:54 left to make it 34-24.

Ole Miss returns the Egg Bowl trophy given to the winner to Oxford for the fourth time in the last five years.

Rebels tailback BenJarvus Green-Ellis earned his second-straight 1,000-yard season, with 53 yards rushing for a total of 1,020 with a game to go.

The Bulldogs (3-9, 1-7) finish with the worst record in the SEC and have not won more than three games in a season since 2000.

Ole Miss (3-8, 0-7) drove 57 yards to the LSU 2 on its second drive. But as Green-Ellis started to stretch the ball across the goal line on the next play, backup middle line-backer Jacob Cutrera, making the start for injured Darry Beckwith, caused the fumble at the 1.

Omarr Conner led a late rally to get the Bulldogs to 20-17 on an 8-yard touch-down pass to Jason Husband with 2:20 remaining. But Mico McSwain recovered Mississippi State's ensuing outside kick attempt to end one threat.

Ole Miss forced LSU to punt after three plays and Marshay Green broke three tack-les on the way to a 44-yard punt return to tie the score at 7.

Mississippi State controlled the game in the first half as freshman tailback Anthony Dixon rushed for 97 of his 125 yards, including a 2-yard dive late in the second quarter that tied it 10-10 at halftime.

LSU answered 14 seconds later when Holliday broke a tackle around the 30 and returned the ensuing kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown that put the Tigers back on top 14-7 with 3:04 left in the first quarter.

Mississippi State held Ole Miss running back BenJarvus Green-Ellis 1 yard short of 1,000 for the season. He finished with 37 yards.

Ole Miss threatened to tie the game going into halftime after driving to LSU's 4, but LSU's Steltz intercepted a pass by Adams in the back of the end zone.

Ole Miss took a lead on its first drive when Brent Schaeffer hit Hardy for a 23-yard touchdown. Hardy, a high school tight end who stands 6-foot-4, lined up at wide receiver and outleaped 5-11 Keith Fitzhugh for the score with 11:02 left in the first quarter.

Schaeffer started the second half, and finished with a career-high 208 yards pass-ing. He also rushed for a career-best 94 yards on eight carries.

Ole Miss had little offensive success the rest of the way with 200 total yards. The Rebels now lead the all-time series 59-38-6.

LSU's 98-yard scoring drive to open the game was its longest of the season, but Ole Miss held the Tigers to their fourth-lowest offensive output of the season with 396 yards.

MEMPHIS (AP) - Dustin Mouzon returned one of his two interceptions 99 yards for a touchdown and Ole Miss stopped Memphis' potential game-tying 2-point conversion with 31 seconds left in a 23-21 victory Saturday.

Martin Hankins connected with Duke Calhoun on an 8-yard touchdown to pull Memphis within two points. But Hankins' pass was incomplete as Ole Miss (1-0) won its third straight in the series that dates to 1921. Rebel coach Ed Orgeron has never lost to the Tigers.

Seth Adams threw for 201 yards and another touchdown for the Rebels.

Hankins finished with 343 yards on 41-of-60 passing.

Mouzon's scoring return late in the first half was one of two Ole Miss touchdowns not by the offense. The Rebels' special teams got on the board in the first half when they blocked a Memphis punt and recovered the loose ball in the end zone.

Turnovers were aplenty as Memphis (0-1) committed five and the Rebels had three fumbles.

Ole Miss led 20-0 at the half. Adams completed his first seven passes, one of them a 16-yard scoring toss to Greg Hardy on the first Ole Miss possession.

Mouzon was providing the defensive strength for Ole Miss, intercepting Hankins twice and recovering a fumble. On the second interception, Mouzon stepped in front of Calhoun near the end zone, and sprinted down the left sideline for a touchdown late in the half.

Between Hardy's touchdown catch and Mouzon's return, the Rebels benefited from another Tigers' mistake. Jamarca Sanford blocked a Memphis punt and the ball was recovered in the end zone by Kendrick Lewis for an Ole Miss touchdown.

Memphis rallied in the second half as Joseph Doss scored on a 1-yard run late in the third period, and reserve quarterback Matt Malouf added a 4-yard run in the fourth to set the stage for the final Memphis drive and Calhoun's touchdown catch.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) -- Despite its best offensive showing in four years, Ole Miss could not complete a second-half rally in a 38-25 loss to Missouri in the home opener.

BenJarvus Green-Ellis rushed for 226 yards and Seth Adams threw for 305 and three TDs, as the senior duo turned career days for the the Rebels (1-1).

Chase Daniel accounted for a career-high 396 total yards and threw five touchdowns passes as Missouri sprinted to a 28-point lead then held on for the win.

The Tigers (2-0) built a halftime lead of 28-7 with four touchdowns and 245 yards passing. Daniel then seemed to put the Rebels away with a 38-yard touchdown pass to Greg Bracey just 1:12 into the third quarter that gave the Tigers a 35-7 lead.

But Adams led the Rebels' push, completing 23 of 41 passes in his second start. His scoring passes of 68 yards to Mike Wallace and 3 yards to Greg Hardy in the third quarter cut Missouri's lead to 38-19.

Green-Ellis cut it to 38-25 with a 2-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter. But failed conversions cost Ole Miss 5 points, and the Rebels couldn't overcome their first-half mistakes, including Green-Ellis' fumble at the Missouri 7.

Ole Miss' 534 total yards is the most in the Ed Orgeron era, and the most since 567 total yards against Wyoming in 2004. Wallace joined in the career performances with 136 receiving yards on 7 receptions, while Hardy recorded a TD catch for the third straight game. All three of his career grabs have gone for scores.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) -- Despite two touchdown catches by Mike Wallace, Ole Miss could not hold off a balanced Vanderbilt offense in a 31-17 road loss in the Rebels' SEC opener. Wallace posted his second straight 100-yard receiving game with 139, including 54 yards on a fourth-quarter scoring toss from Brent Schaeffer.

Chris Nickson threw for 200 yards and ran for 78 more and a touchdown to lead Vanderbilt. Cassen Jackson-Garrison had three touchdowns and 127 yards rushing, and the Commodores (2-1) improved to 1-1 in the Southeastern Conference, while the Rebels (1-2) dropped their league opener for the fourth consecutive year. Ole Miss fell to 46-34-2 against Vanderbilt.

Schaeffer relieved Seth Adams in the fourth quarter, and threw the touchdown pass to Wallace on his first attempt to narrow the score to 24-17. Schaeffer failed to complete a pass on the following possession, and Jackson-Garrison scored for the Commodores on a short field to put the game out of reach.

Nickson, hampered all week by a sore hamstring, completed his first 10 passes to pace a Commodores offense that gained a season-high 183 rushing yards.

Adams threw for 154 yards on 10-for-17 passing, including a 36-yard touchdown to Mike Wallace that narrowed the Rebels' deficit to 14-10. But he threw a late interception to D.J. Moore, and four plays later Vanderbilt took a 24-10 lead.

Two-time All-SEC receiver Earl Bennett caught 11 passes for 100 yards, his ninth career game with at least 100 yards receiving at Vanderbilt.

The Commodores' defense gave up 262 yards but forced six sacks.

Bryan Hahnfeldt kicked a 24-yard field goal for Vanderbilt, and might have had another. Mackenzie Adams botched the snap on his second attempt.

Joshua Shene kicked a 34-yard field goal to narrow the gap to 7-3, but missed another.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) -- Florida's last trip to Oxford resulted in a Rebel upset of the No. 6 Gators in 2002. Ole Miss nearly pulled a repeat performance but fell just short in a 30-24 Florida win.

Tim Tebow passed for two touchdowns, ran for two more and set a school record for quarterbacks with 166 yards rushing to help No. 3 Florida (4-0, 2-0) hold off the Rebels (1-3, 0-2).

Ole Miss rallied to cut Florida's advantage to 27-24 on Seth Adams' 71-yard touchdown pass to Mike Wallace with 7 seconds left in the third quarter. But Tony Joiner ended the rally when he picked off a pass by Adams on the Rebels' next drive. Their final drive ended when they failed to make a first down on a fake punt.

Tebow answered with 37 yards rushing on a 12-play, 53-yard drive that consumed 5:55 and ended with Joey Ijjas' 25-yard field goal. The Rebels failed to make a first down on their final drive.

Ole Miss was able to move the ball on the Gators' young defense with 390 yards of total offense, but was hurt by penalties deep into Florida territory.

The Rebels got field goals by Joshua Shene of 40, 32 and 22 yards on its first three scoring drives. He also missed a 48-yarder late in the second half.

But Adams, whose status was in doubt after he sprained his right shoulder against Vanderbilt, brought Ole Miss back with a 19-yard touchdown pass to Shay Hodge with 2:47 remaining in the third that cut Florida's lead to 27-16.

Then after hitting Wallace on the next series, he connected with Marshay Green on the 2-point conversion to bring the Rebels within 27-24 with a quarter to play.

Adams finished with 302 yards passing and Michael Hicks had three catches for 89 yards, while the Rebel defense held the nation's No. 2 scoring offense 26 points below its season average.

Tebow engineered two second-half touchdown drives, scoring on a 6-yard run and throwing a 37-yard touchdown pass to Louis Murphy.

The sophomore, who was the nation's No. 2 passer coming into the game, finished with 261 yards passing. Percy Harvin had 11 catches for 121 yards and a 19-yard touchdown catching the second quarter that helped the Gators to a 14-6 half-time lead.

ATHENS, Ga. (AP) -- Ole Miss struck early and came within an inch of a two-touchdown lead in the first quarter but could not hold off the Georgia rushing attack in a 45-17 defeat to the 15th-ranked Bulldogs Saturday at Sanford Stadium.

Thomas Brown ran for 180 yards - the most for Georgia in six years - and three touchdowns.

Rebel running back BenJarvus Green-Ellis registered his second 100-yard rushing game and sixth of his career with 108 on 22 carries with a touchdown. Mike Wallace caught a TD pass for the fourth straight game with his 45-yard grab in the first quarter, and Seth Adams completed 24-of-35 passes for 228 yards with one TD and one interception.

The Rebels (1-4 overall, 0-3 SEC) hurt themselves with two turnovers, including a first-quarter fumble by quarterback Adams on a first-down play at the Georgia 1 when they were trying to take a 14-0 lead.

Georgia (4-1 overall, 2-1 Southeastern Conference) led 17-10 at halftime. Ole Miss tied the game with an 18-play drive that lasted more than 9 minutes to open the second half.

The game was tied 17-17 early in the third quarter before Brown, who scored earlier on a 50-yard run, took over. The senior had four carries and one catch for a combined 45 yards on a seven-play touchdown drive that ended with his 4-yard scoring run. He added a 41-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter.

Brown's rushing total was the high for Georgia since 2001, when Verron Haynes ran for 207 yards against Georgia Tech. He matched his career high with the three touchdown runs.

Georgia's total of 328 yards rushing was its most in seven years under coach Mark Richt, topping its 280 yards against Louisiana-Monroe in 2005.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) -- Seth Adams threw two touchdowns and the Ole Miss defense notched the Rebels' first shutout since 2003 in a 24-0 win over Louisiana Tech on homecoming.

Ole Miss (2-4) snapped a four-game losing streak while holding the Bulldogs (1-4) to 301 yards of total offense. Adams completed 16 of 32 passes for 167 yards and touchdowns to Dexter McCluster and Shay Hodge.

Louisiana Tech's Zac Champion threw for 144 yards on 16 of 27 passing, and the Bulldogs lost their fourth straight.

Danny Horwedel missed a 42-yard attempt in the third quarter, and Ole Miss' Brandon Jenkins blocked a 36-yard field goal attempt late in the fourth quarter and Dustin Mouzon returned it 55 yards for the final score.

Daniel Porter rushed for 51 yards for the Bulldogs, and Patrick Jackson added 48.

The two teams combined for four turnovers in the first half, and it was one of those that helped give Ole Miss a 7-0 lead.

Defensive end Marcus Tillman fell on Louisiana Tech center Lon Roberts' errant snap in the shotgun formation on the second play of the game. Three plays later, Adams hit McCluster on a deep slant for a 28-yard touchdown 1:32 into the game.

It was the first touchdown since Sept. 30, 2006, for McCluster, who missed the first four games of the year with a shoulder injury and the last six games of last season with a neck injury.

After Joshua Shene put Ole Miss up 10-0 at the half with a 27-yard field goal in the second quarter, Adams hit Hodge for a 17-yard touchdown in the third quarter for a 17-0 lead.

Louisiana Tech committed 13 penalties for 117 yards and allowed Ole Miss' first shutout since a 31-0 win over Mississippi State on Nov. 27, 2003.

The 24-point winning margin marked the Rebels' largest under head coach Ed Orgeron.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) -- A 43-yard Ole Miss completion in the final seconds was later overturned to end a Rebel rally in a 27-24 loss to Alabama. The Rebels took a 24-17 lead into the fourth quarter, when the Crimson Tide used a 54-yard punt return and 28-yard interception return to score 10 points in the final eight minutes.

On the critical reversal, Ole Miss quarterback Seth Adams completed a 41-yard pass to Shay Hodge to give the Rebels possession at the Alabama 4 with 7 seconds left.

After a 5-minute review showed Hodge stepped out of bounds and returned to the field to make the catch, the play was ruled illegal and Alabama (5-2, 3-1 Southeastern Conference) took over on downs for a final snap to seal the victory.

Ole Miss (2-5, 0-4) has lost three straight to Alabama, each by three points.

Leigh Tiffin put Alabama ahead with a 24-yard field goal with 5:14 left that was set up by an interception by Ezekial Knight. Alabama tied the game on the previous possession on a 3-yard touchdown run by Terry Grant with 7:11 remaining.

Rebel running back BenJarvus Green-Ellis rushed for 131 yards on 20 carries in recording his third 100-yard game of the year, while Adams completed 22-of-40 passes for 284 yards with two TDs and three interceptions. Receiver Dexter McCluster hauled in a first-quarter TD pass for the second straight game and finished with a team-high and career-high seven catches for 75 yards.

John Parker Wilson went 26-of-40 for 265 yards and D.J. Hall pulled down 11 receptions for 140 yards. Alabama finished with 420 yards of total offense, but was plagued by two second-half turnovers and a blocked punt that gave the Rebels the 24-17 lead into the final period.

Ole Miss defensive lineman Greg Hardy posted career highs of 13 total tackles, nine solos, five TFLs, three sacks, two forced fumbles and two QB hurries.

His biggest throw came on third-and-8 when he again hit Smith, who spun away from a defender and sprinted into the end zone with 3:15 to play. The TD pass ensured Auburn wouldn't have a seventh game decided in the final 2 minutes.

Smith finished with a career-high 111 yards on eight catches. Lester had 23 carries, including a 1-yard touchdown in the first quarter.

Joshua Shene connected on a 51-yard field goal in the final ticks of the first half for a 7-3 Tiger lead at the break and supply the lone Rebel points.

Colt David added second-half field goals of 48 and 43 yards as well.

Steltz picked off Schaeffer's errant pass on Ole Miss' next drive with 5:05, however. And Hester punched it in from 2-yards out to secure the win, though Schaeffer would hit Shay Hodge with a 33-yard touchdown pass with 2:54 left to make it 34-24.

Rebels tailback BenJarvus Green-Ellis earned his second-straight 1,000-yard season, with 53 yards rushing for a total of 1,020 with a game to go.

Ole Miss (3-8, 0-7) drove 57 yards to the LSU 2 on its second drive. But as Green-Ellis started to stretch the ball across the goal line on the next play, backup middle line-backer Jacob Cutrera, making the start for injured Darry Beckwith, caused the fumble at the 1.

Ole Miss forced LSU to punt after three plays and Marshay Green broke three tackles on the way to a 44-yard punt return to tie the score at 7.

LSU answered 14 seconds later when Holliday broke a tackle around the 30 and returned the ensuing kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown that put the Tigers back on top 14-7 with 3:04 left in the first quarter.

Ole Miss threatened to tie the game going into halftime after driving to LSU's 4, but LSU's Steltz intercepted a pass by Adams in the back of the end zone.

Schaeffer started the second half, and finished with a career-high 208 yards passing. He also rushed for a career-best 94 yards on eight carries.

LSU's 98-yard scoring drive to open the game was its longest of the season, but Ole Miss held the Tigers to their fourth-lowest offensive output of the season with 396 yards.
